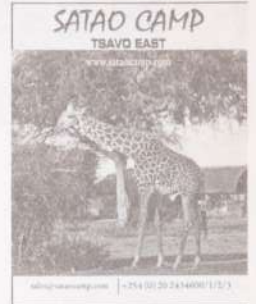

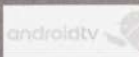

October at the Aga Khan Hospital Mombasa and shall include cervical screening in partnership with Faraja Cancer Trust.

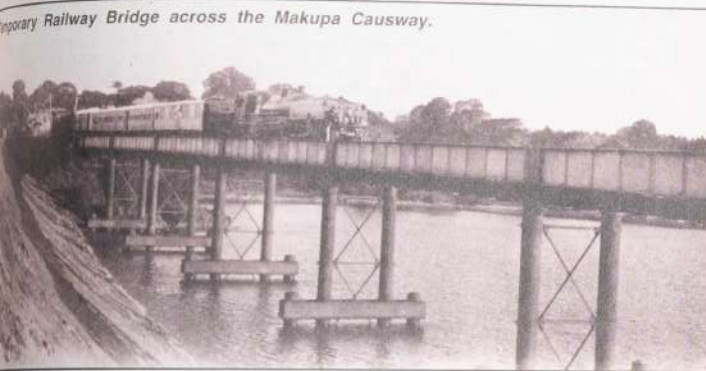

Kenya Ready to Host 2018 Africa Nations Champions
 NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenya will spend over 1 million U.S. dollars to renovate the stadium ahead of the 2018 Africa Nations Championships, which the country will host.

The Kenya Federation of Football Clubs (KFFC) President, Nick Mwendwa said the stadium in Nairobi is scheduled to stage international matches while three other venues will be required to meet the demand for the competition, which brings in over 16 teams.

There should be no cause for concern. The country is on course to host the 2018 African Nations Championships (CHAN), said Mwendwa.

The International Federation of Football Associations (FIFA) will send in a team of inspectors to review the renovation progress.

The event will come a year after Kenya has hosted another international competition in the World U-18 Athletics Championships.

The government is doing what it can to order to have the stadium ready.

There will be further inspections by CAF soon and it is important that we step up the renovation to get the job done properly come around again," Mwendwa.

Alongside Nairobi, Mwendwa said the event will also have venues staged in Kisumu and Malindi.

The country has its infrastructure and all we need to do is renovate them to meet required standards. These standards need to improve their infrastructure. We have a big risk and we must do it right," he said.

Nyali Residents: Enough Is Enough with Graffiti

M.I.T.C. Hosts Tax Clubs Convention

Secondary schools students from around the coastal region staged captivating performances showcasing their talents and the country's tax-compliance-culture.

They presented skits, songs, poems, speeches and solo verses, to educate the public on the importance of paying taxes.

This one day event was organized by the Kenya Revenue Authority (K.R.A.) with this year's theme being *Tulipe Ushuru Tujitegeme*.

Participating schools were: Kenyatta Mwatate, Shimo La Tewa, Voi Educational Centre, Kwale, Barani, Mbaraki Girls', Star of the Sea and Tudor Day Secondary School.

Barani Secondary School from Malindi emerged the overall winner, followed by Voi Education Centre and Shimo La Tewa High school at second and third positions respectively.

K.R.A. awarded the top two schools. It gave textbook vouchers worth Ksh. 20,000 to the first position and Ksh. 15,000 to the second position.

Three years ago, K.R.A. embarked on grooming future tax payers.

It launched an outreach programme and facilitated secondary schools to establish Tax Clubs.

Through this programme, it expects to mitigate the expenses incurred in running after tax payers, and to raise revenue collection by instilling a tax-compliant culture.

Students were excited by this educating event; it set a great atmosphere for cohesion and social interactions.

The revenue authority also used this event to usher in the Tax Payer's month.

KENYA ECONOMY GROWS SIX PER CENT

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenya's economy has grown by 6.2 percent in the second quarter of 2016 (March-June) compared to 5.9 percent in the same period 2015, the bureau of statistics said.

According to statistics from the Kenya National Bureau of Statistics (KNBS), the growth was mainly buoyed by expansion in agriculture, forestry and fishing, transportation and storage, real estate, and wholesale and retail trade.

The bureau said the agricultural sector posted a growth of 5.5 percent during the period compared to a revised growth of 4.0 percent realised in a similar period in 2015.

"The period under review was characterized by adequate and well distributed rainfall that greatly enhanced agricultural production.

