New Investment Boosting Tourism

OPTIMISTIC FORECASTS WITH MORE 'AIR CHARTERS'

MILLIONS OF SHILLINGS are still being spent by both local and overseas hotel and tourist industry investors on numerous new developments - ranging from luxury hotels to five-star nightclubs - as the tour trade along the Kenya Coast looks forward to an almost 'Fully Booked' 1984-85 'Winter Season'.

All the tourist industry at the coast is delighted by the good news that the Kenya Government has 'liberalised' its policy on charters and that more should be flying here next year. Not only are hoteliers happy, but also businessmen, handicraft industries, farmers, safari and tour companies, for it is predicted that the coast can now look forward to, virtually, a 'high' tourist season throughout the year.

It also means a big leap forward towards meeting the Minister of Tourism's target of one million tourists a year by 1988, while foreign exchange earnings will soar.

Meanwhile, considerable development is either taking place or being planned at the Coast to meet the anticipated demand for more beds which, in turn, will create many extra job opportunities for wananchi. However, it is felt that urgent consideration should be given by government to those planning future developments, for it would appear that some help is required.

It is understood that some who have conducted feasibility studies on proposed projects are appalled, and immediately discouraged, by the extremely high cost of plant and machinery needed to set up and run a first class operation. A contributory factor being the very high duty and tax now being levied following this year's Budget.

It has been described as so alarming as to immediately act

tives should be considered. Reference was made to the fact that although overseas investors are, in principle, encouraged to make investments in this country, too much red tape often discourages them and they invest elsewhere.

A north coast hotelier points out that whereas a tax investment allowance is permitted on the south coast, this

was abolished five years ago for those coming with in the Mombasa Municipal area. This means that north coast hotel's envisaging expansion will not benefit at all from this tax allowance.

Another suggestion is that since the hotel industry is generating so much foreign exchange, that a small percentage of individual hotel earnings be

Lucky Coast Winner Meets Mickey Mouse

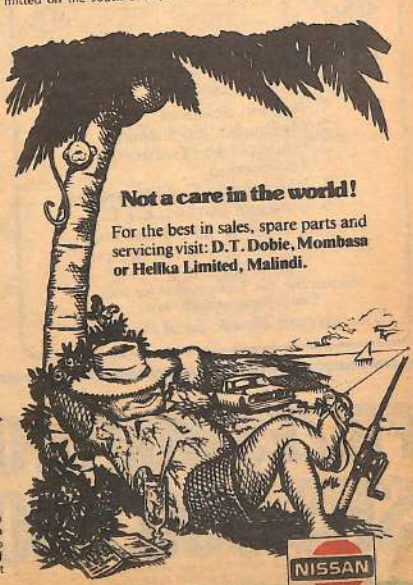

LIFE is made easy for the customers of School Book Centre.

Whenever you face the shop in Kaderbhy Building, Nkrumah Road you'll automatically find new arrivals in the two windows:-

First the right hand window: Business Studies, which covers books on Computers, How To Pass Examinations in Auditing, Statistics, Personnel Management and related subjects. Also here are the "Success" series in Calculations, Economics and Investment as well as "Made Simple" volumes, Study Packs for ACCA and ACCA Past Papers.

The window on the left has up-to-date and technical books like those on subjects of building, electrical work and on motor vehicles. On these two are pertinent questions and answers.

Before we let you follow the trek Coastweek led, we should tell you that you might like to park in Kisingo Road. If you don't want to carry your wares then there is free delivery to offices and most schools and this is not restricted to the island but country-wide.

Further, we wish to pass on School Book Centre's message: They feel they are cheapest in town for they are offering 5 per cent discount on published prices of books — and this 5 per cent discount is also extended to their stationery stock. They add they are not a branch of anywhere but import direct in their own right so keep prices down.

Nearly all brides know where Hirji Lakha is. As the company states they have most cosmopolitan customers. This description covers not only nationalities but also the means or pockets of clients. They reach everyone.

The shop, which opens with a press-button, is air-conditioned and has lights focussed on strategic objects.

Everything has its fashion, and jewellery is no exception. The "In" thing is diamonds, to which the preference has been swinging away from gold. Some items are in both, for example OM, Allah is One and crosses.

White gold too is liked, especially in bangles and chains. Oriental and intricate designs are always popular.

