Indian Navy Ships Visiting Mombasa

Part of Indian navy's overseas deployment in the Gulf of Aden and East Africa, the Indian navy ships *INS Ganga* and *INS Aditya* will call at the Kilindini port on a goodwill visit from Monday, August 23 through to Thursday, August 26, 2010. *INS Ganga*, a Godavari class Frigate, was designed entirely by the Indian Navy's Shipbuilding and Docking organization and was built by the Mazagon Docks Limited, Mumbai. *INS Aditya* is the first indigenously designed Fast Combat Logistic Ship of its class, and was built by the Garden Reach Ship Builders and Engineers Limited at Kolkata.




Indian navy ships regularly pay visits to ports in Arabian Sea, Red sea and Indian Ocean, reaffirming their presence and solidarity for peace with countries in the region. The commitment of India to honour friendship and promote stability among maritime neighbours was tested many times in the past. After the 2004 Indian Ocean earthquake, Indian navy ships were the first to reach Maldives, Sri Lanka and Indonesia to start large scale rescue and relief.

Indian Navy Ships Visiting Mombasa

FROM FRONT PAGE operations within 12 hours from the time of the tsunami.

During the 2006 Israel-Lebanon conflict, the Indian navy evacuated 2,286 Indian nationals, 436 Sri Lankan and 69 Nepali citizens.

The Indian navy is engaged in anti-piracy operations as well. A co-ordinated effort by the Indian

navy and the Indian Coast Guards led to the release of Japanese cargo ship MV Alondra Rainbow. Another warship named *INS Tabar* had to use force to prevent attempts to hijack two cargo ships and in the process destroyed a hijacked 'mother ship' of the pirates.

Subsequently 23 pirates were arrested by the Indian Navy while attempting to hijack another merchant ship.

On a request made by the Seychelles government, the Indian navy conducted anti-piracy patrols and arrested nine pirates.

On December 7, 2009, the Indian navy successfully repulsed a pirate attack on a US owned tanker in the Gulf of Aden. By June 2010, Indian navy had escorted about 1,000 ships of 50 nations in the Gulf of Aden.

Lots Of Action This Week

THE HOLIDAY season is well and truly here at the NYALI CINEMAX where you can see a whopping four new films this week.

Director Jon Turteltaub (*National Treasure 1 and 2*) brings back his favourite hero Nicholas Cage with Jay Baruchel, Alfred Molina and Monica Bellucci in a science fiction, fantasy, adventure comedy, *The Sorcerer's Apprentice*.

Cage plays a magician, Balthazar Blake, who is trying very hard to save the city of Manhattan from the evil Maxim Horvath.

Set in the current time, Blake's powers have diminished somewhat and he realises that if he does not get some help very soon, the city is doomed.

He finds an unlikely and reluctant aide in college student Dave Stutler.

Not only does Stutler have to learn the tricks of the trade, he is put on a crash-course before Horvath can muster up enough strength to strike the deadly blow.

These four characters are recreated on the big screen by director Joe Carnahan and producers Ridley Scott, Marc Silvestri, Ross Taylor Fanger and the original creator of the series, Stephen J. Cannell.

The new star cast includes Corey Burton, Liam Neeson, Bradley Cooper, Quinton 'Rampage' Jackson and Jessica Biel.

The original theme of the story remains intact in that four Vietnam war veterans, wrongfully convicted of armed robbery, escape from military prison and join together to become mercenaries.

Mind you, not the usual mercenaries but the Robin Hood kind, who help all those in need, yet always staying one step ahead of the authorities and continued incarceration.

In this new version, Vietnam has been changed to the Middle East, and a load of special effects and computer tricks add flavour to the film.

Pradeep Sarkar's *Parineeta* and *Laaga Chunari Mein Daag* may not have been box

office hits, but they honed in on social issues that not many like to talk about.

My personal opinion on the two films is very different from the aam junta and I really enjoyed both of them.

