DWAYNE JOHNSON AS HERCULES AND GUJARATI FILM SAPTAPADI AT CINEMAX

A Show Of Herculean Strength By Johnson

WRESTLING SUPERSTAR
Dwayne 'The Rock' Johnson has come a long way after giving up the scuffling on the floor of the WWF ring to make a name for himself in Hollywood.

Considered one of the greatest all-time professional wrestlers in WWF, Johnson crossed over

The forklift series ranges from one to seven tonnes with a choice of diesel and petrol models that can lift to a height of 14.8 metres. The forklifts are all equipped with SAS technology (System of Active Stability) that actively helps reduce the risk of forklift accidents.

Speaking at the launch, Joseph Ng'ang'a, the Business Manager at Car and General explained, "SAS constantly monitors forklift operations and automatically takes corrective action when it senses factors that could lead to forklift, or load instability. It has several advanced functions that work together to keep driver and loads safe. The swing lock cylinder allows the rear axle to lock automatically if the forklift becomes unstable during a turn. This prevents a side tip-over by adjusting the forklifts centre of gravity."

"The forklifts also have a mast front and rear tilt angle control to monitor load height and mast position and adjust to protect driver and the load. The fork levelling control levels the forks at 90 degrees at the touch of a button making it easier and faster to move loads. While the active steering synchronizer ensures that the steering wheels and forklift wheels are always aligned correctly so drivers always know which direction the forklift will move."

Treasury Slash Domestic Loan By 50 Per Cent

NAIROBI (Xinhua) — Kenya plans to slash domestic borrowing by nearly 50 percent this financial year to boost the private sector and grow the economy.

President Kenyatta said that the Treasury would likely borrow around 1.4 billion U.S. dollars in the 2014/2015 financial year, from the 2.17 billion dollars range the year before.

"Our objective is to reduce our initial intended borrowing, which is about 2.17 billion dollars and reduce our exposure in the domestic market to about 1.14 billion dollars," Kenyatta said.

The remarks came as Kenya's internal debt has hit 15 billion U.S. dollars in June following rise in government borrowing, according to Central Bank of Kenya (CBK).

The debt has jumped by nearly a billion dollars since March as government aggressively reaches out to the public through the sale of Treasury bills and bonds to finance its activities.

BELGIUM VISITOR DIES IN ACCIDENT

NAIROBI (Xinhua) — Kenyan police confirmed on Monday that investigations are underway into the death of a Belgian tourist killed on Saturday in a road accident in northwest Kenya.

Traffic commandant Charlton Mureithi said the 52-year-old was travelling with a group of nine tourists when he was killed Saturday night in a road accident along Kericho-Kisumu highway.

He said preliminary investigations showed that the vehicle carrying the tourists lost control due to stones scattered on the road, adding that the eight injured had been treated and discharged.

Last Monday, Cabinet Secretary for Transport and Infrastructure Engineer Michael Kamau said the number of road accident fatalities had been reduced after the government took new traffic regulations.

