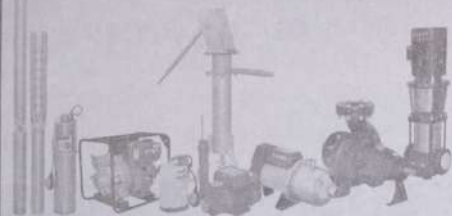

Kenya Ferry Services and Kwale District Eye Centre held a joint eye screening of ferry passengers over the weekend where more than 400 people were screened for cataract and

other eye ailments.

The exercise was held at the Kenya Ferry passenger yard on the Mombasa Island.

"As a responsible company, we have identified eye ailment as a major problem and we therefore decided to work

Kwale District Eye Centre to address this problem among our passengers as a way of giving back to the society," said Kenya ferry services Acting Senior Corporate Services Manager Francis Mugomati.

Kenya Ferry Services and Kwale District Eye Centre have been holding monthly eye screening to help reduce blindness around communities in the coastal region.

"Some of these people have had their sight restored through this partnership," said Kwale District Eye Centre administrator Verena Ndunda.

UN Official Urges Kenya To Ensure Access To Water And Sanitation

NAIROBI (Xinhua) — A United Nations official on Tuesday urged Kenya to ensure majority of citizens have access to improved water and sanitation.

The UN Special Rapporteur on human right to safe drinking water and sanitation, Catarina de Albuquerque, said the government should transform the constitutional rights to water and sanitation into a reality.

"By investing in sanitation, Kenya would make significant economic gains," said de Albuquerque in a statement issued at the end of a seven-day visit to Kenya.

She said the east African nation loses at least 330 million U.S. dollars every year due to premature death, health care costs and productivity losses resulting from the lack of access to adequate sanitation.

De Albuquerque also urged the Parliament to adopt the Water Bill, and the government to subsequently develop a new national water and sanitation strategy, which should be translated into real action at the county level.

About 30 percent of the population have access to improved sanitation and 13 percent of people still have no choice but defecate in the open.

"This is a daily indignity for over 6 million people," she added.

The remarks came after the government said early this month it has developed a five-year master plan to enhance access to piped water and basic sanitation in cities.

Principal Secretary of the State Department of Water James Teko Lopoyetum said the country has experienced rapid urbanization that has in turn exerted pressure on basic services including clean water and sanitation.

He said the government has mobilized resources to expand water supply and sewerage infrastructure in big cities and rural towns.

Kenya is grappling with urban water supply crises due to population growth, poor planning and aging infrastructure.

The UN Special Rapporteur who visited Turkana in northwest Kenya where over 80 percent of the population practice open defecation called on the authorities to take urgent steps to enforce and monitor the official tariffs for water kiosks.

Police Arrest 3 Ivory Poachers

ISILO (Xinhua) — Kenyan police on Tuesday arrested three poachers and recovered two pieces of ivory, weighing 12 kg worth 17,200 U.S. dollars in the country's northern town of Isiolo.

Isiolo County Commissioner Wanyama Musiumbo told journalists that the police also recovered two firearms with eight rounds of ammunitions as the authorities intensify crackdown on the poachers after an elephant was killed in mid July.

"The three suspected poachers were arrested in a security operation involving Kenya Wildlife Service, Northern Rangelands Trust personnel and local officials who stormed their hideout after a tip off from the public," Musiumbo said.

The killing of elephants, rhino and other wildlife species is having a huge impact on tourism sector in Kenya and the authorities have stepped up

surveillance on traffickers of ivory.

Heavily-armed criminals kill elephants and rhinos for their tusks, which are used for ornaments and in some folk medicines.

Wildlife conservationists have decried the entry of organized crime syndicates into the illegal wildlife trade, most notably of rhino horn and elephant ivory, which they said, has created a crisis situation in many African countries.

He urged the public to continue offering valuable information to the authorities to ensure that those behind poaching scenes and other criminal activities are arrested and put to book.

The KWS officer in charge of the A-Company in Isiolo Martin Ng'ethe said that the officers will not relent in their pursuit of poachers.

He said the three suspects are still helping police with investigations and are set to be arraigned in court on Wednesday.

