## 'EYES FOR EAST AFRICA' FUND IN ACTION

### D.O. Caleb Otieno Officially Opens Kwale Eye Centre

THE KWALE District Eye Centre has been opened by The D.O. of Kwale, Mr. Caleb Otieno. He was booked in as the first patient of the clinic and was given a thorough eye examination by the eye surgeon, Dr. Helen Roberts.

Mr. Otieno then planted a 'Bamba Kofi' tree donated by Mr. Mazrui of Bamburi's Diani Estate plant nursery.

Dr. Roberts diagnosed Mr. Otieno's eyes as healthy, a fortunate man indeed, for eye disease in Kwale District and in the whole of Kenya is very common.

One in every hundred people in Kenya are blind.

Many more suffer from eye diseases that compromise their sight.

The prevalence of eye disease is shocking, but more shocking, perhaps, is the fact that 80 per cent of people who are blind could have had their disability prevented, had there been facilities to treat them.

Kwale District Eye Centre is the only place South of Mombasa where patients can consult a fully qualified ophthalmic specialist and receive treatment for their

disease.

The clinic is situated at Waa, 11 km South of Likoni ferry, 800 m up the road leading to Kenya Calcium Products.

Soon there will be a huge sign donated by The Coca Cola Company to show you exactly where to go.

## GERMAN AID FOR LAMU

THE GERMAN Ambassador in Kenya, Mr. Bernd Mützelburg, and the Director of the National Museums of Kenya, Dr. Mohamed Ishakia, have signed an agreement under which Germany will provide approximately DM 61,000 (Kshs 2.75 million) for the restoration of the "Swahili House" - also called "Denhardt House" - in the historic centre of Lamu.

The house, which had been built in the early 19th century, served as a German Post Agency from November 22, 1888, until March 31, 1891, in order to improve communication links between Germany and the small German settler community in the Tana River Delta and in Lamu.

The building was classified by UNESCO in 1985.

As a result of a survey conducted by the Lamu Town Planning and Conservation Office in 1988, the National Museums of Kenya decided to give immediate attention to Swahili House which is, at present in a state of dilapidation.

The funds earmarked for the restoration of Swahili House are a donation under the German Foreign Ministry's budget line for "Efforts to Preserve Cultural Heritage".


### JAPANESE FUNDS AND FIRMS TO IMPROVE MOI AIRPORT

Moody heats up beautifully and the pizzas baked to a perfect crisp will bear evidence.

## HEALTH TIPS

### DEPRESSION - It's A Common Complaint

CAROL KNEW something was wrong with her, but could not figure out what it was.

For months she had noticed she was getting 'lazier and lazier'.

She overslept, yet woke up tired.

Housework was put off and she never had the energy to finish it.

Even washing herself and dressing became an effort.

She also felt miserable and irritable and quarrelled with her family.

Her friend found her too touchy and kept away.

Also, none of her former pursuits and hobbies pleased her any more.

Eating became a chore and when she lost weight became convinced she had AIDS or cancer.

And that was not the whole story.

She worried over everything, blamed herself for this and that, felt utterly useless and lost confidence in herself.

After a while she began fantasizing of dying and ending it all.

Carol suffered from depression that was only moderate in intensity.

Had it got any worse it would have progressed to a point where she could not even move out of bed, would not eat or drink, and probably contemplate or attempt suicide.

Depression is more than ordinary sadness.

Its milder form is so common most people pass it off as just moodiness.

But severer forms are incapacitating.

Some people may drop out of school, or work or even relationships as a result.

For instance, unsuspecting spouses may mistake depression in their partners to be sloth,

quarrelsomeness, loss of interest or even as a sign of ongoing extramarital affairs.

And because many marriages are as taught as a tight rope it needs only this extra factor to snap them.

Depressed people sometimes manage to hide their misery from others and show a smiling exterior.

Smiling and looking optimistic is in these days.

But truly depressed people smile with effort.

An experienced observer can see that these smiles do not reach the ears and that the eyes look sad.

Another group of depressed people go to the doctor with physical complaints which have no real physical basis.

It is more socially acceptable to have physical rather than psychological problems and such patients are often looking for someone to tell their misery.

In the experience of some colleagues, interviewing such sympathetically sometimes causes a flood of tears that helps to make the diagnosis.

Interesting enough, earlier European researchers

thought that depression was uncommon in Africa.

They thought that the African was so simple that he lived in ignorant bliss unlike the sophisticated

Europeans who had more to worry about.

In reality depression is as common here as elsewhere.


Whether it occurred to such extent previously is uncertain.

The research methods used then were faulty, being mainly hospital based and using debatable study tools.

It is likely also that Africans paid little attention to depression.

One indicator is that many local cultures lack a word for the condition.







