GENEROUS SCHOLARSHIPS HELP KENYANS STUDY MEDICINE AT MOSCOW UNIVERSITIES



Sixty-three Kenya students have left the Coast on generous scholarships to pursue medical studies in higher education at Russian Universities.

Tears flowed freely at the Moi International Airport (MIA) Mombasa as parents bade them farewell. The first group of 31 Kenyan students who benefited

from scholarships to study medicine in Russia flew out on Monday and were later followed by the final flight of 32 on Thursday.

The Kenyan students will be studying medicine at three state universities in Moscow, the capital city of

FROM FRONT PAGE Russia. They will join Saratov State university, Nizhny Novgorod Medical State university and Ryazan Medical State university college.

Universal Education Trust Fund (UETF) are implementing the first ever international university scholarship programme.

UETF co-ordinator Ms Halima Ahmed said that the process of

identifying the students was both rigorous and transparent.

UETF is a non denominational, non sectarian, non political and a non governmental national fund.

Its principle mission is to extend school fees assistance to countless and talented children in primary, secondary, special schools, colleges and tertiary institutions.

Many have been unable to continue with their education for lack of finances.

The fund primarily focuses on students from Coast and North

Eastern provinces, two regions that that are widely regarded as being the periphery of Kenya's educational domain.

Successful applicants for the university scholarships were interviewed and shortlisted before the final ones who made it to join Russian universities.

Beneficiaries for the fund are young Kenyan students who attained aggregate A and were unable to get places in any of the State universities in Kenya.

Three local agencies based in Russia who will care for the students for the duration of their

course.

UETF is an exclusive philanthropic venture by TAL Group of Companies, the students have been admitted at three Russian state universities to study medicine.

For the 63 Kenyan students, the fund will be using Sh. 180 million to cover cost airfares, accommodation, health and life insurance covers as well as a \$ 150 pocket allowance per month.

Finance Minister Hon. Amos Kimunya was in Mombasa early last month to officiate at the launch of the international

scholarship programme by UETF.

He was accompanied during a colourful ceremony by Heritage Minister Hon. Suleiman Shikombo and Regional Development Minister Hon. Mohamed Abdi held at the East Africa Environmental Management Company Limited premises in Mombasa.

The fund's trustees, Abdiwahid Haji Yarrow and Twalib Halayam formed the trust in the year 2000 and it has grown over time and today supports close to 6,000 bright students from under-privileged families.

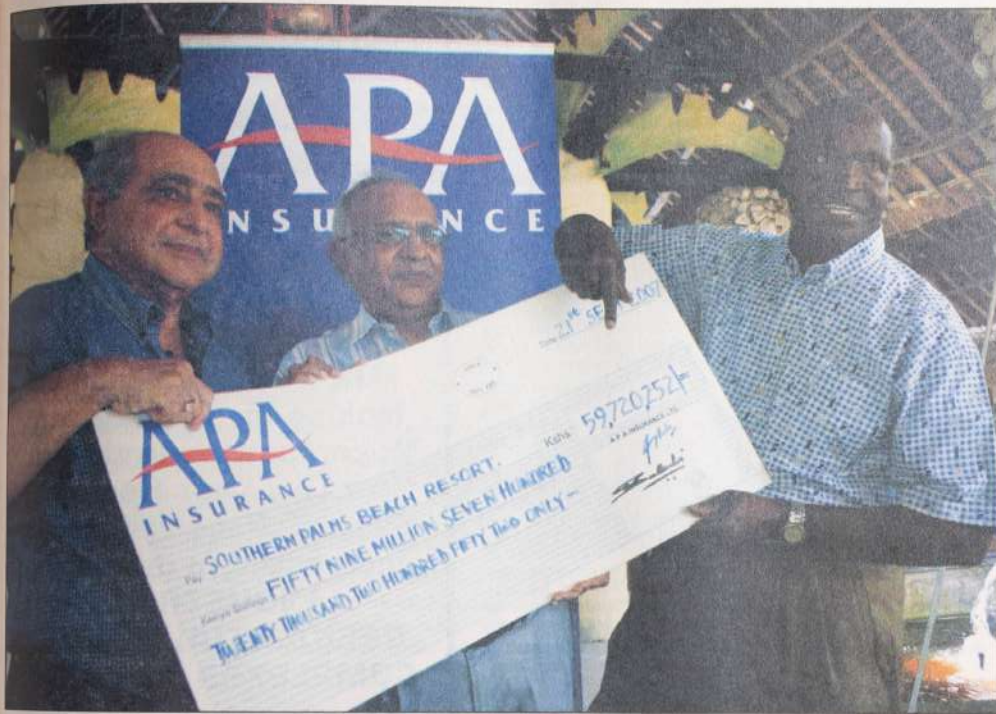

KPA: Some Pertinent Reasons For Mombasa Port Congestion

I have been reading the continued discussions about the congestions in the port of Mombasa and the remedies being applied by the management.