Frequently asked questions on the Ebola virus disease

- What is Ebola virus disease?**
Ebola virus disease is a severe illness, with a death rate of up to 90 per cent. The illness affects humans and nonhuman primates such as monkeys, gorillas, and chimpanzees.
- Ebola first appeared in 1976 in two simultaneous outbreaks, in the Democratic Republic of Congo and Sudan.
- The origin of the virus is unknown but fruit bats are considered the likely host of the Ebola virus.
- How do people become infected with the virus?**
Ebola is introduced into the human population through close contact with the blood, secretions, organs or other bodily fluids of infected animals.
- Once a person comes into contact with an animal that has Ebola, it can spread within the community from human to human.
- Infection occurs from direct contact (through broken skin or mucous membranes) with the blood, or other bodily fluids or secretions (stool, urine, saliva, semen) of infected people.
- Who is most at risk?**
During an outbreak, those at higher risk of infection are:
health workers;
family members or others in close contact with infected people;
mourners who have direct contact with the bodies of the deceased as part of burial ceremonies; and
hunters in the rain forest who come into contact with dead animals found lying in the forest.
- What are typical signs and symptoms of infection?**
Sudden onset of fever, intense weakness, muscle pain, headache and sore throat are typical signs and symptoms.
- This is followed by vomiting, diarrhea, rash, impaired kidney and liver function, and in some cases, both internal and external bleeding.
- Laboratory findings include low white blood cell and platelet counts, and elevated liver enzymes.
- What is the treatment?**
Severely ill patients require intensive supportive care.
They are frequently dehydrated and need intravenous fluids or oral rehydration with solutions that contain electrolytes.
- There is currently no specific treatment to cure the disease.
- To help control further spread of the virus, people that are suspected or confirmed to have the disease should be isolated from other patients and treated by health workers using strict infection control precautions.
- What can I do? Can Ebola be prevented?**
Currently there is no licensed vaccine for Ebola virus disease.
- Raising awareness of the risk factors and measures people can take to protect themselves are the only ways to reduce illness and deaths.
- What about rumors that some foods can prevent or treat the infection?**
WHO strongly recommends that people seek credible health advice about Ebola virus disease from their public health authority.
- While there is no specific drug against Ebola, the best treatment is intensive supportive treatment provided in the hospital by health workers using strict infection control procedures.
- The infection can be controlled through recommended protective measures.
- Is it safe to travel during an outbreak? What is WHO's travel advice?**
During an outbreak, WHO reviews the public health situation regularly, and recommends any travel or trade restrictions if necessary.
- The risk of infection for travelers is very low since person-to-person transmission results from direct contact with the body fluids or secretions of an infected patient.
- WHO's general travel advice**
Travelers should avoid all contact with infected patients.
Health workers traveling to affected areas should strictly follow WHO-recommended infection control guidance.
- Anyone who has stayed in areas where cases were recently reported should be aware of the symptoms of infection and seek medical attention at the first sign of illness.

Coast Hospice: Doing A Wonderful Job Under Difficult Circumstances

Tucked away behind Coast Provincial General Hospital along Abdennasser Road, Mombasa, next to the Kenya Medical Training Centre, Mombasa is a small sanctuary created to help the terminally ill and their families to deal with the pain, stress, and grief, through providing palliative care services.

The Administrator/ Re-source Mobiliser, **Jane Mwanjumba**, talks to *Coastweek* in an exclusive interview about this Hospice, and its future plans.

Founded in 2001 by **Faustin Mwendu** with a couple of friends who had become alarmed at the increasing numbers of people being diagnosed with terminal cancer in the Coast province with little aid to the specialised medical help and counselling needed for such health problems.

The main hospice in Kenya is in the capital Nairobi, out of reach for most coast dwellers, so it was deemed essential to open such an establishment to serve Mombasa residents.

They approached **Dr. Khadija Shikely**, then working as an Administrator at the Coast General, now the County Health Director.

She gave them a small amenity ward in the Coast General complex to start – and they were off.

Very quickly, the numbers of attending patients who heard

about the Hospice or who came on referral as doctors and hospitals became aware of the services being offered, increased so rapidly, it was clear more space was needed, and an old disused mortuary was offered.

They now have two examination rooms, one rest room, two small cubicles which serve as administrative offices, and a small infirmary for drugs – which are heavily subsidised.

To date they have treated over 14,000 cases, either in the hospice day service, or home based service for those now too ill to move.

"We manage pain and symptom control" says Jane.

"We also provide psychological counselling and spiritual care, as well as practical help where necessary.

"We deal with the patients and their families/ care-givers on a day clinic basis, and home visits for those too ill to travel.

"We also visit those in other hospitals for continuation of palliative care and follow up.

Day Care - Once a fortnight on a Thursday the Hospice holds and open day where both patients and care givers can share experiences, give each other advice, support and help,

"It is good to know you are not alone, that others have been through what you are going through" says Jane.

"They give each other tips on how to manage the problems they face Terminal illnesses can wreak havoc in the family unit, and people desperately need this kind of help.

"They come to realise that others are on the same journey and learn to take it one day at a time.

"Also we have visitors and well wishers who just come for an hour or two to chat; many of these people are very lonely, and even feel like outcasts before they reach us.

