

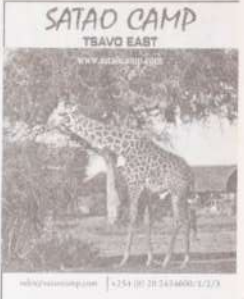

His Honour, the Minister of Health Kwale County, Dr. Athuman Chiguzo, officially received the keys of the newly constructed Palliative Care Clinic facility at Msambweni County Referral Hospital on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> September 2016 at 16.00 at the hospital.

This two roomed unit is the brain child of the members of the South Coast Branch of the East Africa Women's League, spear-headed by their chairman Mrs. Pauline McKenzie, to meet the established need for community outreach for terminally ill patients.

With sponsorship from the Commercial Bank of Africa, today this unit is a reality.

Utilising existing space within the hospital's Outpatients Department, the facility provides a peaceful, private consultation room and an examination room, where patients can receive advice, guidance and treatment from the professional team of hospital staff who will manage this much needed service, especially for the home care of patients, through the outreach programme.

The existing, largely unused waiting area was renovated to meet the hospital requirements

erecting floor to ceiling panels, lockable doors, ceiling fans, plumbing to two stainless steel sinks, lighting and sockets, replacing existing window frames with hard wood and frosted glass and the entire structure was painted throughout.

This Palliative Care facility will greatly assist the hospital medical specialists as a referral unit for patients.

It will also provide a quality working facility for staff coping with the stress and demands of treating terminally

ill patients and their caregivers.

It is the only Palliative Care Centre in the Kwale County.

The objective of the East Africa Woman's League is to "promote the physical, moral and mental welfare and happiness of all women and children".

South Coast Branch members appreciate this cooperation with the Kwale Ministry of Health in developing, through networking and partnership, this new health outreach service.

# Highest Hockey Honour For Former Kenyan International Resham Bains

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) --** Former Kenyan international Resham Bains will receive hockey's highest award in November for his exemplary service to the game, the president of the Federation of International Hockey (FIH), Leandro Negre has confirmed.

Bains, who played hockey for Kenya during the 1971 World Cup in Barcelona and at the 1972 Munich Olympics, will receive the Order of Merit award that is granted to members of FIH for distinguished service over a period of at least 10 years for exceptional contribution towards hockey.

"It will be a fitting tribute for my former opponent on the field to receive the award during the same month I will be leaving office after serving at the helm of hockey for eight years," Negre said in Nairobi during opening of the Sikh Union Club's Mahan Hockey Hall of Fame.

Bains will become the second Kenyan to receive the award after Hardial Singh was honored by the hockey world governing body in 1984.

Bains, who also served as the chairman of the Kenya Hockey Union (KHU) between 2005 and 2013, played in the half back position and after he retired from international hockey, took up umpiring.

He served as a member of the FIH Umpiring Committee, from 2003 to 2005, vice-president of the Africa Hockey

Federation and is presently a member of the National Olympic Committee of Kenya (NOC).

The FIH president said Kenya should do her best to take hockey back to the glorious days of the past when the country was a powerhouse to reckon with.

"Hockey is the only Olympic team sport in Kenya that has received world recognition and I hope to see Kenya back at the next Olympic Games in Tokyo in 2020," he said adding that

African hockey faced many difficulties owing to facilities, infrastructure and levels of coaching.

Kenya, which last featured at the Olympics 28 years ago during the 1988 Seoul Games, was once a powerhouse that would put up spirited struggle against great-playing nations such as Holland, India and Pakistan.

The country was crowned African hockey champions 29 years ago after clinching the gold medal during the Fourth All Africa Games hosted in Nairobi, a feat that earned the Kenya the chance to represent the continent at the Seoul Olympics.

# Officials Urge Innovative Local Financing To Boost Growth Of Film Industry

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) --** There is need for African governments and industry to explore innovative financing schemes alongside enactment of robust policies to spur growth of cinema and audio-visual industry, officials have said.

