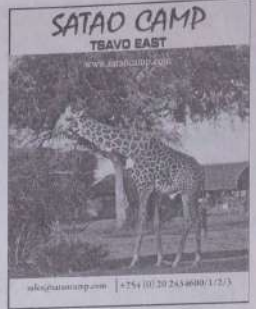

### Governor Asked To Name Road In Honour Of Antão

Seraphino Antão was a Mombasa born Goan who won two events at the 1962 Commonwealth Games, making him the first Kenyan athlete to win a gold medal at an international level.

Now a spokesman for the Goan community has again suggested to the local authorities, including a personal appeal to Mombasa Governor Hassan Ali Joho, that a prominent coastal road or thoroughfare be named in his honour.

Relative to the late Antão, Ivan Fernandes has also urged the local government to name one of the Mombasa roads in his memory.

"This great runner broke the national records in Mombasa, trained in the town and achieved a lot of honours for this city and it would be appropriate if his spirit will live with us in Mombasa," he said.

The late Antão broke records in the 100 and 200 yards at the national level, East African championships and during the 1962 Commonwealth Games.

Seraphino Antão grew up in Ganjoni and Makupa estates of Mombasa.

# Kenya Increases It's Marketing Campaign To Woo U.S. Tourists

by David Musyoka NAIROBI(Xinhua) — Kenya's tourism industry marketers have intensified their campaigns to the United States to woo tourists, as the East African nation seeks to increase her tourism pie from emerging markets.

Kenya, which is facing security challenges, has received a strong endorsement as a tourism destination, despite the various challenges experienced in some parts of the country recently, officials said on Tuesday.

Cabinet Secretary (CS) of East African Affairs, Commerce and Tourism Phyllis Kandie, who is leading a delegation along with officials from the Kenya Tourism Board (KTB) as well as the private sector, is meeting key stakeholders in the U.S to reassure them of Kenya as a safe tourist destination.

"The UN Secretary General has just given Kenya a clean bill of health as a safe tourist destination," she said in a statement issued in Nairobi.

The U.S. market is the second largest source market for Kenya with a 13 percent market share. In 2013, Kenya received 115,636 visitors from the United States.

The tour is part of a strategic recovery plan to be held in key markets. Earlier in the week, the CS held similar fruitful meetings with key tour operators and media, and is set to meet more stakeholder in Washington DC.

The delegation held various sessions and activities in New York including one on one discussion on key issues of concern to the U.S. stakeholders.

The concerns include the need for direct flights between Kenya and the U.S., information on the security measures by the government and product competitiveness.

Kenya's tourism also suffered a decline in the number of tourists arriving since September 2011 when the Somali militant group, the Al-Shabaab, carried out the kidnappings of tourists in the Lamu archipelago and the kidnapping of the Spanish volunteers.

The country has witnessed several hit-and-run grenade attacks in recent months in the capital, Nairobi, and in northern Kenya and Mombasa port city including the recent killing of more than 60 people in the coastal region last month.

Kenyan authorities often blame such attacks on Al-Qaida-affiliated Al-Shabaab rebels from neighboring Somalia.

Kenya's international tourist arrivals for 2013 declined by 15.8 percent to 1.49 million from 1.78 million in 2012. The drop in foreign tourists is largely attributed to increased terrorist attacks that have hit the country.

Kenya authorities this year foiled a major terror plot in Mombasa and arrested two suspects and seized a vehicle that was found laden with explosives.

According to the ministry of tourism, earnings for the sector in 2013 also declined by four percent to close at 1.02 billion U.S. dollars as compared to the 1.14 billion dollars recorded in 2012.

During the meetings, Kandie assured the market the government was addressing security concerns in the country in order to ensure that all tourists and Kenyans alike are safe.

She shared with the U.S. trade market some of the efforts the government has undertaken, including enhancing the Tourism Police Unit, better equipping the security bodies as well as recruiting more security officers.

# President Uhuru Kenyatta In Mombasa To Launch New Port Charter To Unlock E.A.C. Trade Potential

The charter is a single window expected to double East African trade to 33 billion U.S. dollars by next year.

Kenyatta said the charter – prepared by port stakeholders with the support of Trademark East Africa – commits parties from public and private sectors

to measures that will increase the efficiency of the port and the Northern Corridor.

