

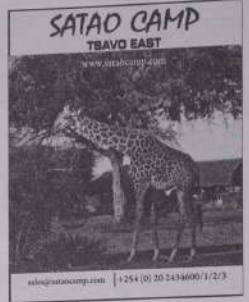

Road Repairs For New Nyali

'Decrepit' would be a good description of most roads in New Nyali, even before the recent onset of the long rains.

Fortunately, New Nyali Residents Association (NNRA) had previously engaged with the Kenya Urban Roads Authority to lobby for much-needed repairs in the estate.

The subcontractor engaged by KURA has been busy for much of the last month repairing the roadbed and sealing potholes on 1st and 2nd Avenues in consultation with members of the NNRA committee and its new administrative assistant, Galyne Onyimbo.

Work will continue shortly on 3rd Avenue pending delivery of additional materials.

Upon completion of these repairs, NNRA will organise preventive maintenance within

the estate to reduce the need for major roadworks in the future and keep the roads in good order for residents.

Plans to grade and level Baobab Road and negotiate the tarmacking of the estate's remaining rough roads are also in the works.

The NNRA committee recently approached KURA through the Mombasa County Executive for Transport and Roads to expedite urgent repairs to Beach Road, where students and staff have been struggling daily for weeks to reach Oshwal Academy due to its waterlogged and deeply eroded condition.

This is a major job that will require tendering, and NNRA will continue to lend the school and

surrounding community its support in pursuit of a speedy resolution.

NNRA would like to express its gratitude to the Mombasa County and KURA officials who have participated in the organisation of the successful roadworks within New Nyali, as well as to the work crews involved.

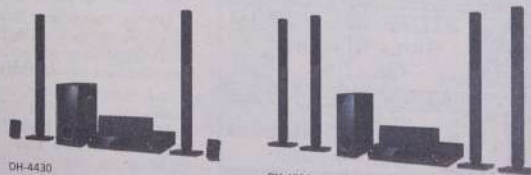

A Heart-Wrenching Tale By John Green

AMERICAN WRITERS John Green is renowned for his young adult fictional stories.

His fifth book is a heart-wrenching tale about young cancer patients who want to make the most of the short lives that they have left to live.

Published in 2012, *The Fault In Our Stars* has been made into a full length film that was released on June 6 of this year and opens at the NYALI CINEMAX this week.

The title has been inspired by William Shakespeare's play *Julius Caesar* in which the nobleman Cassius says to Brutus "The fault, dear Brutus, is not in our stars, but in

ourselves, that we are underlings."

While working as a student chaplain in a children's hospital, Green met 16-year-old Esther Earl who eventually died of thyroid cancer.

It was Earl and other children that he met who showed Green that life may be short, but if lived to the fullest can make a terminally ill person the happiest in the world.

He found the children to be as human as healthy people, and wanted to capture the feeling that the stories he was reading oversimplified and sometimes even dehumanized them.

What Green also learnt was that generally we have a habit of imagining the very sick or the

dying as being kind of fundamentally other.

His story argued for their complete humanity and is portrayed with Shailene Woodley, Ansel Elgort, and Nat Wolff, Laura Dern, Sam Trammell, and Willem Dafoe.

Sixteen-year-old Hazel Grey who is terminally ill with thyroid cancer that has spread to her lungs is sent to a support group much against her wishes.

Here she meets a young man, Augustus who is there to support his friend Isaac who has lost one eye to cancer and is in the process of losing his only other eye as well.

Augustus had osteosarcoma but was now cancer-free after having his leg amputated.

A friendship is struck between Hazel and Augustus which blossoms into a mutual closeness.

They share their favourite novels and their fears and wishes.

This then sets the ground for a bucket-list which Augustus wants to fulfill before Hazel dies.

Don't expect a sob story when you go to see the film, but a rich drama that has all the right comedy and romance - a beautifully told story and film.

