



According to local weather watchers the rains are not a record in themselves but are running close to the record levels of 1972 and 1968.

The new Rhodesian regime — led by blacks under Bishop Muzorewa but saddled with a white-designed Constitution—bas two ways of trying to end this dangerous cival war either lure the lighting parties into a more broadly based black government or defeat them in battle.

To widen his appeal to more blacks, the Bishop would need to win more power through constitutional concessions from the whites To tight it out he would have the whites To tight it out he would have to turn to South African whites for major to turn to South African whites for more dependent on Soviet and



> CRYSTAL BALL ON THE BUDGE

ON Thursday of next week, Mr Kibaki will present the 1979 Budget to Parliament and at this time of year all Eco-nomists get out their crystal balls and attempt to forecast what measures will be measures introduced.

Budgets are prepared in the light of the current economic situation and the overriding factor this year must be the coreign exchange position, which although improving all the time, is still not strong.

The stringent system of import deposits introduced at the end of 1978 are having a beneficial effect, albeit a small one, and foreign currency reserves are still at a low level.

At the same time the inflation rate is at a level high enough to gause the Covernment concern and shows little sign of falling in the near future.

Bearing these two factors in mind, it is unlikely that there will be any give-aways in next week's Budget, except perhaps to the lower paid.

It is more likely that measures will be introduced to further discourage consumption of non-essential goods such as large cars, wines and spirits and imported electrical goods.

electrical goods.

Such measures will have the effect of conserving foreign exchange and of raising more taxes from the wealthier sections of the community.

At the same time we must expect an increase in the duty on beer, tobacco and petrol. All yield substantial sums in tax revenue already and an increase in the tax on them is a sure way of raising at least some of the cash required by the Government to finance the recommendations of the new Development Plan.

Major changes are unlikely

Major changes are unlikely in the field of income tax, as significant reforms were made last year in order to simplify the system. What may happen is that allowances and benefit values might be increased to keep pace with inflation.

Many of these have remained unchanged for several years, despite the rapid increase in the general price level.

circumstances beyond anybody's control, I have to request members of the public to appreciate this fact and tolerate any inconvenience temporarily caused to them.

Moreover, I should like to remind you that these roads which were built very many years ago were not built to a standard capable of withstanding

the current very heavy vehicles.

Coupled with this it will be appreciated that the vehicular traffic has increased by leaps and bounds not envisaged previously and these are, therefore, equally important factors contributing to the deterioration of the roads.

An explanation on the repairs of potholes has been given in the newspapers more than once by the ag. Municipal engineer.

I fully concur with him that the condition of the roads is aggravated during the wet weather. The only solution to this is perhaps recarpeting of all the roads which is very expensive project running into millions of pounds.

Neither the Government who are responsible to maintain town planning roads can afford to embark upon such an ambitious project; though desirable to cope with the present vastly increased vehicular loads and traffic.

However, this matter is constantly reviewed by the authorities and it is hoped that recarpeting of the roads will one day be a viable project.



spent an evening in Nairobi with Cynthia, and her husband, Nat Kofsky

She writes songs for Roger Whittaker

CYNTHIA Kofsky — wife of Nat, the director of Kenya's Conservatoire of Music — who (old-timers will recall) wrote that controversial Kenya Olympic Song for the Melbourne Games in 1956, has burst into song again.

1956, has burst into song again.
This time it's Thorn Trees, both music and lyric, and Idle Dreamer, just the lyric; and her latest music, reminiscent of the Rumuruti bush country of Laikipia where she was raised by her pioneering family, was destined for another old Kenya hand' — ballard singer Roger Whittaker or Hank' as we used to call him.

If my Coast friend Stanley

If my Coast friend Stanley Moss of the British Council will forgive the expression, I dropped in on the Kofskys for dinner the other night; they lived just a proverbial stone's throw away from my Westlands home off Peponi Road.

The words of Thorn Tree are haunting...
Strange grey people live in thorn trees.
Shadowy tolk with sad green

Shadowy tolk with sad green

eyes. Softly I hear their plaintive Reedy and shrill when the mad

And then a later verse:

Only remain the straggling thorn trees, Patterned like the lace on a lonely sky; Only the wind that moans and shuddering.

falls asleep with a sigh

I listened to Roger in Britain hearing Thorn Trees for the lirst time: strumming and then whistling it — according to Nat, he's a great stifleur as well as singer. He later created a French version, Les Lutins Qui Somnambulent (The goblins that walk in the night) and it's already in one of his albums.

