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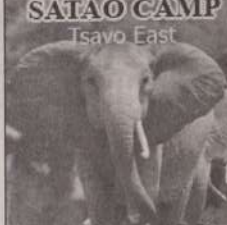

This will pave way for actual construction works for the new terminal, west of Kipevu at a total cost of Kshs. 16 Billion.

The project which on completion will make Mombasa a hub port is being financed through bilateral soft loans from the Japan International Co-operation Agency (JICA).

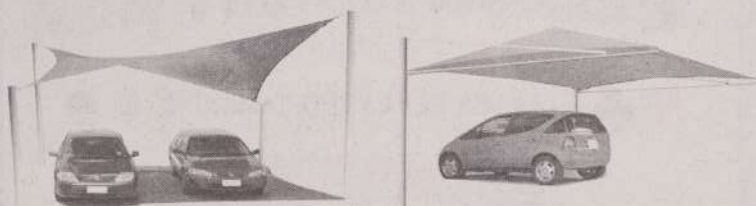
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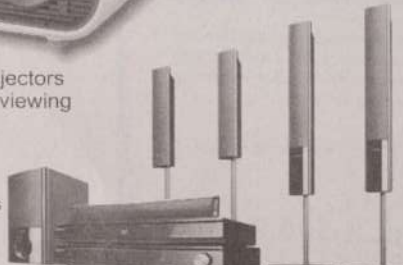
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Rangers Of Sarova Taita Hills Sanctuary Arrest A Poacher

Black Rhinos To Be Marked

Kenya Wildlife Service scientists will mark the ears of black rhinos and fit them with tracking gadgets.

The operation, supported by the Narok County Council and the Frankfurt Zoological Society, will take place from the 7th to 12th June 2010 at the Maasai Mara National Reserve.

The exercise, estimated to cost Sh3 million, will be pivotal in tracking and monitoring the rhino movements between the Maasai Mara and Serengeti National Reserves.

The annual exercise, conducted on a rotational basis between the 14 rhino sanctuaries countrywide, has not only been successful but has also seen the sudden increase in black rhino populations over the years.

Conservationists believe the initiative will go a long way in increasing the population of the black rhinos.

The black rhino population stood at 635 last year despite the rising incidents of poaching which pose a major challenge to conservationists.

Particleboard From Sustainable Forests

PG Bison Kenya commenced business in Nairobi eight years ago to distribute interior building materials manufactured in South Africa, Europe and Asia.

FROM FRONT PAGE capacity will have its first phase fully operational by 2013 and will handle 450,000 TEUs.

Kenya Ports Authority has witnessed increased growth in container traffic over the years

hence the need to establish a second facility to meet the demand.

In 2009, the port handled a record 618,816 TEUs.

The new facility will be operated by a private concessionaire hence brings about competition.

This will enhance efficiency and effectiveness in service delivery at the port of Mombasa.

The main container terminal handling equipment such as ship-to-shore gantry cranes and rubber tyred gantry cranes among others will be provided by the Japanese as part of the loan agreement.

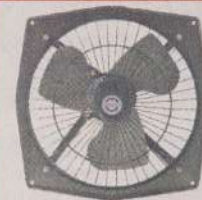
Other facilities in the project include the extension of the rail line that currently serves the Mombasa container terminal, building of a new access road and installation of new buoys and markers in the maritime access channels.

To cope with the continuing container growth before the second terminal enters service, Kenya Ports Authority also plans to upgrade and convert berths 11-14 to another container terminal and offer it on a concessionary basis to a private operator.

Currently, ships use their own gear to load and offload containers.

This additional capacity will help to attract transshipment traffic and target to act as a feeder point for Seychelles, Mauritius, Madagascar and Zanzibar.

At the same time, an additional berth 19 will be constructed at the main container terminal to handle container vessels. KPA is in the tendering stage to dredge the channel and widen the turning basin to allow the latest generation of container ships.