Speaking at a media roundtable ahead of the African Film Festival to be held in Nairobi from Oct. 12 to 16, the officials said a vibrant creative industry will boost the continent's growth and economic development.

Jane Munene, the Executive Director of Nairobi-based African Federation of Filmmakers said the nascent creative audio-visual industry in Africa has potential for growth but to adequate financing and skills development.

"We need to encourage production of African films that tell authentic stories of this continent to the world. However, to achieve this objective, conducive policies and regulations are needed," she said.

The upcoming African film festival in Nairobi will be attended by policy makers, content developers and investors to spur growth of a sector that contributes 5 billion U.S. dollars to the continent's economy.

Munene said African governments are keen to promote growth of film industry through establishment of sound policy, institutional and regulatory frameworks.

"There is need to encourage private sector financing of Africa's cinema and audio-visual industry. Filmmakers need to therefore come up with content that has a competitive edge," she said.

She revealed that a high level dialogue between financiers and filmmakers will be held during the African Film Festival.

The African Union member states have adopted several charters to promote growth of cinema and audio-visual industry in the continent.

Munene noted that greater political goodwill has boosted growth of film industry in Benin, Burkina Faso, Ghana, Nigeria, Mali and Zimbabwe.

She emphasized that a robust Pan African film industry can enable the continent achieve its socio-economic transformation goals outlined in the Agenda 2063.

African countries have grappled with inadequate resources and manpower alongside outdated policies that have undermined the growth of film industry.

Ernest Kerich, the Director, Department of Film Services Kenya's ministry of sports, culture and arts said that structural financing coupled with training and public outreach are key to catalyze growth of cinema and audio-visual industry in Africa.

A new cinema named '*Cleopatra Theatre*' opened over the weekend in Malindi by Nairobi businessman **Harith Ali**. The theatre had a capacity of 478 seats and the going rate for tickets was K.Sh 5/50, 8/50 and 12/- per person.

A container Study Team representing British and Continental Shipowners visited Kenya and Tanzania where they had discussions with top officials in the Ports, Railways, Road Transport companies, Customs and Government departments.

Delegates from 159 countries, including 40 Ministers elected Kenyan Minister for Power and Communications Hon. Isaac Omolo Okero as Vice President of the 18th Universal Postal Congress being held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

# Vetting Commissions Should Reflect 'Pure And Truthful' Conscience Of 'Mwananchi'

**In the last article I covered the vetting process of those seeking public office and how faulted it appeared and emphasised the need to completely revamp the process so that the person being vetted is required to give a full and complete disclosure of all their affairs.**

The vetting team would also do their due diligence and then the two pieces of work would be brought together.

This will form the basis of the soap opera that should then follow with the public being treated to a televised humiliation of a respected person as their start on the journey to serving the public.

This process must be stopped and be revised.

To conclude on the issue of vetting (now that we have a break following the same process being applied to the selection of a Chief Justice) I will turn to how ineffective this process is in producing the desired change in our national values and integrity.

We will start with the end process and then the following week look at the operations in the various public offices and how they are perceived with respect to Chapter six of the Constitution of Kenya.

Since the coming into force of the current Constitution of Kenya in twenty ten, we have had a large number of top people in public service vetted.

The Cabinet Secretaries and Principal Secretaries were all subjected to vetting by Parliament.

The Public Service Commission also did their bit as did the Judicial Service Commission for their relevant teams.

The Commissioners themselves were also subject to vetting by Parliament before they were released as 'Independent' operators for various parts of the Constitution.

The way our Constitution was set up was that the Commissions would be the pure and truthful conscience of the mwananchi.

They were to protect the sovereignty of the people, secure observance by all State organs if democratic values and principles and promote constitutionalism.

They would discharge their duties without fear or favour and would ruthlessly defend the values of the country.

They would be truly independent and would have tenure of office unless of course there was good reason to remove them.

