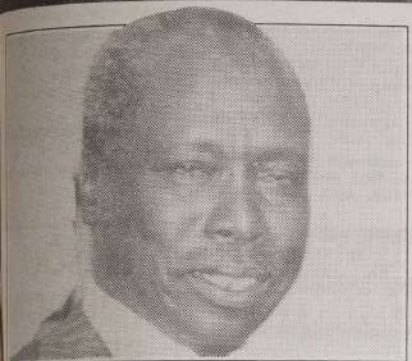

"Crescent of Hope" South Africa would like to thank Mr. Mohamed Salah (Bille) of Combined Freight for his efforts in clearing the borehole rig.

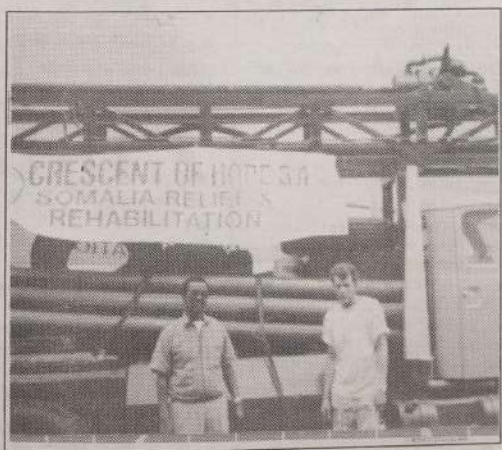

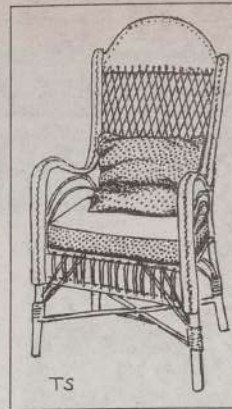

## Audiences Can Look Forward To A Fantastic African Musical

PLANS ARE at an advanced stage to bring *Limanya*, an African Musical, to Mombasa in early September, writes Menander.

After several successful runs in Nairobi, the production team has selected Mombasa for the first "provincial" run of the play, and in time intend to take it on tour to up-country towns.

*Limanya* (meaning "life" in Luhya) may in some ways be compared with *Ipi Tombi*, in that the play portrays the life of a young man, from his birth during his people's migration from the Congo forest to what is now the Luhya area of Kenya, through his growing up, initiation and marriage, then old age and finally death.

Unlike *Ipi Tombi* where the hero leaves his people to seek his fortune in the city and later returns to the ancestral home somewhat disillusioned, Wanglia, whose story is told in *Limanya* spends his entire time with the rural community at home.

Although the setting for the

play is amongst the Luhyas, the intention of the playwright is to emphasize the importance of the ancestral traditions of all people, and not the Luhya alone.

Thus most of the dialogue will be in English, but Swahili, Kikuyu, Dholuo and even some Kimaasai are other languages used.

The songs and the dances, however, are entirely Luhya.

*Limanya* was written by Raychelle Injete, and the directors of the play are Edwins Saka and Hudson Wafula, with choreography by John Mudeambo who also takes the leading role of Wanglia.

### ZAKALE

The music was composed by Joyce Mudoil and Jabali Africa.

The Zakale African Arts Group comprises some 25 young men and women, of whom seven form the band: there are four Sukuti Drummers led by Victor Serani, a Ltungu (seven stringed harp) player, a flautist and a Shiriri (one stringed instrument)

player.

There is also a small group of Luo drummers.