"Notably, the quantity of coffee and tea grew by 16.3 and 49.6 per cent, respectively, in the second quarter," KNBS said.

It said the value of exports of horticultural crops grew significantly (47.1 per cent) in the quarter under review from 177 million U.S. dollars in the second quarter of 2015 to 260 million dollars in the quarter under review.

"This growth was on account of considerable increases in the value of exported cut flowers and vegetables especially in the month of June where the revenue earned more than doubled," it said.

According to KNBS, manufacturing experienced the slowest growth at 3.2 per cent during the review quarter while accommodation and food services continued with the recovery that started in the fourth quarter of 2015 to expand by 15.3 per cent over the same period.

The bureau also attributed the slow growth in the manufacturing sector mainly to low level of activity in key sub-sectors.

The bureau said mining and quarrying; electricity and water supply; and information and communication sectors recorded notable improvements in their growths during the review quarter.

Kenya Budget Hit U.S. 23.6 billion dollars For 2017/18 Financial Year

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenya's budget for the 2017/18 financial year is projected to increase to 23.6 billion U.S. dollars, up from the current 21.1 billion dollars.

Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury, Henry Rotich, said that the government revenues will increase despite a slowdown of global economic performance.

"The growth will stem from an increase in tax revenue collections from the current 18.2 percent of the Gross Domestic Product to 18.3 percent," Rotich said during the official opening of the public sector hearing for the financial year 2017/18.

Rotich said that the 2017/18 budget will expand as tax collections will increase from 13.1 billion dollars for the current financial year to 14.9 billion dollars for the next financial year.

He said that the majority of the government expenditure will go to non-discretionary spending, such as the public wage bill and the repaying of domestic and external loans.

The government will prioritize spending on programs and projects that address poverty reduction, Rotich said, adding that 439 million dollars will be set aside in the next financial year to fund free primary and secondary education.

GOLD PRICES reach an all time record of U.S. Dollars 441 per ounce as world wide investors go into a mad gold rush amid market speculation that it might soon break the U.S. Dollars 500 barrier. The enormous run up began when several big investors, which included three major Swiss banks and West Germany's powerful Dresdner Bank, decided to hedge against inflation by switching some of their paper currency holdings into what they regard as the world's most tangible asset.

Road Fatalities In The Country Are Running Around Twenty Per Cent Higher Than Last Year

Enough of vetting for now.

However, we still have several sessions of this circus scheduled over the next month or so.

First will be those for the Chief Justice and the Deputy Chief Justice.

Then we will have that of the various vacancies that will then be created including the filling of the already vacant positions occasioned by retirement at the top echelons of the judiciary.

This will be followed by what I reckon will rank as one of the best show this year - vetting of the nominees for the new Commissioners for the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission or IEBC.

The reason why I will still have an ear and eye on vetting is that the one for the IEBC will be very politically charged.

The members of the Parliamentary Committee to do the vetting will all have very specific and strong affiliations.

It is most likely that they will view anything positive said by MPs from the other party as sowing the seed for favours at a future time and also view any criticism as filibustering and an attempt to challenge the credibility and honesty of the other party.

Let the party begin!

This week I will go back to what has always been my passion and that is safety on the road - and look at what has happened in the last couple of weeks especially around Nairobi.

Road fatalities in the country are running at around twenty per cent higher than last year.

Since the start of the year it was mainly private vehicles that have contributed to fatalities - whether that of pedestrians or motorcycle users.

However, despite the increase in the number of the fatalities

there has not been any major public reaction apart from the occasional erection of unauthorised speed bumps or temporary road closures at the points where the accidents have occurred.

The most notable reaction was that of the students at a University where several students died due to a matatu accident.

The delay in reaction was a few hours but once the students were organised the confrontation was quite dramatic.

Each time the students came out to protest they were met with the "full force of the law".

In other areas, the public has come out in damaging protest whenever someone is knocked over especially in market places or places where there is crowding.

In the week I was witness to one case where a long distance truck was travelling along the Southern bypass in Nairobi and at some point it got to a crowded area.

It was crowded because the local population had recreated a market that had been moved during the construction of the road.

People were mingling and crossing the road despite the reality that there were barriers which had been installed to stop people from getting on to the bypass.

The truck was travelling at the prescribed speed - I was following immediately behind it.

A matatu came speeding on the lane nearest the centre as it was not expecting that there would be a speed trap in that location.

