

## Kenya Ship MV 'Jamila' Is Stranded Off Somalia

**MOMBASA (Xinhua)** -- A Kenya-owned ship is stranded north of Mogadishu in the Indian Ocean because of mechanical problem, a regional maritime official HAS confirmed.

East Africa Coordinator of Seafarers' Assistance Programme (SAP) Andrew Mwangura said the 'MV Jamila' was sailing from Zanzibar to Mogadishu when it developed mechanic problem.

"We have received distress call that the vessel has drifted with crew member on board. Efforts are being made to contact the rescue center and owner of the vessel," Mwangura said.

# Construction Of Voi Taveta Road

**TAITA TAVETA (Xinhua)** -- Kenyan President Uhuru Kenyatta on Thursday kicked off the construction of a key road that links the East African nation with neighbouring Tanzania.

Kenyatta, who commissioned construction works of the crucial 110 km road that traverses across the vast county and which has been ignored since independence, said it will link Tanzania and Kenya through the Taveta-Voi road.


Residents said the tarmacking of the road will not only spur growth in the county but ease transportation of people and goods between Kenya and Tanzania in the spirit of the East African Cooperation.

The road is tarmacked on the Tanzania side, but has remained in poor state on the Kenyan side for the last 50 years.

Taita-Taveta Governor John Murutu said the construction of the road, alongside the ongoing construction of the Taveta One-Stop border point are important developments that will dramatically change the way Kenya and its people do business with their neighbours.

"I want to express our gratitude to the government for initiating and implementing development projects which they said are a dream come true," Murutu said.



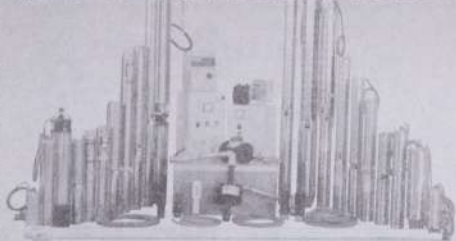

## CONSERVATIONISTS EMBARK ON ANTI-POACHING WALK TO RAISE AWARENESS

**LAIKIPIA (Xinhua)** — A team of wildlife conservationists have embarked on a three-week walk that kicked off on July 1 to raise awareness on the rampant poaching in the country.

The awareness campaign dubbed "Ivory Belongs to Elephants" is being carried out in schools and tertiary institutions in areas around National Parks, game reserves, animal sanctuaries and areas synonymous with human-wildlife all over the country.

"These walks are not only designed to create awareness, but also a platform to share the

last year in Nairobi has seen them walk for over 4,000 km. He said the objective of the walk is to raise awareness against poaching of endangered species among the elephants and rhinos.

Nyamu noted that the number of live elephants stands at 26,400 elephants and the number was decreasing by day owing to rampant poaching.

"Kenya today are faced by many conservation challenges, like other developing countries these challenges have had great negative impacts on our environment and resources," Nyamu said.

Awareness on the wildlife ownership and existing data will shed more light towards conservation. Elephant poaching

the need to create awareness and educate the local communities on the dangers of poaching and also educate them on the contents of the Wildlife Act 2014 as regards penalties and compensation.

The conservationist said it is his responsibility to educate various community values, benefits of wildlife, and create awareness on the massive elephant poaching taking place in Kenya, through walking and talking to communities on the atrocities and the irreversible damages associated with killing of elephants.

The campaign which started in 2013 has reached out to many people in different parts of the world such as Narok, Mombasa,

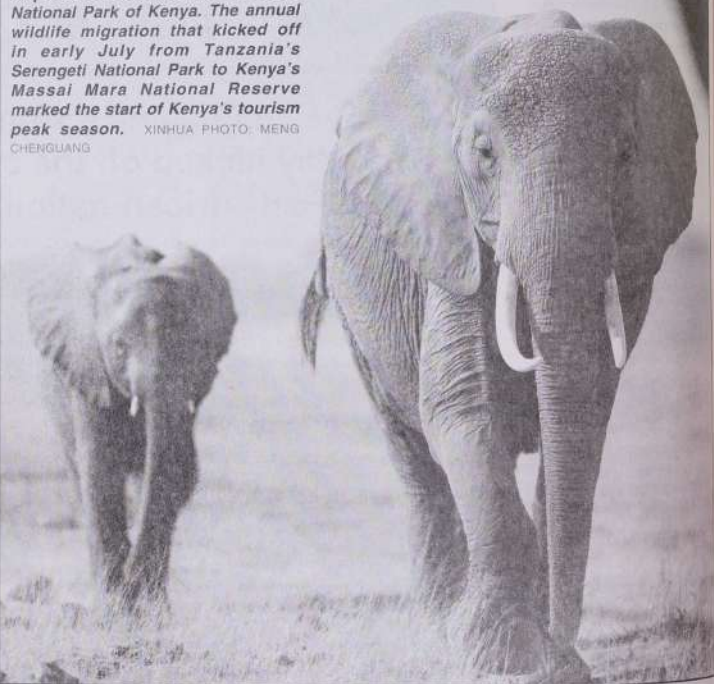

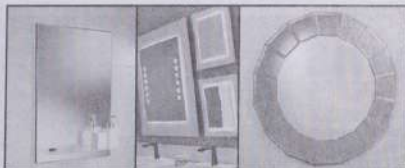

details of wildlife and conservation Act 2012," Jim Justus Nyamu of the Elephants Neighbors Center (ENC), an anti-poaching organization said on Friday.

"To win this war on poaching we call on all Kenyans to take a moment of concern and reflect the state of our resources in the coming years," he said in Nyahururu in northwest Kenya as he embarked on the third phase of the walk which will end on July 21.

Nyamu said his team has embarked on a massive program to educate local communities against engaging in the vice that now attracts huge penalties. He said the walk that begun

and exploitation of ivory trade have continued to pose a major threat to elephant populations in Kenya.

"In the 1979 to 1989, 151,100 elephants were killed in Kenya. We have lost 120 elephants this year alone including one of our biggest tuskers, The Great Mountain Bull of Mt. Kenya National Park," Nyamu said.

"Kenya currently accommodates 26,400 from a population of 35,000 in 2011, at least 4 elephants are killed every day through poaching and community retaliation," he added.

Nyamu stressed that if stringent measures are not put into place the number could drastically reduce and hence

Meru, Nairobi and event.