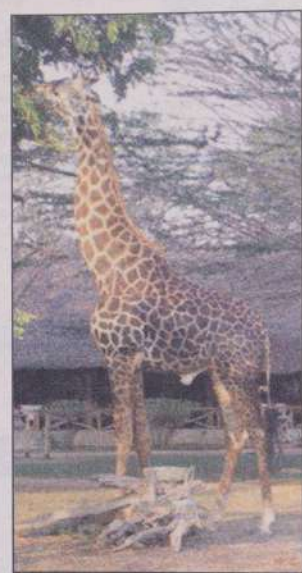

Ban On Night Driving Was Impractical ... But It Did Reduce Fatal Accidents By Twenty Five Per Cent!

The government slapped a ban on night driving by public service vehicles in the recent past and caused a hue and cry from the operators and has caused untold hardships for the small traders.

For the operators it was a case of losing fifty per cent of the available up-time of the buses and matatus.

They could only be on the road in between major towns up to six in the evening from six in the morning.

For the other twelve hours, the vehicles would be idle.

A lot of operators take loans to make the capital purchases and their cash flow is based on having the vehicle running for the maximum possible number of hours.

Herein lies the source of the high risk of having accidents.

It is not often that the passenger loading required by public service vehicles is achieved and this means that there is pressure to ensure that the costs are cut elsewhere.

This is often done by employing few drivers and making them work long hours especially the driving cycle.

A driver is expected to drive for a full journey as quickly as they can in order to maximise the number of trips that the vehicle can make in a day.

This means that drivers do not get enough rest in between trips.

Over speeding also results as the drivers hurry to get to the destination so that they can get a little extra rest.

Maximising the time that the vehicle is on the road can also mean that necessary maintenance will not be carried out.

Another return maximising action that public service vehicle owners take is to carry as much cargo as can be stuffed into the spaces.

In fact some of the vehicles also become large mobile

public transport departing three times a day - the early morning, in the middle of the day and in the early evening.

This gave wananchi many options in terms of how they organised their travel.

However, with the ban on night driving the dynamic of travel changed.

With night driving available a person could travel from Nairobi to Mombasa overnight, do business during the day and return with the night bus thus saving on accommodation.

With the ban on, anyone travelling to do business would have to spend a whole working day on the road, spend the night at the destination and then spend the day doing business.

Instead of then returning, the person would have to spend another night at the destination and then spend the whole day travelling back to their town of origin.

This would mean spending two nights in accommodation and

then losing two working days whilst travelling.

Putting together the operator's losses and the extra costs to the traveller, it would appear that this action would be a big burden on the economy.

However, the reality is that there has been a near twenty five per cent reduction in fatal accidents and almost corresponding reduction in total accident numbers.

One cannot assign a value to life so the payback is probably many times over.

However, we cannot continue with the ban on night driving.

There are mitigation measures that have been proposed by the National Transport Safety Authority but do they go far enough?

Will they result in sustaining the reduction in fatalities and also lead to lowering of fatalities and accidents?

We will find out next week.

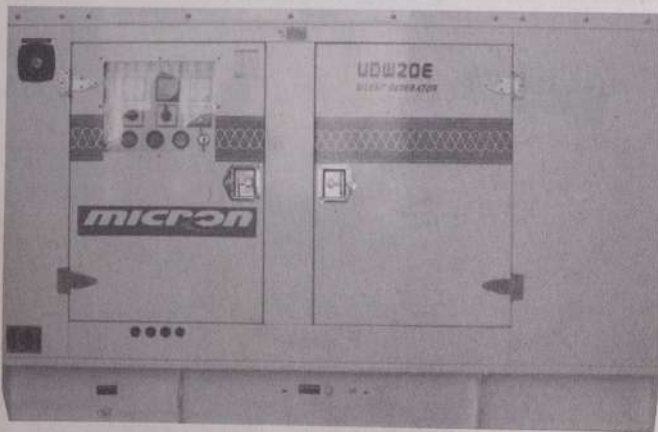
POACHING: WHY ARE NO 'BIG SHOTS' EVER ARRESTED?

