THIRTY ONE VEARS AGO

Coastweek, August 24 - 30, 1979:

OPERATION Census: Kenyans were gearing up Friday night for the 1979 population census which was estimated to cost KSh 45 million. Mombasa was projected to have about 413,000 residents. According to the 1979 Kenya Population Census Guide, the 1969 census showed that Kenya's population was just under eleven million and growing at a rate of 3.3 per cent each year, the highest rate in the world. This meant that if the population continued to grow at that rate, Kenya's population would double in another 21 years.

Muslims were celebrating Idd ul Fitr marking the end of the holy month of Ramadhan with a special Idd message from Kenya's Chief Kadhi Sheikh Abdullah Saleh Farsi.

A four-man team from the Indian Institute of Petroleum Exploration were making preliminary analyses with help from the University of Dar es Salaam on traces of oil found at Songo Songo in Kilwa District, Tanzania. The Tanzanian government meanwhile imposed restrictions on the sale of petrol to further conserve the fuel.

NAAZ cinema was ending its run of 'Scandal in the Family' and moving on to 'Heroes' starring Henry Winkler and Sally Field. REGAL cinema was showing 'Edge of Fury' a Kung-Fu flick starring Yasuki Kurata and Bruce Lee look-alike Ho Chung Tao. Meanwhile, KENYA cinema was winding down its run of 'Moonraker' and despite extra shows added to their schedule, queues continued to build at the booking office. At the CHOX it was Randhir Kapoor and Jaya Badhuri in 'Jawani Diwani' (Crazy Youth).

Letter writers included Abdala wa Khalidi of Takaunga who urged readers "In the name of women's rights" and "In the name of unadulterated Christianity" to "not abolish the right to polygamy" following "recent debate and rejection of the Marriage Bill by Parliament which focussed attention on the African and Islamic institution of polygamy."

Others were Mbogholi wa Maghanga, G. L. Antoni, Mishi Mwachatam of Kwale and Nabila Ali and Shelina Vellani of Mombasa



"This is helping to raise the safety of vehicles on the Kenya roads, but there are no effective checks on used parts."

"This is cause for concern because used parts especially those sourced from an accident write-off are likely to have a limited life.

"In addition they are a threat to the safety of the vehicle owner and other road users."

Aluoch concluded: "My many years of experience in dealing with spares has convinced me that motorists should buy only new genuine spares from recognised dealers and avoid the temptation of paying lower prices for replacement and used spares.

"These are potential causes of trouble and are likely to lead to additional expenses."

But there is something else which makes this event spectacular beyond the sheer mass of migrating mammals.

FEAR AND PANIC

The month long, tranquil marching pace has suddenly come to a dead stop and the entire atmosphere has been abruptly transformed into a state of absolute confusion, fear and panic.

Survival instincts have taken over

A light splash is heard from across the river; Nile crocodiles inhibit these waters.

Uncertain of their next move, the grunting and moaning wildebeest wander parallel along the river bank trying to look for a shallow and trouble-free crossing that displays no hint of observable danger.

But by now, thousands of gnu have gathered at the crossing path and the front line of animals are now being forcefully pushed and shoved up to the waters edge.

The giant Nile crocodiles which average four meters in length will patiently lay in wait.

They know that food will eventually come to them since the wildebeest have no other choice, either you cross the river or starve to death in the now dry Serengeti. The crocodiles are quadrupeds; they have their eyes, ears and nostrils positioned on top of their head so that the rest of the body can remain partly submerged underwater.

In this concealed state, they can easily be mistaken for tree logs, quietly directing their approach to the river shore with stealth.

If need be, they can burst into action and swim at speeds of up to 30kmph.

It is estimated there are less than 400,000 of these living dinosaurs left in the wild.

Anxiety on the river bank has now reached a heightened peak and a gnu finally finds the nerve to plunge into the raging currents, where now, as if by magic, the rest of the herd pour themselves into the wake of the first, their convulsive wading now forming one long synchronized line as they attempt to cross the river.


A five meter crocodile approaches the left flank of the now fear stricken wading herd, swimming past the first few wildebeest that are only a foot away from him.

A struggling target has been sighted! With jaws agape the crocodile lunges into the face of the victim where it holds on exceedingly tightly as it drags the now drowning gnu into the murky abyss.

It is assumed that over 200 thousand wildebeest die from drowning and predator attacks during this migration.

