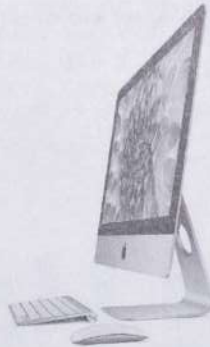

# Kwale County Health Workers Gain IT Skills

Friday 13<sup>th</sup> was a very inspiring and successful day for community health workers from 3 nutrition centers in Kwale region, coordinated by a team of field workers from Trnava University, reports FZASP TRUNU.

After a 3-month course, called "Computer basics" CHWs learned new IT skills and received certificates that can help them in the future. In May 2013, a very

experienced and skill-full programmer, ICT trainer and photographer from Slovakia Paul Markovic, decided to spend five months in Kenya as a development volunteer.

His task (as a part of project of Trnava University, Slovakia) was to increase computer literacy among the local people from the coast of Kenya - through ICT lectures and IT workshops.

For Community health workers (CHWs) who have never handled a computer it was a huge challenge - to learn computer

basics in just 3 months. CHWs had to practise learned skills and knowledge at work - in nutrition centers in Kwale district, established by Trnava University thanks to development project, financed by Slovak Aid.

IT expert: Paul Markovic was teaching 3 groups of people (between the age of 30 to 50 years old - from Kwale, Tiwi and Mkonjani) how to work with MS Office/OpenOffice.

He also provided them with information about new media, mass-media communication,

security and data protection on the Internet.

The local community lacked such skills. But in early September these trained and motivated community health workers were able to find the word 'malnutrition' in Google, they created e-mail addresses for their nutrition centers and sent their first messages.

On 13 September, twelve most successful CHWs who have completed all seven modules of computer course, received IT certificates.

During the graduation ceremony in Kwale health resource center: Slovak field workers Dr. Bozena Baluchova and Mr. Michal Miadok, project manager Dr. Juraj Jancovic and

IT trainer itself Paul Markovic wished them good luck and success in their future work.

Mr. Paul Markovic explained - why it is important to train local Kenyan people to operate the computer:

"Work with computers is now one of the most required skills on labour-market (also in Africa).

"So there is no doubt that my students with IT skills and certificates will have an advantage in the future."

Project manager Dr. Jancovic from Trnava University added: "It will be also very helpful for existing Slovak-Kenyan project, called 'Social and health care for malnourished children under 5 years and their mothers in the Kwale region'.

"One of the project's goals was focused on the collection, digitalization and evaluation of data on malnutrition topic in the coastal area.

"Our CHWs already know how to transfer the data from paper version of Data entry forms into electronic forms.

"This is important for future cooperation and new development projects of Slovakia in Kenya..."

After the Slovak team of field workers from Trnava University return back home, CHWs would be able to work on data collection on nutrition and malnutrition topic - so the communication and cooperation between local partner: Kwale district hospital and Trnava University will continue.

This is an annual event that has been taking place for the last 13 years and the club has been in the forefront in helping the less fortunate members of the society.

Mariakani (which is part of Kilifi district) and its nearby environment poses its residents to a lot of hardships including lack of basic amenities like food, shelter and housing. Healthcare facilities are limited.

Most of the population have to travel far to get access to basic healthcare facilities. Hence, our club has taken up this medical camp as an annual event.

This year's medical camp was the busiest and most successful.

A lot of awareness was created beforehand within the population of that area of the services that were going to be offered.

By 8am in the morning, a lot of patients had arrived as evidenced by the already long queues which were there at the registration desk.

The services offered at the camp this year consisted of many

different disciplines including Eye (which is part of the Outreach programme carried out by Lions Club of Mombasa Pwani), Dental, ENT and General Medical camp.

An added service introduced this year was the provision of ultrasound facilities for those patients that required scans for various ailments. Blood sugar and diabetes screening was also done. All the patients were also given medications free of cost.

