Somali Pirates Take A Beating

DOZENS OF MISSING SOMALIS WHO WENT TO SEA IN SMALL SKIFFS LOOKING FOR FORTUNES NEVER TO RETURN ARE TESTAMENT TO THE 'FOOL'S GOLD' OF PIRACY

The returns of piracy have diminished. Dozens of missing Somalis who went to sea in small skiffs looking for fortunes never to return are testament to the fool's gold of piracy.

Meanwhile the number of pirate shipping attacks world wide have fallen sharply in the first half of 2012, led by a drop in Somali piracy, according to the International Chamber of Commerce (ICC) International Maritime Bureau's (IMB) most recent global piracy report.

Overall, 177 incidents were reported to the IMB Piracy Reporting Centre (PRC) in the first six months of 2012, compared to 266 incidents for the corresponding period in 2011.

The report showed that 20 vessels were hijacked world wide, with a total number of 334 crew members taken hostage.

There were a further 80 vessels boarded, 25 vessels fired upon and 52 reported attempted attacks.

Fast Thriller 'Total Recall' Turns Dreams To Reality

IT IS FANTASY time at the NYALI CINEMAX as all three new films this week are about fictional fantasy characters.

Kenya's tourism sector is once again on a growth path with the number of tourists visiting the East African nation increasing.

The latest report on economic indicators, Kenya National Bureau of Statistics (KNBS) revealed that the number of tourists visiting the country through its two main international airports swelled after months of maintaining a downward trajectory.

The government agency indicated that the number of tourists who arrived in the East African nation through Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA) and Moi International Airport (MIA) increased by 27 per cent in June, from 76,117 persons in the previous month.

The number of tourists went up by 27.3 per cent from 76,117 persons recorded in May to 97,000 persons in June," said the report.

This is the first time since January that the number of tourists arriving through JKIA and MIA increased.

In May, the number of tourists who arrived in the East African nation through the two entry points fell by 4.3 per cent from the previous month.

The number dropped from 79,844 persons recorded in April to 76,117 in May.

In April, tourist arrivals through the airports dropped by 16.8 per cent from 95,633.

In February, the number stood at 105,041, having dropped from 111,584 in January.

Tourist arrivals in Kenya have been on a downward path as Al-Qaeda allied Al-Shabaab militant group scaled up attacks in the capital Nairobi and coastal city of Mombasa.

The situation has been aggravated by travel advisories frequently issued by Britain and U.S., Kenya's tourist source markets.

While the two airports recorded a jump in the number of tourist arrivals, JKIA in Nairobi, recorded the highest.

Number of tourists, who arrived through the airport during the month under review, jumped up by about 20,000, from 71,287 persons in May to 90,972.

On the other hand, the number of tourists arriving through MIA, in Mombasa, increased marginally from 4,830 in May to 5,934 in

June. Similarly, the number of passengers, who left the East African nation through its main airports increased marginally by 0.4 per cent during the period in review.

"The number of passengers who embarked at JKIA increased from 172,704 persons in May 2012 to 173,391 persons, while passengers who landed increased by 0.5 per cent from 171,127 persons in May to 181,770 persons," said the report titled *Leading Economic Indicators*.

People destined to Europe led in the number of those who left the country at 39,451, up from 36,592 in May.

Africa came second with 34,639, down from 39,144 the previous month followed by Asia at 28,282, up from 26,379.

Somali Pirates Take A Beating

FROM FRONT PAGE piracy activity, dropping from 163 in the first six months of 2011 to 69 in 2012.

Somali pirates also hi-jacked fewer vessels, down from 21 to 13.

Nevertheless, Somali piracy continues to remain a serious threat.

"Somali pirate attacks cover a vast area, from the Southern Red Sea, Gulf of Aden, and Gulf of Oman to the Arabian Sea and Somali Basin, threatening all shipping routes in the northwest Indian Ocean," said Pottengal Mukundan, Director of IMB, which has been monitoring world piracy since 1991.

