## 'MILLIONS OF SHILLINGS PAID OUT IN FIRE INSURANCE TO MOMBASA VICTIMS'

The recent spate of fire outbreaks in Mombasa is "no cause for panic", according to Municipal fire chiefs.

According to latest figures obtained from the Municipal Fire Brigade, at least 10 lives have been lost through fire and K.Shs. 2,777,697/15 worth of property has gone up in smoke since January this year.

It further shows that there have been 137 reported cases of fire since the beginning of this year, an average of 23

fire cases every month in Mombasa alone.

A spokesman at one of the leading insurance companies in town declined to give figures but admitted that pay-outs made to fire victims run into millions of shillings.

Mombasa Chief Fire Officer (Municipal Council) Mr Mohamed Sururu commented mid-week:

"We strongly believe we can contain the situation should

there be a major fire outbreak in Mombasa".

As he talked in his office, only one out of four while others had been grounded outside due to mechanical defects.

Mr Sururu - or 'Mr Fire' as he is popularly known - leads a small army of 138 firemen with 9 old-fashioned fire trucks and equipment, some dating back to 1955. The tallest ladder is only 100 feet.

He singled out the Oil Refinery, the 'Ambalal House' and 'Uburu Ni Kaz' buildings as some of the potential hazard areas in Mombasa which could spark off a major blaze in the town.

He went on: "We have always recommended that there should be fixed fire-fighting installations in these complexes. This particularly applies to buildings like the Ambalal and the Provincial Headquarters".

## EMERGENCY FOOD AID PLEDGED TO UGANDA

EDOUARD SAOUMA, the director-general of the Food and Agriculture Organisation of the United Nations (F.A.O.), has approved a grant of \$4,150,000 in emergency food aid from the World Food Programme (W.F.P.) to Uganda for the victims of recent hostilities.

A W.F.P. spokesman told COASTWEEK the aid was for 265,000 people for a period of 90 days.

The W.F.P. assistance consists of maize meal, edible oil and milk powder. The beneficiaries will include nearly 80,000 children.

# ERROL ON FOOD

## SEA URCHINS AND SORBET

**SEA-URCHINS:**  
OR OURSIN as the French know them. For some reason the Sea Urchins on our reefs have not been exploited as delicacies for the tourist. Several species are edible of the spiny covered Echinus but one needs to be guided by someone in the know. The Green and black sea urchins are edible.

Not surprisingly, there are few recipes for dealing with them but in France they are eaten lightly boiled, like an egg. They are cooked in salted boiling water, drained and opened by cutting with scissors on the concave side where the mouth is situated. It is drained completely, the excremental part disposed of, then morsels or 'sippets' of bread are dipped into the shell and eaten.

I have only eaten them raw and straight from the reef. They are opened washed in sea water, and the yellow substance clinging to the shell is eaten. They say that sea-urchin has great restorative powers but as each amount in every creature is so minute one would have to consume a great many before feeling the benefit.

Gathering them at low tide makes an interesting and exotic occupation for a sea-shore picnic. A very tasty sauce can be made by collecting the sea-urchin's flesh, rubbing it through a fine sieve and mixing it with mayonnaise but one would need at least three dozen sea-urchins. I have not tried it and find myself wondering how the ecology of the reef would suffer if the creature was simpler to locate.

**SORBET:**  
Now that Pistacchio has opened in Mombasa it is unnecessary to make one's own ice cream at home, for their produce is so excellent and the flavours are widely varied and really natural. They range from

coffee and lemon or chocolate to Mango, hazelnut and guava ice cream.

But Sorbets are still worthwhile a little effort at home and are such a pleasure to encounter in the heat of Mombasa at the end of a rich meal. They are refreshing, economical and keep well in the freezer.

Water ices and Sorbets originated in the East. It was the Chinese who taught the Indians the art of ice-cream making who passed it on to the Persians and Arabs. Orange ice was given to Richard Coeur de Lion by Saladin during one of his endless crusades and he brought the recipe back to England.

A Sicilian introduced it to France in 1660 where originally the sorbet was served in between courses to clean the palate as indeed was the practise in England during the Victorian era. Alan Bobbe's Bistro in Nairobi is the only restaurant which chooses to serve lemon sorbet, so far as I know; this is packed into a lemon shell and very good it is too.