"A group of young beauticians came to cut hair, trim nails, massage feet and so on, which is an immense boost to their mental health.

"Our medical, nutritional and administrative staff also give their advice in terms of their particular expertise, and also give them up to date information.

"We had one case of a bedridden woman whose relatives, thinking they were helping, wanted to place her child in a boarding school.

"She was heartbroken, knowing she had little time left

and she wanted to be with her child as much as possible.

"It is so important to involve the patient in all such decisions.

"We give practical gifts if we have them to very deserving cases.

"We appreciate any donations of used household equipment.

"We had one case of a man caring for his bedridden wife who was in great pain, so he left her in the bed and slept on a

terms of financial assistance.

"Drugs" she says immediately.

"The cost of palliative care is huge, and we never charge the full amount, often it is a mere pittance, sometimes even nothing where the family is totally destitute.

"Basic medical items like Dettol, wound dressings and so on are needed as well as the more expensive drugs for pain management and symptom control.

"Keeping our vehicle in good running condition for home visits and fuel is a drain on our resources.

"Right now we urgently need some major vehicle repairs, and we do not have the money to pay for this.

"Then there are extended costs for some patients.

We have a young lady who has to go to Nairobi for radiotherapy treatment, we do not have that service in Mombasa.

Her family cannot manage the transport, overnight stay costs as well as the treatment.

This lady has a beautiful singing voice and sings gospel music.

"We would appreciate support for her to record and sell her music.

"There are others too with talents.

"It would be nice to record songs "Voices of the Hospice".

"As well, we would like to improve the facilities at the ' set up a resource centre, an in-patient and child unit.

It would be nice to have more

furniture, and freshen it up the facility with paint.

"The demands on our slender resources are endless.

"We are hoping to eventually be included in the County Health budget projects but right now we need all the help we can get from all our local community, local political and religious leaders, men, women and youth groups, local businesses and corporate institutions.

Future Aims - "Our long term aim is to help set-up hospice units in every one of the six Coast counties.

"We are in Mombasa, but there is, Kilifi, Kwale, Lamu, Taita Taveta and Tana River.

"Progress is being made in Kilifi County.

"Malindi Sub-County Hospital has a palliative care unit which has been running since March 2014. Kwale County, Msambweni Hospital is now in the process of setting up a palliative care unit, at Taita Taveta County, the County Health Secretary has provided space at Voi Hospital for the setup of, a hospice, but much remains for development and setting up facilities."

"Our inspiration and our role model" says Jane, "is Dame Cicely Saunders (1918-2005) a nurse, physician, writer and founder of the hospice.

A Famous quote of hers is: "You matter because you are you, and you matter to the end of your life.

"We will do all we can, not only to help you die peacefully, but also to live until you die."

"Through donations from well wishers we were able to provide him with a mattress and some old sheets for the daily bed changing his wife needed.

"Problems we have to tackle are the inherent belief in witchcraft.

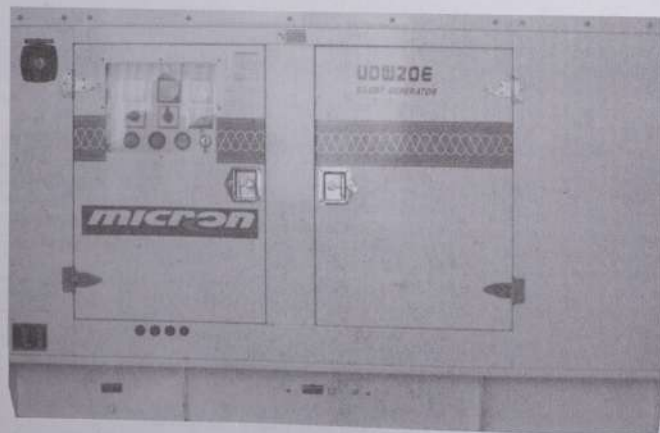

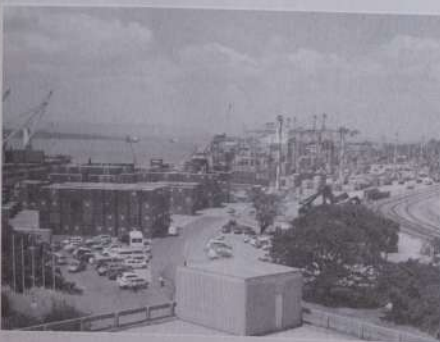

China Construction Firm Builds Three New Berths In Lamu Port

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenyan President Uhuru Kenyatta has signed a U.S. \$480 million dollar agreement with a Chinese firm for the construction of the first three berths of Lamu Port in the coastal region.