Jennifer Lopez to perform World Cup opener

RIO DE JANEIRO (Xinhua) -- FIFA confirmed on Tuesday pop star Jennifer Lopez will perform at the World Cup opening ceremony. Lopez, together with rapper Pitbull and Brazilian singer Claudia Laitte, recorded the official World Cup song "We Are One". FIFA announced "production issues" would prevent her traveling to Brazil two days earlier. FIFA confirmed they would perform it at Thursday's kick-off, which is believed to be the climax of the ceremony. More than 60,000 people will be in Sao Paulo's Corinthians Arena to watch the ceremony and kick-off match between Brazil and Croatia. About a billion people are expected to watch on TV worldwide.

Top-level security for teams in World Cup

RIO DE JANEIRO (Xinhua) -- Seven out of the 32 teams who will play in the FIFA World Cup, which starts in two days in 12 Brazilian cities, have the highest level of security available, the Brazilian Intelligence Agency (Abin) said Tuesday in Rio. According to Abin's assistant director Ronaldo Belham, the United States are among the teams included in this special protection level. The U.S. team's arrival in Sao Paulo, on Monday, featured a lot of security. Belham did not disclose the name of the other six teams who will have top-level security. Security for the Brazilian team is also high. Local daily O Globo reported that the hotel in which the Brazilian squad will be staying in Sao Paulo, prior to the Cup's opening match on Thursday afternoon, is being protected by a tight security scheme, with the participation of the local and federal police, Army soldiers and private security guards. The security was reportedly much more prominent than during last week, when the Brazilian team played in a friendly match against Serbia in Sao Paulo as well.

Federal Police bars entry to violent fan

RIO DE JANEIRO (Xinhua) -- The Brazilian Federal Police announced on Tuesday that an Argentinean man who featured on a list of fans who participate in violent soccer associations was barred entry to Brazil. The man, whose name was not disclosed, flew from Buenos Aires to Sao Paulo with his family for the World Cup on Monday, but flew back home in the same day after being denied entry in Brazil. The Federal Police informed that the man's final destination was not Sao Paulo, but instead Rio, where Argentina will make its first match on Sunday, against Bosnia. According to the police, the man was one of the 2,000 individuals present in a list of violent members of 'barra brava' groups (organized soccer fans organizations), provided by the Argentinean government.

Marco Reus injury 'worse than expected'

BERLIN (Xinhua) -- Marco Reus will be sidelined for longer than expected, as his injury is worse than initially thought, the "BVB" confirmed in an official statement on Tuesday. Further examinations revealed that the attacking midfielder did not only partially tear a ligament in his left ankle but he also "suffered damage to the heel bone with an expected recovery time of about three months," according to club doctor Markus Braun. Marco Reus had to write off his World Cup dreams at Germany's warm up match against Armenia, one day ahead of the departure to Brazil. The Germans celebrated a 6-1 victory with six goals at the second half. However, the "Nationalel" lost Dortmund's attacking midfielder at the first half when he twisted his left ankle awkwardly, unable to continue. It was at first expected that Reus would be out of action seven to eight weeks, as it stands, the 25-year-old Germany international will return in September.

Chamberlain could be back against Uruguay

RIO DE JANEIRO (Xinhua) -- England manager Roy Hodgson hopes Arsenal winger Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain could recover in time and be fit enough to play in England's second group match in Brazil World Cup against Uruguay on June 19. "He's done very well and we will be working on his training programme during the course of the week," said Hodgson at England's training camp here on Tuesday. "The doctors hope he'll be ready for the second game." The 20-year-old Chamberlain injured his right knee during England's 2-2 draw in Miami last Wednesday, one of the final three friendly matches for England to tune-up for the World Cup which saw England only grabbed one victory. The knee injury will keep Chamberlain sidelined in England's group opener against Italy on Saturday in Manaus. And Hodgson also stressed that he could offer no guarantee for Chamberlain to play the game against Uruguay.

Spain captain Casillas: We are favorites

MADRID (Xinhua) -- Spain captain Iker Casillas believes his side is the favorite to win the World Cup which kicks off on Thursday in Brazil. The Spain team have travelled to Brazil as reigning world champions after their success in South Africa four years ago and also as reigning European champions and should they win they would complete the incredible feat of winning two consecutive European and two world crowns. Some have raised doubts about the lack of strikers in Spain's squad and the poor form of some key players this season, but Casillas, who himself had a difficult campaign and was second choice for Real Madrid in the Spanish league, is confident of a repeat triumph.

