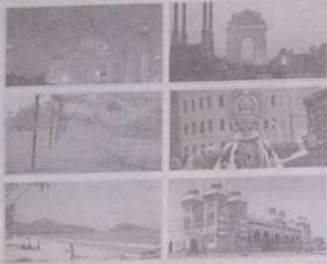

Step Up In Anti-Poaching Measures

NAIROBI (Xinhua) — Wildlife conservationists on Monday vowed to intensify anti-poaching measures and spotlight the plight of Africa's elephants.

Speaking ahead of the World Elephant Day which will be celebrated across the globe on Tuesday, conservationists from the African Wildlife Foundation (AWF) and Wildlife Direct said in Nairobi they are working hard with governments and law enforcement agencies to coordinate efforts to protect the continent's elephants.

According to conservationists, around 500,000 elephants remain in Africa today, down from 1.2 million in the 1980s.

Between 25,000 and 35,000 African elephants are killed by poachers every year in response to rising demand for ivory, particularly in Asia.

World Elephant Day will raise awareness about the ongoing threat to Africa's elephants and worldwide efforts to stop the illegal trade in ivory.

The day presents a platform for creating awareness on the plight of elephants emanating from poaching, habitat loss and

human-elephant conflict.

WildlifeDirect executive director Paula Kahumbu said the conservationists will on Tuesday deliver a petition letter to Kenya's Inspector General of Police David Kimayo, offering citizen help in the arrest of Ivory kingpin, Feizal Ali Mohamed.

Kenya's elephant population has suffered from the same challenges as other elephant populations in the world. Kenya Wildlife Service (KWS) and local and international partners have been working together to minimize threats posed to Kenya's elephant population.

The letter with nearly 400 signatures on it, will be delivered to the police chief to arrest suspected ivory kingpin, Feizal Ali Mohamed who has been a fugitive of the law for over two months.

The letter offers the police citizen support to assist in the arrest of the fugitive Mohamed and specifically, citizens are offering to pay for newspaper advertisements for information leading to Mohammed's arrest, as well as raising funds for a reward for information that leads to his arrest and prosecution.

Despite a new stringent law, the suspected ivory Kingpin, Mohamed, a

Mombasa-based businessman, has evaded arrest since a warrant of arrest was issued on June 11, in relation to a massive ivory seizure on June 5 at a Mombasa warehouse.

Kenya holds the dubious record of the world's leading country in the transit of ivory leaving Africa into the Asian and European markets.

Conservation organizations around the world are also working towards better protection for wild elephants, improving enforcement policies to prevent the illegal poaching and trade of ivory, and conserving elephant habitats.

"The elephant is one of Africa's Big Five and literally looms large, not just in our landscapes but also throughout our history," said Philip Muruthi, AWF's senior director of conservation science.

"This event was not only about raising awareness about their magnificence and plight, but also about drawing attention to the many efforts to save them," said the director.

AWF said its supporting efforts on the ground in Kenya, Tanzania, Zambia, Cameroon, and other elephant range states to bolster security around vulnerable elephant populations.

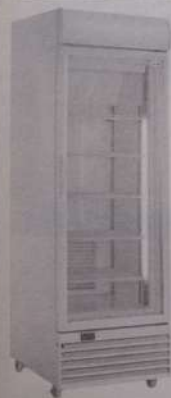

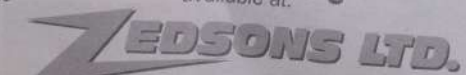

Area in Kisauni Sub-County at Mackline's Academy.