The deal for the three berths under the Lamu Port—South Sudan—Ethiopia Transport Corridor Project (LAPSSET) Corridor Program was signed with China Communications Construction Company Ltd.

Kenyatta said his government has already set aside for 50 million dollars to immediately commence the construction works.

"This includes funds for compensation of project affected persons.

"I am therefore directing the Ministry responsible for lands to complete the process of compensating those affected by this project as soon as possible," Kenyatta said.

The three berths will serve general cargo, bulk cargo and container cargo.

The designs were completed in 2013 and a Chinese firm was awarded the tender.

The LAPSSET Corridor will

create the Great Equatorial Land Bridge, connecting East and West coast of Africa.

It will also see to the development of Kenya's 2nd Transport & Economic Corridor which will in turn reduce over-reliance on the only Corridor-Northern Corridor.

Kenyatta said the commencement of Lamu port project reinforces government's resolve to make infrastructure a key facilitator of social and economic development.

"The commencement of the first three berths will send a strong message to our neighbours of Kenya's commitment to regional trade facilitation and integration," he said.

He noted that the construction of the first 3 berths will present a strong case and trigger participation of the private sector in the construction of the remaining 29 berths and other components of the corridor.

The project components of the

LAPSSET Corridor Program have a budget estimated at 24 billion dollars in construction costs.

The Lamu Port with its 32 berths alone will cost about 3.1 million dollars, the railway 7.1 million dollars while the crude oil pipeline will cost a further 5 million dollars.

"All these components are intended to be implemented as a package that will result in the development of an integrated transport and economic corridor," he added.

Speaking on the sidelines of the event, the LAPSSET Corridor Development Authority Managing Director Silvestre Kasuku reiterated that the project will not only improve Kenya's economy in general but also improve the lives of the people along the Corridor with education being one of the major keys for development, through youth scholarships.

The LAPSSET is one of the major Vision 2030 flagship projects that will ultimately culminate in the attainment of

transforming Kenya into a middle income, globally competitive and industrializing country with a high quality of life in the next 16 years.

The development of the LAPSSET Corridor and indeed the first three berths of the Lamu Port is underpinned by a comprehensive feasibility study completed in 2011.

This study indicated that the Port of Lamu will handle approximately 24 million tonnes of cargo per annum by 2030. This is supported by the fact that the geographical location of Lamu provides a naturally deep and sheltered harbour that will require minimal dredging to receive large post panamax vessels.

NEW 'CLEARANCE RULES' FOR CARGO IMPORTERS

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenyan authorities said on Monday they have issued a new clearance rules for cargo importers following successful piloting of the electronic permits that is expected to spur regional electronic trade.

The Kenya Trade Network Agency (KenTrade) which is implementing an online cargo clearance system said importers of cargo will now be required to apply for Import Declaration Forms (IDFs) through the Kenya National Electronic Single Window System (Kenya TradeNet) as well as apply for Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS) consignment approval through the same System effective on Aug. 1.

"I am optimistic that effective implementation of the System will reduce the cost of doing business due to on-line clearance and simplified procedures," KenTrade CEO Alex Kabuga said in Nairobi.

He said the requirement is part of the ongoing rollout of the System aimed at

simplifying trade processes for Kenya's competitiveness.

"We are determined to build a strong cooperation with stakeholders in ensuring that the Kenya TradeNet System is effectively implemented to expedite clearance of goods," Kabuga said.

He added that the System is currently able to process pre-clearance documents including import and export permits from KEBS, Kenya Plant Health Inspectorate Service, Department of Veterinary Services (DVS), Horticultural Crops Development Authority (HCDA) among other government agencies.

