# Mabati Rolling Mills Sponsors Medical Camp At Mariakani

The Lions Club of Mombasa Pwani in keeping with the Lions motto of "We Serve" organized a very successful medical camp at the Mabati Medical Centre in Mariakani on 7<sup>th</sup> September 2014.

This camp has been an annual event in the calendar of this club for the last 13 years as the club strives to be in the forefront in assisting and helping the less fortunate members of the society.

Mariakani, which is now part of Kilifi county, and its surrounding environs is a hardship area. The area is dry with little agriculture potential due to lack of facilities.

Most of the population have to travel long distances to get access to basic healthcare facilities, food and water.

It has therefore become an annual event in the calendar of this club to hold this medical camp.

A lot of awareness about the camp was created beforehand within the population of that area.

And by 8am in the morning, despite the heavy downpour, long queues were witnessed at the registration desk.

Special tents were set up within the premises to cater for the large number of patients so that they could benefit from the different services offered.

The services offered at the camp this year consisted of many different disciplines including Eye (which is part of the Outreach programme carried out by Lions Club of Mombasa Pwani), Dental, ENT, General Medical camp and Ultrasound facilities.

Blood sugar and diabetes screening was also done. After the screening and treatment all patients were given medications free of cost.

A total of 1321 patients were screened in different disciplines:-  
 • There were 359 eye patients screened. Out of these, 22 patients were found with cataracts.

These patients were immediately transported at the end of the camp to the Lions Medical Centre where they were operated on, accommodated and provided food, given medicines and later transported back to their homes with all these costs

catered for by Lions Club of Mombasa Pwani (LCMP).

One of the patients was a 3 month old baby with Congenital bilateral cataracts.

This patient was attended to and operated on by our specialist eye surgeon Dr. Vishvanatha Gokhale and his team

- 164 Dental patients were screened, 43 tooth extractions were carried out.
- 108 ENT patients were screened and treated
- 601 general patients were seen and given treatment.

The 5 most common ailments that were found were Upper respiratory tract infections, Anaemia, Skin infections, Peptic Ulcer disease and Hypertension.

The rest of the patients were treated for other ailments like Worm infestations, diarrhoea and Malnutrition in Children.

• 18 ultrasound scans were done and this included patients with abdominal complaints and Pregnant mothers.

This service was introduced for the first time last year.

• 69 patients were done Diabetes and Blood sugar screening

Many of the patients had

multiple ailments and the total number of consultations was far above the number of patients screened.

The Club president, Lion (Dr) Sundeep Chavda expressed his sincere gratitude to the Camp Convener Lion (Dr) Adil Gulam, all donors, fellow Lions, Lion ladies and the volunteers who contributed towards this successful activity.

He also appreciated the effort put in by the entire team of

medical personnel who worked tirelessly to ensure success of this activity.

Similarly he was grateful to PDG Lion Dhirubhai Shah and the entire Board of Management and Staff of Mabati Rolling Mills for hosting this camp and their generous donation of Kshs 300,000 towards this noble activity.

Lion Dhirubhai also pledged that Mabati Rolling Mills will continue to sponsor this event

annually for many more years to come. The sponsors then hosted the entire Lions membership together with the volunteers for a sumptuous lunch at the end of the medical camp.

## Mombasa Will Benefit From Economic Zone And Private Investors

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** -- Kenya Cabinet has kicked off bid to attract more foreign investors by approving a memorandum on the revised Special Economic Zones (SEZs) Bill.

A statement issued in Nairobi following a cabinet meeting chaired by President Uhuru Kenyatta said the development of a Free Trade Zone (FTZ), the first of its kind in Sub Sahara Africa, will attract industrial and business activities, propelling the country to a regional trade power-house.

"Setting up of the zones will be used as a tool to promote industrialization, private investment, employment creation, and growth of export diversification by offering high-quality infrastructure and streamlined business processes through a one-stop-shop and incentives to SEZ businesses," the statement said.

The Ministry of Industrialization and Enterprise Development said recently a feasibility study will provide a roadmap towards the establishment of a Free Trade Zone as envisaged in the country's Vision 2030 National Development Plan.

The East African nation has set aside 3,400 square kilometers of land to be used for development of free trade zones.

