In less than two years the Kenya Bus Services is reported to have lost an anticipated revenue in the region of K.Shs. three million due to disputes with the Municipal Council of Mombasa over fare increases and soaring operation costs.

The company is reported to have also incurred a revenue loss of K.Shs. 1,760,000 last year when the Council partly approved the fare increases proposals submitted by the Kenya Bus Service.

And the delay in implementing the proposed fare increases in 1981 up to April 1 is said to have resulted in an additional loss of revenue amounting to K.Shs 1,300,000.

FEAR OF PUBLIC OUTCRY

In addition the delay in the implementation of ferry tolls as proposed by the company is reported to have created a loss of revenue of K.Shs. 380,000 for the first three months of 1981

The Municipal Council of Mombasa which owns 49 per cent of the shares is believed to have delayed these increases for fear of a public outcry from commuters who represent the

At the same time the increase in the price of fuel has also hit hard at the company's operations costs.

It is now claimed that the company's fuel bill is running into the region of K.Shs. 106,000 per month for buses only — a figure which is expected to rise up following the recent increase in the fuel prices.

And the cost of spare parts has, too, been soaring up. The revaluation of the Kenya Shilling early this year is reported to have increased the cost of vehicles spare parts, tyres and chasis by at least

ANYBODY who has worked with — or for — Mohamed Amin usually walks away punchy. His energy is fearsome his drive, to some irrational.

Only 35, his list of accomp-lishments already reads like a list of lifelong honours.

Twelve years is a long time to live in such a relentless shadow but somehow he and me have maintained a love-hatred relationship. He thinks he loves me and I think I hate him.

But indeed in a world of non achievements Achiever par excellence.

It is philosophy to be admired if not relished. Mohamed Amin, of course, is a Muslim — and he has in his own heart a contra-philosophy. Leave nothing to chance: "Make it happen".

Judged on his own record nat has to be the philosophy to follow

For his Karma seems to be destined to guide him inevitable success.

Whenever he's around things seem to happen - and if they don't he makes them.

When he decided on his monumental expedition around Lake Turkana he had only a vague notion of what would

But surely as the months went by things began to happen — to the point in March, 1980 when he decided

somebody should start writing a manuscript for Cradle of Mankind and he began, with his colloborator, plotting chapters.

Sometimes around June he reckoned he had a book and began preparations for its printing. The manuscript was edited and re-edited, the book designed and re-designed.

The transparencies went for colour separations and the next for typesetting and the printers were alerted.

Now all he had to do was to find a publisher. Hard to believe, of course, but that is Mohamed Amin. Hundreds — literally hundreds — of sales literally hundreds — of sale letters flowed across the world.


Withut success. Doggedly this destiny maker packed his suitcases, carried out some duplicate transparencies, some early seperation proof sheets, a dozen copies of the manu-script and for five hungry days and nights expended his tireless energy by lugging his 15 kilos handload along the miles of corridors and the miles of publishers gathered at the Frankfurt International Book

It concluded with a hard bargaining session with one of the world's most respected publishers, Chatto and Windus of London.

They took world rights for the book, excluding the USA, in the English language.

Then Amin strode off again seeking new worlds to conquer and engaged several German publishers in lengthy dialogues punishers in lengthy dialogues resulting in one company taking the German language rights to what every one in the British book trade at least now agrees is likely to be one of the most remarkable books of the

Have you forgiven others for real and imagined wrongs they did to you? Have you decided to become more honest, sincere and truthful? Above everything else, is there room for God and His Prophet in your thoughts and actions? actions

If you can answer yes to all these questions, then you can rightly take pride to have achieved the real purpose of fasting. If not, you have to redouble your efforts for your fast to be accepted by the Almighty

The Holy Prophet once saw a woman — who was fasting on that day — abusing her servant. The Prophet asked her to break her fast.

The woman protested: "But, I am fasting today." The Holy



Avoid too much natural moisture in the pan, this drowns the alchohol and it will not light either.

Shell fish and brandy are very compatible and when kidneys are flambeed they become a great dish, many fruits too benefit enormously with the help of flambeed, brandy, fresh figs and mangoes in particular.

Apart from measles and mumps the most infectious thing is a gurgle, of laughter a fat chuckle, a warm smile! Well worth a trial actually.







## THE 'SAFARI' DRIVE THROUGH UGANDA

LEAVING Nairobi tonight, after fourteen years in East Africa is someone who has contributed more than his fair share to motor sport.

Chris Fryer arrived in Tanganyika in April 1967 as a salesman with Kalamazoo Office Equipment in Dar es Salaam. In 1970 he became the sales manager for Tanzania which involved considerable travelling.

In July 1972, Chris came to Kenya on his appointment as manager of the Mombasa branch of D.T. Dobie, the post he has held for nine years.

Chris now moves to Scotland where he takes up the post of sales and marketing manager sales and marketing managements with Callendus Engineering Co.
Ltd., the Mercedes Benz agents in Glasgow. One of his responsibilities will be the setting up of a commercial vehicle denartment.

Chris became involved motor sport soon after his arrival when he joined the Tanganyika Motor Sports Club, assisting with organisation of events.