I have been a regular user (imports) of the port and I find that there are some simpler and cheaper remedies which will help ease the congestion by quite a bit.

Let me give a few pointers to the cause of the blockage:

- The primary reason is the delay in billing section.

When one lodges a document at the One-Stop-Centre, it must be dispatched to KPA headquarters (CDO) for billing.

This takes up almost two hours at the least.

Then the billing takes up another four hours (if you are very lucky!).

After paying, the document goes back up again and takes another three or four hours to be dispatched back to One-Stop-Centre.

This entire process takes up one whole day of the clearing procedure.

It would be much simpler if the entire billing section was to be shifted to One-Stop-Centre which would cut the time taken to dispatch of document to and from the CDO.

- One of the most puzzling things about KPA is the way they handle the billing of the demurrages.

Assuming that you lodge your document late at the CDO, you

incur demurrages for exceeding the seven-day of free clearance allowed by KPA.

Your invoice will thus reflect the extra charges up to the date of the invoice.

This is ridiculous because it is common knowledge that there is at least another two days of procedure left after the invoice is paid.

This means that after you have cleared your container, you must return back to KPA to get a fresh bill for the extra days you have taken after paying the original invoice.

Let's assume further that you pay the extra charges by 4.00 p.m., it is highly unlikely that you will get the container out that particular day due to various other delays of bookings as enumerated later in this article.

This means after you have loaded your container next day, you must queue up once more to get another invoice for the extra day.

Wouldn't it be more prudent to either allow two free days after date one has cleared port charges or charge for couple of days more on the original invoice so as to save time and effort?

It may seem like saving a very little time but believe me, on the long run it will add up to a lot.

- Perhaps the most intriguing policy of KPA is the system of booking of the transport to carry your cargo after your goods have been cleared.

One must have a booking form stamped by the clearing firm before the booking is accepted.

In practicality, a clearing clerk is not allowed to carry a sensitive thing like a rubber stamp by his firm.

This means he must get a bus out of KPA to his office, get the stamp affixed and then travel back to One-Stop-Centre which takes up about two or three hours.

And now here comes the clincher: If you book after 3.00 p.m, you get a booking for the next day.

I have yet to understand the reason for this policy.

If I am not wrong, the port is supposed to clear cargo twenty four hours a day - so why stop the entry of new trucks after 3.00 p.m.?

In fact the entire booking system should be scrapped.

In the days of yore, Lorries were allowed to enter in the morning to solicit business.

Once your cargo is released, you just shop for a ready transporter, load your cargo and get it out in a matter of hours.

It is my humble suggestion that they should allow maybe 200 trucks in every morning and afterwards let in a lot of twenty for every twenty departed ones.

- Perhaps the biggest factor of congestion is the cranes.

It is not the lack of them but the inefficient way they are being used.

Twice in the last two weeks I have had to wait for over 10 hours to have my container loaded due to the fact that one crane was trying to serve over 50 or 60 trucks in the 'E' block while the other blocks had cranes standing completely idle.

It would take just a bit of common sense for a supervisor to observe the place of congestion and assign the idle cranes to clear it fast.

The use of idle front-loaders would also be a very good idea in easing the above situation.

I think I have highlighted some of the issues which in my humble opinion are the causes of the current congestions in the Port of Mombasa.

They require just a few practical solutions which can only be achieved if the powers-that-be can come down on the ground and implement.

I hope the necessary changes are made urgently as the current situation is most frustrating, not to mention annoying to us importers.

IP Is For Internet Protocol - Meaning Computer Address

IP stands for Internet Protocol which in simple terms means computer address.

It is a unique address that helps electronic devices identify and communicate to each other in a computer network.