The land will be in three regions; the lake side city of Kisumu and coastal regions of Lamu and Mombasa.

The largest chunk of that will be in Mombasa which measures 2,000 square kilometers, while Lamu and Kisumu measure 700 square kilometers each.

The Mombasa FTZ will facilitate importation of necessary raw materials and exporting of finished goods.

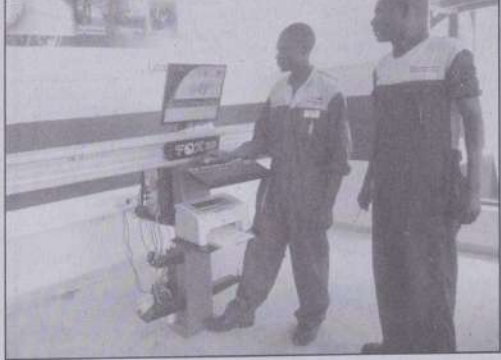
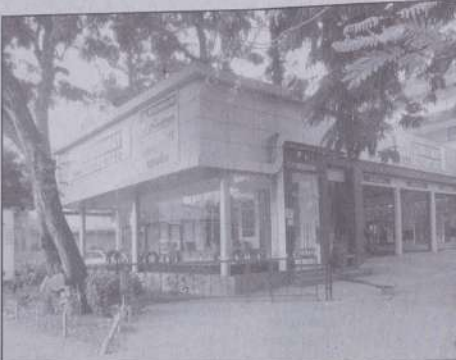
It will include an agro-industrial zone incorporating activities such as blending and packaging of fertilizers, teas and coffees, and a consolidated meat and fish processing facility to encourage growth of offshore fishing, according to the Kenya Vision 2030 blueprint.

According to the cabinet, activities under the Special Economic Zones program will include manufacturing, processing, assembly, mixing, beneficiation and fabrication; services and logistics; warehousing, handling and storage of goods; clearing and forwarding; and bulk breaking.

FTZs has the potential to be developed, whether on a public, private or public-private partnership basis, and any goods introduced and specified services provided are regarded as import duties.

Tax incentives are meant to attract foreign investors, enabling the country increase its attraction to foreign direct investment and benefit from skills transfer from foreign companies setting bases here.

## EAST AFRICAN COUNTRIES PLAN TO LAUNCH COMMON TRAVEL VISA DOCUMENTS

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** -- Kenya will join Uganda and Rwanda to launch the East Africa Visa during this year's Japan Association of Travel Agents (JATA) Tourism Expo to be held later this week, tourism marketers said on Monday.

Kenya Tourism Board (KTB) Managing Director Muriithi Ndegwa said the KTB is seeking to increase Kenya's market share by

continuously positioning the country as the ideal tourism destination in Africa, however, lack of a regional common visa has been a major drawback towards marketing East Africa as a single tourist destination.

"Japan has tremendous growth potential given that 16.5 million Japanese engage in outbound travel annually," Ndegwa said, adding the KTB will be exhibiting at the Expo.

Foreign tour operators have complained of cumbersome immigration procedures at border entry points for those who wish to cover various circuits in East Africa.

In particular, the requirement for tourists to disembark from Kenya tour vehicles to board the Tanzanian vehicles while crossing into Tanzania has been a major complaint by the international and local tour operators.

Kenya allows tour vehicles from the East African Community (EAC) to operate in the country.

Previously, foreign tourists visiting EAC countries are required to stamp their passports in each EAC country visited.

The EAC is also in the final stages of implementing a single visa for the five member states.

## Mombasa Clearing Companies Protest Introduction Of Single Custom Territory

**FROM FRONT PAGE** Association (KIFWA) has called for a review of the system to salvage clearing firms in the country from incurring further losses.

According to KIFWA, about 500 Kenyan companies have already been affected with coming in of the SCT, which became operational in January.

KIFWA National chairman Boaz Makomere blamed the Kenyan government for failing to protect the 1,200 clearing firms in the country.

"The government is losing revenue to the neighboring countries after the partner states introduced tariff barriers that are hindering Kenya's clearing agents to be able to access documents for transit cargo," Makomere told journalists in Mombasa.

