# Presbyterian Church Of East Africa Has Acquired 'Giriama Beach Hotel'

Presbyterian Foundation, an investment wing of the Presbyterian Church of East Africa (PCEA) has acquired the Giriama Beach Hotel in Mombasa at Sh 50 million.

The hotel situated in the North Coast has now been renamed PCEA Guest House and Conference Centre, Milele Beach. And speaking during a ceremony to dedicate the hotel, PCEA Secretary General, Rev Samuel Munguh Njoroge, said that the hotel will be a non-alcoholic establishment.

Mr Anthony Njaramba, formerly with Sarova Whitesands Beach Resort, has taken over as manager.

"In a bid to live up to christian values and expectations, we are turning the hotel into a non-alcoholic establishment that will serve to cater for families, religious groups and tourists," he said.

Rev Njoroge said that plans are also in the pipeline to put up

a state of the art conference facility on land that the Foundation owns and which is adjacent to the hotel.

Once complete, the conference hall will have a capacity to hold 2500 people, making it the largest along the Kenyan Coast.

Currently, the hotel has 72 rooms with a total bed capacity of 184 and 10 apartments. It also has two swimming pools, boutique shop, laundry and a workshop.

"It has been the desire of the Presbyterian Church of East Africa fraternity to have a beach

hotel in Mombasa and today this is a reality," Rev Njoroge said.

Equity Bank Limited fully financed the acquisition of the hotel.

"We are grateful to the bank for agreeing to finance this project and even for availing some additional funds for the renovation work which we intend to undertake," he added.

The Presbyterian Foundation as a body entrusted in the management of the church properties has been aggressive in developing income-generating projects for the church.

## Holy Quran Memorisation Competition Will Be Held At Makadara Grounds In Mombasa

The Fifth Holy Quran Memorisation Competition which has attracted participants from Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania, including Zanzibar and Pemba, will be held between September 23 and 30 at Makadara Grounds in Mombasa.

The Ladies category will be held on September 27 at Baluchi Hall from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., writes **ABDULRAHMAN SHERIFF**.

The competition is organised annually by the Muslim Mercy Youth (MMY) whose chairman, Mr. Abdulrahman Bawazir and the secretary Mr Said Abeid have confirmed that all arrangements for the event have been finalized.

The competition will be graced by the Chief Kadhi, Sheikh Hammad Kassim who is to be the Guest of Honour.

MMY was formed in the year 2003 aiming to raise the standard

of education for Muslims.

Quran Memorisation Competitions are held during Ramadhan. The first event attracted only 90 participants, all from Mombasa but later, attracted more participants who are increasing each year.

In the third year, the event received participants from as far as Moyale, Garissa, Kisumu and Zanzibar.

This year, participants from Uganda, Tanzania Mainland, Zanzibar, Pemba and many parts of Kenya have already confirmed their participation.

Mr Bawazir appealed to Muslims in Mombasa and its environs to turn up in great number to listen to those who are to take part in the competition.

Mr Abeid said due to the large number of participants, the organizing committee addressed the issue by introducing preliminary elimination rounds with those who attained over 90 per cent of hifadh and tajweed selected for the final stage.

He said MMY has seen the importance of Muslims to memorise and recite the Holy Quran and give special awards to those who emerge the most outstanding Holy Quran memorisers.

It was only after the competitions were organized, more Madrassas were established to keep students addressed this shortfall.

New Madrassas that now teaches Quran Memorisation are Darulrfan, Madrassah Madina, Madrasatul Muslimeen, Markaz Hikma, Markaz Tahfidh Ukunda, Madrassah Tahfidh Mito Andei, Madrassah rahma Kilifi and mazny others.

## World Bank May Finance Proposed Dongo Kundu By-Pass To The Kenya South Coast

Plans to see President Kibaki when at the coast to seek help in accelerating repairs to dilapidated roads failed to materialise so a fact-finding mission from the Kenya Association of Tour Operators, Coast Branch, met Engineer Muoria, Ministry of Public Works, coast, on September 13, 2007.

It conveyed the anger being expressed by motorists on being virtually left in the dark about what badly needed repair work had been planned - and when.

It had to be treated with the utmost urgency.

There was one instance of where this was actually happening and all were delighted.