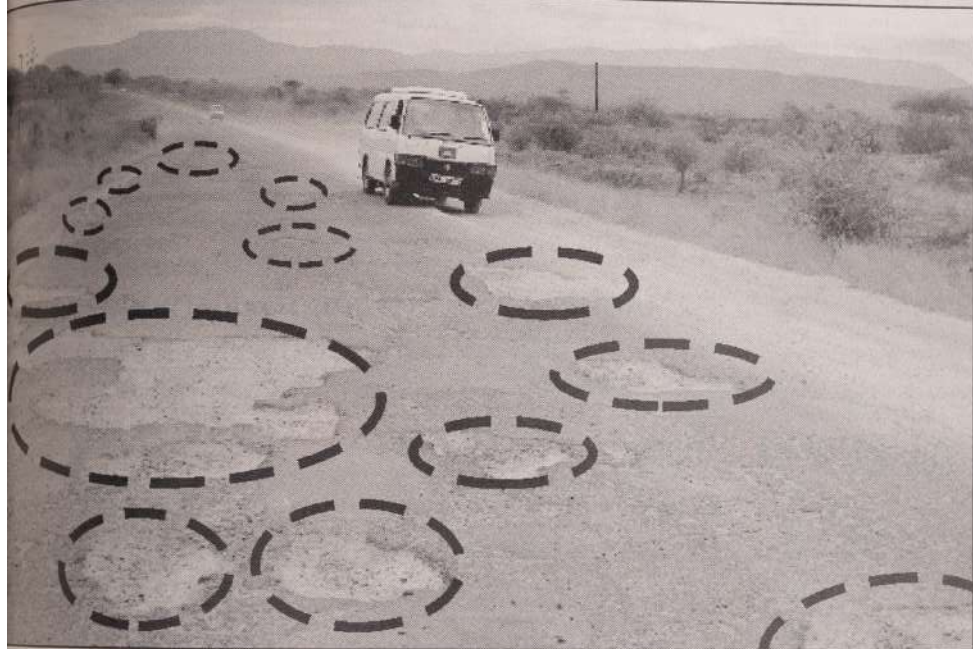

It is also absurd to see what sort of repairs contractors are carrying out with hand held shovels, it beats any common sense why anyone can get away with such shoddy work.

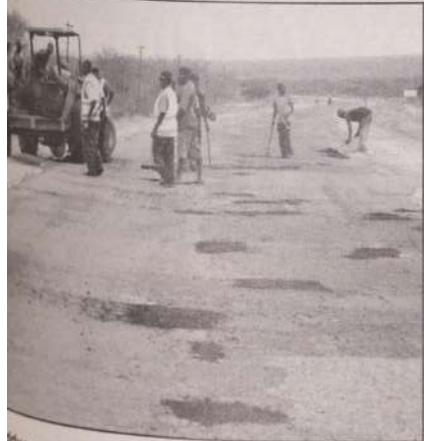

the circumference of the Muslims with the potent objective to help raise funds for the disaster being faced by Pakistan.

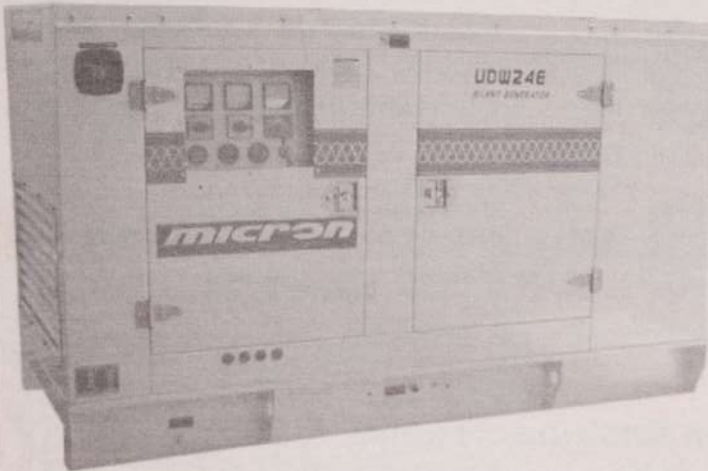



KCB Sponsored East African Golf To

Hot on the heels of the recently concluded Coast Open Meetings for men and women which brought the best of the amateur golfers to the Coast, came the gathering of the best in the professional ranks in Kenya, our neighbours and fellow Community members Tanzania, Uganda and Rwanda and

further afield, Zimbabwe, South Africa and one at least all the way from Italy.