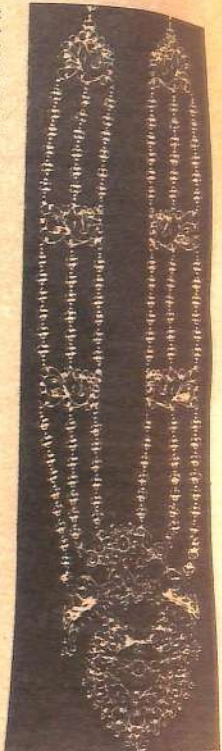
These jewellers or "Pattni People" don't take a course — the art is inborn in them — truly hereditary.

WHEN Jenifer Walters decided to stage *South Pacific* as the Little Theatre Club's Christmas production, she did not have to think twice about whom she should ask to be its music director.

Yvonne Edge only arrived in Mombasa in August last year but there is surely no one better qualified for this exacting job.

allocated towards the purchase of spare parts and vital machinery. This could be based on previous year's returns.

There is little doubt that such is the enthusiasm being generated in the tourist industry that considerable thought is also being given to development projects. However, costs have jumped astronomically, and it does appear that more assistance is required so that more projects can go ahead.

In the meantime, many hotels have already carried out major renovations either to upgrade or make their hotels even more attractive for guests, while others are extending.

Several new hotels are being built.

The largest development presently taking place at the Coast is the Kshs. 280 million Mombasa Intercontinental Hotel Shanzu, which will have 400 beds. It is expected to open next year and will have a conference hall for up to 300 people, a health club, air-conditioned squash court, also tennis court, as well as TV and video in all the rooms.

The African Safari Club group continues to grow. A 260 bed 5-star luxury hotel named 'Silver Star' is expected to be open on Dec 15. It is situated next to Silver and Bahari Beach Hotels. Next door, a large air conditioned nightclub which will have live bands as well as disco, and is expected to be one of the best at the coast, opens around the same time.

At Malindi Silversand Villas (nr Driftwood Club) opens on Dec 1. This is a luxurious up-market development of four beautiful, air conditioned, self catering, villas, seven self-contained cottages and beach house offering a total of 48 beds, and two swimming pools.

The four villas, which are superbly furnished, are now

ready for occupation.

There are plans to re-develop the Blue Marlin into a 400-bed apartment hotel, and recently a considerable sum of money was spent on renovating Malindi's finest hotel, the Sindbad.

It is understood there is a possibility that the skeletal Indian Ocean Hotel, Malindi which was never completed, may now be developed.

At the Blue Lagoon Watamu a fishing club with 30 luxury villas is planned.

Bamburi Beach Hotel is now extending from 220 to 275 beds by the addition of a four storey new wing. A unique disco will be situated on the ground floor, while above will be a gymnasium with German instructors, and a bar serving health drinks.

CONFERENCE HALL

Also on this floor will be an air conditioned Conference Hall to seat 200 people. It will be fully equipped and offer secretarial and photocopying services. This new wing will be ready early December.

Serena Beach Hotel is renovating all 120 rooms, including bathrooms. It is also building two air-conditioned gymnasium and an additional floodlit tennis court - to make two.

These should be completed mid-December.

At Kikambala the Sun 'n Sand is spending around Kshs. 12 million on completely renovating this 180 bed hotel. All rooms are being re-designed, and each will have a bath, shower and WC. Two tennis

courts are being built, while the swimming pool is being extended part of which will run through the dining room.

The gardens are being landscaped, while paths are being tarmacked.

A snack bar and video room are being added.

These developments are expected to be completed by the end of October.

Extensive renovations have been carried out at Whispering Palms and the Two Fishes hotels managed by the African Tours & Hotels.

It is understood, that in the Kikambala area a new hotel is to be built.

Major renovations are presently taking place at the 75 year-old Castle Hotel Mombasa which, in December, will have sixty air conditioned rooms of a very high standard, all with private bathrooms, WC and balconies.

It will also have a new Long Bar, Bistro and Multi-function conference room to seat 80 people which can also be used for art and trade exhibitions, also banquets and cocktail parties.

Mombasa's Oceanic Hotel is planning to extend by 64 beds in a new wing of rooms-cum-apartments. Work on which should start within the next 6 months in addition, a new Lebanese Mid-East Restaurant is to be opened.