"It also sets out, in clear detail, initiatives that we expect to play a substantial part in unlocking the trade potential of the whole region," Kenyatta said.

Other benefits of the charter include reduction of turnaround times in the Northern Corridor; the integration of all port community members' systems into the Kenya National Electronic Single Window System; and the achievement of 70 per cent cargo output routed through the green channel by next year.

Kenyatta announced the construction of the first three berths in Lamu will begin this year.

The move comes after Kenyatta last year directed the clearing process at the port to be digitized in order to enhance efficiency.

Other directives were abolition of transshipment bond, removal of roadblocks along the Northern corridor, rationalization of weighbridges, abolition of scanning of transit cargo within the port and 24/7 hrs operational at port.

Kenyatta directed that the multiple players in government involved in port operations be properly coordinated under the leadership of KPA's MD, who will have direct control over all operation.

All customs decisions were also ordered to be made and finalized at the Port of Mombasa without further reference to Nairobi which has created delays in the past.

Transport and Infrastructure Cabinet Secretary Michael Kamau said the initiatives at the port of Mombasa are meant to improve its efficiency but not to undermine other ports in the region. "The only port we are in competition with is the 'port of efficiency. You can Google the meaning of that," the Cabinet Secretary said with a light touch.

KPA Chairman Danson Mungata disclosed that plans are to

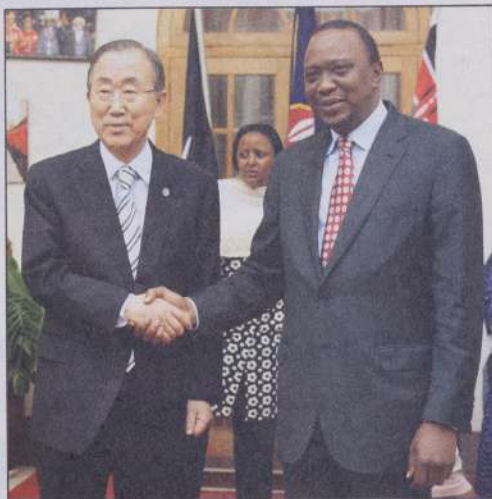
improve the procurement system at the port to ensure public resources are used for the intended purpose.

Kenya Private Sector Alliance (KEPSA) CEO Caroline Kariuki, said the Mombasa Port Community Charter will transform the services of the port and

position Mombasa as the hub and point of entry for all the Indian Ocean countries.

She singled out the government's efforts to reduce transport costs as a move that will significantly increase trade volumes and boost the country's economy for benefit of citizens.

Chris Mgidu and Joy Mwachaka MOMBASA (Xinhua) – President Uhuru Kenyatta has launched a new charter for Mombasa port aimed at unlocking regional trade potential.

The Mombasa Port Community Charter spells out a number of broad goals, which include transforming the Mombasa port to a highly performing landlord port by 2016, and the integration of all port community members' systems into the Kenya National Electronic single window system by December.

The Charter also aims at bringing together the port community to complement individual institutional service charters in addressing challenges that act as efficiency barriers.

"It is critical that those charged with making the port efficient and effective do so if we are to achieve our development goals," Kenyatta said in Mombasa during the launch of the charter.

### A FINAL WARNING: POOR EXECUTIVES CAN BE REPLACED

He warned that the government executives who fail to deliver in line with the charter will be replaced.

The port's management, systems and processes have helped to reduce the time of goods clearance from 18 days to 3.5 days, less than the five days that were the target initially.

Kenyatta said the implementation of the charter will closely be monitored to ensure every agency plays its role in boosting the port's performance.

"We cannot let the Charter we launch today become yet another document, gathering dust deep in a forgotten office," Kenyatta said.

# WERE MAASAI FOREBEARERS OF AN ANCIENT 'EAST AFRICAN EMPIRE'?

**Vast areas of Kenya and Tanzania bear Maasai related names, a sign that the Maasai of Kenya and Tanzania were once the dominant community in East Africa.**

For instance, Nairobi, the capital city of Kenya, is drawn from 'Enkare Nairobi', which means "Place of cool waters" in Maasai. Mt. Kenya is "Eru Kenya", meaning "Snow from Laikipia". Nakuru, Kenya's third largest city, is also a Maasai name.