It was the flooded area by the Roman Catholic Church and Clinic, Likoni, which at last was being seriously attended to.

In the KATO mission led by Chairperson Tasneem Adami, were executive members - Wilberforce Tirip, General

Manager, SOMAK Travel, Shamsheem Mawji, Managing Director, Kety Tours, David Njiri, Managing Director, David Tours and Mike Murithi, KATO's Executive Officer, Coast.

The Roads Ministry was challenged to improve their public relations and introduce regular briefings to keep the public informed of the progress being made.

KATO, Coast, has already requested the Kenya Tourism Federation to do the needful at HDQ level, particularly in respect of the Kilifi-Malindi and Ukunda-Diani Beach Roads by taking it up with the Chief Engineer, PS Roads, also the Chairman and Engineer Nyanganga of the Kenya Roads Board.

Referring to their meeting with Engineer Muoria, Tasneem reported.

**MOMBASA-MALINDI ROAD**

Work presently being under taken is purely of a temporary measure to make it Motorable, while the design for a dual carriage-way was already with the Consultants.

This is between Moi International Airport, Mombasa and Mtwapa and the highway to Malindi.

The African Development Bank will be funding this along with the Voi-Taveta and, eventually the Likoni to Lunga-Lunga section, as part of its agenda to develop regional trade.

If all goes well (because there is an issue of recovering road reserves around Bombolulu and Changamwe) work is expected to start in the last quarter of 2008.

Commented Tasneem, 'they admit the work has been slow'.

The report continues 'Dhanjal Contractors are doing the Mombasa-Kilifi section and have reached the Kikambala area. Work is still in progress.

Around KShs.570 million has been allocated for this portion alone.

### KILIFI TO MALINDI

Messrs Hayer B. Singh, Contractors, were awarded the work last November, but so far very little has been done.

The Ministry, she claimed 'is in the process of recalling the performance bonds and seeking for replacement to hasten the project's completion'.

### LIKONI UKUNDA ROAD

Work is in progress, but slow. There are many obstacles to

clear in built-up areas to enable the contractor on site to continue with repairs.

Utilities such as water, power, phones have all had their underground cables laid in this area. Thus, it is taking longer than expected to lay the drainage required.

The report continues 'the Ukunda-Diani Beach Road, which is in total disrepair, falls under the Kwale County Council which seems unable to cope.

The Ministry of Roads and Public Works has written to their HQ proposing the adoption of this road for future maintenance.

Work on the 35 km section of the Miritini/Maji ya Chumvi Road by The China Roads company is now complete.

Meanwhile the Contractor is still on site to build a dual-carriageway between Miritini and Mazeras, also a Waiybridge.

A 57km road linking Kilifi to Mariakani and as such decongesting traffic to/from Malindi to Nairobi is to route directly on this road thus avoiding transit into Mombasa completely'.

Said Tasneem 'as far as the Dongo-Kundu by-pass is concerned on the south coast, the engineer reported it as being a major project earmarked for the near future connection to ease congestion in the town and frequent delays to board the Likoni Ferry.

However, it would be naive to think that anything will happen before five, to six years because the magnitude of work is huge.

The by-pass would be funded by the World Bank.

## ROYAL BELGIUM NAVY FRIGATE 'F930 LEOPOLD 1'

## BELGIUM NAVY VISIT MOMBASA

Paying an operational call on Mombasa's Kilindini Port next week is the 2,800 tonnes Royal Belgium Navy frigate 'F930 Leopold 1'.

Under the command of Frigate Captain Wim Robbrecht the Karel Doorman class frigate carries a complement of 15 officers, 70 under officers and 60 sailors.

The warship is named after King Leopold I of Belgium and is based at her home port of Homeport in Zeebrugge.

She has a top speed of 30 knots.

Prior to March 29, 2007, the ship was known as the HNLMS Karel Doorman (F827).

It is one of the two frigates of this class that was purchased from the Royal Netherlands Navy on December 22, 2005.

The HNLMS Karel Doorman was the first ship of the Karel Doorman class of multi-purpose frigates (also known as "M-fregat" class).

### NETHERLANDS NAVY

She was the third ship in the Royal Netherlands Navy to be named after admiral Karel Doorman, who was killed during the battle of the Java Sea.