Removal from office in itself is an onerous process and lends itself to dragging the incumbent through the mud, in public, till such time as they voluntarily leave or leave in disgrace.

The premises for removal include serious violation of the Constitution or any other law including contravention of the famous Chapter six on Values.

Other premises are gross misconduct, physical or mental incapacity to perform the functions of the office, incompetence or bankruptcy.

Once any of these are sus-

pected, anyone can present a petition to parliament asking for the removal of the incumbent or the whole Commission.

This will then trigger action by Parliament.

If they find that there are sufficient grounds then they would recommend to the President for the person or the Commission to be removed.

between the government and opposition in the August 2010 election then the tyranny of numbers rule.

The outcome of such a process will most likely be the same.

So in short, the vetting process at entry into public service is a process of potholes and the "independent" process at the end is also filled with potholes.

Whilst the objectives of the Constitution of Kenya were noble, the way it was structured to fulfil its objectives relies on the integrity of a lot of people.

This makes it very difficult to get an impartial process at least in the eyes of most of the average Kenyan.

They have heard and seen a lot of corruption and have seen in the public service over the years the leadership which has been is none.

The reality is that the vetting process is a process of doing the rounds quality-wise whether true or not are seen positive on the uprightness of those who lead us in the public service.

The processes of vetting and removal have completely eroded their credibility and we seem to be quietly sliding back to the olden days.

This is not good for Kenya. As Kachumbuni says, we are moving forward and two steps back is not a good place to be in.

## Spanish Maritime Patrol Helping to Keep Sea Farers Safe Off Somalia

OFF SOMALIA -- Operation Atalanta's Spanish maritime patrol aircrew, based in Djibouti, fly air missions over the Indian Ocean and Gulf of Aden on a regular basis.

Their key role is to keep a sharp look out over the sea and along the Somali coast for any potential pirate activity.

As well as this important counter-piracy work, the Spanish aircrew also regularly performs Civil-Military Co-operation (CIMC) tasks that benefit seafarers in the area.

The Spanish Air Force's P-3 aircraft provides a Search and Rescue role to merchant ships transiting the waters off Somalia.

A life-raft is carried on all flights which can be deployed if the aircrew sees a vessel in distress.

Regular broadcasts are made

on Channel 16 Maritime Mobile Service to ensure ships know that the Operation Atalanta aircraft is flying in the vicinity.

The broadcasts also serve to deter would-be pirates as they remind them of EU NAVFOR's presence.

Since November 2015 Operation Atalanta aircraft have also flown over the UN Food and Agriculture Organisation's (FAO) Fish-Aggregating Devices (FADs).

These large, yellow buoys were deployed along the Somali coast in a UN initiative to help increase fish stocks for local fishermen.

During their over flights, the Spanish aircrew check the position and condition of the buoys to ensure that the fishermen are still able to benefit from them.

Maritime patrol aircraft provide the Operation Atalanta force commander with a highly-versatile capability that can respond to a developing incident at sea very quickly.

It can gather critical information about activity along the coast and far out to sea. Undertaking CIMC tasking is an added benefit and another example of how EU NAVFOR is helping local seafarers off the coast of Somalia.

## SERBIAN MARITIME PROTECTION HONoured FOR KEEPING FOOD SHIP SAFE FROM PIRATES

Operation Atalanta's Serbian maritime protection team has been awarded the Common Security and Defence Policy service medal in recognition of their outstanding work off the coast of Somalia as part of the EU's counter-piracy Operation Atalanta.

The Serbian maritime protection team has been aboard the World Food Programme (WFP) chartered vessel, MSM Douro, for the past six months.

Their role has been to ensure that the WFP vessel, which carries much-needed humanitarian aid for displaced people in Somalia, remains safe from any pirate attack.

The medal ceremony was held aboard counter-piracy flagship, HNLMS Tromp, with the medals presented by the Operation Atalanta Force Commander, Dutch Commodore René Luyckx.

The Master of MSM Douro, Michal Jaszczoit, was delighted to be invited on board to see the men who had protected his ship receive their

medals.

