## DAVID KAYANDA DIES IN TRAFFIC ACCIDENT

WELL KNOWN Coast personality Mr David Kayanda who died this week in a car accident will be laid to rest this weekend at his home near Voi in Taita/Taveta District.

Mr Kayanda who was the personnel manager of the East African Oil Refinery Company, was killed when his car hit a lamp-post near his home in Kizingo as he was returning home at night on Monday.

He was born on August 12, 1930 in Voi, Taita/Taveta District and was educated in Taita and Alliance High School, Kikuyu. Mr Kayanda worked for the Kenya Shell Company for 14 years from 1952 to 1966.

He was elected as a Councillor in Mombasa in 1958 and was the first African to serve as the Mayor of Mombasa between 1962 and 1963.

While working with the Kenya Shell Company Mr Kayanda served in various positions in the company's operations, rising to the post of installation manager in charge of the Mombasa

depot.

He later joined the Government Service in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and served as Kenya's Ambassador to Soviet Union and Eastern European countries from 1966 to 1970.

Mr Kayanda joined the Eastern African Oil Refinery Company as the Personnel Manager on July 1, 1970.

In March 1971 he was sponsored by the British High Commissioner in Kenya for an industrial tour of the United Kingdom.

Following the dissolution of the Municipal Council of Mombasa in 1976, the late Kayanda was appointed by the Minister for Local Government as a member of the Commission which took over the running of the Council's affairs until the General Elections in 1979.

During his life, Mr Kayanda has served in various boards in Mombasa and around the country. He is survived by a widow and ten children.

## LONDON EXPERTS ON TOUR OF KILIFI

KILIFI (K.N.A.) — A team of four experts from the Bocker Consultants of London accompanied by Kenyan officials are on a fact finding tour of Kilifi and Kwale Districts aimed at recommending to the Kenya Government a system of integrated agricultural development programmes for both areas.

According to the team leader Mr John Tell the Bocker Consultants have been commissioned by the International Fund for Agricultural Development to do the exercise on behalf of the Kenya Government.

He said the final recommendations would be put to the World Bank for evaluation and financing.

Accompanied by a former Director of Agriculture in Kenya Sir Roger Swynerton and Mr R. E. Osborne, the team called on the Kilifi D.C. Mr B. A. Omuse who briefed them on the nature of agricultural and livestock performance in the District.

The team will spend two weeks in both Districts and will wind up their work in October when they return to London.

While in Kilifi they toured ranches, research stations, farms and settlement schemes.

# MOMBASA BUS SERVICES FACE 'CASH CRISIS'

THE Kenya Bus Service (Mombasa) Limited is facing a timetable of problems, according to a report outlining the critical financial state of the company's operations in Mombasa.

And now Mombasa commuters are threatened with

the withdrawal of bus services from unremunerative areas of operation and even the complete withdrawal of bus services in all routes after 8.00p.m.

The woes catalogued in the report range from the loss of revenue brought about the delay in approving fare increases, the inflexibility in setting up fare levels, the increase in fuel prices and the cost of spare parts, and the stiff competition from matatu owners threatening to drive the K.B.S. off the road.

In less than two years the Kenya Bus Services is reported to have lost an anticipated revenue in the region of K.Shs. three million due to disputes with the Municipal Council of Mombasa over fare increases and soaring operation costs.

The company is reported to have also incurred a revenue loss of K.Shs. 1,760,000 last year when the Council partly approved the fare increases proposals submitted by the Kenya Bus Service.

And the delay in implementing the proposed fare increases in 1981 up to April 1 is said to have resulted in an additional loss of revenue amounting to K.Shs. 1,300,000.

**FEAR OF PUBLIC OUTCRY**  
In addition the delay in the implementation of ferry tolls as proposed by the company is reported to have created a loss of revenue of K.Shs. 380,000 for the first three months of 1981.

The Municipal Council of Mombasa which owns 49 per cent of the shares is believed to have delayed these increases for fear of a public outcry from commuters who represent the

majority of its electors.

At the same time the increase in the price of fuel has also hit hard at the company's operations costs.

It is now claimed that the company's fuel bill is running into the region of K.Shs. 106,000 per month for buses only — a figure which is expected to rise up following the recent increase in the fuel prices.

And the cost of spare parts has, too, been soaring up. The revaluation of the Kenya Shilling early this year is reported to have increased the cost of vehicles spare parts, tyres and chassis by at least seven per cent.

### INCREASED SUBSIDY

In their report, the company now wants an increased subsidy in respect of pedestrian travel on ferries together with the instruction of a subsidy for

bus operations from the Government and the Council.

The Kenya Bus Service Limited also want to see the cancellation of franchise fees payable to the Council and have gone further and requested the Government to provide revenue support or rebate of duties and taxes for

## FERRY TOLLS HIKE

BY agreement with the Mombasa Municipal Council Ferry Tolls have been increased from Sunday July 19.

A Kenya Bus spokesman told COASTWEEK: "It is regretted that tolls have to be increased but with the recent increases of fuel, .60 cents per litre in February this year and .20 cents per litre in June and a further .40 cents in July coupled with a wage increase in May, operating costs have escalated to such an extent as to leave the Company no option but to implement the toll increase."