As the driver was overtaking he realised that the gap between the trucks he was overtaking and the car ahead of the matatus in the same lane was decreasing and he would be stopped as the

car ahead of the matatu was travelling slower than the truck.

The matatus driver sped up and swerved sharply to the left so as to make it into the empty lane on the left.

The matatus driver could not right the vehicle quickly enough and the matatu ploughed into the crowd that was gathered at the barrier in the new market area.

About twelve people were knocked over by the vehicle and one of them died on the spot.

The matatu driver had the presence of mind to quickly reverse the vehicle and take off

Kenya's Tana Delta Generates USD \$ 2.5 Million Dollars Annually Via Eco-Systems

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- The expansive mangrove forests that dot Tana Delta in the Kenyan coast generates U.S. \$2.5 million dollars annually through a range of eco-system services like flood control, provision of clean water and energy sources, fisheries and building materials, a study has said.

According to Economics of Ecosystem and Biodiversity Services of Tana River Basin launched Thursday in Nairobi, Kenya's longest river could provide answer to poverty, hunger and energy deficit if its resources were utilized prudently.

Conservation group, Wetlands International, and a host of partners carried out the study to evaluate the economic potential of the Tana River basin.

Julie Mulonga, Kenya program manager with Wetlands

International, said the Tana Delta is endowed with abundant resources that can be harnessed to propel Kenya's socio-economic progress.

"The Tana delta has already been declared wetlands of international significance under Ramsar convention.

"Millions of people depend on its ecosystem services like fresh air, water and fisheries," Mulonga said.

She urged concerted efforts to boost conservation of the Tana River basin that is currently

grappling with ecological depletion linked to population pressure and climate change.

The Tana River basin covers 22 percent of Kenya's land mass and is home to 18 percent of the country's population.

It is the source of 80 percent of clean drinking water supplied in Nairobi and sustains reservoirs that generate 70 percent of hydropower in Kenya.

According to the report, the current value of electricity generated from reservoirs along the Tana Delta is estimated at 400 million dollars annually.

It also revealed that irrigated agriculture sustained by the Tana River basin has the potential to produce 64,000 tons of rice and maize every year.

Joakim Harlin, Chief of freshwater ecosystems unit at UNEP, said that attaching monetary value to ecosystems would strengthen efforts to conserve them for future generations.

"Appreciating the true value of freshwater ecosystems like the Tana Delta is key to achieve the agenda 2030 on inclusive development," Harlin said.

He underscored the critical role of community led interventions to reverse degradation of Tana River basin.

'ORGANIC PRODUCT' WILL FIGHT AFLATOXIN IN MAIZE

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- The Kenyan Ministry of Agriculture and its partners on Tuesday launched an organic compound to boost the fight against aflatoxin infestation in key staples like maize and groundnuts.

Officials hailed the organic pesticide called Atlasafe KEO1 as a game changer in the war against aflatoxin, a fungal disease caused by poor post-harvest handling of cereals.

Director general of the Kenya Agricultural Livestock and Research Organization, Eliud Kireger, said that Atlasafe presented to smallholders a cheaper and effective option to contain aflatoxin in maize. "Development of an organic product to fight aflatoxin will be a welcome relief to maize farmers in the arid and semi-arid regions where the fungal diseases are more pronounced," Kireger said.

KENYA TO SEEK CONCESSIONAL LOANS TO BRIDGE BUDGET DEFICIT

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenya plans to seek concessional loans to bridge the budget deficit for the 2017/18 financial year, a senior official said. The National Treasury Principal Secretary, Kamau Thugge, told journalists in Nairobi on Tuesday that Kenya will borrow up to 4.7 billion U.S. dollars both from local and external sources for the 2017/18 budget year.

"We hope to prioritize soft loans because it will help to minimize the degree of foreign exchange rate risk and interest rate risk," Thugge said on the sidelines of the public sector hearing for 2017/18 financial year.

Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury Henry Rotich said on Monday that Kenya's budget for the 2017/18 financial year is projected to increase to 23.6 billion U.S. dollars, up from the current 21.1 billion dollars.

Thugge said that the government will put

in place guidelines to ensure the level of domestic borrowing does not crowd out the private sector from accessing loans.

Since the enactment of an interest rate capping law last month, commercial banks have increased their lending to the government which is considered less risky compared to lending to individuals and corporate entities.

Thugge said that the government plans to use 2.7 billion dollars for interest payments on domestic and external debts and 1.3 billion to repay principal on public debt for the next

financial year. The 2016 National Debt Sustainability Analysis in Kenya's external debt remains.

