## Submarine Cable Safe In Mombasa

**MOMBASA (Xinhua) -- The East Africa Submarine Systems - which has been troubled by controversy since its inception - finally landed safely in Mombasa on Monday.**

The West Indian Ocean Cable Company (WIOCC), the largest single investor in the East African Submarine System (EASSy), said the landing marked a major milestone in the construction of the new system which will deliver 1.4 Terabits per second (Tbps) of capacity along Africa's eastern seaboard.

## Released Korean Chemical Tanker Anchors In Kilindini

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** - A chemical tanker which was released by Somali pirates last week with its 28 crew members from the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) after holding the vessel for four months anchored in the Kenyan port of Mombasa on Saturday.

Andrew Mwangura, coordinator of the East Africa Seafarers Assistance Program (SAP) said the Kiribati flagged MV Theresa VIII was seized on November 16, 2009, about 618 nautical miles northwest of the Seychelles.

"Security officials are expected to visit the crew members in the next 24 hours for debriefing," Mwangura told Xinhua by telephone from Mombasa.

He said the remaining deceased master of the vessel was expected to be flown to the DPRK as soon as the vessel "docks at berth number 9 or number 10 to discharge palm oil."

He said the Singaporean-operated chemical tanker was seized in the south of the Horn of African nation which has been without an effective central government for more than two decades.

"The 22,294 dwt tanker has a crew of now only 28, since the captain of the tanker was reported died from gunshot wounds sustained during the hijack," Mwangura said.

"Information indicates that the exact content of the cargo is palm oil.

A conflict developed two weeks ago among pirates on board and their masterminds on land."

The Horn of Africa nation's coastline is considered one of the world's most dangerous stretches of water because of piracy.

## HORTICULTURE EARNINGS DOWN AMID DROUGHT, FALLING DEMAND

**NAIROBI (Xinhua)** - Kenya's foreign exchange earnings from horticulture dropped 2.8 percent from 2008 to 71.6 billion shillings (about 929.9 million U.S. dollars) last year due to drought and a drop in market demand.

Fresh Produce Exporters Association of Kenya Chief Executive Stephen Mbithi attributed the produce for export fell due to drought and a drop in market demand for some products due to recession in Europe, Kenya's main market.

Despite the drop in earnings, horticulture remains the highest foreign exchange earner ahead of tea and tourism.

Flowers accounted for 51.8 percent of the value of exports in 2009 with fruits and vegetables comprising 48.2 percent.

**FROM FRONT PAGE** serving the country and is likely to rekindle lobbying for lower internet connection charges.

In December, WIOCC had anticipated the landing of the 1.4 terabyte per second cable to be in June 2010.

Kenya's Information Communications Minister Samuel Poghiso said the cable system was expected to raise the bandwidth capacity although activation and utilization of the first two cables (SEACOM and TEAMS) had not been fully implemented.

He said Kenyans were yet to fully utilize the opportunities presented by the landing of the sea cables.

"The East African Marine sys-

tem called TEAMS cable and another called SEACOM are now actively serving the East African region to access international network.

"We must use technology to keep up and aim to prove our professional standards," he said.

The minister also said the new technology brought challenges to both the East African governments and the media.

"Because with this technology we are playing catch up and the media must therefore be in the forefront of training their personnel to use these technologies so that we can also catch up with development.

"We do not sacrifice our own economic development at the altar of expediency in reporting and business," he said.

It will, however, take two months for the costs to drastically reduce to match those offered in other parts of the world.

Wood said although Eassy cable had the lowest cost structure at 260 million US dollars which could give it a competitive edge, it will take a while before charges are drastically cut.

Wood said cable vandalism partly contributed to high connection charges in Kenya.

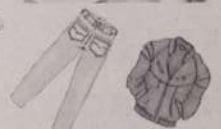

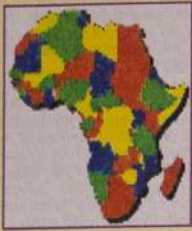

Using the machine, the Engine Rebuild Centre staff measure the delivery of power under load and the engine fuel consumption.

While testing an electronic engine they plug a laptop computer into the engine's system which gives performance data.

In the case of older mechanical engines a print out is taken from the dynamometer gauges.

