## Mombasa Hospital Hosts Orthopaedic Symposium

## Healthy Eyes, Healthy Sight

REPORT BY MOMBASA EYE HOSPITAL & LASER CENTRE, NYALI MOMBASA

### What is cataract?

Cataract is the opacity or cloudiness in the natural lens of the eye.

It is the leading cause of blindness worldwide. It is commonly known.

When the lens is partially opaque, it is called an immature cataract and some light can pass through to help perform some routine functions.

However, when the opacity increases to engulf the entire lens, vision is totally cut off and the cataract is mature.

What are the problems associated with

Cataract?

Patients with cataract usually complain of blurred vision either at distance, near or both. Other common complaints include glare, halos and dimness of colour vision.

However, none of these symptoms are seen exclusively in cataract.

Initially, some help is achieved by changing the spectacle power, but in advanced cases, the spectacles also prove to be ineffective.

What are the causes of Cataract?

The causes of cataracts in adults are aging, sunlight exposure, smoking, poor nutrition, trauma, systemic diseases and medications like steroids.

What is the treatment for Cataract?

There are no medicines to treat cataract.

The answer lies only in surgery, wherein the cataract is removed and replaced by an intra-ocular lens.

What is Phaco technique?



Cataract surgery is typically performed using a procedure called Phaco-emulsification.

It is done through an incision from 1.2mm to 3mm in size.

Phaco needle is introduced through the opening and

harm to the eye.

What are the types of lenses implanted after cataract surgery?

Foldable lens: This lens can be folded and introduced into the eye by the injector through a 1.2 to 3mm incision, where it unfolds automatically to take its position.

The main advantage of this lens is that there is a fast visual recovery.

Non-foldable lens: This lens has a diameter of 5.2mm to 5.5mm. A 3mm incision has to be enlarged to 5.5mm to introduce this lens.

However the incision still remains self-sealing and requires no sutures.

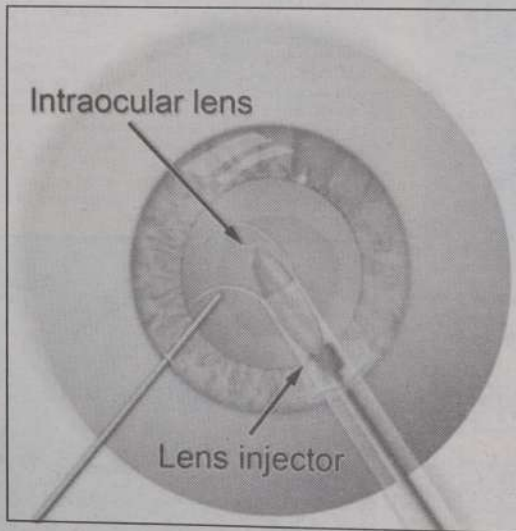

ultrasonic vibrations are used to break the cataract into smaller fragments which are sucked out through this needle.

An artificial lens called Intra-ocular lens is then inserted through this small opening with the help of the injector.

Does one have to wait for the cataract to mature for Phaco surgery?

No. It is easier and safer to operate on an immature cataract by Phaco.

As the cataract matures, it tends to become harder requiring more Phaco energy to do the same job.

The month long *Kenya Food Safari* at the *Hotel Nova Park* in Zurich, Switzerland jointly organised by *African Tours and Hotels, Balair*, and *Hotel Nova Park* was extended for one more week due to its success. The Food Festival, which saw Kenyan food, beers, coconut milk, Giriama dancers along with two cooks from *Mombasa Beach Hotel* flown to Zurich, was aimed at attracting potential holiday makers for the next season.

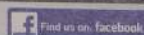

One has to fill in all the declaration papers, pay the requisite port charges, duties, taxes and commissions and then the goods are released after inspection by the relevant authorities to satisfy themselves that all is in order.

Whilst this process may sound very simple, it is actually complicated by the multiplicity of agencies that are generally required to clear imports.

At the last count it was possible that one could be required to have up to fifteen different agencies required to inspect a shipment before it is cleared from

the port of Mombasa.

The same also holds for the Dar es Salaam.

Getting a government officer to be on time is a challenge that is publicly known.

It would be a complete nightmare to try and get a multiple number to show up at one time to clear a consignment.

If therefore may take several days - and indeed maybe a week or more, to get one's cargo inspected and cleared.

Consider now the customer who is from a landlocked country and wishes to transit their goods to the inland destination.

They first have to clear the costs of handling at the port where the cargo landed and then pay the necessary bonds whether cash or paper before the cargo can be released for transit.

When the cargo arrives at the point of entry to the inland country, they then have to go through the full government inspection as if they had landed at the seaboard port.

If the papers are insufficient then they have to get back to the shipping companies and the senders in order to get the correct ones.

This can cause an even bigger delay than if the cargo were to

be cleared at the port of entry.

All these issues make waterborne clearing quite a headache and it is one of the things that really add to the cost of goods in our region.

For each day cargo is held up there are either demurrage charges, storage charges, interest on bonds, accrual of

implemented under the auspices of KenTrade.