He observed that elephant-human conflict remains a major challenge in Laikipia County among other regions, adding that concerted efforts were necessary to sensitize residents on the importance of protecting the animals as a national resource with huge benefits if well taken care of.

Nyamu, who has walked hundreds of miles both in the country and in the U.S. for the last two years, said that lack of proper information on the need to protect the endangered species among the youths was a major challenge, since the youths were being used to exacerbate poaching.

## Protection Of Traditional Knowledge And Culture

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** — Kenya is in the process of developing legislation on the protection of traditional knowledge and its cultural expressions, a senior government official said on Monday.

Attorney General Githu Muigai told a news conference in Nairobi that an inter ministerial committee has been tasked with developing the law.

"It is currently in the drafting stage and when enacted will help position the local creative industries as a catalyst for a Kenyan knowledge society," Muigai said.

He added that all government ministries dealing with creative industries are currently mapping out strategies for enhancing efficiency in the promotion of copyright as a key driver of economic growth.

The East Africa nation is planning to reform the creative industry in order to enhance the utilization of talent among the youth, so as to expand job and wealth creation.

"Protection of copyright and intellectual property are key to the realization of this dream," the Attorney General said. The CEO of Kenya Copyright Board (KECOBO) Marisela Ouma said that the country's creative industry is set to contribute over ten percent of GDP by 2017.

"Despite the favorable outlook, there are still some challenges in realizing the copyright monetization within the creative industries," he said.

The CEO noted that the world has shifted to a knowledge based economy where intellectual property plays a crucial role especially for developing countries.

KECOBO Chairman Tom Mshindi said that there is need to upscale the fight against copyright piracy.

Mshindi said countries that have put in place proper legal structures have a vibrant creative industry which creates intellectual capital.

The chairman said there has been significant growth in the creative industries due to the emergence of digital technology.

## Promoting Health Referral Services

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** — The Kenyan government and donor partners on Wednesday launched a strategy to promote health referral services across the country.

Health Cabinet Secretary James Macharia said the establishment of functional referral health systems is anchored in the national health policy and the constitution.

"An effective referral strategy will enhance close relationship among service providers and ensure citizens receive quality healthcare," Macharia said during the launch in Nairobi.

He added that the referral strategy will also enable the government to overcome logistical challenges in provision of healthcare services in remote parts of the country.

Kenya partnered with multi-lateral donors and charitable organizations to develop health sector referral strategy and guidelines.

Macharia noted that poverty, infrastructural bottlenecks and lack of clear policy guidelines undermined the effectiveness of referral health services in Kenya.

Currently, Kenya has two major referral facilities that have grappled with overcrowding, inadequate personnel and essential commodities.

"Many Kenyans are not aware where to get cost effective health services. Additionally, poorly equipped facilities at the lower levels has forced patients to seek services at higher levels where specialists are concentrated," said Macharia.

It is hoped that development of a strategy on referral health services will address operational hiccups through proper linkage of different actors.

Both the national and county governments will be involved in the implementation of the health sector referral strategy and guidelines.

Macharia revealed that governments at various levels will provide financial resources and manpower to implement the strategy.

"The main cost components envisaged in the strategy are

the patients movements, expertise, specimen and e-health infrastructure," Macharia told health experts.

He noted that investments in new referral facilities are capital intensive. "We are encouraging public private partnerships to meet the cost of vehicles for the patient's transport, medical equipment and commodities," said Macharia.

The establishment of additional referral facilities will minimize a rising disease burden at the grassroots.

WHO Country Representative for Kenya Custodia Mandhate urged the government to prioritize investments in functional health care systems in the counties.

"Comprehensive referral services at the counties will lead to better health outcomes and economic growth," Mandhate said. She noted that Kenya has scaled up investments in the WHO pillars to promote health care including infrastructure, human resources, essential commodities and corporate governance.

## NEW PROJECT REDUCES CHILD MORTALITY RATES

**NANYUKI (Xinhua)** — Kenya has introduced a new project that could help the country's pastoralist communities abandon long-maintained harmful cultural practices such as giving birth at home, which has led to high incidences of child mortality rates.

Giving birth at home with only the assistance of untrained Traditional Birth Attendants (TBA) has significantly contributed to high child mortality rates.

"Women who give birth in hospitals are considered cowards," Alice Nderitu, who is the Project Coordinator of the Road Less Travelled (TRLT), said in Kurum Village, Laikipia County, which is located 200 kilometres northwest of Kenya.

"Giving birth in hospitals improves the chances of child survival, unlike at home where the environment is not hygienic and every woman wants to assist you," she said.

TRLT is a five-year project that supports the efforts of African organizations to improve the maternal and child health in nomadic pastoralists' communities.

In Kenya, the project has received funding to the tune of 2.5 million U.S. dollars from the Anglican Overseas Aid (AOA).

She noted that the project's aim is to build awareness within communities, so that they initiate long term behavior change that reduces retrogressive cultural practices.

Traditionally, women prefer to deliver at home so that they can bury the newborn's placenta at their door step. "This symbolizes that the child belongs to the area," she said.

However, if the mother gives birth in the hospital, the placenta is normally disposed off.

According to Nderitu, some pastoralists' communities encourage pregnant mothers to only consume porridge, especially after six months of the pregnancy.

"The aim is to ensure that the newborns have are small in size, so that it makes it easier for the mother to deliver. However, the practice of denying food puts the life of the mother and child in danger," Nderitu said.

The average weight of babies delivered in the communities is less than 2 kgs against the national average of 2.5 kgs.

The project is also improving the health of women and children through encouraging the adoption of modern family planning methods as well as children vaccinations.

# Conference Tourism Is Fast Growing Economic Sub-sector

*(Xinhua)* -- Conference tourism is a fast growing sub-sector in Kenya's tourism sector, annually generating more than U.S. \$1.1 billion dollars.

graphers either hired or freelance to earn a living during the conference sittings.

One of them is Benson Ndung'u, who ekes a living from taking photographs in conferences and selling them to the participants.

"At no time will all the participants in a conference ignore their photos.

"At least 60 per cent of the participants regardless of whether they are Kenyans or not will buy their photos," Ndung'u who operates from Nakuru town told Xinhua on Tuesday.

Ndung'u has created a network with major hotels in Naivasha and Nakuru towns, popular for hosting conferences with a minimum of 200 participants.