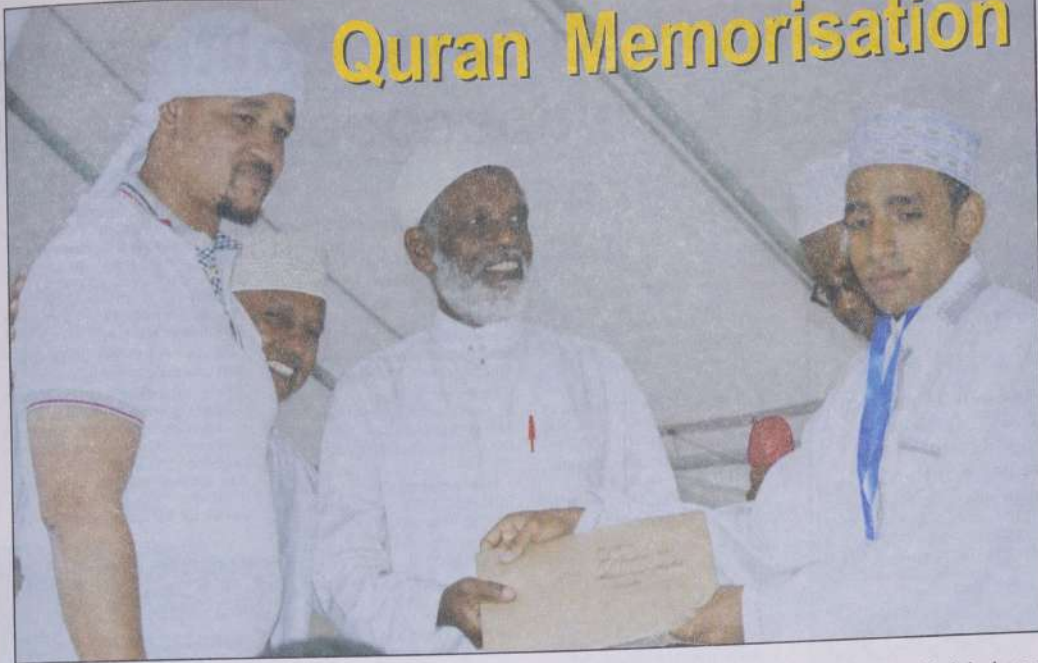

Ministry Beefs Up On Cyber Security

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenya plans to beef up cyber security following the hacking of public government websites, the communications regulator has said.

"All government websites will now be hosted from one place so that we can closely monitor them," Communications Authority (CA) Director General Francis Wangusi said during the second E-learning conference.

Previously, websites of government ministries were hosted by different entities.

Announcement comes after government social media accounts were hacked by cybercriminals.

"The attacks are a wake up call that public websites are vulnerable to malicious attacks," Wangusi said.

The director general said that a technical team has been set up to begin implementing the National Cybercrime master plan.

He noted that the government has set aside financial support to enhance the war against cybercrime.

"We want to reduce it to a minimum so as encourage more businesses to tap the growing e-commerce opportunities," he added.

Uptake Of Credit Reports Still Low Among Kenyans

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenyans are not making use of credit information services which help them access cheaper loans.

The service, which was launched in 2010 to help banks assess the credit worthiness of their customers and thus use their track record to offer affordable loans, remains unpopular among Kenyans.

While banks are making use of the service, many individual Ken-

yans are not, yet the personal loan portfolio in the East African nation continues to grow significantly.

Since the launch of information sharing through Credit Reference Bureaus, Kenyans have requested a paltry 67,610 reports, according to the Central Bank of Kenya (CBK).

On the other hand, financial institutions seeking to rate their customers have requested over 4.3 million reports.

"Following the launch of credit

information sharing in July 2010, the number of credit reports requested by financial institutions stood at 4.33 million in June, up from 3.95 million reports in March, representing an increase of 9.4 percent or 370, 243 reports," said CBK in its banking sector report for the second quarter.

"The credit reports requested by customers went down from 6,422 to 6,094," noted CBK.

According to the Kenya Bankers Association (KBA), credit information sharing allows banks to distinguish between good and bad borrowers.

"Someone who has failed to pay their loan at one bank cannot be able to walk to another to get a loan without the institution knowing about it," notes KBA.

Borrowers with a good credit history, therefore, should be able to access loans more cheaply and easily than high risk defaulters.

The banking sector umbrella body observes that initially, many borrowers who repaid their loans diligently did not get rewarded because their good repayment history was not available to the bank that they approached for new loans.

With credit reports, therefore, customers can get credit using their track record rather than physical security such as land, vehicles, shares and household items.

They can use their favourable credit history to negotiate for favourable credit terms.

But it is evident this is not happening among bank customers in the East African nation if the low number of credit reports is anything to go by.

