In the year 2008, American sports agent J. B. Bernstein, who has had a very successful stint in the past, is struggling with his partner Ash Vasudevan to sign on new talent.

Their new company is almost on its knees with creditors lining outside their doors and not one new signing that they can bag to get a start.

An Asian businessman who has oodles of money is looking to invest in Asian-based athletes

which gives the two even more impetus to get a new signing.

When their last possible big signing bottoms out they are now faced with closing their business.

Ash, who is of Indian origin had been trying to show JB the similarities between cricket, which is not just a sport but a movement in India and American baseball, which has no less of a following in the USA.

So one night as JB is flicking television channels between Britain's Got Talent and a cricket match, an idea hits him like a thunderbolt.

What if they got just two Indian cricketers who could bowl fast and accurately and they would then develop them as major league baseball pitchers in the States?

Convincing Ash and then Chang who buys the idea, they are given a year to deliver these superstars in front of talent scouts who would then make their selections.

A plan is set into place to set up base in Mumbai through a local agent and they would then advertise and go hunting through cities, towns and even villages.

Calling it the Million Dollar Arm Competition, in which the winner gets the prize of 100,000 Dollars plus a fully paid trip to the USA,

The culture and social shock of America takes a while for the boys, who have travelled with an Indian wannabe coach as their translator, to adjust.

Leading the star cast are Jon Hamm as JB, Aasif Mandvi as Ash, India's Suraj Sharma (last seen in *Life of Pi*) is Rinku Singh, Britain's Madhur Mittal (last seen in *Slumdog Millionaire* as Salim Malik), Bill Paxton as coach Tom House, Alan Arkin as the sports scout Ray Poitvint who travels to India, Pitobash Tripathy as the baseball fanatic Amit Rohan who is hired by JB to travel with the boys as their handler and translator, Darshan Jariwala is their Indian agent and guide.

Indian maestro A. R. Rahman has composed the soundtrack for this film.

Idris Elba, Taraji P. Henson, Leslie Bibb, Kate del Castillo and Henry Simmons are going to give you another week of nail-biting thrills in *No Good Deed*, unsuitable for under 16.

As expected Priyanka Chopra is getting superb reviews for her humming performance in and as *Mary Kom*, going on for its second week.

## Improved Security For Tour Industry

**FROM FRONT PAGE** Somali militant group, the al-Shabaab, carried out the kidnappings of tourists in the Lamu archipelago and the kidnapping of the Spanish volunteers.

Lanuka said his ministry had mapped out tourism sites, installations and facilities for purposes of distributing security personnel in such areas.

He said tourism sector was a very sensitive industry and perceptions of insecurity could easily erode international confidence of Kenya as a safe and security tourists' destination, adding that security had been revamped at all airports, airstrips and ferries across the country.

He said his ministry in conjunction with the ministry of foreign affairs had created a system through which regular updates and briefs were provided to foreign missions in the country on security issues.

The east African nation relies heavily on the currency of foreigners that travel to see the wildlife and natural beauty of the land.

A string of terror attacks in recent months has culminated with the mass evacuation of tourists following two explosions that killed ten and injured 73.

These attacks threaten the tourism business, which the country so readily relies on, so by extension the economy is threatened too.

During the meeting, Inspector General of Police David Kimaiyo said the number of police officers exclusively dedicated to tourism will be increased.

He said the Tourism Police Unit (TPU) will equip with modern vehicles and technology to enhance the unit's capacity.

"We are aware of the challenges facing TPU, and I can assure tourism stakeholders that we are addressing these challenges to enhance capacity and visibility of TPU in Nairobi, Mombasa and other parts of the country that form the tourism circuit," he said.

Kimaiyo also promised to come up with a police that would ring-fence TPU from poaching by other police units so as to retain specialized expertise.

## KENYA NEED TO REFASHION ANTI-TERRORISM MEASURES

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** – Kenya must refashion counter-terrorism measures to effectively deal with a threat that has mutated while spreading its tentacles in many parts of the country, leading experts have said.