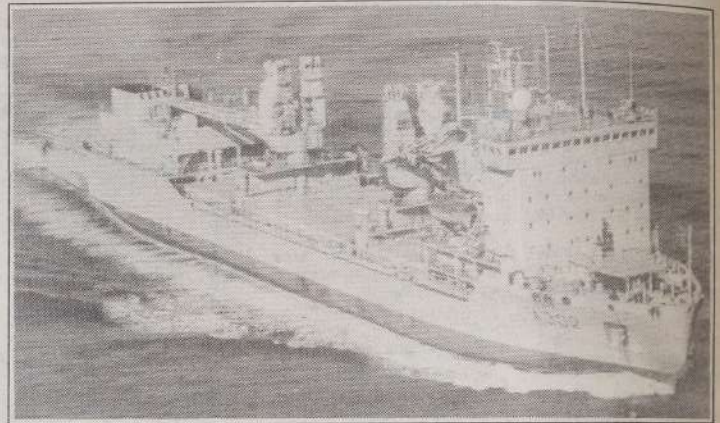

# Problem Of Stowaways Remains A Big Head-Ache For Shippers ...

THERE HAS BEEN quite a bit of movement concerning the Spanish Reefer vessels and trawler in port on Tuesday afternoon, with the reefers *Albacora Frigo Dos* and *Victoria Reefer* moving from alongside the ex (K) jetty, to A and B anchorages respectively, ostensibly to search for potential stowaways.

It probably wouldn't make too much of a difference, not unless of course the search is carried out absolutely thoroughly.

Because, it would appear that most stowaways prefer to really hide themselves and only come out when the vessel has been underway for say two or three days.

Still it is absolutely prudent to do a check prior to departure, especially thoroughly enough so as not to have a surprise later on during the voyage.

The MSC tanker *Potomac* closely followed by the trawler *Albacora Catorce* steamed out just after the *Albacora Frigo Dos* let go her anchor, with the *Victoria Reefer* waiting soon after the convoy had passed to drop her hook at B anchorage.

*Potomac* is on her way back to Mogadishu, having visited Kilindini for just under a week.

*Potomac* is identical to the *American Osprey* which visited Kilindini on a number of occasions during the first and second quarter of this year.

The Zanzibar Shipping Corporation's 13 year old Passenger, General Cargo, Ferry *Maendeleo* is looking pretty smart having been spruced up in the Kipoko dry-dock.

I see that she provides accommodation in the form of 32 berths, with space enough for 422 deck passengers.

Powered by Niigata Main engines producing 2354 kW converting to 3200 BHP.

*Maendeleo* incidentally is the Swahili equivalent of "Progress" in English.

Following her place in the basin on Monday was the Agro Livestock's *Doris* an unusual visitor to the dry dock basin a week or so ago was the motor sailing yacht *Lariana* which was formerly of Sailing Safari, but which I now believe has been taken over by some other group operating from the South Coast.

The *Lariana* is, and has been for some time now, undergoing quite extensive repairs cum

maintenance, no doubt with an eye on the on-coming tourist season.

It would appear that all stops are out with regards to the creation of anti oil pollution committees and centralization of equipment etc. after the grounding of the *Sunetta*.

Word has it that the KPA have placed an order for an anti pollution spray boat.

There was one bought quite some time back, called the *Mafta*, but which has since been, shall we say put on pension.

Anti-pollution response team and equipment is naturally a prudent and commendable measure to take, provided of course that the equipment is properly maintained, and the anti-pollution squad/s periodically exercised.

The threat of oil spill pollution along our coast line would potentially arise every time tanker enters Kilindini, however this would be the rule rather than the case.

## TANKERS

The three tankers which have run aground off the harbour entrance over the past decade, were all successfully refloated, with no oil spill.

However as mentioned earlier the response unit must be kept alert at all times so that, and heaven forbid, there be a case whereby oil pollution does occur and the units and equipment are left in such state of dis-repair so as to be ineffective in time of need.

It would appear that no "batas" (ducks) are required for the next trip of the *Fast Fox*, those concerned having scoffed a good half dozen, so I'm told, and every one succulent little fowl.

Skipper of the *Fast Fox* was here roughly three decades ago, and during the sojourn was apparently a part time resident of the "Rainbow

Day and Night Club", where, I'm lead to believe they woke you up with a 'plop, plop, and swoosh', translating to two alka seizer dropping into a glass, followed by the swoosh.

Guess it must have been necessary, for gentleman in question woke up not only to the plop, plop and swoosh, but also to find a "parrucca" a top a coke bottle, remnants from the night before. Such is life!