Then across a vast length and breadth of about 1,000 kilometres and 800 kilometres respectively, transcending

both Tanzania and Kenya, are numerous locations that have either Maasai names or Samburu names.

The Samburu of Kenya are close kin of the Maasai, and the Maasai and Samburu converse with each other without much difficulty.

The Maasai/Samburu names of key locations that spread across both Tanzania and Kenya include Serengeti, Ngorongoro, Mt. Kilimanjaro in Tanzania, Africa's highest mountain, Mt. Oldonyo Lengai also in Tanzania ("Oldonyo Lengai" incidentally means "Mountain of God", meaning that there are two "Mountains of God" in Tanzania, because the Maasai also alternately refer to Mt. Kilimanjaro as "Oldonyo

Lengai"), Uasin Gishu, Olduvai Gorge, Narok, Kajiado, Nanyuki, Nyeri, Namanga, Magadi, Kiserian, Rongai in Nakuru, Rongai in Nairobi, Laikipia, Ol Moran, Transmara, Oldonyo Sabuk and Amboseli.

The distance between Olduvai Gorge in Kenya and the Ngorongoro Crater in Tanzania is about 1,000 kilometres, in between which are several locations with Maasai and Samburu names.

The distance between Nairobi and Nakuru is 200 kilometres, while the diagonal distance between Transmara and Laikipia is about 800 kilometres.

One interpretation of this can be that the Maasai reigned supreme in East Africa from about AD 1,000 to about AD

1,500, when their power, clout and influence began to gradually wane, as has indeed happened with all other Empires in history.

Indeed, it must have been the Maasai who put a stop to the epic northwards 19th century Ngoni migration from South Africa, that proceeded unhindered through Botswana, Lesotho, Zambia, Zimbabwe and Malawi, a distance of about 3,000 kilometres, before the Ngoni migration came to an abrupt halt in Tanzania.

The Maasai, like the Greece and the Greeks, are not seemingly the mighty ancient Empire that they used to be, but they still feature prominently e.g. the first Kenyan Medical Doctor was a

Maasai i.e. Dr. Jason Likimani, who was the first Kenyan Veterinary Doctor. Joseph ole Tameno, was also a Maasai.

Interestingly also, independent Kenya's founding Premier and President Jomo Kenyatta, from Kenya's Kikuyu tribe, also dropped his initial surname Ngengi, in favour of the name Kenyatta.

"Kinyatta" is a beaded Maasai name which for some reason, greatly fascinated Jomo Kenyatta to the point of inspiring a change of his surname.

Even Jomo Kenyatta was sufficiently awed by the heritage, legacy & legend of the Maasai of Kenya and Tanzania.

## Governor Asked To Name Mombasa Road In Honour Of Seraphino Antão

**FROM FRONT PAGE** Maria and Diogo Manuel and had six siblings and was the neighbour of the famous musician (double bass player) Francisco Mendes.

While at Goan High School he took several sports but inclined towards short distance running.

At school, Seraphino discovered that he had an athletic prowess and participated in several sprint events and was member of the Achilles Athletic Club. He trained on the Goan Institute grounds; at the Mombasa Municipal stadium and on the sandy beaches around Mombasa.

In 1957 he had the opportunity to participate in National Competitions in Nairobi where he broke the Kenyan 100 and 220 yards records.

He competed at the 1958 Commonwealth Games in Card-

iff, Wales, but without much success. Two years later Antão competed at the 1960 Summer Olympics in Rome, Italy, where he reached 100 metres semi finals and 200 metres second round.

The 1962 Commonwealth Games in Perth, Australia marked the highest point of his career, when he won 100 and 220 yards gold medal.

He was also member of the Kenyan 4 x 440 yards relay team which finished fifth.

Other members of the relay team were Wilson Kiprugut, Kimaru Songok and Peter Francis.

The same year he won two gold medals (100 and 220 yard) at the British AAA Champion-

ships, which he attended three times. He also won several gold medals at the East and Central

became the first Kenyan Olympic flag bearer at the 1964 Summer Olympics in Tokyo, Japan, but

was ill and did not perform as well as expected at the track.

He reached 200 metres second round but was eliminated in the heats of 100 metres.