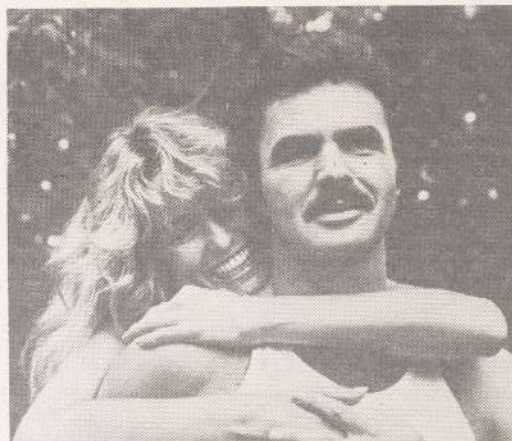

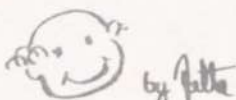

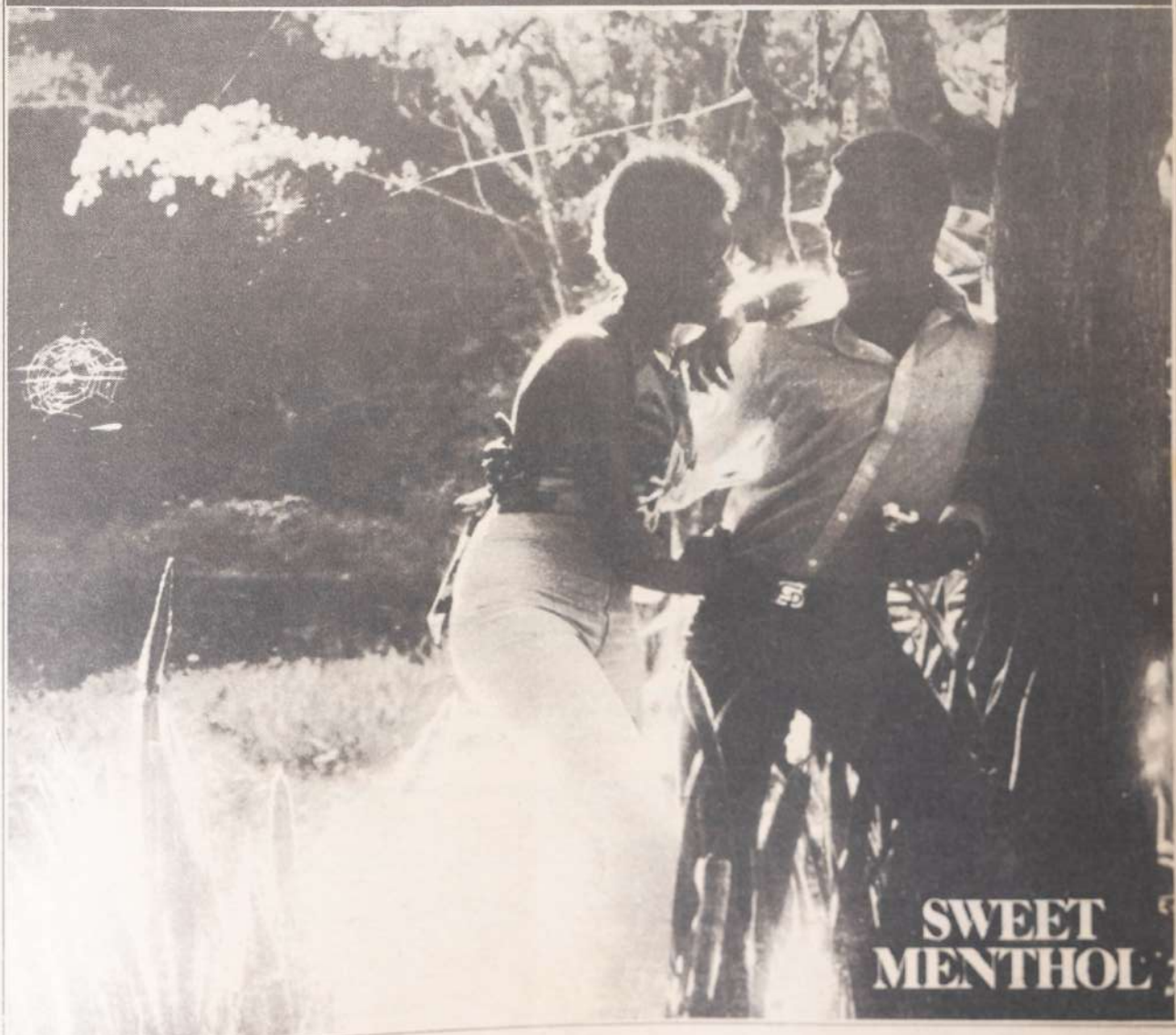

## ANOTHER BIG SUCCESS STORY FOR MOHAMED

ANYBODY who has worked with — or for — Mohamed Amin usually walks away punchy. His energy is fearsome his drive, to some irrational.

Only 35, his list of accomplishments already reads like a list of lifelong honours.

Twelve years is a long time to live in such a relentless shadow but somehow he and me have maintained a love-hatred relationship. He thinks he loves me and I think I hate him.

But indeed in a world of non-achievements he is the Achiever par excellence.

The Hindu, I understand, believe in Karma — that nothing is by chance. On the other hand they advocate, I understand, a policy of passive resistance to whatever fate has in store for them.

It is philosophy to be admired if not relished. Mohamed Amin, of course, is a Muslim — and he has in his own heart a contra-philosophy. Leave nothing to chance: "Make it happen".

Judged on his own record that has to be the philosophy to follow.

For his Karma seems to be destined to guide him inevitable success.

### LAKE TURKANA

Whenever he's around things seem to happen — and if they don't he makes them.

When he decided on his monumental expedition around Lake Turkana he had only a vague notion of what would arise.

But surely as the months went by things began to happen — to the point in March, 1980 when he decided

somebody should start writing a manuscript for Cradle of Mankind and he began, with his collaborator, plotting chapters.

Sometimes around June he reckoned he had a book and began preparations for its printing. The manuscript was edited and re-edited, the book designed and re-designed.

The transparencies went for colour separations and the next for typesetting and the printers were alerted.

Now all he had to do was to find a publisher. Hard to believe, of course, but that is Mohamed Amin. Hundreds — literally hundreds — of sales letters flowed across the world.

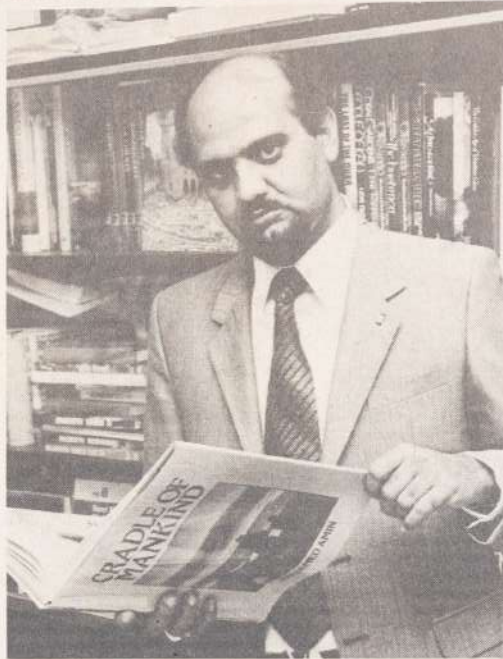
Without success. Doggedly this destiny maker packed his suitcases, carried out some duplicate transparencies, some early separation proof sheets, a dozen copies of the manuscript and for five hungry days and nights expended his tireless energy by lugging his 15 kilos handload along the miles of corridors and the miles of publishers gathered at the Frankfurt International Book Fair.

