## Karim's Sporting Dynasty Captured On Big Screen!

THREE GENERATIONS, two sports, one family – that is what best describes the Karim family in Kenya.

The late Yusuf Karim, who was a world-class tennis champion for 25 years (1951-1977), represented Kenya at the Africa Games in 1974. He played cricket regularly for the Asians against the Europeans in the colonial days and was an active member at Jaffery Sports Club in Mombasa.

Yusuf's son Aasif started off as a tennis prodigy at a young

age representing Kenya against Egypt in the 1988 Davis Cup, but concentrated on cricket as a young man.

Selected for the national cricket team for 23 years, Aasif

captained the team in the 1999 World Cup in the UK.

Aasif's son Irfan is now a member of the national cricket

team having been a key player in the Kenya under 19 team.

Irfan is a student of Loughborough University where he is a member of the university cricket team and also appears for Bromley's Cricket Club.

All this history has now been captured in a colourful and vivid DVD, which has been written and directed by Indian film-maker Amit Tyagi (his last Kenyan venture was the local production film, Muigwithania).

Produced by Alpha Sports Limited, 'The Karims - A Sporting Dynasty' traces the story of this one family that has made remarkable contributions to the

Kenyan sporting circuit.

This documentary celebrates their achievements and contribution to sports and has made it for the nominations of screening at the Tiger Paw Sports Film Festival to be held for the first time in India from August 27th to 29th.

## Emirates Announce Its Fifth Route To Pakistan

Emirates, one of the world's fastest growing airlines, today announced it is to launch services to Sialkot, a fifth route to Pakistan.

The service will commence on 5th November 2013 with weekly flights operated by Airbus A330-200 aircraft in a two-class configuration - 54 seats in Business Class and 183 in Economy Class.

The aircraft can carry up to 17 tonnes of cargo, giving a boost to trade opportunities. Sialkot is the capital of Sialkot District based in the north-east of the Punjab province in Pakistan.

located around 125 kilometres north of Lahore, it provides exporters with a convenient alternative gateway to the Export Processing Zone of Pakistan - the area encompassing Gujrat, Sialkot and Gujranwala.

The area is famous for producing and exporting sports equipment and clothing, gloves, musical instruments, cutlery, umbrellas and leather garments. All imports to the region focus on the supply of raw materials for manufacturing those goods.

Pakistan was the first country on our route network when we launched services to Karachi in 1995, said Barry Brown, Senior Divisional Senior Vice President, Commercial Operations East.

With the addition of this fifth route the airline will operate flights a week between Dubai and Pakistan.

In nearly eight years since our launch, this new service to Pakistan continues to demonstrate strong ties between the two nations and reinforces Dubai

as a conveniently located hub for onward travel on Emirates' network of 134 destinations. Besides boosting global trade and economic opportunities, this new route will provide additional travel options to Pakistanis wanting to connect with friends, families and colleagues worldwide."

Sialkot International Airport, which opened in 2007, boasts the longest runway in Pakistan at 3,600 metres and was wholly funded by the Sialkot Chamber of Commerce.

"As the first privately funded airport in Pakistan, we welcome Emirates' decision to commence

operations to the city", said Sheikh Abdul Majid, President of the Sialkot Chamber of Commerce.

"Sialkot will be able to offer Emirates' passengers another point of entry into Pakistan in a modern, conveniently located and accessible airport."

Emirates flight EK620 will depart Dubai at 04:15 and arrive in Sialkot at 08:20 on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays and Sundays.

The return flight EK621 will leave Sialkot at 09:45, arriving in Dubai at 12:35. Sialkot is Emirates' fifth destination in Pakistan.

## Wildlife Agency Acquire More Land Leases For Elephants!

NAIROBI (Xinhua) — The African Wildlife Foundation (AWF) said Thursday it has secured more than 700 new land leases amounting to over 7,000 protected acres in the Amboseli ecosystem.

AWF Vice President for Conservation Strategy Kathleen Fitzgerald said the newly leased land will extend elephants' range between Amboseli in southern Kenya across the border to Mt. Kilimanjaro National Park in Tanzania.

"We have found that partnering with communities to find innovative solutions to securing critical wildlife habitats is the most effective way of conserving land and protecting wildlife while also benefiting people," Fitzgerald said in a statement released in Nairobi.