Japan's Nishimura to referee opening match

RIO DE JANEIRO (Xinhua) -- Japan's Yuichi Nishimura will referee the opening match of the 2014 FIFA World Cup between Brazil and Croatia on Thursday. FIFA announced on Tuesday that Nishimura will be assisted by compatriots Toru Sagara and Toshiyuki Nagi, with Alireza Faghani of Iran designated as the fourth official. Referee designations have been made for the first four matches of the World Cup. Nishimura, 42, is set to become the third Japanese referee to have officiated at two World Cup finals after Shizuo Takada (1986 and 1990) and Toru Kamikawa (2002 and 2006). At South Africa 2010 he handled four matches, including the quarterfinal encounter between the Netherlands and Brazil. In 2012, Yuichi Nishimura was named AFC Men's Referee of the Year.

Scolari: Brazil Must Win Opener

By Michael Place RIO DE JANEIRO (Xinhua) -- Victory for Brazil in their World Cup opener against Croatia on Thursday is vital to the team's chances of winning football's most coveted trophy for a sixth time, according to Selecao boss Luiz Felipe Scolari.

The 65-year-old warned his players could ill afford to trip in the Group A clash at Sao Paulo's Itaquera stadium due to the resultant pressure in later matches. "We need to win the first match to allow us to possibly slip-up in the second or third and still progress (to the knockout phase). Our tactical work has come a long way. There is little more to do before the first match." For Brazil, Thursday's clash will be followed by fixtures

against Mexico on June 17 and Cameroon six days later. Having slipped to 22nd in the FIFA world rankings in June last year, the Selecao are now third following 15 victories from their past matches. Included in that run was last year's Confederations Cup triumph, sealed with a 3-0 demolition of world and European champions Spain in the final. But Scolari refused to bask in past glories as he underlined the importance of a positive start in Sao Paulo. "What worries me is Croatia," Scolari said. "It's important that we start the match well and pressure the opposition from the outset. "When we score early it seems that everything falls into place. It makes the opponent change their strategy and often lose their way."

BLACK STARS URGED 'DO GHANA PROUD'

By Alex Osei-Boateng ACCRA (Xinhua) -- Former presidential candidate of Ghana's opposition New Patriotic Party (NPP), Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo, has urged the Black Stars to make Ghana proud as it makes its third consecutive appearance at the FIFA World Cup in Brazil this month. He said football pundits, all over the world, have always bet their money on Ghana to be one of the first teams to exit the World Cup at the group stages.

In its maiden appearance in 2006, when Ghana was grouped with Italy, Czech Republic and the USA, the odds were heavily stacked against the West Africans. However, the can-do spirit of the Ghanaian was clearly made manifest and the Black Stars placed second in the group and qualified for the round of 16. Similarly in 2010, against the likes of Germany, Serbia and Australia, Ghana progressed to the quarter finals stage, a step further to what was achieved in 2006.

Mexico National Football Team Feted In Brazil

MEXICO CITY (Xinhua) -- The city of Santos, in Sao Paulo state, Brazil, welcomed Mexico's national football team with a celebration, the Mexican Football Federation announced Tuesday.

Mexico is one of 32 teams competing at the 2014 Brazil World Cup, which kicks off Thursday. The general director of Mexico's national teams, Hector Gonzalez Inarritu, thanked Mayor Paulo Alexandre Barbosa for Monday night's festivity, which took place at Monte Serrat, the second-highest mountain peak in Santos, and accessible via a cable car.

According to Gonzalez, the Mexican team is working hard and is highly motivated, and has been buoyed by the kind reception it has received from Brazilians, allowing both players and their trainers to work comfortably. The team will remain in Santos till Wednesday, June 11, when it will travel to Natal for its June 12 game against Cameroon. The following day, the team travels to the seaside resort of Recife where the players' families are staying. A luncheon has been organized in Recife for the players and their families, to afford them some time together, which is considered good for the athletes.