Speaking during an interview with Xinhua on the eve of the 1st anniversary of Westgate terror attack, diplomacy scholars noted that Kenya remains a terrorism hotspot hence the need to strengthen pre-emptive measures.

Patrick Maluki, diplomacy scholar at University of Nairobi, stated that evolution of global terror has disrupted security architecture of vulnerable states in Asia, Africa and the Middle-East.

"We are a soft underbelly as global terror evolve and acquire a more virulent form.

"Kenya has survived terror attacks since 1998, and we are not yet of the woods as radical elements train their eyes on our soil," Maluki told Xinhua.

The fight against terrorism in Kenya has been a patchwork of successes and failures, but the Westgate shopping mall attack reminded everyone that fresh impetus must be injected to conquer this evil.

Civilians, authorities and security personnel were astounded by the surgical precision employed by a dozen hooded assailants, who stormed into a relatively secure shopping mall on September 21, 2013 to carry out an orgy of terror.

Maluki noted that Kenya has created a model institutional framework to embolden the fight against terrorism.

"The capacity of our security apparatus to combat terrorism is not in doubt, but we need to equip them with sophisticated technology and retrain them on new ways to cope with this challenge," said Maluki.

The Kenyan anti-terrorism police unit has received support from countries like China, the United States, France, Britain and Russia.

Maluki told Xinhua that terrorism presents potent threat to Kenya's stability, its economic interests and those of its bilateral partners.

"Our friends in Europe, America and Asia feel the pinch whenever Kenya suffers a terrorist attack.

"Sustaining friendship across the board is critical to revitalize the war against terror," Maluki said.

As Kenya marks the 1st anniversary since the Westgate terror attack, experts said the east African nation must review counter-terror measures to cope with a rapidly evolving threat.

The country's parliament is fine tuning a landmark terrorism bill to enhance a coherent response to this challenge.

Kenya is not immune to terrorist attacks based on the fragile security architecture and infiltration by Somali-based militants who have established active cells inside the country.

Joshua Kivuva, a political scientist at the University of Nairobi, stated that a retool of Kenya's foreign and security policies is critical to contain the growing threat of terror.

## Land Commission Support 'Mombasa-Nairobi Railway'

**The Chairman of National Land Commission (NLC) Mohamed Swazuri has vowed to support the construction of Standard Gauge Railway (SGR) development project,**

reports *Winston Otum.*

He assured Kenya Railways Corporation his commission will ensure land is available for the construction of the SGR project.

"The NLC will do the necessary and what it can to make land available for the flagship project,"

he said. Swazuri added that preparation for the commencement of the project from Mombasa to Nairobi was underway.

He spoke during the Kwale County SGR symposium held at co-operative house in Kwale town.

He however acknowledged his commission was faced with teething problems before the commencement of the SGR project.

Mr Swazuri said his commission was ready to partner with the state corporation to ensure the success of the project.

He added NLC was ready to partner with the county governments where the SGR will pass through to success of the project.

Mohamed Swazuri also announced that the government will compensate families for their land that will be used by the Standard Gauge Railway.

He said the families that lack title deeds will be required to produce supporting documents on the occupied land.

"The law entitles compensation of families who occupy the land in good faith," he said.

Swazuri assured the families with proper documents they will be compensated before the commencement of the flagship project.

He spoke during a symposium on SGR held in Kwale County.

Mr. Swazuri urged the state corporation to roll out a sensitizing program for county residents in which the SGR will pass through.

He told the forum majority that the programs will allay fear of the residents when the contractors moves to the site.

"Let the county governments assure all that the government has no intention to violate the rights of its residents and displace them," he pointed out.

The NLC boss urged the parties affected to lodge their grievances within the grace period stipulated for compensation before commencing of the Standard Gauge Railway (SGR) development project.

## KENYA WILL 'EXPORT' SURPLUS POWER

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** – Kenya plans to begin exporting surplus power to South Sudan, Tanzania and Uganda by the end of 2016, the Energy and Petroleum Ministry said on Tuesday.