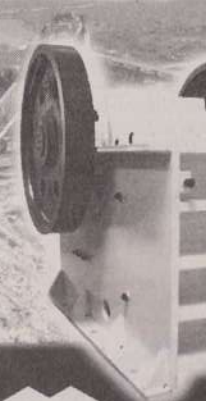
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THIRTY ONE YEARS AGO

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Rescue And Safe Recovery Of Tsavo Lion Cub 'Shaka'

ought this would be an interesting story for Coastweek readers, its small change from a wildlife photos to a safari adventure.

During my photography safari in the month at Ngutuni sanctuary, I came across a four month old cub that was injured and had a degeneration of the limb.

I was concerned for the cub and when it was abandoned by its mother and pride, and tired of waiting about all the lion deaths in Kenya every week, I got into the lion and started making calls to Kenya Wildlife Service officials to do something about it.

After a few hours, they called in a resident vet and the KWS site manager to monitor the cub.

During the weekend, logistics were very difficult but I managed to get some action happening.

At the same time, I was posting updates on 'Shaka' the injured lion cub from my BlackBerry onto Facebook, and it quickly generated a lot of interest and soon enough, people in Kenya and across the world were writing and sharing contacts for me for people they knew who could help with the rescue.

It was amazing how people came together at a time of need for the protection of our wildlife.

'Shaka' was monitored by KWS for four days after I found him. Finally, when it was confirmed that he was definitely abandoned by his pride, a plane brought him from Nairobi with a capture team to dart and rescue

he was then flown to the Nairobi National Orphanage where he is receiving care.



Our aim is for his full recovery and hopefully reintegration into the wild.

Emirates To Launch Nairobi-Prague Route

Kenya exports to the Czech Republic include tea, jute, and vegetable, among others.

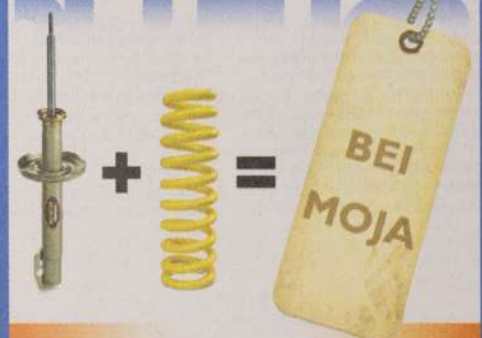

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THAT PAINLESS SWELLING ON YOUR BODY SHOULD BE CHECKED

A swelling in the neck, armpit, or groin, or unexplained growth in the arm, or leg should prompt one to seek medical attention. Such swellings may be indicators of a serious disease known as lymphoma.

This was the message passed on to the public during a free talk on lymphoma and leukaemia at the Aga Khan University Hospital, Nairobi (AKUH,N).

Explaining lymphoma and how it develops in the body, Professor Malikit Riyat, a Haemato-Oncologist of AKUH,N said:

"Lymphoma is a type of cancer that begins in the lymphatic cells of the immune system and presents as a solid tumor of lymphoid cells.

"It is treatable with chemotherapy and in some cases radiotherapy, or bone marrow transplantation.

"Lymphoma is also curable depending on the histology, type and stage of the disease and can affect anybody regardless of their age."

"The lymphatic system is part of the immune system which consists of a network of vessels that carry a fluid called lymph.

"White blood cells called lymphocytes are contained in the lymph and they attack a variety of infectious agents as well as many cells in the pre-cancerous stages of development."

"Lymph nodes are small co-

lections of lymph tissue that occur throughout the body that filter the lymph, which may carry bacteria, viruses, or other microbes.

"At infection sites, large numbers of these microbial organisms collect in the regional lymph nodes and produce the swelling and tenderness typical of a localized infection often referred to as 'swollen glands.'

"In some areas of the body (such as the front part of the neck) they are often visible when swollen.

