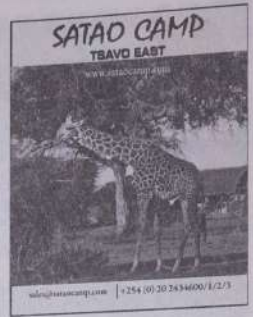

## Hotpoint And LG Electronics Partner With Kikuyu Hospital

A total of 950 beneficiaries have received replacement limbs.

Patients with various physical deformities will benefit from artificial limbs thanks to a Ksh 2.5 million sponsorship from Hotpoint Appliances Limited and LG Electronics.

The artificial limbs used in the treatment are imported from Switzerland.

The PCEA Kikuyu Orthopedic and Rehabilitation Centre (KORC) is one of the few facilities in Kenya that provide orthopedic, reconstructive surgery and rehabilitation for patients with physical deformities.

The partnership which has been ongoing since 2005 has benefitted over 950 patients most of whom come from poor backgrounds and could not afford the treatment costs.

Under the partnership, PCEA Kikuyu Orthopedic and Rehabilitation center and the two partners will cost-share labor and personnel for the entire process of the operation which will cover the full cost of pre-screening of the patients and any other logistics for the project.

## E-Wastes Turns Into Lucrative Goldmine

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** — It is becoming clearer that the electronic waste such as dead mobile phones and TV sets are not just a nuisance but a lucrative goldmine that can give the country a huge economic boost.

As Kenyans dump their old and dysfunctional electronic gadgets and go for newer and latest versions, there is growing demand for recycling such gadgets to retrieve valuable components.

Most electronic devices contain a variety of materials, including metals that can be recovered for future uses.

National Environmental Management Authority Deputy Director for Environmental Awareness Betty Nzicka said that e-waste offers a huge economic opportunity for Kenya, terming it as "urban mining" to retrieve valuable metals from discarded electronic equipment.

"As Kenyans focus on looking for minerals under the ground, let them know that in e-waste there is a lucrative opportunity before our very eyes."

"This form of mining metals and other valuables from e-waste deserve much more attention than it is receiving," she Nzioka on Tuesday.

She added that by recycling e-waste, people can not only protect their own health, but also the environment. "And we could also making big money out of it," she said.

She explained that the new e-waste Regulations to be gazetted soon will be a big boost to the recycling sector since it places obligations on manufacturers of electronic equipment to ensure that their products are recycled once they reach their end of life.

UN Under-Secretary-General and the Executive Director of UNEP Achim Steiner said that the sustainable management of e-waste can combat poverty and generate green jobs through recycling, collection and processing of e-waste.

"Smart public policies, creative financial incentives and technology transfer can turn e-waste from a challenge into an important resource for sustainable development," Steiner asserts.

According to UNEP, e-waste is now Kenya's fastest growing waste components with over 17,000 tonnes of electronic waste generated in Kenya annually.

This includes 11,400 tonnes of e-waste from refrigerators, 2, 800 tonnes from TVs, 2,500 tonnes from personal computers, 500 tonnes from printers and 150 tonnes from mobile phones every year.

In addition, it is also estimated that 15,000 tonnes of used computers and mobile phones are shipped to Kenya every year, which degenerate quickly into e-waste after only a few years of use.

The Kenya Industrial Research and Development Institute (KIRDI) CEO Dr. Charles Muturi said although e-waste presents a serious threat to human and environmental health if not properly disposed off, they also present a significant economic opportunity if managed well.

## Government To Increase Security For Tourist Area

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** -- The Kenya government will enhance security patrols in the environs of tourism facilities across the country for the safety of tourists.

Commerce and Tourism Principal Secretary Ibrahim Mohammed said in a statement that although adequate security has been provided within tourism facilities, their surroundings also needed security vigilance.

In order to enhance visitor's safety, patrols by the Tourist Police Unit (TPU) will be stepped up within the environs of tourism facilities with additional personnel.

"We also urge stake holders in the industry to maintain security arrangements currently in place," Mohammed said.

More than 20 people were killed in attacks on the coast in the townships of Hindi and Gamba.

However, officials at the Kenya Tourism Board (KTB) said neither Hindi nor Gamba are areas frequented by international tourists and there were no tourists in the area at the time of the incidents.