The Port still looks fairly empty, with roughly nine general cargo berths empty at time of writing.

The container berths, are as usual fully occupied.

She's stationed off and in Kisimayu.

Some of you might have noticed one of the Belgian air force helicopters flying up and down the channel over the past week.

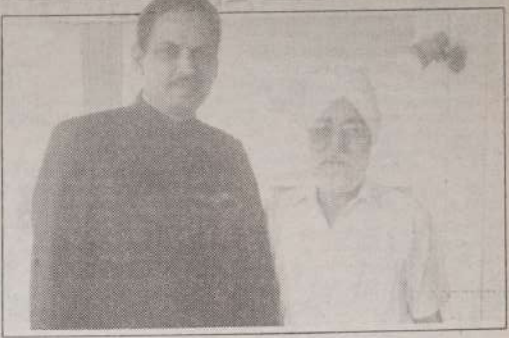
The *Anomis* will arrive carrying consignment of explosives and military equipment on the 26th.

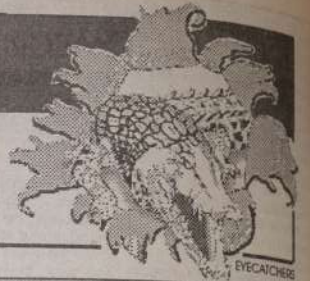

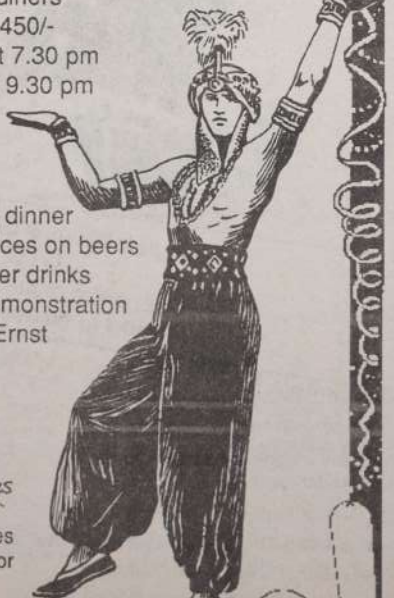

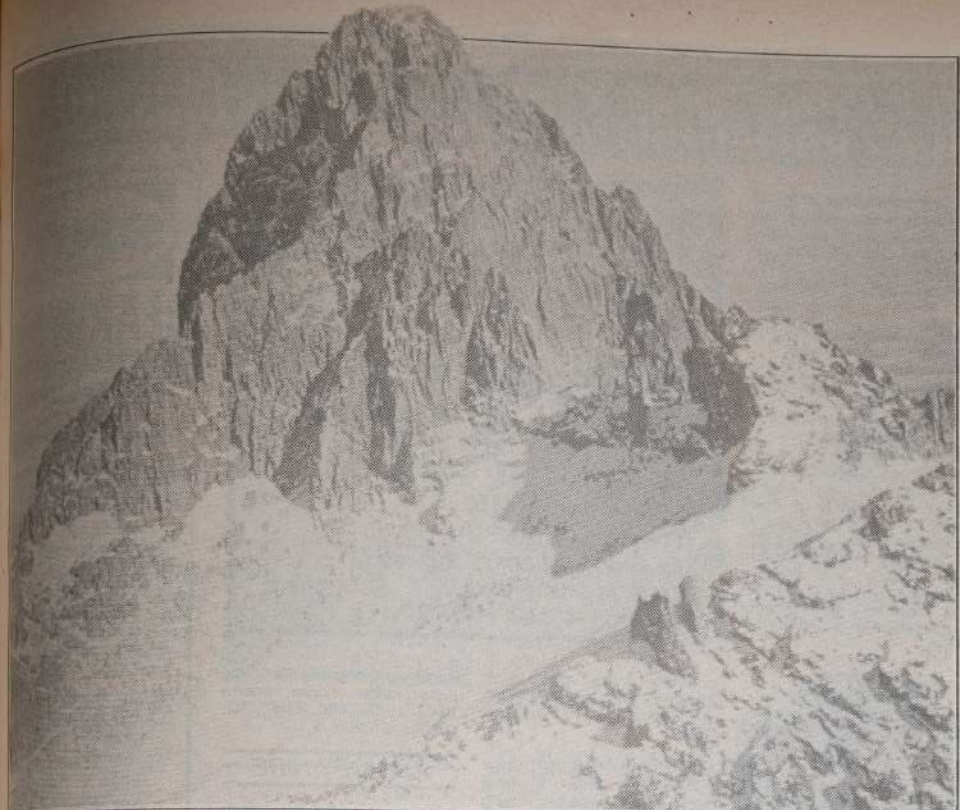

# Naro Moru River Lodge, die Basis für Bergtouren am Mount Kenya

Die zweieinhalbstündige Fahrt von Nairobi nach Naro Moru ist in jeder Jahreszeit sehr angenehm. Man fährt durch eine weite Hügelkette, an den steilen Kaffeefarmen, Obstplantagen, Reisfeldern, Getreidefeldern, zwischen hat man einen Blick auf Buschland, dichtes Urwald, Täler mit glitzernden Bächen, und erreicht schließlich das Herz des Kikuyulandes, den Mount Kenya.

Sie ist bekannt für hervorragende Organisation und ein komplettes Angebot an Trekking und Bergtouren mit erfahrenen Bergführern und Portieren, Verleih von Bergsteigerausrüstung, Transport der Bergsteiger zur meteorologischen Station, wo der Aufstieg beginnt.

Das Hauptgebäude des Hotels besteht aus einem angenehmen Speisesaal, ganz in Holz gehalten, der herrlich zum gemütlichen Bar mit internationaler Atmosphäre und

jeden Abend einem knisternden Kaminfeuer, dem Konferenzzentrum und Videozimmer sowie dem Lager für Bergsteigerausrüstung.