The syrup which forms the base of all sorbets is very easy to master. The next step is the art of folding in the egg white when the sorbet is half frozen — the flavour becomes a matter of personal choice for it is chiefly a fruit puree.

**LEMON SORBET:**  
1 pint of water  
Juice of half a lemon  
8 ounces sugar  
Juice of four lemons  
2 egg whites  
juice of one orange

Make a syrup with the sugar, water and juice of one lemon. I usually include a sliver of lemon peel at this stage as well. Lump sugar is recommended on account of its clarity but it is a refinement which is strictly optional. Bring the syrup to the boil. Simmer for 5 minutes. Cool.

To this syrup add the juice of the lemons and orange and strain into ice trays or a metal container. Plastic will not do at all. Chill. When almost set, whip the egg whites until really stiff, fold these with a fork into the sorbet. It must be done swiftly so that the egg white holds its shape in the frozen syrup. Rechill.

Serve when firm in chilled, stemmed glasses. For a dinner party scoop out a melon and serve it filled with sorbet or use the lemon shells if the idea appeals. One does not need a large helping of sorbet.

Sorbet may be made from any fresh fruit puree — in general you will need 1/2 pint of puree to one pint of basic syrup but you must let this cool before adding the fruit puree — mixing this in a chilled bowl will help speed up the freezing process if one is rushed for time.

I try to make my sorbet always the day before required. Raspberries, strawberries, pineapple, limes, oranges, grapefruit, peaches (tinned) are all suitable fruits for sorbet.

**SOUBISE:**  
A delicious puree of onions sometimes incorporating rice served as an accompaniment to lamb or other cuts of meat.

**SOUFFLE:**  
These are savoury or sweet concoctions which should be as light as air and are made from a puree thickened with the yolks and whites of eggs. It is a pity that many people are nervous of making an attempt to master them. Truly they are not difficult and they are so delicious.

It is only fair to say they will not wait for diners to come to the table. Make them for the maximum of four people who will wait for you to bring the souffle in and eat it without delay. Here are two recipes for classic souffle flavours cheese and chocolate.

**CHEESE SOUFFLE:**  
5 eggs  
generous 1/2 pint milk  
2 tablespoons plain flour  
4 ounces grated cheese

salt and pepper  
2 ounces butter  
A little mustard  
Firstly prepare the soufflé dish. Coat this in butter, it with flour which will make the ingredients cling the straight sides of the and will push it upwards. the butter, stir in the flour add the milk and season as one would make a béchamel sauce.

**CHOCOLATE SOUFFLE:**  
8 squares of bitter chocolate  
4 squares of milk chocolate  
1/4 pint of Bechamel sauce  
4 egg yolks  
5 egg whites  
2 teaspoons castor sugar

Prepare the souffle dish the foregoing recipe preheat the oven. Add chocolate and sugar to bechamel, when a little stir in the egg yolks.

When ready to put in oven, beat the egg whites in tip into the soufflé and place in the hot oven. Bake for approximately 15 minutes. Serve while still little soft in the centre. thin cream should be served separately. Serves 4.



## WASINI ISLAND DINING

A group of nine Italian tourists from Milan, were the first to tour the

Wasini Island Restaurant which is run by Kisite Tours.

The restaurant which is owned by a native of the island Abdalla Masoud, was the centre of a controversy in July this year, when the Coast P.C. Mr Elud Mahihu had to intervene.

Mr Mahihu had advised the islanders that the restaurant would help to give employment to the island and bring income to them.

The islanders followed Mr Mahihu's advice and now the restaurant is fully operational and giving employment to three cooks, two waiters and one gardener — all natives of Wasini.

The main purpose of Kisite Tours, who have an office in Shimoni, is to exploit the potential of the Kisite Marine National Park.

Tours are arranged from Shimoni to Kisite Marine Park by their motorised dhows Ashraf and Tai Siri, where tourists and visitors are taken for gogging.

Gogging equipment, masks, snorkels and flippers are available for hire at 20/= at the Shimoni office, while on the dhows there are life belts for use by non-swimmers.

After the gogging at the park, visitors are taken to the Wasini restaurant, where traditional Swahili cuisine is offered.

The restaurant has a fully stocked bar and small 'bites' are available (at the bar) which include i.e. fried coconut strips and fried fish.

The lunch is a marathon five course affair. First course has fresh oysters on the half shell with fresh lime. Second course is crab Shinoise (crab cooked with ginger).

