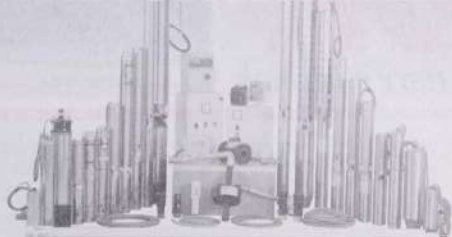

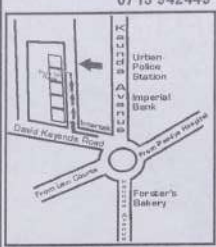

KWS Spearhead New National Wildlife Climate Change Adaptation Strategy

Kenya has started developing the country's first ever National Wildlife Climate Change Adaptation Strategy.

The process is spearheaded by the Kenya Wildlife Service (KWS) in conjunction with the Kenya Climate Change Working Group (KCCWG) and other stakeholders.

The strategy is aimed at inspiring and enabling wildlife resource managers and other decision makers to take the much-needed actions in order to adapt to the changing climate and preserve the precious wildlife resource for posterity.

Such adaptation actions are fundamental towards sustaining Kenya's ecosystems and wildlife resources as well as the livelihoods and values that the wildlife provides.

Speaking while opening the National Wildlife Climate Change Adaptation Strategy Inception workshop in Nanyuki, the KWS Deputy Director in charge of Biodiversity, Research and Monitoring Dr. Samuel Kasiki said that apart from poaching, climate change is another silent threat to Kenya's wildlife.

The workshop, which brought together wildlife and tourism stakeholders, university scholars, conservation scientists and key policy makers from across the country discussed the impacts of climate change to the country's wildlife and the various ways of mitigating the adverse effects brought about by them.

In emphasizing the importance of the Strategy, the KWS Assistant Director for Ecosystems Conservation and Management Dr. Erustus Kanga, pointed out that over the years, Kenya has suffered greatly from the effects of climate change.

These include loss of wildlife as a result of prolonged drought, increased cases of human wildlife conflict due to change in wildlife migratory patterns and change in home ranges, increased wildfires and invasive species as well as extreme weather patterns and events that have negatively impacted on the country's infrastructure.

The workshop will outline specific goals and

objectives that will pave way for the formulation of a clear action plan which is fundamental towards the realization and successful implementation of the National Wildlife Climate Change Adaptation Strategy.

Already, the country has in place the National Climate Change Response Strategy (NCCRS) and a National Climate Change Action Plan (NCCAP) all aimed at combating the effects of climate change in Kenya.

However, the development of the National Wildlife Climate Change Adaptation Strategy comes at a critical time when climate change is a reality in

Kenya as depicted by variation in weather patterns, unpredictable levels of water in lakes and rivers, frequent and prolonged occurrence of droughts and floods, and other environmental disasters.

These occurrences have adverse impacts on the Kenyan economy and livelihoods that largely depends on natural resources such as water, land, plants and animals. The country's wildlife and tourism sectors, which support a large proportion of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), remain vulnerable to the impacts of climate change.

The successful implementation of the strategy will go a long way towards addressing some of these challenges as the country continues to strive towards saving the last great species and places on earth for humanity.

'Kilifi Gold' Triathlon Success

The 11th annual Kilifi Gold Triathlon was a huge success and 2013 was our best year yet, writes Erin Tyburski of the Kilifi Gold Triathlon 2013 Committee.

The event was held on Saturday, August 31st in support of Lifting the Barriers (LIBA), a Kilifi-based nongovernmental organization.

LIBA provides children, youth and women with the tools to move from apathy and poverty to stability and self-sufficiency, thereby promoting vibrant and self-reliant citizens.

The main event and two pre-events raised Kes 430,000 to support the establishment of Bofa Primary School in Kilifi, among other projects LIBA is leading.

This year's event had over 100 participants in the individual and team races.

