It was just another day for eye surgeon, Dr Helen Roberts MBE FRCOphth, but her days are not quite like anyone else.

It takes her around 15 minutes to restore sight to a person blinded by cataracts, and she might treat up to 20 patients in a day.

On this particular day, how-ever, Helen's routine was interrupted by the arrival of a large cake which her staff had secretly had baked for her in celebration of the fact that it has been 20 years since Helen decided to dedicate her life to Kenya.

And during that time Kwale
Disrict Eye Centre has seen
400,000 people and carried
out 30,000 sight restoring
eye operations.

That's quite an achieve-ment, and Helen celebrated it by sharing the cake with her staff and all the patients in

Helen's clinic, the Kwale District Eye Centre (KDEC) les just inland from Momb-asa's famous Diani Beach.

And, while dinner at one of Diani's glossy hotels will cost about the same as making a blind man see, most of the ocal people are so poor they can't even scrape together the money for the subsidised fees: so they pay with a chicken, a few mangoes; or

KDEC never turn a patient who needs care away.

Which is probably just as well when you consider the following. Kenya's rate of blindness is ten times that of the Western the Western world; of the world's 45 million blind people 90 per cent live in the developing world and of the millions of Kenyans who go blind, 80 per cent need never have done so. Blindness, tragically, is





Kenya Airways East African Safari Classic Rally On The Launch Pad!

go to the start of the Kenya Airways East African Safari Classic Rally the excitement is starting to build, reports SAMSON ATEKA.

The realisation that soon all sixty-plus rally cars and their associated spare parts, wheels and tyres will be arriving in Mombasa by sea and by road means that the crews who will drive them away from Mombase, on November 21 st are beginning to feel the same keen anticipation that an astronaut feels when that an astronaut feels oised on top of a rocket at Cape

The frisson that the rally crews feel is generated by the fact that they are about to tackle a 4,100 kilometre (2,550 mile) route through some of the original sections used on this rally's

For fifty years, the Safari was the gold standard for toughness on major international rallies.

First held in 1953 to celebrate the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II, the last of these

events was held in 2002

So popular was the concept that one year later it was re-born in 'historic' format as the Safari Classic and has run every other

As in the five previous Safari Classics, the route will pass through the countryside regions of Kenya and Tanzania.

It will take the competing car from sea level on the Indian Ocean at Mombasa to altitudes of some 2,600 metres (8,500 feet) high above the Great Rift Valley in Central Kenya.

It will pass under the legendary slopes of Tanzania's Mount Kilimanjaro and visit several of the region's famous game reserves and national parks.

During the nine-day rally, there is one day of rest and recuperation in the middle where it is permitted to service the cars for an extended six-hour period and this takes place at the Ol Tukai Lodge in the Amboseli national park.

Typical of the event, for both nights that the rally is there the park rangers have to provide 'security' in the service area to prevent inquisitive elephants from 'playing' with the rally cars

Just over sixty crews from all over the world have entered the 2013 Kenya Airways Safari Classic and the cars that they are driving are equally diverse.

They all have to be of a model that was manufactured before 1979 and yet comply with all modern safety standards.

There is a preponderance of Porsche 911s in the entry this time, probably indicative of the fact that the last Safari Classic in 2011 was won by ex-World Rally Champion, Björn Waldegård, in a Porsche 911.

a Porsche 911.

He came though various tribulations on an event that was very largely wet and muddy but he may find it even more difficult this year as he will find another ex-World Rally Champion and fellow Swede, Stig Blomqvist also in a Porsche 911.

With no fewer that thirty With no fewer that thirty-one Porsche 911s entered and the start area at the Sarova Whitesands Hotel looking alittle like the daily output from the Stuttgart factory's production line, one might be forgiven for wondering who might be able take the fight to the Porsches.

take the fight to the Porsches. There is no difficulty there since \$x\$-times Kenyan Rally Champion and Safari Classic winner in 2009, Ian Duncan, is returning with his Ford Capri V6 while another Kenyan exchampion, Alistair Cavenagh, heads a list of drivers who are behind the wheel of Ford Escort RSs similar to those cars that won the original Safari Rally in 1972 and 1977.

A car that made its name

A car that made its name winning the Safari Rally in 1971 and 1973 was the Datsun 240Z and there is a strong group of drivers from within Kenya and outside who are driving Datsun 260Zs - the same model that won the first two Safari Classics in 2003 and 2005 - on this year's

Principal amongst these are Steve Perez from the UK who finished third in 2009 behind Innished third in 2009 behind Duncan and Waldegård while alongside him in the Kick Energy Team, he has Geoff Bell from South Africa who finished second in 2011 with his 2602, finishing behind Waldegård after leading for much of the last leg of the rally.