The 412-bed five-star Nyali Beach Hotel is planning to extend by a further 200 beds. Phase 1 of this proposed deve-

lopment will be a new luxury wing of 60 rooms at the Palm Beach to replace the present bungalows there. Phase 2 covers an extra 40 rooms. This development is expected to take place in the next few years.

NEW FITNESS CENTRE

Mombasa's Reef Hotel has just opened a new Fitness Centre with fully equipped gymnasium, large aerobics room, sauna and health bar, as well as spacious changing rooms. A fully qualified physiotherapist is in attendance. A Pizzeria is to be added to the hotel's facilities, while a small night club is planned.

The hotel now has a Barracuda Scuba Diving and Windsurfing School complete with instructors.

Their Shimoni Reef Fishing Lodge is now fully operational and able to accommodate 24 people. It has its own fleet, including 'COUNTSDOWN' a fully equipped boat for deep sea fishing, a glass bottomed boat and dhows.

Should tourism increase, as is anticipated, the Reef Hotel is planning a 100 room development on the south coast, for which investment money is available.

Major developments are being planned at Diani Reef Hotel on the south coast, work on which is expected to start in the near future. They include a 100 room luxury wing and Vacation Club with 150 chalet units.

The Leisure Lodge complex is extending with the addition

of 95 international luxury standard suites. Half have already been completed, and the rest will be built next year.

It is a completely new complex with its own swimming pool and public rooms representing an investment of Kshs. 50 million in foreign currency.

Thus the four star Leisure Lodge is being joined by a Five Star Leisure Lodge Hotel and Leisure Lodge Club.

During the 10th anniversary celebrations of Robinson Club Baobab recently, the board of Directors of Robinson Kenya Ltd, agreed to consider further development in Kenya following a suggestion made by Mr Japhet Kiti, Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Tourism & Wildlife to build a second Robinson Club in this country.

MSAMBWENI PROJECT

Meanwhile, a new (80-100 bed) hotel is nearing completion at Msambweni, while at Tawi six cottages are being built.

It is understood there are plans to build a 300-bed hotel to replace Twiga Lodge.

DATELINE: DAR ES SALAAM

Tanzania's Top-Quality Coffee Is A Real Foreign Exchange Earner

THIS WEEK news of Tanzanian Coffee making a further breakthrough in international markets hit the main headlines of the local press here. With the imminent requirement of foreign exchange earnings to revamp the country's bleak economy, the disclosure that the country had been allocated an increase in quota made heartening news.

Tanzania's coffee quota for this year has been set at 766,901 bags which marks an increase of 59,434 bags from the allocation given last year.

Coffee which is the country's top foreign exchange earner was under threat some two months back when it was speculated that over 13,000 bags were to be withdrawn from the international quota between October 1983 and September 1984.

The present increase in Tanzania's quota represents a 1.35 percent of the world annual quota which is set at about 59 million bags and local authorities have affirmed that the country will be able to fulfill this new quota.

To this effect it is reported that in Morogoro a campaign has been launched to revive coffee farms in the region and also to open new ones in potential and viable places.

The primary advantage of having an increased quota is that prices of selling coffee within the quota system is more paying because coffee sold outside the international coffee organisation (ICO) market fetches only half the ICO price of 141 US cents a pound.

Zimbabwe

Meanwhile in Dar es Salaam three neighbouring countries have stepped up usage of the port here for their imports and exports. The three countries Malawi, Uganda and Zimbabwe have transhipped some 7200 tonnes of imports and exports in the first half of this year.

It is also hoped that Malawi and Zimbabwe which still channel a large portion of their cargo through South Africa will increase usage of the Dar es-Salaam port which is much more cheaper other landlocked countries which have traditionally used the port here are Zambia, Rwanda, Burundi and Zaire.

There has been a vast improvement of port operations here particularly because of technological changes in ship design and cargo handling methods after the introduction of container and other unit loads. Congestion problems, a prominent feature until recently, have now also been overcome.

To facilitate port operations the Tanzania Harbours

of seven experts from the world bank.

A new sewerage and sanitation department has been established within the Dar es Salaam City Council to be controlled under one of the foreign experts and it is expected that to begin with some 100 pit latrines will be built in the coming month.