Thugge said that currently the government stood at 48.3 percent of the Gross Domestic Product. The official said the foreign exchange reserves was enough to cover more than five months of imports.

The International Monetary Fund approved a precautionary access facility of 1.5 billion dollars in foreign exchange to cushion Kenya from external shocks.

KENYA ELDERLY PERSONS DECRY DISCRIMINATION

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Eliud Karanja, an 87-year-old Kenyan, has nostalgic memories of a bygone era when old age was regarded as a treasure by the wider society.

The sharp-witted elder is an encyclopedia having witnessed epoch moments in Kenya's journey from colonialism to a free and economically vibrant state.

Thousands of men and women of his generation, Karanja pointed out, fought for Kenya's independence and his patriotism was not diminished in spite of frailties associated with old age. In colonial days, Karanja has endured different forms of discrimination in the hands of his close relatives and the general public.

During a public forum held in Nairobi recently ahead of the World Elder Persons Day on Saturday, Karanja decried emotional neglect from a society whose indifference to its elders has reached a crisis proportion.

Age is no longer alluring like it used to be in our societies. We are being subjected to cruel treatment from our own children and grandchildren of the modern society," Karanja lamented.

He pointed out public service vehicles that discriminate elderly persons with careless abandon, yet their persistent pleas for fair treatment always fall on deaf ears.

"I never board a mini-van that ply from my home in the city of Nairobi to the city center, the driver and conductor treat me like a beggar. It is a humiliating experience to ride in a public vehicle where the crew treats old people with contempt," Karanja said.

With an aging population that is estimated at 1.5 million in Kenya, with abject poverty, poor health and emotional abuse, the government has rolled out a raft of programs to shield the elderly from social exclusion and other injustices.

Karanja and his elderly peers who attended the forum said that the neglect of senior citizens from the bondage of deprivation, and disease was far from over.

Dr. Daman Mohamed, a 76-year-old mother of four, decried discrimination at the health center where she has frequently had to seek medical attention.

She dealt with rampant discrimination in the health facilities as doctors give old people casual attention yet their ailments are more severe compared to those of the youthful ones," she said.

Karanja said that health-care providers in Kenya continue to treat elderly people like a burden.

It is unfortunate that even doctors are very slow in attending to elderly people who endures agony while queuing alongside younger compatriots in health facilities," she added.

Karanja elderly persons have not only suffered in the hands of relatives but also unscrupulous people hell bent to profit off their plight.

Dr. Torito Kinyanjui lamented how an unscrupulous person most freed him after a court awarded him compensation for injuries he suffered after an accident.

Medical services in this country are too exorbitant for older people to be able to afford, she said.

Karanja should step in to protect us from unscrupulous people," Kinyanjui said.

Karanja joined the rest of the world to mark the UN Day for Older Persons. Campaigners piled pressure on nation states to act on the day that is to blame for violation of rights of the senior citizens.

There is a driving force behind denial of older people's rights. The various forms of discrimination are prohibited by law, age discrimination is often not, including under the international human rights law," said HelpAge International CEO Justin Derbyshire.

Ambitious Ethiopia-Djibouti Electric Railway Becomes Fully Operational

ADDIS ABABA Ethiopia (Xinhua) -- African people cherish a dream that one day the capitals of all African countries will be linked by high-speed railways, Chairperson of African Union Commission Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma has said.

Perhaps, the African people have never come closer in their endeavor towards making the dream a reality.

On Wednesday, Africa's first modern electrified railway—the Ethiopia-Djibouti railway built by Chinese firms, is set to become fully operational.

With the inception of what has been hailed as the "Tazara railway in a new era", a new chapter will be turned over in Africa's railway history, while a new milestone will be set up in China-Africa traditional friendship.

During a visit to Ethiopia in May 2013, Chinese Vice Premier Wang Yang hailed the Ethiopia-Djibouti railway as the "Tazara railway in a new era."

In 1970s, China, where a thousand things still waited to be done, resolved to support the construction of the Tazara railway which links Tanzania's Dar es Salaam with Zambia's Kapiri Mposhi.

More than 50,000 Chinese railway workers worked for construction of the railway.

Among them, 64 Chinese experts made the ultimate sacrifice in a land far away from home.

But Tazara Railway has since become a symbol for China-Africa friendship which opened a new era of development for China-Africa friendly relations.

China has since put on top agenda its assistance to African countries in building infrastructures.

He who wants to get rich must first build roads.