The report in part, has attributed the noticeable decline in Somali piracy to the pre-emptive and disruptive counter piracy tactics employed by the international navies.

This includes the disruption of mother vessels and Pirate Action Groups.

"The naval actions play an essential role in frustrating the pirates.

"There is no alternative to their continued presence," said Mr Mukundan.

The effective deployment of Best Management Practices, ship hardening and,

in particular, the increased use of Privately Contracted Armed Security Personnel (PCASP), has also contributed to the falling numbers.

As of 30 June 2012, Somali pirates were still holding 11 vessels and 218 crew, 44 of whom were being held ashore in unknown locations and conditions.

The decline in Somali piracy, however, has been offset by an increase of attacks in the Gulf of Guinea, where 32 incidents, including five hijackings, were reported in 2012, versus 25 in 2011.

In Nigeria alone there were 17 reports, compared to six in 2011, Togo reported five incidents including a hijacking, compared to no incidents during the same time last year.

The IMB report emphasized that high levels of violence were also being used against crew members in the Gulf of Guinea.

Guns were reported in at least 20 of the 32 incidents.

At least one crew member was killed and another later died as a result of an attack.

Attacks elsewhere in the world have mainly been armed robberies.

Indonesia accounts for almost 20 per cent of the global numbers, with 32 reported incidents compared to 21 over the same period in 2011.

Twenty-eight of the vessels targeted were boarded, including 23 anchored vessels, two berthed and three that were underway.

Guns have been reported on one occasion.

IMB further noted that many other attacks may also have gone unreported.

The IMB PRC remains the world's only manned centre to receive and disseminate reports of piracy and armed robbery 24 hours a day across the globe.

As part of ICC it is an independent body set up to monitor these attacks free of political interference.

IMB strongly urges all shipmasters and owners to report all actual, attempted and suspicious piracy and armed robbery incidents to the IMB PRC.

This is an essential first step in the response chain.

The statistics and reports of the IMB PRC act as a catalyst to encourage firm response by government and law enforcement.

Justice is as much as a matter of public perception as it is the application of the law. The Chief Justice should end lobbying in court in favour of the affluent.

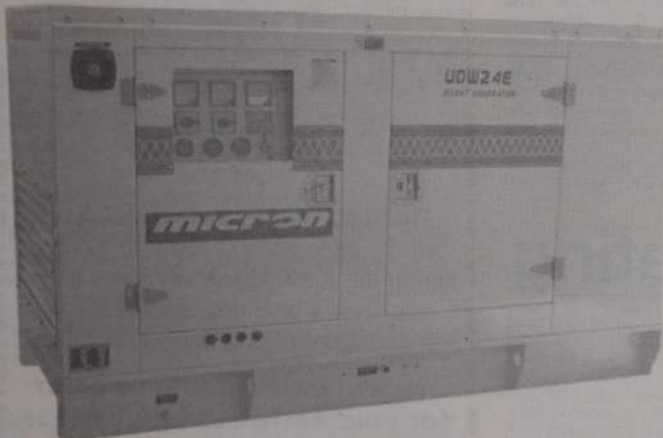
So let justice prevail and long live justice for all.

KWS Translocate 150 Jumbos From Narok North District To Maasai Mara

Kenya Wildlife Service (KWS) has begun a month-long exercise from Tuesday, August 28, 2012 to translocate 150 elephants from Narok North District to the Maasai Mara National Reserve.

The exercise aims to mitigate rising cases of human-elephant conflict in the area.

The translocation is set to greatly minimize the human-elephant conflict particularly regarding to crop raids, property destruction, human injuries and death.

It is also expected to reduce incidences of elephant mortalities and reduce KWS expenditures on Problem Animal Control.

This is the second phase of the translocation exercise.

In the first phase carried out late last year, a total of 62 elephants were successfully moved from Narok North District to the Maasai Mara.