Zimbabwe Braces For World Cup 'Blackouts'

HARARE (Xinhua) -- Zimbabwe's power utility authorities Tuesday issued a new load shedding schedule that will leave consumers without power for eight hours a day, at a time when large numbers of football-loving Zimbabweans are expected to glue to TVs for the World Cup. The schedule, issued by ZESA Holdings, is basically a reminder to people of the power-thirsty African country that the chronic problem of power shortage will not be solved in anytime soon. Zimbabwe needs 1,800 to 2,400 megawatts of

power a year but is capable of producing 1,200 megawatts at most. "To this end, ZESA has put in place measures to boost power generation. In spite of the measures, power supply shortfalls will still be experienced," ZESA subsidiary Zimbabwe Electricity Transmission and Distribution Company said. According to the schedule, consumers will either be shed from 5 am to 1 pm or from 1 pm to 9 pm on given days. Essential services that include major referral hospitals, water and sewer installations, airports, major central business districts will be spared from load shedding.

European Union Funding For Drought Hit Areas

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- The European Union has provided U.S. \$6.5 million dollars to help Kenya alleviate a severe drought in 23 arid and semi-arid counties across the country.

Head of Development at the EU in Kenya Erik Habers said the emergency response funds were channelled to the National Drought Management Agency (NDMA) for its drought crisis preparedness and response fund, immediately ready to deploy to counties affected by low rainfall.

"This emergency fund plans to shore up communities against incidents of reduced rain and prevent drought turning to famine," Habers said in a statement released in Nairobi.

He said an additional 7.4 million dollars will be provided by the EU for further activities soon, adding the funds are expected to be immediately dispersed to many of the 23 counties to reduce the impact of unusually low rainfall on livestock and livelihoods.

"Drought and the impact on food supply is a real and increasing problem for hundreds of thousands living in the arid areas of Kenya," Habers said.

He said the EU has partnered with the National Drought Management Agency since it was set up in 2011 and is keen to contribute to Kenya's drought preparedness and management.

The Drought Contingency Fund provides the crucial missing element for an effective response to an impending drought and is the first of its type in Africa.

It is designed to deliver a quick response from the NDMA to counties in the lead up to and in the event of an official drought being declared in order to mitigate its destructive effects.

"In each phase there is a comprehensive set of activities involving livestock and agriculture, water and nutrition, education and conflict, in the alarm and emergency

phases of a drought. County plans will focus on saving livestock and protecting livelihoods," the EU said.

"For animals, there will be supplementary feeding, emergency vaccinations and measures to open up unused pasture.

"Measures also go towards increasing water supplies such as storage and rehabilitation of shallow wells."

Kenya has experienced low production of basic staples such as maize and beans leading to acute food insecurity amongst many Kenyans in the arid regions.

The government says it has mobilized resources from development partners to address the current food deficit in the country.

Depressed rains last fall led to inadequate production of key staples like maize, wheat and legumes in Kenya's breadbaskets.

Food security experts have regretted that over-reliance on rain fed agriculture has worsened food insecurity in Kenya.

Jodhpur Is Popular For High Profile Weddings

JODHPUR AND MUMBAI - Our longest road trip was between Jaipur and Jodhpur, only 350 kms but taking almost eight hours.

We wanted to stop on the way in Ajmer, which houses the shrine of the Sufi saint Khwaja Moin-ud-din Chishti (mere gharib nawaz) whose followers include Emperor Akbar and more recently Indian music director A. R. Rahman. It is said that seven pilgrimages to Ajmer are supposed to equal one to Mecca.

However, after seeing the commercialisation of (Moin-ud-din's brother) Salim Chisti's mausoleum in Fatehpur and warnings from our guide that it is a long walk from our car to the dargah through very dirty streets and with too many beggars, we declined.

Jodhpur, the second largest city in Rajasthan is known as the blue city since most of the houses near the Mehrangarh Fort, the older part of Jodhpur, are coloured blue.

Devout followers of Lord Shiva, who is always denoted in a blue hue, the residents have decided to paint their houses this calming colour.

Cleaner than the previous cities we visited, we stayed at Ajith Bhavan, an heritage hotel which has old style rondavels but with modern interiors.

