During the 2006 Israel-Lebanon conflict, the Indian navy evacu-ated 2,286 Indian nationals, 436 Lankan and 69 Nepali

The Indian navy is engaged in anti-piracy operations as well. A co-ordinated effort by the Indian navy and the Indian Coast Guards led to the release of Japanese cargo ship MV Alondra Rainbow. Another warship named INS Tabar had to use force to prevent attempts to hijack two cargo ships and in the process destroyed a hijacked 'mother ship' of the pirates.

Subsequently 23 pirates were arrested by the Indian Navy while attempting to hijack another merchant ship.

On a request made by the Seychelles government, the Indian navy conducted anti-piracy patrols and arrested nine

On December 7, 2009, the Indian navy successfully repulsed a pirate attack on a US owned tanker in the Gulf of Aden. By June 2010, Indian navy had escorted about 1,000 ships of 50

The forthcoming visit seeks to foster maritime goodwill between our two nations that share a rich cultural and maritime heritage.

The bridge of friendship that the Indian navy ships aim to build would bring the two countries even closer, enhance existing bonds and further cement ties



I fail to understand when we ignore infrastructure that leads to regional markets yet we speak about the east African integration and vision 2010.


It is also absurd to see what sort of repairs contractors are carrying out with hand held shovels, it beats any common sense why anyone can get away with such shoddy work.



# THIRTY ONE YEARS AGO

#### Coastweek, August 17 - 23, 1979:

FOLLOWING A shortage of wheat flour caused by a drop in supply from Nakuru, Mombasa faced an acute shortage of bread as bakeries laid off staff and housewives were said to go on a 'panic buying' spree. A spokesman for Atta Limited said they were getting only 4,000 bags a month instead of the usual 15,000.

The Coast was gearing up for polls after the end of a voter registration drive. The upcoming elections would see Shariff Nassir of Mombasa Central battle it out with Mohammed Jahazi, while Mombasa South's Khalif Mwavumo was up against former Mombasa Mayor Abdalla Mwidau, Richard Peter Owino, Charles Mboya and Joseph Okoth Waudi. Said Hemed of Mombasa North had as his contenders former MP Ibrahim Mwaura, Nairobi-based journalist Kumbu Chokwe, and Jossy Kiparide. In the running for the Mombasa West seat were Ferdinand Mwaro and David Kioko.

Faheem Parkar, an ex-Kensec student showed Coastweek his model of the Kenyatta Conference Center that earned him first prize at the Mombasa ASK Show in 1976. The model was constructed using approximately 10000 matchsticks and took him six months to build.

H.E. Junejo has charged me personally and the Muslim Association of Mombasa with the task of mobilizing all possible resources within and without



# Kenya to Face Africa Rugby Crisis

Kenya may pull out of the Confederation of Africa Rugby (CAR) Cup tournament if the continental body fails to reschedule its matches to Nairobi.

Kenya which is pooled in Group B has been grappling with the fixture demands and Kenya Rugby Union (KRU) chairman Richard Omwela said they have written to CAR demanding for the tournament to be brought back to Nairobi or they will not honour the

"They need to get us playing

here in Nairobi, if they fail to do so, then it means we will be pulling out," said Omwela.

Uganda Rugby Union (URU) have also protested to CAR over the Africa Cup format that brought Namibia on board.

Initially, Kenya was scheduled to host the matches which had Uganda, Zambia and Cameroon either late July or early August.

However, CAR came up with a new draw format that pooled together defending champions Namibia, Kenya, Uganda and Cameroon

#### TOURNAMENT

This was after Kenya expressed its inability to host the tournament.

Kenya was unable to stage the event since the US\$30,000 that CAR allocated was little considering that they had hosted the Junior World Rugby Tournament last year.

Omwela said Kenya wanted an additional US\$20,000 but CAR refused and moved the event to Namibia.

Omwela said Namibia have in turn submitted a budget of US\$160,000 to CAR.

CAR is yet to announce dates for the event, another issue that has bothered participating countries.






