'RING-US-UP' IS LIVE TONIGHT!

THOUSANDS WILL JOIN MOMBASA CHARITY AUCTION

AN ANTICIPATED bumper audience of more than 50,000 Mombasa viewers are expected to watch and participate in tonight's VoK Ring-Up TV auction programme as items worth over half a million shillings go under the hammer. The T.V. extravaganza, running from 8.00 p.m. to midnight with a half hour news break and in colour for the first time, is once again being organised by the Mombasa Round Table No.3 and Mombasa Nyali Round Table No. 25 in conjunction with the Voice of Kenya and the Kenya Posts and Telecommunications Corporation. The annual programme is also being sponsored by Mwangi Coffee Exporters and Zubeidi Brothers together with Inland Containers of the Jaffer and Jaffer Group.

London worth 24,000/- each, two return tickets from Nairobi to Jeddah worth 12,000/- donated by Saudia Airlines and a MITA photocopier retail-valued at 60,000/-.

Various dukas will be selling household goods, office, hardware goods, radios, musical instruments and various items of general interest.

BATTERY EXPORTS BREAK-THROUGH

A VALUABLE export order worth nearly 1.25 million shillings in foreign exchange has been fulfilled by Associated Battery Manufacturers (East Africa) Limited.

5500 completed batteries have been shipped to Dubai in the Gulf, on board the "Lloyd Mexico". Part of the shipment will be transferred to Muscat and Oman.

It is unusual for manufactured goods to be shipped abroad from Kenya, especially to the Middle East where competition is intense.

The order was obtained through Chloride International Marketing, the group company in Britain which is responsible for finding export markets for all group factories.

Twenty-eight tons of lead in ingot form have been exported by ABM to Uganda, in a con-

signment worth Shs. 330,000/-.

Further consignments of batteries have gone to Burundi valued at Shs. 143,000/-, and to Rwanda worth Shs. 136,000/-.

Yet another export enquiry from Ghana has been received which if confirmed will mean an order valued in the region of Shs. 2.5 million.

The managing director of Associated Battery Manufacturers, Mr Rob Bertram said:

"It is immensely satisfying that it is on the basis of quality and delivery that we have obtained these orders for export.

"Our recent factory extension, plus our self-sufficiency in lead from local sources mean that we can handle the larger volume of export business without affecting our production to satisfy local demand."

Russian Trawler Runs Aground Off Mtwapa

A STRANDING drama and an expected salvage episode, which proved not to be, provided considerable excitement last Sunday particularly to the residents of Mtwapa Creek. The centre of interest was the 635 gross ton twin funnelled Russian stern trawler GERANTA which grounded on a coral reef on the southern side of the entrance to Mtwapa.

She took the ground at approximately 8 a.m. on a falling tide so that at low water at 11.30 a.m. she was nearly high and dry. Whilst her Master had apparently indicated that no help was yet required in early afternoon the Mombasa based Eagle tug SEA EAGLE was first on the scene followed by the Murri tug BARBARA.

Bob Brenneisen, Managing Director of Bamburi Portland Cement Company and a resident of Mtwapa kindly alerted me to the position of the stricken vessel so we proceed to view the scene from his Zodiac for some 2 hours and watched with interest the Russian efforts — the crew must have numbered about 20 — to refloat by use of their anchor to haul themselves off the reef stern first on the incoming tide.

On their third attempt they were successful and at 5.30 she floated free on an even keel two hours before high water thereafter she proceeded due East and entered Mombasa on Monday morning berthing at Liwatoni for presumably an examination as a first priority.

The state of the tide, calm seas and the location of her grounding was a stroke of good fortune for the Russians because the incident had the makings of a constructive total loss.

Questions undoubtedly to remain unanswered are (a) what was a foreign trawler doing in such close proximity to the

cently of cadet training vessels and with the visit of the Korean HANBADA fresh in our minds, a second such vessel of a different class to call this week is the Polish harqueentine POGORIA due to have arrived on Wednesday for a three week visit. Built in Gdansk in 1982 of 342 tons displacement she took part in the International Tall Ships Race in 1980.