A total of 1506 patients were screened in different disciplines:-

There were 568 eye patients screened. Out of these, 41 patients were found with cataracts.

These patients were immediately transported at the end of the camp to the Lions Eye and Blood Centre where they were operated on, accommodated and provided food, given medicines and later transported back to their homes with all these costs catered for by Lions Club of Mombasa Pwani.

124 Dental patients were screened and 80 tooth extractions were carried out.

715 general patients were seen and given treatment.

The 5 most common ailments that were found were Upper respiratory tract infections, Anemia, Skin infections, Malaria and Hypertension.

The rest of the patients were treated for other ailments like Worm infestations, Peptic ulcer disease and Malnutrition in Children. 130 ENT patients were screened and treated.

69 patients were screened for Diabetes and Blood Sugar.

20 ultrasound scans were done and this included patients with abdominal complaints and pregnant mothers.

This service was introduced for the first time this year.

Many of the patients had multiple ailments and the total number of consultations was far above the number of patients screened.

The Medical/Camp Convener, Lion (Dr) Sundeep Chavda expressed his sincere gratitude to all donors, fellow Lions, Lion ladies and the volunteers who contributed towards this successful activity.

# We Should Have A Ban On Imports Of Any Car Older Than Six Years?

In the second part of our series on how to reduce road carnage in Kenya, we cover the area of transport resources and by this we mean, the modes of transport as well as the infrastructure that is available.

The first thing that we must legislate is what is considered a legitimate means of transport or conveyance and these should all be recognised under the law.

This means that if it can use any public area considered to be a road or path then we must have legislation that makes it a legally acceptable means of conveyance.

The items must start from simple things like bicycles, perambulators, motorcycles and mkokotenis.

We must prescribe what is acceptable and what is not acceptable from a technical point of view.

There should be a prescription on what minimum maintenance is required especially in safety critical items.

This may seem to be going over the top but it is necessary to start at this level and with excessive detail to boot, if we are to make a long lasting change in the mental model Kenyans have around their resources.

When we come to motorised transport resources then we must revisit the issue of age and agree at what age we will start major inspections and certification of the transport resources as being fit for purpose.

Many countries make it mandatory for vehicles that are more than three years old to have annual checks and recertification for roadworthiness.

In Kenya we only do that for commercial vehicles including public transport vehicles.

These checks are mandatory by law and are required annually throughout the life of the vehicle.

Most checks carried out on vehicles after accidents reveal they have the certificates but that the vehicle is however defective.

It is common knowledge that a large number of commercial vehicles on Kenyan roads are actually unroadworthy though they carry a valid inspection certificate which effectively defines them as roadworthy.

The main cause of this is common knowledge - money changes hands.

People acquire the certificates by bribing the police officers and inspectors who are involved in the inspection process.

Some operators even go as far as not even bothering to get certificates, they just bribe the police and enforcement officers on the route that their vehicles ply so that they turn a blind eye to their non-compliance.

There has to be a change in the way we inspect and license vehicles so that any vehicle having a roadworthiness certificate is actually roadworthy.

The suggestion we have - and which has been made in this column before - is that the activities of vehicle inspection should be decentralised and privatised.

The law should be changed so that inspection is carried out at approved garages and by approved persons.

The government should become a licensing agency such garages and persons.

An audit agency should be instituted also within the government whose role will be to carry out compliance and quality checks on the private and public inspection agencies and persons.

Where agencies or persons are found to practice without proper certification, very punitive measures should be put in place to discourage unofficial agencies operating

that are inspected increases and also the number of "must replace" safety critical items should also increase so that despite the age of a vehicle, one can ride sure that the vehicle is mechanically sound to operate and that the only idiot is likely to be the one behind the wheel.

This escalation of replacements and should we say also cost of inspection, should make it punitive to make a car roadworthy after say ten years.

It is this latter fact that makes mtumba cars cheap and thus attractive to Kenyans.

The cost of keeping a car on the road after five years in most of our traditional sources for second hand vehicles, Japan included, is prohibitive.