It concluded with a hard bargaining session with one of the world's most respected publishers, Chatto and Windus of London.

They took world rights for the book, excluding the USA, in the English language.

Then Amin strode off again seeking new worlds to conquer and engaged several German publishers in lengthy dialogues resulting in one company taking the German language rights to what every one in the British book trade at least now agrees is likely to be one of the most remarkable books of the decade.

That's the opinion of the

commentors who write for the UK publishing Press. It's already been chosen for the Best Book Club list — a selection of only 1,000 of the 40,000 odd books published in UK every year.

Back in Nairobi he began round the clock sessions supervising the finished work. In April the printers in Italy pressed the button and the book began to roll — all 15,000 copies of what most believe is only the first of many print runs

### LONDON MURAL

Enough, enough, cried his work ridden colleagues. But now Amin began tirelessly to organise a giant photo-mural exhibition for display in Kenya and London.

And where did his unbidden Karma enter the story?

With the surprise news which surprised him and which he told nobody that HRH Princess Alexandra would open his photographic exhibition.

"There had been some suggestion that another Royal might be interested in opening the exhibition," says Amin, "but I didn't pay much attention to it. That was too big a dream."

"Then I got a call from the British High Commission about the exhibition and when I was in London two weeks ago was invited to the Friary Court home of the Princess to meet her secretary and lady-in-waiting."

The hero gets his hard earned Royal accolade on October 23, this year, at the Commonwealth Institute.

And nobody will begrudge it him!

## New Schools Teach Dumb And Disabled

THE DEAF may have a double disability for those who are invariably dumb if they are born deaf (congenitally deafness). But this does not deprive them of some of their skills even at the expense of educating them.

This was just what the pupils of Buguruni School for the deaf in Dar es Salaam did at a sports day to bid farewell to the 19 pupils and teachers from the Milton Keynes School in outer London who completed a one month's tour of the country as guests of the Tanzania Society for the deaf.

The pupils contested with their hosts in several events and later teamed up to play football match against the organisers of the sports day — the Lions Club of Dar es-Salaam and the Leos.

For the visitors the sports gala gave them reminiscences of the 1979 group which first visited the school in 1979. That group was responsible for erecting the sports grounds and donating most of the sports equipment to the pupils.

The Milton Keynes (one of ten cities carved out of greater London) — Tanzania Society for the deaf axis is probably one of the greatest models of Anglo-Tanzania Co-operation, for not only does it embrace a reciprocal element to the benefit of the society and the deaf children but also exposes both groups to each others problems and experiences.

And the "missionaries of charity" in Tanzania — the International Roman Catholic Charitable Organisation that mans project initiated by India's world renowned social worker — Mother Teresa has received a donation of 64 tons of food and medicines worth one million shillings from her supporters in Canada — the "Co-workers of Mother Teresa".

The consignment of rice, powdered milk and dried beans is to be distributed to famine areas in Tabora and Dodoma, where together with Dar es-Salaam, the missionaries of charities is involved in caring for the destitute.

The secretary-general of the Canadian Organisation, Father Frank West said that the goods will arrive in piece-meal. He has also had talks with the Ministry of Agriculture on how his organisation can give greater assistance to the country.

In keeping with the United Nations-designated International Year for Disabled persons (IYDP), the Norwegian Association for the disabled has donated 83 wheelchairs worth over 500,000 shillings and other equipment for the disabled. The donation was channelled through the Rotary Club of Dar es Salaam.

### Game Gold

Tanzania was piped to second place by Mozambique in the 1981 world hunting exhibitions at Plovdiv, Bulgaria.

Tanzania won gold, silver and bronze medals and two certificates for exhibiting animal trophies, mounts, skin, hides and other game items.

The exposition held once every ten years is organised by the International Council of Hunting and Games conservation and the International Conference of Sports Fishing. It is aimed at showing the interaction between hunting, fishing and man in the modern

society. Canada's Minister, Pierre Elliott Trudeau is to pay a four-day visit to Tanzania accompanied by his three sons. He will talk with the President and other Government officials later visit the game parks.

The first Omani ambassador to Tanzania, Mr. Al-Jamali told "COASTWEEK" that the Sultanate of Oman is bent on progressing its historical links with Tanzania.

Mr. Al-Jamali who presented his credentials to President Nyerere last week said that negotiations are underway for Tanzania to provide Oman with cattle seedlings for experimentation.

He ruled out the possibility of supplying any land in Tanzania as it was committed to International Oil Company and meeting its demands.

The Revenue, Income and Customs and Excise departments in the Finance Ministry are to be disbanded. The Minister for Finance, Mr. Amos told the national assembly the objective of forming departments, for direct and indirect taxes was to improve revenue collection and management of Government expenditure.

### Arusha Mines

The foundation stone of the first ever Mingsha Mines near Arusha is to be laid next month. Production will start in 1983.

The project to be financed by the Government of Tanzania will save the country one million shillings in foreign exchange once in production.

A Tanzanian — Mr. K. K. K. has been appointed Director General of the Tanzania Central Bureau (TCB) a branch of the Tanzania Railways Corporation. Mr. Kaale will have the task of preparing the Bureau which is to be established in January.

In Nigeria, a post office can secure a professional field except law, which is unemployed as the country is "flooded" with attorneys.

But Tanzania still has a shortage of lawyers because the University of Dar es Salaam is not producing enough lawyers. A peculiar incident has occurred into the system of countries-dual system manpower.

The Minister of Justice, Julie Manning said in the Assembly in Dar es Salaam that the three chambers of the legal bodies — the chambers and Tanzania corporation had a return to some employers in some cases pointed out that they do not complain that the interest.

