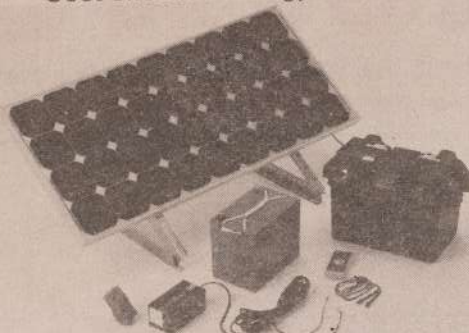

New Community Health Boost To Kwale, Kinango And Msambweni

GENEROUS EUROPEAN COMMISSION DONATING MOTOR BIKES FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH BY GOVERNMENT DISTRICT MEDICAL OFFICES

District Medical Offices Kwale, Kinango and Msambweni were given motor bikes to facilitate transport for health managers responsible for promoting community health initiatives at the village level.

Community Health Department to provide motorbikes and thanked the donors, European Commission and Aga Khan Foundation, UK for providing the funds.

Mombasa Students Achieve Impressive Music And Drama Results

The annual LAMDA exams (London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art) ended on June 11, 2010, and for the seventh consecutive year Mombasa students achieved an impressive 100 per cent pass rate at Introductory, Level 1 and Level 2.

Congratulations to every LAMDA student who took an exam this year!

The London based examiner, Mr. Brian Hindle, was full of praise for all the candidates and complimented their teacher, Mrs. Jean Hughes for her total dedication and for the excellent standard of the work presented.

This year there were a staggering 208 entries ranging from Introductory to Silver Medal exams.

In total 121 gained the highest possible grade - Distinction, 82 gained Merits and 5 gained passes.

The highest marks (90 per cent) this year went to Sahil Varia from Aga Khan Academy for Acting Grade 3 and Pooja Shah from Mombasa Academy for Spoken English Grade 5.

Once again, the best results were gained in the Spoken English and Public Speaking Exams.

From Mombasa Academy, Wanjiru Mugo and Henal Patel both gained 88 per cent Distinction at Grade 5 and Matteo Rosafio gained 82 per cent Distinction at Grade 1.

Abass Palkhi and Shama Jaffer gained 87 per cent and 86 per cent Distinction for Grade 5 and Dhruv Shah 89 per cent, Rohin Kanji 84 per cent,

Mohammed Tarmal 82 per cent and Mehdi Khaki 80 per cent at Grade 4.

Payal Sadrani had an excellent result with 88 per cent at Grade 2 and Shahil Shah 84 per cent and Karan Khagram 80 per cent at Entry Level.

There were equally good results from Oshwal Academy where Meer Shah gained 86 per cent at Grade 1 and Yashvi Radia 84 per cent at Grade 2.

In the Speaking of Verse and Prose exams there was a very high standard with many students gaining 80 per cent or higher.

Included in this group were Juhaina Islam Ali, Simone Patel (88) Riva Patel (88) Ziana Bhanji (86) Chia - Mei Chui, Tatyana Bryant (86) Sote Chemngorem, Carla Careno, Ines Careno, Baraka Wandario, Aryan Gor, Danilo Rosafio and Amira Hayatan all from Mombasa Academy.

At Oshwal Academy very high marks for Grade 2 Verse and Prose were gained by Meer Shah (88) Riaan Lakhani (88) and Aneri Shah gained 86 per cent at Grade 1.

At Entry Level fantastic results were gained by Haytham Buran, Kamran Sheikh and Vishaan Shah.

From the Aga Khan Academy the best marks were awarded to Ruhil Shah, Ayesha Lalani, Ria Devani and Alimohamed Jaffer.

The most demanding exams are the Acting Exams and this year there were some really excellent marks.

For the first year some of the younger children took their Entry exam and the results were very

pleasing with all the entrants gaining Merits and Distinctions.

The highest mark went to Rani Shah with 88 per cent, followed by Keshni Majithia 84 per cent, Anjali Bechra 82 per cent and Ria Savadia 81 per cent.