The system is also used to apply for and approve Kenya Revenue Authority's IDFs.

The initiative is also expected to facilitate international and domestic trade at the port of Mombasa, and has been touted as the solution to the persistent delays at the port.

It is expected to reduce the time it takes to process goods through customs at the port by half, from seven days to three days.

The project comes as Rwanda, Uganda, and

Kenya are mulling a uniform regulatory framework for citizens wishing to start business in individual member states.

The project is the first of its kind in Kenya and is aimed at improving Kenya's global and regional competitiveness through integration of import cargo clearance and trade logistics processes.

KEBS MD Charles Ongwae said under the new rule, cargo importers with hard copies of clearance documents presented at the entry points for goods whose IDFs were processed through the Kenya TradeNet system must also include a copy of the KEBS consignment document from the Kenya TradeNet System.

Kenya Revenue Authority's Simba System, Kenya Ports Authority's KWATOS System and Kenya Plant Health Inspectorate Service's system, which play central roles in cargo clearance, have already been integrated with the Kenya TradeNet System to enable electronic lodgment, processing, and sharing of IDFs and Manifests (Sea and Air) among stakeholders.

Matatu Operators And Commuters Revert To 'Cash' System

Towards the end of June, public transport vehicle (matatu) operators in Kenya scrambled to acquire cashless payment gadgets to meet a government imposed deadline of July 1.

In Nairobi, the capital, a good number of the matatu operators bought the gadgets at 69 U.S. dollars to implement the government's directive and remain in business.

But the did commuters, who bought the payment cards and loaded them with cash to avoid inconvenience.

But on July 1, the government relaxed the implementation of the directive that could have seen matatu operators become

one of the countries with a cashless fare payment system on the continent.

The move was to give matatu operators and commuters time to acquire the gadgets.

However, matatu operators and commuters who had bought the gadgets and were using them have now abandoned the system, throwing into disarray Kenya's quest to have a cashless fare payment system.

The matatu operators are back to full swing to the cash payment

system, which the government had blamed for fanning corruption on the road.

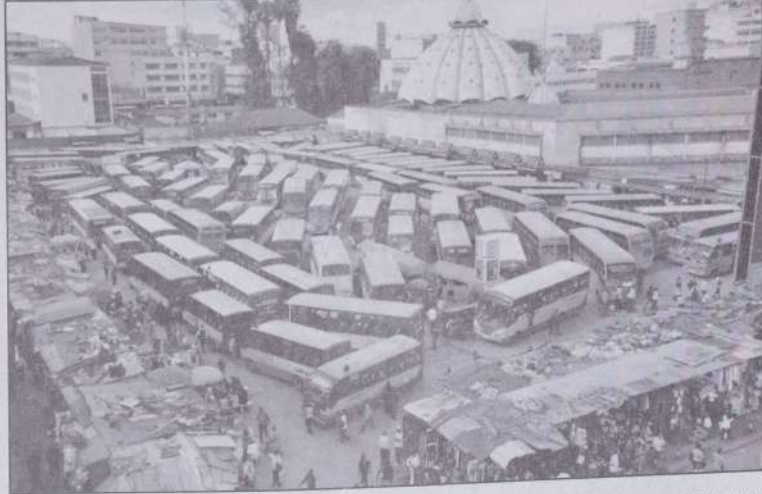
"I stopped using the system about a week after the July 1 deadline.

"Since then I have never touched it, and this is because no commuter is asking about it," said matatu conductor Alfred Mwashu, who plies the Buru Buru route, on the east of the capital.

He said many commuters who have bought payment cards stopped using them as soon as the government postponed the implementation of the system.

"There was nothing to compel them to use the cards.

"About a week after the relaxation of the rule, I found it difficult to use the gadget because every passenger I went to in the vehicle paid in cash," noted

one could lose change to the conductor.

"But I could not continue using it especially after the government relaxed its directive," he said.

Postponing the mandatory implementation of the system put commuters at risk of losing their money, according to Abdi.

"Matatu operators were not

obligated to use the system, which the majority had opposed. Loading money in the card thus put one at risk of losing it.

"It has happened before where passengers have lost money after a bus company that was using the system abandoned it."