# NEW SHIPS FOR INDIA SHIPPING CORPORATION

SHIPPING NEWS from GRAY PHOMBEAH

THE SHIPPING Corporation of India is introducing a new regular containerised service between Bombay and Madras, and the East African ports of Port Louis, Maputo, Beira, Mombasa and Dar es Salaam. The first fully containerised vessel, *m.v. Bhavbhudia*, is expected to leave the shores of India in the first week of August and arrive in Mombasa in the third week of August.

During its round of calls at the East African ports, the vessel is scheduled to load on its way back containerised cargo for Madras and Bombay.

A spokesman for the Shipping Corporation of India told *COASTWEEK* that the present Break Bulk service will continue but the company will now concentrate more on containerised cargo. Backed up by modern and fast container-oriented vessels, the service will be operating on a monthly basis.

The Shipping Corporation of India was formed in 1962 following the merging of the Eastern Shipping and Western Shipping Lines, both of India. It is a fully government-owned company based on the expertise of the two former companies which have been plying down the East African ports for the last 26 years.

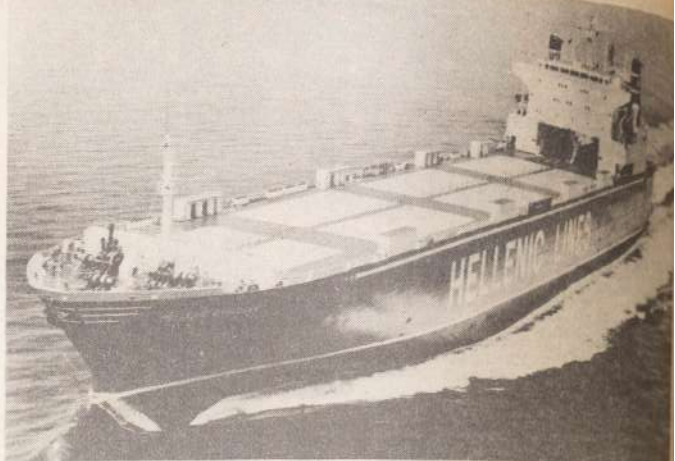
Providing for passenger traffic service in the beginning, the company later started to cater for cargo and finally in 1976 switched over completely to the handling of cargo and goods.

Their vessels have been discharging various types of cargo at the port of Mombasa including engineering goods, chemicals, animal feeds and machinery from India.

### DIVERSIFIED FLEET

The Shipping Corporation of India has been operating a diversified fleet of vessels comprising of cargo liners, multi-purpose container-oriented cargo vessels, bulk carriers, tankers (crude carriers), Very Large Crude Carriers (VLCC) as well as passenger and cargo vessels.

Boasting of vast connections in other foreign ports, the Shipping Corporation of India operates other services to all five continents of the world. The Mombasa office is headed by Mr Asid Taneja as the manager, assisted by Mr A. P. Chhaya as the deputy manager.



M. V. "Hellenic Explorer" is one of the Hellenic cellularised operated of its 42 vessels sailing from US East Coast, Gulf and Canadian ports to

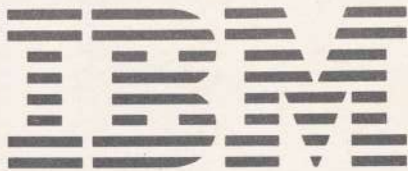

## HELLENIC LINES TO RUN NEW AGENCY

HELLENIC Lines Limited have recently established a broad new agency to provide a full range of bookings and market services for Hellenic Lines as well as other shipping companies.

With effect immediate expert Hellenic-American Agencies Inc., will serve as general agents for North America.

Hellenic-American Agencies also handle all bookings for Hellenic Lines services with offices in New York, Houston and New Orleans.

However, Hellenic Lines, will continue to maintain its current network of agents at other locations throughout the US and Canada.

In order to provide the full range of services for Hellenic Lines as well as for other affiliations in the future, the company, will have available the various functions of traffic, sales operations and documentation.

Hellenic operates 42 ships, including cellularised container vessels "roll-on, roll-off" carriers, semi-containerships and large and small conventional vessels.

They sail from US East Coast, Gulf and Canadian ports to the Mid-East, Eastern Mediterranean, Indian subcontinent and East Africa.

Due to heavy demand, Hellenic Lines recently announced the expansion of its fully cellularised operation connecting the US, the Western Mediterranean, and UK Continent service with India and Pakistan.

## KIGOMA TO GET CRANES

TONY BARROS reports

THE Tanzania Government is to hire two diesel run cranes to operate a generator from Barotsi to improve cargo-handling at Kigoma Port. The generator would be used in the event of power cuts at the Tanganyika Port.

The Minister for Communications and Transport, Ibrahim Kaduma, told the National Assembly that the equipment would improve cargo handling at Kigoma whose port lacked facilities.

He noted that the shortage of equipment contributed to delays in the bus route, wagons along the Dar es Salaam Railway line running from Dar es Salaam to Kigoma and between 20 to 30 days in the Ministry was hoping to increase it to ten days.

On Pillage of the Dar es Salaam port, Adige Kaduma told the house that there had been a problem by having equipment of clearing and unloading companies from outside the port area.

He claimed that the transit sheds were not carried out by equipment of these agencies. Tanzania Harbour authorities would now study the area it didn't have container

# BUS SERVICES AFFECTED BY 'CASH CRISIS'

...company.  
But even more trying for the company has been the stiff competition from matatu owners who seem to have found an upper hand in the market.  
According to latest K.B.S. statistics about 1,000 matatus are on the road in and around Mombasa against 90 or so buses operating in the area.  
It is estimated that the matatus are robbing the Kenya Bus Service over one million shillings every month and more in thousands of shillings annually.

K.B.S. statistics show a decline of 216 per cent in passengers in April 1981 and 11 per cent in May against the same months in 1980.

The percentage loss rose to 27 per cent in June this year against the same period last year.

The Director and General Manager of the Kenya Bus Services (Mombasa) Limited Mr. J. Steadman told COASTWEEK.

"The introduction of mini-buses as matatu has now compounded the situation we are facing. Overloading upto 40 passengers, they cause far more damage than the ordinary matatu.

If the matatus were operating in a fair competition, the situation would have been different. Unfortunately this is not the case.

"At one time there were about 1,200 matatus on the road in Mombasa".

## REPLACEMENTS

He went on to ask: "The question is: does the country need matatu or the Kenya Bus Service to continue? We have to come up with the answer."