"There is no hotel that will allow any photographer to take photos and sell them within its premises. It is a matter of security that the hotel management is aware of the photographer's activities," says Ndung'u.

Since 2011, he said he has received a boom in his business as the number of conferences held in his area of operation has gone up.

His busiest months range from April to October during which many local and international organizations hold their workshops in either Nakuru or Naivasha towns.

Both towns are located in Nakuru County in the Rift Valley region of the East African state.

They lie to the north western side of Nairobi, the country's capital city and take only an hour for one to reach Naivasha town through the road.

Nakuru town hosts the rhino sanctuary park-Lake Nakuru National Park which is only two hours away from the capital city.

"From 2011, I have had busy weeks between April and October, unlike in the former years when I could attend one major conference in a week," he says.

The growing trend in the conference tourism, according to Ndung'u, is attributable to developments made in the private sector which encompasses nongovernmental organizations.

On a number of occasions, Ndung'u said he is hired to take

photographs for organizations.

"These days there are many nongovernmental organizations which require professional photographers," he says.

His price ratings depend on the size of the photograph with the highest going for five dollars and the least one dollar.

Michael Wachira, equally earns his living from shooting videos for organizations as well as taking photographs.

He said many non-governmental organizations currently working on issues related to agriculture, environment, and peace and gender development hold numerous consultative forums in hotels providing him more opportunities for making good profits.

"Now than before, I am actively

involved in shooting videos for organizations holding seminars for farmers and community representatives discussing issues related to peace," said Wachira who travels across the country to shoot videos for respective organizations.

For shooting a single function for an organization, Wachira said he draws 2,300 U.S. dollars the amount that sums up to 9,150 dollars a month during the peak period.

However, incidents of terrorist attacks in the country heavily affect their business as some of the conferences are cancelled due to fear while some of the donors who fund the organizations withdraw.

Ndung'u and Wachira are some of the Kenyans who are the direct beneficiaries of the

conference tourism in the East African nation which prides in existence of numerous magnificent tourist sites.

Currently, more than 750,000 Kenyans depend either directly or indirectly on the tourism sector for a source of living.

The ranking of Kenya as second popular destination for holding international meetings in Africa puts pressure on the leadership to expand its meetings, incentives, conferences and exhibitions facilities to attract more business tourists.

In its medium term strategic plan, the Ministry of Commerce, Tourism and East African Affairs has prioritized the expansion of the conference tourism facilities as well as improving the standards of the existing ones.

Among the areas earmarked for the further developments of the conference tourism facilities include Mombasa in the coastal region and Kisumu in the western part of country.

"Currently, hospitality investors are expanding their facilities to tourist attractive sites. This therefore not only provides a good environment for business discussions but also a conducive atmosphere for relaxing," noted Kamau Njuguna, the chairman of the Kenya National Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Nakuru County Chapter.

"Due to the nearest of the facilities to the attractive sites or the parks, participants are lured into visiting these places and that means money.

"This collectively boosts the tourism revenue."

## KENYA POWER RECEIVE U.S. \$40.6 MILLION DOLLARS FOR ELECTRICITY CONNECTIONS

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** --Kenya Power has received U.S. \$40.6 million dollars from the French Development Agency (AFD) and the EU to connect about 300,000 electricity customers in the next four years.

Kenya Power CEO Ben Chumo said the first tranche of the loan facility amounting to 5.5 million dollars will be disbursed in the next two months and will mainly benefit applicants for single phase electricity connections whose quotations do not exceed 400 dollars.

"Stima Loan is one of the initiatives spearheaded by the company in collaboration with the government, AFD and EU to ease the cost of power connections and help accelerate access to electricity by more Kenyans in line with the country's development vision," Chumo said in a statement issued in Nairobi.

The east African nation mainly relies on hydro for generation of electricity.

However, this year, Kenya did not receive adequate rainfall during the long rains season that normally begins from March

to May. The Kenya Electricity Generating Company says the decrease in rainfall has led to drop of water at the Seven Forks power generation dams, which account for about half of the country's total electricity output.

Chumo said Stima loan program

follows a successful pilot project which begun in 2010 with 53,836 Kenyans benefitting at a total cost of 13.7 million dollars as of June.

Managed as a revolving fund, he said, Stima Loan customers will pay a 20-percent up-front

deposit and repay their loan within a period of 24 months.

"A 5-percent administration fee is charged on the loaned amount. The period of disbursing subsequent Stima loan tranche amounting to 5.4 million dollars will depend on loan uptake".

# Our Traditional 'Matatu Culture' Traits Can Be Found At Fairs And Exhibitions

I was having a drink with **Kachumbari** last week when he said that Kenya is now officially a matatu culture country.

The group in which we were seated protested at his utterances and asked him why he thought so about the country of his birth.

He was silent for a while whilst the gathering his thoughts and the rest of the team started airing their views on the subject matter.

The key point that was debated for some time was what exactly was matatu culture?

The first obvious characteristic that comes to mind is the fact that people associated with the trade in detail tend to be cantankerous.

They will not talk quietly especially in the presence of people whom they do not know or do not know well enough.

It is interesting to observe that the matatu operators tend to be reasonably sensible and quiet when it is only themselves involved in an activity.

When talking to passengers and anyone else it is as though the recipient of eh message is deaf or considered to be far away.

So the first characteristic is that when they are by themselves they talk quietly and in normal voices.

However, when talking to their customers and other strangers the sound level of their voices goes up by a magnitude of three or four.

A matatu park or stop is thus a place you do not want to be.

The next characteristic is that the matatu operators are prone to violent behaviour.

Sometimes it happens when they are provoked by someone undermining them in words or when they are restrained physically from doing what they consider is their right.

If physically restrained, they will take the law into their own hands and do whatever is necessary to remove the restraint and they will revert back to their cantankerous selves.

If they are provoked verbally then a shouting match ensues and they are not averse to mock charges and shadow boxing in order to intimidate the people who are provoking them.

If one stops then they quickly switch back to the amiable cantankerous.

If not then they will become violent and take matters to a conclusion.

The third characteristic is that matatu operators have swarm like behaviour.

If a new opportunity opens then within a very short time there is a mass of matatus and a new "route" is opened up.

The same happens when a pedestrian route opens up.

They will quickly create a matatu stop and give the place a name. If one tries to restrain them then they will take the law into their own hands.

They will force the issue or boycott a service that would have already existed.