It added that Lamu Island, one of Kenya's primary tourist resorts, was in no way affected by these attacks.

KTB said the majority of visitors traveling to Lamu arrive by air into the local airport.

In a statement issued on Tuesday after chairing National Tourism Crisis Committee meeting, Mohammed said the upcoming recruitment of additional police officers was in the right direction in improving security in the country.

He assured tourists of their safety during their tour of the country and termed the shooting incident as unfortunate and a rare occurrence.

## COAST COUNTY RECORD HIGHEST SUPPORT FOR NEW 'TOBACCO TAXES'

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** -- More than 80 percent of Kenyans support taxation on tobacco products to help curb tobacco related illness, according to a recent survey.

An opinion poll conducted by Ipsos Synovate says tobacco use is not only a chief contributor to non-communicable diseases and deaths, but also a negatively impact on economic development in the country.

The survey commissioned by the International Institute for Legislative Affairs showed that out of those interviewed, 70 per cent admitted to knowing that cigarettes should not be sold to persons under the age of 18 years.

According to the survey conducted between April 28 to May 7, Coast County recorded the highest support to the introduction of taxes on tobacco products at 90 per cent while Nairobi County recorded the lowest at 65 per cent.

A majority of male and female respondents living in both urban and rural areas were in favor of an increase in taxation on tobacco products.

Kenya falls below the 70 percent tobacco tax threshold as recommended by World Health Organization (WHO).

Research shows a correlation between prolonged lives with increased taxation on tobacco products.

Less than half of the respondents knew about laws on tobacco use.

Only 10 per cent were well-informed that cigarettes should not be sold as stick, but rather in a packet.

Statistics indicate a decline in real cigarette tax revenue even as consumption increases. Cigarette tax yield share has fallen from 35 per cent to 30 per cent between 2000 and 2008.

The reduction in real price of cigarettes coupled with increased consumer incomes has made cigarettes more affordable and therefore accessible even to the youth.

Our final look at what the National Road Transport safety Authority needs to do in order to reduce road accidents will focus on the vehicle standards.

In the early days in Kenya, buses, lorries and a majority of the commercial vehicles were imported as Completely Built Units or CBUs.

They used to reflect the research and technology that had been done by the original equipment manufacturers.

This meant that safety and all its many nuances had been considered before a vehicle was released for public use.

This research continues as we see new models coming out that have to be approved by various national bodies before they are put on the road.

Safety features that have been added over the years include safety belts, air bags, anti brake lock systems, run flat tyres, crumple zones and many more.

Some of the more subtle ones include bonnet symbols that collapse.

The most famous is the flying angel that adorns the bonnets of Rolls Royce vehicles.

These vehicles are very rarely seen on Kenyan streets and if they are they tend to be the vintage models that were introduced or imported either in the colonial era or in the period immediately after when we still had very strongly shackled relations with our former colonial masters.

Sadly Kenyans cannot afford this very fine luxury car and as such no agency is willing to set up a franchise for the very few that are present.

The nearest one can talk of a bonnet adornment was the star of the Mercedes Benz.

This used to stand out of the

front end of the bonnet of the vehicle but instead of adopting the folding or collapsible model, the German manufacturer re-located its identity onto the grille.

This collapsible adornment was adopted as a safety feature when it became apparent that many people were gored by the fixed symbols that sat on the bonnets.

More important for us in Kenya is that the many matatus and commercial vehicles on the road should be designed to and operate in accordance with set national safety standards.

What we now have in Kenya is a situation here the commercial vehicles bigger than pick-ups or mini buses are brought in as partially assembled vehicles or Knock Down Kits.

These are assembled by the local assembly plants and then released on the markets for body builders to now construct the load carrying details.

The same chassis can be used for a five tonne commercial vehicle as well as a thirty-seater bus.

The people who assemble these have engineered them to suit the current fads.

They are built to carry the maximum possible load.

The safety factors in design that we are normally used to are thrown out of the window in the pursuit of capacity.

There are no operating instructions issued by the body builders on how to best use the product that they have put on the market.

The only operating manual one gets is the one issued by the engine and chassis manu-

facturer.

A lot of our road accidents are caused by the way in which the vehicles are loaded.

Prime movers that are, say, designed to tow no more than thirty tonnes of gross load are being used to tow much more - sometimes in the range of up to forty tonnes gross.

