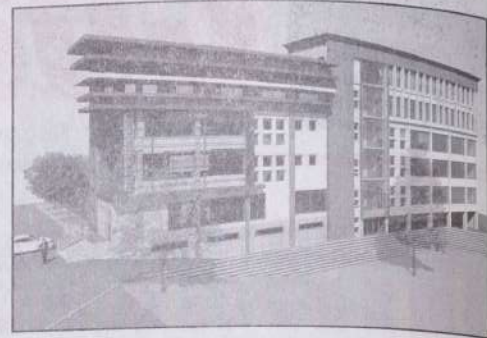

The above committees will depending on the number of teams to be hosted further be divided into sub-committees for accommodation, transport, training facilities, ticketing and sales, protocol, entertainment, security, medical services and other as advised.

Mombasa County Stadium will co-host along with Moi Karasani, Nyayo stadium, Mumias, Machakos and Kisumu stadiums, the CECAFA tournament scheduled to be held from November 27 to December 12, 2013.

2013 KCB Kenya Rally Championship in a Mitsubishi Evo 10. This also means that the Kenya Airways Safari Classic may well be deprived of the

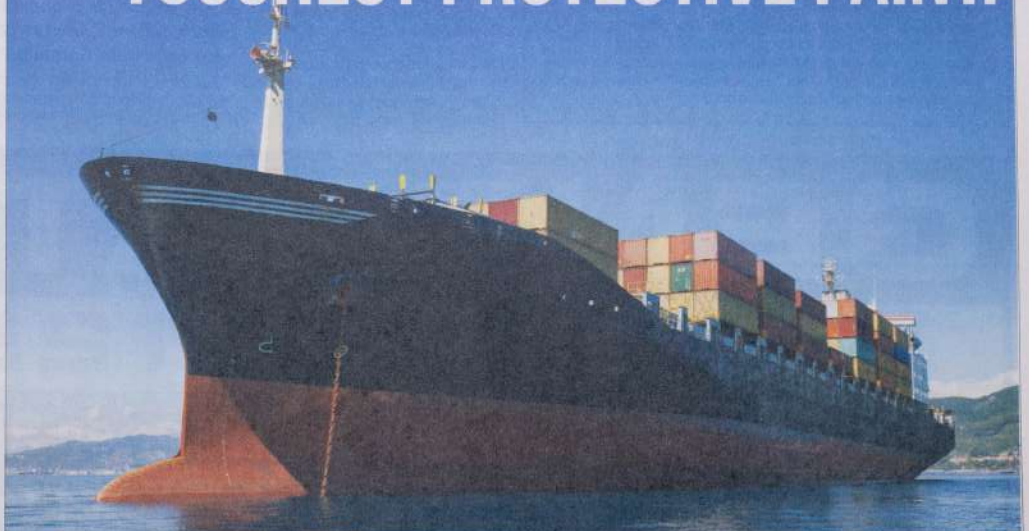

# Our Only Way Forward Is To Ruthlessly Create Honest Cops!

Our road transport sector is due to undergo a lot of changes resulting from the incessant ability to 'kill'.

Traditional black spots have remained black spots despite all the boys in blue and the facility owners have done.

Salgaa, Machakos turn off, Kinungi, Milolongo, and all the areas we thought would have

been made safer have not changed.

Whenever we think they have gone off the radar screen, they return with a vengeance and each time the story is almost the same - either major damage or motile fatalities.

Our fatality count this year to date of over three thousand is a grim statement of our road safety standards.

Over and above our suggestions over the last few weeks, it is also now coming to light that the boys in blue are equipping themselves with sufficient gadgetry and laws to launch an onslaught on miscreant drivers.

The main places where technology can be applied to influence driver behaviour is in the area of speeding, driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs and that of jumping traffic lights.

There is also technology in the form of tachographs which can be applied to vehicles but will need intervention in order to interpret and educate drivers on their driving styles and behaviours. Speed limitation devices are also available.

The other areas where technology can be applied is to check the condition of the vehicle.

This would help if the safety critical items were to be regularly checked and calibrated.

However, the country does not have the capacity currently to make this compulsory for all vehicles and it is not part of the low hanging fruit that would have immediate impact on road fatalities and damage to property.

These interventions have been tried in the country with varying degrees of success.

The 'Michuki Rules' brought in speed governors or limiters and these were very quickly frustrated by the drivers who found a way to disable them and continue operating the way they have always done.

The matatu community has developed their own language by which they pass on message about where the cops are carrying out speed checks.

So after disabling speed limiters, they would tell each other where the cops were and the drivers would slow down to a crawl when they reached the

Kenyan drivers also found ingenious ways of avoiding the boys in blue - by wearing hijabs or having special drivers to drive them from one side of a road block to another.

This latter service was a brainchild of some cops who decided that they could make money in a different way by setting up a road block and then having a few drivers either side of the road block to offer their services to motorists who had been drinking and were not sure of whether they could pass a breathalyser test.

The service consisted of driving the drunk driver from one side of the road block to other for a fee. This would be split between the cops and their operators!

The breathalyser is about to come back but this time backed by all the legal clout that it needs.

However, the cops in Kenya are sure to find ways of frustrating the device or of extorting money from drivers who would otherwise fail the test and be the subject of prosecution and/or incarceration.

As for tachographs and speed limiters, the technical bods in

Kenya have to scan widely to find equipment that will be tamper proof to the point of destruction.

We have a long way to go even if the police were to introduce all the solutions that they are currently planning.