"Lymphocytes recognize infectious organisms and abnormal cells and destroy them.

The two major subtypes of lymphocytes known as the B cells and T cells produce antibodies (proteins that circulate through the blood and lymph and attach to infectious organisms and abnormal cells).

"Antibodies alert other cells of the immune system to recognize and destroy these intruders (pathogens)."

"T cells, when activated, can kill pathogens directly.

Choice Of Fuel Pump Sign Is A Strange One

Kachumbari travelled out of the country recently and had the occasion to drive in several countries in Africa, Europe as well as the Middle and Far East.

He had to do the usual adjustment of driving on different sides of the road as well as having to remember which jurisdiction he was driving in and the way the 'Highway Code' that was fashioned in that jurisdiction.

It brought to my mind the potential issues that long distance truck drivers have to cope with.

Typical journeys for these drivers in any continent other than

in North America always involves crossing many borders and having to cope with driving on different sides of the road, different requirements in respect of driving law as well as the varying driving etiquette and habits.

I have written extensively in earlier issues about the multiplicity of highway codes in the world and the need to start a movement aimed at creating a universal one that will apply to all countries.

It should not take much to do as the objectives of all such codes is the same.

They all aim to put some order in the way that we use the roads and also ensure that common courtesy and safety are at the

top of drivers' minds.

Bar a few quirks that exist in some countries the Highway Code is all but international.

Car manufacturers have been at the forefront of making driving



rules get closer to standardisation.

The configuration of the gearbox, the locations of various controls, the universality of the driving pedals - all these are industry generated standards or norms.

There are still areas where there are differences that make cars unique.

Car shapes are also rapidly converging especially in the low cost car area as science takes over from art in design.

One of the key areas where there is still large differences is in the layout of the dashboard but even here, there is gradual convergence emerging.

The positioning and style of the various gauges is still very much open architecture.

The vehicle and engine speed indicators occupy different positions on different cars.

Some have certain gauges whereas others do not have them.

We have analogue gauges and electronic ones that still mimic the original analogue displays.

More and more are going fully electronic such that some of the dashboard displays of high end vehicles are beginning to resemble aeroplane cockpits.

The reason for going into all this is that Kachumbari came across an emerging sign that most people still do not know the meaning of.

In an increasing number of vehicles, the manufacturers are putting a small petrol pump sign next to the fuel gauge on the dashboards.

Some have arrows and others do not have arrows.

The pump handles on the sign are also pointing in different directions.

So what do these small pump signs mean?

They are actually intended to indicate which side of the car the fuel filler cap is.

The choice of a fuel pump as a sign is a strange one. Could the vehicle manufacturers or the makers of the instruments and components that go into the dashboard not have come up with a less confusing way of telling the driver which side the fuel filler cap is on?

JOHANNESBURG (Xinhua) — South Africa's national soccer team Bafana Bafana, preparing to host the FIFA World Cup next month, beat Guatemala side 5-0 in a World Cup warm up on Monday night.

Katlego Mphela scored two penalties. Other scorers were Rerelwe Letsholonyane Letsholonyane, Surprise Moriri, and Bernard Parker.

Beck Ruled Out Of Germany's Squad

BERLIN (Xinhua) — German head coach Joachim Loew has left Hoffenheim defender Andreas Beck out of his final squad for the World Cup in South Africa, the German football federation DFB said.

"That's is of course disappointing for Andreas. He gave everything at the training camp. He always acted fair and correct, but we have enough defensive alternatives," said Loew.

Ronaldo Expected To Head Portugal

LISBON (Xinhua) — Cristiano Ronaldo will be the most heavyweight player in the Portuguese squad for the World Cup in South Africa, though coach Carlos Queiroz has yet to finalize his line-up.

Ronaldo's Real Madrid teammate Pepe should also be included in the squad after the Spanish club's medical staff gave him a nod to play following a long lay-off since the center back twisted his right knee last December.

