'Repairs Plan' For Mombasa Nairobi Road

MINIMUM SHS. 20 MILLION

A TEAM OF NORWEGIAN experts and engineers from the Ministry of Transport and Communications are meeting today in Mombasa to decide the fate of the portion of the Mombasa-Nairobi main road came the damaged portion of the Mombasa-Nairobi main road came to a halt in February last year due to lack of funds for the repairs which are estimated to cost Kshs. 20 million.

A spokesman for the Norvegian firm Norconsult confirmed in Nairobi statuties on the damaged area spanning 100 metres to establish the cause which led to the collapse of the huge section completed and a final report submitted to the Ministry of Transport and Communications.

which is expected to take six months to complete. Findings into the causes of the damaged road are said to be incomplete and further carried out during the reconstruction period to neutralise different factors which led to the damage.

It had been suggested that lack of proper drainage facilities in the area could have caused the road to collapse following the heavy rains in 1979/80.

Excavation work carried out at the site is reported to have found trapped water underneath which could have caused the surface to give in and sink.

TRANSPORT PROTEST

Local Ministry officials confirmed that further damage to the road has been caused to road during, last years rains, extending the cracked portion 50 metres further near the Mombasa-Nairobi railway line in Changamwe.

The Ministry of Transport and Communications has been under pressure from motorists and transporters to repair the section of the road which has remained closed for the last two years.


Hundreds Prepare For Tourist Bourse In West Germany

City Residents In Frantic Search As Water Supplies Run Dry ...

THIS WEEK. Dar Es Salaam Residents faced a chronic water shortage which has never manifested itself a accutely as over the three days it persisted. City residents, almost without exception, were all bucket-in-hand trooping to water taps that still trickled with some water and to water holes and accesible rivulets.

Others frantically looked for running water at isolated offices and residences with tanks while some hired vehicles to collect water from offices and houses with reservoirs.

The surply integration live water from the water from offices and houses with reservoirs.

The supply interruption also forced many restaurants and tea shops in the city to close down and also disrupted services at hospitals which had to use water prudently from their reservoirs.

Moreover a number of industries were forced to close down while others had to reduce their operations.

The cause of the problem was attributed to a power cut at the lower Ruvu water plant due to some power pylons being burnt as a result of a shortcircuit to an earth wire.

shortcircuit to an earth wire.

To assist in the city's recurring water supply problem, the Minister for Water and Energy, Almoor Kassum, said that Indian expertise will soon be brough into the country to study the poor water situation and will then advice on permanent solutions rather than the stop-gan measures that are operative. gap measures that are presently being taken

Kassum, who returned to Dar Es Salaam this week



from a seven week tour of France, Holland and India said that the Indian Government had already agreed to the proposals of sending the experts to Tanzania.

Philip Ochieng On The 'Freedom Of The Press'

LIKE other professions and occupations the journalists too have their association or their union.

This is the Kenyan Union of Journalists (KUJ) which is a body of about 200 members who are active as writers, broadcasters and photographers

Once every month members meet on the second Friday in order to be together at drinks and to dine at leisure. Later they listen to a talk of special interest to members.

He co-authored, together with Joseph Karimi, the amazingly successful book, after the emergence of the Nyayo erg. "The Kenyatta Succession".

Philip Ochieng is back in Nairobi to "explore possibilities" and, if he so decides, he may have to leave his job where he is employed by UNICEF in Geneva in their Information Department.



ADDIS ABABA TALKS ON THE MOMBASA-LAGOS HIGHWAY

THE fourth meeting of the Governing Council of the Lagos-Mombasa Highway Authority has been hosted at Africa Hall, headquarters of the Economic Commission for Africa (FCA)

The two-day meeting, which was attended by representatives from Cameroon, the Central

African Republic, Chad, Congo, Cabon, Guinea, Kenya, Rwanda, Sudan, Uganda and Zaire, discussed the report of the meeting of experts which met in early January 1984, and adopted resolutions on the pressing problems facing the activities of the Authority.

activities of the Authority.

The current chairman of the Council, Mr. Abel Aleir, the Minister of Construction and Public Works of Sudan, said in his opening statement that the financial problems of the highway programme were well-known to all members of the Authority and he expressed the hope that the meeting of the Council would adopt realistic resolutions with regard to the 1984 work programme of the Authority.