Now comes the real dish — Samaki wa Kupaka (fish cooked with coconut and tamarind) and Wali wa Nazi (coconut

flavoured rice, chapatis and curry).

A fourth course is fresh fruit, followed by Tangawizi (coffee served out of Arab coffee pots) and halwa.

After lunch, guests are at leisure to visit the island village with its friendly people — of course with a guide — before they take a book back to Shimoni.

Thorn Tree Safaris, whose office is in Ambalal House Mombasa, are the booking agents for the Kisite Tours.

Prepare the souflee dish as in the foregoing recipe and add the chocolate and sugar to the chamel, when a little cool in the egg yolks.

When ready to put in the oven, beat the egg whites, fold in the chocolate mixture and tip into the souflee dish. Place in the hot oven for approximately 35 minutes. Serve while still a little soft in the centre. Fresh cream should be handed separately. Serves 4.

## WE ARE ALL DYING

YOU may not want to think about death at all. But these days it seems that you can't go through a day without the thought of death creeping into your mind.

Yesterday, your friend fell suddenly ill. Now she is in an intensive care unit and chances of her recovering are nil. What could have caused her illness? The doctors say tension has been building up in her system and this has resulted into high blood pressure.

As far as you are concerned your friend has been one of those people who take life easy. You have never known her to be tense. She has always been relaxed even in situations where she ought to have been anxious. So now if she is dying of hypertension, what is going to happen to people like you who are always tense?

Often, you hear or read of people who are killed in matatus. Most of your friends and relatives depend on matatus to get from one place to the other. Also, you often take matatus when there is no other means of transport. Nowadays you cannot help feeling that perhaps a relative, friend or even yourself might be a victim of roads' deaths.

Also, it means death or serious illness anytime now if you take most medical reports and warnings seriously. For some time, you used to dismiss cancer as a plague of the industrialized countries. But numerous medical reports show that the disease is here. And who knows, you could be a cancer-risk.

### DISEASES

Since risks of certain diseases increase with age, so state medical reports, you cannot help worrying about

your health as days pass. Some medical warnings can indeed scare the life out of you while ironically they are supposed to help you. Women are advised to do self-examination once or twice a month to detect any lumps in the breast. This is because it breast cancer is detected early, a woman has a chance of surviving. At the same time an X-ray technique is recommended because it reveals breast cancer long before it can be detected by self-examination

TELLING IT LIKE IT IS by REGI MTHARA

As some people note, these days, it seems that the air you breathe, most of what you eat and whatever you drink can cause diseases. Just imagine that the cup of coffee you cannot do without, according to some scientists, can speed up the production of cancer causing agents in the stomach if you take it with certain foods like bacon and cheese.

Even tea drinkers are not to feel comfortable. It is said that tea has dangerous tannic acid that can harm the stomach.

### CANCER AGENTS

If you can't do without your alcohol you are in even more serious trouble than tea or coffee drinkers. Everytime you take an alcoholic drink, you increase chances of getting some kind of cancer.

Recent research in the U.S. showed some alcoholic beverages to have cancer causing agents.

In fact everything can make you ill. Even employment. Dissatisfied employees are frequently ill more often and for longer periods than satisfied. Heart, circulation, stomach and intestine illnesses are listed as most frequent ailments in working situations.

All this makes you feel death is much more around than some people think.

# TANZANIANS SOON HOPE TO EXPLOIT GAS

THE TANZANIA Government is looking into the possibility of constructing a plant at the Songo Songo in Kilwa District to exploit the newly discovered gas for the manufacture of Ammonia and Urea, the vice President Mr About Jumbe has said.

Mr Jumbe who was speaking at the island 32 kms. from Kilwa in Southern Tanzania said that the building of the plant will depend on the final results of the feasibility studies of the natural gas.

The studies undertaken by the Indian consulting firm - Oil and Natural Gas Commission since 1976 have been completed and is now being studied by the Tanzania Petroleum Development Corporation (T.P.D.C.) together with the World Bank and the Tanzania Investment Bank (T.I.B.) - partial financiers of the study.

If the project succeeds, the manufacture of Urea from the Songo Songo gas will provide a rich nitrogenous fertiliser for the country's agriculture. The Songo Songo gas pool has about 30 billion cubic litres of natural gas.

Part of the equipment for a table salt laboratory to be established in Dar es Salaam with the aid of the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation (U.N.I.D.O.) has arrived. The equipment is worth 800,000/=.