"The state has failed to protect our jobs. We are losing business that will have ripple effect on the on revenue collection and laying off of workers employed in clearing firms," he added.

The system launched by Kenya, Rwanda and Uganda allows hinterland states to use the Mombasa port to collect customs duty at the entry point.

Under the new regulation, Uganda, Rwanda and South Sudan among other countries have positioned customs officials at the port.

Under SCT arrangement, once goods are cleared at the port of entry, they are not to be subjected

to further customs procedures at border posts within the SCT.

This reduces delays and eliminates associated costs, which KIFWA had perennially complained about.

The system requires customs and clearing agents of the partner countries to be based in Mombasa.

However, the freight agencies said Kenyan transporters will lose business while dozens of Kenyans employed directly in the transit trade and transport service sector will lose jobs.

The neighboring countries are now said to allocate their own clearing agents to clear cargo at the port of Mombasa, locking out Kenyan freight forwarders.

The association is now appealing on the government to hold talks with all stakeholders to avert looming crisis that might affect operations at the port of Mombasa.

The introduction of SCT was aimed at developing a bilateral framework, which seeks to fast-track different initiatives agreed upon under the auspices of the East African Community (EAC).

Once implemented, the initiative is expected to eradicate barriers to trade by adopting a central model of clearance of goods, whereby tax clearance and inspection will be done only at the point of entry.

# Draconian Measures Sometimes More Than Necessary To Maintain Road Safety In Kenya

We are happy that there are many efforts to improve road safety in the country.

The focus on cities is forgivable as the logical thinking is that the largest number of drivers live there so the biggest impact can be made in those areas.

However, when it comes to the issue of where the biggest risks lie in terms of outcomes then it must surely be away from the cities.

Our reality is that a disproportionate number of road related fatalities happen outside of the major conurbations despite the fact that the road using population in those areas is low.

However, the amount of transit traffic bumps up the volume of usage of roads in non-urban areas.

It is here that I believe the National Transport and Safety Authority or NTSA should invest more.

What we currently have as a compliance enforcement agency is a dilapidated and underpaid traffic police force who spend most of their time looking to raise money for their own pockets.

There are a few honest cops that stick to their role religiously even in the face of motorists

who have, in a reversal of roles, now come to demand that cops accept bribes so that the miscreant driver can dispense with the inconvenience of the law and get on with their life.

We motorists now drive around with the expectation that should we break the law there will always be the opportunity to pay our way out of it.

We are the ones now offering the bribe instead of what used to be where the boys in blue would demand the payment.

aspects of road safety that should quickly bring results.

However, as I started off by saying, it seems everything is centred around our major urban areas (all four of them!) and even then only half heartedly.

Let us start with the infamous alcoblow or breath alcohol testing devices.

These came in with much fanfare, especially since their earlier use had been suspended due to a court ruling on how they came to be deployed.

This time round the legal loopholes were closed. What the NTSA bods did not reckon with is the challenge that connectivity and social media would bring.

Social anti alcoblow networks were quickly set up and drivers were able to rapidly disseminate the locations where alcoblow testing was being carried out on the roads.

Drivers in the network would then know how to behave or what to do.

Over time the effectiveness of this campaign (and that is all it has turned out to be) is now questionable.

Yes, it has led to some more responsible drinking but it is only a matter of time before complacency sets in and people go back to their bad habits.

The reality is also that the use of this deterrent technology was only really concentrated in the major cities and mainly Nairobi.

Upcountry areas have only had the occasional visit by the agency and probably on demonstration visits rather than for implementation and training.

My take is that the alcoblow phenomenon is now more a talked about item rather than one that people feel seriously threatened by.

The shock tactics have dissipated and something different needs to be done.

I propose that our enforcement agency implements a system whereby a driver accumulates points for every infringement of driving law - speeding, driving defective vehicles, driving under the influence of drugs (including alcohol), having an accident (with more points for more severe accidents) and so forth.

These points would hold for five years and should one cross a certain threshold then the driving license is withdrawn.

### PENALTY OF LONG SUSPENSION

Re-instatement of a driving license should be only be done when the driver has served time and also been through refresher training and passed an exam on all that they need to know about driving and based on first principles.

Such drivers should also be required to drive around with a large sign (suggest the colour pink) that tells road users that they have been naughty and are just now getting back into driving.