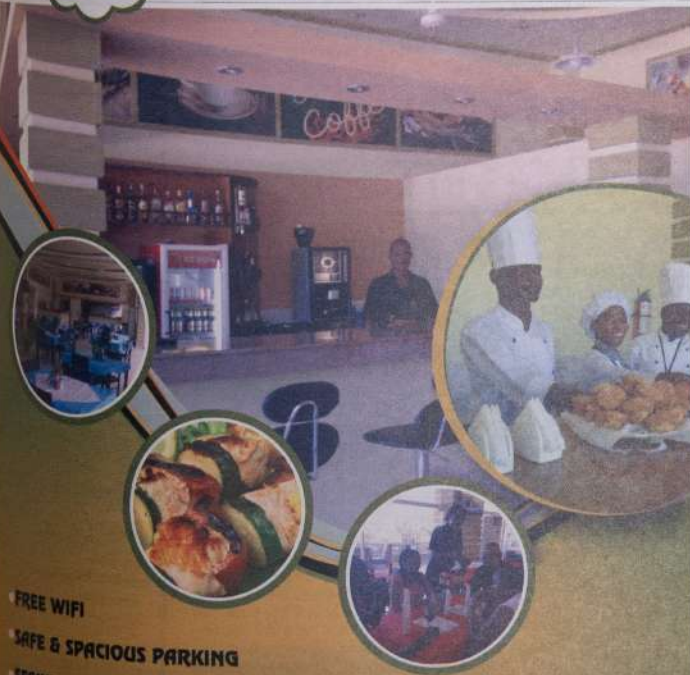
The annual Free Medical Camp offered services including diagnosis, treatment and referral.

'GOOD GOVERNANCE' PRINCIPLES MUST ENHANCE INTEGRITY

INDUSTRIALISTS CALL FOR STREAMLINING OF PROCUREMENT SYSTEM

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenya's industrialists have called for transparency and efficiency in the public procurement system in the country as the government moves to automate the system to curb graft.

Kenya Association of Manufacturers (KAM) Standards and Regulatory Affairs Chairman Palu Dhanani said having efficiency system will ensure security of supply, lower total cost, reduced risk and improved quality of goods and services.

"This will also enhance business confidence to work with the government," Dhanani told a procurement meeting in Nairobi.

The government plans to launch e-procurement system implemented under the

Integrated Financial Management Information System (IFMIS) on Wednesday to make contracts more transparent to ensure efficiency.

Public Procurement Oversight Authority (PPOA) Manager in charge of Capacity, Augusta Njue said as far as procurement is concerned good governance principles may enhance integrity in public procurement.

"This can be done through maintaining high standards of integrity in all business relationships both inside and outside the organization and fostering the highest possible standards of professional competence," Njue said.

The government's procurement platform is part of efforts to automate and streamline the public financial management processes and procurement.

Further Surveillance To Prevent Ebola Outbreak

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenyan government has stepped up surveillance at points of entry following alert from the World Health Organization that the country is highly vulnerable to transmission of the deadly virus.

Health Cabinet Secretary James Macharia said President Uhuru Kenyatta has ordered state agencies to intensify surveillance measures at the main airports and borders.

"The ministry of health has been closely monitoring the evolution of Ebola outbreak in West Africa and have adopted stringent measures to prevent importation of cases into the country," Macharia told journalists in Nairobi.

So far, the Kenyan government has ruled out any Ebola case following thorough screening on passengers originating from West Africa, he said.

More than 10,000 travellers from West Africa have been screened.

The health cabinet secretary noted heavy human traffic from Ebola hotspots has increased Kenya's vulnerability.

To strengthen Ebola detection, the government has established temporary holding rooms at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport.

Macharia said an additional isolation facility will be established at a public hospital in Nairobi.

"Assessment for potential

isolation facilities is ongoing in four counties and towns near ports of entry into Kenya."

The government has confirmed it has not advised the national carrier, Kenya Airways or any other airlines from flying to or from West Africa.

Kenya Airways incoming CEO Mbuvi Nguze said the airline will not stop its flight to the four countries which have been affected by Ebola despite the UN health agency declaring the situation emergency.

The WHO last Friday declared Ebola an international health emergency.

It made a number of recommendations for countries looking to stop transmission of the disease, for states with potential cases and for states that are not currently affected but are seeking to reduce the risk of exposure.

So far, more than 1000 people have died of Ebola in four West African countries.

Health officials have warned that the East African region is vulnerable to an Ebola outbreak due to human migration and tropical weather.

MOMBASA NOW LIKELY HOST ANNUAL KENYA SPORTS PERSONALITY OF THE YEAR AWARDS

By Kimathi Kamau **NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- The annual Sports Personality of the Year Awards for Kenya will be held outside the country's capital for the first time as it marks its 11th edition in December.**

"We are in consultation with sponsors to change the venue and take the event to counties, as it stands there is high possibility of hosting it in Mombasa," said the founder Paul Tergat on Friday when receiving sponsorship from MultiChoice Kenya.