IP addresses are found in technologies such as Ethernet which is used across Local Area Networks.

Devices used in networks such as routers, computers, printers and switches, all have their own IP address.

An IP address helps identify a specific computer or other network device on a network just like a phone or mobile number which identifies a

telephone or mobile.

Helping computers in a network to transfer data to each other, an IP address has



no data guarantee and can end up corrupting and cause connection errors.

This will all depend on the network set-up designed.

There are different versions of IP addresses such as IPv4 (Version 4) which has 32 bit

addresses and is the first version to be used globally.

The other version currently in deployment is the new standard protocol IPv6 (Version 6) which consists of 128 bit address and is the next contender for the version 4.

IPv6 address example: 4FDE:0000:0000:0002:0022:F376:FF3B

IP addressing is quite complex and there is a lot to understand about assigning IP to devices.

IP subnetting is another complex method where it involves splitting an address

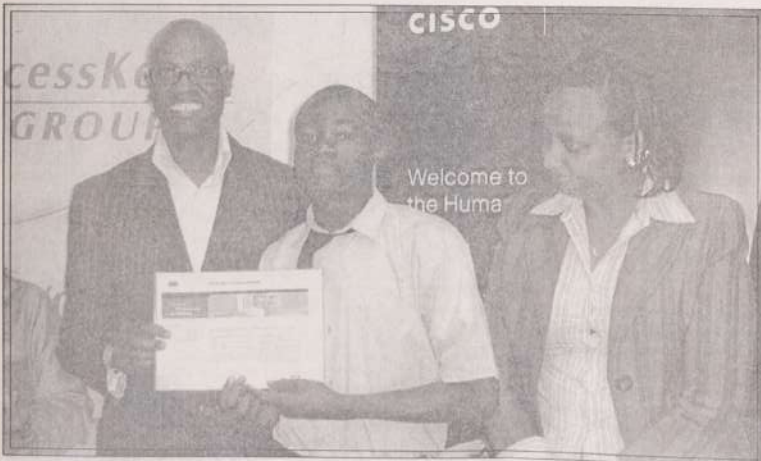

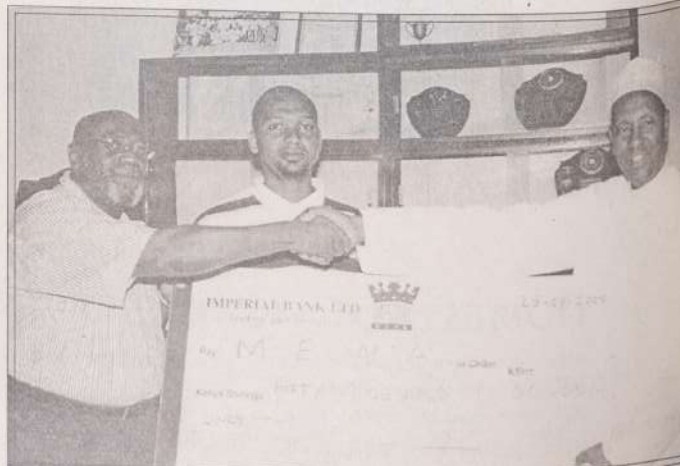



Die tragische geschichte von Port Reitz ...

Ein Kapitänleutnant von der niederländischen Marine, der 1781 in den Kampf von Dogger Bank verwickelt war, hatte nicht nur Zeit gefunden, während des Gefechts die Geschehnisse in einem Aquarell festzuhalten, sondern gab 200 Jahre später Anlass, dass sich ein meiner frustrierendsten Datennachforschungen begann.

Aus 'Coast Causerie' Band 1 von EDWARD RODWELL

Der Marineoffizier mit Namen Reitz wurde später Vater eines Sohnes, der zum ersten Kommandanten von Mombasa ernannt wurde und dessen Name in der Ortsbezeichnung Port Reitz, dem wunderschönen, friedlichen Hafen westlich von Kiindini weiter lebt.

Ich war fest entschlossen, den Ort zu finden, wo Lt. Jacobus Johannes Reitz von der Royal Navy begraben liegt und war einmal so nahe am Ziel, dass mir von seiner Familie, der ostafrikanischen Kolonialregierung, der britischen Regierung und der Kirchenbehörde die Erlaubnis erteilt wurde, seine Überreste nach Auffindung unter einem Lagerhaus in der Nida Kuu, Mombasa, zu entfernen und auf dem Gelände bei der **Mombasa Memorial Cathedral** beizusetzen.