Abdi assured he exhausted money he had in the card and he has not bothered to load

"I just walk with it in my wallet.

"If the government says using the card is mandatory, I will start using it again.

"If the current state remains, I will forget about it."

However, according to matatu operators, they risk losing customers if they insist on using the gadget.

"You cannot force someone to pay fare with the card.

"They will simply board another vehicle and you will end up losing customers.

"Cash is simple, it is what commuters are used to."

Kenya's National Transport Safety Authority went easy on the use of the payment cards to give matatu operators and commuters time to embrace the system, noting it would be implemented gradually.

Bernard Mwaso, an information technology expert with Edal IT Solutions in Nairobi, said it is not unusual that matatu operators and commuters who had embraced the system have abandoned it.

"It happens all the time with new technologies.

"People would always go back to what they are used to, but if they see the benefits, they embrace the new technology."

He explained that what the government should have strived to do is to make Kenyans see the benefits of the system and let them adopt it at their own pace, as it happened with mobile money.

"The system would curb frequent fare hikes, especially during peak hours.

"This was something good, but it was not allowed to come out as the government imposed a deadline."

'Land Grabbing, Asset Stripping, And Looting The Government Coffers Through Shady Deals'

We will continue to look at the area of our country's political culture this week having considered a historical perspective last week.

At independence, the political culture of the country was clearly derived from several sources.

The first was the system that was in use in the United Kingdom.

This was a clear democratic state with some system of devolution.

The others were those that came from the exposure of some of the leaders at that time to the two sides of the cold war namely the United States of America - the USA and Union of the Soviet Socialist Republics - the USSR.

These were clear federalist systems.

Over the years, the political parties in Kenya have morphed into different forms. For the first forty years of independence, the country was dominated by one strong party that gave us only two presidents.

Political freedoms were seriously curtailed as they were seen to be a threat to the incumbent government.

Sycophancy became the order of the day and political careers rapidly became economic careers as those in the top or middle circles began rent seeking as a result of the positions they occupied.

This period saw the development of two cultural types in politics.

The first was the diehard activists whose core role was to harass and torment the government in power at the time.

These people were harassed, locked up on the flimsiest of excuses, tortured, hounded and sometimes forced into exile.

They came from either minority tribes that felt they were being denied a piece of the national cake or people who felt that their

political ideology would be the one that would best serve the country.

The mainstream party in the forty years was seen as a very capitalist driven party so the activists tended to be socialists.

However, the capitalists were not there to create a capitalist society. They were there to dominate the capitalist space.

They would be the ones who would sequester property and businesses and make it their own through their connections with those in power.

Land grabbing, asset stripping, looting the government coffers through shady deals or directly were the main ways in which money was made.

This was done with impunity and the population of the country

own money or money provided by external agitators and sponsors to fund the activities of their parties.

Some of the activists had made their money through the largesse of the colonial powers or through behind the scenes engagement with the post colonial government and then proceeded to fall foul of the leaders of the political machinery that was in power.

One of the key characteristics of the political parties was that they each had a power base in some ethnic province

They were either based in Central Province, Western and Nyanza as a block, the Rift valley - which had a split between looking to Central and to the West, Coast Province and then Eastern Province - which also had the same tension as Rift Valley, they would look to join with Central or Coast.

In short, our political parties were very much centred on tribal political chiefs.

Over time as alliances were formed out of necessity, the complexion of the political parties would change depending on whom the king pin was and where they sought their alliances.

This shifting kaleidoscope of political shades played out very rapidly from the time multiparty politics came into its own.

For the last ten years or so, the political culture in this country has been driven by the character of the leader rather than by any deep political ideology or any stated leadership wish or manifesto.

We are still in the mainstream party government and activist opposition dispensation that has characterised politics in this country since independence.

The party in government is seen to be there to loot the nation for the benefit of its members.

All of us are still preoccupied with sharing of positions in the ministries, parastatal managements and boards, diplomatic

placements and wherever it is perceived that there is a chance to reward people who are loyal to the party rather than those who will deliver to the nation.

Those who are there are seen by us, the population of Kenya or Wanjiku, to be people who will make plenty of money and share it with us - their personal sycophants.