The personal or household loan portfolio is the biggest in the country. Interestingly, it is among the leading in non-performing loans as interest rates remain at an average of 17 percent.

The sector's loan as at June stood at 5.1 billion dollars, up from 4.9 billion U.S. dollars in March.



We will continue to look at the area of our country's cultures this week and take a glimpse at the political culture of Kenya.

First however we will set the scene and take a quick look at

how the political environment has evolved over the ages. This is not an academic look

but rather a layman's view of what they have seen since the country was 'born'.

Kenya as we know it today started off as part of the British East African Protectorate at the time when the British Empire was expanding across the world in search of raw materials for its industrial revolution.

This was in eighteen ninety five.

At that time the main export commercial activity was the trade of slaves from our shores.

Fortunately this was stopped and other activities were encouraged through the settlement of people of various classes from the mother country.

Effectively the country Kenya was carved out during the 'Scramble for Africa' which was done at a meeting held in one of the European capitals some time in the eighteen eighties.

This almost arbitrary demarcation of Africa by the colonial powers put together very unlikely bedfellows in the name of creating parcels that the colonisers would then call their piece of territory.

NO CONSIDERATION

There was no consideration given to the wishes of the natives as to whether they would have liked to associate with each other and if they did who they would have liked to associate with.

The net effect was to put together a set of tribes and clans that would not necessarily have agreed to be governed together.

In the nineteen twenties the colony of Kenya was established as well as that of Uganda.

Before this date, the two countries were what formed the East African Protectorate.

Again, the boundary that separated the two countries was drawn by the colonial masters and not by the inhabitants of the country.

In the early sixties a wave of independence started that would see most African countries become independent within that decade.

The different countries followed different routes to getting independence.

Some declared unilateral independence.

These were mainly those where the colonial officers and their populations decided to secede from their home countries.

They simply sequestered the governance that was present in the colony and one of them became Prime Minister or President of the newly declared country - either by seizing it or by election.

Another batch had uprisings of the natives which the small spattering of the colonial forces and governors could not contain.

Some ended with the colonial masters routed and an independence declared by the natives who freed themselves from colonial shackles.

Others ended when the colonial masters invited the political arm of the native resistance to negotiate a programmed

withdrawal with an agreed replacement government who would take over the instruments of power in a structured manner.

The final batch were the negotiated changes of government where there was agitation and the colonisers were smart enough to realise that their time was up and that a structured retreat would be the best way out instead of trying to fight the inevitable.

Kenya was in the batch that had a bloody uprising.

This provoked the colonial masters to invite the political arm of the uprising to a conference in their capital that would negotiate the method of exit of the colonial masters and also what the new instruments of power for the succeeding native

There were also Federalists and Unitary proponents.

This mosaic of political thinking is what Kenya started off with.

At independence there was a dominant ruling party and several other parties that were seen as opposition.

This is what happened in a lot of African countries where the political shades that emerged at independence reflected fairly consistently the shades that existed at the colonial heart quarters.

So, the initial political culture and leanings in Kenya were copied or derived from the experience of those Kenyans who got their education in the different countries that Kenya was aligned to.

There was also the Cold War that was shaping international relations and Kenya was not spared from the influence of this war.

A lot of Kenyans went to seek free or subsidised education in the Soviet Union and the United States.

This exposure would colour their thinking and being the educated ones, they would also influence the section of population that they were close to.

This added to the many areas that would influence the development of the political culture in Kenya.

We will make a stop here this week and look at the post independence development of the political culture in Kenya, what it has eventually become today and where it might end up tomorrow.

As Kachumbari says, the politics in Kenya is a great kaleidoscope.

TEN YEARS' AGO

The objective is to improve education, health and the quality of life of the people living in the vicinity of the power station."

"Since the launch of this long term social responsibility scheme in 2001, thousands of people of all ages, races and religious have benefited from Health Action Days held in the rural areas. Schools and homes for child-ren, the physically handicapped and the aged have also been assisted to improve their facilities and services."

They were almost a reflection of the political split in the colonial masters.

There were socialists and democrats.

Classic and vintage car enthusiast John Wroe has entered a 1936 Bentley for the CBA Africa Concours d'Elegance which will be held at the Nairobi Racecourse on September 28th.

The Bentley will be appearing in the classiest event on the Kenya motorsport calendar for the first time and will contest the class for cars made in 1940, or earlier.