It was laid down on 26 February 1985, launched on 20 April 1988 and commissioned on 31 May 1991.

She took part in anti-drug operations in the Caribbean together with the U.S. Navy, was part of the UN operations in the Adriatic Sea during the conflicts in the former republics of Yugoslavia, as well as various NATO exercises.

On 20 July 2005, the Belgian government decided to buy two of the remaining six Dutch M-class frigates to replace the two remaining frigates of the Waelingen class (Waelingen and Westdiep) currently in service with the Belgian Naval Component.

On 22 December 2005, Karel Doorman and Willem van der Zaan were sold to Belgium, they

will be known in the Belgian Naval Component as *Leopold 1* (F930) and *Louise-Marie* (F931) respectively.

The HNLMS Karel Doorman was taken out of service in 2006 and turned over to the Belgian Naval Component on March 29, 2007 when it was christened the F930 Leopold 1, in honour of the first King of the Belgians, by Queen Fabiola of Belgium at the Zeebrugge Naval Base.

The patronage of the F930 Leopold 1 was accepted by the city of Nivelles.

The Willem van der Zaan will be commissioned into the Belgian Naval Component as the Louise-Marie in March 2008.

### BIRD WALK AUGUST 18TH

We decided to check out the Bamburi shale quarries on the edge of Ngau Tatu, an old haunt of mine.

The area is being planted with trees and so is easy and pleasant to walk in.

The pond at the entrance was alive with weavers, Golden Palm, Grosbeak, Village and a lone Golden Weaver.

Also lots of Zanzibar Bishops, all busy nest building.

Diedrik Cuckoo, male calling loudly from just above our heads while the female hung around the Village Weaver nests looking for a good place to lay her eggs.

A splendid Yellow Billed Egret stood in the middle of the pond so all my keen juniors were able to get a good look.

The walk up to the swamp gave us good views of several Tropical Boubous, sitting in pairs,

a Paradise Flycatcher, Mangrove Kingfisher, a flock of Red Billed Quelea, Common Waxbill, as well as several other seed eating finches.

Scarlet Chested Sunbirds, male and female posed for us and Pale Flycatchers were numerous.

Three migrant Common Sandpipers flew off from the swamp as we approached.

Dodging the safari ants, especially for those walking with their eyes on birds, proved somewhat lively with lots of jumping about.

Back at the pond at the end of the walk we saw an Allen's Gallinule and a Black Crane while a Purple Heron flew overhead.

This area is very lovely for a bird walk.

Savings and Loan Kenya Limited, opened a branch in Mombasa at Makena House, opposite Ambalal House, Nkrumah Road.

Delegates From 159 countries, including 40 Ministers elected Kenyan Minister for Power and Communications Hon. Isaac Omolo Okero as Vice President of the 18th Universal Postal Congress being held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

A special edition of *Coastweek* was air-freighted the previous week to Zurich, Switzerland by African Tours and Hotels for the month-long Kenya Food Safari being hosted at the Nova Park Hotel.

The special issue had the front page in German with an exclusive report on the food safari, aimed at boosting Kenya's tourism.

Tanzania was to begin using crop-waste as a source of energy to run its machinery in the rural areas.

The crop-waste would be transformed into combustible gas known as Bio-Gas which could be used to drive machinery using diesel engines in the Ujamaa villages.

The energy project was to be jointly undertaken by the state owned Small-scale Industries Development Organization (S.I.D.O.) and The Netherlands Twente University of Technology.

The pilot plant would be constructed in Arusha and later be extended to other areas if successful.

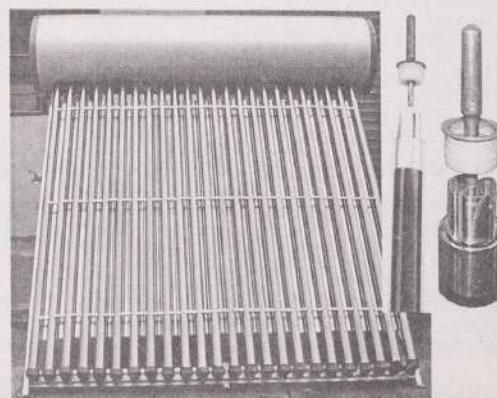

Ich bin immer wieder überrascht, wie schnell sich die Kinder von schmutzigen, mageren, unterernährten, hohlhäuigen Wesen in saubere zufriedene Kinder mit lächelnden Gesichtern verwandeln.