The fourth characteristic that has permeated our society is

that of what we agreed to call the soap box oratory syndrome.

We were not sure whether this was first popularised by politicians or by matatu operators.

The syndrome is characterised in their dealing with issues that concern the group by holding

will find several scenes where a villain or hero speaks to a crowd from some kind of oratory platform and that meeting is where they will resolve issues.

There were several other characteristics that defined the matatu culture but these four - namely, cantankerous, violent, swarming and soap box oratory syndrome - are the keyones that define the matatu culture.

If we look at the goings on around us, one will find all or some of these characteristics defining how we do things.

Start with the call to industrial action and how it is done - one will find these characteristics.

Move on to the arena of politics and how we carry on political engagement, especially with the main political parties and we find some of the matatu culture featuring in the modus operandi.

Go to exhibitions and fairs and the some of the matatu culture traits can be found.

The one place that I least expected to find this was at the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport on Nairobi.

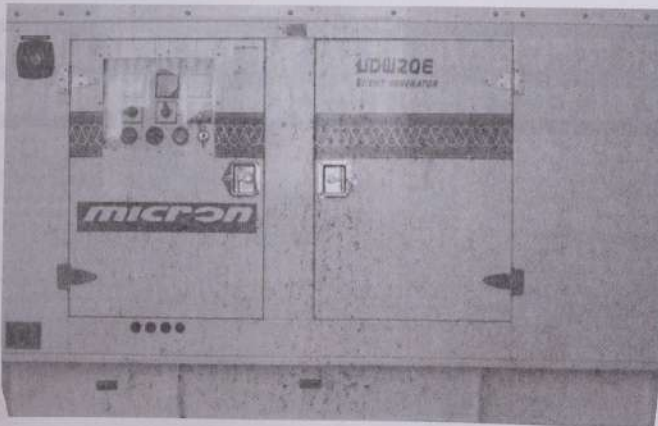

# CHELI AND PEACOCK TRUST TREAT OVER 500 PATIENTS AT THE MAASAI MARA CAMP

Last month the Cheli and Peacock Community Trust held its third medical camp at the Aitong Health Centre, not far from Elephant Pepper Camp in the Maasai Mara.

The three-day camp took place from 24th - 26th June 2014 and focussed on adult health, maternal child health (including cervical cancer screening and family planning), nutrition and dentistry.

The main aim of the camp was to concentrate on these four areas of health, while also making the capacity of the staff

clinicians and Community Health Workers.

Working with our partners Safarilink Aviation and The Kicheche Community Trust, a team of six were flown to the Mara North Conservancy for the medical camp and stayed at the nearby Elephant Pepper Camp.

Dr Anne Kihara, Dr Rose Kosgel, Dr Irene Marete, Dr Sarah Awino and three dentistry experts kindly volunteered their time to work alongside health centre staff to treat an impressive 544 patients!

The majority of patients required paediatric attention, while others were treated for obs and gynae related matters,

general ailments and dentistry.

Fantastic progress was made with general outreach although, to build a way forward with the community, the Trust has highlighted that more training on early diagnosis, prevention of infection, dietary issues that place severe pressure on dental care and male attitudes to family planning needs to be the focus of future work with the Aitong Health Centre.

It was also agreed that collaborating with other partners and clinics in the area, alongside the Ministry of Health would also bring great benefit.

The Cheli and Peacock Community Trust, its partners and volunteers are already planning the next medical camp in November/December this year, which will look to build the capacity of Aitong clinic staff through training on key health-related issues (such as Emergency Obstetric and Neonatal Care) and also branch into other clinics nearby.

Commenting on the medical camp Stefano Cheli, Owner of Cheli and Peacock says: "We began this medical camp in 2012 and, since its inception, the team of experts and the wonderful staff at the clinic have provided free medical care to over 1,200 members of the local community on the edge of the Mara North Conservancy.

"We are immensely grateful not only to our partners and

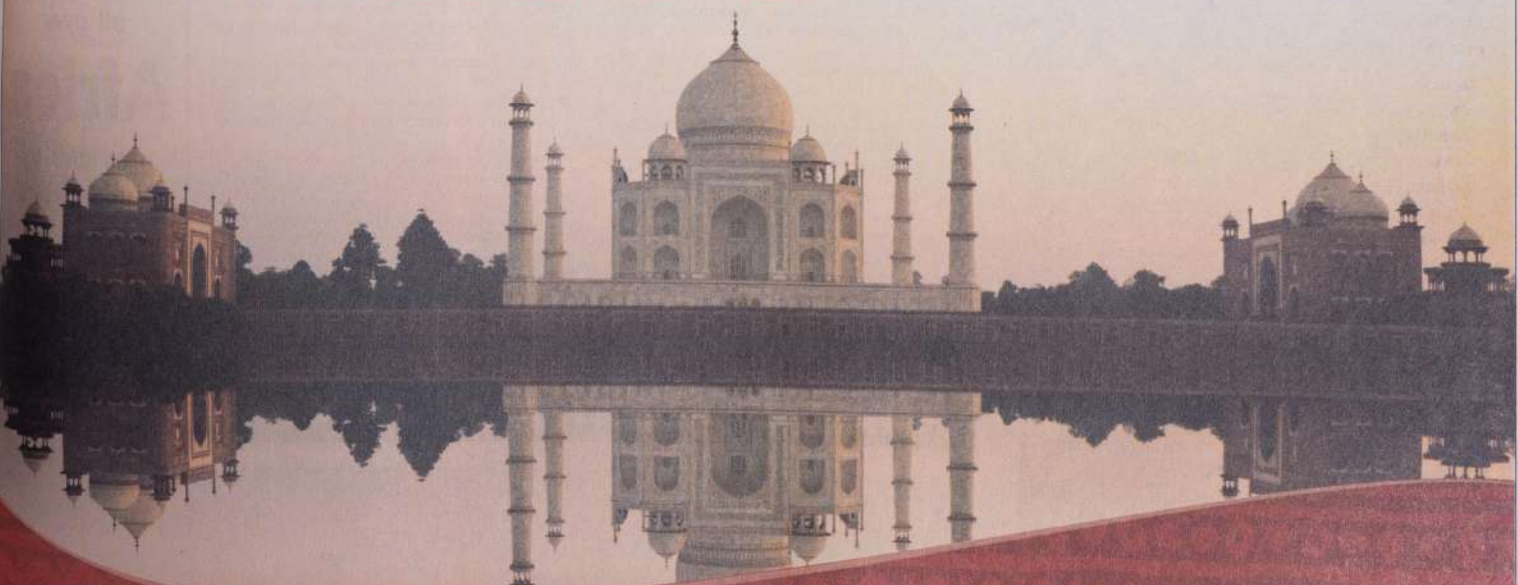

# UNEMPLOYMENT RATE STANDS AT 12.7 PERCENT

## Government Is In Process Of Developing A National Employment Policy

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** – Kenya is in the process of developing a national employment policy as the unemployment rate currently stands at 12.7 per cent, a senior government official has confirmed.