This is one of the key lessons China has learned after realizing rapid economic development following decades of reform and opening up to the outside world.

China is willing to share the lesson with African countries so that they will get rid of the bottlenecks that have been holding back economic growth for centuries.

In recent years, Chinese President Xi Jinping put forward the new concept of "building nests to attract phoenix" and "teaching them how to fish" in China's cooperation with Africa. Chinese Premier Li Keqiang also proposed that China and Africa work together to develop the "Three Major Networks"—railway, road and regional aviation.

With sincerity and good faith, China is helping African countries to boost infrastructural construction, promote Africa's inter-connection and integration process and help Africa realize independent sustainable development.

It is against this historic backdrop that the Ethiopia-Djibouti railway, which links

Ethiopian capital Addis Ababa with the port of Djibouti, comes into being as an early fruitful result in China-Africa co-operation in building the Three Major Networks and driving industrialization.

Thus, the railway, following its predecessor Tazara Railway, has become another symbol for China-Africa friendship.

Built in 1970s, the Tazara Railway played a major role in the socioeconomic development of Tanzania and Zambia.

As the Ethiopia-Djibouti railway commences operations, it will avail landlocked Ethiopia a precious access to the sea, greatly improving its logistics capacity.

On the other hand, the small, resource-poor Djibouti will have a chance to realize its ambition to become a regional transport hub.

The railway's operation will also help boost economic growth along the railway, speed up urbanization, create jobs, improve people's living standards and promote socioeconomic sustainable development.

The Ethiopia-Djibouti is built with a complete set of Chinese standards and equipment.

During the process, a great number of Ethiopian and Djibouti technical and managerial personnel received systemic

training in Chinese railway technical knowhow, paving the way for the development of their own railways by the two countries themselves.

It is foreseeable that more and more African countries will improve their understanding of and finally accept the Chinese railway standards, pushing forward their own railway development, which in turn will speed up their industrialization process.

Besides, the Ethiopia-Djibouti railway is also expected to give impetus to the economic development of East Africa and even that of the whole Africa.

Interest Rate Capping Drives Kenyan Loan Sharks Out Of Business

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Sitting in his shop hosting some old electronic gadgets at a backstreet in Nairobi, Kenya's capital, Peter Mogaka looked pensively at the passing on the streets. He put his right hand on his chin, and after a few minutes stared at his mobile phone expecting a call to come in, but it did not.

Back, Mogaka's phone stopped ringing as people in the street called him seeking help.

He would then ask them a question that included the name of the shop he would hand him before they would go to the shop.

He included electronic goods, a TV, music system, car stereo and mobile phones, some of which were in his shop.

It is bad. It has now become difficult to find someone to buy from because people are wary. I have reduced my prices but things are not selling," he said Monday.

Other loan sharks in Mogaka's fortunes have suffered the worst ever since the

East African nation capped commercial bank's interest rates at 4 percentage points above Central Bank rate (currently 10 percent).

At 14 percent, commercial banks' lending charges have halved making them become the first point of call for citizens seeking cheaper loans.

The financial institutions have recorded a five-fold surge in personal loan applications ever since the law to cap interest rates came into effect last month.

The Kenya Commercial Bank (KCB), for instance, said last week that it lent out 63 million U.S. dollars in three weeks, mainly to individuals, casting away initial fears that the law would deter banks from lending to ordinary people, who are deemed high risk.

"We were issuing out 10 million

dollars a month in new personal loans in the old interest rate regime, but that has now risen to 63 million dollars in three weeks," said KCB chief executive Joshua Oigara.

Commercial banks have also reduced rates on mobile phone platforms to less than 2 percent a month based on the capped charges.

Similarly, the institutions have recorded a surge of loans on the platforms that initially had disrupted the loan sharks business.

With the new developments in the banking industry, many shylocks in the East African nation now stand no chance to get customers.

"The last time I went to a shylock, that is early last year, I lost my television set worth 247 dollars for a loan of 99 dollars which the loan

shark said it had more than doubled in two weeks. All I do now is to save some money in my mobile account to enable me borrow when I am in financial distress," said Peter Mutie, a primary school teacher in Nairobi.

And like many other employed people, Mutie applied for a bank loan of 1,980 dollars last week to take advantage of the low bank charges.

"I am still waiting for feedback and I am hopeful that it will be positive. I want to use the money to build a house," he said.

George Kiarie, a shylock in Kayole on the east of Nairobi, like Mogaka and many other loan sharks, is contemplating changing his business to shore up his fortunes.