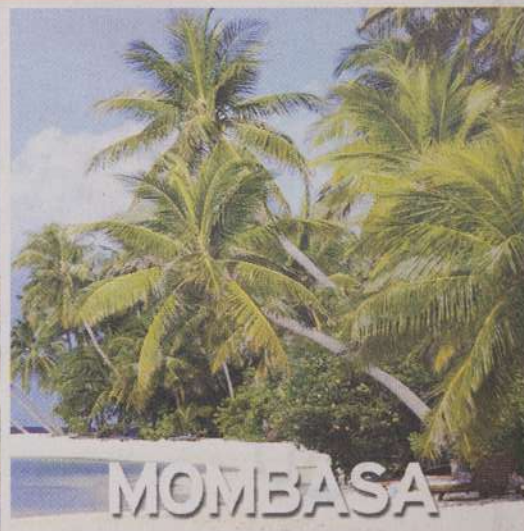
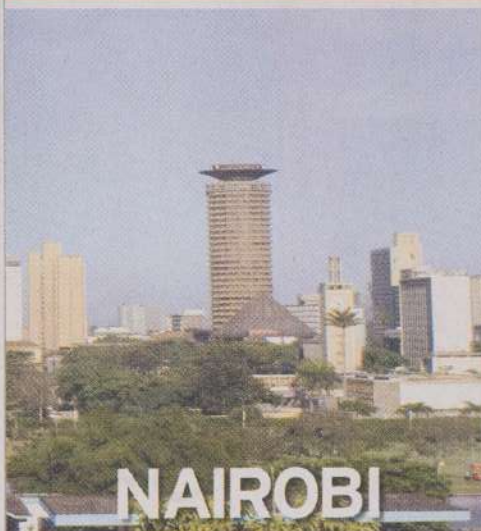

# Kenya Charges 11 Somali Pirates With 'Illegal Entry'

**MOMBASA (Xinhua) -- Kenya charged 11 Somalis arrested in the Kenyan waters on the Kenyan coastal town of Lamu on suspicion of piracy with a misdemeanor of being in the country illegally on Monday.**

The pirates who were arrested on Sunday pleaded guilty to a charge of being in the country illegally and each ordered to pay a 20,000 shillings (266 U.S. dollars) fine or face a jail term of three months in default.

Resident Magistrate M.K Mwangi

directed that the suspects be repatriated back to their country after compliance.

The suspects who were unrepresented, were in tattered cloths and looked haggard, as the charges were read and translated to them in Somalia language by a court interpreter.

They were charged with being found "unlawfully present in Kenya without any lawful authority" on March 20 at around 2:30 p.m. in Lamu district being Somali nationals.

Prosecutor Obed Ndubi told the court the charge was as it stated and did not add any facts, moments after which the magistrate passed his sentence on the suspects' admission.

This was the first time that Kenyan police arrested suspected pirates in Kenyan waters.

The team was led by the area boss Augustine Kimantera and criminal investigations commander Joseph Owiti, officers from the and other security departments.

According to sources, the suspects ran out of fuel while in the area and hijacked the fishing vessel, commanding the crew to take them to Somalia taking them as hostages.

One of the crew members made leading to police intervention.

The Provincial Criminal Investigation Officer Nyagah Reche confirmed the suspects will be interrogated by anti-terror police unit before being charged.

A source said when the suspects realized police were within the area they threw away their ammunition and skiffs to erase any evidence that would link them to piracy.

Currently the Kenyan courts have 100 suspected pirates facing charges with one group of seven serving a year jail term after an appeal filed in 2006 challenging the sentence flopped.

Last week, the second group sentenced to 20 years in prison at Mombasa court after being found guilty of piracy.

All the groups were arrested in the Indian Ocean and Gulf of عدن by the United States, French and German Navies.

## Somali Pirates Hijack Kenyan Fishing Boat

**NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Somali pirates have hijacked a Kenyan-flagged fishing vessel with 16 crew members onboard in the Indian Ocean off Somalia, a regional maritime official said on Tuesday.**

Andrew Mwangura, the East Africa Coordinator of Seafarers Assistance Program (SAP) said the Sakoba was taken last week but he received information on Tuesday.

"The fishing vessel was hijacked last week but we received information on Tuesday.

"It's not clear when the vessel remain seized but it seemed it was in the Kenyan waters," Mwangura told Xinhua by telephone from Mombasa.

He said the vessel has 10 Kenyans, a Spanish captain, a

Polish chief engineer, a Senegalese, a Namibian and a citizen of Cape Verde.

Reports said the ship was registered in Spain three days ago.

However, a statement from the European Union said the Kenyan-flagged fishing vessel was hijacked 400 nautical miles (740 km) east of Dar Es Salaam.

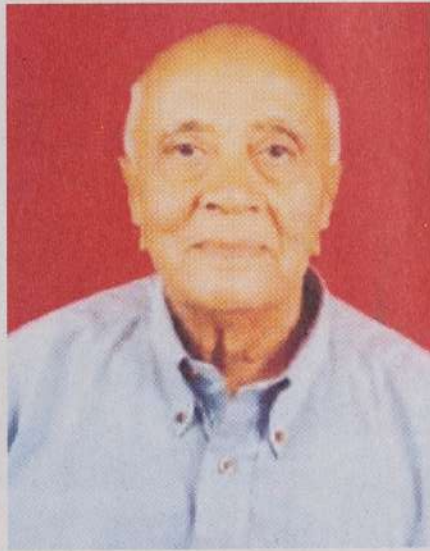
"The Sakoba is heading towards (the Somali coastal village of) Haradere and Navfor is continuing to monitor the situation," the statement said.