The policy, which aims to create more job opportunities for the young Kenyan, is currently awaiting parliament's approval, Anne Waiguru, Secretary of the Devolution and Planning Cabinet, told a regional youth forum in Nairobi.

"Under the policy, all major investments and projects in the country will be subjected to systematic analysis to determine their employment creation potential before they are adopted for implementation," Waiguru said during the opening ceremony of the Eighth Extraordinary Youth Summit on International Conference on Great Lakes Region (ICGLR).

Waiguru said the unemployment rate currently stands at 12.7 per cent and mostly affects the youth between the ages of 18-35 years, who account for over 30 per cent of the total population in Kenya.

The five-day event brought the region's youth leaders and policy makers to examine the status of youth employment in the region as well as review ingenious interventions of addressing youth unemployment.

The 12 member states include Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, Angola, Burundi, Central African Republic, Republic of Congo, Democratic Republic of Congo, Zambia, South Sudan, Sudan and Tanzania.

"All State departments are conducting analysis to determine number of jobs they can create for the youth," Waiguru said.

She added that Kenya has

been trying to put in place sustainable and dignified employment opportunities since it gained independence in 1963.

Government statistics showed that Kenya is experiencing a

youth bulge as the youth population has grown from 3.3 million in 1969 to about 16 million at present.

"A higher proportion of workers are found in the rural

areas where employment opportunities are fewer, and access to information is low," she said.

"This has led to high rural to urban migration among young people, with resultant social and economic implications," Waiguru said.

ICGLR Executive Secretary Professor Ntumba Luaba said that the biggest challenge confronting the youth today in the region is creating youth employment.

"We should also draw more and more from the talents and creativity that accompany youthfulness," he said.

The executive secretary noted that the 12 states of the ICGLR have diverse experiences and approaches in dealing with youth unemployment.

## Australian Firm Swala Energy Seeks To Drill Kenya Oil Block

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** – Australian oil and gas firm Swala Energy on Monday expressed its commitment to drill the first exploration well in Block 12B onshore Kenya under its product sharing contract (PSC).

The firm's CEO David Mestress Ridge said in a statement issued in Nairobi that recent seismic results have provided technical comfort to both Tullow and Swala to make an informed decision to proceed into year 3 and 4 of the PSC.

"Under the terms of the PSC the joint venture is obliged to acquire 300 square kilometers of 3D seismic data on exploration well during years 3 and 4," Ridge said in the statement.

"The interpreted data received so far from the recently completed seismic survey over Block 12B has given Swala and Tullow firm confidence to continue to work to drill an exploration well in 2015," he added.

Swala Energy Ltd said in June it has completed a binding farm-out agreement for a 25 per cent working interest in its Block 12B onshore Kenya with Spanish integrated oil and gas company, CEPSA Kenya.

Under the terms of the farm out, Swala will retain a 25 per cent net working interest in Block 12B, CEPSA will also hold a 25-per cent net working interest and Tullow Oil will retain the remaining 50 per cent interest and operatorship of the joint venture.

The farm out was first announced on March 10 although CEPSA requested confidentially until the completion of the deal.

At the time the agreement was subject to the consent of the Kenyan government and competition authority of Kenya.

Under the terms of the deal, CEPSA will reimburse the company for its past costs and carry Swala through two exploration wells up to a maximum of 7.5 million U.S. dollars for each one if CEPSA decides to participate.

## I.F.C. And BIDCO Sign U.S. \$36.5 Million Dollars Loan agreements

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** – The World Bank's private lending arm International Finance Corporation (IFC) on Thursday inked a 36.5 million U.S. dollar loan agreement with consumer group firm BIDCO.

IFC Head of Manufacturing for Sub Saharan Africa German Vegarra told a news conference in Nairobi that the financial assistance will help BIDCO to expand into new market categories.

"The seven year loan will be extended at prevailing market rates," Vegarra said. BIDCO is a major agribusiness player in Africa and produces over 40 different brands of edible oils, detergents, soaps and animal feeds.

IFC said that BIDCO could transform itself into pan African company in the next five years.

The firm currently has operations in Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda and Tanzania.

He noted that the funds will help create more

opportunities for small scale farmers who supply BIDCO with raw materials.

Vegarra said that BIDCO is one of the firms that is bringing global manufacturing practices to Kenya.

"We expect it to share its expertise with other players in the manufacturing industry in order to improve the global competitiveness of Kenyan firms," he said.

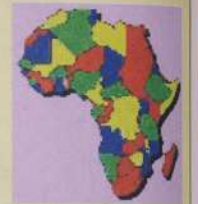
BIDCO Executive Director Tarun Shah said the funds will help the firm to set up new manufacturing plants in Kenya.

"The growing purchasing power of Kenyans is fueling increasing demand for consumer goods," he said.

BIDCO Director Vimal Shah said that approximately 10,000 farmers supply his firm with oil seeds.

"These farmers have been given training and assistance in order to enhance their productivity," Shah said.

This includes academic skills such as numeracy and general knowledge as well as use of computers.

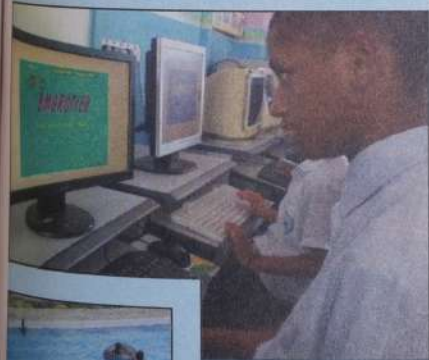
As part of vocational training, children learn jewellery making and screen weaving.