Cabinet Secretary for Energy and Petroleum Davis Chirchir told a media briefing in Nairobi that the construction of the transmission lines to connect Kenya's electric grid to its neighbors will be completed in two years.

"Any excess power will be exported to the neighboring states that will face production deficits," he said.

Chirchir said by the end of 2014, Kenya's electricity installed capacity will hit 2,300 Megawatts, up from 1600MW at the beginning of 2013.

The east African nation plans to add 140MW of geothermal power in the next two months, and it also has an ambitious plan to connect at least 5,000MW of power to the national grid in the next 40 months.

The key demand drivers for the power will be the steel and iron industries, information and communication parks as well as Standard Gauge Railway.

The ministry will partner with

the Nairobi county government to light up the street lights. "This will accelerate the push to achieve a 24-hour economy," Chirchir said.

Principal Secretary for Energy and Petroleum Joseph Njoroge said that the cost of power is set to reduce by 40 percent in the next one year. "We will achieve this by exchanging fossil fuel generation with geothermal power," he said.

## Retail Prices Reduced For Super Petrol, Diesel And Kerosene Fuel

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** – Energy industry regulator has slashed the retail prices for super petrol, diesel and kerosene by different price margins in the latest review for September. Prices of super petrol will go to 111.64 shillings per litre, kerosene decreases to retail at 81.63 shillings per litre, and diesel decreases to sell at 102.36 shillings per litre.

# I Fail To Understand Why We Have Buildings Collapsing In This Era of Modern Technology

I am very grateful for the invitation as a chief guest for this year's Architectural Association of Kenya Annual Convention.

These kind of professional forums are avenues for innovations, share of ideas and solutions facing the profession.

It is my assumption that you decided to invite a person who is not an Architect to be the chief guest so that you can get ideas from another perspective.

Indeed you will get them.

I am informed that the Architectural Association turned 47 years old this year after its establishment in 1967 and it does not only incorporate Architects but also Quantity Surveyors, Town Planners, Engineers, Land scape Architects and Environment Design Consultants and Construction Projects Managers.

It was also encouraging for me to note that the Association brings together professionals from Public sector, Private and also academia.

This variety of experience converging here today I have no doubt will tackle all the topics during these two days of the convention.

I would like to appreciate the achievements so far made by this Association as highlighted by the previous speakers.

However there is a lot that you as professionals need to tackle especially now that there is a boom in the construction sector in the country.

For example the country has been witnessing collapse of newly constructed and unfinished buildings.

If this Association incorporates almost all the concerned parties from surveyors, architecture to engineers I fail to understand why we should have building collapsing at this era of modern technology.

Equally important is to note that land is one of the biggest problems in the country as outlined in the 4th agenda after the last general election, which has led to conflicts in various parts of the country.

I believe you as surveyors and other professionals in this Association you have a duty to this country to ensure that your work is diligently done without compromise to avoid injustices.

This goes to Town Planners,

The roads we construct in our country especially by local companies do not last.

This has led to a situation where the government instead of building new roads it keeps on repairing the old ones.

Where could be the problem, is it a matter of compromising quality or unqualified engineers in the market or poor supervision?

I am aware that the government has the intention to increase the road network in the country.

However if this is the way we do our construction then it will be a challenge to achieve this noble dream. There is explosion of construction work with beautiful designs in other parts of the world incorporating green

of Architects and Practice have discouraged glass finishing of houses especially in tropical climate areas like Mombasa.

My question is how do you build a glass house in Mombasa like the TSS Tower that will require 24 hrs air-conditioning?

I also understand that some of the concerns you are going through in your profession.

One of them being the by-laws of the previous municipal council put in place, like in Mombasa where it is required that all the buildings to be painted white.

This indeed kills the architectural input that brings the beauty and uniqueness of construction work.

Likewise the municipal councils before the new constitutional dispensation used to approve design and construction works done by technicians.

This Association should therefore work closely with county governments and come up with code of conduct as an Association to ensure that construction sector is not compromised.

