The Kisauni housing scheme will have 84 -bedroom flats, 82 -2-bedroom flats and 102 single roomed flats, both for enting.

The Council has suggested that the second phase of the Kisauni project should be converted into public rental houses instead of low cost tenant purchase bungalows.

The negotiations have centred particularly on the council's intention to have the whole scheme converted into public rental houses.

HOUSING LINETS.

The council has argued that the municipality needs more housing units for rental other than bungalows for tenant purchase.

Annues accomodating 3,246 families in the public rental scheme.

The tenant purchase scheme, including the completed USAID and the Nation House Corporation protects, provide 345 units in Garagamwe.

Other 429 units provide shelter for the families of council staff members.

When completed the new housing scheme is expected to provide houses for some 424 families.





He is a graduate of Utalii College, part of his training taking place at the Inter-continental Hotel, Frankfurt Mr Kagambi was Mr Modigell's assistant for a while at Jadini Beach Hotel/Africana Sea Lodge.

A major development presently underway by Alliance Hotels, is the complete renova-tion of the 75-year old Castle Hotel, a famous landmark Mombasa

Said Mr Modigell 'this lliance Hotels curr towards the contribution contribution towards the growth of the tourist industry' adding 'if all goes well we hope o embark on new projects in the very near future'.

### BIG STEEL CARGO GOES 'MISSING'

OVER 8.000 TONNES of steel has been stolen in transit somewhere between the port of Dar es Salaam and Lusaka.

The stolen consignment was part of the 115.000 tonnes of steel donated to Zambia by North Korea for the construction of a multimillion kwa-ba multimillion kwacha

complex of the National Institute for Planning and Management, and almost certainly disappeared at Dar-es-Salaam.

Ongara however assured Zambian exporters and importers that security at the port had improved with more stringent regulations adopted by port authorities.

at the port.

"We had to reduce the number of agents and we intend to reduce the number further to ensure proper accounting of goods at the port while they are still in our hands". he said adding that the wagon turn-around time on Tazara from Dar es Salaam to Zambia has now improved from more than 29 days to less than a week.

The Tanzanian government is now expecting to secure a loan of \$62m from the World Bank and other international donor agencies for the rehabilitation of Dar es Salaam

es-Salaam.

The revelation by President Kaunda of the missing consignment coincided with the wisit to Lusaka of a principal secretary in the Tanzanian Ministry of Communication and Works Odira Ongara, who was in the Zambian capital to persuade importers and exporters to use the port of Dar es Salaam.

He said while four years ago the port had over 200 forward-ing and clearing agents, the number had been reduced to less than 50.

The large number of agents created confusion which enabled some of them to steal cargo and involve themselves in other clandestine activities at the port.

Each box is insured for Kshs. 30,000/-, for a rent of Kshs. 7/- per day or 45/- per week, plus a refundable deposit of 100/-.

An added incentive in this new Safe Deposit System is that it involves no investments on the part of the hotel. In fact hotels receive a handling fee for each safe rented at a rate of 15 per cent up to 25 per cent.

Safe Rental also undertake to install their safe units free of charge and are willing to share the cost of building a special room.

#### SUITING CLIENTS' REQUIREMENTS

Each safe deposit unit consists of 20 safes of varying measurements to suit individual client's requirement.

Safe Rental Ltd., the brainchild of Mr Han Van Schooneveld of Amsterdam, Holland, currently operates in Africana Sea Lodge, Jadini, Leisure Lodge, Shelly Beach, Lawford's, Eden Rock and many other hotels at the Coast.



The extravagent layout of the camp is unique in its siting on an island between two streams, both of which are banked by dense trees which effectively screen the tents and permenent structures from view of the road.

The tents, each with private bathroom facilities are situated along the streams, looking across a swamp and

natural pools which have long been favourite watering holes for the resident and migrant animals of the reserve.

Permenant structures at the camp include a comfortable lounge area with a lookout attic affording sweeping views of the plains beyond the camp. a dining room as well as a swimming pool.

One notbale feature of the camp is the extent to which the natural environment of the Masai Mara has been retained. The permenant structures are alki made of natural rock obtained not five miles from the camp.

Throughout the construction process all the trees on the site were preserved and the camp management has already started planting trees and shrubs all of which are indigenous to the Masai Mara.

Solar heating panels have been installed for all the camp's hot water requirements which will avoid the burning of wood for fuel.

The new camp is a part of a major expansion programme by Sarova Hotels which also includes major rennovations to the New Stanley Hotel involving the construction of a swimming pool on the fifth floor.

The Group's two other hotels, the Ambassadeur and Whitesands, are also currently undergoing refurbishing and rennovation.

Each man in a zone detense is responsible for an area or zone around himself. This are can best be described as a circle with a 2 m rodus.

When the offense has the ball in his area, the detensive man has to attack the ball. The other detensive men move in to protect the middle of the zone.

The front man or men are responsible for keeping the

oftensive point man who is bringing the ball down, from driving in for the layup or the short jump shot.

The middle man is responsible for protecting the middle of the zone and for tebounding and protecting against the base line drive or layup.

Remember, the weakness of the zone defense is that it torces most shots to the outside which gives the offensive team a good rebounding position.