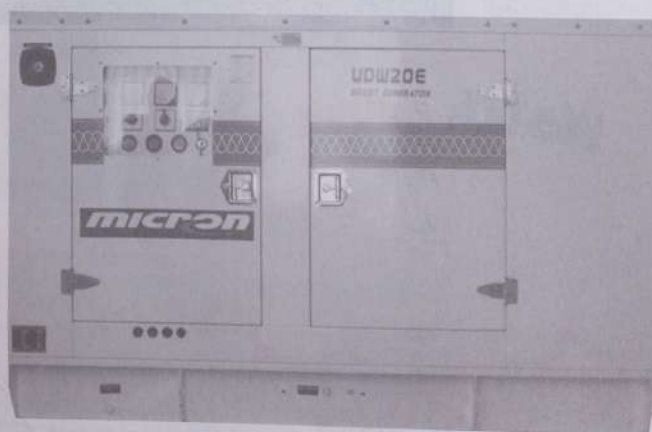
After the Olympics, he retired from the sport and moved to London, England.

In 2003 he made a visit to Kenya attending the 50th anniversary of the Kenya Amateur Athletics Association, now known as Athletics Kenya.

Seraphino Antão died in September 6, 2011, following a battle with cancer.

# With Modern Day 'Cats Eyes' We Could Make A First And Significant Move To Rebuilding The Safety On Our Roads

As part of the debate around what needs to be done to reduce the number of road accidents in the country, the issue of night driving has been given a lot of air time.

Main for this is that a lot of people have been travelling over night to a destination, done work during the day and travelled back to their place of abode in the night and have thus only lost a day away from their base location of work.

Banning night movement for public transport has rendered this small convenience impossible.

The National Road Transport Safety Authority has designed some rules that have to be met before they can licence a company to operate overnight public transport.

We have covered these rules over the last few weeks but these rules will not have a significant impact on road accidents.

Fitting speed governors, getting the right kind of drivers, having multiple drivers and carefully selecting what hours the work are all important.

However, the state of the road is a major contributor to accidents and this is not being fully addressed.

The biggest contributor to road accidents and especially at night, is the range of vision (or lack of) that is available to the driver.

Long distance driving requires that a vehicle keep a reasonable rate of progress.

This means that the speed of the vehicle should be a steady one that is within the law.

It also requires that the journey should be as smooth as possible to allow passengers to sleep for long enough for them to be rejuvenated in the morning when they get to their destination.

The biggest contributor to a driver being able to drive safely and at the best rate of progress is that they should be able to see clearly for the twice the distance it would take to brake.

A driver should also be able to see at least one hundred metres either side of the centre line of the road for them to be comfortable that they can see any potential hazard that might be approaching the road on which they are travelling on.

The biggest problem to driving at night is the lack of street or highway lighting in most roads in Kenya.

Unless we put lighting on all major arteries in the country, any other measures taken in the name of improving road safety will only be paying lip service to the promise.

My serious proposal is that we should ban all night driving till there is sufficient lighting to on all major arteries.

The reality in Kenya is that it will take time for us to get to a state where all roads are

or else last for only a fraction of their expected life.

The last is that preventive and breakdown maintenance should be done as scheduled and when carried out should be finished very quickly.

The record of our public entities that are entrusted with providing service to wananchi is dismal.

The administrators of such organisations like dealing with large construction projects but hate managing maintenance outfits.

It is seen as a demotion when one is put in charge of the maintenance function.

Calling a spade a spade, it is easier to extract corruption money from large construction projects as the amounts paid out can be dismissed as small variations.

One thing that can be done however is to put 'cats eyes'

markings on the roads.

Modern day cat's eyes are manufactured in many different colours which can determine different conditions on the road.

If these were installed used judiciously and were fully cognisant of design we could make a significant move to rebuilding safety on our roads at night as well as putting some discipline on the way we drive.

In concluding I will reiterate that the rules that have been made for allowing night driving will not have a significant reduction in road transport accidents.

The suggestions we put forward need to be adopted in order to have simple long lasting measures that the drivers can adhere to.

As Kachumbari says, road safety can only be improved by some bold out of the box ideas.

The latter will only be possible when several things are in place.

The first is that Kenyans must stop stealing road hardware.

The thriving scrap and second hand market is what tempts many people to steal fittings from the road to either sell as second hand material or in the case of metallic parts of road hardware - that includes lamp posts - to sell as scrap.