These elephants have since been monitored intensively by GSM/GPS satellite collars, aerial and ground patrols.

A number of the translocated elephants will also be fitted with GSM/GPS collar chips to monitor and track their movements.

Rapid change in lifestyle of local communities from pastoralists to crop farming and other incompatible land-use practices have tremendously led to increased human wildlife conflict in the Narok County.

Such conflict in many areas is mainly attributed to increased human population and loss of elephant habitat due to un-

controlled human activities, especially crop farming, charcoal burning and human settlements.

Narok County is currently designated as one of the human-wildlife conflict (HWC) hotspots in the country with elephants identified as the most problematic wildlife species. Earlier this year, KWS launched a national

elephant conservation and management strategy. The document provides a clear roadmap for conservation and management of elephants in Kenya for the next 10 years.

The elephant strategy seeks to reduce cases of human-elephant conflict and increase the value of elephants to people

and habitats.

It outlines strategies KWS and other conservation partners will use to protect the species, particularly in key strategic locations, such as dispersal areas, migration corridors and in the human-elephant conflict hotspots such as the Narok ecosystem.

World Bank Guarantee Electricity Sector

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- The World Bank and Kenya government on Tuesday signed a partial risk guarantee to cover the energy private sector investors to the tune of U.S. \$47 million dollars, under Ronald Njoroge.

Permanent Secretary of the Finance Ministry Joseph Kinyua

told journalists here that the deal will add another 87 Megawatts to the national grid.

"The World Bank and the Kenya government has reached a 47-million-dollar agreement that will see the private sector increase its participation in energy generation," Kinyua said during the signing ceremony.

The events come a month after the government commissioned

the construction of a geothermal power plant in the country's Rift valley which contains a potential of over 7,000MW of green power.

The secretary said that under the agreement government will provide a letter of support to the Thika Power in order to build a thermal power plant in Nairobi.

According to the ministry, Independent Power Producers (IPPs) have been demanding payment security from national distributor Kenya Power which has already provided the security to three private power investors.

"It is not possible due to legal framework to issue government guarantees as it will compromise debt sustainability benchmarks," the treasury official said.

World Bank's Director for Kenya Johannes Zutt said that his institution will send a guarantee letter of credit issued by Citibank to the IPP.

Zutt noted that under the framework of the Multilateral Insurance Guarantee (MIGA), which is part of the World Bank, has committed to provide an additional termination and political risk to the IPP amounting to 49 million dollars.

The official added that the International Development Assistance (IDA) which belongs to the World Bank has also signed a project agreement with Thika Power.

According to the World Bank, it provides Partial Risk Guarantee (PRGs) to Citi Bank when it issues a letter of credit to the IPPs.

"The 47 million dollars are part of the 166 million dollars that the bank has earmarked to Kenya's energy sector," he said.

Zutt said that bank hopes to leverage 400 million dollars from

the private sector in order to connect an additional 285 MW in the electricity grid.

"The PRGs are designed in order to provide minimal support to the IPPs given Kenya Power's history of timely payments of energy producers," he added.

Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Energy Peter Nyoike said that there are five IPPs that are in the process of undertaking power projects.

"The Lake Turkana wind Project is under negotiations with the World Bank but the preliminary timeline is that in 28 months, the first phase will be connected to the national grid," he said.

The ministry of energy said that the government approached the World Bank last May in order to provide letter of support.

"The signing of the agreement shows that the bank will continue to support our efforts to increase electricity access to all areas of Kenya," Nyoike said.

He added that guarantees will cushion the IPPs in the event that Kenya's power is unable to fulfill its payment obligations.

Kenya Power Managing Director Joseph Njoroge said that the Thika Power plant is at advanced stage of construction while the construction of another 83 MW power plant will soon commence after reaching an guarantee agreement with the World Bank.

"We will continue with our robust pace of growth in order to meet our targets under the economic Blue Print Vision 2030," he noted.