With the spare capacity that engines have they can generally do so on relatively flat areas.

However when it comes to climbing, such vehicles crawl up inclines in first gear for long distances because they need all the torque that is generated at the low gears to grind up the mountains.

Our road designers have actually taken this into consideration and are putting up what are correctly called crawler lanes on long uphill sections of roads.

This is meant to accommodate the overloaded vehicles that can climb at slow rates.

The problem with this is that level of overloading is different so one gets lorries of similar designs travelling at different speeds.

The drivers try to overtake each other in vehicles that are not capable of accelerating at the desired level.

We thus have two slow vehicles side by side where crawler lanes are provided forcing any smaller, faster vehicle to use the lane meant for oncoming vehicles.

The worst case is where the two vehicles are side by side on a normal single lane highway

(which is most of our roads).

Faster vehicles have to patiently wait till they complete the manoeuvre.

However, our reality is that patience is a very unreliable commodity in Kenya so it is most likely that a following vehicle will go off the road and attempt to overtake the two slow vehicles that are occupying the two lanes.

This means that should the driver encounter an unusual situation when going downhill, they will be unable to stop in time and thus be involved in an accident.

For buses and commercial passenger vehicles the issue is slightly different.

The load bearing compartments are normally at the back or a large carrier is put on the roof.

The luggage space inside the bus is also put above the passengers' heads.

This usually means that buses and matatus are top heavy.

The most likely scenario to cause accidents is when the driver has to make a sudden turn at speed or even a normal corner at high speed.

The top of the bus or matatu will tip over due to the amount of load on top.

The other more likely scenario is that the driver will lose control as the vehicle leans over due to the bad weight distribution.

We can go on and on about the possibilities but hope that these couple of examples illustrates the urgent need for the National Road Transport Safety Authority to set national standards for construction of commercial vehicles.

These do not need to be prescriptive but they should set the safety operational envelopes that vehicles have to meet.

The manufacturers and body builders have to apply for type approval when they are satisfied that the vehicle meets the standards.

They should also be required to prepare simple operational manuals that set the dos and don'ts about using whatever they have designed.

It should then be a requirement that the driving licenses that drivers have are for type approved vehicles and they need to be proven competent to operate the vehicle.

It is very much like airline pilots. Having a pilot's license does not mean that you can jump into any plane and fly it.

One has to go for training and get type approval for a particular type of plane and they then also need to go for regular refresher training - especially on emergency operations in simulations.

I cannot understand why piloting a sophisticated vehicle is any different from piloting a plane especially where on the ground one meets any changing circumstances and conditions whereas in the air it is basically weather and the condition of the machine.

In conclusion, the NTSA needs to really up their game and think seriously about radically reforming the way we manage road transport in the country.

It is not sufficient to simply put out legislation.

There must be a redesign of everything - vehicle standards, road standards, teaching standards, driving standards, policing and enforcement standards as well as a clear continuous improvement process that ensures that they keep abreast but preferably ahead of the emerging new challenges to safety on the roads.

As Kachumbari says, the NTSA has its work cut out and we hope they have the acumen and the courage to go out and make a step change and a tangible difference to driving safety on our roads.



This is a recipe for accidents.

On coming vehicles normally have to get off the road - if they can that is.

Typically, you will also have overloaded vehicles going downhill and under these circumstances, the drivers tend to free wheel to save on fuel which they sell off to roadside fuel merchant - these are the shabbily dressed young men one sees at the side of the roads waving jerry cans at passing motorists.

Their aim is to buy whatever they can from these 'frugal drivers' and sell to others at a cheap price whereby they also keep some of the employer's money!

The overloaded lorries accelerate much faster going downhill and they find it difficult to brake since the braking systems cannot cope with the excess load and speed (call that momentum) that such an overloaded vehicle has.

A graphic novel addressing the global ivory trade and slaughter of African elephants titled 'A Dangerous Life' was launched at a ceremony hosted at the Library of Congress famed Thomas Jefferson Building.

In vivid illustrations and text, it tells the story of a teen girl from America whose family made a fortune in the early 20th Century from elephant ivory.

She and the Chinese and Kenyan friends she meets on her trip vow to save elephants and educate people about ivory and where it comes from.

The KWS Deputy Director of

Strategy and Change Mr. Edwin Wanyonyi spoke at the event of the enormous task of stopping poachers on the ground.

