Complications Of Urban Driving

HUMAN POWERED TRAFFIC OF MKOKOTENIS, SKATEBOARDERS, ROLLER BLADERS AND PEDESTRIANS

Urban drivers also suffer from the 'soja syndrome'.

However, Kachumbari's research found that there were slightly different strains of the disease in each town and also depending on what form of driving one did.

The driving populations can be split into matatu drivers, bus drivers, truck drivers, taxi drivers private drivers, learner drivers and weekend drivers.

Urban driving is also complicated by the fact that you add two wheeled traffic in the form of bicycles and motor cycles although these two also appear occasionally in rural settings.

Another type of complication is the human powered traffic of mkokotenis, skateboarders, roller bladers and pedestrians.

Some of the symptoms we have covered before apply equally to the urban driver and other road users.

The inability to turn the head and look at wing mirrors, rear view mirrors and indeed the blind spot immediately over the driver's left and right shoulders occurs to different degrees in the different populations of drivers.

'KAMIKAZE' ATTITUDES

The common symptom for urban drivers is the kamikaze attitude.

This affects almost all classes starting from private drivers through the well known matatu driving population to the pedestrians and roller bladers.

Road users in urban areas seem to have a strong desire to commit some kind of injury or damage to themselves or their form of transport.

The most common is trying to squeeze into spaces that do not exist.

Jay walking pedestrians trying to find space between slow moving vehicles in traffic jams or even trying to run across a carriageway in full speed traffic

illustrate this.

Another example is the motorcyclist who turns to the right without taking into consideration the condition of traffic around them.

The matatu driver is the expert at finding the space that does not exist.

The jerking motion for their vehicles that they seem to have perfected is another external indication that they are suffering from the syndrome.

This is also beginning to appear in other types of road users with the most interesting being the motorcyclist.

The local courier and food delivery riders seem to be the ones who are also beginning to pick up this aspect of kamikaze attitude.

In their haste to get to their next delivery point they seem to want to weave into almost non-existent spaces between vehicles.

In the process they are generally so busy trying to create this non-existent space that they do not notice what is going on around them.

This could lead to serious consequences for the riders especially when other drivers are also trying to find the "no space".

A symptom of the syndrome that is predominant amongst urban drivers that one rarely finds in rural road users is that of impatience.

This is characterised by the high incidence of the use of the horn, headlights, hands or voice.

In some extreme circumstances bumper bashing or brake screeching is also seen but these are rare and are almost a certain indication that the driver is suffering from a very rare and extreme case of the syndrome.

Urban drivers are very expressive and want to share their impatience with other

drivers. It normally only takes one driver to start and very quickly one will find out who else in the traffic is suffering from this characteristic of the syndrome.

Matatu drivers do it anyway. However the really annoying one, for me at least, is the driver whose vehicle horn seems to have been filled with water.

The horn hardly sounds and yet the driver believes that other road users have been engaged the minute he has completed trying to imprint his first digit onto the horn button of his car.

This is the type of driver who believes that all and sundry have acute hearing capabilities yet the truth is most drivers and road users are especially lacking in this area.

In fact it is indeed another of the symptoms of the soja syndrome.

Another expression of impatience that is exclusive to matatu drivers is that of absolute humility.

This expression is used in the absence of any direct way of describing it.

This is when the matatu driver looks you in the eye and begs to be let through whilst in fact they are inching into the non-existent space.

The use of hands to reinforce the requests also quite common.

This element of impatience and its manifestation is perhaps the one defining difference between urban and rural drivers and is likely to be so because conditions to breed this symptom do not generally exist in rural areas.