Njoroge added that due to an acute shortage of power, his company will enter into power purchase agreements with any IPPs as government resources are limited.

French Navy Stealth Frigate 'La Fayette' Visits Mombasa

French Navy Ship La Fayette has been visiting Mombasa over the week end 25-27 August 2012.

Integrated in the European Atalanta operation against piracy for the duration of its deployment in the Indian Ocean, off the Horn of Africa, La Fayette participates in all missions fighting against sea piracy.

During the stop-over, the commander, Capitaine de Vaisseau Guillaume Merveilleux du Vignaux, and the French chargée d'affaires, Stéphanie Seydoux, welcomed Kenyan political and military authorities,

diplomats, esteemed guests and journalists on board.

Also expected is Admiral Jacques Launay, Chief of the European mission EUCAP-NESTOR, which aims at strengthening the maritime capacities in the Horn of Africa, including Kenya.

Called to active duty in 1996, La Fayette is the first in a series of five innovative light frigates with stealth and discretion qualities that are remarkable assets to conduct maritime operations, including those carried out on the coastal fringe.

This type of vessel specially

equipped with a Panther helicopter and speedboats is particularly suited to the fight against piracy that requires endurance, strength, discretion and quick projection capabilities.

Based in Toulon (France) it is served by a crew of about 170 sailors.

Operation Atalanta is a large-scale anti-piracy operation set up by the EU in November 2008 under the French Presidency of the European Union.

It deploys a multinational naval force in the Gulf of Aden and the Somali Basin, including French Navy ships.

Consisting of thirty warships from 20 nations, Operation Atalanta provides protection for nearly 80 per cent of commercial shipping in the Gulf of Aden.

France was previously involved in escort missions for ships chartered by the World Food Programme (WFP) between Mombasa, Kenya and Somalia (Operation Alcyon).

The operation was taken over by Europe's Operation Atalanta, the first maritime operation carried out as part of European Security and Defence Policy (ESDP).

France played a pioneering role in the decision to escort civilian vessels in the Gulf of Aden, in securing a firm mandate from the UN Security Council to combat piracy, and in the decision to launch the first operation of the EU's Operation Atalanta.

EU Naval Force German Warship Sachsen Repairs Merchant Dhow Adrift Off Somalia

German E.U. Naval Force Frigate 'Sachsen' has come to the aid this week of 'Al Saciid', a cargo dhow adrift off the Somali coast due to a problem with the steering gear.

The Sachsen was advised of the dhow's predicament by a Japanese MPRA (Maritime Patrol and Reconnaissance Aircraft) patrolling the area. Having established good communications with Al Saciid's master, he agreed to receive a technical team from the German frigate. The German technicians removed the broken parts and took them back aboard Sachsen where they were welded. The repaired parts were then handed over to the dhow's crew, who were able to continue safely on their way.

Coast Launch For 'The Life of William Northrup McMullan' By Biographer Judy Aldrick

This new book by Judy Aldrick brings to life one William Northrup McMullan, writes **Marlene Reid**.

Her book is a well researched account of his life covering his early years in Canada and America until his arrival in BEA (British East Africa) in 1905, when the country was beginning to develop and the 'Lunatic Express' was opening up the country, until his death in 1925.

Born of a long line of Williams in Canada where his grandfather had emigrated in 1834 from Stranraer, in North West Scotland, in search of a better life:

proprietor of grocery and hardware stores and supplying wood for the railway he was blessed with five sons.

James and William (Northrup's father) moved to America, St Louis, and set up very successful companies that manufactured railway cars.

James moved into politics but William stayed with the railway cars and became very wealthy.

Thus Northrup was born into an already wealthy family becoming an only child when his two siblings died in infancy.

Northrup was himself a sickly child with a weak chest not helped by St Louis' sooty and damp climate; nor was he academically very bright preferring to be outdoors fishing and hunting.