"I have several electronic gadgets and furniture I was offered as

collateral by those I gave out my money and they failed to pay. I will sell them and get capital to start a new business. I am thinking of banking agency or selling cooking gas."

Analysts noted that shylocks stand little chance of survival under the current interest rates regime and advancement of banking technology.

"Consumers now have several options from where to borrow cash without many restrictions. They can borrow on mobile phone or from banks at low interest rates, so why should they go to shylocks?" said economic lecturer Henry Wandera, noting that most shylocks were operating illegally, with the banking law failing to reign on them but the changes in the sector would now eliminate them.

Kenya Wildlife Service Slate The Latest 'Livestock Invasion' In Protected Areas

NAIROBI (Kenya Wildlife Services) -- Kenya Wildlife Service (KWS) has noted with concern an upsurge of livestock incursion in protected areas in the last three months.

Increased number of livestock illegally entering parks and reserves for pasture has been noted in Tsavo East and Tsavo West national parks, Kora, Sibilo, Chyulu and Meru national parks and Marsabit national reserve.

To stem this incursion, KWS has mobilized her rangers for mop up operations in the affected parks and reserves with a view to bringing to book herders illegally grazing livestock in the protected areas.

Consequently 71 herders have been arrested and are being held in various police stations awaiting to be charged in courts of law for illegal entry into protected areas and introducing livestock.

They will also be charged for disturbing wildlife in their habitats against the provisions of the wildlife Act.

KWS is greatly concerned that livestock invasion into protected has led to pushing wildlife out of their habitats, and that livestock are diminishing pasture meant for wildlife.

This will not be condoned and the invaders are warned that KWS will enforce the respective law to the letter to protect wildlife and their habitats from destruction.

The Service is wary that bad

elements posing as herders may gain access to the protected areas and engage in poaching.

Members of the public are therefore warned that they will face the full force of the law once they are caught grazing livestock in the protected areas.

Kenya on Course to Host 2018 Africa Nations Championship!

(Xinhua) — Kenya has secured over 1 million dollars to renovate its stadiums ahead of the 2018 Africa Nations Championships, which the country will host.

Kenya Federation president, Nick Njiru said only one stadium in Nairobi is fit to stage international matches while three others will be required for the tournament, which brings in 16 teams.

It should be no cause

"The country is on course to host the 2018 African Nations Championships (CHAN)," said Mwendwa.

Confederation of African Football (CAF) will send in a team of inspectors to review the organizational progress.

The event will come a year after Kenya has hosted another international competition in Nairobi, the World U-18 Athletics Championships.

"The government is doing what it has to do in order to have the venues ready.

Alongside Nairobi, Mwendwa said the event will also have matches staged in Kisumu and Mombasa.

"The country has its infrastructure and all we need to do is just to renovate them to meet the required standards.

"These stadia only need to improve their playing infrastructure.

"We have taken a big risk and we must do our best to get it right," said Mwendwa.

Kenya was picked by CAF's Executive Committee to host the tournament in February, following what the body termed as receipt of necessary government guarantees and complete dossier, including the required infrastructure and security.

Physically challenged boys and girls will show how fast they run on crutches.

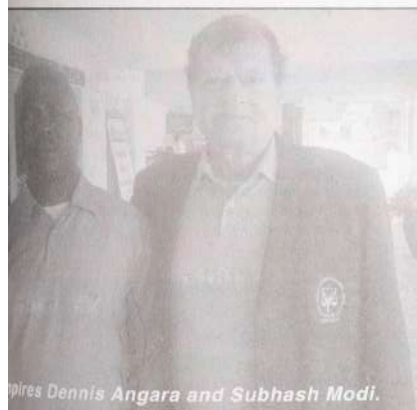
The hearing impaired children will show their ability and how the Intellectually Challenged young children will fill sand in bottles.

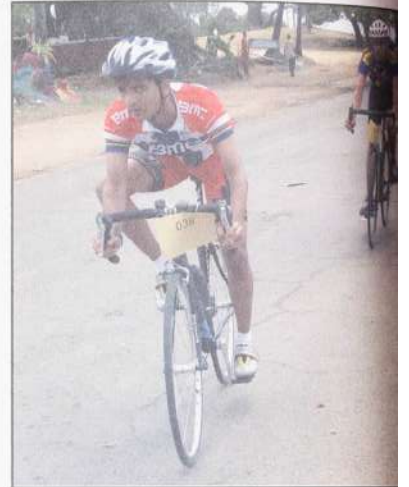