At the moment the Kenya Bus Service Limited has 20 buses lying at the Kenya Commercial Bank Limited at Thika ready to be scrapped but the loss-making company does not have the money to pay for them. Five have been scrapped since the beginning of this year but replacements will be made.

"We have not reduced our fares to any great degree — we are gradually coming to that," he warned.

"We have made attempts to improve the situation, we have got a stringent economy in our department. However, these measures we are taking are a critical financial situation."

"The off-peak season tickets introduced recently have made no impact on the company's revenues."

## OFF-PEAK HOURS

During the morning peak hours the matatus and K.B.S. buses are unable to cope with the passenger demand during off-peak hours and matatus appear too slow on the road running at a snail's pace.

"I have said it before and I say it again — that we are prepared to live and work with matatus. But only in the short run."

"There must be made to change the same rules and regulations which our buses are used to. Otherwise the matatus are in jeopardy."

"The company emphasised that the company is seriously considering pulling back its services to non-urban areas of Mombasa and go ahead with the complete withdrawal of buses after 8:00pm.

According to the latest feasibility study on the expansion of terminal facilities for Likoni and Mtongwe Ferry carried this year, between 18 and 20 million shillings are required for improvement of the landing facilities on both ends.

The replacement or addition of one large ferry is estimated to cost K.Shs. 12 million.

The recent increases on ferry tolls on commercial and private are only aimed at subsidizing the carriage of pedestrians and cyclists who do not pay tolls.

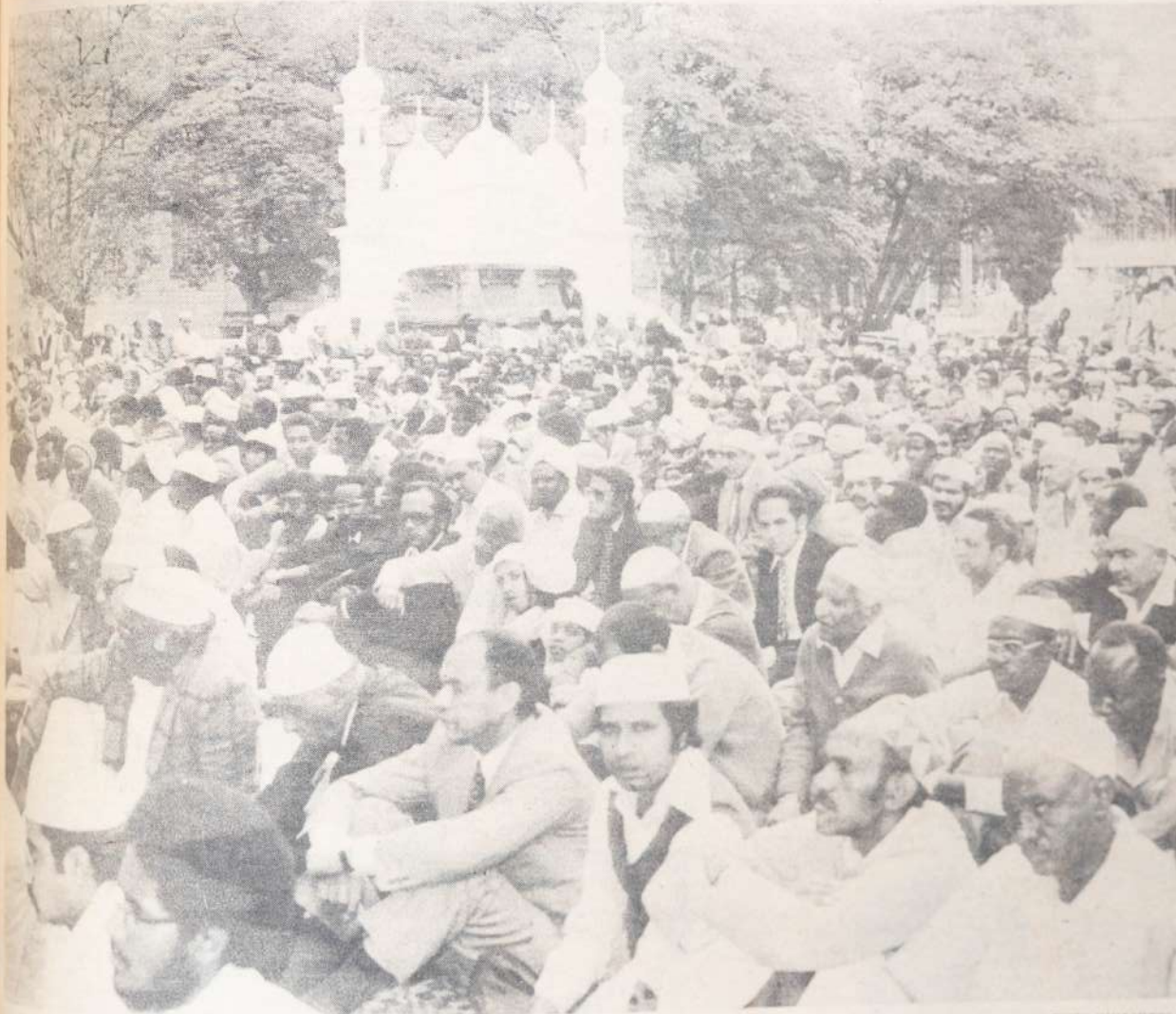

it include the resolution to help the needy — always? Have you thought of showing more respect to your elders? Loving more tenderly those who are younger?

Is there anything for your neighbours and friends in your resolutions?

Have you forgiven others for real and imagined wrongs they did to you? Have you decided to become more honest, sincere and truthful? Above everything else, is there room for God and His Prophet in your thoughts and actions?

If you can answer yes to all these questions, then you can rightly take pride to have achieved the real purpose of fasting. If not, you have to redouble your efforts for your fast to be accepted by the Almighty.

The Holy Prophet once saw a woman — who was fasting on that day — abusing her servant. The Prophet asked her to break her fast.

The woman protested: "But, I am fasting today." The Holy

Prophet said: "But was not your fast broken by the abuses you were heaping upon that poor girl?"

Imam Ja'fer Sadiq has said:

"Your fast-days should not be like ordinary days. When you fast, all your senses — eyes, ears, tongue, hands and feet — must fast with you."