U.N.I.D.O. is assisting Tanzania in developing her salt industry and under the programme, Tanzania should be able to produce 170,000 tonnes of salt annually by 1981.

The Vienna-based U.N. agency has committed 24 million shillings to the

establishment of four salt works along the coast and provided survey equipment worth 160,000/= U.N.I.D.O. is also assisting in salt production at the Nyanza Salt Mines which was trial production.

The government has opened a special unit at the Central Veterinary Laboratory in Dar es Salaam to manufacture vaccines for the treatment of animal diseases. The project worth 700,000/= will be run by local experts and will be the first of its type.

When in operation early next year, it will produce anti-anthrax, anti-black water and anti-brucella vaccines.

The Kibo Paper Factory has complained that it is not receiving sufficient waste paper for processing into other paper products. The waste is used to make corrugated paper sheets for making boxes and other paper products.

Implementation of a three-year water supply master plan covering Iringa, Mbeya and Ruvuma regions at a total cost of 115 million shillings has started.

The three-year project is being undertaken by Danish International Development Agency (Danida) is aimed at expanding the supply of fresh water in the three southern Tanzania regions.

The Serengeti Research Institute (S.R.I.) famous for some major scientific techniques based on tropical ecological research at the Serengeti is to become an autonomous institution.

The Institute set up 13 years ago and run by the Tanzania National Parks through international donations will have its own board of governors, the chairman and director-general will be appointed by the President.

### PAPER MILL

The National Development Corporation (N.D.C.) has awarded a British company - Mowlem the contract to prepare the site for the construction of the 2.1 billion shilling Mufindi Pulp and Paper Mill due to start next year. The contract is worth 26 million shillings.

The project is scheduled to go into commercial production in October 1982 when paper machine 1 will be installed. Paper machine 2 is expected to be installed in March 1983 making possible the production of 60,000 tonnes of paper a year.

# Every day 5,000 letters in Kenya go 'blind'.

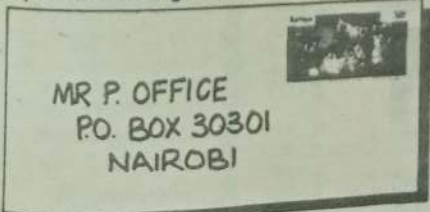
Over 1 million letters are mailed every day in Kenya. Each one is hand sorted for delivery. But every day we see roughly 5,000 letters which bear incorrect or illegible addresses. Some of these are just stamped blank envelopes with no name or address whatsoever.

All these 'blind' letters have to be individually sorted in a special department. In this section we work a few minor miracles every day. A patient team tries to decipher the smudged or scrawled address. Failing that we open the envelope to find the address of the letter writer. If it's there we return it to the sender.

## Address letters correctly, clearly, carefully.

When you write a letter be sure to include your home address on the letter itself. This will help us trace you, should the letter go 'blind'.

On the envelope take care to write the name of the person to whom you are writing and the correct box number.



Print the name of the town in BLOCK CAPITALS and underline it. Use a pen; pencil may smudge. If your handwriting is not good we suggest you print the entire address in BLOCK CAPITALS.

The most common cause of confusion and delay is carelessly written P O Box numbers. Sevens and nines can look like ones. Threes can look like eights and so on. Please take particular care over the box number.

Put the stamp in the top right hand corner and seal the envelope. An unsealed envelope does not qualify for a cheaper postal rate. This cheap rate applies only to cards. The minimum charge for an internal letter is 50 cents whether the envelope is sealed or not.

Follow these guidelines and address letters correctly. For us it will be a sight for sore eyes. And you will avoid the disappointment of a letter going 'blind'.

## Port Authority gets a new fork lift delivery

EIGHT of an order for 13 new fork lift trucks delivered to the Kenya Ports Authority last Wednesday by the Construction Equipment Division of Gailey and Roberts Ltd are of the biggest lifting capacity ever put into general purposes use at the Port of Mombasa.

They are ten-ton Caterpillar V.225's, diesel powered with power shift transmission. The other five are three-ton Caterpillar V.60 B's, diesel powered with hydrostatic transmission.

The handing over ceremony for the first 13 trucks was performed by Mr Francis N. Thaiya, Construction Equipment's Lift Truck Sales Representative, to Mr Andrew P. Burnard, Kenya Ports Authority's Chief Engineer, in the presence of C.E.'s Sales Manager for Kenya Mr John G. Rotherford and Coast Province Service Manager Mr Fred Mwakesi, and K.P.A. Principal Engineer, Mombasa Mr A. Akali.