He wrote his own music for Cynthia's Idle Dreamer lyric, and that has appeared (in English) on a Whittaker disk made in Germany. Neither of Cynthia's songs have yet been released in Britain.

I was privileged to see a letter written by Nairobi-born Roger — who was given his first real chance in showbiz

by Ron Partridge of the Nairobi Equator Club way back in the fiftles — who told Cynthia:
"I think that between us we have created a couple of very lovely little songs . . . I hope that file is as blissful in Kenya as I remember it".

Roger's parents, incidentally, live not far from me in neighbouring Loresho.

Cynthia, Nat and myself had a good natter about those long-forgotten arguments that surrounded her creation of the national song for the 1956 Olympics Olympics.

A certain Mr Wm. T.
Bircham — one of the six
finalists whose entry didn't
make it — rushed into print
with a letter to the Sunday
Post suggesting that Cynthia

had unfair help from her violinist husband, who had (most wisely) retired as a judge because of his wife's parti-cipation.

Bircham had 'noted' that Cynthia couldn't read, let alone write, music and, therefore by implication, Nat must have had a hand in the song.

In a spirited reply, Cynthia wrote: "I do not read or write wrote: "I do not read or write that the plane he ear.

music. I play the piano by ear
and Kenya Land of the Lion
was composed by myself alone,
complete with melody,
harmony and rhythm, and only
then set down on paper from

Kenya Land of the Lion and its composer created quite a story at the time. The Standard gave Cynthia this write-up:

As a child she learned to love Kenya and its wild-life. Living in Rumuruti she kept lion and leopard cubs as pets and when she was 16, she shot a charging lion near her home. Her brother, Mr Bill Ryan, is a well known Kenya hunter.

Mrs Kofsky wrote her song while on leave at Mombasa. "I went out for a walk one evening on the beach by myself and made up the tune. I made up the words later. We sang it all the way up from Mombasa in the car . . . it nearly drove the family crazy".

During the Forces radio station's "Wireless for the Blind Fund Request Programme" — I suppose this was the start of the present Round Table's Ring Us Up — an announcer, asked to play Land of the Lion remarked: "Sorry we don't have the record: If I had the words I'd sing it for you".

Committee visited the studio,
put down a donation and
challenged the announcer:
"Here are the words — sing it!"
He did.





The extent that lesser powerful teams have humiliated out teams and the number of goals they have conceded at an continus the faculties of even the most impassionate occer observer in this country!

We had every reason to rejoice when three teams room the Coast joined the select elite of Kenya Super eague contenders this year. But this joy has been shortlived by our teams' dismal erformances in the current league. Frankly speaking, Coast soccer is no longer what it used be exhibitive, entertaining and satisfying fairs' mania classic goals.

In other words, we had stopped regarding and even watching soccer as it should be long time ago! Instead of the professional spirit of the game and the urge to win came in mere personalities who turned the pitch into a battlefield between soccer pundits and seemingly reduced players into sporting mercenaries.

At the corner, soccer lovers watched in utter be-wilderment!

In the process, out went discipline among players, proper and principled administration of soccer at all levels, and finally the glory of winning and the moral obligation of delivering the goods to the fars.

of delivering the goods to the fans.

And the soccer politics revolving around matters totally alien to the interests of the game, have not even spared those who see soccer as an end in itself! Humble players have mercilessly been cast asade, their brilliant careets cut short and the country denied the services of its most declicated and selfless ambassadors in the world of sports.

Subjectively, everyone would wish to see the golden era of Coast soccer regained and the reputation of Mombasa as the home of soccer in the country restored.

But analysed philestoryly the selection of the society of the

But analysed objectively, this is a long way off from now, and taking into account the sad situation Coast soccer find itself in, such a phenomenon may never come to pass.

Yet in all failmess, the decline of soccer as a sport in Mombasa cannot be taken at face value it is not the result of one man, one team or the soccer lovers of Mombasa.

It is, in fact partly attributable to the current chaotic situation which continues to bedevill the administration of soccer in this country. And despite a new administration at the belin of power, its future still looks as confused

A lot of soul-searching is therefore, called for from all ose concerned in order to steer away the game from its esent steady decline.

Once upon a time there were such names like Lindonde, Kadenge, Madegwa and Sungura. These stars must be replaced and soccer re-admitted to its rightful place among other sports in the country.

As for Coast, no amount of tears can water and blossom the tree of soccer. The reality of the present is that we have to start all over again from scratch.

From the accumulated ashes we must search for the mnants of soccer — for the future.