"KWS officers are right now conducting surveillance efforts and investigations trying to identify trafficking gangs so that they can be arrested and prosecuted".

But he added "we are fighting international criminal syndicates that are motivated by extremely powerful financial incentives. Our hope is that the novel will educate and inspire young readers to become advocates for conservation and help society turn away from ivory."

"It is important that young people all over the world understand the true cost of ivory to innocent elephant lives" remarked AWI President Cathy Liss. We need to the world to know that this is happening and that we must not only support strong enforcement but cut off demand.

Kenya is being featured at the Smithsonian Institutes Folk life Festival under the theme of Kenya, Mambo Poa. The book will be distributed at the festival and will also be distributed in Kenya and in particular to visitors of Kenya's national parks.

# Ports Authority chairman Danson Mungatana Emphasises 'Safety And Health During Work'

**Kenya Ports Authority chairman Hon. Danson Mungatana has emphasised: "We take safety and Health and Safety very seriously."**

Speaking at the port during celebration of the recent International Labour Organization 'World Day for Safety and Health at Work' he noted:

"We have had very serious accidents lately in the port and looking at our statistics, they have been rising.

"In the first quarter of 2014 106 accidents cases were reported in the port up from 90 accidents that happened during the same period in 2013."

The most recent accident case was the fatal accident involving a vessel which hit a portal crane along berth no.7.

The crane toppled into the ocean and hit an escaping ship clerk on the head, resulting into

a fatal injury.

Common causes of accidents in the port include:

- Debris left behind after construction works

- Potholes, manholes, leaking roof and blocked drainages in KPA Housing Estates have not been repaired and unblocked.

- Lack of appropriate road signage along the main roads within the port area

- The performance of Departmental Safety Committees Meetings is still wanting.

Action need to be taken to avert the situation.

- Carelessness of drivers and pedestrians

- Not using PPEs (Personal Protective Equipment) in operation areas.

Control Measures put in place include:

- Training of employees in matters of safety has been prioritized as provided for in the HSE Management System.

- All equipment be in good working condition prior to engagement.

- Enhanced supervision at the work place.

- All employees should be made aware and sensitized on the importance of adhering to the HSE Rules and Regulations

- PPE's should be utilized by ALL employees at work place.

"I am calling upon all stake holders, including the traffic police to intensify vigilance in order to get rid of bad safety habits in the port roads.

"I equally ask the KPA safety officers not to relent in the fight to have safe working place.

"Please make sure that staff are properly kitted with PPEs and they must use them while at work. Anybody found in operations area without PPEs must be appropriately disciplined."

The fact is, sensible safe guards that require employers

to protect their workers in workplaces to become more efficient, more productive, more innovative, more competitive and more profitable.

The empirical evidence is clear. Regulations do not kill jobs. They stop jobs from killing workers.

He concluded: "Maintaining work safety is a critical, ongoing pursuit which can earn the Authority both an efficient, productive workplace and a motivated staff.

"The more conscientiously we maintain the physical well-being of ourselves the less work we will lose due to injuries, ailments, and less money the Authority will lose in insurance and diminished productivity."

## EU Naval Force Bidding Fond Farewell to Tanker FGS Rhön

**German Auxiliary Replenishment Tanker FGS Rhön has completed her time deployed as part of EU Naval Force Somalia Operation Atalanta.**

The ship has significantly contributed to the success of the EU's Counter Piracy Operation off the coast of Somalia for the last three months.

FGS Rhön has conducted 24 Replenishments at Sea (RAS) with eleven different ships from Operation Atalanta but also from NATO and the Combined Maritime Forces (CMF).

With these RAS, ships from Australia, Canada, Turkey, Netherlands, Spain, France, Greece and Germany were able to maintain a continued presence in the area of operation.

Rhön has transferred more than 4,500 cubic metres (4.5 million litres) of ship and aviation fuel.

After successful 30 cataract operations which were conducted on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> May 2014 at Moi District Hospital - Voi County and 24 cataract operations which were conducted on Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> June 2014 at Dzitsoni Primary School - Kilifi County, Sri Sathya Sai Centre Mombasa pledged to conduct 108 cataract surgeries before Guru Purnima day on 12<sup>th</sup> July 2014.