Mr Rotherford said that the whole of this latest order for Caterpillar lift trucks by the K.P.A. had been assembled in Construction Equipment's Mombasa branch.

## KILINDINI TRAFFIC AT LOWEST LEVEL

BERTH OCCUPANCY in Kilindini by deep sea vessels over the past week has been at the lowest level for a very long time, in fact, last Saturday only three vessels were alongside the deep-water quays leaving thirteen berths unoccupied.

However, with the customary ebb and flow of shipping Kilindini will, hopefully, soon regain an improved traffic level.

Familiar red double decker buses of London Transport were to be seen in Kilindini this week on board the 19 year old 6700 ton Mediterranean Shipping Company vessel 'Corinna' discharging at No. 11 Berth.

The four buses in question, carried on deck, had been loaded in the United Kingdom and destined for discharge at Dar es Salaam.

At No. 17 Berth the Clan vessel 'Clan Alpine' which is the newest vessel in the dwindling Clan Line fleet, albeit 12 years old, was loading 40 containers for Manchester, the contents being Tea and Cotton Yarn.

Her Mombasa loading was confined to containers only — a trend which is becoming more and more the norm in this container age.

### A BARGAIN OFFER LED TO COURT!

MOST consumers are under the impression that if goods are advertised at a particular price the trader is legally obliged to sell them at that price.

A case of this nature arose recently when a coat was advertised in the window of a leading London department store at £25, but the display assistant had put on the wrong price tag and the correct price was £250.

Sensing a bargain a customer harangued the manager, arguing that the shop was legally bound to sell her the coat for £25 since she had accepted their offer and a valid contract existed.

In the sense that the main basis of a contract is an offer by one party and an acceptance by another she was quite correct, but she still had no legal right to enforce the contract.

Much of the law of contract is governed by decided cases, and in the leading case of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain v Boots Cash Chemists (1953) it was held that goods displayed do not constitute an offer.

Instead they are merely an invitation to treat, and the actual offer is made by the customer when he selects the goods and tenders the price.

Subsequently the trader may accept the offer, in which case a valid contract comes into existence, or he may reject it and there is no contract.

It is interesting to note that in the case of self-service supermarkets contracts are made at the checkout counter when the cashier accepts the customers money.

Obviously then, prices displayed on goods are not binding on a trader and he is within his rights to ask a customer for a different price to the one indicated.

Any trader who indulges in such practices, however, will soon lose goodwill, and it is worth mentioning that that in the case quoted above the department store agreed to sell the coat to the customer for £25, even though a genuine mistake had been made, as a gesture of good faith.

The resulting publicity given to the case in the national press improved their reputation and boosted the store's profits in ensuing years.

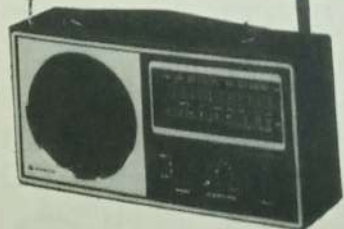

DER Monsun bläst allmählich ab, Windstille breitet sich aus und die Luft, gesättigt mit hoher Feuchtigkeit, ist zum Schneiden. Am Landeplatz im Alten Hafen von Mombasa tragen die Hafnarbeiter barfuß, mit nacktem Oberkörper, schweißgebadet ihre schweren Lasten an Land.

Mueham gehen sie ihren Weg über die schloppigen Planken, während die Kapitäne dieser grossen, ganz aus Holz gebauten Segelschiffe angestrengt Ausschau halten nach dem winzigen Anzeichen einer Brise, die sie zu ihren fernem Heimatorten bringen wird auf ihrer letzten

Reise in dieser Saison. Seit über 2000 Jahren und arabische Daus unzählige Male regelmässig zwischen dem Persischen Golf und der ostafrikanischen Küste hin und her gefahren.

Heute jedoch, gleich den saisonbedingten Monsunwinden, nimmt ihre Bedeutung immer mehr ab und sie sind die aussterbenden Opfer der sich dauernd zandernden Zeiten mit ihren neuen Märkten, besseren Transportmöglichkeiten und anderen modernen Erfindungen, die dieses allhergebrachte Transportmittel langsam aber sicher verdrängen.