Ajit Bhavan is extension of a palace which is occupied by a cousin of the Maharajah, the hotel being part of their property.

Lovely gardens, lots of chirping birds and old items like cooking pots, hoes, horse and wagon paraphernalia are spread out

throughout the grounds.

In the past, Jodhpur was the capital of the Marwar kingdom from where we get the Marwari Jains who eat no garlic, onions, eggs or meat.

They have a separate township behind the fort where all the above food items are totally banned.

In Jodhpur the king is called Rao, not Maharaja and you will see different coloured and styles of turbans and tilaks (annotation on the forehead, very typical in India) depending on the origin of the family.

400 feet above the city, Mehrangarh Fort is actually a combination of many palaces spread over five kilometres and the current fort was built in the period of Jaswant Singh (1638-1678).

Entry through the fort is through seven gates of which one is the

Loha Pol (blood gate), the final gate into the main part of the fort complex which still bears the hand prints (sati marks) of the rani who in 1843 immolated herself on the funeral pyre of their husband Man Singh.

Men's chambers were golden in colour while the women had red sandstone finish, the former being taller had bigger doorways while the women had much smaller doorways.

Women, were kept in purdah so could only observe what went on in the courtyards from raised balconies through specially

made screens so that they could look down but no one could see up.

The nearby lake, which is less than half its original size now, had a special water wheel system operated by camels.

Water could be taken up to the top of the fort (400 metres) through this system.

You can see some very well preserved old cannons on the ramparts which also offer breath-taking view of the city.

War in those days was a heavy affair with the Kings outfit weighing 5kg. and a soldier's armour 11kg. plus the heavy sword.

Hilts on the sword were small because a prince would be trained in warfare from the age of 12 and probably did not live beyond 30 or 40 as most died in battle.

There is a room where different cradles are on display, each prince had their own cradle.

An interesting art collection is housed in one of the rooms as is the hundreds of years old armoury.

Paintings by Mughal artists had side profile and sharp noses on rice paper thus preserved very well, while Hindu artists painted the front profile.

Other galleries display the elephant howdah (seats used by the royals to sit on the elephants), Palanquins, Turbans, Folk music instruments.

One very interesting display that we saw in one of the galleries was a ladies' make up box with two long wooden appliances on either side.

We were told that these were dumbbells for the royal ladies to keep fit since all they did was sit and eat all the time - gyms existed even four hundred years ago.

If you are lucky and they are not closed for renovation or because of graffiti you can see the Moti Mahal (Pearl Palace) - built by Sur Singh 1595-1619 and the largest period rooms with five alcoves leading onto hidden balconies so that his five queens could listen in on court proceedings without being seen; Sheesh Mahal (hall of mirrors), Phool Mahal (Palace of flowers) - a grand room where dancing girls performed under a ceiling of gold patterns where only male royals were allowed; Takhat Vilas - residence of Rao Takhat Singh (1843-1873), the last ruler to reside at the fort.

While this last room is still traditional you can see glass balls on the ceiling attributed to western influence that was brought in by the British.

The fort is a popular site for musical and dance performances and film shooting, the most recent was the 2012 release of The Dark Knight.

Chamunda was the kul devi (family goddess) of the kings and her idol was installed in a temple in the fort in 1460.

She remains the Maharaja's and the Royal Family's goddess and is worshipped by most of Jodhpur's citizens who still come to pray at the temple on holy days. There was an old man sitting in one of the rooms smoking a hookah with an interesting contraption by his side.

Opium was very legal a few hundred years ago in Rajasthan.

In fact, the guide was quick to point out that "opium is not good if you smoke it but perfectly all right to drink in small quantities, making you very relaxed and happy".

The poppy flower grew abundantly here in Rajasthan and its seeds were cultivated for opium. This was put in a muslin bag with some water and the concoction would drip out of the hanging bag into a container below.

These juices were then drunk by men, women and children alike - they must have been a really happy lot in those days.

Not very far from the fort is the Jaswant Thada, a mausoleum built from the best Makrana marble by Rao Sardar Singh in 1899 in memory of his father Rao Jaswant Singh II.