# A Versatile Jumbo, Three Ways To Spell Moquadishu, And Why Steve B Is At Sea

THE VERSATILE *JUMBO CALLISTO* arrived last week and dropped the hook at 'A' anchorage. Versatile she certainly appears to be, for she's listed as being a RoRo Cargo-General Cargo-Dock Ship Barge Carrier. Built in 1983, she's had a couple of changes in name, but nearly always reverting to one of her former names, except in one instance in 1990 when she was known as the *Tiger Creek*.

She was christened the *Callisto* and kept that name until 1988, whence she became known as the *Jumbo Callisto* for a year, reverting back to plain *Callisto* in 90, just briefly though, for during the same year she became the *Tiger Creek* and then back again to *Jumbo Callisto* as she presently is known!

She boasts capacity of some 444 x 20 containers including 20 reefers, a lane length of 430 metres and two cranes of 35 SWL each.

She's got quite a bit of a proboscis in the form of her bulbous bow, which is a little different in comparison to the 'usual' bulbous bows, in so far as it is 'turned-up', rather like that of a haughty lady.

She is powered by MAK 6M453AK Main Engines, producing 4,000 bhp or 2,942 Kw if you prefer.

*Jumbo Callisto* has arrived from Mogadishu, where she's been busy delivering cargo.

Several 'long time no see' ladies turned up in port the other day.

They being the Somali registered fishing trawlers *Cusmaan Gedi Raage*, *Farax Omar* and *21 Oktober* as well as the reefer *21 Oktober II*.

I understand that the *21 Oktober III* and *21 Oktober IV* should be arriving within the next couple of days.

Interesting to note is the variations in spelling.

*Oktober* for one, and then the port of registry, 'Mogadishu' in one instance, and 'Mogadishu' in the others.

I believe that there are about five different ways of spelling the town.

We shall see?

The KPA will shortly be taking possession of another anti-oil pollution vessel, named, we are told the *Faglo*.

Her predecessor the *Mafutasaw*, thankfully, little action in the way of dealing with oil spills, and is now sadly, just a heap of rust.

Let's hope that the *Faglo* doesn't have too much cleaning-up to do in the future, and is naturally maintained thoroughly to deal with such spills should they ever occur.

There was a not unexpected quick turn-around for the vehicle carrier *Crystal Ace* which arrived on Saturday morning, disgorged her 290 odd vehicles and was out that afternoon.

The Belgian Naval vessel *Zinnia* arrived in as well, and sailed on Tuesday after a nice weekend of R & R.

I noticed that she had a fair few bundles of razor wire slacked on her fore deck.

*Zinnia* is 'stationed' at Kisimayu and comes to Mombasa every few weeks or so, so has become a 'regular' visitor.



# Airport Plan Will Include Strengthening And Rehabilitation Of The Main Runway

The Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association at its recent committee meeting at the Oceanic Hotel heard from the General Manager, Moi International Airport, Mr. S.K. Nyole, that the main contractors - **Tankenaka and Mitsubishi** - are on site making the necessary preliminary arrangements, including the setting up of a site office, to start on these major improvements which will take 21 months to complete.

These include a new terminal for international traffic situated next to the existing terminal which is to be rehabilitated and used solely for local flights.

Work also includes the rehabilitation and strengthening of the runway, and the extension of the apron to accommodate three jumbo-size jets at one time.

Hangars are going to be provided for light aircraft, while the control tower will be receiving new navigational equipment.

The car park is being enlarged and roads within the airport attended to, while the whole perimeter area will be fenced for security.

Said Mr. Nyole 'it will be an international airport of which Kenya and Mombasa can truly be proud'. The MCTA meeting was chaired by Mrs. Fahab Mwendwa, First Deputy Chairman, in the absence of Zul Harunani, Chairman.

He is now member of the Board of Directors of the National Water Conservation Pipeline Authority and was at a meeting in Nairobi.

MCTA welcomed a new committee member, Mrs. Vicky Letaipan, Chairman, Air Operators Committee, Coast.

Vicky is Manager of **British Airways** Mombasa Office.

Discussion on matters concerning the Mombasa Municipal Council had to be postponed as its representative was not present.

Mrs. Loma Hayes, MCTA's Chief Executive and KAHC's Executive Secretary, Coast, reported on a hotelkeepers meeting which had been addressed by the Chairman and Managing Director of the National Water Conservation Pipeline Authority who had imparted the good and long awaited news that water from Baricho (Malindi) would be increased by

some 30,000 cubic metres a day from around November this year.

A 15-strong team from the Authority had turned up at the KAHC meeting including directors and some engineers.

On the question of security, committee members heard there had been two recent delegations from the tourist industry (MCTA/KAHC/KATO) to the Kenya Police Headquarters, Coast, to discuss how this could be strengthened, while a 27-strong delegation went to see President Moi on his recent visit to the Coast to also discuss this issue as well as to ask for the speedy setting up of a Tourism Authority of Kenya.