On her current voyage she is on charter to the West Island College of Canada and is virtually operated as a floating school for Canadian students. Her total complement is 54. Many shiplovers will look forward to this visit and the sight of a sailing ship in Kilindini after so many years.

Two French Naval units arrived in port at daybreak on Monday for a short visit during their tour of duty in the Indian Ocean. Both vessels have visited Mombasa before namely the frigate PROTET (F-748) with a standard displacement of 1750 tons, and the depot ship RHIN (A621) of 2075 tons. Commissioned in 1964, the RHIN entered AMGECO drydock on arrival whilst the PROTET berthed astern of H.M. S. HYDRA at Mbaraki Wharf. I understand there will be another French Naval visit in early January.

Loading in Mombasa this week has been the 19PJ built ARNSTADT on her maiden voyage to East Africa for D.S.R. Line, the East German Shipping Group, and members of the

East African Conference Lines, who operate a regular service to and from Scandinavia, N.W. Continent and East Africa with an additional call at a UK port Northbound.

Having been taken round the vessel by her Master, she is certainly an extremely well built compact type of cellular container ship of the smaller type. Built in Spain and one of several of a similar class she carries some 440 containers and has two 36 ton deck cranes. Her crew accommodation is of a very high standard having a sauna room and gymnasium. A sistership the HALBERSTADT is due next month.

Hard Times For Singapore Firm

A well known worldwide name in marine salvage circles and oil supply vessels with a fleet of over 100 vessels is the Singapore based SELCO organisation which has regrettably suffered a financial collapse as a result of its Singapore parent company having acute cash problems. A rescue attempt is however underway and it is hoped that SELCO can be kept going by some means.

It is quite a number of years since one of their tugs was in Mombasa; their fleet includes several salvage tugs purchased secondhand from the United Towing Group, the Hull based towage and salvage company in the United Kingdom.

I was interested to read that the top ten flags flown by the world's major merchant fleets are in order of size: Liberian, Panamanian, Japanese, Greek, Russian, United States, Norway, China, United Kingdom and Italy.

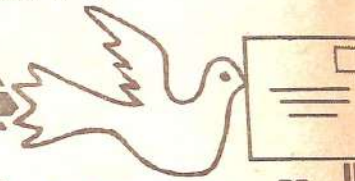

COUNCIL REPLY ON 'CROWS MENACE' ...

I REFER to a recent letter in *Coastweek*, by Oba Seneka, in which he stated that the Council "seems to have run out of firing power" in their efforts to control the House Crow in Mombasa.

Whilst it is true that no poisoning or shooting is at present being carried out, the Council has continued to apply control measures to these vermin.

The Council's Cleansing Department has done much to improve refuse disposal in various areas and has consequently reduced the availability of food for the crows.

In addition, on 18th October, 1985 a programme for the destruction of House Crow nests, eggs and chicks throughout the Mombasa Island, was launched.

The crow breeding season is from October to January and it has been the Council's aim to disrupt their breeding.

This involves the bringing down of nests by the use of long poles and some tree climbing.

The results to date are that from 1899 nests, 998 eggs and 500 chicks have been destroyed.

It is intended to continue this programme until the end of the current breeding season and in

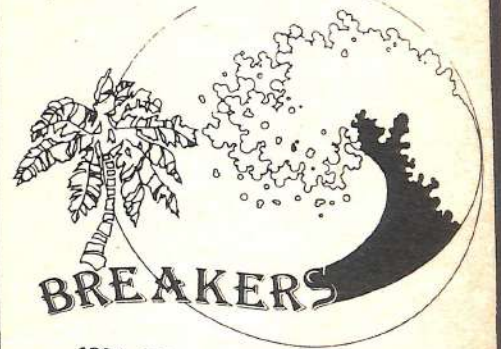

Continuing Chaos As Motorists Search For Precious Fuel Supply

WHILE some 65,000 tonnes of crude oil was brought into the country free from Iran some ten days ago, chaos still reigned at many city petrol stations this week as hundreds of motorists scrambled for petrol and diesel.