The newly formed department will collaborate with the Ministry of Lands, Natural Resources and Tourism to rehabilitate, repair and improve the present city sewerage and sanitation system which is very unhygienic and a serious health hazard.

Tanzania received some 20 million dollars (350 million shillings) in March last year under an agreement signed between the world bank and Tanzania on one hand and the IDA and the Dar es Salaam City Council on the other.



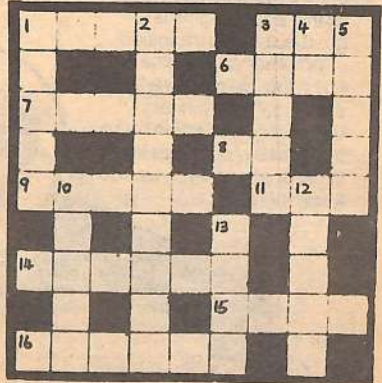

For Jim Davies — A Dream Begins Taking On Reality ...

SELDOM does the opportunity lend itself to write about yachts in this column but at the invitation of the Owner/Builder I spent a very pleasant and interesting few hours earlier in the week at the North side of African Marine and Engineering Company's premises inspecting a fine looking ferro concrete ketch in the latter stages of fitting out.

The owner/builder I refer to is Jim Davies, deputy Managing Director of Car and General (Kenya) Limited, who laid the keel and started on the frames in the garden of his house in Nairobi eight years ago. Subsequently he shifted operations to Mombasa on moving to the Coast, although his business life has since shifted back to Nairobi.

Building the ketch, yet to be named Shaza (Swahili for mother of pearl), has undoubtedly been a monumental and dedicated effort for somebody with a love for ships and the sea and the advantage of being an all round fundi.

A few details of Shaza, presently on the quayside being fitted out for her first taste of water, are length 37 ft. overall, ketch rigged, 13 tons displacement, or Thames measurement about 25 tons, draft 6 ft 6 ins., will have three plain sails plus one mizzen staysail.

Fitted with a Volvo Diesel 3 cylinder 36 H.P. engine, a spacious saloon, four permanent berths especially fitted for long distance family cruising in mind to be shared by Jim's wife and his two children. Her fuel capacity is 80 gallons, water 100 gallons, and holding tank capacity of 20 gallons.

It is the intention to register her in Kenya. I certainly take my hat off to Jim Davies for his single handed achievement and Shaza certainly has the makings of a magnificent floating home with many halcyon years of sailing ahead and the

job of getting away from it all.

So the grain dischargers continue to arrive, the Santa Maivra with 2,250 tons from Mozambique was due on Tuesday, the Lykes Lines Dolly Turman with 5,000 tons Maize and 5,000 tons Wheat was due yesterday, the Greek vessel Kavo Yossaras is due on Sunday with 13,800 tons from Thailand whilst next week the Dutch vessel Salland (ex Nedlloyd Salland) arrives with 10,000 tons bulk Wheat from Holland, and our regular Soda Ash loader, the Lady of Lorne, which invariably arrives in ballast condition, is this time importing 12,000 tons maize from Thailand thereafter she will back load Soda Ash.

The Turret moved this week from "T" anchorage to Mtongwe. She was originally one of the Manta Line fleet salvaged by Murri Freres.

Whilst on the subject of salvage I understand Bison 1 proceeded to Madagascar last

Friday to aid a stricken Ro Ro vessel which had suffered a mishap; I have received no further news at time of writing.

The two Manta line vessels Copper Trader and Franky are still awaiting tow across the Indian Ocean, meantime they continue to remain under arrest by the Port Authority.

It is unusual to see a Lebanese vessel in port, I am referring to the 23 year old Sunshine, a bright cheerful name for a ship, which name for a ship, which completed discharging 800 tons of general cargo at No. 2 berth before moving round to Mbaraki Wharf to load cement for the Red Sea. This Beirut registered vessel has a gross tonnage of 2600 and deadweight of 3600 tons.

An equally old ship is the small Dutch Shell tanker Acteon a regular discharger, which has been alongside Shimanzi Oil Jetty this week discharging refined oil products. She had arrived from the Seychelles and sailed for Djibouti.

The 4 year old Singapore registered tanker Viking Snipe, the owner must be an ornithologist; arrived on Wednesday to discharge 50,000 tons crude oil from the Gulf.

