Cataract is the opacity or cloudiness in the natural lens of the eye.

It is the leading cause of blindness worldwide. It is commonly known.

When the lens is partially immature cataract and some perform some routine



Naval Forces Quick To Destroy Somalia Suspect Pirate Boat

EU Naval Force flagship, ITS San Giusto has stopped and apprehended a Somali pirate skiff with with seven suspect pirates onboard.

The EU warship, that was carrying out counter-piracy patrols as part of Operation Atalanta, had sighted the skiff carrying a ladder and up to 20 fuel drums 180 miles east of Socotra and immediately launched its helicopter to investigate

Once at the scene, the boarding team from San Giusto boarded the vessel and apprehended the

Speaking about the successful capture of the skiff, Rear Admiral Potts, who is the Operation Commander of the EU Naval

"This was the first sighting of a suspect pirate vessel in the Somali Basin for over 3 months and EU Naval Force got to it before it had a chance of carrying out an attack on ships transiting the area

Rear Admiral Potts added

"We knew, as the monsoon period ended this month that pirates would try their luck at sea and this is why we have constantly warned against complacency."

"My message to the pirates is

clear - we are watching you and we plan to capture you if you put to sea

"Equally, this is an indication that pirates still intend to get out to sea and all involved in countering piracy, whether they are the military or industry must remain vigilant and prepared."

After gathering intelligence, the skiff was destroyed, thus preventing the suspect Somala pirates from using it to attack ships in the future.

GHANA HOLD ARGENTINA TALL SHIP UNDER ARREST

ARA Libertad (Q-2) is a tall ship which serves as a school ship held by a Ghanian court and was previously in the Argentine Navy. She was built in the 1950s at the Rio Santiago Shipyard near La Plata, Argentina. In October the vessel was seized in Ghana because of debts to NML Capital, a subsidiary of US hedge fund Elliott Management Corporation, one of Argentina's former creditors. Argentina's foreign ministry condemned the move as "a stunt" pulled by "vulture funds" which it claimed was in contravention of the Geneva Convention.