The forthcoming Concours is the 44th in the annual series organized by the Alfa Romeo Owners Club and will feature 12 car and eight motorcycle classes.

There will also be a Classic Car and Motorcycle Sale open to machines made in 1989, or earlier regardless of their condition.

In addition to completing a full restoration of the Bentley which started two years ago John Wroe is preparing the 1930 Ford Model A which won the prize for the most elegant car at last year's Concours.

The locally built body of the Bentley has been fully repaired and painted and work on the upholstery and interior is underway.

The first prototype Bentley was made in London in 1919 and over the years the company developed

engines ranging from four to eight litres. Supercharged versions achieved a string of successes in motor races, but the company struggled to be profitable and closed in 1931.

Rolls Royce acquired the assets of the company and continued the Bentley name. John Wroe's car started life as a four door sports saloon with a body made by Mann Egerton.

After two owners in England, the car was purchased by Colonel Victor Charles Thompson who registered the car in Kenya in September 1954. After years of hard work the engine failed and was replaced by a compatible Rolls Royce engine imported from England.

Ownership of the Bentley changed hands five times before John Wroe purchased the Bentley from a farmer in Kiambu. John Wroe's 1936 Bentley is among the cars which will be seen for the first time at the Nairobi Racecourse.

Another is the 1954 MG TF two seater convertible of Chandan Gidomal which will contest the sports car class. The MG will be up against the 1972 Alfa Romeo Spider of Jaspal Kalsi which won the class last year.

Sports cars and pre-1940 machines are the last classes to be judged and are the greatest attractions for knowledgeable Concours spectators.

Port Police Seize A Mombasa Heroin Haul Worth U.S. \$12.7 Million Dollars

MOMBASA (Xinhua) -- Kenyan police on Tuesday seized heroin worth U.S. \$12.7 million dollars from a suspicious stateless ship intercepted off the Kenya coast in Lamu by Kenya navy officers.

The drugs were impounded during the ongoing inspection of the vessel that remained highly guarded at the port of Mombasa. Head of Anti-Narcotics Unit Hamisi Massa said the drugs weighing 342 kilograms were discovered in a fuel reservoir inside the vessel that was intercepted while trafficking the narcotic drugs. Massa said the samples of drugs were subjected to thorough analysis where they tested to contain high grade heroine at the government chemist.

"We have managed to discover more drugs from the vessel after our officers stumbled on the drugs that were hidden in a diesel tank in the vessel. "We are still conducting more inspection," Massa told journalists in Mombasa. The multi-agency had early intercepted sachets of heroine with an estimated value of U.S. \$34,300 dollars that prompted

the officers to conduct more inspection on the vessel. The nine crew members aboard the ship MV Alnoor have been charged with drug trafficking, in Mombasa court. Police had applied to detain seven Pakistanis, two Iranians and an Indian arrested aboard MV Alnoor at Port police station pending investigation. Prosecutor Paul Makonge said

anti-narcotic officers found 974 grammes of heroin with a street value of U.S. \$34,300 dollars in the ship, which originated from the United Arab Emirates. Massa said investigators also need to sift through more than 150 drums of water and diesel that was drawn from the ship. The stateless ship was seized by the Kenya Navy last week off the Lamu coast following a tip-

off from Interpol and tugged to Mombasa port under heavy guard. Massa said they still sieving through 300 bags, which had been declared as white cement allegedly imported from Yemen. Police sources indicate that the ship could be among the vessels linked with international drugs trafficking and arms trafficking in the coastal region.

BURUNDI IMPROVING ROAD ACCESS

BUJUMBURA (Xinhua) -- Burundi is in the process of executing several sub-regional road projects to overcome challenges arising from its landlocked status, Transport Minister Virginie Ciza said on Sunday in an exclusive interview.

Madam Ciza cited the Rwanda-Burundi multinational road that will stretch to Tanzania via Ruhwa (in Rwanda). The road will pass through Burundi up to the east of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DR Congo). At the same time, she said, work on Mugina-Mabanda-Nyanza-Lake road will begin soon to improve regional traffic between Burundi and its neighbors in the south, including Tanzania. "Burundi does not have much difficulties in execution of these projects. We have the means: the financial means are there and human resources are also available," the minister affirmed. She said with regards to land transport, Burundi

was faced with immense challenges due to poor state of infrastructures. "Our roads are degraded. But we are in the process of consulting our partners to analyze the ways and means of rehabilitating them," she revealed. Regarding Burundi's participation in regional integration projects as a member state of the East African Community (EAC), she highlighted the construction of regional roads linking EAC member states and ongoing projects such as the construction of a railway line. "These projects will enable us to open up our country, because Burundi's access to Dar-es-Salaam and Mombasa ports will be easier," she said. With regards to development of water transport, Ciza said Burundi was in the process of extending Bujumbura port through funding from African Development Bank (AfDB). Burundi government appreciates the contribution of technical and financial partners in opening up the country.