The 23 year old Panamanian bulk carrier MIA remains firmly at "V" anchorage. I have little information about her but I believe she had come down from Mogadiscio and was calling at Mombasa for bunkers and water which seems to be taking somewhat longer than expected.

Some years ago vessels of the National Shipping Line of Pakistan used to be regular callers when they operated a liner service to the United States; probably many readers will remember the serious fire and subsequent constructive total loss of the Chenab in Kilindini.

The Aziz Bhatti built in 1966 also used to call at Kilindini so it was quite like old times to see her last weekend when the 9,400 gross ton vessel made a brief call to discharge 500 tons Rice given to Kenya for the drought stricken areas by the people of the Republic of Pakistan - a generous gesture. The vessel sailed from Mombasa on Monday afternoon.

That morning I also watched the cattle carrier Egeon sailing for the Arabian Gulf with her 850 head of cattle on board. She arrived on the October 9 and berthed at No. 14 on the 11th.

Mombasa has always been a popular focal point for transhipment of fish from Taiwanese/Korean catcher boats to mother vessels. On Tuesday the catcher boats Daewang No. 7 and Pescamar No. 8 are due to tranship their fish to the Shinbungo Maru.

The Tanzania Harbour Authority tug Mamba was due Mombasa on Wednesday of this week towing the T.H.A. heavy lift (Jumbo) crane for survey and dry docking at African Marine drydock.

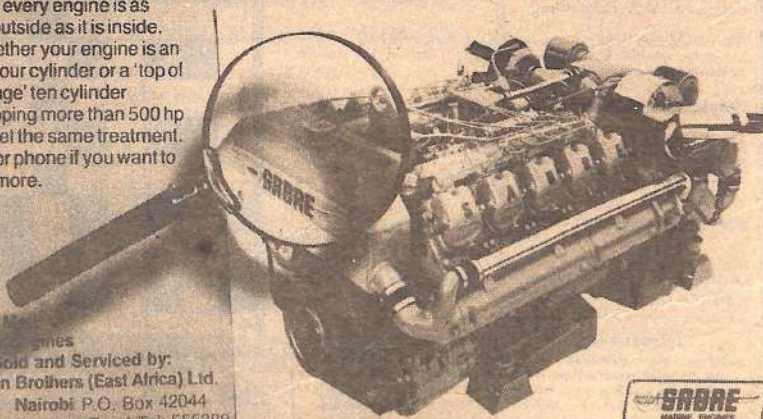

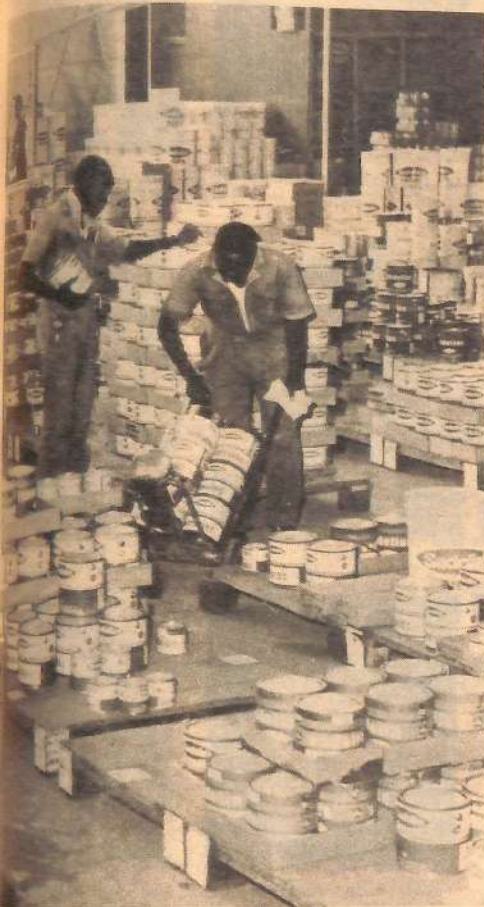

OVER 200 years ago saw the beginning of the Sadolin Group when dyer Jacob Holmblad was granted royal permission, to establish a textile dye plant in Copenhagen. He was not only an initiator but an experimenter and his efforts over the years were continued by his son, Lauritz Holmblad, who founded the first real paint factory in Denmark in 1819.