"We want to take the gala where the athletes come from

likely destination of the awards that have feled famed icons such as world record holder, David Rudisha, former double world champion and Olympics silver medalist, Vivian Cheruyot and top swimmer, Jason Dunford, among other glitterati.

The International Olympics Committee Member added the panel of judges drawn from local media houses and title sponsor Safaricom has a tough job in their hands to select nominees who will be further reduced to three to vie for awards at the gala.

Kenya has excelled at the recently concluded Glasgow Commonwealth Games where they topped the athletics charts

with 10 gold, 10 silver and 3 bronze as well as the World Junior Championships in Eugene, Oregon where they brought home 16 medals to finish second behind hosts the United States.

Organizers have set a budget of 238,772 dollars that will cater for prize money where winners in each category receive a cash token of 1,705 dollars.

Traffic jams and the general road congestion in Kenya, and indeed anywhere else, is a rich field for picking up silly behaviour and sometimes simple bad luck.

When one is using a congested road, one has to be fully with it otherwise silly or even dangerous incidents and accidents can happen.

Things can also go horribly wrong in deserted or semi deserted roads and access ways.

One of the most common ones is when a road user assumes that no one else is using the space in which they are.

Let us start with pedestrians. When on the pavement we

should be aware that there are other pedestrians who are likely to use the same space.

In most countries there are no directional pedestrian lanes so one can walk in any direction so long as they stay on the paving.

This general lack of order as far as pedestrians are concerned is a recipe for disaster.

All it takes is for one's attention to be taken away for a short instance for an incident to happen.

In this day and age, the most common cause of distraction for pedestrians is the mobile phone.

They are carried in all sorts of places - trouser pockets, jacket pockets, handbags, back packs and holsters.

There are even the rare occasions when people carry their mobile phones tucked away in the socks.

Whenever a mobile phone announces the fact that someone is trying to get in touch with the device, most people will immediately rush to get the phone.

In doing so, one is temporarily out of touch with their surroundings and in that moment - which can be short or long depending on where the phone is - things can go wrong.

The first thing that I have seen happen to people is that many people will lose their step, especially when walking on uneven paving or on rough unpaved ground.

The worst case I have seen is to see a person disappear into a hole as they retrieve their phone.

This happened in shags when I was there for Christmas a few years ago.

I was walking with some of my rural cousins to an event several homesteads away.

We had to walk as taking a bicycle would have been selfish and there was no space in my car for the multitude that decided to go and attend the function.

The route we took was a narrow path and which was overgrown on the sides by grass as a result of the long rains. We heard a phone ring loudly and one of the team

decided to get off the path to answer the phone - we were walking in single file because of the narrowness of the path.

He stepped off the path and on to the grass and walked along as he attended to the phone.

He walked along the patch in the knee high grass and talked on his phone and then we suddenly heard a scream and I turned just in time to see my cousin disappear into the grass.

He did not trip into anything but went straight down till he was submerged in the grass.

break his fall in the hole.

His ego was also seriously bruised since he was an athletic young chap who had dressed himself to the nines and his girlfriend was also in the group that was heading out for the function.

Another instance that also happened in the rural area roads involved a cyclist.

There was this group of schoolchildren who were wending their way home.

The group of about ten students was walking on the edge of the road.

The free space from the edge of the road to the bushes was about three metres wide and the students were walking in a group that filled the whole space.

Kachumbari was driving along at a sedate pace since he was new to the area and was sightseeing as well.

He went round a corner and saw the students a few metres ahead.

He moved towards the centre of the road as is customary for defensive drivers when they see a group of children on the side of the road.

This forced the cyclist to take a sharp turn onto the path by the side of the road and straight to the students who were wending towards him.

He turned even harder and clipped one student and was then catapulted into the bushes on the side of the road as his bicycle was held by the undergrowth.

He ended up draped over a branch of a mango tree some three metres away from where his bicycle had launched him.

The bicycle rider had obviously assumed that there was no traffic on the road and did not reduce speed as he approached the entry to the main road.

The driver of the vehicle had defensively moved his car close to the centre of the road - for the students but it could also have worked for the cyclist.

The students did not have any time to react and they obviously were oblivious to the possibility that someone could appear from the side road.

In these two incidents, pedestrians were at danger because of not anticipating the credible happenings from their surroundings.