The conservation group had previously signed land-lease agreements with hundreds of landowners to the east of Amboseli National Park to ensure a protected wildlife corridor between Amboseli, Chyulu Hill National Park, and through to Tsavo East National Park.

The newly leased land, also known as Kitenden

Corridor, provides elephants with the space they need to freely and safely move out of the park as they follow rains and search for food.

"By extending the Kitenden Corridor, we aim to reduce conflict and provide both communities and elephants with a more peaceful existence," Fitzgerald said.

AWF launched the land lease program more than five years ago, and with these additional lands, AWF will have protected more than 25,000 acres in the Amboseli ecosystem.

The elephants frequently come into contact with farms and communities as they cross park boundaries, resulting in conflict. AWF has been working with the Maasai community at the Olgulului Group Ranch to set aside this land for wildlife, in exchange for a bi-annual lease payment from AWF.

Thus far, 533 landowners have signed agreements to lease 5,330 acres of land, and another 170 are set to sign their lease agreements by the end of the month for another 1,700 acres.

Experts predict current levels of poaching and human-wildlife conflict will lead to the near extinction of lions in 15 years and elephants in 20 years.

**MOMBASA (Xinhua) - Kenya Ports Authority has recorded a 13.2 per cent improvement of container off take at the port following stringent measures introduced by the government.**

Addressing the media at KPA headquarters in Mombasa Gichiri attributed the improvement to implementation of presidential directives that include streamline of all government departments at the port.

## Stock Exchange To Trade Kenya Mining Firms

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- The government plans to set up metals and minerals exchange or futures market for minerals,**

writes Christine Lagat.

Mining Cabinet Secretary Najib Balala has held a meeting with relevant government agencies to work out modalities of establishing the Minerals and Metals exchange.

"We can't have all the minerals and metals but we can lead the region in trade," Balala told journalists in Nairobi.

Efforts to establish a futures market is one of the highlights of the country's Mining Bill 2013 which classifies it as one of the country's flagship projects.

Among other measures, the cabinet seeks to empower the mining Secretary to promote minerals and establish a mineral commodity exchange.

Kenya is yet to fully tap the immense mineral wealth due to technical and financial bottlenecks.

Balala decried that poor infrastructure, inadequate capital and lack of geological data, shortage of manpower and poor marketing strategies have undermined the growth of mining sector.

**REGIONAL MINING HUB**  
Kenya intends to create a regional legal and policy environment to promote the mining sector.

Balala emphasized that the East African nation aims to become a mining hub in the region.

Kenya is endowed with a number of mineral resources that contribute significantly to the socio-economic development of the country.

Analysts say mineral industry in Kenya cannot therefore develop until laws are revised and the government can guarantee secure title of minerals and the required surface rights.

Balala said a team has been formed under the chairmanship of Peter Mwangi, CEO of Nairobi Stock Exchange to work around the issue, research and advise the cabinet secretary on how

mining companies can be encouraged to list in the stock Exchange. Balala said the ministry intends to create an industry around mining and the establishment of the minerals and metals exchange is just one of the many ways to achieve this.

Other ways include undertaking of a nationwide airborne geophysical survey to establish

the country's mineral worth, establishment of the National Mining Corporation as an investment arm of the government, Establishing a state of the art mineral certification laboratory, establishing mineral processing and value addition clusters with gold refinery, iron and steel plants glass manufacturing industry, gemstone cutting centers and building materials

factories for cheaper housing.

"It is evident that Kenya is endowed with a variety of mineral resources which are capable of contributing significantly to socio-economic development."

The recent move to revoke about 43 prospecting, mining and exploration licenses was meant to pave way for a more clearer and transparent way of licensing in the sector.

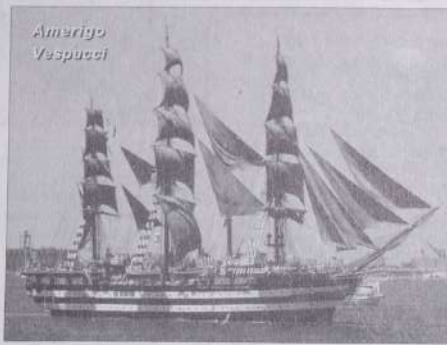

## Current Devolution Game Here Is Representation Of The Power Or Status Of The County Governor

The next piece in the devolution puzzle is the relationship between the Governor and the senator as well as these two and the Executive and National Parliament.