How? You should keep your eyes off from unlawful sights and objects; spend this most precious gift of God in good cause, pious acts and read Qur'an.

Ears should abstain from hearing unlawful gossip, lies, false statements and obscene words.

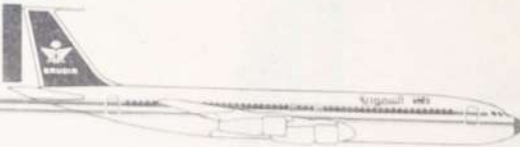

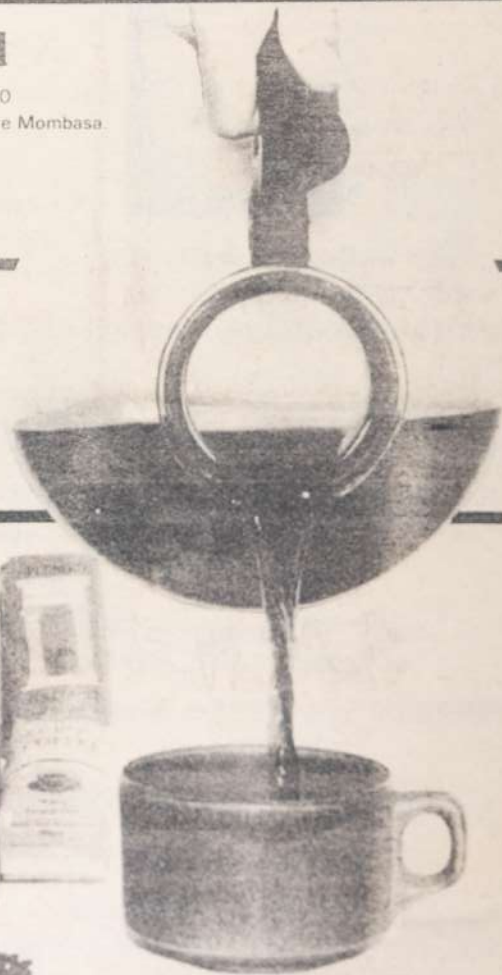

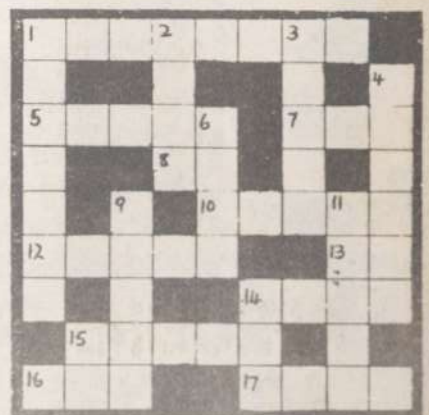

# ERROL ON FOOD

**COOKING** with brandy isn't half as extravagant as is made out, though you will pay more for any dish that is flambéed in a restaurant for the showmanship alone. The flash in the pan as it is ignited at the dinner table adds instant glamour to any dish and to any party.

In fact Albert, the French Maître d'hotel under whose expert eye the now defunct New Stanley Grill Room flourished for many years used to dread the first patron of the evening asking for Crepes Suzettes for example — because the mere sight of it brought about a positive rash of orders for flambéed dishes at once.

And if the management were also trying to get a cabaret act onto the floor punctually, this naturally delayed service considerably.

One of the basic secrets is not to flood the dish itself in booze which is a common temptation and a mistake. The brandy should be used with discretion to bring out the flavour not swamp it.

And while the addition of brandy might lift an ordinary dish into the Cordon Bleu class, the drenching of dreary food with alcohol will never disguise it.

Brandy may be added at

different stages of cooking but when it is 'flamed' the ignition imparts a distinctive flavour, it burns away the alcohol while taking up the excess fat in the pan with the attractive bonus of a pretty, blue flame.

This term should not be confused with 'à la Flamande' which is a garnish for braised meat and cabbage with belly pork.

Forget about the anti-climax of the christmas pudding that would not light and follow a few simple rules; start with the golden and essential one. Always heat the brandy first, then add it to the piping hot food and ignite immediately — but stand clear the flames shoot high and fast. There is no point in losing your eye-lashes in the process.

Avoid too much natural moisture in the pan, this drowns the alcohol and it will not light either.

Shell fish and brandy are very compatible and when kidneys are flambéed they become a great dish, many fruits too benefit enormously with the help of flambéed, brandy, fresh figs and mangoes in particular.

### FLAMBEED CALVES KIDNEYS

- 1 large calves kidneys
- 1 1/2 ounces butter
- 4 tablespoons cognac
- 1 tablespoon french mustard
- 1 teaspoon plain flour
- 14 pint light stock
- 3 tablespoons double cream

Remove the skin and hard fat from the kidneys. Dice. Heat the butter and when very hot add the kidney. Saute over a moderate heat for 4-5 minutes. Heat the cognac, pour over the kidneys and flame.

As soon as the flames have subsided, remove the kidney pieces with a slotted spoon and keep warm. Stir the mustard and flour into the hot butter, add stock, sprinkle with freshly ground pepper and salt simmer for a few minutes, uncovered to reduce.

Add the cream, and the kidneys and heat through. Check seasoning. Serve without delay.

### FIGUE FLAMBEES

This is a slight extravagant dish and Grande marinier can be used as an alternative to brandy.

Allow 1-2 fresh figs per portion.

They must be ripe. Peel them and then prick them all over with a silver fork. Place in a chafing dish. Allow a liqueur glass of brandy of Grand manner per portion or mix the two liqueurs if you like.

Place the figs in a chafing dish pour the liqueur in and as it gets hot set alight, shaking the pan as it burns so that the figs get cooked all round in the process. Serve from the chafing dish at the table.

Bananas take on a very superior flavour flambéed in rum or brandy. For a luncheon or dinner party of eight you will need a dozen bananas which must be prepared by removing their skins and slitting them lengthwise.

Heat 5 ounces of butter in a frying pan or chafing dish which is suitable to bring to the table. Allow the bananas to simmer for two minutes in the

butter then sprinkle with 2 ounces of sugar. When the sugar has melted add 6 table-spoons of warmed brandy or rum.

