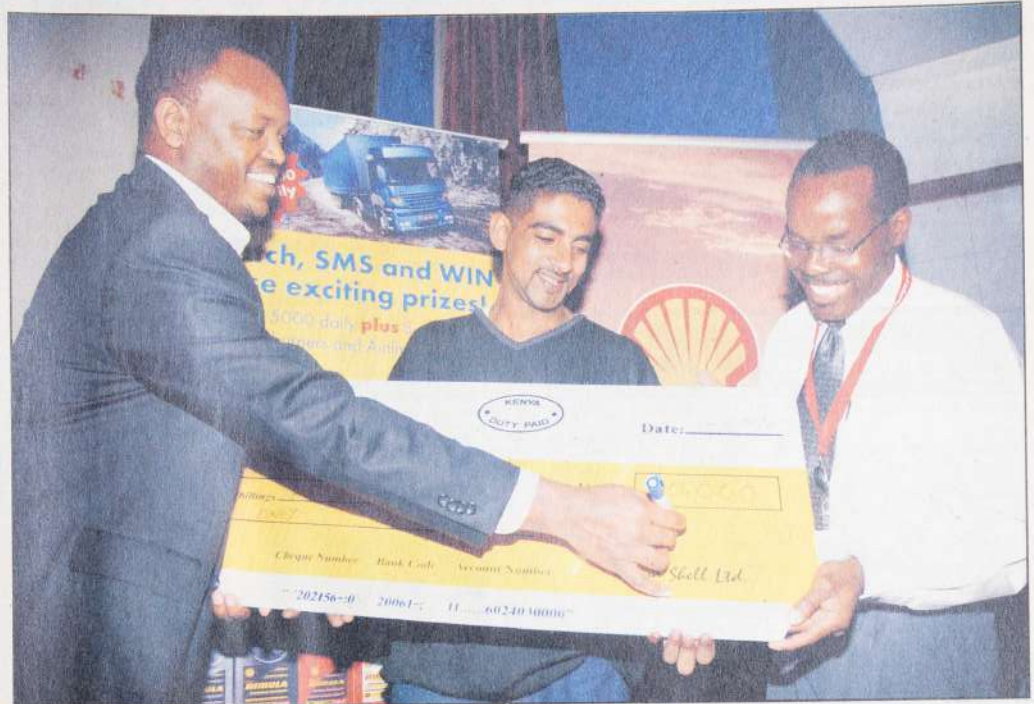
For those spectators who wish to come and watch the spectacle please remember that the area is private land and there is constant work in progress in developing not only two championship golf courses but also a world class housing estate.

Shimoni Boat Operators Protest KWS Parks Fees

Recent media reports have indicated that Shimoni boat operators are bitterly protesting against the 100 per cent increase in the marine park fees by the Kenya Wildlife Service (KWS).

According to the spokesperson of the Kisite Private Boat Operators Association, Mr. Hassan Mohamed, the current fee of \$10 being charged by the Wildlife Service (KWS) is clearly hurting their business.

Therefore, the proposed 100 per cent hike for next July will be catastrophic to say the least.

Almost all products and services in Kenya and the world are becoming more expensive due to rising costs of production and other economic factors.

For this reason many people wonder why boat operators protesting on a \$20 park fee are not even charged to them at the first place.

The fee is actually paid by the foreigner directly to the

operator, if one has a little understanding of the tourists who visit these areas you will agree that they are the kind of tourists who will be greatly encouraged to tour if park fees are reduced at this rate.

Shimoni Island Restaurant, Shimoni Slave Caves, the Kisite Marine Park, and the Mpungu Marine Reserve in the area are visited mainly by second-tier tourists who opt out of Maasai and other relatively expensive Kenya tourists' packages.

Therefore, these south coast tourists have naturally fallen into the category of discounted destinations for those with less money such as students and other 'budget' tourists.

It is thought to think along these lines when planning to improve parks and services.

When planning must consider the stakeholders.

All tourists can go to Tsavo National Park and Maasai Mara. They can only afford a few dollars for the Kisite swim and Shimoni Coral Gardens.

The whole issue is not how much tourists can afford to pay for a day.

Therefore, the boat operators are protesting that the frequent fees are destroying their business.

In their prime fishing areas are fenced off to become marine parks and reserves in the area. Wasini residents decided to close boat operators rather than fishermen.

It became a crime to fish in these parks and since they did not want to fish in Tanzanian waters they diversified to operate tourist boats with great investment.

Evidently, even from this week's news, Tanzanians do not take kindly to Kenyans who fish in their waters.

The said Shimoni boat operators are typical low resources villagers who can hardly make ends meet.

In the context of increased regulations regarding taxes, required boat safety-gear and mandatory insurance, their business is already becoming unprofitable and difficult to sustain.

KWS can put a smile on these tax-paying hardworking boat operators by proposing a park fee that will attract more visitors.

In any case park fees can be decreased or eliminated in order to save boat operators from losing their livelihoods.