This should be a portable one that they display in any car they are driving and under penalty of a longer suspension should they be found driving and not displaying the sign.

As Kachumbari says, Draconian measures are sometimes necessary.

If we are to see a bigger impact on road safety than I propose that the NTSA and traffic police should merge into one authority that has the combined powers of the two.

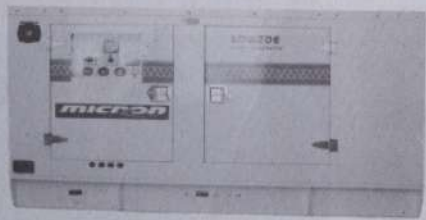
This would mean that the one authority will be able to lead in making the appropriate or necessary legislation, do the education of the population (and I hate the phrase "capacity building" with a passion), implement preventive interventions, check compliance and also arrest and prosecute as necessary.

The same NTSA would also set driver training standards, regulate vehicle licensing as well as set national standards on road architecture as well as technology.

# Extended Period Of Unprecedented Growth Affects Mombasa Port Productivity - Report

Kenya Ports Authority is in receipt of a letter from the Kenya Ships Agents Association raising concerns over poor port productivity experienced in the last three Months. A KPA Corporate Affairs Department spokesman commented:

"The concerns which were also raised during the weekly Friday stake holders meeting are well noted and every effort is being taken jointly with the stakeholders to address them. "However, we have reliably learnt that a copy of this letter is in the hands of a section of the media. "In this regard therefore we wish to state the position as follows:

**Low Port Productivity;**  
The port has been experiencing unprecedented growth in cargo volumes since the beginning of this year, with highest growth recorded in the Months of June and July.

Total cargo throughput registered a growth of 12.8 per cent having handled 11.9 million tons up from 10.5 million tons handled in the same period 2013.

Container traffic realized a growth rate of 11.5 per cent reaching 463,807 TEUs compared to 415,948 TEUs registered during the same period in 2013.

At the same time there were 25 ship calls at the container terminal in the Months of June/July compared to 11 handled in the same period in 2013.

This was due to an increase in the number of unscheduled vessels calling the port by some shipping lines such as the CMA-CGM line which increased by 14 vessels.

Transshipment traffic for the last six months also grew by 122 per cent which is way above the projected 12 per cent.

While we welcome this good port business, it is unfortunate that it has coincided with the ongoing rehabilitation of our existing infrastructure at the container terminal yards.

expansion of exit gates and adjacent roads.

On the other hand, the port's berth capacity was reduced when Berth No. 8 was withdrawn from normal shipping operation for nearly two months from 4th July to 29th August 2014 when it was occupied by the drug suspect vessel M.V. Amin Darya (aka Alnoor).

Although temporary, these have interfered with our yard planning and slowed down our operations.

It is also important to note that, the entire Coastal region is currently experiencing long rains and the port is not spared

leading to interference of ship operations.

Consequently some vessels have been adversely affected causing their long stay in the port.

**Measures taken to address the above issues:**

During the September 05 Friday stake holders meeting the issue was extensively discussed and the following measures were agreed.

A separate meeting has been scheduled between KPA and the shipping Lines to address the arrangement of Fixed Berthing Window operations.

This will entail signing of Service Level Agreements.

Major works on the yards suspended to allow clearance of the vessel backlog.

Review of targets between the Union and Management with the view to improving productivity.

All vessels carrying over 3,000 TEUs to be planned at Berth No.18 for faster operations.

Restrictions in the number of empty containers handled by each vessel

Kenya Ports Authority regrets the inconvenience caused to its esteemed customers during this period.

"We wish to assure all port users that upon implementation of the above measures port operations are expected to normalise before the end of this Month.

So far fluidity is slowly returning back to normality and by the morning of September 05 there were only three ships waiting, which were expected to go to berth by the next day September 06, while the container population in the yard was only 12000TEUs against a capacity of 23,000 TEUs.