Es gibt ein separates Erstklassrestaurant mit Bar, das Dekor in lokalem Tannenholz; zu diesem Komplex gehören auch der beheizte Swimmingpool auf dem Deck mit atemberaubendem Blick auf den Mount Kenya, eine Sauna und Umkleieräume. Eine Squashhalle und zwei Tennisplätze ergänzen das reichhaltige Sportsangebot.

Wer weniger sportlich ist, kann auf dem Hotelgelände Vögel beobachten. Es wurden 257 verschiedene Vogelarten identifiziert, die man auf einem vier Kilometer langen Wanderweg beobachten kann.

Ferner gibt es Gelegenheit zum Forellenfischen; am mit Seerosen bedeckten Stausee können erholungsreiche Barbacues arrangiert werden, oder man

1977 kam er zu Alliance Hotels als Management Lehrling. Dabei erhielt er, wie er sagt "ein umfassendes Training in allen Sparten und Arten von Hotels. Bis 1981 war ich im *Jadini Beach Hotel*."

Auf Empfehlung von General Manager Chris Modigell und mit einem Stipendium von der österreichischen Regierung absolvierte er von 1981 bis 1982 einen Hotel Management Kurs in der Hotelfachschule im Schloß Kleinsheim, Salzburg, den er als erster Afrikaner mit Auszeichnung abschloß.

Er blieb weitere drei Monate in Österreich im Hotel Wende, um die Arbeitsweise in einem europäischen Hotel kennenzulernen und seine Kenntnisse in der deutschen Sprache zu verbessern.

Dann kehrte er nach Kenia zurück und wurde Assistant Front Office Manager im *Jadini Beach Hotel*. 1984 wurde er zum Front Office Manager in der *Africana Sea Lodge* befördert.

Im Juli 1985 wurde er wiederum befördert und zum Manager der *Naro Moru River Lodge* ernannt.

Er ist sehr stolz darauf, daß er bei der Erweiterung und Verbesserung der Lodge mitgewirkt hat, als 1988 und 1989 der beheizte Swimmingpool auf dem Deck mit Aussicht auf den Mount Kenya, das Restaurant, die Bar, Umkleieräume und Sauna gebaut wurden.