The Senate and Governors are at the heart of the devolution process.

The changes in the Executive are profound in that the people who are selected are no longer Members of Parliament.

They are independent of Parliament but answerable to parliament for what they do.

In the case of counties, the process is the same.

There is an elected County Assembly which in reality is like the county parliament.

The Governor also picks his executives who are the equivalent in the county scene to the Cabinet Secretaries.

They also have to go through a similar vetting process to that of the Cabinet Secretaries.

The relationship between the County Assembly and the County Executives is exactly the same as that at the national level.

In effect, the Governor is like the President of the county.

This has caused teething problems which will have to be solved.

The manifestation of the issues here is the proliferation of state like lecterns which will be feared everywhere the governors are invited to speak.

There is also the small issue of what kind of flag the Governor is supposed to fly.

Current currency is that they will fly the national flag on their

independence from the national government, they should morph into different animals and show that in their own unique way.

Counties should have their own flags and coats of arms that will differentiate them from each other as well as from the central government.

Governors should use whatever lectern they are given except obviously in the county assembly where they will be invited to attend and use whatever furniture is available there.

The cost of having to transport a lectern (and presume red carpets, special chairs, official county portable toilets and the like) is one that the nascent county governments can ill afford.

Looking at the county budgets, all have been based on "meeting the expected" standards of decorum and reward - similar to the national budget.

### PARLIAMENTARIANS

The clamour by the parliamentarians for higher wages and allowances has percolated very quickly to the county officials - even knowing that these structures are brand new.

We all think that devolution will be done and dusted in a few months and that the new institutions will be up and running

and deliver services in the few months.

This is a serious myth. The haggling around power budgets, trappings and resources in general will not end soon.

The reality of the bleak situation that counties will find themselves in will begin to sink in.

The promises made during campaigns will sadly be unfulfilled as quickly as wananachi would have hoped for.

We should resign ourselves to the fact that counties governments are a new structure though they are successors to the former City, Municipal, Town and County Councils in whatever combination they existed.

They will have to define what they are in real life rather than what they were defined as on paper.

They will have to find ways of making money and spending the same.

They will have to structure how they relate to their citizens and citizens of other counties as well as the other arms of government.

These realignments and definitions will take a long time and some of the inaugural players may be long gone before the steady state is achieved.

As Kachumbari says, the future of Counties is not soon.

## KWS Position On Maasai Mara National Reserve

Kenya Wildlife Service (KWS) wishes to correct a misrepresentation of facts regarding its interests in the Maasai Mara as carried in sections of media, writes KWS spokesman Paul Udoto.

KWS management is not interested in taking up the management of the Maasai Mara National Reserve and all we are calling for is sustainable utilization of wildlife resources in the ecosystem.

As a State agency responsible for all wildlife in the country we will consult and provide all necessary support to the County Government of Narok.

We have initiated consultations not just with the County Government of Narok but many others across the country including Nakuru, Tana River, Kwale, Taita Taveta and will reach out to more with a view to securing our wildlife in national interest.

It should be noted that KWS is mandated through Wildlife Conservation and Management Act (CAP 376) of 1989 the authority to manage all National parks and Reserves in the

country. Consequently, KWS manages approximately eight per cent of the total landmass of Kenya that consists of 22 national parks, four national sanctuaries including six marine national reserves and four marine national parks.

KWS also manages some National reserves under an MOU.

There are also 125 field stations scattered across the country for management of wildlife outside the protected area system.

It cannot be gain said that KWS has invested heavily in the management of the Mara ecosystem to sustain the integrity of biodiversity.

We run a research facility inside the reserve and we are involved in conducting research and long time monitoring programs in the Mara ecosystem.

We have overtime carried out total aerial census for wildlife populations, sample wildlife counts, biomass assessments and offered veterinary services.

Furthermore, wildlife security as envisaged in law is jointly carried out by KWS to offer reinforcement to fight poaching gangs including intelligence gathering on local cross border gangs. KWS has been in the fore front in securing visitors both on transit into Mara or within Mara.