The second is that electricity should be reliably available.

The reality is that our electricity supply is not as reliable as it can and should be.

The fluctuations in power quality causes serious stress on the material that is fitted to enhance safety on the road that they tend to either not function

## Public Sector Adopts On-Line Financial Management System

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) --** The Kenyan public sector has scaled up the adoption of an on-line financial management system to enhance efficiency and accountability in the delivery of critical services.

A statement issued by the Treasury on Monday revealed that State agencies have fast-tracked the adoption of the Integrated Financial Management System (IFMS).

"The national treasury stepped up efforts to enhance the adoption of its on-line public finance management system training users in both national and county governments," in a statement from the Treasury.

Kenya launched a platform to automate the management public finances in May.

Government officials said digitization of public finances will help root out malpractices and leads to the loss of revenue.

The national Treasury has the capacity of State agencies to adopt the Integrated Financial Management Information System (IFMS).

The on-line platform has been rolled out in central and county government offices.

It added that the training of state officials has commenced to facilitate smooth adoption of digital financial management platform.

"Through the IFMS academy based at the Kenya school of government, the treasury has trained more than 5,000 users at the national and county levels," the Treasury said.

IFMS Director Jerome Ochieng said that the new academy will offer regular trainings to state officials in charge of implementing the digital platform.

"Continuous sensitization and training within the counties using the system has seen users embrace the change from the manual system of operations to the automatic system. The system encompasses several modules that cover financial processes," Ochieng said.

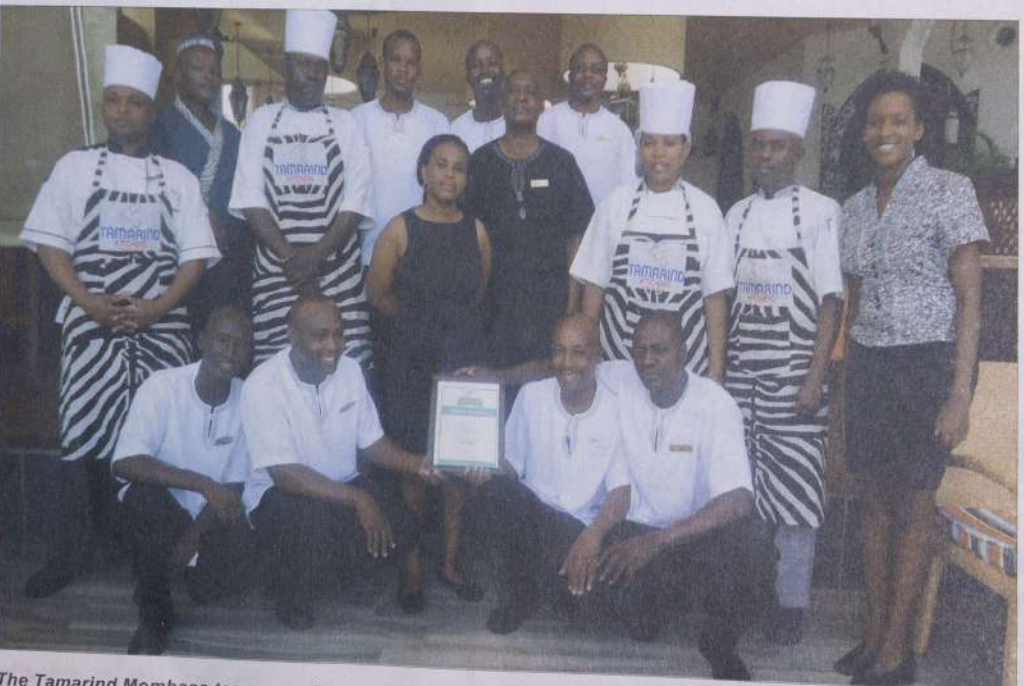
He disclosed that state budget officers can now access financial transactions and reports from the integrated system. "The system will enable expenditure control and follow up of the national and county government's transactions," Ochieng said.

# Record 'Hash' Seizure For Combined Task Force 150

Fresh from setting the record for the largest maritime heroin seizure, HMAS Darwin, operating in support of Combined Task Force 150 (CTF-150) has set another record in the fight against drug smuggling and the funding of terrorism.