In 1968 he started rallying with Brian Barton in a Hillman lmp, originally bought for Meg Fryer to get to the nearest duka; a particularly smart bit of salesmanship on the home

Ninety minutes before the start of a training rally, Bert Shankland was hired to fit the compulsory seat belts and at signing on, Chis was connecting up a Speed Pilot, the current navigational aid that gave time elapsed and average speed, but rather overlooked the all-important distance travelled.

The newly formed team made second place out of twenty-two starters and Chris was truly hooked on motor sport

8 Gordini, purchased from Alec Rose, then the Datsun 1000 saloon that Ewart Walker had driven in the 1969 Safari.

With their new mount, Fryer and Barton achieved fifth position in the Coco Cola Rally, starting at Moshi when one could choose one's start point, Monte Carlo style.

After making sixth overall in the Rift Valley Rally, the Datsun saloon was switched for a 1000 cc coupe, with the 1970 Safari as the target.

Chris and Brian started number 94 from Kampala and at the half way mark had hauled themselves up to 28th on the road.

On the tarmac near Mito Ndei, Chris was snatching some sleep when he heard Brian comment on loss of power. He opened his eyes, noticed the oil pressure was falling and at that second a main bearing that second a main bearing seized, shearing the crankshaft.

Next step up the power ladder was a Datsun 1600 SSS, the ex-factory rally car that Jack Simonian had rolled in the Meru-Embu section of the previous Safari, when the crossing of a narrow bridge went wrong.

This car was used to recce the 1971 Safari route. In the rally Chris had the use of a Marshalls entered Peugeot 204.

To his delight he came 25th overall, entitling him to that coveted trophy, a Safari overall, entitling him to that coveted trophy, a Safari finishers badge, and was also third in class. A little outside help was required after the car left the road between Kampala and Jinja, missed all the trees that lined the bank and came to a rest a hundred feet down the bank.

The ever rising costs forced Chris Fryer to retire from active participation in motor sport, but a year later he took on the considerable responsibilities of Assistant Clerk of the Course (Coast region) for the Safari Rally, a job he repeated in

In 1976 he attempted the Safari once more in the red Datsun 120Y with Ewart Walker, their rally ended with so many others in the flooded drift at Kitui.

For four years, Chris helped the Datsun teams effort in the Safari, driving a chase car, first with John Lockhart-Mure, then with David Horsey. In 1981 he reverted to the lowly rank of spectator, but he positioned his Range Rover at the only mud hole in the Coast route just in case he would get

Among the many events that Chris Fryer helped put together was the 1970 Richard Leonard Rally, a 1,600Km. event based in Dar es Salaam, named after one of the founder members of the Tanganyika Motor Sports Club.

The winner received a gold plated trophy that became the property of Bert Shankland the third time he won it, an occasion that coincided with the end of rallying in that country

→In 1974 Chris was assistant to Allan Johns in the Coast 800 Rally, a new event created to mark a resurgence of interest in Mombasa Motor Club.

With John Gardiner's help he with John Gardiner's help he put on a training rally that brought the cars up Nguu Tatu, long before the present highway was constructed. The organisers sat at Ribe and developed ulcers waiting for the first car, well over 30 minutes overdue; when the cars appeared they were covered in mud.

M.M.C.'s first taste of special M.M.C.'s first taste of special stage rallying was in a Fryer! Lockhart-Mure training event, when Vipingo sisal allowed cars through their access roads. Only six kilometres in length, the stage produced some unexpected thrills; a sisal train had been parked on the route.

Chris has been a steward for rallies and track events, on rallies and track events, on one memorable occasion he ended a motor-cycle practice session at Nguu Tatu by a smart karate chop with the chequered flag on the helmet of a rider who ignored his "off-the-track" signal. This brought a heated protest, but it did allow the rest of the riders to get on with the event.

Chris has represented Mombasa at the Annual Motor Sports Conference, otherwise known as the Mike Doughty Talk Show, when the years events for every motor club in Kenya are haggled over.

Chris Fryer's final contri-bution to motor sport in Kenya was to act as M.M.C. Steward for the 1981 Severin Malindi Rally Rally and provide a commentary at the start over the public address system.

With two Safari finishes to his credit, the Malindi Rally has always held a jinx for Chris In three attempts at the rally he had never finished.

he had never finished.

His first attempt at the Malindi was in 1977. After 350km., whily lying fourth on the road, a piston disintegrated putting him out of the rally. In 1978, he was an early casualty in the first competitive section, when his Datsun sank to its headlights into the mud in a flooded maize field behind in a flooded maize field behind Vipingo Estate.

Attempts to winch the vehicle out uprooted the substantial looking tree at the other end of the cable and the car was still embedded in the scenery while other crews were collecting their loot at prize-giving on Sunday afternoon.

Chris' third attempt at the Malindi was the year of the Nguu Tatu mud bath, when three quarters of the field bogged down nineteen kilometres from the start.

Chris Fryer extracted his car fourteen hours later; less successful salvage operations went on for three days. Rumour has it that a thriving Auto-mobile Village Polytechnic is still using some vehicles whose still using some vehicles whose crews walked off in disgust.

Once Chris is established in Scotland he intends getting involved in organising motor sport once more. He will not be entering, in his opinion to be successful in European rallying you must have no family, no prepagate the of meaning to the organical to the organ nerves, lots of money and be in one's early twenties. 