At the age of 16 he joined his father in the factory which was not at all to his liking.

He found working with his father difficult especially as his father favoured William Keene Bixby as his right hand man over William.

Due to increasing poor health and fear of consumption Northrup was sent to New Mexico where he found life much more to his liking; his health improved and he came back weighing 250 pounds and measuring 6 feet 3 inches.

In 1894 Northrup married Lucie Fairbanks Webber.

The two were such opposites in every way that 'a marriage of convenience' was a speculation among their friends.

In 1898 the young couple moved to England where Northrup acted as the company representative until 1901 when his father died.

With half his father's fortune plus his own considerable wealth Northrup became a very rich man and the scene was set for him to follow his longing to travel to Africa to hunt lion, which his father would never allow him to do, in the steps of his heroes Rider Haggard, Frederick Courtney Selous and Rudyard Kipling.

"The fascination of big game hunting and the exploration of Africa attracted him and for the next four years he followed his inclination in that direction and travelled extensively".

He entered with enthusiasm into the exploration of Ethiopia and led two expeditions on the Nile, neither of which were successful but the camp life, the hunting, the camaraderie was what Northrup had failed to find in America and he was never again happy to be away from the great outdoors despite all the dangers, discomforts and uncertainties.

His safaris, with their large number of porters, mules, the boats (which refused to be assembled when they reached the Nile), plus the huge amount of rations make it easy to imagine that it was not easy to travel with all this over the hostile and difficult terrain.

By now Northrup was of huge proportions and had a gargantuan appetite, due to which, food sometimes ran out and starvation loomed; plus he was too heavy for the mules; and walking was not an option.

However, despite the setbacks, Northrup and two of his companions were made members of the Royal Geographic Society due to the large numbers of skins, details of unknown flora and fauna they returned with.

The next foray was to British East Africa (BEA). Determined to shoot rhino or lion which had evaded him on his recent expedition Northrup, who had heard BEA had plenty of lion, arrived in Mombasa, the entrance for all new settlers, in September 1904.

There was no infrastructure in Kilindini at this time and Northrup found the red tape which caused many tiresome delays very irksome.

Eventually he was allowed to travel as far as Athi and so embarked on the railway to Nairobi which took 36 hours and which Northrup called 'Tinsville' due to all its tin roofs.

He soon presented himself to the Commissioner, Sir Donald Stewart, a military man with a fondness for alcohol and at his most accommodating with this larger than life, wealthy American. Northrup was allocated a plot on a farm called Long Juju, in Nderegu, on which to pitch his camp.

It was situated near to Athi River close to Ol Donyo Sabuk. Northrup had arrived!

The clean air, the open aspect, the perfect view, the abundance of wild life was paradise to him, a complete contrast to the sooty, polluted and damp climate of St Louis.

He had fallen in love with BEA, he lost all interest in expeditions: BEA now became his new enthusiasm.

The McMullans were here to stay.

He abandoned his planned hunting in Uganda claiming poor health.

He managed to buy Long Juju farm and then acquired the mountain Ol Donyo Sabuk from the syndicate of Englishmen who owned it, bringing his land

but he was nevertheless a prominent member of the early pioneering group whose input was so important in shaping the future of Kenya".

He used his money to fund many projects, many of them unsuccessful, he assisted his friends and did not hesitate, at the outbreak of World War One, to involve himself with the 'Old and Bold' or the 'Boozalers', a medley of mismatched older men who formed a fighting force to protect BEA against the Germans, the only British Expeditionary Force to embark in the field without prior training.

To join this force Northrup had to become a British citizen.

He took part in the first battle at Bukoba which lasted for two days after which he was assigned to the commissariat, a much more suitable niche for him with his poor health and 64 inch sword belt.

He turned both Juja and Chiromo over to the army as convalescent homes for soldiers, funding them from his own money.

He was devastated to hear that his hero Selous had been killed by a sniper at Beho Beho in Tanganyika.