We have single handedly attended all problem animal incidents to mitigate human wildlife conflicts in the area.

We are currently engaged in delivering three schools constructed by KWS namely Katakala (Ksh.3 Million), Enoompabari (Ksh.3.4 Million) and Olkeri (Ksh.2.4 Million) as part of our corporate social responsibility.

KWS is the lead agency in the joint enforce on the Mau Forests Complex restoration.

Large tracts of Mau forest is now being rehabilitated through collaboration of other agencies such as Kenya Forest Service, Narok County Council (now County government) and Administration police (Kenya Police Service).

# HNLMS Johan De Witt Joins EU Naval Force Operation Atalanta

The Dutch Landing Platform Dock *HNLMS Johan de Witt* has joined the EU Naval Force (EU NAVFOR) Somalia - Operation 'Atalanta' anti-piracy patrol.

For the next four months, *Johan de Witt* will be the EU Naval Force flagship, hosting the Force Commander, Commodore Peter Lenselink, and his multinational staff on board.

*HNLMS Johan de Witt* is a Landing Platform Dock, 176.5 metres in length and 16,948 tonnes displacement.

She can accommodate up to 600 persons and has many different assets, teams and capabilities on board, such as an enhanced medical facility, with a fully equipped operating room and a special medical team.

Two Cougar helicopters are embarked, a Landing Craft Task Element and a Scan Eagle UAV, an unmanned aircraft.

The warship also has a team from Belgium on board who operate a specialized boarding craft known as a Fast Raiding Interception and Special Forces Craft (FRISC) and a Maltese Special Duties Enhanced Boarding Team (MSDEBT), who are trained to execute maritime

awareness and security operations and are able to board ships when necessary. This is not the first time that the Dutch warship has been part of the EU Naval Force, having also participated in the April 2010 mission.

Talking about his ship and crew, the Commanding Officer of *Johan De Witt*, Captain Frank Foreman Royal Netherlands Navy, said:

"The men and women on board *Johan de Witt* are ready in all

respects to conduct this important operation, including the deterrence, prevention and repression of piracy, and our national contribution to help bring stability and security worldwide.

"We have a multinational crew, including a Belgium FRISC team and a Maltese team capable of performing maritime situational awareness operations, among other things.

"As well as naval teams, we also have personnel from the Air

force and Army, who work side by side on a daily basis. We look forward to the coming months and the many challenges that we will undoubtedly face to help strengthen stability and security."

Before joining EU Naval Force, *HNLMS Johan de Witt* conducted an intensive programme of training, including Operational Sea Training (OST) in Plymouth, United Kingdom and specific training for counter piracy operations in The Netherlands

## WARSHIP RESCUES STRANDED SAILORS

A Combined Maritime Forces (CMF) warship has rescued a group of sailors left adrift for five days in the Gulf of Aden.

The South Korean destroyer *ROKS Wang Geon* picked up the mariners near a busy shipping lane after their vessel caught fire and sank.

*Wang Geon* was on patrol as part of Combined Task Force (CTF) 151, CMF's anti-piracy operation, when she spotted a bright orange life raft drifting in the water.

Launching her sea boat despite rough seas, *Wang Geon's* highly trained boarding team recovered the crew from the life raft before returning them safely to the ship, where they immediately received first aid, medical care, food and berthing.

The sailors (eight Indian, two Yemeni, one Nepalese) were the crew of the *MV Al Saeed*

2, which was carrying livestock between Somalia and Yemen when it suffered a catastrophic engine fire.

They had gone for five days without even a bottle of water between them, and were close to dehydration.

The crew have since been safely turned over to the Yemeni Coast Guard.

*Al Saeed 2's* captain, Akbar Abbas Chamadiya, said: "We had almost given up hope before the Korean warship came to save our lives. Our deepest gratitude goes to Captain Han Young-Hee and his crew for rescuing us and providing us with care."

*Wang Geon* has returned to her patrol, monitoring international waters in the Gulf of Aden and Northern Indian Ocean for pirate activity and ensuring maritime security in the high-risk waters off the Horn of Africa.

# Former Slovak Foreign Minister Dr. Eduard Kukan Enjoys Holiday in Kenya

Every VIP guest from Slovakia has taken his family and their four grandchildren on a trip of a lifetime to Kenya.