Near it is the crematorium and other smaller cenotaphs of members of the royal family, the construction of this structure officially moved the royal crematorium out of the fort to this present location.

Handicrafts and textiles from Jodhpur are the biggest money earners and the city is also becoming very popular (like Jaipur and Udaipur) for high profile weddings.

We also had the best masala chai (tea) here in Jodhpur and you can purchase this masala from many shops in the bazaar.

Umaid Bhavan, the official residence of the Maharajah built in 1927 and at one time was the biggest private residences in the world.

Now a small portion is occupied by the royal family, a few rooms have been converted to a museum, while major part of the palace is a hotel run by the Taj group and is now closed to all non-residents.

A room at the hotel can set you back about 50,000 rupees going up to 100,000 rupees a night.

The king's collection of vintage cars are also on display.

Lying just 250 kilometres from the border with Pakistan, Jodhpur is an important base for the Indian army, Indian Air Force and Border Security Force (BSF) and you can see MIG jets speeding across the skies on reconnaissance flights every day.

This meant that for our flight to Mumbai we had to undergo very strict security checks (though nothing like Srinagar) and we boarded our craft in an cordoned off area to keep prying eyes off the air base.

The wreckage of a shot down Pakistani military aircraft with an upside down flag of Pakistan on it, is proudly displayed at the main gate of their base.

You would pay between 10,000 and 12,000 rupees for a double on bed and breakfast for a sea facing room but it is worth every penny.

Mumbai is a city that never sleeps, there are so many buzzing nightspots and restaurants from low to very high end, that one is spoilt for choice.

While in Mumbai you should try out Trishna (only in South Mumbai) and Mahesh (three branches the closest one in Juhu) for really good seafood, Elco market (Bandra) for their pani puri, pau bhaji, matka kullfi and of course the really cheap shopping but keep an eye out for quality. Only Parathas that has by far the most variety of Punjab parathas and the best sarson da saag and makkhi ki roti complete with traditional white butter.

Only Parathas have many branches in Mumbai and one in Dubai but the closest to Bandra is their Palli Hill branch.

Lucky Restaurant in Bandra sells the best biryani I have ever had and this fact is verified by none other than Salman Khan, his brothers Arbaaz and Sohail who have given their views which are pinned with pride on their boards.

Again, if you are not used to spicy food, you must ask for mild food wherever you go otherwise your mouth will be on fire.

A wonderful and memorable trip, unfortunately too short as I would have preferred a few extra days to be able to experience all that I did more comfortably.

India has some beautiful and very well preserved historic monuments and sites but unfortunately not many see them as such and have caused so much damage through graffiti, forcing the authorities to close down certain areas, which is a real shame for those who appreciate these sites.

Kenya Wildlife Service Senior Warden Simon Gitau Wins prestigious 'Rhino Charge' Award

A Kenya Wildlife Service Senior Warden has won one of the prestigious Rhino Charge awards at this year's off-road motorsport competition.

Simon Gitau, the KWS Senior Warden of Mt. Kenya National Park and Reserve, has won the Ken Kuhle Trophy for services to conservation for his exemplary dedication to the conservation of the mountain and the development of the communities around it.

KWS sponsored a guard post, provided security intelligence and water bower in the Rhino Charge 2014, which was held on June 1 in Kalama Conservancy, Samburu County.

The event raised Kshs. 112,919,334, crossing the mark of Ksh 100 million for the first time in the 26-year history of the Rhino Charge.

This beats last year's figure of Ksh 90 million.

Prizes were awarded at a colourful ceremony held in the Conservancy.

The prize giving event was attended by senior officials of the key agencies involved in the conservation of the water towers, namely Kenya Wildlife Service Deputy Director Robert Njue, Kenya Forest Service Chairman Peter Kirigua, Kenya Water Towers Agency Chief Executive Officer Francis ole Nkako and Rhino Ark Chairman Michael Karanja.

These institutions have jointly been involved in the conservation of Mt. Kenya, Aberdares and Mau Eburu in a public-private partnership arrangement that has provided a working framework for the conservation of mountain forests, the main sources of water in Kenya.