The drugs, 6,248 kilograms of cannabis resin (also known as hashish or hash), are the largest maritime seizure of hash in the Indian Ocean to date.

On 28 June 2014 the drugs were discovered aboard a dhow in international waters.

In an operation lasting over 12 hours, boarding teams from HMAS Darwin conducted an intensive search finding the drugs hidden within the hull of the vessel.

Commander Terry Morrison, Commanding Officer, HMAS Darwin, said of this achievement:

"HMAS Darwin remains focused on the war against funding for terrorist organisations and I am proud of the continued dedication and professionalism of the crew onboard HMAS Darwin and the role they play as part of the Combined Maritime Forces."

Commodore Jeremy Blunden Royal Navy, Commander of CTF-150, noted the continued success of HMAS Darwin while supporting CMF.

He said: "Yet again HMAS Darwin has delivered an outstanding result."

"My congratulations to Commander Morrison and his very fine ship's company who have set new standards for professionalism and teamwork in

counter narcotics activity in the Indian Ocean."

Darwin's latest seizure is the eighth during the ship's current deployment to the Middle East.

On 23 April the ship set a new record for the most heroin seized at sea when 1,032 kilograms was discovered on a dhow off the coast of East Africa.

So far in this deployment the ship has seized and destroyed

1,675 kg of heroin and 10,647 kg of hash.

Commodore Keith Blount OBE Royal Navy, Deputy Commander Combined Maritime Forces, said:

"I am particularly delighted with this latest seizure. Yet again, this was a coordinated piece of activity which shows what CMF can achieve. Both CTF-150 and HMAS Darwin should be rightly proud of their efforts."

## F.G.S. BRANDENBURG IS THE SECOND GERMAN SHIP ASSIGNED AS FLAGSHIP OF SOMALIA ANTI-PIRACY OPERATION ATALANTA

F.G.S. Brandenburg has been patrolling areas in the Somali Basin and the Gulf of Aden as the flagship of EU Naval Force (EU NAVFOR).

F.G.S. Brandenburg is the second German ship assigned as flagship of 'Operation Atalanta'.

Their task is to protect vessels of the World Food Programme (WFP) delivering aid to displaced persons in Somalia as well as African Union Mission on Somalia shipping and to deter, prevent and repress acts of piracy and armed robbery off the Somali coast.

As a unit of the deployed task force off the Horn of Africa numerous tasks have to be dealt with: monitoring the Internationally Recommended Transit Corridor (IRTC) in the Gulf of Aden and along the Somali coast line.

This is usually done in coordination with the Maritime Patrol Reconnaissance Aircraft (MPRA) of the EU Naval Force stationed in Djibouti or in the Seychelles.

Also behaviour of local mariners and fishermen is surveyed to react on any occurring irregularities indicating pirate activity.

After nearly three months in the area of operation the Commanding Officer of the FGS

Brandenburg, Commander Gerald Liebich, takes some time to assess their time at sea to date:

"During the last two months we have sailed about 18,000 nautical miles (more than 30,000 kilometres).

"In order to maintain a continued presence in the area of

Friendly Approaches within the last two months.

"We use these talks with local fishermen and merchants to find out about their daily routine and to get to know the local business structure along the coast and on land.

"It is important for us to find out what role piracy plays in the

When the team talked to the ship's master, they found out that the dhow was held by pirates just two days ago.

Due to constant presence of MPRA's and navy vessels the pirates eventually fled ashore.

"This incident shows us, that the threat from piracy still exists, although the presence of the international Naval Forces has prevented any successful hijacking of merchant ships within the last two years."

Members of the ship have also taken part in Local Maritime Capacity Building. "In May we trained with Police and Naval Forces in Tanzania.

The Main focus in that exercise was conservation of evidence and first aid training."

"And in June we conducted an Search and Rescue (SAR) exercise with the Seychelles Coast Guard and other relevant local authorities, focusing on rescue and evacuation measures."

"I think we've presented a good platform as flagship for the EU Force Commander, Rear Admiral Jürgen zur Mühlen, and his international staff. We have all cooperated very closely and well together."

"My ship's company has done a very good job, with great professionalism and motivation."

"I am convinced that the second half will be just as successful and competent as the first."

When the ship comes in contact with a dhow or other small vessels, we conduct a "Friendly Approach."

