Financial Performance Highlights (September 2010 vs. September 2009) Balance Sheet:

- Total group assets increased by 29% to KShs 80 billion, fuelled by growth in customer deposits which, at KShs 62 billion, rose by 30%.

The Down Syndrome Society of Kenya has adopted a unique animal 'the Zedonk' whose parents are zebra and donkey, at Nairobi Animal Orphanage.

The 10-year-old zedonk was brought to the orphanage from Maralal on October 3, 2010 after being released by the local community to Kenya Wildlife Service.

Prime Bank and Devki Steel Mills provided the sponsorship to the society for the adoption.

In Kenya, there are an estimated 45,000 people with Down Syndrome and the number is rising with the national average being oneto every 800 births.

Down Syndrome is a genetic disorder caused that leads to developmental delays, learning disabilities and physical defects, including hearing disabilities, speech and heart

Erik Madete, the Down Syndrome Society of Kenya chairman, said parents with children suffering from the condition suffer from rejection by the public, lack of specialised support and lack of appropriate curriculum in schools





The Pluses, Perils and Pitfalls Of Our Local Driving Schools

We go back to driving schools this week and look at what it takes to select a good one all things being equal.

Learning to drive is like a rite of passage that for many young-sters marks a large and important leap towards adulthood.

The problem is that learning how to drive can be taxing upon the parents and frustrating for the teen if the parent tries to do the work themselves.

While it is important for parent and child to spend time together, it does not necessarily have to be behind the wheel of an internal combustion engine.

Driving schools becoming the preferred alternative when it comes to teaching inexperienced people how to drive.

Driving schools are beneficial for a number of reasons and we will give the ones that apply to a well run and professionally managed unit.

One of the most important is the accuracy of lessons given.

There are no short cuts or bad habits that pass down to the new drivers, just knowledge and skill.

So, how can one make sure that the driving school they select is a good one?

We will need to develop a system in Kenya that makes this question easy to answer.

Accreditation is the most important for any excellent driving school.

We should require that all driving schools are accredited.

CONFIDENCE

In addition they should also meet all other business licensing requirements and they should show all this openly to give the customer the confidence that they are actually proud to comply with the law.

If not then one should be suspicious that they are likely to be taking shortcuts

One should visit the premises of the school that they plan on handing over hard earned money to in order to confirm that it meets

their expectation.

Whilst at the driving school, one should also look at the vehicle and ensure that it is well maintained with the school name prominently displayed.

Inspect the vehicle and make sure that everything is in working condition.

Safety is a large concern and should not be overlooked.

One of the best ways to tell if the driving school is one that you would trust is to ask questions.

Question the owners and the instructors, and if you can find any, former students

Make sure to ask about their insurance, since if they do not have any then you do not want to use that school.

Also ask about how much experience the instructor has and what program they had to go through in order to achieve their position.

Do not be afraid to ask any other questions that come to mind

More than likely, the driving school will not be insulted and will welcome any inquires.

However, if they get stroppy about being asked questions then it is time to run.





Paul Tergat Hails Haile Gebreselassie's Plans

NAIROBI (Xinhua) -- Former world marathon record holder Paul Tergat on Tuesday termed Halle Gebrselassie's decision to rescind his retirement from athletics as the best for the sport.

Tergat has been Gebrselassie's bitter friend that they sat side-by-side prior to the race in New York marathon race fielding questions from journalists.

"Legends of any sport do not retire; instead they fade off the stage graciously and continue working in the disciplines they know best.

"Where can Haile go to, we all love him and it is best he stays in athletics for longer," said Tergat.

"The presence of Haile in athletics is big and it is still required, to inspire and guide the younger people."

Tergat said he too was surprised by the sudden announcement by his greatest friend to throw in the towel, moments after he had bet on him to win

DISTANCE RUNNER HAS CONFIRMED HIS CHANGE OVER RETIREMENT

37-YEAR-OLD

ETHIOPIAN

"Halle Gebrselassie has done everything in the sport except win a marathon with stiff competition," said Tergat prior to the start of New York marathon.

Tergat said then that what Gebrselassie needed in his career was a win before "millions" in New York.

"He has achieved everything - and what is missing is New

"Winning New York is like the ultimate test for any marathoner. I have raced there and I know, it is one of the hardest marathons in the world and I still say, he needs to win it."

Tergat, 42, said for any athlete of repute winning a race like he New York marathon was the ultimate test because of its hills and turns. He noted that after he regains his fitness, Gebrselassie will be a force to reckon as he prepares for London 2012 Olympics.

The two friends turn out arguable as the flercest rivals both on track and in marathon

At the Atlanta Olympics Games in 1996, Gebrselassie was the religning world record holder at 10,000m and the twice defending world champion.

His main rival was cross-country champion Paul Tergat.

The two men dominated the final with Gebrselassie winning dramatically by just six metres.

This tense rivalry was repeated in Sydney 2000, when Gebrselassie sensationally took gold with his very last stride beating Tergat by only 0.09 seconds, closer than the winning margin in the men's 100 metre dash.

On Monday Gebrselassie, the 37-year-old Ethiopian distance, confirmed he had changed his mind over retirement.

Gebrselassie won four straight 10,000 metres world titles 1993 in Stuttgart and won Olympic gold over the distance 1996 in Atlanta and 2000 in Sydney.

The diminutive runner was a world record holder over 5,000m and 10,000m and officially ended his track career with a 10,000m bronze at the 2003 worlds.

However, he returned to come sixth at the 2008 Olympics after not running the marathon due to pollution concerns.

Moving on full-time to the classic 42.195km marathon he first contested in 2002, Gebrselassie claimed the world record 2007 in Berlin and bettered it there the following year to 2 hours 3 minutes 59 seconds.

Tergat said he knew Gebrselassie was acting out of rage for both his knee injury and failure by him to win the race.

"He rescheduled his flight and left New York immediately.

"I knew he could turn around and rescind the decision after he had relaxed and am happy he just did that," said Tergat.

At 42 Tergat has not even thought of retiring and will continue working in a discipline he said he enjoys so much.

"Deep down, when he is all alone sitting by the fire, Halle must realize he dropped one of the biggest clingers of his running career," said Tergat.