Hijackings off East Africa are a cause of growing international concern, spurring a number of international navies to patrol the pirate-ravaged Gulf of Aden.

Hundreds of other vessels remain hostage aboard the ships in the Gulf of Aden and surrounding seas.

An estimated 25,000 people annually cruise the Gulf of Aden off Somalia's northern coast.

These are Shaan Vora, Karan Kaghram, Urvi Dayal, Katie white, Njau Njuguna, Oliver Holdingfay, Payal Sadrani and Rohin Kanji. Accompanying them is the school's assistant coach Ramadhan Vyombo who will be the assistant coach under Coach Malik Abdulkarim.

This is a great achievement.

# TIGER WOODS SET TO RETURN FOR U.S. GOLF MASTERS

NEW YORK, (Xinhua) — Tiger Woods will come back to golf competition in April at the U.S. golf Masters, the world's top golfer said on Tuesday after staying away for nearly five months over a sex scandal.

In a statement on his website, Woods said he would return to the sport he has long dominated at famed Augusta National Golf Club at the year's first major championship, which begins April 8.

Woods has won four times at Augusta National, including his first major title in 1997, the first major crown ever taken by a black golfer.

"After a long and necessary time away from the game, I feel like I'm ready to start my season at Augusta," Woods said on the website.

"The Masters is where I won my first major and

I view this tournament with great respect."

Woods has not played in a tournament since winning the Australian Masters on November 15.

Twelve days after that triumph came a car crash near his home that touched off a global scandal which led to his admission of adultery and put his golf career on hold while he fought his own personal demons.

"I have undergone almost two months of inpatient therapy and I am continuing my treatment," Woods said. "Although I'm returning to competition, I still have a lot of work to do in my personal life."

Woods decided against playing in a tune-up event to prepare himself for the challenges he will face on and off the Georgia course in three weeks time.

"The major championships have always been a special focus in my career and, as a professional,

I think Augusta is where I need to be, even though it's been a while since I last played," Woods said.

Other possible comeback events for Woods would have been the Arnold Palmer Invitational and Tavistock Cup two-day exhibition event, both next week at Orlando, Florida, near his home.


"When I finally got into a position to think about competitive golf again, it became apparent to me that the Masters would be the earliest I could play," Woods said.

"I called both Joe Lewis and Arnold Palmer and expressed my regrets for not attending the Tavistock Cup and the Arnold Palmer Invitational. Those are fantastic tournaments and I look forward to competing in them again."

"I have deep appreciation for everything that they do to create a wonderful event for the benefit of the game," Woods said.

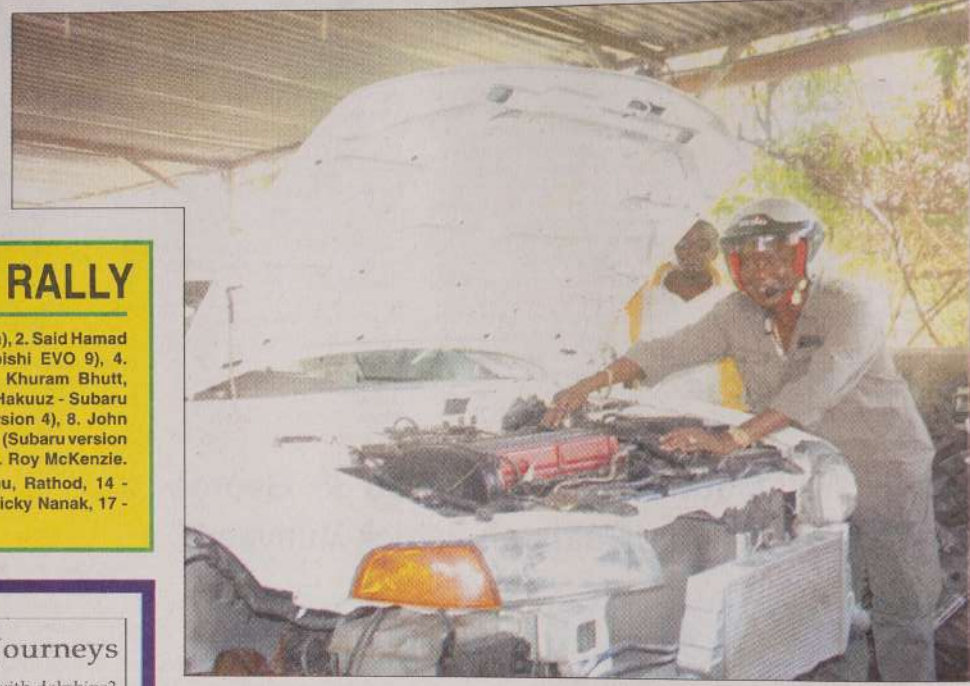