Touch with a lighted match and serve immediately. Tinned peaches or apricots may be drained of their syrup and treated in the same way. Heat them, sprinkle them with chopped cashewnuts, popping them under the grill so that they become a little toasted. Then pour over warmed brandy and ignite at once.

Next time you manage to get a fresh lobster try this delicious alternative as a change from boring old lobster Thermidor. Slice the uncooked lobster in medallions, simmer for a few minutes in melted butter, remember that the longer you cook lobster the tougher it becomes.

Heat a small glass of brandy, pour it over and ignite. When the flames die down, beat together two egg yolks and 1/2 a gill of fresh cream. Season to taste with freshly ground black pepper, salt and paprika. Pour this mixture over the lobster and stir until it thickens.

Do not allow it to boil. Serve immediately.

# CLUB CHE-SHALE A PLACE IN THE SUN

Johnny and Vanessa Aniere of Club Che-Shale have just returned from a business trip to Zanzibar, and will be re-opening their exclusive sports fishing lodge on August 1, at the Nyaleti Hotel.

The disturbing omens of inflation in Europe, and the long-haul vacations, have returned quite 'domestic'. He finds there are many people around who are having to tighten their belts as far as holidays are concerned.

He was also excited over the fact Che-Shale will be situated in a prestigious area such as Vogue, Queens and Queens early next year.

Johnny and Vanessa developed this unique lodge situated in a magnificent bay 14 miles north of Mombasa.

Makuti-roofed tents have given way to eight well appointed bandas with makuti and makeka (matting) on the exterior walls, giving that 'outdoor' touch while bright yellow khangas have been converted into curtains. Each banda has its verandah, a bedroom, shower room and is situated under shady acacia trees with the sea just a few yards away.

The comforts offered are modern and a generator provides electricity throughout, although all cooking is done on charcoal.

The ingeniously constructed bar is a well-stocked bar, with well cushioned banquettes overlooking the sea. Vanessa, who is in charge of the culinary department, finds that her Bar is in great demand. She offered makes a special change from usual items of potato chips or nuts!

Che-Shale these include fried seaweed (which is revolting but tastes good) and Shushi, Japanese style with a soya and wasabi dip.

Shrimps are first fried and salted and put out into the sun to crackle and pop.

The restaurant is adjacent to the bar where Vanessa specializes in such culinary delights as bouillabaisse, crab and spiced crab cooked in coconut milk, as well as traditional dishes. They make their own pasta for popular pasta.

After hunting was stopped he decided to explore the area further. Siad Johnny Vanessa and I had cut our way through bush to get there, and it was most difficult to find water.

This was eventually discovered, but in limited quantities. Hence this is one of the reasons why Che-Shale will never grow.

They started developing the site in 1978 initially to accommodate 20 guests in makuti-roofed tents. With the new bandas there is only room for 16.

## SAND-DUNES

Che-Shale is an exclusive retreat sheltered by sand-dunes through which only land-rovers, or camels, can pass. Because it is difficult to reach by car, guests are collected at the Sindbad Hotel, Malindi, and conveyed in four-wheel drive vehicles to this remote beach.

The pioneering spirit also runs in Vanessa's family for her grandmother was Eva Noon who came to Kenya in 1912 and during her life-span here pioneered the hotel industry at the Coast. She and her husband Harry, built Nyali Beach Hotel which opened in 1946. Today, it has 406-beds and is one of the largest on the Coast.

Vanessa, who is the daughter of Alec Noon was born in Nairobi, and on completing her education in Kenya and U.K. worked for her grandmother at Nyali Beach Hotel for a while.

She married Johnny in 1965, and they have three children — two girls and a boy.

From August 1 until December 15 a 25 per cent discount is being offered on their usual tariff rate of Shs. 550 per person a day. This also includes windsurfing, sailing in their fast Hobie Cat catamaran, or Sun Fish dinghy, beach casting, snorkelling, laundry and room service, also transfers to and from Che-Shale form Malindi's Sindbad Hotel.

Bookings for Che-Shale can be made through Block Hotels Central Reservations offices at Nairobi and Mombasa (the latter being situated in Ambalal House) or through a travel agent.

The lodge is in direct radio contact with Block Hotels Reservations offices in the morning and afternoon, thus enabling intending guests to

obtain any further information they may require — sea conditions, confirmation of boat bookings, and transfer arrangements form the Sindbad

Taking the entire lodge over for the weekend August 15/16 are committee members of the Skal Club of Mombasa who are top executives in the Coast's tourist industry.

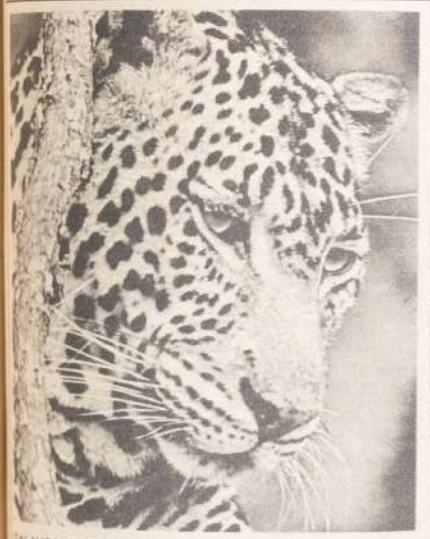

Moku, hob hervor, daß die Gruppe in enger Verbindung steht mit dem Roten Kreuz in Koblenz, das in der Vergangenheit einen Austauschbesuch nach Mombasa geschickt hat.

Die Gäste werden einige Zeit in Koblenz

Von Koblenz machen sie einen Abstecher nach Genf, um das Hauptquartier des internationalen Roten Kreuzes und der Vereinigung der Gesellschaften des Roten Kreuzes kennenzulernen. Bei dieser Gelegenheit können sie sich selbst von der Arbeit und Koordination der Organisation überzeugen, die in einem wirkungsvollen, weltweiten Netz den Armen, Kranken und Hilfsbedürftigen in Kriegszeiten und in Katastrophenfällen besteht.

# ENDE DES FASTENMONATS RAMADAN

DER heilige Fastenmonat der Mohammedaner hat am 4. Juli begonnen. Sobald die schmale Neumondsichel am Himmel sichtbar wurde, feuerte die Kenya Navy nach alter Tradition einen Schuß aus der Kanone beim Fort Jesus und gab damit das Zeichen zum Fastenbeginn.