Sai Vision 2014, 3rd screening outreach camp was conducted on Sunday 06<sup>th</sup> July 2014 at Mabati Rolling Mill Medical Clinic - Mariakani division - Kilifi County; which is about 36 km from Mombasa.

In this task, Sai Centre joined hands with Lions Medical Centre who have the required medical personnel and paraphernalia to reach out to the rural population.

The camp screening started at 9.00 am and continued till 1.45 pm; doctor Henry Mbindyo from Coast General hospital (Mombasa) was supported by staff from Lions Medical Centre and 3 students from Mabati

Technical Training Institute helped in the registration of patients.

A total of 297 patients were screened and we managed to get 25 patient who required cataract surgery.

These 25 patients who required cataract surgery were transported to the Lions Medical Center - Mombasa by Lion's own vehicle on Sunday where they were accommodated and given meals free of charge.

Further medical examinations were conducted and investigations done in the evening to check on patients' blood sugar, blood pressure etc..

Biometry (ultra sound) was done on all the patients to determine the power of the lens to be

inserted during surgery.

25 surgeries were conducted on Monday 07<sup>th</sup> July 2014 and discharged on Tuesday 08<sup>th</sup> July 2014 after post-operative examinations were conducted on the patients and medications given. All cataract surgeries were successful. A follow up examination will be done after 4 weeks.

The surgery (small incision surgery) was successfully done

by Dr George Bins and Dr. Margaret Onyart.

Mr. Norman Disouza the chief administrator of Mabati Medical clinic thanked Sri Sathya Sai Centre Mombasa for the kind gesture and supporting the local population with eye camp.

This also means that to-date Sai Vision 2014 have managed to restore sight of 79 people after one is fully or partially blind due to Cataract eye problem.

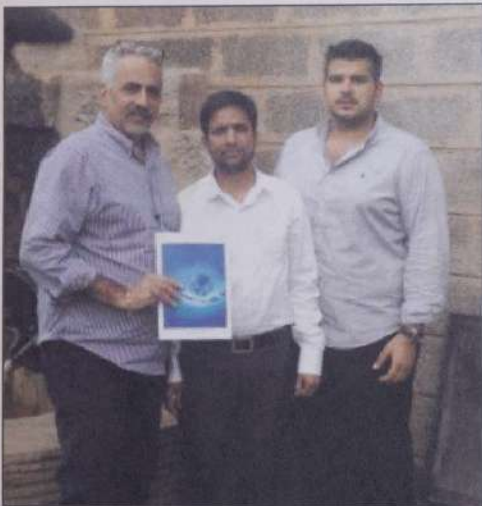

# Building Boom As Consumption Of Local Cement Doubles

**Kenya's construction sector booms.**

The industry is among the fastest growing in the country, with Kenyans consuming a month's worth of cement than what they used a year ago, according to new economic data released by the National Bureau of

Statistics (KNBS).

Similarly, manufacturing has been on the increase as demand surges, with the East African nation producing 60,000 metric tonnes of cement more than a year ago.

Kenya's construction sector, while still in its nascent stage, has expanded exponentially as developers put up structures for both private and commercial use.

In the capital Nairobi, the skyline has changed dramatically in the city center as old buildings are

replaced with skyscrapers, some going up to 30 floors.

A similar scenario is replicated in city suburbs, where buildings of up to seven floors are taking the space where bungalows and maisonettes once stood.

Things are not any different in other parts of Kenya where residential and commercial buildings that include shopping malls are fast coming up.

The huge demand for cement has thus pushed up consumption and production. According to KNBS, Kenyans are now consuming more than 450,000 metric tonnes per month, up from 340,000 metric tonnes a year ago.

In May, consumption of cement in the East African nation stood at 450,379 metric tonnes.

This was an increase of 112,513 metric tonnes from what the country consumed in a similar period last year and 140,878 metric tonnes in 2012.

Since the year began, according to the government agency's Leading Economic Indicators report, Kenya has consumed over 2 million metric tonnes of cement.

The use of cement has increased from March, with consumption rising from 387,266 metric tonnes to 426,523 metric tonnes in April and 450,379 metric tonnes in May.

During the first five months in 2012 and 2013, Kenyans had consumed 1.5 million metric

tonnes and 1.6 million metric tonnes of cement respectively.