No Terror Threat To World Cup Game, FIFA Promises

JOHANNESBURG (Xinhua) — There will be no terrorist attack on the FIFA World Cup game between the U.S. and England in the South African city of Rustenburg on June 12, FIFA said.

There have been several reports in South African media on recent weeks about possible terror attack on the FIFA World Cup in South Africa from June 11 to July 11.

The reports have been denied by South African police minister Nathi Mthethwa and state security minister Siyabonga Cwele.

Ghanaian Fans Give Up Trip To S. Africa For Security Concern

ACCRA (Xinhua) — For fear of attacks by gunmen, abductors and kidnapers at the Angolan enclave of Kabinda, scores of Ghanaian soccer fans gave up their plan to a torturous journey from West Africa to South Africa to support Ghana at the World Cup, the organizer announced.

The decision was taken on the advice of security experts who said the Kabinda province of Angola, a war zone which was an unavoidable part of the route to South Africa, posed a great threat to the lives and safety of the supporters, said the president of the Ghanaian Supporters Union, Abraham Boakye.

Last January, the Togo's national football team, on their way to the African Cup of Nations in Angola, was attacked by gunmen at Kabinda, leaving two players dead and six others injured, though the team had an Angolan military escort.

In an interview with Xinhua, Boakye said the security team, which had planned to accompany them on the trip, had gathered intelligence reports, indicating that the Ghanaian contingent would not be a welcomed idea in the oil rich war torn enclave of Kabinda.

"Besides, the rebels at Kabinda may want to kidnap or abduct our supporters to use them as ransom for demands from the international community and to

advance their own course," he added.

Boakye and the members of the Ghana Supporters Union were quite distressed about the cancellation of the trip.

"In fact I didn't know what to do

JOHANNESBURG (Xinhua) — South Africa's all-time leading goal scorer Benni McCarthy said on Tuesday although he was disappointed with his exclusion from the final South African squad to play in the FIFA World Cup, he was still part of the team.

McCarthy, aged 32, who has scored 32 goals for South Africa, was excluded when coach Calro Alberto Parreira on Tuesday named the 23 players who will represent South Africa as hosts in the World Cup which kicks off on June 11.

He issued a statement to the South African Press Association (SAPA) saying all the players who made the South African national call-up should be proud.

Zambia Not To Supply Power For World Cup

LUSAKA (Xinhua) — Zambia's power utility firm will not supply power to South Africa during the World Cup because the country was also in need of electricity due to increased power demands, a senior company official said.

South Africa's power utility firm Eskom has already applied to Zambia's power utility Zesco to consider supplementing power during the World Cup which starts on June 11.

But Zesco acting Customer Service Director Monica Chisela said at a press briefing that although Zambia, as a member of the Southern African Power Pool, was obliged to support Eskom during the World Cup, the power utility firm will only be able to do this "when it is necessary to do so."

She further said the power utility firm will only be able to supply power to Eskom during off-peak hours and when it was necessary.

According to the official, Zambia was also in dire need of power, especially during this time of the year when the weather was becoming cold and in which customers will need increased use of power.

Zambia generates 1, 400 megawatts of electricity and consumes about 800 megawatts during the day and this goes to 1, 500 at peak periods in the evening.

Brazil is so far the biggest team in the history of Zimbabwean football to play in the country, and many locals will put aside their woes of persistent failure to qualify for the world soccer.