# Poachers Kill Female Black Rhino In Ol Pejeta Sanctuary

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** -- East Africa's largest black rhino sanctuary Ol Pejeta said Thursday it has lost a female black rhino after succumbing to injuries sustained during armed attack last Thursday in Laikipia, northwest Kenya.

Ol Pejeta CEO Richard Vigne said the eight-year old animal named Malkia had birthed her first calf exactly a month prior to the attack by armed poachers who escaped and managed to spare the rhino.

During the attack, the calf was separated from her mother and was killed by a pride of lions. She was injured. Tragically, Malkia also died. She succumbed to her injuries a day after the attack, Vigne said in a statement.

"We remain devastated by this loss and you can rest assured that we will continue to review

and improve every aspect of our security operations," he said.

He said the rampant poaching has reached unprecedented highs as the price of rhino horn has surpassed that of gold,

prompting poachers to take greater risks.

The latest incident comes after the wildlife conservancy dropped its plans to deploy drone in the fight against rampant poaching after the government banned its use for security reasons.

Vigne said the plans to launch the "aerial ranger" to enhance protection of wildlife had been stopped due to rising insecurity.

Poachers target especially rhinos and elephants for their tusks and skins, which fetch a lot of money in the black market particularly in Asia.

The east African nation has already created a multi agency anti-poaching crack unit, which has been deployed in the poaching hotspots.

The Treasury has already allocated 2.31 million U.S. dollars for the operations of the unit.

## GOVERNMENT WILL BUILD 'CRADLE OF MANKIND' PALEONTOLOGICAL CENTRE

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** -- Kenya is planning to build a paleontology centre that will help make the country as the cradle of mankind.

Culture Cabinet Secretary Ali Wario told journalists in Nairobi said the centre will be completed in the next three years.

"We need to take advantage of Kenya's huge fossils reservoir in order to boost the tourism sector," Wario said during a conference on international tourism practices.

The two day event brought participants to review ways of promoting of heritage tourism.

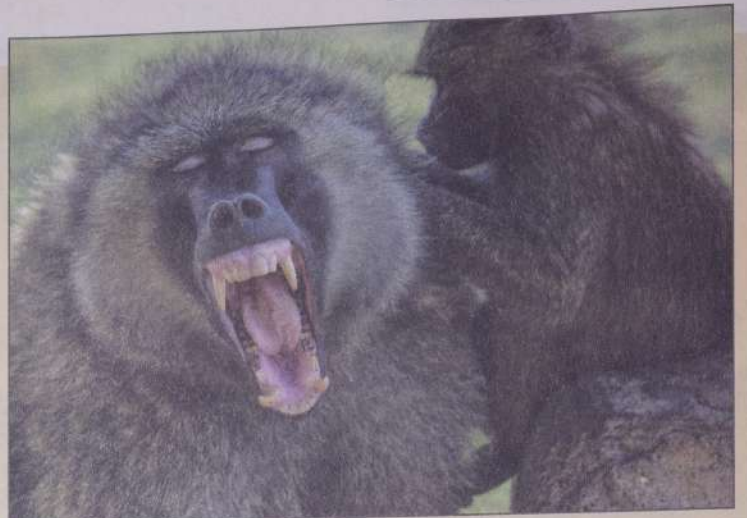
He said the center which includes a research facility will be built in the Lake Turkana region in northwest Kenya.

Lake Turkana is home to one of the largest fossils collection in the world and is also the location where the oldest complete human skeleton called Turkana boy was found.

Wario said that the government is currently engaging experts to design the facility.

"The region is largely inaccessible due to lack of infrastructure such as road, water and power networks," he said.

He added that the facility will be built through public private partnerships.

## TOURISTS LOVE BABOONS

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** -- Baboon tourism is a rapidly growing sector of Kenya's tourism sector, industry said on Wednesday.

Shirley Strum, Director of Uaso Ngiro Baboon Project (UNBP) said in Nairobi that Baboon tourism gives an opportunity for communities to benefit from abundant wildlife species that can often be a problem to them.

"People are interested in watching primates and they are a lot easier to see compared to other wildlife species," Strum said during a tourism forum in Nairobi.

UNBP has been conducting Baboons and cattle walks in conjunction with the Masai community in the country's range lands.

"The aim is to provide an opportunity for tourists to learn about the primates as well as the rich Masai livestock culture," she said.

Primate tourism started in Africa in the 1970s. Kenya has no gorillas but has plenty of baboons.

"They are suitable for tourism purposes as they are not prone to getting diseases," she said.

She noted that on average, it costs 20 U.S. dollars to view Baboons compared to 600 dollars per day for viewing gorillas.

UNBP Project Programme Officer Deborah Nightingale said local communities have developed knowledge on baboons. She said the project has helped reduce the negative attitude towards Baboons. "They are considered as pest due to their destruction of livestock and property," Nightingale said.

# HMAS Darwin Seized Narcotics Worth U.S. \$1.9 Billion Dollars During Five Month Deployment

Combined Maritime Forces HMAS Darwin has completed her highly successful deployment to Middle East in support of Combined Maritime Forces (CMF) and is now heading home to Sydney.

Deployed under tasking to CMF's Combined Task Force 150 (CTF-150) HMAS Darwin and her Ship's Company seized narcotics with a street value of more than USD 1.9 billion during their five month long deployment.

Over this period, HMAS Darwin had been supporting CTF-150 in the mission to promote maritime security and to counter terrorist acts and related illegal activities.

Darwin has been the backbone of CTF-150 operations and achieved remarkable success.

During a series of often long and difficult boarding operations they seized in excess of twelve metric tonnes of narcotics and hold the record for the largest ever single seizure of heroin (1,032 kg) in CMF's history.

Over six tons of hashish found concealed onboard a dhow by HMAS Darwin's boarding team.

During the deployment, Darwin has also undertaken a number of Safety Of Life At Sea (SOLAS) actions including the rescue of eleven fishermen and two children, found adrift off the coast of Pakistan in March after

their vessel had sunk five days earlier.

The ship also conducted a delicate medivac operation of a French fisherman who had suffered a heart attack.

HMAS Darwin's Commanding Officer, Commander Terry Morrison, is extremely proud of the efforts of his crew and notes that their success sets a high bar for other ships following in their footsteps.

He said: "This team of highly-trained sailors has performed incredibly well in everything from search and rescue operations, to making significant drug interdictions that will effectively impact funding for extremist and terrorist organisations."