In 1918 he was knighted for his 'unusual' services, something that meant a great deal in the society of those days.

Post War years brought many changes. BEA soon became 'Kenya'.

There were many currency changes, soldier-settlement schemes, the need to make Kenya profitable, a desire for Kenya to be more independent from the colonial office, local people were needed in the work force, the dreaded 'kipande' card was introduced.

Northrup threw himself wholeheartedly into this confusion; he became a member of the Legislative Assembly (Leg Co.) and spoke at many assemblies.

He worked closely with Lord Delamere who was establishing training schemes for Africans, Northrup supplying a lot of the funding in the last year of his life.

A rare close-up of the McMullans at home and at play comes from a diary kept by William Keeney Bixby on his two month visit in 1921.

Northrup was proud to show that he had made good, maybe not in the way his father would have wanted but nevertheless he had proved himself something which Bixby appreciated.

By 1921 Northrup had lost heart in his many unsuccessful farming experiments at Juja.

He had built a new house at Ol Donyo Sabuk, he had tried and abandoned gold mining once but then got enthused a second time

but true to form the mine failed to produce gold.

The McMullans were now part of the Nairobi High Society, on easy terms with the governor and top officials, even Karen Blixen who was a renowned snob was a close friend.

Northrup struck up a friendship with Martin and Osa Johnson, an American couple, pioneer photographers.

The idea of shooting animals with the camera instead of the gun, previously urged by Selous and now firmly acceded to by Northrup was taking hold.

His last safari accompanied by Lucie, was a visit to the Johnsons at Lake Paradise.

When leaving they promised to come back but that was not to be.

Northrup was now seriously unwell.

His over-eating and over-drinking had caught up with him.

Northrup left Kenya on February 23rd 1925 for the last time.

He was taken off the ship at Marseilles and rushed to a Nice hospital where he died on March 22nd from pleurisy and heart disease.

His embalmed body was returned to Mombasa, and after a service with full military honours, on March 30th he was buried on Ol Donyo Sabuk, his favourite spot in the world.

Kenya had lost a faithful friend. The MacMillan Library [with its famous lion sentries] in Nairobi still stands in his memory.

He helped found the YMCA and there were many other beneficiaries of his wealth.

He chose Kenya as his home, his enthusiasm and he used his money for its early development.

Judy Aldrick has brought Northrup to life; she tells his story with neither sentimentality nor criticism, she presents the story of Northrup warts and all.

Copious footnotes and bibliographical details complement the text.

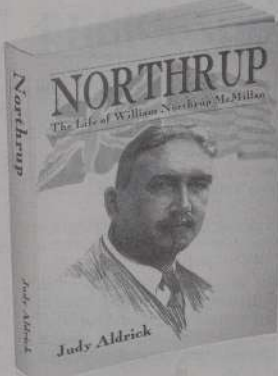
Eighty maps, illustrations and old photographs (some a little difficult to see in detail) in just over 200 pages of text, recreate the scenes of that time.

As with Katharine Fanning Judy has captured the life of another larger than life, mostly forgotten personality; a part of Kenya's history, captured before it is completely obliterated.

The Farm soon had every modern convenience including electricity.

This must have been in big contrast to the many settlers who could hardly make ends meet.

BEA in 1905 was everything that Northrup desired; a touch of the Wild West and New Mexico, Maasai and other tribes taking the place of Native Indians.

Juja soon became a haven of hospitality with many prestigious visitors (the most important of whom was Theodore Roosevelt in 1909) all being lavishly entertained.

There was plenty of animals in the vicinity with the exception of elephant and hunting was easy to arrange.

The McMullans had also acquired a house in Nairobi from Ewart Grogan.

The house, Chiromo, was considered the finest in Nairobi and it was here that Lucie liked to be; the maleness of Juja not being to her liking.