Owners prefer to get rid of them at a throwaway price and buy a new vehicle.

It is these rejected cars that are then minimally refurbished to meet our lax requirements and then exported for Kenyans and indeed our fellow East Africans to buy.

If we look carefully it is these same cars that feature prominently when road accident fatalities feature.

Any attempt to tighten these restrictions meets with howls of protests about disenfranchising wananchi from cheap and affordable imports.

Cheap yes but affordable? Are we saying that as a

country we can push this affordability at the cost of losing lives?

This is not acceptable in our view and we must balance need and greed.

We should have a ban on imports of cars older than six years.

My considered view is that we should privatise licensing inspections immediately and have them available in all county headquarters as a start.

They can be further devolved, as the vehicle population justifies.

Certification of vehicles should start after three years for new vehicles and immediately for any second hand car irrespective of age.

We should ban the importation of cars older than six years.

For those who insist on keeping cars for long, they would be a special licensing category for vehicles older than ten years.

We should also license and register all forms of transport types including BICYCLES an subject them also to minimum requirements.

In this way we can be sure the pool of transport resources and especially the motorised type meet minimum standard and especially in respect of safety ones.

As Kachumbari says, let us start by getting the hardware right.

When a vehicle is found to be defective after a license has been issued then the owner of the vehicle should be subjected to a fine or imprisonment which should increase in severity the more non-compliances are recorded per inspection of their fleet or if they are regular offenders.

All vehicles should have an inspection certificate when they are first registered as brand new vehicles.

Such vehicles should have a period of three years before they become due for annual inspections.

After that the number of items

## MARA CHEETAH RESCUE

Having the title of fastest land mammal on the planet, the cheetah is also undoubtedly the most graceful and fragile of all our Savannah big cats.

With only a hundred odd so individuals left in the wild, the cheetahs existence in Kenya is literally hanging by a whisker.

Although there are many human and natural contributors leading to the loss of our beautiful cheetahs, presently the major threat to them is a disease known as Mange.

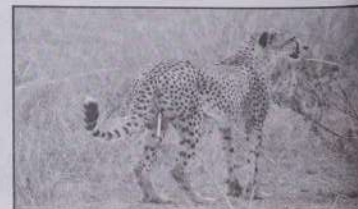
The disease by the Sarcoptes mange mite is a contagious skin disease that is spread to the cheetah when they come into contact with other infected animals, such as prey or even carcasses of domestic or other wild animals.

The mites from an infected animals simply and easily transfer themselves to the new host with the results potentially reaching epidemic proportions.

An untreated animal faces certain death from the effects of the disease.

KWS Honorary Game Warden and Wildlife Photographer, Shazaad Kasmani, who was recently in the Maasai Mara shares photographs of a treatment operation and reports on the survival of Kenya's last Cheetahs.

The animals only real hope is early detection and treatment by veterinarians with a dose of injectable ivermectin medication.



A few seconds after receiving treatment, the dart falls off and the cheetah carries on with its daily life as per normal.

Commodore Jeremy Blunden Royal Navy, Commander of Combined Task Force 151, and Commodore Henning Amundsen Norwegian Navy, Commander NATO Task Force 508, share a common goal of deterring and disrupting piracy in and around some of the world's most dangerous shipping regions.

During the meeting the two Commanders reviewed the current piracy situation and discussed ways in which the two Task Forces can continue to support and coordinate with each other.

Commodore Blunden said: "It is important that the Task Forces meet regularly to ensure we continue to work together effectively to share information, coordinate our movements and tactics and to keep the pressure on those thinking of resuming piracy.

"While reported acts of piracy have diminished significantly in recent months, it is certainly not yet defeated and we must remain on our guard."

Piracy in the Gulf of Aden and Somali Basin reached its peak between 2010 and 2011 when 72

vessels and over 1400 hostages were taken. Pirate attacks declined significantly in 2012 thanks to the international military efforts and measures adopted by the merchant community.