"We have done about 20

Additionally, Friendly Approaches are one way to inform the local seafarer community on the objectives of Operation Atalanta.

Early in their deployment the Boarding Team approached an Indian Dhow because a distress signal was seen from one of the MPRA's.

# More Resources Needed To Tackle Wildlife Crime

By Chris Mgidu NAIROBI (Xinhua) — Global wildlife conservation firm, International Fund for Animal Welfare (IFAW) called on governments to commit the resources needed to reverse the decline of numbers of wildlife around the world.

IFAW Director of International Environmental Agreements Peter Pueschel said the governments should step up efforts to address security threats, organized crime and critical losses in biodiversity which were the focus of the inaugural meeting of the UN Environment Assembly (UNEA) in Nairobi. "While we are encouraged that wildlife crime is now being discussed at the highest political levels, we need to ensure that the commitments lead to

positive changes on the ground," Pueschel said in his presentation at the session.

"The world is facing a loss of its biodiversity, "Wildlife, of which elephants are one of the most endangered face extinction due to poaching and the loss of their natural habitats," Pueschel said.

Pueschel urged the governments to increase cooperation through National Environmental Security Task Forces (NESTs) as recommended by the Interpol who is planning to expand its presence in Eastern Africa so as to help governments combat poaching and other forms of environmental crime. Assistant Director of Environmental Security David Higgins said that Interpol will deploy more personnel at its regional bureau in Kenya by the end of October.

# WOMEN'S SOCCER IS FACING A BLEAK FUTURE SAYS ASHA PILI

FKF South Coast Branch women representative Madam Asha Pili has appealed to President Uhuru Kenyatta to come and rescue women's football in the country.

The tough talking Madam Asha revealed that women soccer is facing a bleak future due to lack of sponsorship.

She described the current Kenya Women Premier League format whereby teams converge to play once a month as a mockery and called for dissolution of the same.

"We want a league not a tournament. We want a league where teams play home and

away matches. Currently, the women league is being played like a tournament," claimed Asha.

She applauded the President's efforts in supporting Harambee Stars tour of Brazil watch the prestigious World Cup and appealed to reciprocate the gesture by supporting the women soccer in the country.

She called for government allocation of budget for promotion of sustainable women soccer programme.

The National Women Premier league, she noted, grounded to a halt last year due to lack of sponsorship - "Women talent has gone to waste as the players abandoned their soccer career to seek employment as house

maids in Arab nations," she added. She mentioned the likes of Salma Mohammed, winner of the golden boot in 2012 women league and Fatma Mohammed, former Harambee Starlets assistant coach who are now working as house maids in Saudi.

Madam Asha disclosed that women are preparing a memorandum to the President about the issue.

Madam Asha Pili is credited for the formation of the defunct National Ladies Soccer Institute (NSIS) that organized Kenya's first ever Women Premier League in 2010 that was jointly sponsored by the government and United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) to the tune of Sh15million.

The directors have recommended a dividend of Kshs 1.75 dividend per share for the year ended 31 December 2013.

# 'GLOBAL PROTECTION' FOR AFRICAN LION

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- An international wildlife body on Thursday proposed the global protection of the African lion.

Convention on Conservation of Migratory Species of Wild Animals (CMS) Executive Secretary Bradley Chambers told the UN Executive Environmental Assembly that the Africa Lion should be listed into the CMS Appendix II.

"The African Lion has seen a 30 per cent decline in population over the last two decades as a result

of habitat loss and other man-made threats," Chambers said in Nairobi.

"This will obligate coordinated management by the countries in which the Africa lion migrates," Chambers said.

The convention is the only global convention protecting species that move across international boundaries.

The CMS Conference of the Parties (COP) will take place in Ecuador in November

East and Southern Africa are one of the key habitats of the African lion, whose number is approximately 40,000.

The species has been the target of illegal hunting for

their skin meat and as well as for trophy purposes. "Climate change is also having an impact on the Africa lion's food supply," he said.

Currently, it is not a protected species internationally but it is only protected in some countries such as Kenya. In East Africa, the Africa lion migrate much like the annual wildebeest migration.

Also proposed to be included in the endangered list is the polar bear and shark species.

Other issues that will be discussed at CMS COP11 include the illegal hunting of elephants, which are being driven to the brink of extinction as on average a hundred animals are being poached every day.