Ich kann die ganze Geschichte hier gar nicht beschreiben.

Lt. Reitz war 1824 auf der **H.M.S. "Leven"**, als das Vermessungsschiff Mombasa anliefe.

Der Imam von Muskat versuchte gerade, die Insel zu unterwerfen und die lokalen Häuptlinge baten Kapitän Vidal, den Union Jack, die britische Nationalflagge, über dem **Fort Jesus** zu hissen, um dieses politische Argument ein für allemal auszuschließen.

Das war keine leichte Entscheidung, aber nach langem Hin und Her und Für und Wider wurde die Flagge gehisst.

Lt. Reitz wurde zum ersten Kommandanten des Forts befördert.

Seine Mitarbeiter waren Mr. **George Phillips**, Fähnrich zur See, ein Marinekorporal und drei Seeleute.

Das war eine unvorteilhafte britische Entscheidung; der Leutnant und seine Männer hatten keine Kenntnisse der arabischen oder Suahelisprache, keine Ahnung von der Natur der Einwohner und keine Erfahrung in tropischen Krankheiten.

Nach sechs Monaten waren drei der sechs Leute gestorben und die Bewohner von der Küste waren unzufrieden mit den strikten britischen Regeln, vor allem mit der Abschaffung des Sklavenhandels, des Schmuggels und anderer

Verbrechen, die zu jener Zeit gang und gäbe waren.

Eine der Lt. Reitz übertragenen Aufgaben bestand darin, die Topographie der Küste in Verbindung mit der Geschichte und der Ökologie zu erforschen.

Am 5. Mai 1824 machte er sich auf, um die Panganifälle zu besuchen und unterwegs die Landschaft kennenzulernen.

Die große Regenzeit stand vor der Tür, aber das Wetter war noch angenehm.

Reitz beachtete die Warnung nicht, dass das Wetter innerhalb von Stunden umschlagen könnte und seine Expedition machte sich auf den Weg; Reitz und ein paar andere ritten auf Eseln und siebzig Lastenträger marschierten in einer Linie entlang dem schmalen Küstenstreifen gen Süden.

Sie waren nicht viel weiter als Tiwi, als der Regen von Tanganjika, heute Tansania, her einsetzte.

Lt. Reitz war 1824 auf der H.M.S. "Leven", als das vermessungsschiff Mombasa anliefe.

Am Morgen des 7. Mai kam die Reisegruppe bei der Insel Wasini vorbei und gelangte nach Mkwini, wo sie hoffte, Segelschiffe vorzufinden, die von Mombasa aus geschickt wurden und dort auf sie warten sollten.

Die Esel waren von der langen Reise erschöpft und

Reitz und einige seiner Leute beschlossen, die Reise in Kanus fortzusetzen.

Bei Gegenwind, strömendem Regen und schwerem Seegang musste ständig Wasser aus den Booten geschöpft werden und die kleine Flotte wurde ins offene Meer hinausgetrieben.

Erst als der Sturm nachließ, konnte wieder Land gesichtet werden und schließlich erreichten sie Tanga.

Dort ruhten sie ein paar Tage aus und fuhren dann mit den Booten weiter nach Pangani.

Es war eine katastrophale Reise, die Boote wurden vom Wind und den Wellen ständig abgetrieben, außer dasjenige von Reitz; die Ruderer kämpften neun Stunden gegen die Elemente, bevor sie die Mündung des Flusses erreichten und in dem Dorf Mbeni landeten.

Am Tag nach ihrer Ankunft hatte Reitz hohes Fieber.

Die Crew unternahm ihr Möglichstes, aber das Fieber ließ nicht nach und es gab keine Hoffnung auf Hilfe vom Land oder vom Meer her.

Es wurde beschlossen, den jungen Marineoffizier nach Mombasa zurückzubringen.

Reitz wurde mit einer Plane gegen Wind und Regen zugedeckt und lag bewußtlos im Achterschiff, ohne zu bemerken, was mit ihm geschah.

Die Wellen schlugen hart an und über das Boot; Nacht für Nacht gingen die Seeleute an Land und trugen den Schwerkranken an den