The first person that there could be a hole in the ground in a rural setting and in the second case, the likelihood that a cyclist could come careering out of a side road.

As Kachumbari says, attention is necessary all the time when out and about.

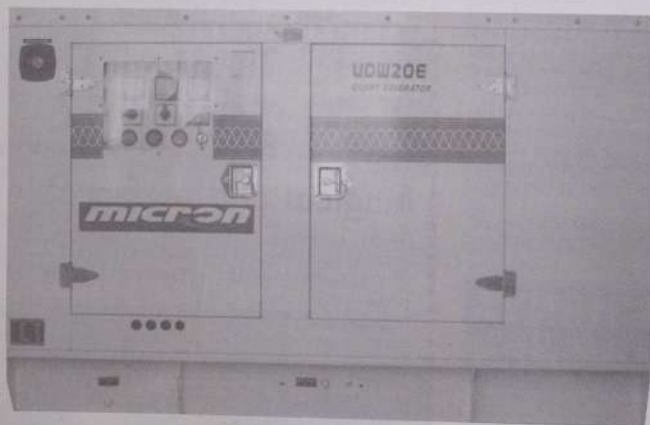

RWANDAN TRADERS WELCOME CONSTRUCTION PLANS FOR NEW INLAND PORT NEAR KICUKIRO

KIGALI (Xinhua) -- Rwandan traders are excited about the plans by government to construct an inland clearing port in Masaka, Kicukiro district, in the city suburb of capital, Kigali.

Rwanda government on Tuesday announced plans to put in place a new Kigali Logistics Platform, a port that seeks to improve the country's import and export fortunes.

The land locked small East African country's new port will

replace the current Gikondo-based Magasins Generaux de Rwanda (Magerwa) which private sector says is small considering the growing number of imports.

"This is a very big opportunity for us because we shall use the port to expand our business, because the previous one (Magerwa) was too small to accommodate our stock," said Jean Marie Kabera, an importer of used cars.

Kabera told Xinhua on Wednesday that business is

already booming in Rwanda and Magerwa had become a challenge to them as it creates a lot of traffic of the heavy-loaded trucks crossing through the city.

"I am looking forward to buy a piece of land near the port and set up my business. I am now selling more stock and making more profit than ever before.

This place will boost my business once the construction is done," noted Kabera, a trader who has been dealing in second hand cars for eight years.

Rwanda's imports continue to increase year on year, as companies invest more on capital, consumer, intermediary goods, energy and lubricants.

Total imports increased by 2.2 percent in 2013 to 2.25 billion U.S. dollars from 2.2 billion dollars in 2012, according to figures from Rwanda central bank.

The inland port will cover 70 hectares of land and the government and the plans were underway to ascertain how much needed to compensate the occupants of the land and the cost of developing it.

"We are hoping that commodity prices will go down once the port is operating because of reduced transport costs and delays in traffic jam will have a positive impact on the country's economy," Freddie Iraguha, a dealer in ceramic material.

The first phase of the project is expected to start in the next six months and last up to 2017, after which some of the Magerwa businesses will be able to shift, according to Rwanda minister of trade and industry, Francois Kanimba.

He said the Masaka location was chosen as it is a central passage where trucks coming from the neighbouring countries of Uganda and Tanzania borders can stop without having to enter the central business district.

"The concept of the Kigali Logistics Platform is to create an inland dry port that will accommodate all the logistics facilities with some of them being

a huge container depot, Yard Park and warehouses to allow Rwandan traders conduct their businesses with ease," said trade and industry minister.

Rwanda's economy grew by 7.4 percent in the first quarter of 2014, a huge rebound from 4.7 percent in same period 2013.

Plans To Drop Electricity Price By 47 Per Cent In Three Years

THIKA (Xinhua) -- A Kenyan official said Sunday that the country plans to reduce the cost of electricity by 47 per cent in the next three years amid increased power generation from cheaper sources.

Principal Secretary for Energy and Petroleum Joseph Njoroge said the electricity producer, Kenya Power, is implementing a countrywide operation to upgrade the power network ahead of the expected additional generation capacity.

"The ongoing power project is all about making it easier to do business in Kenya, it's about creating opportunities and jobs for all Kenyans," Njoroge said in Thika, about 60 km east of the Kenyan capital Nairobi.