The sprint triathlon consists of -

- a 750m swim in the clear blue waters of Kilifi Creek;
- a 20 kilometer cycle around the untouched landscape of the Kilifi Plantations sisal and dairy farm; and a five kilometer run through the baobab and coconut-dotted sisal fields.

The winner of the men's event Swaleh Balala set a new course record time of 1 hour and 25 minutes.

Centered at the Kilifi Plantations airstrip, the event

also included 15 stalls selling local handicrafts, clothes, baked goods, products made from recycled materials, eco-friendly products, and jewelry.

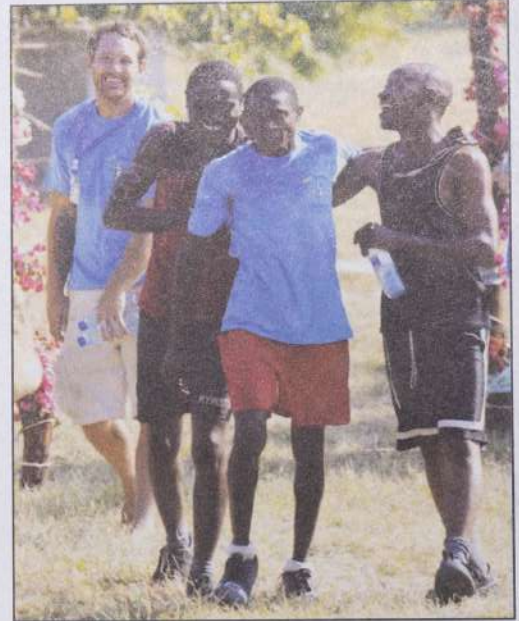
Kivukoni School also had an area for the children to have their faces painted for free.

Veterinarians? - A Westgate Rescue via KSPCA

After the tragic attack on the Westgate Shopping Centre, we at KSPCA apart from being horrified that humans could do such things, were worried what might have happened to the animals being sold on Peponi Road, writes a Nairobi spokeslady.

However for the first few days we were not allowed to go near the place to check if any of them had been left.

Today (24.9.2013) we were told that things were a bit quieter as we rushed down. The police and military could not have been more helpful and let us into Peponi Road with our vehicle once we explained our mission.

There we found five puppies and three kittens sitting where the soldiers were with their rifles. The soldiers had taken pity on them and were giving them some food. We gathered up the animals and put them in the vehicle.

While we were doing this we heard gun shots which reminded us that it is still an unsafe place. After we had left a bomb went off and the bomb disposal squad rushed to the building.

We had just left in time. The general public does not realise how risky a law enforcement's life can be. They should be congratulated for their bravery.

DR. ROLAND MINOR RECEIVES 'TREVOR BLACKBURN' AWARD

Dr Roland Minor has been confirmed as winner of the Trevor Blackburn Award in recognition of his outstanding contributions to animal health and welfare in Africa, for the impact of his work in animal disease control - particularly his involvement in the eradication of rinderpest - and his significant contribution to the delivery of veterinary services in numerous African countries.

The announcement came during the Awards Ceremony at the British Veterinary Association's Members' Day in Cardiff.

Roland Minor grew up in Argentina and at the age of twelve became fascinated by the science of cattle production and decided then that he would become a veterinary surgeon.

Graduating from the University of Cambridge Veterinary School in 1963 Mr Minor has devoted most of his life to Africa where he has been involved with animal disease control, the provision of veterinary clinical services and support of animal production systems.

He has worked and made significant contributions to the delivery of veterinary services in some 12 countries in Africa.

He has occupied public and private sector, field, laboratory and administrative positions, gaining a breadth of experience that has led to his subsequent work as a much respected international veterinary consultant.

Roland Minor was one of the first veterinarians to use the newly developed rinderpest tissue culture vaccine in the field - the vaccine that eventually led to the declaration of the global eradication of rinderpest in 2011.

A paper on rabies published in

Veterinary Record while he was working in Kenya earned Mr Minor the William Hunting Prize in 1978 and helped to secure him a position at the Centre for Tropical Veterinary Medicine in Edinburgh. Working in Southern Sudan, he identified East Coast

Flu in Ugandan refugee camps and consequently its spread into local (native) herds where it has now become enzootic.