In addressing the Serbian team on the Dutch frigate's flight deck, Commodore Luyckx said that they should be rightly proud because due to their hard work and dedication they have ensured that food and other humanitarian aid arrived safely in Somali ports.

Following the ceremony, the Serbian team returned to MSM Douro to continue their protection duties and HNLMS Tromp resumed her counter-piracy patrols that are helping to ensure that piracy remains suppressed off the coast of Somalia.

The Serbian team will remain aboard the WFP ship for a few more weeks, until another team takes over this important role.

## Vegetables Growing In Kenya Gets Boost With New Types

CPBI (Xinhua) -- The growing of the highly popular indigenous African vegetables in Kenya has received a boost as farmers are now growing fast-growing, high-yielding varieties.

The growing of the vegetables, commoned widely across the African nation by health-conscious consumers, has increased in tandem with rise in demand as farmers relied on traditional species, which grow naturally.

Kenya Plant Health Inspectorate Service, however, recently released certified varieties of nightshade, vine tomato, jute mallow, and eggplant, giving farmers the opportunity to reap big profits from their ventures.

Alumiti, a farmer in Nairobi, a suburb of Nairobi, is among those growing the new varieties of seeds.

"I heard of the new seeds three months ago and I came here in Nairobi."

"I've already had my first harvest and I'm impressed," he said.

These are the vegetables growing faster, in about two months, they are also offering farmers the chance to fetch more in the market," said Alumiti, who has a small bunch of the vegetables at 0.09 U.S. dollars.

Abukutsa, a professor of horticulture at the Jomo Kenyatta University of Agriculture and Technology, who has been licensed to commercialize the new varieties of seeds will foster production and consumption of indigenous crops.

These early maturity and resistance to drought and diseases, the vegetables are very nutritious," he said.

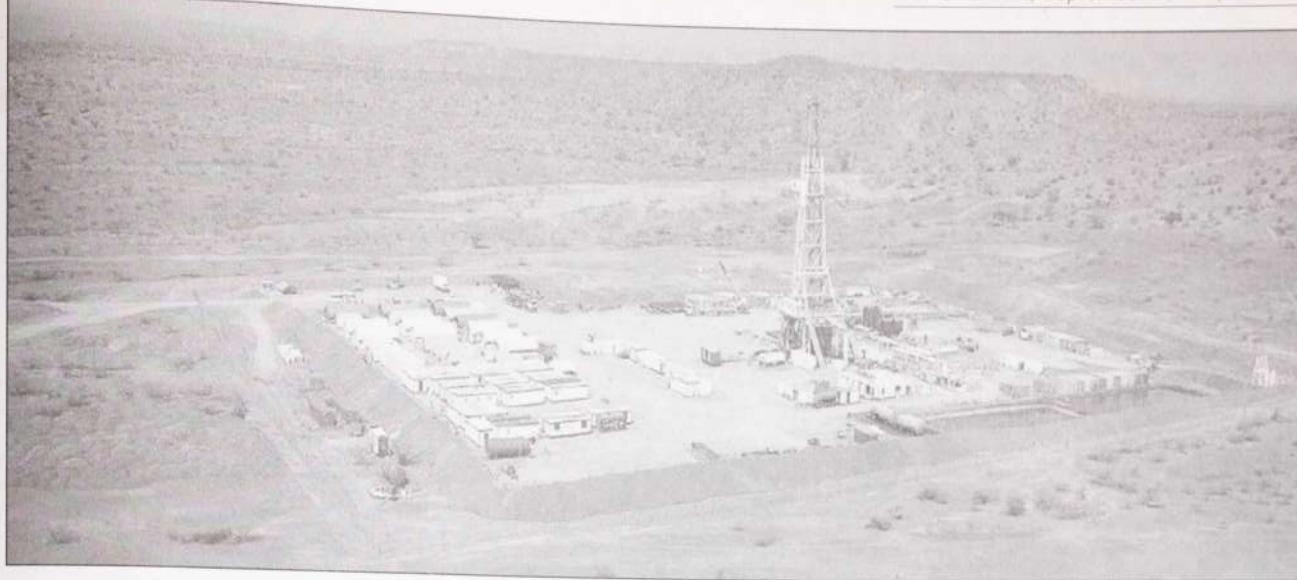
The quantities of valuable nutrients such as iron, calcium, vitamins in the vegetables are higher compared to some of exotic vegetables," Abukutsa said, noting that the vegetables contain high levels of antioxidants, substances that reduce the risk of heart diseases and types of cancer.