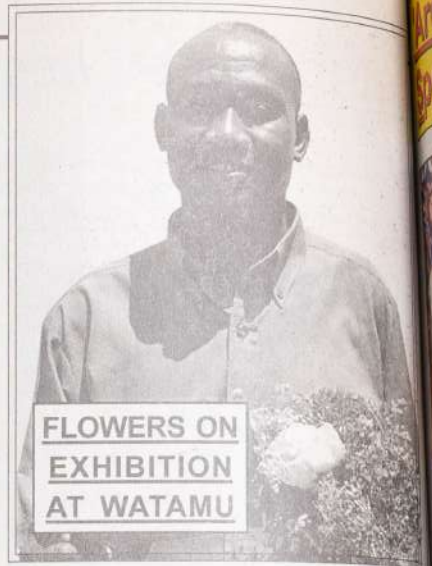
ABSENCE OF ANY ROAD MARKINGS

Congested roads that are in a bad state of repair contribute to this as does the lack of working traffic control devices.

The absence of road markings and signage is also a contributor to the breeding of this symptom.

We will continue next week to complete the dissertation of the research done by our very own eminent scholar.

As Kachumbari says, the urban setting is a rich environment for the breeding of this syndrome.

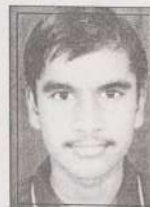

Over 16,000 job-seekers were registered in Mombasa during the 'ten percent additional employee intake' drive.

He attributed the high number of vacancies remaining to job-seekers' low skill level as well as their apathy toward farm work and non-white collar jobs.

Kenya's Civil Aviation Board (C.A.B.) rejected Enterprise Holidays' application for a charter service licence in a move that came as a great shock to many in the tourist trade. A subsidiary of British Airways, Enterprise Holidays were pioneering long-haul destinations to a hitherto virtually untapped mass market in the U.K. at very competitive prices.

Master story-teller and 'griot' American-born Mary Carter Smith was visiting the Coast spending six days at the Trade Winds Hotel, Diani, where she gave a free show to honour the International Year of the Child.

Coast cultural and archeological author Jim Allen contributed a vivid description of 'Vave', a rare Bajuni dance of exceptional beauty that he lamented was fast disappearing as a cultural treasure, probably never to be performed again.

REGAL Cinema was still showing "The Ten Commandments" with Charlton Heston and Yul Brynner to packed audiences even though it was coming to the screen for the eighth time that year.

Shariff Nassir for spreading the Nyayo philosophy so effectively at the Coast as well as in the whole country; and key-ring collector M. H. Mohamedali, who was looking to increase his collection from his current total of 600.

National Muslim Education Trust (NMET) Work On Unified Syllabus For Madrassas

National Muslim Education Trust (NMET) is trying to come up with a unified syllabus for all Madrassas in the country, the trust interim Secretary Dr Ahmed Yassin has disclosed, writes **ABDULRAHMAN SHERIFF**.

Dr Yassin said the trust would seek the recognition of the Islamic education system by the Ministry of Education.

He was speaking during the launching of the trust at Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Secondary and Technical School in Mombasa where the Minister for National Heritage, Hon Suleiman Shakombo was the Chief Guest.

The syllabus proposed included bachelors of Business Education, Information Technology (IT), Nursing and Education. All the courses are integrated with Islamic studies.

The trust spokesman, Sheikh Ahmed Msallam said they have been meeting to develop structures and strategies to improve education within the Muslim community.

Sheikh Msallam who said the trust was officially registered, asked Mr Shakombo to help NMET secure official recognition by the government.

"It should be referral institution on all education matters relating to Muslims," he said.

He said there are 12 Christian based universities in Kenya and not a single Islamic University.

Currently there are three Islamic colleges, one each in Thika, Mombasa and Lamu but yet to be recognized by the Ministry of Education.

"There has been several attempts and efforts made to get authority to start an Islamic University but it has proved difficult to get an interim certificate from the commission of higher authority," he said.

Sheikh Msallam said new universities and campuses are being established in Muslim areas in order to build capacity and a base of Muslim graduates who will be able to work in such colleges as lecturers and researchers and to manage institutions of higher learning.

The trust is also intending to set up a fund to run the Islamic education endowment fund.