Auf eine Bevölkerung von etwa 12 Millionen Einwohnern kommen in Kenia über 4 Millionen Mohammedaner. An der Küste ist der islamische Glaube besonders verbreitet, und in der Altstadt mit ihrem typisch arabischen Charakter findet man auch die meisten der rund 50 Moscheen Mombasas.

Berühmt ist die Baluchi-Moschee, gleich hinter dem Hauptpostamt; allerdings wurde der 1875 von den Baluchi-Vorfahren gestiftete Bau im Jahre 1964 ersetzt durch das sandfarbene Gebäude mit weißem Spitzenbesatz. Neben der Post, direkt an der Digostraße ist die Khonzi-Moschee, eher unscheinbar, aber immer gut besucht. Gegenüber sieht man am Ende der Gusi-Strasse die weiße Kuppel der klassischen Scheich-Jundani-Moschee in der Sonne blitzen.

Der Fastenmonat Ramadan ist eine harte Prüfung für die Muselmanen und bedeutet eine Umstellung ihres gewohnten Lebensstils. Fastenzeiten und Betzeiten müssen strikte eingehalten werden, und nach zwei bis drei Wochen fällt es vor allem den Berufstätigen schwer, sich bei dem ständig wachsenden Schlafmanko auf die Arbeit zu konzentrieren, die ja normal weitergehen sollte.

Nach Sonnenuntergang beginnt ein emsiges Treiben in den Straßen der Stadt. Jetzt wird das Fasten unterbrochen durch einen lang ersehnten schwarzen Kaffee, heißen Tee, Kokosmilch oder auch nur kaltes Wasser, wenn gerade nichts Besseres zur Hand ist. In Mombasa ist die Szene besonders ausgeprägt auf dem Weg zur alten Nyali-Brücke, in der großen Kurve von der Digostraße zur Abdel-Nasser-Straße. Gegen Abend strömen die Menschen in Scharen zu den Bergen von grünem, auf dem Gehsteig aufgestapelten Kokosnüssen und zu den Straßencafes. Das gesellige Leben beginnt, der knurrende Magen kann endlich wieder gefüllt werden!

### SUAHELI-GERICHTE

Während die Männer sich in den Moscheen zum gemeinsamen Gebet versammeln, einheitlich im weißen Kaftan und mit der runden, reich bestickten Kopfbedeckung, fallen die Frauen dort durch Abwesenheit auf.

Sie sind mit der Zubereitung der Hauptmahlzeit "Futari" beschäftigt, die aus zwei bis vier verschiedenen Gängen besteht. Viele der pikant gewürzten Suaheli-Gerichte, wie Biriani und Pilau, werden in Kokosmilch gekocht. Nach Mitternacht wird eine kleinere Mahlzeit genannt "Daku" eingenommen, meistens Curry mit Reis, Sauermilch und eine Süßspeise.

Zwischen "Futari" und "Daku" beten die Frauen zu Hause und lesen im Koran, oder sie wandern in ihren schwarzen Umhängen, den "Bubuis", durch die Straßen, besuchen Freundinnen und tauschen mit ihnen Essen oder

kleine Geschenke aus. Dieser Brauch heißt "Bembe".

Nach dem "Daku" steht einem wohlverdienten Schlaf nichts mehr im Weg bis um 5 Uhr früh, wenn es Zeit ist für die Morgengebete und ein neuer Fastentag beginnt.

In der Biasharastraße, wo sich ein Stoffladen an den anderen reiht, ist tagsüber Hochbetrieb. Die Kinder sollen neu eingekleidet werden für das Fest das "Idd-ul-Fitr" am Ende der Fastenzeit, das dieses Jahr am 3. August als gesetzlicher Feiertag stattfindet. Stolz werden nun sämtliche Familienmitglieder in der neuen Ausstattung spazierengeführt. Man verschickt Idd-Karten mit Glückwünschen an Verwandte und Freunde wie in Europa zum Jahreswechsel.

Während des Fastenmonats gibt man großzügig Almosen an die Armen. Nach dem Koran sollte man auch freiwillig "Zakat" bezahlen, eine Steuer von 2 1/2 Prozent auf die jährlich angesammelten Ersparnisse, die für Krankenhäuser, Schulen und andere soziale Zwecke verwendet wird.

Manche Familien schlachten ein Schaf oder eine Ziege und laden weniger bemittelte Verwandte, Bekannte, und auch ihre Dienstboten ein, damit sie an den Feierlichkeiten und Freuden des Idd-ul-Fitr teilhaben können.

Durch die gemeinsam erduldeten Strapazen während des Ramadan fühlt man sich besonders verbunden mit seinen Mitgläubigen. Es ist eine Zeit des Friedens, des Verstehens, der Großzügigkeit und der Selbstdisziplin.

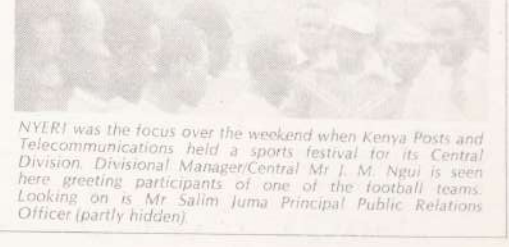

## FINDING OUT WHO IS THE CLUB'S BEST

NYALI Golf and Country Club was the scene of the Monthly Medal last weekend and this was also used as the qualifying round for the Club Championship (Greenwood Cup), Strugglers Cup (B Division matchplay) and Bunny Mug (C Division matchplay).

Nowadays of course, all the big time golf in professional circles is judged by 72 holes medal, so that the best performance in the long run wins, but in most amateur golf clubs, the matchplay event still exists, sometimes augmented by a 36 hole medal event.

I remember an instance several years ago at Royal Nairobi Golf Club, where a 12 handicapper won the club championship, against all odds and a lot of low handicappers, and it is this spice of the uncertainty that retains matchplay in amateur circles.

To revert to the monthly medal, apart from the three divisional winners, most of the rest of the scores were rather poor, generally due to high winds and the extraordinarily

tough rough. The big rough was almost impossible to get out of at times, it was so thick, and the wise thing to do in a lot of cases was to declare the ball unplayable - a thing which most golfers are very loathe to do.