Chiromo had a fine outlook over the Ngong Hills and the Athi Plains, built of the finest materials and with a 75 acre estate surrounding it; ample room for Lucie's horses, dogs, gardens and a guesthouse.

Chiromo, now part of Nairobi University, was a virtual palace, becoming another centre to entertain their many visitors.

Northrup did not quite fit into any of the categories of settler

SAVE WILDLIFE THROUGH AFRICA'S WILDEST STORIES

To most people, Paula Kahumbu is known as a hard core conservationist and defender of animal welfare.

She has worked for KWS, Lafarge EcoSystems, Kenya Land Conservation Trust and the blogging platform WildlifeDirect.

Many will remember Paula as the best selling author of *Owen and Mzee*, a true story about the friendship that developed between a baby hippopotamus orphaned by the Indian Ocean Tsunami in 2004, and a 130 year old giant tortoise that still live at Haller Park.

The book sold over a million copies and is now in over 25 languages including Kiswahili.

Paula believes that everyone has a story to tell and is now launching her latest project *Africa's Wildest Stories* the revival of African storytelling in the digital age to inspire generations and save wildlife.

This project capture stories through audio and video

recordings around nature and wildlife in Kenya told by those who experienced them, and made accessible for anyone anywhere to listen to them on a public radio exchange website called Prx.org, and on youtube.

Africa's Wildest Stories is only two months old and is already creating quite a buzz in the conservation community.

Kahumbu started the project *Africa's Wildest Stories* earlier this year when Nickson Parmisa, a local Maasai from Kitengela told her of his concerns that the wisdom, knowledge and traditions of his people were dying.

He warned that this loss of traditional knowledge is already contributing to the serious mistakes we are making regarding the management of natural resources such as wildlife, water, forests and habitats, and this was leading to the killing of lions.

Recently initiated as a Maasai junior elder, Nickson said he had become acutely aware that the knowledge contained in the oldest age class, 90 - 110 year olds was

vanishing, and that this year already the group had been reduced from 5 to just three individuals.

They decided to record the audio and video stories from those willing to tell them so that their real life stories can be retold the way they were originally told to current and future unborn generations.

The stories are accessible to anyone anywhere via the internet on WildlifeDirect.org and for radio stations through a public radio exchange Prx.org. This project makes connections between our extraordinary cultural and biological diversity and recognizes that this is a vital part of Kenya and Africa's heritage.

By simply converting your telephone into a recording device, anyone anywhere can capturing stories from their elders and contribute to the archive of *Africa's Wildest Stories*.

The aim of this project is to create Africa's largest online living audio oral history of wildlife related stories told by people who live or have lived in Africa.

The purpose of the course was to comprehend and interpret basic epidemiological and biostatistics concepts and terms commonly used in scientific medical literature and develop and strengthen basic knowledge which enables them to promote their learning and skills required for advanced learning in Epidemiology and Biostatistics.

The participants of the course were attending

from different health sectors such as government, both urban and rural, provincial and district health officers, health manager from private hospital in Mombasa, and health managers from Aga Khan School of Nursing.

It was also attended by two health managers from Aga Khan health project in Tanzania "Joining Hands Initiative".

The course was developed and facilitated by the faculty members from University of Alberta, Canada and members of CHD, Mombasa.

The course was designed with a purpose to allow knowledge gaining and sharing through morning classroom sessions, and facilitated afternoon group work sessions utilized to practice the knowledge gained using specially prepared case studies and data.

This element of practical demonstration was well received by the participants.

CHD will continue to offer such courses in future due to positive feedback from participants.

launch time. They had decided to discard the school uniform for the day, and wore colourful dresses, with moon, rockets, astronaut, and other space features drawn with felt pens.

The boys had their shirts similarly decorated in various space themes.

As launch time approached, many parents arrived and sat on the grassed area near the classroom.

In the classroom there was an electric aura, some of the pupils so excited that they had goose pimples.

When the radio broadcast started, the silence in the room was most uncanny.