Subsequently, as Deputy Director of Veterinary Services in Botswana, his principal concern was the control of foot-and-mouth disease.

A detailed account of Roland Minor's professional work can be found in the recently published book 'A Lot of Loose Ends - A Vet in Africa' which primarily focuses on his work from the mid-60s in what is known as the Greater Horn of Africa, which includes Uganda, Kenya, Ethiopia and Sudan.

Mr. Minor now resides in Lamu, on the Kenyan coast. On learning that he was to receive the Trevor Blackburn Award, Roland Minor said: "I was flattered to be considered for the award. It's like the icing on the cake after an exciting and fulfilling career."

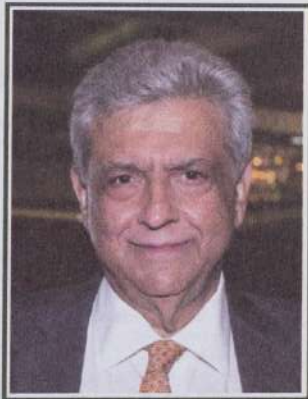

It is Useless To Make Well Meaning Laws If One Has No Intention To Enforce Them

We will this week look at the third area of focus that we believe is needed in order to make a long-lasting impact on the safety on our roads.

This is in the area of values. These values are not only for the road but will probably need to be inculcated into our national psyche for the betterment of the country.

When the Michuki rules were introduced and enforcement started, the matatu industry and some other public transport operators decided to go on strike in protest against the rules.

It was a simple indication that they were not willing to embrace the change that those rules were intended to bring on yet the benefits to all was not lost.

The industry thought that by denying their service to the public the commuters would force the hand of the government into repealing the rules.

They were in for a shock. Wananchi decided to walk to work or pool transport or even bring little used vehicles, motorbikes and bicycles into service so that they could defy the protesting public transport operators.

For nearly a week the public refused to compromise and eventually the matatu operators capitulated when they realised that the banks would be on their back for payments, the staff were beginning to demand pay whilst assets were idle and the other creditors were also agitating for payment.

One by one they began to install

the hardware that had been prescribed namely fitting speed governors and safety belts.

They had to put definitive yellow lines on the side of the matatus and also put the route number on which they would operate in large writing on the side of the vehicle.

These simple requirements were supposed to start an attitude change amongst the drivers of the public service vehicles.

One was to respect the speed limits and the other was to stick

vehicle. The behaviour change was only partially achieved as there were more rules required to ensure that the changes started.

Passengers refused to belt up because of the typical short intervals between the stopping of matatus to pick up and offload passengers.

This needed to change so that the matatus would only stop at the designated areas.

Wananchi were not happy to walk the extra distance to the designated stop nor were they happy to be dropped at a designated stop and then have to walk back.

The freedom as to where matatus stop and how long they wait for also contributed to the challenge of changing behaviour.

The fight for passengers amongst the matatu operators is the root of the problem as well as the working conditions where the vehicles are expected to bring a certain minimum amount per day.

This requirement meant and still means that the driver and his tout are under pressure to fill up and maximise the number of trips.

Passengers are rough handled and the drivers will do anything to make it between the ends of the route in the minimum time.

This drives the culture of overlapping, unruly behaviour and bullying of other road users.

The key change that has to happen is that the Michuki rules and a whole load more have to be put in place and then followed by ruthless enforcement.

We suggest that any passenger who is caught breaking

rules be ejected from the matatu immediately and the matatu be allowed to continue on its journey without any refund of cash.

The passenger can be left dealing with the cop.

As for the operators, they should be arrested and kept in a sin bin for half a day and their vehicle parked for that period as well.

It means that we will not have to crowd courts and engage legal machinery for mundane matters.

This simple incarceration will cause the passengers and operators to feel the pinch and they will conform.

The campaign will have to be carried out for several years till proper decorum returns to the road.