Ich danke Gott für den Programm Koordinator Henry der nie ruht, und für alle Angestellten, besonders die Hausmütter, die immer nur daran denken, was sie für die Kinder tun können.

Wir danken auch allen Wema-Freunden, Gönnern und Freiwilligen, die ich gar nicht alle nennen kann, deren Liebe und Großzügigkeit überwältigend ist.

Wir haben uns vergrößert, dank dem AED Partnerprogramm, wodurch unsere Organisation weiter entwickelt und gestärkt werden konnte.

Wir haben nun ein besseres internes System bei der Verwaltung, bessere Finanzkontrolle und Geschäftsführung.

## Kenia rechnet dieses Jahr mit 2 Millionen Besuchern

"NACH DEM gegenwärtigen Trend können wir bis zum Ende dieses Jahres mit zwei Millionen Besuchern und Kshs 60 Milliarden Einkünften aus dem Tourismus rechnen."

Dies sagte Morris Dzoro, Minister für Tourismus und Wildleben, in seiner Ansprache, als das Kenya Tourist Board im Juli sein zehnjähriges Bestehen feierte.

Im Jahr 2006 verzeichnete Kenia 1,6 Millionen internationale Ankünfte.

"Unsere Sommersaison hat gerade begonnen und ich fragte einige führende Persönlichkeiten in der Tourismusindustrie an der Küste, wie es mit Hotelbuchungen aussieht und ob sie besser sind als im vergangenen Jahr."

Auni Kanji, Senior Regional Director East Africa, Abercrombie and Kent, sagte:

"Die Buchungen haben zugenommen und in den Game Lodges stehen kaum genügend Unterkünfte zur Verfügung, wahrscheinlich, weil die große Tierwanderung bereits begonnen hat."

"Wir erhalten auch schon Anfragen für Incentive Gruppen im nächsten Jahr."

Während das Kenya Tourist Board sehr gute Arbeit leistet beim Marketing, sollte die Regierung jedoch das Marketing Budget erhöhen, um neue Märkte zu erschließen, das heißt mehr investieren in Marketing und Werbung.

Es ist interessant festzustellen, dass die Zahl der Besucher aus USA diejenige aus Deutschland überflügelt hat mit 86.528 Touristen aus USA und 83.394 aus Deutschland.

Mr. Kanji bemerkte, dass die fliegenden Händler am Strand ein ungelöstes Problem darstellen.

Trotz Verhandlungen während der letzten drei Jahre konnte bisher keine praktische Lösung gefunden werden.

Der Kenya Wildlife Service versprach, die Angelegenheit zu überprüfen und eine allgemein akzeptable Lösung zu finden.

Ferner wurden die schlechten Straßen von Mombasa nach Malindi und an die Südküste erwähnt.

Shafket Pervaiz, General Manager Rhino Safaris, sagte:

"Für Rhino Safaris sieht die Sommersaison vielversprechend aus und besser als im vergangenen Jahr, vor allem dank dem My Travel Charterdienst, der seit November das ganze Jahr hindurch von London (Gatwick) und Manchester Touristen nach Mombasa fliegt."

Was den italienischen Markt betrifft, erklärte Mr. Pervaiz, dass die Italiener vor allem von Mitte Juli bis im Dezember nach Kenia kommen.

"Die Strandhändler sind zurückgekommen in Scharen und sind noch aggressiver geworden."

"Wir erhalten viele Reklamationen von Gästen, dass sie belästigt werden und sich nicht ungestört am Strand aufhalten können."

"Es ist frustrierend, wir beschweren uns ständig bei der Regierung, aber es wird nichts unternommen."

Er unterstützt Auni Kanji in seiner Bitte an die Regierung, dass die schlechten Straßen nach Malindi und an die Südküste repariert werden.

# Unfortunate Victims First 'Slugged' And Then 'Mugged' During An Imaginative Mega Scam

Creativity and ingenuity is an attribute that is well spread in the Kenyan population.