In his address, the ECA Transport, Communications and Tourism Division Director, Mr. Tohouta-Moussa, said the meeting would discuss the financial problems which the Lagos-Mombasa Authority secretariat had facing during the past two years and which stood in the way of the full implementation of the programme of work.

He disclosed that the staff

He disclosed that the staff of the secretariat of the Authority have not received their salaries

tor several months.

He added that such financial difficulties were being faced by several other African institutions because African countries have to pay contributions to the numerous organizations of which they are members and in some cases have failed to do so.

GOVERNING COUNCIL

The solution adopted by the Governing Council of the Cairo-Caberone Highway Authority, he noted, was to do away with the bureaucratic and administrative organs of the secretariat and maintain a technical unit only to implement the programme and thus enable the Authority to fulfil the same functions with less financial contributions from Member States.

This re-organization, Mr. Tchouta-Moussa said, would reduce the contributions of members by at least 80 per cent

Mr. Mwele Ounia Ikandanya, Director-Gereral of the Lagos-Mombasa Trans-African High-way Authority spoke in some detail about the financial difficulties of the Authority and said only 36 per cent of the 1983 budget had been paid by Member States, putting the programme of work in jeopardy. He told the Council these

He told the Council lasting solutions had to found to this problem.





TRYING to recover a big slump in its export earnings, the Akamba Handicraft Industry Cooperative Society Limited, Changamwe, is going all out to promote new and traditional markets more vigorously.

markets more vigorously.

In 1981 they exported woodcarvings value Shs. 460,028/Since then they have been
dropping - in 1982 to Shs.
220,280/-, and in 1983 to Shs.
178,000/- writes Neta Peal.

Its dynamic manager, Michael
Chesikaw, attributes the fall-off
in exports to 'fierce competition
from middlemen - including
those who come and buy
direct from our members.'

These 'middlemen' pay for

These 'middlemen' pay for what they buy immediately, whereas members have to wait until the end of the month for payment of their wood-cavings sold by the Co-op.

cavings sold by the Co-op.

During the 'high' season
average monthly earnings from
the co-op are Shs. 12001- while,
during the 'low' season they
drop to about Shs. 7001-. On
average they produce seven
woodcarving a day, and work
a seven day week.

a seven day week.

Eightyfive percent of the society's annual profits are distributed among them, while of the 15 per cent retained by the Co-op some goes towards payment of a 'small commision' to tour operators for sending tourists along to them.

Said Mr. Chesikaw 'from April 1, we shall be increasing this commission to compete more effectively with shops in the

It is understood that some co-op members, by dealing with

such middlemen, can earn more from them than from the

The big inducement being 'spot cash'.

On the other hand, it is pointed out, that if all their cavings were sold through the Co-op this would increase the dividend to members.

used to participate in Trade used to participate in Trade Fairs in Munich, Vancouver, Britain, Japan organised by the Kenya External Trade Authority (KETA) and the Kenya National Chamber of Commerce and Industry.

Kenya Craft Union

Then the Kenya Craft Union, of which the Akamba Handicraft Industry Co-operative Society is a member, started undertaking this promotion on their behalf.

It is asserted that the KCCU over-priced woodcarvings to such an extent that a good number of buyers went elsewhere for their requirements. Many old customers were lost, while potential ones were frightened away.

Helping in this export thrust is John Shepherd, from Milwaukee, USA, who graduated from the University of Vermont with a degree in Business Administration.

He has had considerable practical experience in business, and came to Kenya as a member

of the American Peace
Already the new spacious
showroom at Changamwe is
helping boost local trade. In
1981, 3.5 million carvings were
sold, which soared to 4.2
million in 1983.

The showroom, with Kamba style makuti roof, and nine-adjacent offices and export department cost Shs. 1.6 million to build. Former facilities were far too cramped, while woodcarvings could not be displayed to their best advantage.

Future plans include a restaurant and theatre, similar to the Bomas of Kenya, where Akamba traditional dancing rarely seen by local residents and tourists - will be performed over weekends.

The restaurant will be open dishes, including som of the favourite food of the Akamba, one being Muthokof, which are beans and maize smashed together with a cream sauce.

Tourist Attraction

The total cost, including furnishings and equipment, will be in the region of Shs. 2.5 million. Said Mr. Chesikaw 'we are presently trying to raise the money and, if successful, plan to start by the end of this year.'

If properly run, this could be a big tourist attraction at the Coast. Other plans include protecting the entrance and car park from rain and overmuch sun by having a makuti roof above.