Adding variety to the entry list there are Mazda RX7s, Datsun 1800s, Ford Escort Mk1s, and then the true individualists who are driving cars like a Mercedes 220SE, a Chevrolet Corvette and a Ferrari 308 Dino GT4.

If there was one thing that has been learned in past years and on all the Safaris that preceded the Safaris that preceded the Safari Classic, on a rally that takes in such large sections of un-metalled road in areas populated with wild animals and where climatic conditions are categorised as 'subject to change', any one of the sixty or so cars that leaves Mombasa can have a chance of success.



He is therefore trained both, to gve Anaesthesia to all patients indergoing any type of opera-tors and to manage the very sck patients in the ICUs. In fact, the role of the Anaesthesiologist in the ICU is often much larger han that of his other colleagues

comes to the operating theatres, gives one injection and goes

away.

Little do they realize that whilst they are asleep, undergoing their operation, it is the Anaesthes-tologist who is besides them during the entire procedure ensuring that they remain safe and stable throughout the duration of the operation.

It is also the responsibility of the Anaesthetist to make sure the Anaesthelist to make sure that the patient wakes up well after the operation is over and to ensure that the patient is stable to go back to the wards.

Likewise, in the ICU, the Anaesthesiologist is the Intensivist and is therefore the first Doctor to be called in for the very ill patients.

It is his job to carry out all the invasive procedures on the patient, put him on Life Support if necessary and continue treating the patient till he is ready to be discharged from the ICU.

The idea of this Symposium is to educate people in all walks of life so that they understand the role of the Anaesthesiologist in their lives should they be admitted to hospital for any allmost.

Dr. Madhu Patel, Chairman of the Kenya Society Of Anaesth-esiologists, and Ms. Selina Ambitho, Nursing Director of the Mombasa Hospital, both feel that Anaesthesiology has been a very poorly understood and underrated speciality in medical practice and it is high time our citizens do understand the re

lives, should they ever be admitted to hospital.

This, being a clinical symposium, is also meant to educate the medical staff and other Medical Colleagues in the entire Coast region. It is a part of the Continuous Professional Development that the Medical Practitis pment that the Medical Practiti oners and Dentists Board has always advocated.

Focus should for example be on the highest population impacted by road transport accidents and not necessarily only those that cause deaths

If one works out from current rudimentary data, it will be obvious that one has to work out on the area of pedestrian safety and behaviour and the same in the area of public transport.

Let us start with the latter. In an earlier article I presented the new Regulations that under development for public transport.

We will be asking a large number of people to do something that they cannot consistently do.

It may have an impact in making the few people who are honest and sticklers for rules to comply.

The majority of Kenyans will

What is needed is a holistic understanding of the causative factors of accidents in the public transport sector.

The causes will not be found in what other countries have looked

It will require a uniquely Kenyan development as they will be driv-en both by common international factors as well as uniquely local factors that need to be taken into account when designing interventions intended to improve the safety performance in this sector

We do not intend to prescribe

what the solutions would be as they are beyond the ambit of this

The same intervention is needed for pedestrians. It is woefully evident that they have not been a consideration in a lot of the actions that have been taken to improve road safety in the country, yet they are the most vulnerable road users.

most vunerable road users.
Start from kids who are released to go to school by their parents as they also have to go to work at the same time and end at the elderly who still need to get around in their day to day life.

in between one will also have to cater for those who are physically and visually challenged as well as those who are hard of hearing.

There are some immediate actions that can and should be taken to create a step change in reducing accidents

The low hanging fruits are

This should again be followed by research both into causative factors.

A lot of information is available from the work done in countries that have faced similar ballo-oning accident rates.

This area especially is one that almost any major city in the world has found solutions for and the safety authorities should be able o quickly find and adapt or adopt from those cities.

The implementation of these quick wins may not be as fast as that in the public transport sector because of the spread of the area and jurisdictions for

there has to be a good interactor between the Authority, the central government and the county governments.

The egos that exist here may prevent effective and uniform implementation of the solutions and the Authority will require many skills to help it get buy in by all stakeholders to the solutions in with. it comes up with.