High marks were also gained by Akhil Jasani and Burhanuddin Yamani with 88 per cent at Grade 4, Raja Shah 83 per cent, Palin Shah 82 per cent, Amy Phillips 81 per cent and Kyla Conway 80 per cent at Grade 3.

This year the examiner awarded seven medals to the

older students.

Bronze Medals for Public Speaking were awarded to Zeinab Tarmal Distinction and Vivek Dhutia Merit.

Bronze Medals for acting were awarded to Tulsi Shah and Kaajal Chandi and Yashna Gudka gained a Silver Medal.

In the Verse and Prose Exams Dishti Sasan gained a Bronze Medal Distinction and her sister Disha was awarded a Silver Medal.

All the younger LAMDA students did exceptionally well

with the majority gaining Distinction.

A special mention must go to the Jaffery Academy student where every student gained Distinction!

Overall, the examiner was absolutely thrilled with the consistently high standard of work and thoroughly enjoyed his 10 days in Mombasa.

He was full of praise for Jean Hughes and all her enthusiastic and well rehearsed students and already looks forward to his next visit to Kenya.

On the occasion, Dr. Aryn Lakhani, Director of Community Health Department at Aga Khan Health Service, Kenya is committed to bringing government health services to the rural population.

The impetus to donate the motorbikes stemmed from the need to provide easy transport for district health managers visiting their community units and providing on-site supervision to Community Health Workers (CHWs).

She emphasized that an on-site monitoring system is in place to document the usage and impact of these motorbikes on health outcomes at the community level.

The project is required to estimate and measure any impact it will provide to CHWs in the rural population.

Kenyan beaches risk losing glamour if pollution is not checked.

"Tourism and coastal livelihoods are threatened if pollution along the Kenyan coast goes unabated."

These were the words of Fred Sewe the local coordinator of International Coastal Clean-up.

Speaking in Mombasa during the local chapter of the International Coastal Clean-up (ICC) exercise held on 18th September 2010, Sewe said that the growing pollution levels along the Kenyan coast who a serious threat to the of Kenyan beaches tourism and more importantly marine life along the Kenyan coast.

"During this exercise we have seen plastics and glass dominate the pollution but also unseen is petroleum products, industrial effluence and raw sewage that ends up in the ocean" added Sewe.

Speaking at the same event, NEMA Provisional Director who represented the government at the event echoed Mr. Sewe's sentiments adding the

government in conjunction with various stakeholders amongst them KATO, NEMA, KWS, KPA has instituted various measures

to ensure the beaches remain clean and safe for all.

Key amongst the government's recommendations is the mandate

to ensure no raw or untreated effluence is directed to the ocean.

For enforcement of this, the government in conjunction with NEMA has set up checks and balances that will incorporate severe punishment of fines and jail terms for the perpetrators.

During the cleanup exercise, over 3000 volunteers joined hands to make this year's event a big success.

Majority of the volunteers descended on the Jomo Kenyatta Public Beach but hoteliers and other organizations on the beachfront organized similar exercises on their properties including Diani, Shelly Beach, Jumba Ruins, Mtwapa Beach, Kibisi, Malindi and Shimoni.

"It's great that people are becoming aware of marine debris as a global problem," said Sewe.

"But it is especially encouraging that more and more people are doing something about it and getting involved at the local level.

"The efforts of everyone who volunteered today have made an important difference in preserving our coastal ecosystem."

The volunteers collected, bagged and weighed every piece of trash they found.

Ocean Conservancy will use the information gotten this year to produce the world's only annual country-by-country, state-by-state index of the problem of marine debris.

Kenya 'Highway Code' Remains A Survivor From Colonial Times

In considering the implementation of the new Constitution in Kenya, we last week considered what needs to be looked at in respect of managing the road infrastructure in the country.