Dr. Eduard Kukan, currently a Member of the European Parliament (MEP), since his arrival on August 10 for his family's stay at the Leopard Beach Resort and Spa.

He is the former longest serving Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Slovak Republic 1998-2006 he was appointed in 2000 for the appointment of Chris Modigell as Hon. Consul for the Republic of Slovakia in Kenya which hosts the Consulate of Slovakia for over 12 years.

As Minister of Foreign Affairs he was responsible for all international successes of Slovakia: EU, NATO.

In March 2004 he was almost elected President.

He had also been the Director of the African Department at the Czechoslovak MFA.

He speaks fluent Swahili and he was one of the senior international election observer during Kenya's last elections.

At the age 73 years he is in a very good shape to take his family on a spectacular migration safari to the Masai Mara for the migration.

Here they stayed at the Mara Sarova Camp before flying with Blue Sky to Diani for the stopover on one of the world's most famous beaches.

Their second safari leg will take them with Southern Cross Safaris for two nights to the Satao Camp in Tsavo East ending their trip on the foothills of Mt. Kilimanjaro at the Satao Eleral.

This is a private conservation area which sits in the critical wildlife corridor that links the Kilimanjaro Forest Reserve in Tanzania to the Amboseli National Park and beyond.

They will also visit the Satao

Eleral Community and Wildlife trust with a new school project partly funded by a small grant made available by the Slovak aid from a small country with a big heart in the center of Europe.

## Government Forming Special Crack-Unit To Curb Poaching

The Kenyan Government has formed a special inter-agency crack-unit to combat poaching in the country.

The anti-poaching unit named the Elite Inter-Agency Anti-Poaching Unit comprises of security officers from the Kenya Wildlife Service (KWS), the Administration Police (AP) and the General Service Unit (GSU).

The special unit, which shall be under the command of KWS, will undergo a joint training at the KWS Law Enforcement Academy (LEA) at Manyani before deployment to poaching hotspot areas of Narok, Tsavo and Isiolo.

In a speech read on her behalf by the Principal Secretary for Environment, Water and Natural Resources Dr. Richard Lesyampe, during the unveiling of the unit, the Cabinet Secretary Prof. Judi Wakhungu said that the Government has now taken the fight against poaching a notch higher.

Urgent and decisive action now needs to be taken to eliminate the escalating poaching crisis which has now become both a national and economic issue', Prof. Wakhungu said.

The Cabinet Secretary added that the Government has committed to provide facilitation and equipment to support the Elite Inter-Agency Anti-Poaching Unit operations.

The Government shall also deploy aerial surveillance support to enhance their capacity to deal with poaching incidents.

Already the Government has established an Inter-Agency Task Force to advise and coordinate wildlife security management interventions across the country.

While flagging off the Elite unit, Dr. Lesyampe said that the fight against poaching was no longer a KWS affair and appealed to every Kenyan to help the Government curb the menace.

The message we are now sending out is that poaching has come to a stop', the Principal Secretary reiterated.

The unit will be supported by the governments of Kenya, the United States, China and the United Kingdom through their respective embassies in Nairobi.

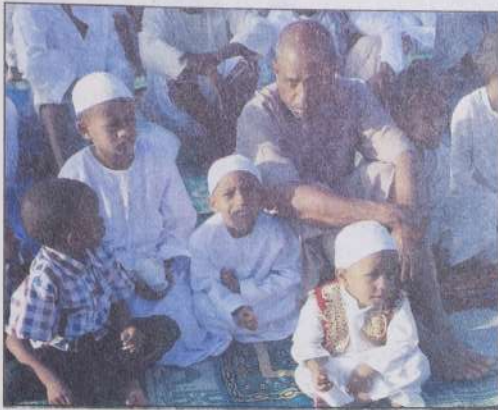

His forced lead of the Suit promoted Declarer's King and the game was made. Brilliant play.

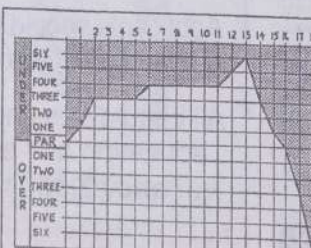