The long term solutions to both the public transport sector as well as pedestrian safety will need continuous analysis and research into the causes of accidents and this will require that the information gathering system be all inclusive.

system be all inclusive. It will have to capture standard data as is required to be reported now but will need to be extended to capturing a lot of other data such road conditions and the environment at the time of the accident to the types of injuries and damage and the treatment that was given and the effect of that was given and the effect of such treatment.

It will require that there is monitoring of the impact of all the interventions and a redesign should it be necessary to do so.

The long term research and intervention cannot be done by the Authority on its own and with mean that they need to build up collaborations and coalitions with research agencies and peers that will help them to fulfill this long term mandate.

The big question that arises from all this is whether the establishment of the Authority took into consideration the full extent of the mandate they need CONCLUDED PAGE FIFTEEN



A total of 168 goats were sacfisced Majengo while as usual lacrifice was also done in the small village of Moyeni in Kwale.



Artificial Reef In Mombasa Marine Park And Reserve

The MPV Fish Eagle is a multi purpose vessel that was originally built in Germany by J.G. Hitzler Schiffswerft (Hitzler shipyard) in 1966, reports **Project Coordinator** SANDER D. DEN HARING.

Her early days were spent as an oil field supply vessel in the North Sea.

In the early 80's a British company called Eagle Tugs Ltd bought her and changed her name from the original Fangturm to Fish Eagle.

The company positioned her in

Mombasa to assist with the rising oil industry in Madagascar.

MPV Fish Eagle was purchased by Kenya Marine Contractors Ltd in 1997 and has been based in Mombasa ever

Throughout her time in Mombasa Fish Eagle has been used as an offshore supply used as an offshore supply vessel, a tug, an accommodation vessel and a diving support vessel, in the following countries: Kenya, Somalia, Djibouti, Tanzania, Mozambique, Madagascar, Mauritius, South Africa, Eritrea, UAE, Turkey, Pakistan, India, Thailand, Malaysia, Singapore and Indonesia.

MPV Fish Eagle has performed her multi-facetted jobs with distinction, however, the time has come to retire her.

When a vessel reaches the age and/or state of retirement there is generally one of two possible options: decommission the vessel for scrap metal (the most commonly used method and the most profitable for the owner), or use the vessel to create an artificial reef.

The latter option has gained global momentum in the past two decades, especially for decommissioned navy vessels.

Transforming vessels into artificial reefs is also not something new along the Kenyan coastline: the MV Alpha Fungua and the MV Dania were sunk as artificial reefs in 2002 in the Diani and Mombasa areas respectively.

respectively.

The MPV Fish Eagle will soon follow suit as Kenya Marine Contractors Ltd has chosen a similar fate for the decommissioned vessel in a bid to return something to the Mombasa area.

This conservation initiative aims to create a new (artificial) reef in the Mombasa Marine Park and


It will achieve this by creating shelter and habitat for fish, and by providing substrate for coral (and other invertebrates) to attach onto.

The location for this new artificial reef will be on a flat sandy area about 300m off of the main fringing reef within the

This barren sandy area currently offers no shelter or substrate and therefore attracts

Once the ship is sunk, it will not only attract huge schools of fish and other diverse marine life (as have the MV Dania and MV Alpha Fungua), but also recreational scuba divers.

The local diving industry is given a great boost having a dive site such as this to offer and the wreck's popularity has already been guaranteed by local support and interest.



Kenya Marine Contractors Ltd has generously donated not only the vessel, but also the cleaning and preparing of the vessel.

Before a vessel can be sunk as an artificial reef, it must be cleaned of all materials toxic to the environment.

This includes all lubricants, hydrocarbons (oil and diesel), and refrigeration coolants.

Furthermore, all machinery

(including the engines), electrical materials (appliances and wiring), wall paneling and insulation material will also be removed from the vessel.

Once the vessel is cleaned, it will be prepared for diver safety. doorways will be widened, windows will be removed, access holes will be cut throughout the vessel and any areas deemed unsafe for diver

visitation will be permanently sealed.

The cleaning and preparation of the vessel is expected to be completed by December 2013 and the vessel shall be sunk shortly thereafter.

To raise awareness of this endeavor various events are planned to introduce residents and visiting tourists to this new dive site.

The local dive centers operating within the Mombasa Marine Park and Reserve have all embraced this initiative and have already generated enthusiasm with their current and future diving clients.

The Kenya Wildlife Service (the management authority of the marine park) is also actively supporting this project and will work with the dive centers to raise the profile of the upcoming this active. dive site.




