



lights which further enhanced the occasion.





We must stop thinking this way Consider what happens when things go wrong.

One could be frightened, injured, seriously injured, maimed, disabled or killed as a result of not having said or done what we should have done or said in the first place.

When in a motor vehicle in whatever capacity, your chances of getting to the end of the journey unscathed will depend on how you conduct yourself.

As a passenger in a motor vehicle one must first of all be comfortable that the vehicle they are about to travel in is safe.

This does not call for major interrogation of issues: One has to do very simple

Go round the vehicle and have

a look at the tyres. If they are all in reasonable condition then that is the first

Go the extra mile and ask the

mainly for pressure but also the condition.

If this is so and the driver can allow you to verify then this is another plus.

In going round the motor vehicle also check that the lights "appear" to be in good condition and that all bulbs are in place and the light

Also check that the wing mirrors re intact and look to be adjusted

If they are commend the driver of the vehicle for that then proceed to ask them whether they have gone the extra mile and checked whether they all actually work.

offer to help verify their condition by standing outside the vehicle as the driver tests the headlights, indicators and reversing lights.

Another tell tale sign is the condition of the paintwork.

As a driver of a vehicle, remember that you have a big responsibility for the lives of the people in your vehicle and others who are in other vehicles on the road.

You also have

You also have a responsibility to pedestrians, cyclists, animals and other users of the road - whether they are there legally or not

A driver cannot decide that and has to assume that whoever is on the road is there by right or by exception and deal with the consequences.

A driver has also to carry out all the same checks that I have detailed above for a passenger.

In addition, the driver has to check themselves and be sure that they are in a fit state to be in charge of the vehicle.

Has one had enough sleep? is one fully sober and free of drugs, including excess of items like caffeine?

Is one fully physically fit to drive - hands, feet and head?

The list is not short.

The other key thing to a safe journey is to ensure that one plans the route to minimise the exposure to hazards and heavy

Not only should one plan the route but one should also determine which is the best time

This way one can cover a significant distance before the roads get busy.

Night driving should be avoided at all costs especially when one is driving between two urban

Our roads are littered with broken down vehicles, potnoles and other hazards that could easily turn what would be a standard drive into a fatal accident.

Accident.

Not many drivers have the skills to drive at night and many are also not aware of their own physical limitations to night driving and especially the issue of night vision or lack of it.

of night vision or lack of it.

correct mind set AND retain it for the future.

We were towed back to the club and once ashore we must have emptied 200kgs of water from the