Vom Fenster seines Buroes im 2. Stock blickt der zuständige Registrierbeamte Iuer Daus müessig auf die wenigen verankerten Segelschiffe. Es ist sehr ruhig im Hafen und er kann sich noch gut erinnern an die alten Zeiten, wenn sich im Maerz der Nordost-Monsun drehte und lange Reihen von Daus unter Abhaltung froehlicher Abschiedsfestlichkeiten nach Hause segelten.

«Oft waren die Daus hier so zahlreich um diese Jahreszeit, dass man Muehe hatte, ueberhaupt darzuweisen nur einen Flecken Wasser zu sehen», sagte der Registrierbeamte traumerisch und schwenkte seine Hand mit einer ausladenden Gebaerde in Richtung Fort Iesus, der portugiesischen Bastion aus dem 14. Jahrhundert, die trutzig und wuerdig die Einfahrt zum Alten Hafen bewacht.

## die Kohle 40 Jahre unterwegs war

war der Hafen von Tanga, der sich noch fest in deutscher Hand befand.

Im Morgengrauen des 14. April lag die Kronborg vor der Mandabucht, 1500 Meilen noerdlich des Hafens von Tanga.

Als sie auf den Lotsen wartete, entdeckte Kapitane Christiansen von seinem Ausguck aus drei kleine Rauchwolken und wusste, dass ein englisches Panzerkreuzer auf ihn zukam.

Die Rauchwolken kamen von der H.M.S. Hyacinth. Es war zu spaet, um noch in den Hafen nach Tanga zu gelangen; die Kronborg steuerte zum Ufer am Noerdende der Bucht und warf den Anker aus.

Als Kapitane Christiansen von der Kommandobruecke in den Funkraum hinabstieg, verfehlte gerade die erste Salve der Hyacinth um 50 m ihr Ziel.

Die zweite Salve traf das Schiff am Bug und eine Kugel traf die Kohle, die sofort Feuer fing. Hydranten wurden in Aktion gesetzt und Loescharbeiten waren in vollem Gange, um die Ladung und vor allem die Munition so gut wie moeglich zu retten.

Der Maschinenraum wurde durch eine andere Kugel zum Feuerkessel. Eine Kugel nach der andern explodierte an Deck, es war Zeit, das Schiff aufzugeben und zu verlassen.

## 'BAGAMOYO'

Die Kronborg hatte 13.000 Seemeilen gut hinter sich gebracht und jetzt, direkt vor dem Ziel, war sie am Ende. Nachdem die Hyacinth ihre Aufgabe erledigt hatte, dampfte sie zurueck zur Rulijimuehung. Sobald sie ausser Sicht war, konnten die Arbeiten an der Kronborg beginnen.

Obwohl sie gesunken war, konnte der groesste Teil der Ladung durch Taucher geborgen werden und wurde von Lastentrageern auf dem Kopf nach Ambon, Pangani, Bagamoyo, Dar es Salaam und zum Rulijidelta gebracht, wo die Koeningberg vergeblich darauf wartete.

Als Admiral King-Hall nach einigen Wochen in die Mandabucht zurueckkehrte, war das Schiff leer, bis auf die Kohle.

So blieb die Kronborg waehrend der naechsten 40 Jahre unter Wasser in der Mandabucht, bis eine Firma namens Mawa-Handelsgesellschaft beschloss, sie zu bergen.

70 Tage lang fuellten Taucher die Loecher mit Zement auf und reparierten die Holzplanken. Dann wurde das Wasser ausgepumpt, der plumpe Rumpf erhob sich langsam und schwamm.

Der Schleppdamoelr Simba von der Halengesellschaft zog die Kronborg in 10 Stunden von der Mandabucht nach Dar es Salaam.

Als ich damals an Bord ging, untersuchte ich den Rahmen, den Maschinenraum, den Schacht und die Luken. Und dort war immer noch die Kohle, so gut wie neu, strahlend wie Diamanten.

Ein Teil der Bodenplatten in der Kapitanekskajete war noch in gutem Zustand, das Steuerrad und das Ruder konnten sich nach einigem Schrubben, auf jedem Schiff befinden.

Aber die englischen Geschosse hatten der Kronborg so stark zugesetzt. Ueber 80 Kugeln hatten sie getroffen und ihren Rumpf durchloechert.