The main problem arose because a number of people having got fed up waiting for hours in long queues, chose to ignore these queues and instead crowded the fuel pumps asking the attendants to fill their jerry cans.

Some people took advantage of the situation by buying fuel and selling it at hiked prices to some cars at the back of the queue.

Indeed the refilling of vehicle fuel tanks with petrol from jerry cans has been a common sight in the city off late.

At some stations Police had to be called to put a stop to the pulling and pushing around the fuel pumps and only when armed Policemen arrived did some semblance of peace descend on the crowd.

Whilst the recent Iranian contingent was being refined by the Tanzania Italian Petroleum Refinery (TIPER), petrol stations were being given certain quotas which evidently did not prove sufficient for the high demand.

The fuel shortage also accounted for slow movement of coffee exports from the country.

The Tanzania Coffee Marketing Board (TCMB) which recently was allocated a further

13,000 bags by the International Coffee Organisation (ICO) is currently anxiously trying to meet the demand so as to earn the country much needed foreign exchange.

The Board is working round the clock to ferry coffee from producer regions to Tanga port for overseas shipment to ready buyers in Europe and Japan.

It is reported that some 74,000 bags worth some 296 million shillings in foreign exchange have already been exported.

COFFEE EXPORTS

This was part of the board's first export quota which ends this month. The balance of 120,000 bags of coffee under the first quota has to be shipped by the end of this month.

The board recently needed about 20,000 litres of fuel but only managed to get around 4500 litres to haul coffee from Moshi to Tanga port either by

trains or lorries. The board's manager commented recently that there is enough coffee in the country but the problem is that of haulage.

Meanwhile in a recent seminar held in Arusha, on trade liberalisation which was attended by marketing executives from local companies, a call was made to monitor the quality of goods being imported.

It was noted that the liberalisation policy could turn the country into a dumping ground for dangerous and inferior quality goods.

The executives also called on the government to permit importers to bring in raw materials so as to overcome input shortages in many local enterprises.

It was said that through such importations industries in the country could be revived to work to full capacity and provide jobs to the people.

To encourage exports, the participants appealed for an elimination of the existing bureaucratic procedures and stringent laws which hindered smooth operations in exporting goods.

The Government was also called to allow individuals to import items like tyres, gunny bags and fertilisers in order to enhance the agricultural sector.

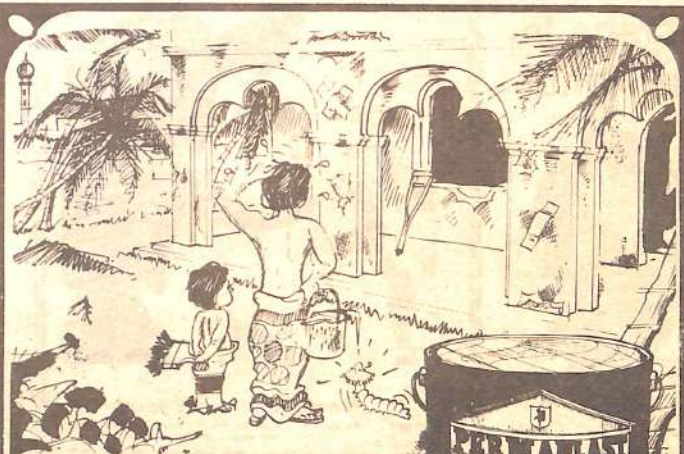

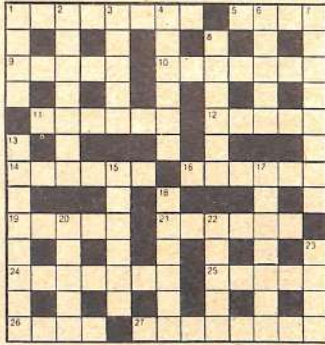

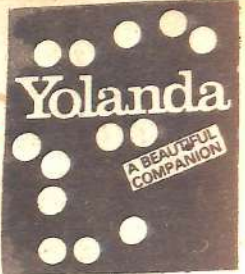