We considered the challenges of operating between the counties and the central government - which still needs a name as we transform the civil service from the pre-colonial service to the one we want to drive the country to achieve vision 2030 - but that is another story.

The second area of concern that Kachumbari put on the table was around the harmonisation of laws around how we drive.

Under the current dispensation, the Highway Code we have survived from the colonial times with very little modification.

He told me that a spirited internet search revealed that the last official gazetted revision was in nineteen sixty seven.

This means that a lot of water has flowed under the bridge since then and if there were to be enforcement of road regulations we would be found woefully lacking.

Where does this fit in with the constitution implementation?

The Highway Code is like the constitution for the use of the road.

It governs what we do when we do it and how we do it. The Code also ensures that there is equity in everyone's usage of this public space.

Though the process of designing and putting in place of such a code is not as extensive as that required for constitutional change, the impact of the few people who normally carry out such work is quite far reaching.

As we go ahead to implement the Constitution of Kenya we should also take the opportunity to realign the tenets of the

went a bit too far. In the driving culture in Kenya we have allowed the same impunity to set in. Motorists have not batted an eyelid as anarchy has set about on the roads - primarily driven by the dramatic rise in the population of matatus as well as the stagnation in the development of the infra-structure.

The rise in population of vehicles and other road users has not been matched by a development in terms of enforcement agencies and resources.

Our police force is completely understaffed to deal effectively with the population of vehicles that we have on the roads.

The vehicles and technology that they need to make stickable prosecutions are almost non-existent and where they do they are from the last century.

These factors have allowed impunity to set in.

The matatu culture is what started the change and the general driving population has had to join into that culture as survival would be difficult if one drove normally.

If one were to drive in accordance with the outdated Highway Code one would be more than likely to end up in an accident.

As part of the change, we should look at influencing the culture by reviewing the Highway Code and including in it expected behaviours on the road that would reflect where as a country we wish to go. Following on this, the Traffic Act also needs a complete review that should include serious punitive measures for all counts of not following the Code or the Act.

We would need to set up a strong enforcement agency that has all the bells and whistles for it to effectively discharge its duties and it should also have the teeth to bite when necessary.

This should all be done in an integrated way such that the local government's own machinery dove-tails into the national enforcement agency and reinforces it.

As Kachumbari says, change is not without its bitterness.

Swahili Traders Of 1850 Thought That 'All Roads Led To Buganda'

I recently received an interesting forward on Alidina Visram: His name appears among the few leading entrepreneurs along-with the likes of Muljibhai P. Madhvani, founder of the largest business conglomerate in Uganda, and Mehta s, the first Indian family who did commercial farming in Africa.

Aldina Visram, owned the first business shop in Kampala and Jinja towns. If one had been able to question an Arab or Swahili trader of Unyanyembe about the destination of commercial traffic leading north in 1850, the reply might have been "all roads lead to Buganda".

[Unyanyembe is a large township centrally situated in Unyamwezi - Present day Tabora in Tanzania is located in this township.]

The answer was not very far from absolute truth. Some, and not all, initial pioneers of migration to Africa from India, were great visionaries. Most of them were those who came exploring new horizons, prospects, found a means to survive, and generally became traders. They then called their kith's and kin's and helped them settle in Africa.

As it was colonial rule then, they all became British subjects.

Majority of them, down the line, migrated to the U.K.

Those who came for the installation of the railway are not excluded from this.

I base my above observation from what I was told by my father. My Grand-father, Maneklal Maganlal Rawal, had migrated to Mombasa in 1907-8.

Apart from doing trading of spices, which was a very common trend then, he eventually ended up opening a business of Hardware, which still exists under the name of 'Mombasa Hardware'.

Prior to this, he was involved into partnership with one Nanji Kaidas.

They, I believe, used to deal in sanitary ware, like tiles and maybe textiles.

My father was born, brought up in Mombasa (born 1937).

His ailing health restricted his stay in Kenya. He was suffering from asthma, and after a major operation in which one of his lungs was removed, he had to leave Kenya in January 1960.