The energy permanent secretary was speaking when he witnessed a 630,000 U.S. dollars power upgrade project aimed at stabilizing power supply to the town's Central Business District and its industrial customers.

To accelerate its geothermal power production programme, the east African nation has also resorted to mobile wellhead plants which are faster to deploy.

Kenya has historically relied on hydropower for the bulk of its power generation.

During drought seasons, when hydropower drops in supply, Kenya has had to turn to costly emergency diesel-fired plants.

Heavy fuel oil plants offer a viable and lower cost alternative than diesel-fired plants to address the short-term energy deficit in Kenya.

Njoroge said generation projects for the 5,000 MW additional capacity in the medium term are well on course with electricity prices for domestic customers expected to come down from a current average of 0.19 dollars to 0.10 dollars per unit.

According to him, large power consumers, who include manufacturers and industrialists, should anticipate about 40 per cent reduction in power bills over the same period with unit prices expected to drop significantly from an average of 15 dollars to nine dollars.

MOMBASA-NAIROBI CHINESE RAILWAY PROJECT FOCUS ON JOBS

Nairobi (Xinhua) -- The Mombasa-Nairobi Standard Gauge Railway (SGR) project by China Road and Bridge Corporation (CRBC) attaches great importance to staff localization, according to project deputy manager Li Juguang.

Li noted that 572 Chinese managerial personnel and engineers have arrived in Kenya so far and 2,162 local employees have been recruited.

CRBC said there will be around 2,500 Chinese management personnel and

engineers and up to 30,000 local personnel of different categories for the SGR during the construction period.

The proportion of Chinese personnel to Kenyan will be about 1: 10, and local employees will be the main force for implementing the project, Li said.

Located in Kenya, the upcoming railway will connect the port city of Mombasa and the capital Nairobi with a total length of 485 km.

The designed speed is 80km/h and 120 km/h for freight and passenger trains respectively.

Li said the head office of Mombasa-Nairobi

SGR project is responsible for the construction management with three branch offices in Nairobi, Mito Andei and Mombasa and 18 site offices along the route.

According to Li, CRBC plans would set up a "Long Service Award" for local employees to enhance their sense of belonging.

It will also assist employees who have difficulties in their life.

Chinese premier Li Keqiang witnessed the signing of the loan agreement for the SGR project along with the heads of state from four East African countries during his visit to

'Friends of Kenya' Team No 21 have enjoyed considerable success during 55th Hawaiian International Billfish Tournament, Kona, Hawaii, held over the week 26 June to 3 August, 2014.

The above tournament is an invitation only tournament, reports Peter Ruysenaars.

When Kenya Association of Sea Anglers (better known as KASA), the governing body of big game fishing in Kenya, was approached to appoint a team and provide a team name we were told to make up our own team and make our own arrangements.

Mark Allen approached people of like mind and willing to meet their own expenses for the trip so we decided, in such difficult times for tourism into Kenya, that it would be appropriate to use the team name 'Friends of Kenya'.

The name 'Friends of Kenya' came about as a result of an annual competition held out of Hemingways, Watamu, initiated by Mark Allen some years ago.

The team members were, the Team Captain, Mark Allen, owner and captain of the well known sport fishing boat 'Simba', operating out of Watamu, Mark Smith, a regular fisherman to Kenya, and Peter Ruysenaars, the owner of Pemba Channel Fishing Club, Shimoni.

After long journeys from Shimoni and the UK, the team members finally met up in Kona, Hawaii, on 26 July in time for team registration and briefing in readiness for five days of fishing for big blue marlin.

Kona is known as one of the hot spots in the world for big blue marlin, June through August being considered prime time.

Team registration took place on 26 July and team briefings and ceremonies started on 27 July with a grand parade of participating teams and the countries they represent.

Australia, China, Japan, Kenya, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Vanuatu and USA.

There were 34 teams entered in all - Team 21, 'Friends of Kenya', as we were known, drew slot number one for the boat roster.

This determined the boats and the order of the boats we would fish.

The draw gave us a good feeling and the team came determined to do well with the intent on winning.

The 28 July was the first day of the tournament.

Our first boat was named 'Topshape', voted the best captain and deckhand of the 2013 tournament.

Al and John told us that fishing had not been good and that we were not to get too disappointed if we hooked up and lost fish because the marlin were not very aggressive nor were there many marlin about.