"We have followed in the wake of a long succession of Australian and other CMF warships and we wish the crew of HMAS Toowoomba a very successful deployment."

HMAS Darwin is the 57th Australian warship to deploy to the Middle East since the first Gulf War in 1990.

## IF YOU WANT TO SELL GOODS IN KENYA, THEN YOU MUST PACK THEM IN SMALL QUANTITIES!

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Shop keeper Antony Musau does not remember the last time he sold a 2.87 U.S. dollars mobile phone airtime scratch card in his**

**shop in eastern Nairobi.**

"I am not certain, but I think it is early last year.

"That was the last time I stocked the card because people do not buy it," recounted Musau.

While he once stocked the 2.87 dollars card, Musau has never sold the 5.7 dollars and 11.5 dollars cards in the four year he has operated the shop.

"Those are cards that I will never touch.

"No one will buy them.

"I do not want to tie my money in something that will not go," said the trader who runs the shop in Komarock, a middle-income estate.

Musau, as many other traders in suburbs across Nairobi, has shunned the high value cards as consumers give them a wide berth.

"The most popular cards with mobile phone users are the 0.23 dollars, 0.57 dollars and 1.2 dollars cards. These cards fly off the shelves like hot cakes.

"You only bring the high value cards at your own peril," noted Musau.

However, of the three cards, what go most are the 0.23 dollars and 0.57 dollars.

The 1.2 dollars scratch card, according to Musau, is popular among the older generation.

The buying habits have made shopkeeper Carlos Ngugi, as Musau, stock lower value denomination scratch cards than the 1.2 dollars.

The popularity of the small value cards has seen airtime sellers, including in the city centre, shun the high value scratch cards.

Analysts note that it is not unusual for Kenyans to shun the high value cards, as the same is happening with other goods.

"If you want to sell goods in Kenya, then you must pack them in small quantities.

"This is a lesson manufacturers know too well, the reason why they sell goods in smaller packages," said Nairobi-based economics lecturer Henry Wandera.

Wandera noted that things are not any different with airtime, which is not in the first category of basic needs.

"When you go to shops, especially in middle-income estates, many people, for instance, buy bread and milk first, then ask for airtime, not the other way round.

"It shows where airtime lies in order of importance, the reason why people prefer the small value cards."

The low denomination scratch cards until recently were popular in rural Kenya and among the urban poor due to low incomes.

"The cost of living is rising. When this happens, people budget for things that are basic to them first because they can touch others. It does not matter the levels of income or social class one belongs, this happens naturally."

While among the low-income earners people may shun completely things like airtime, with the middle-income earners, consumers budget everything.

"This is the reason 0.23 dollars and 0.57 dollars airtime are moving faster unlike before when many would go for 1.2 dollars airtime.

## MAPUTO IN TALKS WITH E.C. ON FISH

**MAPUTO (Xinhua) -- The government of Mozambique and the European Union (EU) are in negotiations on the latest protocol to the Sustainable Fisheries Partnership Agreement in the capital of Maputo.**

The present protocol allows 43 purse seiners and 32 surface longliners flying the flag of an EU member state to catch a total of 8,000 tonnes of tuna per year in Mozambique.

In return, the EU pays the Mozambican government 980,000 euros (about 1.35 million U.S. dollars) annually out of which 460,000 euros is earmarked for the support of the fisheries policy to promote sustainability.

The next protocol will be different to previous editions, as the former Portuguese colony has embarked upon rapidly building its own tuna fishing industry.

Mozambican Fisheries Minister, Victor Borges, said that trade links between his government and the EU are very strong, and Mozambique is striving hard to meet EU demand on fish standard.

Borges also said that Mozambique now produces more than 200,000 tonnes of fish per year, adding that by next year, the catch will be 300,000 tonnes.

The Mozambican government is importing fishing boats from France. On Monday, five boats that will form part of Mozambique's tuna fishing fleet began their journey to Maputo from the French port of Cherbourg.

The government has argued that the creation of a national tuna fishing fleet will bring in revenue of about 90 million U.S. dollars a year and create 1,500 job opportunities, helping the country become one of the main fish suppliers in the southern African region.



## Spanish Navy Joins 'Operation Atalanta'

Spanish frigate *ESPS Navarra* has joined the EU Naval Force Somalia Operation Atalanta. Over the next five months the task of the 214 men and women on board will be to deter, prevent and repress acts of piracy and armed robbery in the piracy high risk areas and escort World Food Programme (WFP) and African Mission in Somalia (AMISOM) vessels in the Gulf of Aden and Indian Ocean to protect them from pirate attack. This is the second time that she has deployed with Operation Atalanta, the first deployment being in 2010. The Spanish frigate has a Sikorsky helicopter embarked.

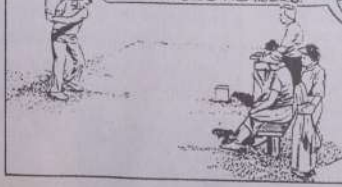

## Kenya Plot To Defuse Cook Islands Assault

NAIROBI (Xinhua) — Kenya have made strides in

Sevens rugby evolution and are confident to clinch a medal during the Commonwealth Games which start in Glasgow on Wednesday.

The team of 12 players and seven officials left Nairobi on Monday for the Scottish capital, their hard work in training camp will end on the medal podium in Glasgow. Captain Andrew Amonde said it will be a morale booster if they secured gold.

"We are all committed to the course. Playing for Kenya is a gesture nobody can pass on. We are all selected on merit and we must return the same favor and trust that the coaches and the fans have with us," Amonde said on Monday in Nairobi.

Kenya team dubbed "Shujaa", who were eliminated by Australia in Main Cup quarter-finals of the 2010 edition, are in Pool B alongside rivals South Africa, Cook Islands, Trinidad and Tobago for the rugby competition that will take place on the weekend of July 26-27 at the Ibrox Stadium.

Head coach Paul Treu has recalled veteran Oscar Ouma and captain Andrew Amonde, who missed the final round of the 2013/14 IRB Sevens World Series due to injury, back to the team.

Ouma has replaced French-based winger William Ambaka who suffered an ankle injury ahead of the 2015 Rugby World Cup qualifiers.

Kenya will open the campaign with a match against Cook Islands on Saturday. They will then face Trinidad and Tobago and South Africa to determine who progress to the Main Cup

quarters. Treu said he has opted to blend his squad to give younger players a chance to blossom and gain some experience ahead of the Rio 2016 Olympics Games.