The East African nation consumed 4.3 million metric tonnes of cement last year, up from 3.9 million metric tonnes in 2012.

The huge demand has pushed up production, which stands at more than 470,000 metric tonnes a month.

In the first five months of the year, 2.3 million metric tonnes of cement has been produced, up from 1.9 million metric tonnes during a similar period in 2013 and 1.8 million in 2012.

Production of cement, however, has not increased as fast as consumption.

While consumption has been consistently growing, according to KNBS, production has been fluctuating, dropping in some months.

In the first quarter of this year, the state-run agency noted that the sector contracted.

However, consumption of cement increased.

"Construction recorded a slower growth of 4.9 percent compared to a growth of 7.4 percent in a similar quarter in 2013.

The growth in the sector was reflected in cement consumption which expanded by 17.2 percent," said KNBS in an economic analysis for the first quarter.

There are five cement companies in Kenya, namely Bamburi Limited, Rhino, East African Portland, Athi River Mining and Savannah.

Bamburi and East African Portland are the biggest, commanding more than half of the market share.

Rhino and Savannah are the newest companies seeking to get a pie of the rising demand of cement in Kenya. All the cement companies are headquartered

in Athi River, on the outskirts of Nairobi, with others having branches in Mombasa.

As demand of cement increases, more players are set to come into the sector, among them Dangote Cement, owned by Nigerian tycoon Aliko Dangote.

Cement manufacturing has been done in Kenya for the past 50 years, but it is only recently that consumption increased, following the boom in the construction sector.

In the first quarter of this year, loans in the sector jumped to 921 million dollars, up from 832 million dollars. Housing developers are reaping huge in the sector, with property values increasing by 3.44 times since 2000, according to HassConsult, a real estate firm.

The average value of a property has grown from 81,609 dollars in December 2000 to 282,758 dollars last March.

## WORLD CUP DEATHS

**KISUMU (Xinhua) -- A football fan was stabbed to death in Kenya whilst his attacker was lynched by angry members after the pair argued over the result of Friday's World Cup quarterfinal between Brazil and Colombia.**

The incident happened in Awendo, Migori County, on the western part of the nation as police launched investigations over the two deaths.

Awendo police boss Kipsang Chengach confirmed on Sunday that a 25-year-old man was knifed to death outside a local pub in the town after he disagreed over the outcome of the match.

Chengach added the suspect fled the scene but was tracked down eight hours after committing the murder and was lynched.

Oshimbo is appealing for more security personnel to patrol the town for the rest of the tournament where matches run deep into the night in the east African nation.

The two bodies were taken to a local mortuary, pending post mortem examinations results.

## First Lady Margaret Kenyatta Launches Taita Taveta 'Mobile Clinic' For Mothers

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenya's First Lady Margaret Kenyatta has launched the first fully kitted "Beyond Zero" mobile clinic to improve access to health care for mothers and children in the country.**

Margaret said her office will prioritize counties for the clinics based on HIV, maternal and child health indicators to ensure ultimately all counties are supported.

"When we started the Beyond Zero campaign, I made a promise to raise funds to provide mobile clinics, to improve access to health care for mothers and children," she said when she launched the initiative in Nairobi.

The First Lady has since March 2013 resolved to leverage on her position to make a positive contribution by profiling key challenges facing Kenyan families, with a view to have them (challenges) receive accelerated policy, resource and service delivery responses.

The "Beyond Zero" campaign is expected to support county health management efforts through mobile clinics, provision of incubators, point of care infant diagnostic kits, oxygen concentrators as well as through intense community and household awareness raising and sensitization on adoption of preventative health practices.

Margaret urged other like-minded partners to come on board as a lot of work remains to be done to achieve the "Beyond Zero" initiative.

She particularly expressed her gratitude to General Motors for providing a prototype of the mobile clinic which will be used for the first time in Taita Taveta in the coast region.

The First Lady through her "Beyond Zero" campaign an-

icipates catalyzing national and international actions with a view to accelerating the realization of three Millennium Development Goals (MDGs).

Cabinet Secretary for Health James Macharia said the mobile clinic will bring hope to mothers who face pregnancy related complication in the country.

He said the launch of the mobile clinic services is a key milestone

in the health sector as it helps in ensuring easy access to affordable maternal and child health care services.