He then settled in Bombay.

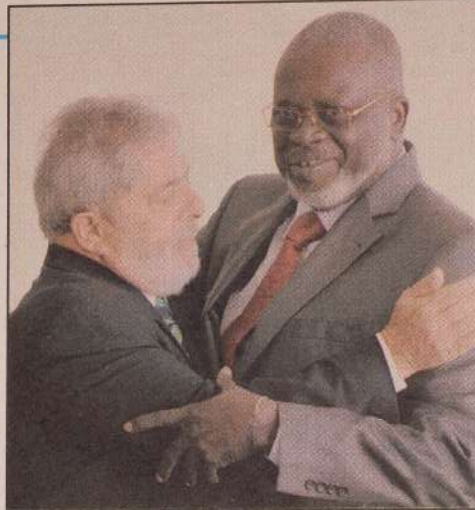

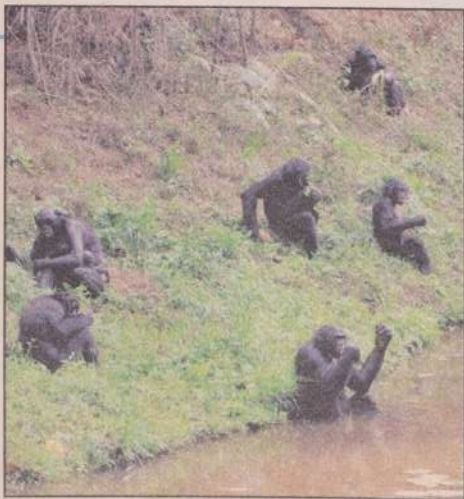

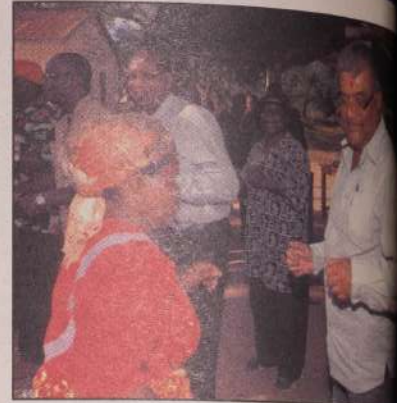

Sh7.5 Million Raised At Cycle With Rhino

KSh7.5 million has been raised at the weekend during the 6th edition of the annual Cycle with the Rhino cycling race at the Lake Nakuru National Park.

The money will be used for the erection of a baboon-proof electric fence around the park as well as implement community projects in conservation.

Flagged off by the Minister for Forestry and Wildlife Hon. Dr. Noah Wekesa, the event drew over 57 adult cyclists for the 64-km gruelling race within the park and through the neighbouring community as well as Nakuru Town.

Unlike previously, this year's race had three categories for children, juniors and adults (professionals).

The children's race attracted 25 participants. Four top winners of the race were sponsored by Standard Chartered Bank, the event's lead sponsor.

The adults' race was won by 26-year-old Samuel Mwangi, followed by John Njoroge, 25, while the third place was taken up by Suleiman Kangangi aged 21.

The first woman cyclist was Seline Atieno, 25, sponsored by Lake Nakuru Lodge.

Speaking at the event, Dr Wekesa said Kenyans were facing adverse effects of climate change, including prolonged drought and extended rains. He called on Kenyans to conserve the environment as a way of

mitigating some of the effects.

KWS Director Julius Kipng'etich said Nakuru town had a great potential to emerge as a tourism hub besides being the traditional agricultural hub for Kenya.

He pledged KWS support for the development of tourism potential in newly-created counties.

So far, 18 km out of the 74 km of the baboon-proof electric fence has been rehabilitated since the cycling event was started in 2003. During this period, Sh25 million has been raised for the fence.

Mr Kipng'etich noted that human wildlife conflict and road crashes on the Nairobi-Nakuru highway had drastically dropped since a 10-km fence was erected two months ago by KWS in partnership with Soysambu Conservancy.