"The focus is on Rio 2016. But we have to put our foot down and get some results in tournaments like the Commonwealth Games. Then we will be able to access the players performance and see who is best suited to play in which position," said Treu.

It will be the second major tournament for Treu, who picked up the mantle from Englishman Mike Friday last year.

In his first task in the International Rugby Board (IRB) World Series, Treu helped Kenya

to finish in seventh position.

It is paramount for the team to perform well as the International Rugby Board (IRB) has picked the World Series as one of the tournaments where the first four out of the core 18 teams will make it to the 2016 Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

"Glasgow is part of our preparations for the new IRB season and 2016 Olympics, but also a chance for us to make Kenya proud after Simba XV failed to qualify for the World Cup. It's definitely going to be a tough tournament, but being the first time for some of us to participate in a multi-sport event, we want to leave a mark," said Treu.

## NAIROBI HOSTS WORLD HOCKEY LEAGUE SERIES

NAIROBI (Xinhua) — Six teams have confirmed participation in the International Hockey Federation (FIH) World Hockey League Series in Nairobi from Sept. 2 to 7.

The competition will serve as a qualifier for the 2015 World League Championships.

African Hockey Federation (AFHF) had initially granted the hosting rights to Zimbabwe, but the southern Africa state declined, citing lack of a certified international playing pitch.

"It is an honor for AFHF to give us the chance to host the tournament, just months after hosting another successful continental championship in Nairobi," Nahashon Randiek, the Kenya Hockey Union (KHU) Chairman, said on Tuesday in Nairobi.

"The preparations are going on well. I believe Kenya has a great chance of qualifying to the global journey on home soil. We failed to South Africa for the World Cup in Netherlands earlier this year and hopefully, this time round, we will get it right."

Randiek said Kenya was given the rights to host the event by virtue of having successfully hosted

major tournaments in the recent past, including Africa Cup of Nation last year.

At the end of World League Series one, top teams (both men and women) will qualify for the second round, where they both face South Africa, who were given a bye after winning the Africa Cup of Nations last year.

The event has attracted Ghana, Zimbabwe, Kenya, Egypt, Nigeria and Tanzania, and will see five men's and four women's teams battle it out for a spot in the round two.

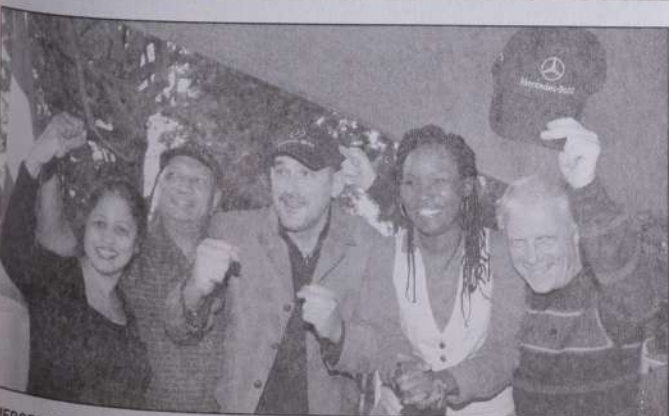
It is important for Kenya to win because all the finalists at the World League Series, which will be played in Uruguay in July 2015, will earn an automatic entry to the Rio 2016 Olympics Games.

Hosts Kenya, Ghana, Nigeria, and Tanzania will field both men and women's teams while Egypt will send only the men's team.

The world league round one is open to all teams where the winners from all regions proceed to league two where they join teams ranked from 12-19 on the FIH world ranking.

The winners of round two advance to the semi-finals where they lock horns with the world's best in hockey ranked 1-11 in the world.

NAIROBI (Xinhua) — The Kenyan women's marathon team for the Commonwealth Games in Glasgow suffered a blow on Monday hours before departure when Birmingham World Half silver medalist Philes Ongori was forced out of the squad with injury.

Ongori, who ran a marathon career best of 2:23:22 for a ninth finish in Boston in April, finished second in Prague last year and was seeking first honors for her nation over the ultimate distance on what was

to be her debut Club Games.

Paris marathon winner Filomena Cheyech who ran her lifetime best of 2:22:44 in the French capital on Apr. 6 and 2011 Boston champion, Caroline Kilel, who won Frankfurt last year in a 2:22:34 personal best, will now chase the medals for Kenya as the podium sweep dream ended with Ongori's heartbreaking withdrawal.

The news was confirmed to local website Capital Sport by Athletics Kenya president and Track and Field team manager Paul Mutwii ahead of their scheduled departure for Scotland Monday night.

"Ongori is not coming with us because she reported to me two days ago that her recurring injury has failed to heal and therefore requested to excuse her self from the team," Mutwii said in Nairobi.

Kilel, who was compelled to cancel her initial flight to Scotland on Sunday after her name was wrongly printed on her ticket, is confident they will deliver the top medal despite the Ongori injury blow.

"I have trained well and being my first time to compete, I want to bring gold home. I ran in the Glasgow course back in 2009 where I finished fourth. Because I'm familiar with the route, I believe I will win a medal. We are strong despite Ongori pulling out in the last minute. Cheyech and I have personal bests of 2:22," she said.

Chege grabbed his second immediately after the restart, the lanky frontman leaping head and shoulders above the rest to head home Kitale's 6th goal.

Kennedy Mwenda and Joseph Thuo also found the back of the net before full time

to ensure Kitale whitewashed a hapless Bomet 8-0 and book their slot in the national finals.

Kitale Starlets were not quite as ruthless but they did a similar job as their boys' counterparts.

They won 2-0 against Nakuru Starlets in their knockout match before edging Naivasha Site 4-2 in post match penalties.

Sinathe Baraza netted the solitary goal in the 1-0 win over Cherangany in the final, a result that booked them a date in the national spectacle.

The two Kitale teams join Nairobi's JMJ Academy, Beijing Girls and Kibra League Queens as well as Eastern's Black Cats and Maragwa Queens who already qualified from their provincial finals.

Others who have advanced to the nationals are Kisumu Lakers and Nyamira Girls from Nyanza as well as Murhanda and Shinyalu Girls from Western.

The last leg of the provincial finals will be played in Coast before teams assemble for the nationals slated to begin on the August 9.