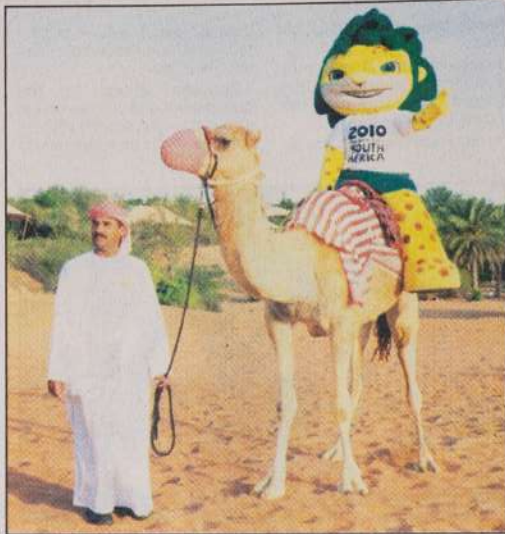
FIFA World Cup Mascot Enjoys Filled Tour Of Dubai with 'Emirates'

WORLD CUP FEVER HELPS BOOSTS TELEVISION SALES IN BANGLADESH

DHAKA (Xinhua) - The sales of televisions increased in Bangladesh ahead of the FIFA World Cup 2010 which begins June 11 in South Africa.

The electronic retailers see the World Cup tournament as a unique opportunity to raise their sales as more customers will purchase televisions to watch the upcoming sporting extravaganza.

Muhammad A Manhan, senior manager of the M K Electronic store, told Xinhua that more customers are showing their interest in buying a new or a better television due to the World Cup.

"For the World Cup, our LCD television selling is going up. And we are expecting to sell more when the World Cup starts," he said.

Manhan said they usually sold four to six televisions everyday, but now, the number increased to 7 to 10.

He said people can only watch the World Cup matches once in every four years, so the customers are focusing on bigger and high-quality televisions like LCD, Plasma and LED

televisions although they are very expensive.

The senior manager said that their store has launched a promotion campaign to boost the sales of televisions ahead of World Cup.

Consumers can get special discounts ranging between 300 taka (4.29 U.S. dollars) and 100,000 taka (1429 U.S. dollars) depend on the size and brand of the televisions.

Murad Khan, a businessman who was selecting LCD television in the store, told Xinhua that he is a big football fan, so he plans to buy a high-quality television to better enjoy the world's premier soccer event.

He said: "World Cup is ahead to us. Bangladesh is in World Cup fever."

"That's why I am here."

Anwarul Islam, manager of Butterfly Electronic company, said their sales of televisions have nearly doubled ahead of World Cup.

He added that the sales would peak during the first week of June when most middle income people will start buying.

Construction Work Expected Soon On Lamu Port

ALSO ON RAILWAYS FROM LAMU THROUGH ISIOLO TO JUBA AND LAMU THROUGH ISIOLO TO MOYALE

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Kenyan President Mwai Kibaki on Tuesday vowed to continue championing economic reforms, expressing optimism the country will attain between 4.5 percent and 5 percent growth this year.

Addressing the nation during celebrations to mark 47th self-independence day in Nairobi, Kibaki said the government was giving priority to the opening up of the second development corridor in Northern Kenya.

Kibaki emphasized that the opening up of Northern Kenya would develop strong trade and investment relations with the neighbors.

He said the government has already awarded contracts to undertake feasibility studies for Lamu port, the railways from Lamu through Isiolo to Juba and Lamu through Isiolo to Moyale.

"The construction of these infrastructure facilities will begin soon.

"We have also tendered for the

Standard Gauge Railway from Mombasa to Malaba, and will also put in place a much improved Nairobi commuter rail service," the president said.

The President at the same time said the developments together with the significant investments made in the expansion of roads, electricity generation, water supply systems, telecommunications, and airports, are clear indications that the country is preparing for the sustained employment creation and development expected under Vision 2030.

President Kibaki noted with appreciation that the tourism industry has bounced back due to intensive joint marketing by the government and other industry players.

Meanwhile it was reported from Nairobi that Kenya's inflation rises to 3.9 per cent in May.

Kenya's month-on-month overall inflation rate rose to 3.9 per cent in May from 3.7 per cent in April due to falls in food prices, the country's statistics bureau said on Tuesday.