KWS is negotiating with various conservancies to create wildlife corridors between Lake Nakuru and Lake Naivasha, Mr Kipng'etich said, adding that the park's 4000 buffaloes had exceeded its carrying capacity and required more space.

He commended Forestry and Wildlife Minister for recently gazetetting Lake Elementeita, laying ground for its planned declaration as a World Heritage Site.

Last year's race was a huge success where a total of 62 bike riders raised Sh7.5 million in cash

and kind sponsorship.

Conceptualised in 2003, the unique and spectacular event aims to rehabilitate the 180-square kilometre electric fence and undertake community conservation education around the fragile Lake Nakuru National Park ecosystem.

Indeed, Nakuru town and the Lake Nakuru's National Park's sustainability is highly threatened by the increasing urbanization, pollution, land de-gradation, decrease in quality and quantity of water in the lake and loss of biodiversity, as a result of deforestation in Mau, Eburu and Bahati forests.

Consequent research has shown possible danger in losing this important ecosystem within the next 8 years, if matters remain the same!

Cycle with a Rhino is one of the initiatives that have been developed to curb the degradation of this ecosystem.

Standard Chartered Bank Kenya led the way as corporate sponsors for the 2010 event, donating Sh2 million.

Other key sponsors included Safaricom, Kenya Commercial Bank, Gilgil Telecommunications, Kenya Airways, Geothermal Development Corporation, UUNet and WWF—the global conservation organisation.

Conceptualised in 2003, the unique and spectacular fun-filled-cum-fundraising cycling race aims to rehabilitate the 74-km baboon proof electric fence and undertake community conservation education around the fragile Lake Nakuru National Park.

Lake Nakuru National Park designated a Ramsar site in 1961, extended up to 1964 and the 63rd in 1968. It was the current size of 1968 through funding by the World Fund for Nature.

Due to rising water levels established as a Ramsar site in 1984, later a sanctuary in 1987. Ramsar site (protection) in 1990 for the migratory water birds.

The park's chain fence erected in 1976 as a fence in 1967.

On August 10, 2009, it was branded as a "Paradise" famous of millions of birds.

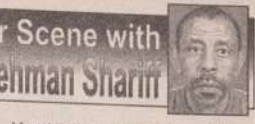

Daegu, World Championship in 2011 and London Olympics in 2012 are the next hurdle and with a spear and shield, there is little to stop this Moran attaining the elder and legend status.

DAVID RUDISHA RECEIVES HEROIC WELCOME IN KILGORIS BY MASAAI COMMUNITY



NAIROBI, (Xinhua) -- Kenya's 800m race world record holder David Rudisha (C) is welcomed after being in a Moran "warrior", a rite of passage in the Masaai culture, during his homecoming party in Kilgoris, 315 km west of Kenya's capital Nairobi, Sept. 17, 2010. Tethering his father's goats he would get excited whenever planes flew past his village.

Well, at 21 years, he has travelled, most of the time first class, in some of the world's sleek planes. But not once in his life had Rudisha been inside a helicopter.

"This is a new experience to me. I am in for a treat. I have never rode in a helicopter. This is great, I feel really nice that they (Kenya Police) could get me such a grand trip home,"

Rudisha told Xinhua at his home in southwest of Nairobi.

From Nairobi, Rudisha, himself a constable with the police force, was given a grand passage to the Wilson Airport with four limousines, two escort cars in front and behind with two motorcycle outriders.

His motorcade snaked through the morning traffic along the busy Uhuru Highway and Lang'ata road to the Wilson Airport.

He was received by Deputy Commissioner of Police Jonathan Kosgei and ushered into the Kenya Police helicopter together with his fellow athletes Janeth Jepkosgei, Wilfred Bungei, Alfred Kirwa Yego, Richard Mateelong, Milcah Chemos and Sammy Tangui, his pace setter.