Clearly, the proposed 100 per cent park fees increments will definitely hurt tourism and families in the areas.

It is observed that, there are many park services that need to be improved.

Logically, higher fees may take care of this.

But Wasini residents will not be

able see it this way due to their current conditions.

For example, the all important 15 mile dirt-strip from the main Lunga-Lunga highway, the only road to Shimoni which brings in tourists has never been paved even after 44 years of Kenya's self-rule.

Probably Kenya's parks should be expensive in those areas that are known world wide such as the Mount Kenya, Tsavo National Parks and Maasai Mara.

These are our signature attractions and we have every right to benefit from them.

However, if we reach a point where tourists are discouraged due to high fees many locals will suffer as a result of reduced visitors.

For people who have never protested since the 13th Century, Wasini and Shimoni residents are taking this very seriously when they decided to stage the one day a week protest.

While the protests serve as a statement of distress unknown in their customs, the government ought to take note as the go-slow is also hurting families in this far flung and forgotten island communities of Kenya.

'Soja Syndrome' Is Well Established With Tractors And Similar Agricultural Vehicles

After Kachumbari's treatise on the 'soja syndrome' last week I opened my eyes in town and also when I went shags to see how far spread the 'soja syndrome' was.

His contention was that the syndrome is restricted mainly to security services drivers but I found that there were mild forms of the syndrome in other drivers as well.

I left Kachumbari still carrying out his research to see whether he could come out with a definitive set of symptoms that could exclusively describe the 'soja syndrome'.

I will start with the rural setting because here the 'soja syndrome' is quite well established but for different reasons.

Those who have travelled through the sugar belt, the tea belt and coffee belt must have had the benefit of having interesting experiences with tractors and similar agricultural vehicles.

It appeared to me that the drivers of such vehicles are afflicted by severe attacks of the soja syndrome.

A lot of the times, these drivers operate in areas where there are hardly any other vehicles so they do not need the same amount of awareness as other drivers on busy roads.

The terrain in which they operate is also quite overgrown and bushy hence there is hardly any point in looking anywhere other than straight ahead.

Drivers of agricultural vehicles thus appear to be incapable of turning their heads to look around for possible hazards that could be approaching or for things they should be taking evasive action against.

This stuck head is one of the indicators of the soja syndrome and is quite acute in these drivers.

The other reality that agricultural vehicle drivers have is that because they drive in relatively isolated roads where there is little or no traffic at all they tend to forget that they need to check whether there are other vehicles on the road before they

turn or make any manoeuvres.

In the sugar, tea and coffee areas, they quite often have to drive on main roads and their memory process stays on with the knowledge of the isolated roads.

They do not look to check out for other traffic before they turn.

They cannot apply any signals anyway since most of the

Overall, agricultural vehicles need to be treated with caution because their drivers suffer generally from serious cases of soja syndrome.

They tend to be slow and unpredictable.

They emerge unannounced and more often than not at speed from concealed entrances such as fields or tracks off the main road.

Drivers may not be used to driving on main roads or in traffic.

They lack indicators and mirrors and more often than not mud and dirt make indicators and lights difficult to see.

A loaded trailer can obscure the driver's view behind him.

Beware of poorly loaded trailers, as they can be unstable.

Agricultural vehicles are often noisy, and the driver may not hear other vehicles approaching.

Before overtaking an agricultural slow down and double-check it is safe to pass.

If the road ahead is not clear due to oncoming traffic, or trees and hedges obscure your view, slow down and stay behind the vehicle until it is safe to pass.

I have witnessed and also been told of several road accident that

have happened in the last six months that involved agricultural vehicles.

One was when a tractor suddenly tried to cross a road and collided with a fuel tanker.

Two people died as a result of this accident.

In another incident, a tractor coming out of a side road joined the main road without stopping and crushed two cyclists who were riding side by side on the main road.

They were minding their own business as they were absolutely in the right.

As Kachumbari says, this disease can be found in most driving populations with varying degrees of severity.

The law in the country requires that they meet all the requirements of town trailers.

They should have indicators and brake lights as well as reversing indications.

Conscientious operators will also fit reversing warning horn or beepers.

Reality is that most major agricultural businesses do not equip their vehicles to meet the requirements of the Traffic Act.

Their argument is that the vehicles operate on private land for most of the time hence it is not cost effective to fit the requirements of the law.

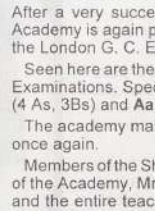
In the latter case the driver has no option but to use both hands and invariably they are at the soja syndrome location on the steering wheel five-to-one.

One hand only is an acute case where it is almost beyond treatment.

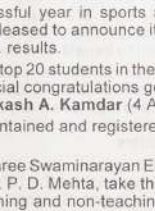
Such drivers if found by their employers should actually be dismissed from work as they are putting a large number of rural folk at an increased risk of accident.