Indigenous vegetables for many years have for long been treated as weeds but with the growing popularity, they have found their way into the formal economy and are now sold in supermarkets at a premium amount.

Indigenous vegetables made less than 50 percent of all vegetables consumed in the country because they were considered a poor man's crop.

However, with increased demand, the plants make up more than half of all vegetables consumed in the East African region, according to the Kenya Agricultural and Livestock Research Organization.

Indigenous vegetables have many advantages over the exotic vegetables like tomatoes and Sukuma wiki because they don't require a lot of fertilizers and are resistant to pests.

## Turkana County Residents Demand Their 'Fair Shares' From Oil Windfall

by Robert Manyara LODWAR (Xinhua) -- Four years into the discovery of oil in Kenya's northwestern Turkana county, the local residents' initial hopes of better economic prospects has been replaced by rising impatience.

In the past three years, there have been numerous protests in the vast and semi-arid region as locals demand jobs and monetary compensation.

Local people often complained of being sidelined by oil exploration firms, alleging that only well-heeled businessmen and politicians have benefited from the business.

Initial protests in the regions near oil fields stemmed from fear by the herdsman community that exploration will displace them from their ancestral land.

"We feel our livelihood has been threatened by the oil exploration activities in the region and our livestock and people will be displaced," said Arot Chegem, a resident in Turkana.

Chegem insisted the government and oil companies should compensate Turkana herdsman displaced from their ancestral land when oil exploration started.

However, despite simmering discontent from a section of the population, there are other indications that the oil

drilling has boosted local economy.

A spot check by Xinhua reveals that modern schools and health centers have been constructed in the areas where oil exploration has been ongoing.

"Our children used to cover a long distance to school and there were no health facilities nearby. But since the oil companies pitched tent here, our lives have improved tremendously," said John Ekai, an elderly herdsman.

International oil companies have been prospecting for oil in Lokichar and Ngamia-1 regions of Turkana county since 2012.

Since oil exploration commenced in Turkana, conservation lobbies have been pushing for compensation to local people who lost their ancestral land that is rich in flora and fauna.

At the same time, community leaders have lobbied oil companies to invest in physical and social infrastructure including roads, schools, hospitals and power.

Last month witnessed violent protests by Turkana residents demanding compensation by oil companies. Local administrators brokered a truce between the oil companies and the aggrieved communities.

On their part, the oil companies promised to invest more resources in projects that uplift the living standards of locals.

"We have partnered with key stakeholders to ensure that local people are involved in our projects.

"We have employed several top and middle level managers from Turkana county," said Martin Mbogo, the Kenya Country Manager for Tullow Oil.

The county government of Turkana has organized several meetings between oil companies and community leaders to address the row over compensation.

County lawmakers said at a recent meeting that the passage of Kenya's petroleum bill 2015 will ensure that local people benefit from 10 percent of profits generated from oil exports.

## INNOVATIVE WAY OF CUTTING COST FOR HOUSING IN KENYA

by Robert Manyara NAKURU (Xinhua) -- A Kenyan software developer is giving prospective home owners an ingenious option of designing interior finishings of their homes amid fast rising of property prices in urban areas.

With the virtual interior design application developed by Busalire Emeka, buyers eyeing a particular house under construction can select and define decorations of the interior sections.