The arrangement has seen the erection of a historic 400-km electric fence around the Aberdares and inspired similar efforts underway in Mt Kenya and Mau Eburu.

The partnerships formed under this model foster efficiency and effectiveness by leveraging the relevant strengths of respective partners and avoiding duplication of effort.

Rhino Charge was started in 1989 to raise funds for the construction of the Aberdare electric fence.

Based on its success, the project has since been extended to Mt Kenya and Mau Eburu

This year's motorsport event was won by Alan McKittrick (McKittrick/ Knight/ Ray/ Jessop/ Bovard/ Smith) in Car 5 with a distance of 31.34 km, against a theoretical shortest distance of 24.6 km.

His team visited all the guard posts.

David Lowe, Clerk of the Course, said:

"I am so happy to see the Rhino Charge and its conservation mission continuing gaining momentum with the Ksh 100 million mark being surpassed this year.

"The Rhino Charge Organizing Committee remains committed to the conservation ideals of the late Ken Kuhle, the founder of Rhino Ark.

"As the event grows bigger, we are reviewing its organization towards minimizing its ecological footprint.

"I am delighted to note that our hosting communities not only benefit from the access fee from thousands of spectators, but also get their profile raised as tourist and conservation destination".

Winner of the most prestigious Victor Ludorum - highest fundraiser and best placed by formula - was won by Alan McKittrick in Car 5. McKittrick's team has been highest fundraiser for 12 years in a row. This year they raised Ksh7,236,768.

Since Car 5 entered the Charge in 1989, the team has raised a staggering amount of Kshs. 108,477,303.

The exciting Rhino Charge event lived up to expectation for the entrants who were flagged off at 7.30 a.m. from the spread of guard posts scattered through the rugged rock strewn hills and gulleys of Kalama Conservancy.

The event, which entered its 26 year since inception, attracted international competitors from the UK, US, Nigeria, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

Best placed overseas entrant was Peter Castle in car 39 placed 11th overall in the event.

Speaking during the prize giving ceremony, Christian Lambrichts, Executive Director of

Rhino Ark underlines that "the Rhino Ark's conservation successes have proven that public/private partnerships are effective vehicles for delivering lasting solutions to the challenges affecting the conservation of the Nation's natural endowment.

They have, indeed, provided a sound blueprint for the conservation of Kenya's 'water towers' that are the source of the country's water resources".

He said the electric fences were the hardware of Rhino Ark's conservation work and they were complemented by 'software' interventions, mainly capacity building of Rhino Ark's partners, including communities.

The interventions aim to (i) make the electric fence as effective as possible; (ii) improve the management of the protected areas inside the fences; and, (iii) address poaching, one of the most pressing threats to our wildlife and habitats.

These software interventions are wide ranging and include:

- The development and implementation of formal environmental curricula for all primary and secondary schools around Eburu forest;

- The conducting of joint quarterly surveillance flights above Mt. Kenya and Aberdare forests to detect emerging issues;

- The establishment of a high tech. Patrol monitoring system for Mt. Kenya. The system will be replicated to the Aberdare during this year;

- The design and conducting, together with the judiciary, KWS and Space for Giants, of training programme for KWS wardens on the prosecution of wildlife crimes;

The camping fees totalling Ksh 2.9 million was raised from entry fees into the venue by all en-

trants. The funds will go to local conservation projects run by a local committee. The money raised during this event will go towards fencing Mt Kenya and Mau Eburu.

Work on these two projects is well underway with 53 km of the Mt. Kenya electric fence already built and 30 km on Mau Eburu completed.

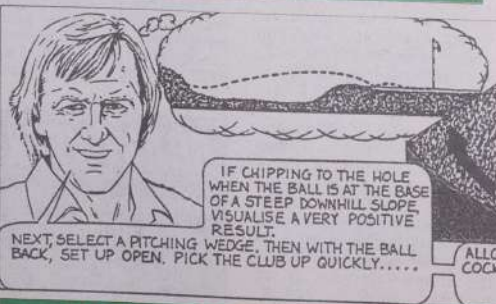
In B Division, two Pauls, Macharia and Krijner tied on 74, Macharia beating Krijner with only half a point, 35 against 35.5.