F.G.S. 'Brandenburg' And Japanese Destroyer 'Inazuma' Meeting At Sea

EU Naval Force flagship, German frigate FGS Brandenburg and the Japanese destroyer, JS Inazuma, have met at sea during regular counter piracy patrols.

The EU Force Commander, Rear Admiral Jürgen zur Mühlen, took the opportunity to welcome his counterpart, Japanese Commander of Escort Division 8, Captain Koji Tachikawa and some of his staff members on board. For more than 10 years the Japanese Navy has been deploying maritime forces to the Horn of Africa. FS Inazuma is currently operating in the Combined Maritime Forces Task Force 151. As well as another warship, the Japanese Navy

has two Maritime Patrol Aircraft conducting patrols in the Gulf of Aden to help protect merchant shipping in the area. During the visit the Japanese Commander was given a ship's tour. The two Commanders and their staff also discussed the importance of mutual understanding and cooperation in the fight against piracy. At the end of the visit the two ships performed a traditional 'sail past' to say farewell, before they resumed their counter-piracy patrols in the Gulf of Aden. "This was an important visit to underline our common willingness to increase cooperation and foster friendship between our people", the Force Commander stated at the end of the meeting.

TANZANIA ECONOMIC GROWTH AT 7.0 PER CENT IN 2013

DAR ES SALAAM (Xinhua) -- Tanzania's economic growth remained strong in 2013 at 7.0 percent, which was above the regional average in the East African Community (EAC) and sub-Saharan Africa, according to an official report publicized Monday. "It is expected that this performance will improve further to 7.2 percent and 7.5 percent in 2014 and 2015," said the financial stability report from the country's Central Bank. The report said the economic performance in Tanzania remained stable as of this March, as

reflected by the broad macroeconomic indicators, despite challenges posed by regional and global environments. The report said in 2013, crop production, trade, manufacturing, real estate and business as well as transport and communication contributed about 60 percent to GDP and close to 66 percent of GDP growth rate. "Together, these sectors absorbed about 65 percent of total bank lending during the same period," said the report. The report added that inflation remained at single digits during the year to March

2014 due to continued implementation of prudent monetary and fiscal policies. However, the report warned that expected rise of food price in the EAC region may pose risk to inflation. It said the Tanzanian shilling remained fairly stable against major currencies except the Japanese Yen. With regard to major trading partners, the shilling appreciated against the Indian rupee and South African rand which had depreciated against U.S. dollar on account of capital outflows due to anticipated policy shift in advanced economies, said the report.

KERSI RUSTOMJI RECALLS WHEN HAND CRAFTED LEATHER FOOTWEAR WAS ALL THE RAGE

Cobblers of Mwanza, Nairobi And Mombasa

While 'Bata' was ubiquitous in later years, early Indian cobblers created all the footwear in East Africa.

Every town had its lone cobbler family.

The cobbler worked on the verandah of the front room of their shop-cum-home.

A flat square cushion on a 'guniya' a gunny sack on the floor was their seat to squat on.

The leather crafting tools lay within easy reach as did an old battered aluminium 'sufuria,' cooking pot, with water to soften the leather for cutting, stitching, smoothing, and a very smooth black granite piece was at hand, to sharpen the half moon leather cutting and trimming knives, and the hooked stitching needles.

Nails, hammers, stitching string, and needles lay near an old tin that contained homemade blue coloured lye.

A ball of wax was at hand to apply to the stitching needles for easy penetration of the leather.

A variety of leather rolls lay in a wooden chest nearby.

A thick red covered ledger book that sat atop the chest was the order book.

Ichhoo Mochi was one such cobbler.

Ichhoo the Cobbler of Mwanza, in the then Tanganyika now Tanzania, was the town shoemaker.

To get any footwear, men's, women's, and children's one arrived at Ichhoo's and after an exchange of pleasantries a discussion on the type of footwear one wanted ensued.

In course of this general exchange of styles, type, and colour of leather, Ichhoo, or his 'aashishtent,' assistant,

rose from the squat, smoothed his greyed white pyjama pants and the unlucked shirt, also quite grey from use, and disappeared in the room at the back.