Our aim was to manage a marlin a day.

It took a while before our team captain was lucky to tag our one and only fish of the day, which put us in joint second.

Overall this was not a good day for the tournament with only eight marlin caught.

Little did we know that fishing was to get worse.

Day two of the tournament was on 'Hooked Up', a very old boat.

Jim and his deckie RJ did their best to find us a marlin.

Our only chance of the day resulted in pulled hooks 15

Habits.

Mark Smith was now fed up of looking at a blank sea for almost two whole days.

metres from the boat.

Fishing was even worse on day two with only four marlin caught.

Team 21, 'Friends of Kenya', slipped into third position overall but were still very positive.

Day three of the tournament was on JR's 'Hooker' with Kevin and Scooter as the crew.

The day was a total blank, we did not even raise a fish.

In addition we had a 'Jonah' on board.

'Jonah', a satellite tag, derived his name in Kenya.

'Simba' was given the honour of deploying a satellite tag into a blue marlin out of Shimoni, Kenya in February, 2013.

Both Captain Mark Allen and Mark Smith pled the Shimoni waters for days on end not raising marlin or losing them every time they had a hook up.

Eventually their luck changed and "Roger the marlin" was tagged and sent on his way.

Hence the tag was named "Jonah".

The scientist and researcher behind the Great Marlin Race, which is an international satellite tagging programme to help us learn more about marlin, their routes and habits, among others, was on board with us on day three.

"Jonah" played his part again, or shall we say it was one of our excuses for not landing a marlin that day.

What we did learn, however, was that "Roger the marlin" was eaten by a predator very soon after his release.

A sad ending for "Roger the marlin".

These satellite tags are expensive and cost U.S. \$4,500 each.

They transmit information for up to 180 days.

It is a great shame that the "Shimoni Tag" was eaten soon after "Roger the marlin" was released especially as only 15 of these tags are deployed world wide annually.

Again only four marlin were caught and the warnings of slow fishing were now being confirmed.

The end result was as follows;

Team China 1,986 points, Team Kenya 1,425 points, Team Japan 1,129 points, Team South Australia 1,050 points and Team Vanuatu 1,027 points

This was not a bad effort on our debut.

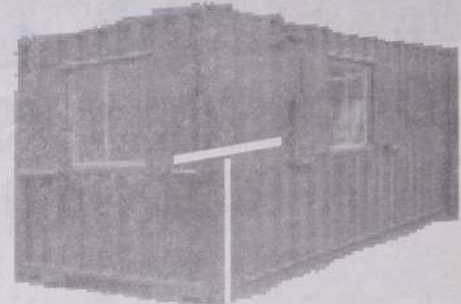

COACH WILLIAMSON EYES ON 'AFRICA NATIONS CUP'

NAIROBI (Xinhua) — For five years, he failed to get Uganda Cranes to the Africa Nations Cup, but it is a challenge that Scot Bobby Williamson is not ready to pass on.

Williamson said his priority is to compete in the continent's biggest football fiesta in 2017 as he takes over Harambee Stars from September.

"It was my target and ultimate goal to take Cranes to the AFCON, but it was never to be. But with Kenya, I believe, we will be able to do it together," he said on Friday from Kigali, Rwanda.

Williamson is in Kigali, with the Gor Mahia, the Kenyan Premier League Champions, in what he said will be his last assignment.

before taking over his new role as Kenya's head coach, after the country football officials sacked the previous technical bench, which was headed by Algerian Adel Amrouche.

"My focus at the moment is on Gor Mahia. It is not my way to talk about two things at the same time. But with Kenya, it will be a long term plan.

"We have to execute it together and hopefully, get the team to the World Cup in Russia in 2018 or the Africa Nations Cup in 2017," Williamson said.

Kenya was shocked by tiny Lesotho when they lost 1-0 aggregate, as they held Harambee Stars to a barren draw in Nairobi. Two weeks earlier in Maseru, Kenya had lost 1-0.

"We have sacked the technical

committee because of the ban, Amrouche has one year from Confederations of African Football (CAF) and poor fielding of players during the qualifiers," said Sam Nyamweya, Kenya's football boss.

Williamson will work alongside former international defender Musa Olien as his assistant, while Simeon Mulama will be the team manager.

Kenya last featured at the African showpiece in 2014 when it was held in Tunisia.