The Kenya National Bureau of Statistics (KNBS) said food and non alcoholic beverages' index which accounts for 36.04 percent

of all the weight in the new Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased by 0.4 percentage points from 107.6 points in April to 108.1 points in May.

"However, during the same period, housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuel index dropped by 0.6 percent mainly as a result of fall in the price of electricity," The bureau said in a statement.

The bureau said the drop in electricity prices was caused by significant drops in the fuel cost and foreign exchange adjustment levies.

Kenya switched to the new calculation method in October last year which is in line with best practice as recommended by the International Labour Organization and which has been hailed as a true reflection of the current cost of living in the country.

The East African nation had been using the arithmetic means, which was widely criticized, with many arguing it had an upward bias to the computed index.

For example, the basket of goods and services consumed by households has also remained unchanged over the years and has been viewed as being vulnerable to erratic price

movements in the market. The data is generated from 13 urban centers in the country and it is believed to be a reflection of the spending behavior among Kenyans.

It is collected in the second and third weeks of the month under review in order to maintain consistency in price variations.

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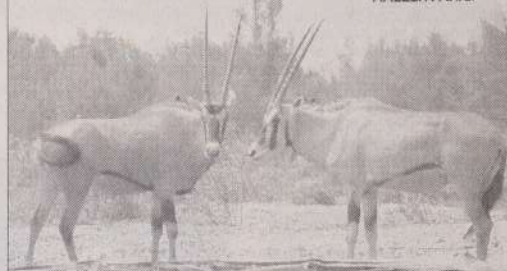
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Katherine Mary Trood was born on a tea estate in a remote part of India near to the Tibetan border "where our customary method of reaching the nearest station was to mount an ancient and docile lady elephant".

Through the machinations of her aunt she became engaged to a young doctor working in Dar es Salaam and in 1926, young and naïve, full of hope and excitement, she embarked on the S.S. Morvada with a large number of wedding presents to join her fiancé.

Getting cold feet about the looming marriage she disembarked at Mombasa with Charles Fannin, an older married man she had met on board ship, deciding to keep her large cargo of wedding gifts; Charles later being dispatched to Dar es Salaam to explain the situation to the hapless fiancé.

The early chapters describe in delightful detail Katherine's life in Mombasa and Nairobi, where she went to live and work to avert a scandal for her and Charles, until 1929 when they were married.

Mombasa Memoir: The Fannin Papers

Friends of Fort Jesus current chairman Marlene Reid reviews a new book by Judy Aldrick on a colourful and long time Mombasa resident, the late Katherine Fannin. This is a unique and invaluable record of the times with numerous and fascinating descriptions of Malindi, Mombasa Old Town, Dar es Salaam, Zanzibar and Tanga

settlers of whom there were quite a few and helped to found an Almshouse (mostly by badgering officials and the wealthy) in Majengo, for destitute elderly Africans who since the end of the slave trade had ceased to be under the patronage of their owners and were living on the streets.

She was also instrumental in founding the K.S.P.C.A.

Among the many books she had brought with her from

brilliant dress of gleaming silver lame and was indeed indefatigable throughout the evening".

In addition to all her committee work Katherine was learning Italian, German and Spanish.

She already spoke French and Swahili.

Abyssinia (now Ethiopia) was at this time occupied by the Italians and in 1938 very little was known about what was going on there and with the threat of war in the air the British administration was anxious to find out.

At this time Katherine wanted to return to England.

A previous request to return through Abyssinia had been refused as a preposterous idea but suddenly it became possible as Katherine seemed just the right person and all the previous obstacles suddenly disappeared.

"Capable and energetic, with a talent for languages and a knowledge of surveys and maps she seemed just the right candidate for some fast footwork in the field of intelligence".

"Katherine Fannin 'the spy' was born".

Eighteen days driving though Italian Somaliland, Abyssinia and Eritrea on her way to England and her return trip in February 1939 (when the Italians and the British were keen to form an alliance against Germany) as an unofficial spy for the British and propaganda for the Italians, was in Katherine's words "The adventure of a lifetime".