Other road users other than public transport vehicles will also have to suffer the same punishment for simple road offences.

Getting a central driver registration and management system would aid in this effort.

Infringements can be given points and these can be uploaded to the driver's record and when they reach a certain threshold, the driver would have to stop driving and cool for several months and appear before a parole body that he can decide whether he can be allowed limited use back on the road with a proviso that any infringement of any law within a given time will double the driving stop and then a third period would lead to withdrawal of the license.

As Kachumbari has noted before, Draconian measures are necessary to drive behaviour change.

The vehicles were also limited to a defined number of passengers - seated and belted up.

These were supposed to inculcate an attitude change amongst the operators so that they would begin to treat passengers better.

Passengers were also supposed to behave better and respect the fact they were all supposed to be seated rather than stand.

They were also expected to belt up whenever seated in the

SPECTATORS WILL TRACK CARS IN REAL TIME DURING KQ 2013 SAFARI CLASSIC

The organisation of the 2013 Kenya Airways Safari Classic Rally this November is set to get a notch higher, thanks to the deployment of the RMS Safety Tracking system, which anyone anywhere in the world will be able to follow the progress of the event minute by minute, writes Samson Ateka.

The main reason for using this sophisticated modern system is to provide the rally organisers with up to date information on all of the sixty-odd rally cars as they find their way round the 4,100 km route in Kenya and Tanzania.

But there is an attractive spin-off for rally enthusiasts since by using a link provided by the Safari Classic website:

www.eastafricansafarirally.com

they can track all the rally cars in real time.

The provider of this service, Peter Silberberg of RMS, says that this service works so well in East Africa thanks to the fact that the telecom companies and the governments have invested heavily in digital telephone communications in preference to stringing hundreds of thousands of miles of copper wire between equally laboriously erected telegraph posts.

The way it works is that each rally car has a GPS receiver and the positional information thus received plus the car's ID is then re-transmitted via the digital telephone service to a network of servers located round the world.

Should a rally car drop out of contact with the digital network, the on-board system continues to store the data and then 'catches up' when the connection is remade.

This is what Peter Silberberg has to say about RMS and the 2011 Safari Classic: "The system was used to monitor 55 competition vehicles, 3 helicopters and 4 course cars on a route covering Kenya and Tanzania totalling 4,165-kilometres of which 1,995-kilometres were special stages. The stages were long and tough, the longest of them being 154 kilometres. The event saw monsoon conditions with flash flooding and the system played a key role in providing the Clerk of the Course with the necessary information to re-route vehicles and ensure that everyone got through safely."

Being an endurance rally, Rally HQ moved 6 times during the running of the event, usually overnight, and due to the flexible design of the system this was achieved easily allowing the Clerk of the Course always access to the system to monitor the progress of vehicles. Additionally, tracking was provided to mobile units including the event Medical Officer who monitored competitors from a helicopter throughout the event.

Coverage was also provided on the event website with a very large audience following the rally throughout; at times it is estimated that there were over one million people watching the tracking on the internet.

"Anyone wishing to follow the Safari Classic by means of this system will find a link on the event website," added Silberberg.

HOSTED AT AGA KHAN ACADEMY GYMNASIUM MOMBASA

The national trials for the World Sitting Volleyball Championships took place at the Aga Khan Academy gymnasium in Mombasa last weekend with stakeholders lamenting on the low turn up of teams. The two day event was held to select Kenya's national team to participate in the Zone 5 world championships qualifiers in Kampala later in the year has attracted only seven teams from amongst the 15 teams in the Kenya Sitting Volleyball Federation seven different countries. The federation chairman, Duncan Karanja said the low turn-out was occasioned by a last minute directive that each participating team be funded by their respective county government unlike in the past where the national trials were funded by the Ministry of Sports.