Commodore Amundsen said: "Our joint efforts provide a significant contribution

to the safety of merchant ships passing through the Gulf of Aden and the Indian Ocean.

piracy. "To achieve this, it is of the utmost importance to enhance the cooperation between the forces present in the area."

Lieutenant Commander Stephane Guillon French Navy from Brest, France who works for the Royal Navy's Maritime Battle Staff in Portsmouth and is currently seconded to the international staff on CTF 151 said:

"NATO and CMF share the same objectives and together we can coordinate assets to protect the merchant community and deter pirates from their illegal activity."

CTF 151 is responsible for deterring and disrupting piracy and helping to build regional capacity in a huge area covering 2.5 million square miles.

## MULTINATIONAL

The Task Force is part of the Combined Maritime Forces (CMF), a professional, multinational naval partnership comprising 29 nations, who focus on maritime security operations and work together to deny the use of the seas for piracy or other illegal activity.

CTF 508 conducts counter-piracy in a similar area and is part of NATO's Operation Ocean Shield, which was established in August 2009.

HNoMS Fridtjof Nansen is the current flagship for the Task Force.

## Italian ENI Discover Gas In Mozambique

MAPUTO (Xinhua) -- Italian company ENI has announced the discovery of a new gas deposit off the Rovuma river basin, in the northern Mozambican province of Cabo Delgado.

The Mozambique News Agency (AIM) said that preliminary results showed that the new deposit in Area 4 contains between 5 trillion cubic feet and 7 trillion cubic feet of the natural gas, following the digging of an offshore well named "Agulha," meaning needle.

Citing a statement from the Mozambican National Petrol Institute (INP), the agency said that ENI and its partners are evaluating the new discovery and designing the strategy for exploration. The 6,203 meter deep well, Agulha, is the 10th well dug in deep water in the Area 4 off the Rovuma river basin, about 80 km off the coast to the Indian Ocean.

The concessionaires of the Area 4 of the Rovuma river basin are led by ENI East Africa with 70 percent of shares.

Last week, the Mozambican government earned 400 million U.S. dollars in tax from the sale of more than 20 percent of shares to the China National Petroleum Corporation.

## Port Traffic Records Slight Decline

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Port of Mombasa handled 10.5 million tonnes of cargo in the first six months of 2013, a slight decline from 10.6 million tonnes in the same period of 2012, officials have said.

"This decline was caused by a slowdown of activities as a result of the political anxiety brought about by the 2013 presidential elections," Kenya Ports Authority (KPA) Managing Director Gichiri Nduia said during the annual KPA stake holder's forum.

The event brought over 100 experts to review ways of expanding port capacity.

KPA said that in 2012, the Mombasa port handled 21.9

million tonnes of cargo against the 19.9 million tonnes handled in 2011.

"Container traffic expanded by 17.2 per cent as it increased from 770,000 (Twenty Foot Equivalent Containers) TEUs in 2011 to 903,463 TEUs in 2012," he said.

KPA said that in 2012 imported traffic grew to 18.7 million tonnes, compared to 16.9 million tonnes recorded in 2011 which is a 10 per cent increase.

Nduia said that Uganda remains the dominant transit destination for the port of Mombasa as it accounted for 73.1 per cent of the market share in 2012.

"South Sudan took the second place with 11.6 per cent, while the Democratic Republic of Congo was third with 7.3 per cent in the same period"

The KPA chief noted that Rwanda, Tanzania and Burundi contributed to 3.9 per cent, 2.8 per cent and 0.6 per cent of the market share, respectively, in 2012.

Transport Cabinet Secretary Michael Kamau said that the government has recognized that transport and infrastructure is key to growing the economy.

## INFRASTRUCTURE

He added that the National Transport and Infrastructure Policy is currently being implemented so as to modernize Kenya's road and rail network.

"We are also working with the rest of the East African Community in order to integrate transport infrastructure," Kamau said.