Another important issue this Association need to think about is coming up with Landmark structures in the counties that they lack one like Tana River where I come from.

This landmark structures should be of modern design, green architects without compromising the traditional architecture of those counties.

I personally like the building of the Parliament of the Republic of Tanzania that was built on traditional hut design by our own Architect Mr. Kimathi.

most cities in our country are poorly planned to the extent that even the city planner himself find it difficult to direct someone to a place.

When you cross over to our neighboring country Tanzania in a small town like Tanga it is well planned that you can easily locate a street and a house (e.g 'naenda barabara ya saba nyumba ya kumi'), nowhere in Kenya you can do that.

Most addresses in the world are identified by roads numbers, streets numbers and house numbers. This is a challenge to the Association to find a solution to the poor urban planning in our country.

To you Engineers present:

architecture technology that is cost effective.

Most of our modern buildings are not cost effective and we are not going green.

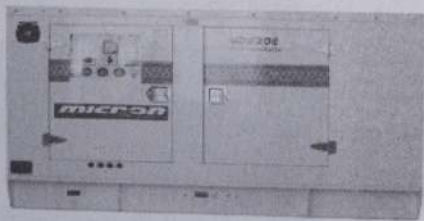
What I mean is that we should have buildings that have minimum maintenance cost.

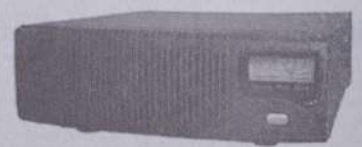

## QATAR AND KENYA TO SET UP DIRECT SHIPPING

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenyan and Qatari governments have signed a maritime cooperation agreement as part of efforts to establish a direct shipping lines between Doha and Mombasa.**

The deal, signed in Nairobi, includes agreements on seafarers that will help Kenyans get a priority in employment opportunities with Qatar shipping lines.

"Under the maritime deal, there will be direct shipping between Mombasa and Doha, which is set to boost trade in Kenya and the East African region," said a statement issued after the signing ceremony.

The deal was witnessed by President Uhuru Kenyatta who met a Qatari delegation led by transport minister Jassim Saif Al Sulaiti.

During the talks, Sulaiti briefed the President on other economic deals that were initiated when Kenyatta paid a state visit to Qatar earlier in the year, in which Kenya is set to benefit from its cooperation with Qatar.

According to the ministry of trade, bilateral trade is in favor of Qatar as Kenya's exports to Qatar in 2011 totaled 580,000 U.S. dollars while imports reached 11 million dollars.

Most of Kenya's exports included unprocessed agricultural goods, while its imports consisted of fertilizer, chemicals, plastics and furniture.

"The delegation also informed the President that Qatar Airways will soon start cargo flights from the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport," the statement said.

Another team from Qatar is expected to come to Nairobi to map out the deal in which cargo will be lifted from Nairobi to Doha for onward transmission to all parts of the world," it said.

Sulaiti informed the President that his government has also offered to give training to three Kenyan engineers on port development. The three engineers will be attached to the Doha Port Authority and will be exposed to port constructions and improvements, and Qatar will employ more Kenyans in its aviation and transport sector.

## Progress At The Port Of Mombasa

**Kenya Ports Authority is working hard to expand capacity ahead of demand at the Port of Mombasa so that it can keep abreast with the current maritime trends.**

Due to this, over the last five years a lot of construction work has been going on.

In April 2012 KPA completed dredging the Port entry channel and the turning basin to -15m deep and 300m wide at its narrowest point.

This was aimed at attracting post panamax vessels which already have started calling at the port of Mombasa.

Another important project that was completed and commissioned in August last year by three East African Heads of States was Berth No. 19.

This 240m length berth increased the Mombasa Container Terminal quay length to total 840m.

This means that the terminal now can comfortably handle three panamax vessels at a go.

I would like to state that this construction works at the port are very rare and the Association should be taking the initiative to come and see these projects.

These are projects that come once in a lifetime and once you miss to witness one being constructed now you will die without seeing one.