This will be facilitated if current restrictions on the flow of charitable resources into Kenya were relaxed.

Hon Shakombo was invited to assist the trust in its efforts to a multi purpose community center and headquarters of the trust in Mombasa.

The Minister promised to hand over the memorandum to President Kibaki.

Among the objects of the trust are to formulate and develop a unified national Madrassa curriculum and to protect the rights of the Muslim girl child pertaining to her education, upbringing and all-round

development.

Muslims Education and Development Agenda Network (MEDAN) is serving as the interim secretariat of the trust.

From August 13th until the 27th a group of ten people from the Netherlands were visiting projects of East African Care - Kenya.

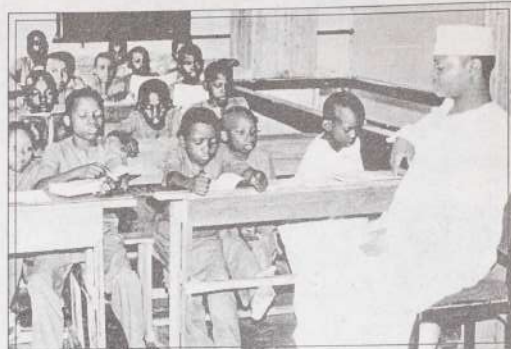
East African Care - Kenya a Dutch NGO is helping people in Kwaile District with Water wells, Sanitation and Education.

He thanked Mabati Rolling Mills for the joint partnership in assisting the needy people while looking forward to continued partnership.

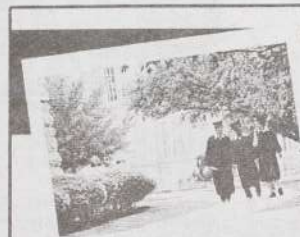

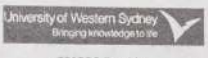

Unser erstes Projekt war die Renovierung im Jahr 2000 von Gebäuden, Bau eines neuen Blocks mit Toiletten sowie Beschaffung von Schülerpulten für die Ziwa La N'gombe Primary School in Bombolulu an der Nordküste von Mombasa.

Die Schule hatte 650 Kinder in 12 Klassen und nur 200 Pulte.

Es gab keinen richtigen Fußboden und nur Lehmwände.

Wir setzten einen Zementboden ein, pflasterten die Wände der Klassenzimmer, die auch gestrichen wurden, und dekorierten die Umgebung mit Pflanzen.

Ferner fügten wir eine Bibliothek hinzu, Klassenzimmer, ein neues Büro für den Rektor, einen Lagerraum und Toiletten für die 650 Kinder, die bisher eine einzige Toilette teilen mussten.

Das Projekt konnte 2001 abgeschlossen werden.

Das zweite Projekt war der Bau einer neuen Schule für die Kengeleni Primary School in einer der am dichtesten besiedelten Slumregionen in Mombasa.

Viele arme Leute wohnen hier und es gab nur eine Schule, die wie ein Hühnerstall aussah, wo

tüchtigen Büros, Toiletten und ausreichende Wasserversorgung, voll eingerichtet mit Mobiliar und Schülerpulten; der Vorhof wurde gepflastert.

Die Schule hatte 708 Kinder, 17 Lehrer und bestand aus einigen halb zerfallenen Gebäuden, so dass wir beschlossen, sie neu herzurichten in Rekordzeit.

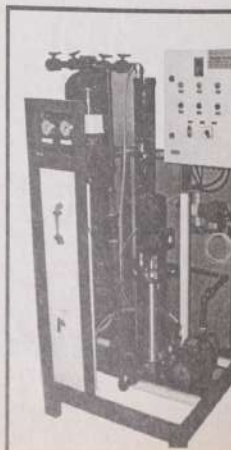

MUMIAS SUGAR GOLF DAY
It was all "natural sweetness" as the Nyali Golf and Country Club course hosted another well attended and sponsored Mumias Sugar Golf Competition on Saturday 1st September 2007.