Then there is the rest or opposition who still believe that the best way to "fight" the government is to engage in trench warfare by agitating the population to rally behind them as they march forth to slay the monster that is the party running the government.

This is done in the tried and tested manner of yester year.

First make demands that you say wananchi wish to see. Nobody listens or instead pooh poohs the demands.

The next step is to threaten mass action. Same treatment - nobody listens but when the shout is too loud, they block the opportunities and finally the mass action is allowed to take place but then doesn't have the desired effect.

Finally there is the political and constitutional route to get the attention that one wants.

This is usually lengthy, risky and tedious but if done well will achieve the desired result of creating change.

Change however, has its own risks. Many times as we have seen in the past, when change happens, the people who benefit from the change are never those who have really sacrificed and suffered to execute the change. Other people tend to come from left side and slide into the leadership position and the change agitators are left out again to continue fighting for change against the next lot of people who get into the leadership of the nation.

As Kachumbani says, change is a constant but does not always reward its creators and agitators.

Declarer knocks out West's Ace of Trumps and soon claims his contract.

If East had covered the King of Hearts, with the Ace, Declarer would Trump and rely on West to have two remaining Aces.

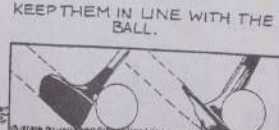

Football Kenya Federation (FKF) boss Sam Nyamweya announced that Gor Mahia, the Scotsman who is in charge of domestic champions, will take over from Belgian Adel Amrouche who was sacked last Sunday after the team was eliminated from the 2015 Afcon by Lesotho on home soil.

Retired defender and captain Musa Otieno comes in as the assistant head coach with another retired veteran Stars midfielder Titus Mulama appointed Team Manager to take the places of sacked James Nandwa and Jacob Mulee.

"I promised Kenyans that we would act quickly

and Bobby is the man to do the job of taking us forward," Nyamweya who also disbanded the team on Sunday added.

Speaking to local radio station earlier Tuesday Williamson said it "would be an honour and privilege to manage Stars, but FKF must speak to Gor Mahia first. What Kenya needs is to start from the youth ranks to restore her former glory."

The 52-year-old is preparing to take Gor Mahia to the regional Cecaafa Club Championships in Rwanda with the team due to depart Nairobi Wednesday for Kigali.

"My concern at the moment is with Gor Mahia seeing them do well at Cecaafa," the man who led them to their first domestic honours in 18 years last season stated.

He was fired by Uganda after a five year stint in charge of the Cranes last year after failing to qualify for the 2013 Afcon in South Africa.

GEOFFREY MUTAI TO RACE IN NAIROBI DIAMOND 10KM RUN

by John Kwoba NAIROBI (Xinhua) — Kenya's New York Marathon champion Geoffrey Mutai is the latest elite runner to confirm participation in the inaugural Nairobi Diamond 10km Run, which will be held on August 17.

Mutai, 32, will be defending his New York title in November and wants a fast short race to gauge his speed.

Mutai has had a poor season in 2014 over the 42km distance, finishing sixth in London.

However, he has had good run in shorter distances in Boston and New York.

"The focus is to win in New York. But the organisers have not confirmed the names, but want to run there.

"I have started my preparation and Nairobi Diamond 10km run looks a good bet for me to test my speed," Mutai said on Sunday from Eldoret.

"I also want to help boost the profile of the race. Many times we go abroad to run at some time we are not able to win. But here, even if I don't win, I want the race to continue being there and top athletes coming to run here."

"I will bring along several athletes we train together with them in Kaptagat and am sure other elite runners will be coming here too.

"I am not running because I target the prize money, far from it. We just want support it, make it more lucrative," he added.

Mutai's best time over the 10km event is 27:19 and he wants to run as close to it as possible.

But he will not be alone. Leonard Komon, the world 10km record holder and Kenyan champion, former Africa champion in the distance among the athletes who have confirmed participation.

Barnaba Korir, Nairobi Cour Athletics Kenya chairman who is also race director, said over 2000 people have confirmed participation in a race which has a prize pack worth 120,000 U.S. dollars.