## TANZANIA AND THE WORLD BANK AGREE DEAL TO IMPROVE DAR ES SALAAM PORT

**DAR ES SALAAM (Xinhua) -- World Bank and a coalition of development partners have signed an MOU for the U.S. \$565 million dollars improvement of Tanzania's port of Dar es Salaam.**

A statement issued by the World Bank in the commercial capital Dar es Salaam mentioned the other development partners as the UK Department for International Development (DFID) and TradeMark East Africa. "The project is intended to increase

the capacity of the port to handle 28 million tonnes by 2020 from the current 14.6 million tonnes handled in 2013/14," said the statement.

The statement said the joint project to be known as the Dar es Salaam Maritime Gateway Project, includes the deepening and strengthening of berths 1-7 and the dredging of the entrance channel to the port. Other works will include the construction of a new berth and roll on - roll off terminal, and improvements in the spatial efficiency and operational effectiveness of the port.

## Senior KWS Officials Attend Voi, Taita Taveta County Meet

Kenya Wildlife Service (KWS) Acting Director General, William Kiprono has said that 575 rangers will soon graduate and be deployed to boost capacity to address the plight of elephants emanating from poaching, habitat loss and human-elephant conflict.

He was addressing participants at Voi, Taita Taveta County, during the recent World Elephant Day celebration.

"Next month, these men and women will graduate and join the ranger force to sustain our effort in conserving wildlife," he said.

He said that KWS is investing on areas of mutual interest with County governments and communities living in wildlife-inhabited areas to minimize threats posed to Kenya's elephant population for better protection, improving enforcement policies to prevent the illegal poaching and trade of ivory, and conserving elephant habitats.

He appealed to local communities not to be used by ivory dealers to undertake poaching or transport poached ivory noting that the new Wildlife Conservation and Management Act, 2013

provides for stiffer penalties on offenders.

"We modernizing our security operations, systems and rangers deployment to ensure that our troops embrace latest and appropriate technology in their day to day operations," he said.

"This will enable us achieve high standards of performance and stop any further poaching incidences".

While addressing the celebration, Taita Taveta Governor, John Mruttu said that his government is working closely with KWS in sensitizing communities on the new law and explore areas of benefit sharing envisaged by the new law. Other stakeholders who participated in the event included WWF, IFAW, Save the Elephants, Elephant Neighbours, The Tsavo Trust and David Sheddicks Wildlife Trust.

World Elephant Day is celebrated worldwide to raise awareness on the plight of Asian and African elephants. This year's World Elephant Day was used to educate local communities on the need to protect the elephants, their role in the county and national economies as well as the penalties associated with trophy poaching of elephants and illegal possession of ivory.

## American Family Offered Free Holiday After Terror Mixed-Up

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenya government has offered an all-expenses paid holiday to Kenya for the American family who were harassed for 'mistaken identity' by a police officer on the outskirts of Nairobi.**

Cabinet Secretary for Internal Security Joseph Ole Lenku said the security officer was searching the family when he later asked the 15-year-old female tourist that she resembles wanted terrorist Samantha Lewthwaite, commonly known as the White Widow.

"The government will sponsor a fully-paid holiday for the family of the 15-year-old U.S. tourist, who was reportedly harassed by a police officer along Molongo, who accused her of looking like terrorist Samantha Lewthwaite," the statement said. Lenku who made the announcement while meeting tourism stakeholders urged the body to follow up on the matter

with the U. S. Embassy and the tourist's family. The tourism stakeholders had complained to the government that the police have been harassing tourists and branding them terrorists.

There has been wide speculation in Kenya that British terror suspect Lewthwaite was among the Somalia militants involved and who attacked Nairobi's Westgate shopping mall in September last year.

The "White Widow" is suspected to be part of a syndicate of terrorists that have been operating in the east African nation, which has been hit twice by Al-Qaida operatives in 1998 and 2002.

Lewthwaite is the widow of Germaine Lindsay, one of the four bombers involved in the July 7 terror attacks in London in 2005, in which 52 people were killed and hundreds more injured.