In this way, Emeka says, buyers can reduce the total cost of the house by reviewing the rates of the whole interior design.

"Should the prospective buyer feel like the interior design finishing is too expensive, then they can have a discussion with the real estate developer and cut it by up to 25 percent," Emeka, the founder of custom software developer firm, Egalaxykenya, said on Tuesday.

He said the application gives the homeowners the power to determine the final look of the house unlike when one buys a finished one and is too constrained financially to make adjustments.

"This (house) is a lifetime investment and therefore it is important to have control over how it looks," he said.

"Many of the current homeowners are buying houses through mortgages and when you start paying, it really hits you so hard (that you have no money to consider changes to the house)," he noted.

The application available on his online system solutions platform allows one to have a 3-D view of the interior finishing. These include the floors, walls, kitchen and washrooms. Further, one can have a view of the physical shell of the house such that the intended buyer can have a clear perspective of the finished product.

"By looking at all the features, the buyer can then come up with his or her own finishing and present the requirements to the property developer to customize it to his or her liking," said Emeka, who has assisted various Kenyan developers and prospective homeowners design their interiors with the application since beginning of the year.

The software developer is one of those who represented young innovators at the Nairobi Innovation Week in August, 2016.

However, he says capital is a major challenge to developing a product that meets the needs of the consumers within a shortest period. His plan is to synchronize it with low cost housing units to capture a market in need of affordable houses but that requires huge capital currently out of his reach.

## African Farmers Challenged By 'Limited Market Access'

by Robert Manyara NAKURU (Xinhua) -- As stakeholders in agriculture from different parts of the world converge in Nairobi for a global forum to deliberate on issues bedeviling farmers in Africa, the desire of Kenyan farmers is that they find headway to their hurdles in accessing profitable markets.

The week-long African Green Revolution Forum which kicked off in Nairobi on Monday seeks to look into challenges of farmers in the African continent and put forth action plans for solving them.

"Getting a market where you can sell your maize, potatoes, carrots or any other produce and making a profit is a big challenge to farmers," said Margaret Munga, a member of the Mau Narok Rural Farmers Sacco in Rilt Valley, Kenya.

Many of the rural farmers who mainly depend on agriculture for their daily livelihood are finding it hard to sustain their farming due to low profits against high cost of farm inputs, she said.

"Helping farmers identify a good market and assist them access it is the best way to assist them reap the benefits of their farming activities," noted the mixed small scale farmer who mainly grows carrots, potatoes, green peas and rears dairy cattle.

For Samuel Muraya, a hardworking farmer in Bahati, north of Nakuru County, finding a long-term solution to brokerage would give farmers a broad advantage to huge profits.

Muraya grows peanuts, tomatoes, carrots, kales, spinach, and passion fruits. He also has beehives and dairy cattle. He says his key customers are the brokers who buy in bulk at their own predetermined price.

"Brokers know how to make money out of farmers.

"They will bargain until you give up and sell to

them at their own price," he said.

"It is better you sell to them at a throw-away price than make a total loss. You cannot afford to let go a customer because tomatoes cannot stay for too long before they are consumed," he added. I consider throwing away rotten produce a painful loss. That is throwing away all the capital and the little profit you could make out of it," he said.

He said the rural farmers should be educated on how to overcome the challenge of marketing the produce. According to him, forming associations to collectively sell the produce is a good practice but ensuring accountability, transparency and sustainability is a big obstacle.

Kibet Korir, an agricultural specialist said rural farmers need not just information on good farming practices but also profitable markets.

"From my experience in training farmers, I have realized that they are willing and ready to adopt new ways of farming to boost the harvests," he said.

"But the question is what happens after the high yields? Are they able to say they significantly increased their profits by capturing a well-paying market or they feel disappointed because they have to sell them at the same throw-away price?" he said.

Korir recognizes the need to establish and efficiently implement policies that support farmers in accessing the regional markets such as in Uganda, Burundi, Rwanda and Tanzania.