The live broadcast, apart from some static was very clear, and I was on toes, noting and ticking all the information against the headings on the blackboard.

For half an hour, we listened to the information.

Then, finally, the 'countdown' commenced.

On the board I started to cross off the numbers as *T minus* was called out.

It seemed so long, yet it was only a very brief moment.

Then we heard: It was a 'go'.

As I crossed out the words takeoff, and turned to look at the class, there were wide eyes, open mouths and utter silence.

Then they all stood and gave a roar, the girls ululated, the boys whistled, all clapped and jumped up and down.

Through the open door and the ventilated walls we saw parents stand arms raised cheering, and women shuffling and ululating around the headmaster.

Every classroom had children poking their heads out of the windows, and through the entire school desk tops rattled, and hand claps rang out.

The whole school day was abuzz with nothing else, but the moon shot.

And, this distant event so far away from the tiny Likoni village had an instant happy return for one member of the community.

From the day of the display and till the day of the launch and the first step on the moon, our regular *mama mandazi*, the mandazi lady, who sold these triangular pastries at recess, made a very good killing, setting up raffia trays, near the VII class door.

Perhaps, a very first economic windfall that emanated concurrently from a space programme.

It certainly was for an old lady vending her mandazi in a sleepy little Likoni Village, on the African mainland.

When I chided her for commission she promised me a free supply for the rest of the week.

On the day of the landing, the excitement was no less.

This time the school ground was full of parents and villagers.

They filled all the grassed areas near the class room and the school playground.

Men sat quietly, and puffed hand rolled 'sigara' [cigarettes], that had a strong whiff.

Women chatted and retrieved their small scampering children into their laps.

Every person waited to hear just the few words that would tell them, a man had landed on the moon.

In the class room, the radio once again brought live information as the mission progressed.

As I hastily scribbled the distance away from the lunar surface via the live transmissions, not a child in the class fidgeted or whispered.

Then as 'chalked' *Houston*,

Eagle has landed, the pupils came alive.

Claps, whistles, and ululations filled the classroom.

The Head master who sat in the corner and self received hugs from almost hysterical girls.

When silence returned we awaited the next great moment.

It seemed too far way.

It was too long to wait after such a mighty journey, as the astronauts rested on the moon.

But when, 'One step for man, giant leap for mankind' came through, the whole class rose in great shouts, then shot out of the door and ran round the school, in between the classes, screaming, shouting, clapping, and some with tears, went to the soccer field and began a spontaneous ngoma, dance.

Never before the school had experienced such exciting days, and for the kids of the class VII, it was the most memorable day of their lives.

The men and women of the village stayed back, asking me countless questions.

A festive mood pervaded at the school, until at the end of the

school time, as the last bell rang, shouting clapping school children burst out of the classes and made noisy way home.

During my 2001 visit to Likoni and the school, the class VII kids, now all adults with families invited me to an informal 'chai' and 'mamuni' at a pupil's home, who was now a teacher at his old Likoni Primary School.

As we sat in his small front yard, the Class VII of 1969, now young men and women, arrived.

They recalled the days of the broadcast at the school, an event they would not forget.

The girls, now mothers, said they felt especially important, to be included in an event of such Global importance.

It enhanced their self image so very greatly, as no other girl pupils even in Mombasa mainland high schools had had such front row seats.

Three had young sons; yes, they were called 'Armstrong'.

Rest in Peace dear Armstrong.

The joint effort of the Japanese women aided them to a sixth consecutive team bronze medal - making them the only medalling country outside of the typically strong African triumvirate of Kenya, Ethiopia and Eritrea.

In China a total of 30 countries were represented brining together 123 runners.

Both were on the reserve list for the Olympics. Only Peninah Arusei, third in Nanning City in 2011 has been retained in the team.

"The team faces a stiff challenge from all over the world in their quest to retain both the men's and women's overall title, which Kenya won in Nanning China in 2011."