"This will facilitate the smooth

flow of people and goods in economic bloc," he said. Kamau said that Kenya will continue to expand port capacity so facilitate trade with its landlocked neighbors.

He added that due to record capacity expansion, the port of Mombasa was for the first time ranked among the 120 largest ports of the world.

The cabinet secretary said the second terminal contains the port of Mombasa should be completed by the end of 2013.

Kamau said Kenya is in process of implementing the East Africa Vehicle Load Capacity Bill 2013 which proposes a maximum weight of 56 tonnes on a seven axle truck.

## Zanzibar Deny Connection With Impounded Ship

ZANZIBAR, Tanzania (Xinhua) -- The government of Zanzibar said on Tuesday that it has nothing to do with a ship which was impounded in Italy last Sunday with 30 tonnes of illicit drug hashish, although the ship has been registered in Zanzibar.

"Ship registration could be carried out in any country according to international law, but the country can not be involved in any incident such as it happened to the ship of the Gold Star Company," Zanzibar Minister of Finance Omar Yusuf Mzee said at a press conference.

He said the Zanzibar's government has received the information of the incident and investigation is going on to acknowledge all those connected with the affair.

Abdi Maalim, Zanzibar Director of Marine Transport Authority, said the ship which is owned by Gold Star Shipping Company

was registered by its chief registration officer based in Dubai in 2011.

All ship staff have been ar-

rested and are now under interrogation to know who exactly is connected with the 30 tonnes of illicit drug, he said.

## Japanese Vessel Detained For Illegal Fishing

CAPE TOWN (Xinhua) -- Japanese vessel has been arrested for allegedly fishing illegally in South African waters.

The Japanese-registered long-line vessel Koei Maru No. 88 had been arrested for a variety of alleged transgressions near the Allwal Shoal Marine Protected Area off Durban in Eastern South Africa, according to the Department of Fisheries in Cape Town.

The ship's owner had paid 2 million rands (about 200,000 U.S. dollars) as "security" for the release of the vessel, department officials said. Officials were investigating a variety of marine-related transgressions and court proceedings would follow, according to the Durban-based Mercury newspaper.

The first phase involves construction of initial three berths scheduled for completion in 2016.

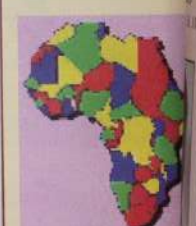
The new berths will have an additional capacity of 450,000 TEUs, with two further expansion phases running through to 2020.

The Shipping Magazine also reported on the port's investment in new and modern cargo handling equipment which has greatly improved efficiency.

The equipment include ship to shore gantry cranes terminal tractors and reach stackers.

With the developments and progressive developments it is envisaged that, the port of Mombasa will reach greater heights.

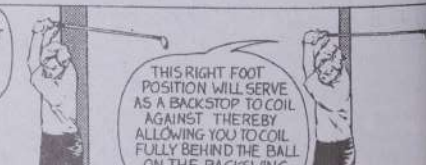

In places where AccessKenya has existing infrastructure on fibre-optics or by wireless, it provides the connectivity through its own network.

Where that is not the case, then they deploy a VSAT (very small aperture terminal) as a ground station through one of its partners.

This is particularly useful in the remote areas visited by the rally such as in the Amboseli National Park.

They also supply the connectivity in Tanzania.

To ensure that the connectivity is up and running and working at all times, AccessKenya provides a technical person who travels around on the event and is available 24/7.

As Kenya's leading Corporate Internet Provider, this provisioning of service to the East African Safari Classic is very much the same as the requirements from their 6,000 plus corporate customers - reliability and uptime are of the essence - and the rally is no

exception, except of course that many of its locations are in the middle of nowhere!

During the rally, Jonathan Somen will have other things on his mind.

the Kenyan National Rally Championship round in July, the KCB Safari, when the result of poor pace note saw the Escort go into a ditch before leaping on and twice clouting a bank on the other side of the road.