## RIFT VALLEY RAILWAYS FIND FUNDING FOR LOCOS REHAB

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Rift Valley Railways (RVR), which operates the Kenya-Uganda railway, has secured U.S. \$20 million dollars asset financing deal with two banks to help it acquire 20 locomotives from the U.S.**

The RVR said the funds from the Standard Bank of South Africa and CFC Stanbic Bank is part of the wagon rehabilitation in Nairobi and Kampala. RVR's group CEO Carlos Andrade said insufficient locomotive power is the single biggest obstacle preventing a step change in the amount of volumes they transport.

"This new financing not only clears this bottleneck but is also a vote of confidence by a major international lender in our operations as it is premised on revenues to be generated by the trains," Andrade said in a statement issued in Nairobi.

Under the deal, Standard Bank will be providing 20 million dollars or 80 percent of the price, while RVR will provide the remainder of the 25 million dollars total amount.

The railway runs from Mombasa to the Ugandan city of Jinja, but years of neglect and under investment have made the railway to be inefficient. The railway line serves Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi and eastern Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) ferrying their imports that come through the Port of Mombasa.

Since the start of the investment and turnaround program in January 2012, RVR has completed the rehabilitation of 73 kilometers of railway track between Mombasa and Nairobi.

## EU Navy Frigate ESPS 'Navarra' Assisting Yacht In Gulf Of Aden

**EThe EU Naval Force frigate, ESPS Navarra, has come to the assistance of a stricken yacht in the Gulf of Aden.**

The yacht had been detected midweek on the warship's radar in the early morning. ESPS Navarra's Bridge team initially tried to hail the yacht via their VHF radio.

After several attempts a member of the crew finally answered the call.

He said that they were running very short on water and fuel, but still had some distance to travel in to the Indian Ocean.

This is the second time that the Spanish frigate has helped a yacht that has gotten into difficulties in less than two months.

ESPS Navarra's Boarding Team was tasked by their commanding officer to launch and provide the much-needed water and fuel.

The Spanish crew then invited the master of the yacht to re-consider his route so that he would avoid sailing into waters where the piracy threat is still considered to be present.

The present combined threat assessment of International Naval counter-piracy forces is that all sailing yachts under their own passage should remain out of the High Risk Area (HRA) or face the

risk of being hijacked and held hostage for ransom.

Yachts remain extremely vulnerable to attack.

## ZANZIBAR AND COMOROS PACT ON MARITIME TRANSPORT

**DAR ES SALAAM (Xinhua) -- Zanzibar and the Comoros have agreed to strengthen cooperation in a number of areas, including maritime transport, education and fisheries, said Zanzibar's State House in a statement.**

The statement was issued at the end of Zanzibar President Ali Mohamed Shein's four-day tour of the Comoros on Thursday.

The two Indian Ocean Islands have also

agreed to cooperate in health, information and culture, tourism, agriculture, trade and commerce, and religion.

The statement said a memorandum of understanding (MoU) on the cooperation was signed by Shein and the President of the Comoros, Dhoinine Ikililou, who pledged full implementation of the cooperation.

The two leaders expressed their readiness to see to it that the signed MoU was fully implemented without delay.

Shein said: "I am happy to see the MoU provided for a joint implementation committee comprising members from both countries which would be responsible to oversee the implementation of agreed programs under it."

He said the great challenge facing the two governments now was the implementation of the MoU in order to fulfill people's hopes and aspirations as they have high hope on this cooperation.

## Combined Maritime Forces Warship And Aircraft Seize U.S. \$130 Million Dollar Hashish Haul Off Somalia Coast

A Royal Australian Navy warship operating under command of Pakistan Navy-led Combined Task Force 150 (CTF-150), part of the Combined Maritime Forces (CMF), supported by a Royal New Zealand Air Force (RNZAF) maritime patrol aircraft, have co-ordinated their efforts this week to strike a blow against hashish traffickers off the coast of Somalia to the tune of \$280 million (AUD) (U.S. \$130 million dollars).

The Anzac-class frigate HMAS Toowoomba and the RNZAF P-3K2 Orion aircraft trailed a dhow from the Arabian Sea to the Horn of Africa.

After four days of inclement weather, the crew of HMAS Toowoomba were able to board the dhow and, after an exhaustive search, the ship's boarding team discovered 5588kgs of hashish in hessian bags.