The first is that we have to be reliable and relatively tamper proof equipment.

The equipment has to have several levels of redundancy as well as built in checks that stop the user from negating a reading.

There needs to counter checks on the usage of the equipment and also remote diagnostics of tampering and data analysis.

All the belts and braces need to be put in place such that the boys in blue are not able to circumvent the intended use and outcomes.

Without this there will be heavy investment in technology that will not achieve the desired reduction in the rate of fatalities in Kenya but that will have the undesired effect of making the pockets of the boys in blue bulge even more with money extorted from drivers wishing to avoid prosecution.

As Kachumbari says, the only way to start making change is to ruthlessly create honest cops.

Coastweek reports on the 'menace' piracy continue to highlight the drama on high seas viz - a - viz marauding sea - pirates 'abducting' and

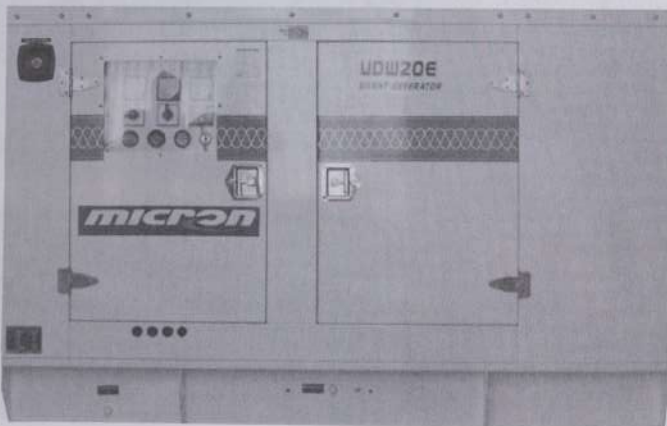
holding crews hostage and 'demanding' ransom.

At the 2011 Dubai Air Show, Emirates ordered 50 Boeing 777-300ERs with options for 20 more at a total value of US\$ 26 billion (AED 95.4 billion).

It was then a record breaking aircraft order - the single largest by any airline with Boeing in dollar value.

Emirates' Airbus A380s - Emirates currently operates the world's largest fleet of A380s with 39 in service.

Its order for 50 additional A380 aircraft today brings Emirates' total A380 order book to 101 aircraft, worth US\$ 45 billion.

A combination of two and three-class cabin configuration, the first 25 of these latest A380 aircraft orders are scheduled to be delivered before the first

quarter of 2018.

"The A380 continues to be the flagship of our fleet, and after five years in operation it remains highly popular with our passengers," said Tim Clark, President Emirates Airline.

"It is still one of the most efficient aircraft to operate today in terms of fuel burn and emissions per passenger, and it gives us the flexibility in some cases to meet passenger demand in slot-constrained markets. This latest order will help us meet both fleet expansion and fleet replacement needs."

Emirates has been associated with Europe's largest passenger aircraft since April 2000 when it became the first airline to announce plans to purchase the super jumbo.

As the largest customer for the A380, Emirates is therefore the largest supporter of European aerospace manufacturing jobs tied to the A380 programme, which is spread across Airbus' manufacturing centres in France, Germany, England and Spain.

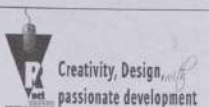

On Monday, South Africa beat third seeds Ghana 2-0 while Egypt, who are ranked second in Africa edged hosts Kenya 3-2 on the opening day. In the women's matches, South Africa, also reigning champions, showed their skills as they stun Kenya 1-1 while Ghana dismissed Tanzania 18-0. Tanzania are making a debut at the tournament.

On Monday, Ghana women's team held South Africa to a 1-1 draw. South Africa went one up in the first half through Cecilia Evans penalty corner while Elizabeth Opuku of Ghana dribbled the ball past the entire South African defence beating goalkeeper Phumelala Mbande to equalize in second half.

At the same time, Africa Hockey Federations president Seif Ahmed has confirmed that Africa will only get one slot for each of the men's and women's competitions at the World Cup next year.

Ahmed, an Egyptian, who is in Kenya to oversee the Africa Cup of Nations earlier said that the top two teams will get the automatic tickets to the World Cup. But he rescinded the words on Monday.

"I have to tell you that it is not the top two teams that will get automatic qualification. There were some changes," he said Tuesday in Nairobi. "We will only have the top teams from here in Nairobi making it to The Hague, Netherlands for the World Cup."

The Africa Hockey Federations President rued the lack of prize money and player incentive as result of the low turnout for the event.

Only hosts Kenya, Egypt, Tanzania, Ghana and South Africa turned up for the week-long tournament. Other giants like Nigeria, Cameroon, Zimbabwe, Namibia and Algeria have given the tournament a bye.

"It is unfortunate for us. Disciplines like football, athletics and cricket have the money and sponsorship, which they use to entice their players. In hockey it's different and the continent is struggling to have competitions like this one," said Ahmed.

"We don't have money and in future if sponsors don't come on board, we might reconsider hosting this tournament after four years."

Kenya replaced Egypt as hosts because of political unrest back in Cairo, but Nairobi too had its share of insecurity as terrorists struck the popular West Gate Mall. This prompted the Africa Hockey Federation to postpone the tournament from September to November.

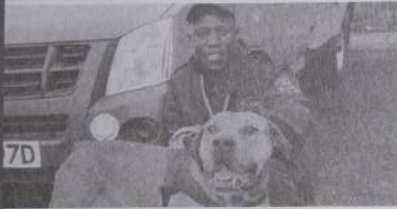