Er zeigt den Gästen immer gerne sein Hotel und ist ihnen behilflich, ihren Aufenthalt nach ihren Wünschen zu gestalten.

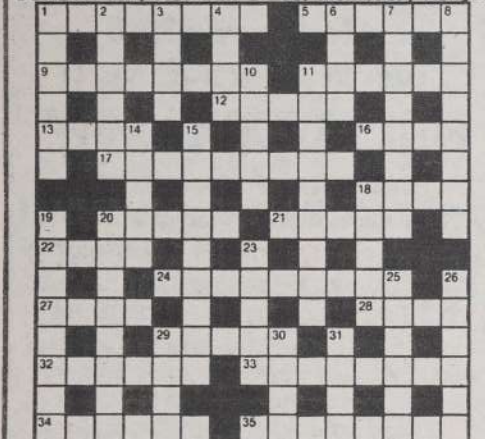

THE WORD horrific tends to creep in when newspapers report multi-fatality or serious injury accidents.

Some colleagues seem to have run out of suitable "superlatives" to describe their degree of revulsion when seemingly avoidable accidents take so much life.

I spent some time recently with a road safety expert in order to brush up on current thinking about how to reduce carnage on our roads.

I must immediately point out that I met the expert while she was on holiday on our beaches and had seen some of problems that we face.

The key areas to address in trying to reduce accident rates and injuries or fatalities are Education, Engineering and Enforcement.

I have written incessantly about the lack of effective

## Education, Engineering And Enforcement, Can Radically Reduce Road Accidents

pursuit of latter.

Making laws is fine but enforcement needs a whole cultural change in the people entrusted to do so.

Utsumi Iwata wrote is indeed a most noble appropriate motto and aim.

More rigorous and honest application of the law would go some way in addressing the issue.

Viewed by itself, however, this usually leads to the conclusion that all accidents are as a result of driver error.

This is not always the case. If you break the law then you have erred.

It requires more than just breaking the law for accidents occur.



Hence enforcement by itself is not the answer.

Education has mainly been limited to public awareness campaigns.

But again a one off blitz that cannot be sustained will not cure any ills.

A continuous dose of the correct information at the right time and place will gradually lead to people having a change in their mind set.

But this is in terms of years rather than months.

It could take a whole age group for the effect to be seen.

To rely on commercial organisations to foot the bill for public awareness campaigns or school and industry education programmes as has been the fashion is not the answer.

They can certainly contribute but a commitment must come from the National Road Safety

Council for a sustained and independently funded campaign to which willing donors can contribute.

For this to be realised, the organisation has to make itself credible and creditable vehicle for change that people can willingly invest in knowing that it will be put to the best use.

A lesson that those who run such organisations have to learn and convince the people who have money of their sincerity.

The road environment is another factor that contributes to accidents.

This can be put under the broad brush of Engineering.

The experts in this field are commonly called Highway Engineers.

The environment is probably one of the most powerful ways of influencing road behaviour and forcing changes in peoples' mind sets.

The environment should also be forgiving if people make mistakes.

A typical example is the

conflict between lighting up the road which reduce the emergency area that a motorist has.

The greening of cities and towns by the planting of trees close to edge and also in central reserve also encroaches on the motorist's escape area.

Another example of how engineering could reduce accidents is by introducing features that make people take only one option.

Imagine that you come across a heavy vehicle crawling up a crest of a slope on double lane single cartway at 10 kph.

Many motorists behind will be trying to overtake and increase the chances of a collision.

**SMART CHARLIES**

The simple solution is to widen the uphill stretch to two lanes to allow faster vehicles to overtake the slower ones.

This does not stop the smart Charlies who will then creep up and still overtake two vehicles by getting into the third lane meant for traffic going the other way.

The elegant and from the engineering point of view most effective solution is to also add a centre barrier to the road instead of just putting double lines to separate the two uphill from the single downhill lanes.

As Kachumburais says, have EA, will win!