Commander Cath Hayes, the commanding officer of HMAS Toowoomba, praised her team and her colleagues in CMF:

"I am proud of the tenacity and hard work displayed by the Toowoomba team to intercept and board the dhow in challenging weather conditions before executing an extensive search of the vessel to locate the elaborately concealed drugs."

She added: "This is a great result for the ship and our Pakistan Navy colleagues at CTF-150 who led the operation."

HMAS Toowoomba's boarding officer, Lieutenant Stefan Stuart, said the drugs were well hidden and, once found, were extremely difficult to access and remove.

He said, "It is great to make an intercept of this magnitude."

"The weather was not on our side but our training and our persistence paid off."

HMAS Toowoomba was operating under the command of CTF-150, the CMF Task Group responsible for promoting safety and security at sea, and the RNZAF P-3K2 Orion aircraft is deployed in support of the international counter-piracy effort.

CTF-150, currently commanded by Commodore Sajid Mahmood of the Pakistan Navy, is an international task force charged with conducting maritime security operations to deny

terrorists the use of the seas as a venue for attack or to transport personnel, weapons, or other illicit material.

This is the first successful counter-narcotics interdiction operation for CTF-150 since the Pakistan Navy took command of maritime security and counter-terrorism mission on 14 August.

Commodore Sajid said, "I am incredibly proud of the sailors and airmen involved in this complicated operation."

"CTF-150 has a long history of disrupting narcotics trafficking in the region and Toowoomba, with the support of 5 Squadron of the RNZAF, have carried this on. Keep up the good work!"

## Vehicles Belonging To 'Untouchable Millionaires' Drive Contraband Goods Into Kenya From Somalia

WJAJR (Xinhua) -- Security officers in Wajir County of northern Kenya have seized contraband sugar worth U.S. \$23,000 U.S. dollars, which believed to have been smuggled into the country from the neighboring Somalia.

Wajir North Deputy Sub-County Commissioner Benjamin Nzioka told Xinhua that the officers manning Bambaa road block along Takaba-Moyale road, intercepted a truck, which was ferrying the sugar from neighboring Somalia through Elwak border and destined for Moyale markets in Kenya.

Nzioka said there were some 400 bags of sugar, with each weighing 50kgs.

And the truck driver and his tout were also arrested.

Wajir County Police Commander David Kirui said the two will be arraigned at Moyale court to face charges of being in possession of unaccustomed goods.

Smuggling of sugar has been rampant along the Kenya-Somalia border since the fall of Siad Barre's

regime in the 1990s.

It has created an "untouchable" community of millionaires, mainly Kenyan Somali traders, who are protected by a ragtag army in their trade deals.

Kenya produces 500,000 metric tonnes of sugar annually, while the consumption is about 800,000 metric tonnes, leaving a shortfall of 300,000 metric tonnes, which is supposed to be imported from the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (Comesa) region.

Markets in northern are flooded with contraband goods smuggled into the country from neighboring countries.

About 70 percent of the goods in the markets are not of Kenyan brand.

It is in public domain that the contraband goods, smuggled from neighboring countries and flooded at the local markets are part of 'al-Shabaab'-run business.

The business is also believed to be a key income for the terror group after African Union peace keeping mission in Somalia (AMISOM) flushed out the militants from Somalia's coastal line.

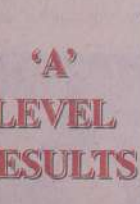

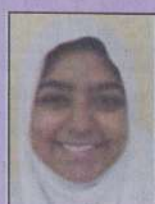

# Why Not Borrow A Leaf From China To Excel In Chess Says Ex-Kenya Chairman Stanley Luruti

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) --** With the visit to Kenya by former grandmaster of chess Gary Kasparov in July, it is perhaps an opportune time to look inward and assess the level of the game in the country.

Russia dominated the game of the kings during the last century but tables have since turned with other countries having since eaten into their turf.

Is it a far-fetched dream that a Kenyan may one day feature in at least a championship elimination stage?

"Given what it took in effort and time to get the chess standards to the level they are at in Russia and other Western countries, this may be a long shot," former Kenya Chess Association chairman Stanley Luruti said.

"Chess in Russia and most of the West is very much part of the ordinary life and

professional sport where everyone plays the game," Luruti told Xinhua in Nairobi.