What brought them to our shores was the grand finale of the Kenya Commercial Bank sponsored East African Tour 2010 staged at Nyali Golf & Country Club.

The disappointment of the cancellation of the much-awaited Sunshine Tour event at the Coast

was made up by the exhibition of golf of high calibre, which the final of this tournament provided.

For the professionals, this is no fun and games but business and as in any business, there is work to be done and fight to survive and get to the top.

Given this keen competition, just a little less than half the contestants were eliminated after the half way cut on Thursday 12th.

From the original field of 48 professionals, 27 survived the cut, representing the top end of the field with a strong presence from Kenya, led by Jacob Okello and Dismas Indiza both on 142 and which also included the highest placed on order of merit James Ngigi, past winners such as Richard Ainley and Nyali's own Kopan Timbe.

The reduced field also included

one professional each from Tanzania, Uganda, the sole contestant from Italy and last and, not in the least bit least, in fact the star of the field, James Kamte from South Africa.

All eyes were on James and he did not disappoint.

At the end of the second day cut, he was lying third, two shots behind the joint leaders Jacob Okello and Dismas Indiza both of who have good experience of tackling the Nyali course.

Jacob is not only no stranger to but is in fact a home grown Nyali player, having started to play there as a youngster under the watchful eye of one of the finest Coast players, his Dad, Ben Okello. James Kamte on the other hand was a first time visitor to Nyali.

It is a true mark of a good player, that he learns a new course quickly, learns to adapt his game to the course and the conditions, avoid the pitfalls and the traps and take advantage where available.

His four-day total of 290 was 9 shots behind James Kamte but good enough to give him the second position.

Jacob Okello who had a mini disaster on third day with 78, shared the third position with Nicholas Rokoino on 302.

James Kamte's winning performance on the pro side was reflected on the amateur side by a stellar performance from Murtaza Saeed who took the top amateur prize with 40 stableford points, counting out another outstanding performance from the veteran Mzee Patrick Munyao.

Only those two in the entire field of 159 amateurs could rise to forty points, 32 others falling in the thirties, the vast majority in the twenties and 20 players in the rather lowly position of tens.

Playing along side the pros had its excitement as well as some down side, the narrowed fairways and the difficult pin positions creating problems for most.

We are in the process of putting together a comprehensive plan between now and the World Cup to address the issues and make sure we can achieve our potential as a team of individuals. It is still time for us to put things right and go to the World Cup and perform at our best, we are not doing ourselves justice at the moment, we know that more than anyone, and we will work together to make sure results improve."

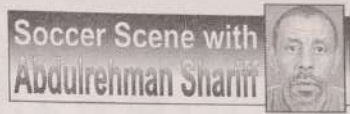

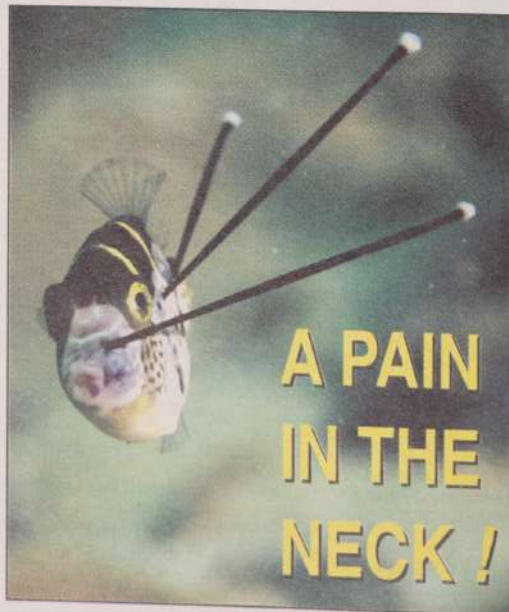