During the 19th century, under the guidance of the Holmblad third generation, Carl Frederic Holmblad, the production of paints was expanded to include all types of oil paint and distemper together with precipitate mineral dyes.

In addition, the painter's own previous primitive grinding was replaced by industrial production of paint.

Carl Holmblad's son, in turn, established a lacquer factory and a varnish factory.

Thus, from 1877 to 1893 the Holmblad family had developed one of the leading paint companies in Scandinavia.

Whereas Holmblad's started with textile dyeing, the Sadolin family began with artistic colours. In 1907, Mr Gunner A. Sadolin's paint factory was founded, establishing Sadolins Farver which produced artists colours. He had studied the composition and chemistry of paints and developed a method for producing wax colours.

Danish industrialists thought his products promising and supported the company and in 1909 Sadolins Farver was transformed into a limited company and the manufacture of printing inks was started.

At this stage the Sadolin and Holmblad organisations began comparing notes as their interests were in many ways

overlapping. Accordingly the two companies merged and in 1912 the company of Sadolin & Holmblad Limited was formed.

During the 1914-18 war the company turned its attention to the specialised paints required by the armed forces, particularly the navy and the production of anticorrosive paint and marine paint was started, and more and more specialisation continued.

DANISH PAINTS

1919, production of oil colours was introduced and in 1925, as the first Danish paint and varnish company to do so Sadolin & Holmblad pioneered the manufacture of nitrocellulose lacquers.

Experimentation was now at

an increasingly sophisticated level and in 1931, Sadolin & Holmblad established its own central laboratory to carry out research and production development.

With such a rapidly developing industry Sadolin & Holmblad found themselves in something of a quandary. They had the ability to undertake large-scale production of an increasing range of paint products backed by considerable technical expertise but with only a modern home market to supply. It could be said that their success had overtaken their potential in Denmark.

The solution of course was exportation, and by the beginning of the Second World War in 1939, Sadolin & Holmblad had set up a network of sales

organisations covering no less than forty countries. By this time production of raw materials had increased substantially.

After the Second World War, Denmark gained international placing as the world's second largest exporter of paints and by 1976 Sadolin products were on sale in ninety-seven countries.

MIDDLE EAST

An international division had been established and the company continued its marketing through the establishment of companies in Europe, Africa, the Middle and Far East.

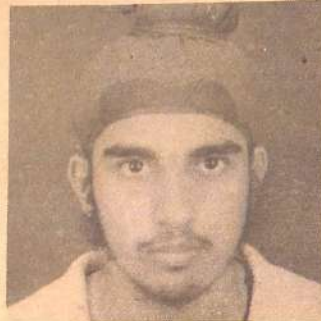

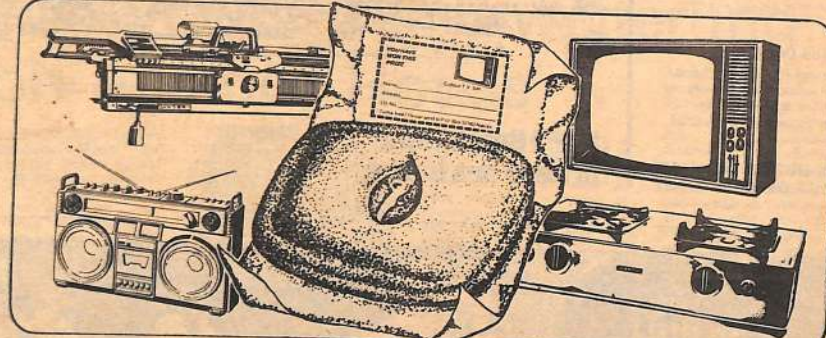
Those very few bandits remaining should surely come out and join others in our national development efforts.

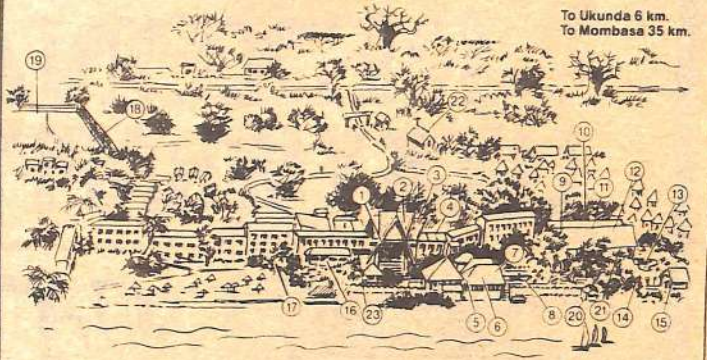

Es bietet unter anderem zwei VIP-Suiten, einen Konferenzraum mit Sitzplätzen für 300 Personen, einen Gesundheits-Club, klimatisierte Squash- und Tennisplätze. In vier verschiedenen Räumen wird Essen serviert.