At the competitive level the game is run and managed either directly by government agencies or well funded associations.

Even more, the talented youth are committed to dedicated chess schools like the renowned Botvink School of Chess of which Kasparov is a product of.

Besides, leading chess players in Russia are supported by the government which not only provides an income, but also sponsors their participation in overseas tournaments.

Chess in Kenya is neither a household game nor is the playing elite large enough to be said to represent all possibly talented players.

Funding and sponsorship of chess activities is lacking and is nowhere comparable to those of the West, nor does the Kenya Chess Association seem to be committed to spreading the game beyond Nairobi.

Further, the more pseudo scientific nature of the game means that even the talented players would have to go through a nurturing process with instructors and stiff competition to develop and

perfect the skill of play. Instruction is the other relative disadvantage facing aspiring Kenyan chess players.

Chess skills are much like science or art and the better skilled person will inevitably have a better insight than the persons with mere knowledge and interest in the game.

So what is the answer to developing chess in Kenya?

"China may offer a solution." "The last two decades has seen China almost totally dominate the women's game and holds all the women's chess titles in the world," Luruti said.

World women's champion Hou Yifan, from Beijing, has been honing her skills since she was five years old and is the youngest person ever to win the female title.

Xie Jun, immediate former champion, is also from China and so are most of the top ten women players.

The Chinese men's team

defeated Poland at the Chess Olympiad in July, and their miracle is a possible route for Kenya if the country is serious enough to take the game to the next level.

The Chinese achieved that through rigorous promotion of the game in schools, institutions and among the playing fraternity.

The program, enforced with talent searches and training for selected persons saw China, just like Russia establish a successful youth program, where play in international competitions for top players at all levels of the game ensures exposure of their top players to international competitions.

Githinji Hinga, current chairman of the Kenya Chess Association, says there are about 30 chess clubs in the country, with the number of active players numbering over 20,000.

About 5,000 players are registered on chess.com where they play the game on line.

## Kenya To Establish A Digital University

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) --** Kenya has established supportive infrastructure and hired skilled personnel to set up a digital university that will have satellite centers in all counties, officials have said.

Principal Secretary for Education Belio Kipsang said the proposed National Open University of Kenya will utilize digital platforms to expand access to higher education among the youth.

"The proposed university will be dedicated to an open, distance and e-learning mode of delivery.

The government has invested in the information and communications technology (ICTs) to scale up e-learning," said Kipsang.

The ministry of education had earlier formed a taskforce to look into the viability of a digital university.

Taskforce members noted that Kenya had adequate infrastructure and human capital to facilitate the establishment of a virtual university.

According to Kipsang, the digital university will ensure a critical mass of citizens have access to affordable and convenient higher education.

"The government will provide financial, institutional, infrastructural and human resources to the proposed institution once it is approved by cabinet," Kipsang told reporters.

Demand for higher education among Kenya's youth has exerted pressure on learning

facilities and human capital. Kipsang noted that Kenya has one of the highest population of youth enrolled in tertiary institutions in Sub-Saharan Africa.

"The traditional model of learning has failed to cope with a high number of students seeking higher education.

"The open university model will address this bottleneck," Kipsang said, adding that the digital university will be open to school leavers and adult learners employed in the public and private sectors.

Regulators have established guidelines to ensure the digital university offer quality and marketable courses, which will include engineering, business, medicine and liberal arts.

Declarer, however, was not the innocent victim of a brilliant double.

If he had played a low Spade from Dummy at trick One, the opponents could have made only Two tricks in Spades and Declarer could have made his contract.

Bombers should have equalized in the injury time when they were awarded a penalty by the referee following an infringement inside the box but Fredrick Ochieng wasted the spot-kick.

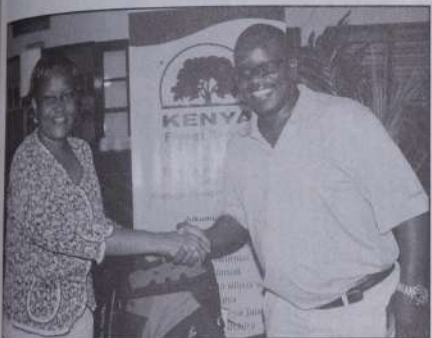