Armed with an expensive cine camera she managed to photograph places of 'interest', taking stock of military installations and equipment, carrying her Henry Salt book (now claiming him as a relative) asking all the important people and officials to sign the book which acted as an aide to her memory as to who she met, where.

She dare not write anything down but could only rely on her excellent memory.

On arrival in Britain she went to her Barclays Bank, requested a typewriter and typed out all her information before presenting it to the Foreign Office.

The Italians had made a very favourable impression on her, which did not please the British officials who made snide remarks about her subjectivity to Italian flattery.

Katherine felt and no doubt voiced the opinion that the occupied lands were well organised, well managed and were being well developed and was particularly admiring of their splendid road network - something even then lacking in Kenya!

Alleged 'atrocities' she refused to believe.

No doubt she was kept well away from any place where she might have witnessed them with one exception when she witnessed a savage beating.

The chapters covering these travels include a well researched history of the political situation prevailing in Abyssinia.

"resounding success".

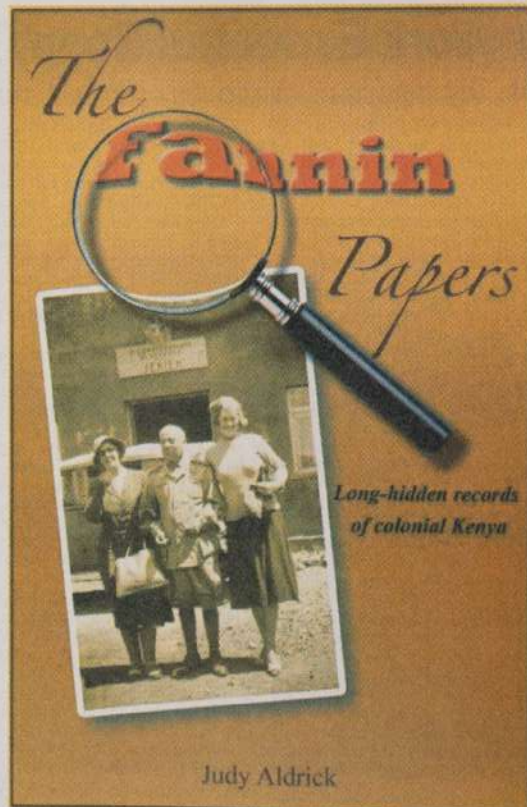
Armies had travelled along the routes she had taken with the assistance of her maps and photographs subduing the Italians as they went putting an end to Italian East Africa.

She was particularly vocal on what should be done in Ethiopia and Somalia, strongly advocating a return to Italian rule which she considered had been exemplary, writing letters to the *Times* to express her views.

Needless to say her voice was not heard.

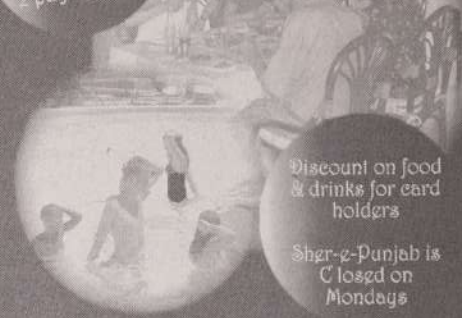

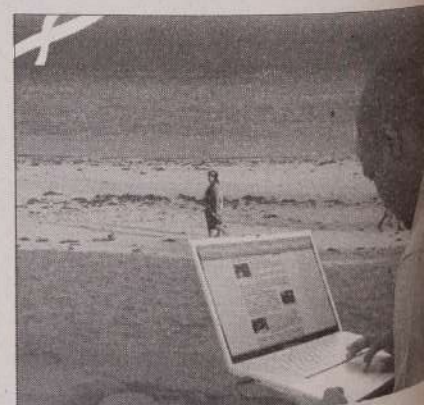