Die Kohle wurde an die Eisenbahngesellschaft verkauft und das einst stattliche Schiff auseinandergeronnen.

Ein Sprichwort sagt: "Altes Eisen rostet nicht". Die Kronborg war ein Schiff aus Eisen mit einer Gussseissenschraube.

Ein Seengebauer, der die Maschinen auseinandergeronnen hatte, meinte, er koennte sich wieder fuer den Gebrauch herrichten, wenn man ihm genuegend Zeit zur Veruegung stelle.

Es war ein gutes, altes Dampfschiff, das 40 von seinen 60 Jahren unter Wasser verbraucht hatte. Es wurde als Schrott verkauft und alles, was davon uebrigblieb, ist diese Geschichte.

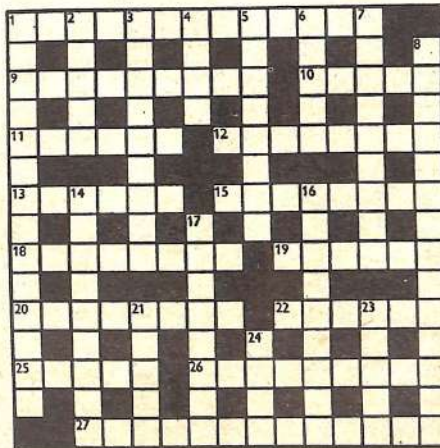

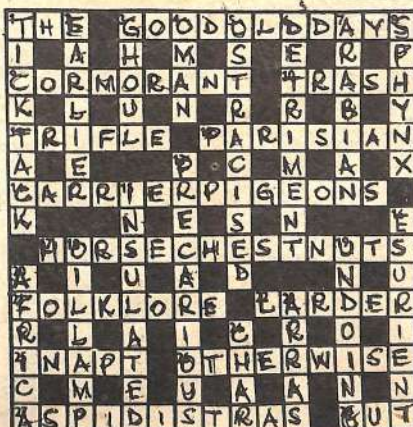

service expired, a local programme secretary was appointed early in 1975. From last October 1977, the branch was operated by lay leaders without professional support.  
In April 1979 a branch secretary Johnson Ngasha was appointed and he has proved to be very efficient.

## 'MILLIONS PAID OUT IN FIRE INSURANCE'

Refinery, there is an up-to-date fire-fighting installations at the refinery. This includes a water ring surrounding the area, fire hydrants and other equipment.  
"In fact there have been two cases of fire in the past. And in both cases we managed to control it".  
Admitting that the Brigade is under-staffed as well as ill-equipped, Mr Sururu revealed that recommendations have been made for two more fire sub-stations at Likoni and Kisumu.  
During a ride around the new Moi International Airport in one of their new fire trucks, Head of the Mombasa Aerodrome Fire Brigade, Mr E. Mboya told me that he has enough men and equipment to cope with any emergency fire-outbreak at the airport.  
A six-wheel rapid intervention vehicle, costing 2 1/2 million shillings, is among the various fire-fighting equipments purchased recently to safeguard the new airport.  
"We have seven modern fire trucks and 72 firemen in a 24-hour alert for any blaze at the airport".  
He explained that the chronic water shortage in Mombasa poses no problem to the airport brigade. Eight static water tanks, each storing 40,000 gallons of water, have been installed along the runway and within the airport compound.  
There is, too, a water reservoir which feeds the whole airport in case of water shortage.  
And the whole airport is equipped with hose reels

connected to the main water system, has asbestos blankets within the kitchen and the control tower and is installed with a safety device in case of fire.  
The Shell premises are, too, protected against fire as a sprinkler system of water is fitted to all aviation tanks.  
"So, for all intents and purposes we are fully prepared for any fire disaster."  
Plans are also under way to have a small fire station on the south creek equipped with a fire boat to combat air-crash disaster on the sea. The station will be parallel to runway 03.

Dinah also became National long jump champion, National Schools Champion and Inter Colleges Champion, all at the age of 17 years.

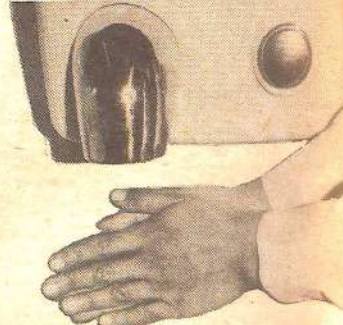
## KISUMU HOTSTARS PLAY IN MOMBASA