This agency has been established to unify the work that is being done by the multi-plicity of agencies at the moment.

In a nutshell, the system will allow importers to lodge all their documentation in one place and the agencies involved will have to do their bit within an agreed time frame without waiting for the others.

This on line system should make monitoring of performance quite simple and will also reduce the opportunities for graft.

I do not believe it will fully eliminate it as we have seen cases where an officer demands a bribe in order to push the "send" button on the computer.

As for reducing the customs points, the heads of state from

the East African countries recently signed the agreement for the establishment of a single customs territory and agreed that it should be fast tracked.

This single event will revolutionise the issue of trade movement in the East African Community and have a very positive impact on the cost of living as well as the cost of doing business in the region.

For road users, it should ease the mechanics of travelling across the borders in the region and hopefully in the not too distant future, remove the necessity for paperwork when one crosses the border.

It should lead to paperless movement in the community. As Kachumbi says, we should all dream hard of the paperless community and it might just become a reality sooner than later.

## Naval Forces Quick To Destroy Somalia Suspect Pirate Boat

EU Naval Force flagship, ITS San Giusto has stopped and apprehended a Somali pirate skiff with seven suspect pirates onboard.

The EU warship, that was carrying out counter-piracy patrols as part of Operation Atalanta, had sighted the skiff carrying a ladder and up to 20 fuel drums 180 miles east of Socotra and immediately launched its helicopter to investigate.

Once at the scene, the boarding team from San Giusto boarded the vessel and apprehended the men.

Speaking about the successful capture of the skiff, Rear Admiral Potts, who is the Operation Commander of the EU Naval Force said:

"This was the first sighting of a suspect pirate vessel in the Somali Basin for over 3 months and EU Naval Force got to it before it had a chance of carrying out an attack on ships transiting the area.

Rear Admiral Potts added:

"We knew, as the monsoon period ended this month that pirates would try their luck at sea and this is why we have constantly warned against complacency.

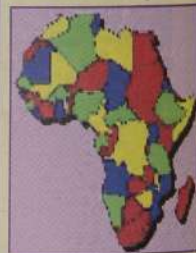
"My message to the pirates is

clear - we are watching you and we plan to capture you if you put to sea.

"Equally, this is an indication that pirates still intend to get out to sea and all involved in countering piracy, whether they are the military or industry must remain vigilant and prepared.

After gathering intelligence the skiff was destroyed, thus preventing the suspect Somalia pirates from using it to attack ships in the future.

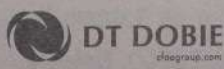

# Mashujaa Cup Battle

That's the good news for this region but another huge headline grabber was "tiny" Cape Verde qualifying for the first time, after shockingly dispatching Cameroon to the doldrums.

On Ethiopia's qualification to the AFCON finals, all the signs of good things about Ethiopian football had started showing in the last three years.

After many years of official infighting at the Ethiopian Football Association, normally returned in time for a brand new FA office to enter an Ethiopian team in the Cecaifa Challenge Cup in Tanzania in 2010.

British coach Irem "Ify" Onuora, took Ethiopia to the semi-finals of the Cecaifa Challenge Cup on his first attempt and although tenure in the team lasted only the 2010-2011 seasons.

The Glasgow born ex-Huddersfield player said his leaving Addis Ababa had

everything to do with FA shenanigans and neither his coaching neither abilities nor the quality of Ethiopian players.

Ethiopia beat Sudan 2-0 last Sunday in Addis Ababa levelling the tie on goals after they had lost 3-5 in a goal scoring thriller in Khartoum on the first leg.

The away goal rule favoured the Ethiopians to go through.

Onuora was elated at Ethiopian qualification for the AFCON finals for the first time since 1982.

Ethiopia won the Cup of Nations in 1962.

The other Cecaifa team campaigning on the final weekend was Uganda who was eliminated in a heart breaking

penalty shoot-out by African champions, Zambia in Kampala last Saturday.

Uganda had the match 1-0 after 90 minutes, levelling the similar first leg score for the Zambians in Ndola.

Uganda missed the 10th kick in sudden death penalties to break the deadlock.

The Confederation of African Football (Caf) on Tuesday revealed the seeding for the draw for the 2013 Africa Cup of Nations.

Cote d'Ivoire is among the top seeds, despite the abandonment of their second-leg tie with Senegal and no news of an official result from Caf.

The match has been organised by the Football Kenya Federation (FFK) national office between the National Division One Zone league leaders, Bandari FC and their zone 'B' leaders, Homeboyz.

The two teams are hotly expected to qualify for the Tusker Premier league next season.

Bandari FC Head Coach, Shauki Shedu said they will go out to win the match and return back to Mombasa with the Mashujaa trophy.

"We are going to win the cup because I know my team is better and in top form," said Shedu.

Meanwhile, Ethiopia will be the only East African country to qualify for the 2013 Africa Cup of Nations finals to be held in South Africa.

FFK South Coast Branch Secretary Evans Mwachia is demanding its respect from the national office in regard to football matches held within its area of jurisdiction.