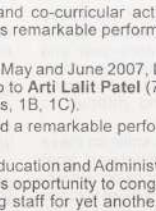

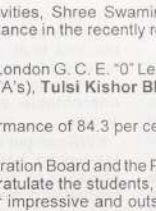

COAST ROADS ISSUE WILL BE RAISED WITH PRESIDENT KIBAKI

While people continue to complain about the bad state of the roads at the coast, they have yet to come together and make their feelings known to government.

Plans are underway to make this possible when the President and his Ministers visit the coast at the end of August.

'We also hope to take them out on the Mombasa-Malindi road.

'They have to see what people are complaining about. I was shocked when I drove on that road again recently. The road to Diana is equally bad'.

However, Tasneem was able to report that the flooded area by the Roman Catholic Church and Clinic, Likoni, is being repaired.

NO ROAD DRAINAGE

'It had no drainage and this is being attended to right now.

'But we must give them time as

it is not something you can do overnight'.

Commenting on the road going towards Neptune Hotels and Chale Island she said 'it has gone'.

'We are taking tourists to four and five star hotels along a one star infrastructure - if that'.

'We now say enough!

'Today, tourism is the largest contributor to the exchequer, and what can be done should be hurried up.

'As far as the Mombasa - Malindi road is concerned we were told that funds have been allocated for it.'

'However' said Tasneem 'I am given to understand that it cannot be rehabilitated any more.

'This road has to be rebuilt.

'If this is indeed the case we would like to know when we can expect some action.

'Meanwhile, the Public Works have to attend to the horrific crater size potholes.

'Your vehicle can get trapped in one leaving you with heavy repair bills.

'Maybe the time has come for us to consider privatising roads like many other countries.'

We wonder:

'Why does the infrastructure

have to get so dilapidated when we have two full Government Ministers and many more who hail from the coast?

'Why do our coast politicians not fight for better development here?'

Operation Census: Kenyans were gearing up Friday night for the 1979 population census which was estimated to cost KSh 45 million.

In Mombasa, projected to have about 413,000 residents, all bars, restaurants and nightspots were to close at 5.00 p.m. to facilitate the exercise and allow people to be counted at home.

According to the 1979 Kenya Population Census Guide, the 1969 census showed that Kenya's population was just under eleven million and growing at a rate of 3.3 per cent each year, the highest rate in the world.

This meant that if the population continued to grow at that rate, Kenya's population would double in another 21 years.

A four-man team from the Indian Institute of Petroleum Exploration were making preliminary analyses with help from the University of Dar es Salaam on traces of oil found at Songo Songo in Kilwa District, Tanzania.

The Tanzanian government meanwhile imposed restrictions on the sale of petrol to further conserve the fuel.

Meanwhile, KENYA cinema was winding down its run of 'Moonraker' and despite extra shows added to their schedule, queues continued to build at the booking office.

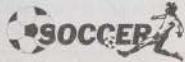
At the CHOX it was Randhir Kapoor and Jaya Badhuri in 'Jawani Diwani,' (Crazy Youth).

Here is the authors' account of Pir Baghali, a railway laborer who possessed extraordinary spiritual powers, is wonderful:

"He was an honest and hardworking man.

"He was always helpful to the needy and was kind to both people and animals.

"He was known to be strong and athletic, and could run fast enough to catch a peacock or a vulture before it could fly away.

"It is said that during construction of the railway, the kerai or metal filled with concrete and sand which the workers usually carried on their heads, floated a few inches above his head.

"Pir Baghali was a pious man.

"It was said that through his prayers, he could help keep the wild animals away and thus keep the labourers' camp safe.

"When he died, he was buried next to the railway line on Mackinnon Road.

"A mausoleum has been built there in his memory.

"Today many travelers, regardless of whether they are Muslims, Sikhs or Christians, stop by his graveside to pay their respects, give offerings and pray for their safe journeys.

"People say that they arrive safely at their destinations because they had stopped at Pir Baghali's graveside.

"The trains running on the railway line he helped build customarily slow down at Mackinnon Road to pay tribute to this legend."

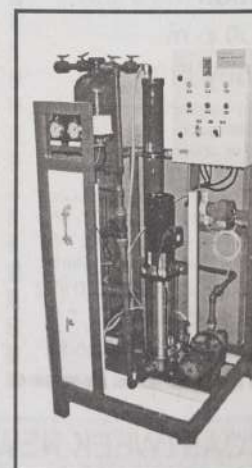

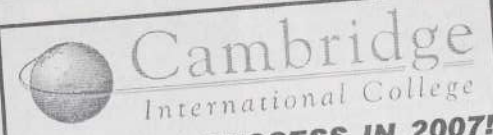

If he retained the Club Queen, Declarer could set up a long card by leading twice from Dummy and ducking the Queen.

Needing to avoid West winning a subsequent lead, Declarer had to abandon Clubs and instead focus on Spades and Diamonds.

It is expected that there will be a full house of 70 cars and 40 motorcycles.

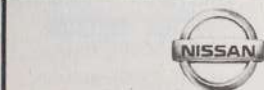