The greener grasses however on the other side, replenishes the losses with over 400 thousand births a

This great natural spectacle based purely on animal instinct reflecting the survival of the littest is what we humans come to witness annually from all over the world.

Last week we considered what disruptive technology could do and began to examine what would be necessary for this phenomenon to hit the motor vehicle industry.

The main item that would create the disruption necessary to move vehicles to electric energy is the powerful and easily rechargeable battery.

A lot of researchers are working on making car batteries cheaper and faster to charge, of course.

In the meantime, though, there are three approaches to the trade-off, each of which has its champions.

The first trade off accepts the range limit and promotes the design of small, thrifty vehicles specialised for city

This has the virtue of simplicity and the vice of inflexibility

It means that the vehicles will be simple personnel carriers with a limit of maybe two to three people in cramped conditions.

The range will be probably some hundred to a hundred and fifty kilometres and will have batteries that are rechargeable in the typical time that meetings take - that is probably three to four hours if one includes the pre meeting banter and the refreshments or entertainment

Recharging points can then be available in the basements or parking of most buildings in the city of the programme is supported by the city fathers.

The second trade off option is to add a petrol-driven generator known as a range extender.

This will complicate the mechanics of the vehicle, but will provide the driver with a security blanket, for he knows he will never be stranded if he

can find a petrol station.

The third answer is to keep the car all-battery, but to introduce a network of battery-exchange stations similar to the existing network of petrol stations, so that someone who is running out of juice can pull in, swap over the battery pack and pull out.

The only challenge here is that the battery packs should generally be the same for all

One can imagine having different types of battery that have characteristics that suit the vehicle design style

> There will be those that require high pulling power but not high speeds - read diesel engines.

There will also be the other extreme that require rapid acceleration and then be able to maintain high speeds read petrol engines

Then there will be the variants

It will be like having different grades of fuel so that the vehicle manufacturers can design their engines and mechanics to reflect the driving style they desire to achieve to match the battery characteristics

In the first category of the so called city cars, it is expected that the first series of vehicles that will be commercially and widely available will come out next year.

Typically they may cost around fifty thousand dollars but it is expected that the price will drop rapidly as they catch on in the major cities in the developed

They will have between five

and ten percent of the number of batteries that the super cars covered last week need.

This means that their range will probably be between one hundred and one hundred and fifty kilometres before they need charging.

Charging will still remain a challenge for these vehicles.

They will rely on the fact that the range is suitable for a day's operation and they can be left charging overnight.

These city cars are all very well as runabouts, but if electric vehicles are to become widely

adopted and displace hydro carbon fuelled vehicles, they will have to make a serious impact in saloon-car market.

To do this with an all-battery powered car will not be easy especially given the current price tag.

Whilst an all electric car is very desirable, the reality is that they hybrid will form the intermediate solution as the "disruptive" technology is perfected.

The Lithium ion battery, which is the current staple for cars, will need to have a rapid charge capability for all electric cars to make an impact.

Alternatively a new kind of battery that can be programmed to replicate whatever the cal manufacturer needs in terms of vehicle response will be the defining moment for battery powered vehicles.

This will require materials that can respond to digital inputs in order to programme their response.

This Holy Grail is still far in the future but not unimaginable.


In the meantime hybrid vehicle will rule the roost and we will continue on that next week.

As Kachumbari says, serious challenges still lie ahead in creating all electric vehicles.



In 1973, he was also named "Coast Cricketer of the Year" - an award which, doubtless, was inspired by his performance against Mombasa Sports Club in that year when he took a record 9 wickets for 49 runs in an

Mehdi left Kenya to settle in England in 1974 where he

continued his distinguished playing career before turning his attention to coaching full-time.

He has devoted the last twenty years to coaching youngsters in England and is

currently an integral part of the England Cricket Board's "Chance

to Shine" project, a much lauded programme which is targeted at spreading the essentials of the game of cricket to young boys and girls in England.

For some time, Mehdi had expressed a keen interest in coming to Kenya during the off-season English winter months to promote the development of the game in the Coast - particularly amongst local schools where cricket is not part of the sporting curriculum



He is also particularly eager to participate in junior club cricket to identify talent amongst various age-groups for the Cricket Kenya Elite Programme.

Cricket Kenya Chairman, Samir Inamdar, said that Mehdi's visit to Kenya to coach youngsters between September this year to March 2011 was only made possible by an extremely generous sponsorship from an cricketing well-wisher who wishes to remain anonymous.