We also have a lot of brilliant minds that are idle due to the fact that we are churning out a lot more secondary and tertiary institution grandaunts than the country's employment needs.

Students released from these institutions and who do not get jobs have to survive somehow and they tend to put their minds to use with some great and others not so great results.

The level of raw entrepreneurship in the country is amazing.

Starting from the little retail vendors at the street side in housing estates through to the whiz kids that are luring venture capitalists and investment clubs to commit cash, the spirit of "can do" in Kenya is exhilarating.

However, we also have the dark side of this creativity in that some people put their minds to use with some great and others not so great results.

The reality in this world is that we cannot all be perfect.

Breeding clever criminals as part of the education system is a given, we cannot get away from it.

It from this murky part of reality that Kachumbari gave me this week's story.

At the end of one month, a gentleman decided he would visit some friends in the Eastern suburbs of Nairobi.

This was a place known for music and pretty diversions, especially for youthful looking slightly inebriated men.

When they got there, they settled into a corner of the bar and continued their consumption of alcoholic beverages.

It seemed like they intended to have a last feast before the dreaded Alco blow meter would be put back in the hands of the cops.

It is not clear how it happened but at some stage of the evening, each of the buddies had acquired a female companion and they

made their perches at the bar available to these ladies.

One of them who was with Kachumbari's friend, decided that the counter was too crowded and convinced her "catch" to relocate to another table.

This he willingly did as by this time it was the Tusker that was thinking and talking!

They settled at the table for about another hour and by this time some three additional ladies had joined and the gentleman was really enjoying the attention he was getting.

They danced and drank till the witching hour of three and the ladies managed to convince the gentleman to give them a lift to another drinking joint closer to their place of residence.

He agreed and they all bundle into his car and they proceeded to the back end of Uthuru.

When they got there, the ladies graciously invited him for a final drink at their modest local pub.

The fellow agreed and they proceeded and stop in front of some mabati gates.

He did not notice that they were spanking new mabatis or even if he did he did not show it.

They went into the joint and by that time the place seemed relatively quiet.

There were only a few patrons and the music was subdued.

The ladies greeted the patrons as very familiar persons.

They sat down ordered drinks and ordered one for the fellow as well.

They settled into the place and quietly the other patrons disappeared.

After a short while, there was a lot of commotion and the place was invaded by some masked gunmen.

They tied up the girls after taking off their clothes and only left them with their skimpy undergarments (commonly referred to as tea bags).

They proceeded to rough up the few other patrons and also tied them up and then frogmarched this bewildered gentleman to his car.

They did the usual in terms of demanding his ATM card, pin number wallet and the like.

They would target groups and split out whom they thought was most vulnerable and then take him away using their full charm.

It later transpired that some twenty people had been cleaned out during this scam.

Their vehicles were recovered and they were all unharmed but as a result of the operation, the gang was able to net in excess of one and a half million shillings, mobile phones, laptops and other high value personal electronic goods.

As far as I know as of today, the police are still trying to corner the gang that set up this ingenious crime.

They have some leads but each one seems to lead to a dead end.

As Kachumbari says, it's all about imagination and flair.

Declarer advanced the Nine of Hearts, running it when West played low.

East won with the Knave and returned a Club, and Declarer won the Ace.

The Kenyans participation has been made possible through the collaboration of International Olympic Committee, Olympic Solidarity, International Rowing Federation, Kenya Rowing and Canoe Association and Kenya Watersports Trust - through the support of the Tourism Trust Fund.

M/s Sheila Stephens, the Development Manager Of International Rowing Federation is expected to give a key note speech to address the modern concepts and development areas of concern.

Experts from UK, and South Africa will take the participants through a series on lectures and practical demonstrations, Boat repair methodology and performance based of the South African model.

Kenya Rowing and Canoe Association (KRACA) Secretary General Saifudin Patwa noted:

"It is hoped that the knowledge from this conference gained will drive the country-wide development of watersports in general in network of clubs already under various stages of development.

"Particularly as Kenya will be hosting the 5th Africa-Canoe Kayak Championships and Beijing Games Olympic Qualifiers from 1-5 November 2007 at Masinga Dam."