A few minutes later, he emerged with a thick, very dog-eared shoe styles magazine, which had seen better days in some English shop.

Used for years it always showed the 'letesht shtaeel letesh' according to Ichhoo.

From the description by the customer, Ichhoo flipped the pages to find the closest match, and handed over the magazine.

The customer looked at the picture, flipped more pages back and forth, and after the pros and cons of various styles was entered into, one was chosen, often with a few

modifications by the customer.

Ichhoo returned to his squat and opened the thick red covered ledger book.

He turned to an empty double page, as the customer removed the shoes.

First the right and then the left foot was placed on the ledger book, and both were traced on each page.

The customer name and date were entered in one corner of the page, and the price as well the delivery date written.

Some days later, at least three 'fitting' visits followed.

During these, various kinks, tightness, or looseness, noted next to the outlines of the two feet, and another fitting date given.

The next day the fitting done, problems again noted in the ledger next to the foot patterns, and a new date for delivery entered.

The wise customer never went on the new nominated day, for he knew his Ichhoo.

Therefore the customer arrived on a third or fourth day

after the new date, and was greeted with:

'Aare sahib, what happened? You are late. Your boots are ready.'

The customer was never right.

After retrying the new pair satisfactorily, Ichhoo wrapped it in old newspaper pages, tied with the stitching thread, the money paid, and Rustomji carried home his new pair of hand-stitched shoes, until next Navroze, the Parsi New Year.

Boot and not shoes, was the generic Indian word for all foot wear, except for 'eeshliper,' slippers or 'sendl,' sandals.

Many Nairobi residents will recall Pitamber Khoda on the old Government Road, a leading shoe dealer.

Mombasa readers will recall two such shoemakers, at the side of the Regal Cinema building, off the then Salim Road, one I think was Parmar Shoe Maker.

Kenya Sweats On Player Availability Ahead Of AFCON

NAIROBI (Xinhua) — Kenya is sweating on the availability of three of its players for the return leg match of the 2015 Africa Nations Cup (AFCON) qualifier against Lesotho in Nairobi on Sunday.

Kenya's captain Victor Wanyama (Southampton) and his brother MacDonald Manga (Parma, Italy) are available for selection as they are still in the country on summer holiday.

South Arabia-based central defender, David Ochieng, who was recalled to the team, but might be locked out of the national team by his club.

The qualifiers are not falling within the FIFA International days and clubs are at liberty to deny the players permission to leave.

However, captain Victor Wanyama (Southampton) and his brother MacDonald Manga (Parma, Italy) are available for selection as they are still in the country on summer holiday.

South Arabia-based central defender, David Ochieng, who was recalled to the team, but might be locked out of the national team by his club.

Kenya lost out 1-0 in the first round in Maseru and must beat Lesotho by at least two clear goals to be able to advance to the next stage.

The winner of the two-legged between Kenya and Lesotho will advance to the group stage, where they will join Gabon, Burkina Faso and Angola in Group C.

The top two teams in each group qualifies for the 2015 Africa Nations Cup finals set for January-February 2015 in Morocco.

Kenya last competed at the Africa Nations Cup in 2004 in Tunisia under coach Jacob Mulele.

However, they will face Lesotho without head coach Adel Amrouche, who is serving a one year ban for gross misconduct by Confederation of African Football (CAF).

With the absence of the Amrouche, his assistants James Ndlovu and Ken Odihambo are tasked with the crucial duty of seeing the national side overcome the southern African country.

Football Kenya Federation Secretary General Michael Esakwa confirmed that they had put in a request for Ochieng, who if available will be returning to the team after two months after he was kicked out of the team by coach Adel Amrouche for skipping training sessions.

"We expect the players to be available by Thursday. It is an important match that Kenya must win if we are to have any chance of making it to the main group qualifiers," said Esakwa.

Lesotho team are expected to arrive on Thursday with 19 players and seven officials.

Head coach Seephephe Matete has maintained that his team will be coming to Nairobi to finish the work started in Maseru.

"The points we have should motivate us against Kenya since we now have an advantage over them," he told reporters in Nairobi on Tuesday.

Matete said having played Kenyans at home; they have understood their playing style which will be a huge advantage on the return match. "Kenya are not a bad team. They are more ball players, and they don't play long balls. So at least we can plan for them; like I have said we have studied their strengths and weaknesses," he said.