Mvita MP Abdullswamad Shariff Nassir who attended the event's opening ceremony exuded confidence that Kenya will produce the best team to defend its title. He said though the transition to devolved governance of sports presented challenge in this year's turn out, the sport has not been given enough support and called on leaders to support sports. He assured the Mombasa team that it will be supported financially. He congratulated the counties that participated and called on other counties to support their teams fully as a way of promoting the sport. He thanked the organizers for choosing Mombasa as the host county saying it is the best

destination for local tourists. The MIP said he will soon table a bill in parliament that will seek to scrap the assessment fee that the disabled are required to pay in health facilities. Mombasa county team manager Anisa Abdala called on the corporate community to sponsor various teams as a way of showing solidarity with the disabled. Kenya which hosted the 2010 world championships for ladies won the title while the men's team finished second in their 2009 championships held in Rwanda. Our hearts melted with tears when we saw young children under threat and stress during the siege at Westgate Mall, writes Mariam Mpaata.

Even more painful that people lost their lives. The nation came to a stand still because of selfish and cruel people. I still do not understand which planet these people came from. It is horrible and inhumanly to rob a child's life, a life that would otherwise have achieved so much, a life that could have had a chance to play and enjoy its childhood, a child that otherwise bring pride to his family and nation. It therefore becomes everybody's business to preach peaceful co-existence every so often, not only because children might be hurt or die but because nobody has the right to take a life apart from He who created it. Period. My reasoning might never be accepted by those that seek to do otherwise but am better off saying it anyway. Because War has never solved anything, I continue to believe one wrong plus another will never equal to right. No matter what reasons are advanced for war, the innocent end up suffering most. Innocent children do not get to play soccer and that makes me mad. Football has demonstrated its power for good on countless occasions over the years and can be used to advance many a message, the most significant being peace. In Rwanda, a soccer programme Esperance was set up to bring ethnic groups back together after the genocide that left thousands killed. Many other soccer programmes celebrated the international peace day celebrations with the aim of create more awareness on their role as peace makers. Where there's conflict, soccer always brings hope, a ray of sunshine to the affected areas. Soccer for youth therefore continues to create an avenue through which tensions can be diffused. Soccer has the capacity to diffuse any religious, tribal, economical barriers. It can be used to place emphasis on creating a culture of peace through teaching the principles of faith, discipline, teamwork, and respect for the opponent. Back home in Mombasa, Junior Stars was born out of the need to bring back children to the playgrounds after the 2007/8 post-election violence. Some people decided that they would solve political grievances by killing each other. Children lost hope of ever going back to the fields. But we have since learnt that political differences are not solved that way, by the way we handle our last elections. Many youth groups like Junior Stars have over three thousand youth getting together to interact through soccer related activities and the result is usually amazing. Seeing children from all walks of life enjoying the game with discrimination is a beautiful feeling. Many young people have realized along the way that it is much better to play with each other than alienate each other. A man is determined by the way he bounces back after a fall. We cannot lie low but rather be inspired to create social centers that eliminate any sense of isolation and hopelessness among our youth. To all those lovely young and old people whose lives were cut short may they rest in peace. To those who got injured may they be healed and to those who lost property, may they recover from their losses.

Florence Kiplagat Sweeps Women's Event

BERLIN (Xinhua) -- Kenya's Wilson Kipsang Kiprotich won the 40th Berlin Marathon by breaking the world record with 2:03:23 here on Sunday.

The 31-year-old broke the old record of 2:03:38 set by his fellow countrymen Patrick

Makasu. Second placed Eliud Kipchoge finished the 42,195 km course in 2:04:05, which is a new personal best, followed by Geoffrey Kipsang, who crossed the finish line with 2:06:26.

"I made my dream come true. My plan was to push and it really worked out. It is a very nice course. It is wonderful, a lot of people are cheering. I really love it," Kipsang said after the race.

Florence Kiplagat won the women's competition with 2:21:13 as she was able to leave Sharon Cherop in second with 2:22:28. It is the second triumph for Kiplagat after 2011. Kazakhstani-born German long distance runner Irina Mikitenko completed

the race in third with 2:24:54.

The Berlin Marathon was first initiated in 1974 and is held on

the last weekend in September.

The course is considered one of the fastest worldwide.