Alle Zimmer liegen auf der Meeresseite und sind mit T.V. und Video ausgerüstet. Von der SnackBar mit Barbecue-Buffer hat man eine phantastische Sicht auf den Strand und das Meer.

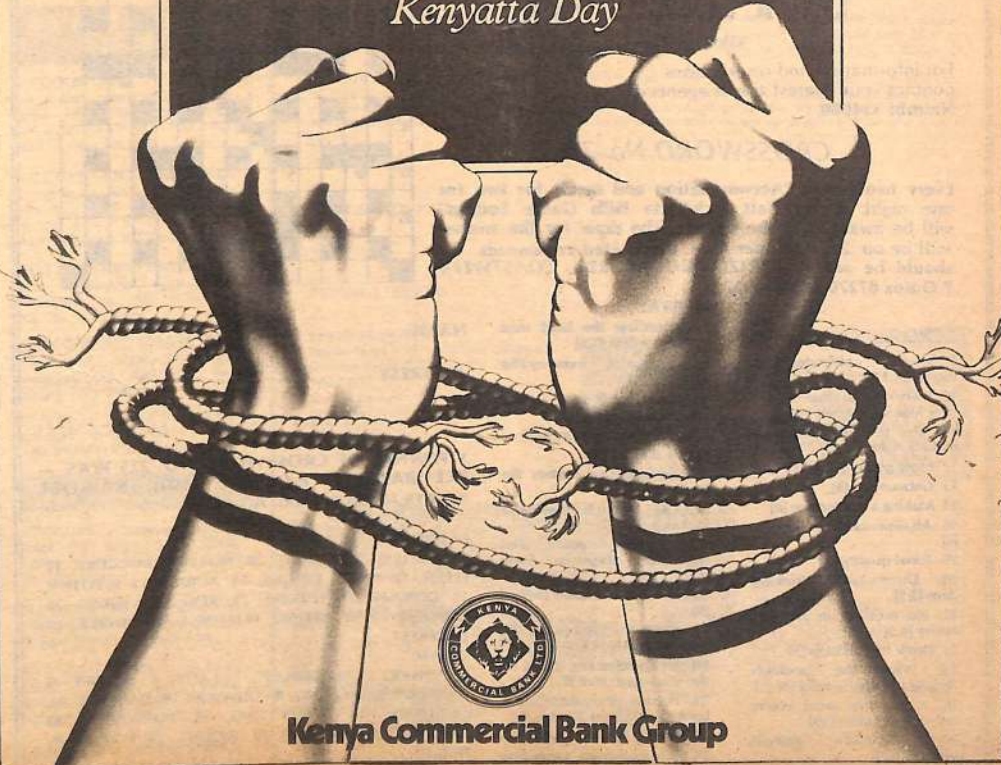

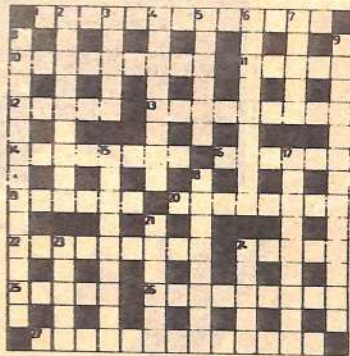

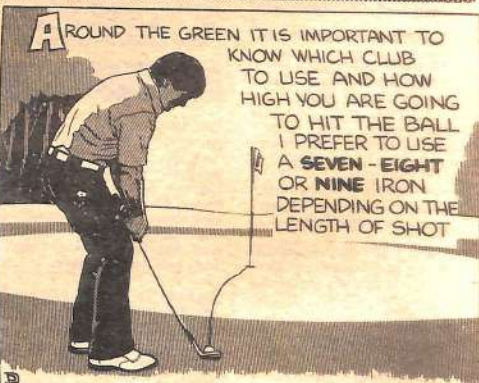