"The fact that we have this kind of machine which will be helping our people to access health services indeed it will make a big difference.

"So let me congratulate you for helping Kenya achieve this milestone," he said.

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- President Uhuru Kenyatta has said his government plans to modernize the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport to make it a regional hub.**

Speaking after an inspection of the new terminal at JKIA in Nairobi, Kenyatta said once the ongoing modernization is completed, the airport will be able to handle 20 million passengers a year and become a premier regional hub in the East African region and prolong its usefulness.

"One year ago after the fire that destroyed the arrivals terminal, this project was launched.

"I am happy with the progress made one year later," the president said.

Fire gutted down JKIA on August 07 last year, disrupting air travel across the continent including the Middle East and Europe.

No serious injuries were reported in the incident which also coincided with the 15th anniversary of the bombing of the U.S embassy in Nairobi.

## 'Rift Valley Railways' Reduce Debt Facility

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Regional rail operator Rift Valley Railways (RVR) said Tuesday it has completed the final drawdown of 69.6 million U.S. dollars of the 164 million dollar debt facility which it raised through leading global and East African financiers late in 2011.**

The debt was part of the total 287 million dollar capital financing package which was provided in the form of a series of loans, comprising 40 million dollar from the African Development Bank (ADB), 32 million dollar from Germany's KfW Bankengruppe and 22 million dollar from the International Finance Corporation (IFC).

RVR Group Chief Executive Officer Darlan De David said the capital financing package was a mix of debt, equity and monies from internally generated profits.

"We have so far invested 120 million dollars in revitalising the railway, surpassing the investment requirement threefold, only midway through the investment period," David said in a

statement issued in Nairobi.

Since the start of the turnaround programme in January 2012, David said RVR has completed the rehabilitation of 73 kilometres of railway track between Mombasa and Nairobi.

Along with installation of GPS-based train operating technology on all trains, this helped cut cargo transit times between the two cities by six hours.

Freight clients in particular are benefitting and taking advantage of more investment in revitalising the Kenya-Uganda railway system in the past two years than in the previous 26 years, with high-profile companies in the steel, oil and bulk grain businesses signing new contracts amid improved speed, reliability and safety records along the railway line.

David said the region's transport sector will experience a significant reprieve on cargo haulage this year, once RVR augments its locomotive fleet with the additional 30 trains it is acquiring.

Kenya is also fast tracking the construction and rehabilitation of more than 160 km of railway line within its main metropolitan area of Nairobi, as it seeks to ease traffic congestion and reduce the cost of doing business.

national Engineering Corporation, managed to remodel the airport's garage area into a temporary arrival terminal.

The temporary terminal which was being used until last Friday had greatly improved operations at the busy international airport.

"The airport is the gateway to Kenya and its maintenance should showcase the country," Kenyatta said.

The new terminal known as Terminal 4, which was test-run last Friday, has seven boarding bridges and will double JKIA's annual passenger capacity.

The new terminal covers 178,000 square meters and will have 50 international and 10 domestic check-in points, 32 contact and 8 remote gates and an associated apron with 45 stands and linking taxiways.

President Kenyatta congratulated the workers for a quality job and told them to ensure the facility was maintained to international standards.

Deputy President William Ruto said the ongoing modernization projects at the airport will position JKIA as a true regional hub.

"We are truly proud to modernize our airport using our local resources," said Ruto.

The president said plans are underway to modernize all airports in the country, as part of its effort to make the country a regional air transport hub.

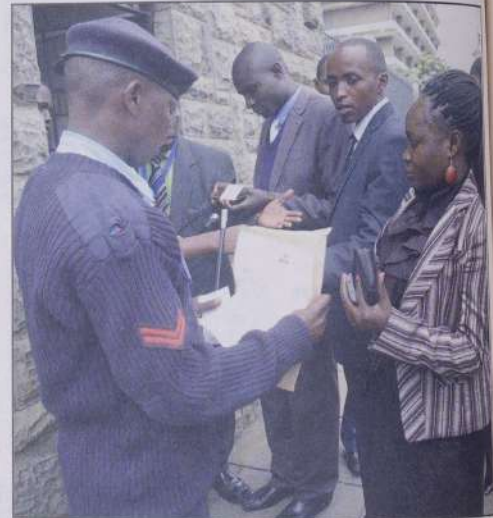