Said Kurt Zurcher, Resident Manager, **Hotelpian** International Travel Organisation, Switzerland,

who is MCTA's overseas tour operators representative's security measures taken by the police on the day of the IPK strike were very good.

Tourists arriving and departing Moi International Airport were given police escort and travelled in convoys of 'mini' buses.

Mr. Zurcher, who was with the delegation visiting President Moi said 'we were all most impressed by how well informed the President is on tourism'.

The delegation was from MCTA, KAHC, KATO and included five overseas tour operators.

Generally speaking, MCTA committee members felt that such greater concern is being shown towards the development of the tourism industry.

As far as tourism trends are concerned, Mr. Zurcher reported that tourism may pick up slowly and surely if such incidents as riots cease and the situation remains calm.

It was felt that little or no damage had been done to the tourist trade through reports on recent riots.

It was agreed that Mrs. Aase Sondhi, a MCTA executive member who was attending the World Tourist Day event in London should be asked to represent MCTA.

Other hoteliers from the Kenya coast were also attending.

## HIRE CARS

It was reported at the meeting that some hire cars are being harassed by Nyali Bridge personnel claiming they had recently passed through without paying the bridge toll.

It was the previous hirer of the car who had been at fault.

It was agreed that managers of hire companies should be approached if their cars are involved.

Mrs. Mwendwa read to members recommendations by the Coast Development Authority submitted for discussion at a recent Resource Management Workshop at which the tourist industry was well represented and papers presented.

Of late Councils have been proposing the implementation of a levy based on the number of hotel beds.

It was felt they should not charge the tourist industry or tourists.

**Exporter Assistance Scheme Is Well On It's Way!**

IN ITS first eighteen months of operation, the Kenya Exporter Assistance Scheme has allocated almost \$1.4 million to nearly 140 companies in support of over 230 projects aimed at the development of long term sustainable exports.

Results to date indicate that over \$30 million will accrue to the Kenyan economy as a result of the two year pilot project, set to complete in April 1994, but already a further two year programme is being discussed.

Nearly thirty Coast manufacturers have participated in the scheme and, having successfully developed their Export Marketing expertise, are now exporting their products into a variety of markets which include the PTA, North America and Canada, Europe, South Africa and the Middle East.

The industry sector profile includes Clothing, Textiles and Footwear, Chemicals, Food and Food Products, Handicraft, Steel and Metal Products, Plastics and Packaging, Paper Products, Fish and Furniture.

KEAS is an integrated promotional and assistance package that encourages business leaders to put more resources into Export Expansion thus meeting Kenya's principal medium term objective of generating foreign exchange earnings and productively absorbing the rapidly expanding workforce.

Outside Nairobi, Mombasa and the Coastal area have been the main target focus and a large client base has been established.

During one of his regular visits to local clients, Mr. Brian Buckley, a Director of KEAS, also met with a number of new potential exporters and encouraged them to emulate the success of the local manufacturing community.

He said that the ongoing improvements in export facilitation being implemented by the Export Programmes Promotions Office in the Treasury had greatly encouraged manufacturers to enter the market and to expand existing export markets.

The rapid success of the scheme is an indication of the potential that exists for Kenyan manufacturers.

## ADVANTAGES

Those companies on the coast have a particular advantage with greater proximity and access to the countries main export port resulting in shorter delivery times and lower freight charges.

KEAS is being implemented by TDI, the Trade Development Institute of Ireland, which has extensive experience of such schemes in both developed and developing countries.

DIE Krokodilfarm "Mamba Village" entstand im Jahre 1984, weil die menschenfressenden Krokodile im und am Tanafluß eine große Bedrohung für die in dieser Gegend lebende Bevölkerung darstellten.

Die Wildhüter des Kenya Wildlife Service waren ständig auf der Jagd nach diesen gefährlichen Panzerechsen, um die Menschen vor ihnen zu schützen.





# Drugs, Drinks And Driving - A Deadly Dilemma On The Road

FOR THE next two weeks I will be busy with driving under the influence of drugs (It is not only drinking that is dangerous) and look at how the so-called developed countries are trying to tackle the problem without encroaching on the citizen's freedom.

I am grateful to Kachumbari who has done most of the donkey work. In his travels, he went out of his way to pick up little snippets of information and send them back to me.

We will start with Germany. The authorities there have long prided themselves on the successful rehabilitation of drink offenders.

The programmes used have reduced the number of repeat offenders from 17 per cent to 13 per cent.

The programmes were set up mainly in response to the well documented carnage on the autobahns, where speed limits are practically non-existent.

The programmes are extremely 'humane' as they are tailored to the type of offence and the driving history of the offender.

The mildest programme is for first time offenders.

It is spread over two or three weeks and involves up to six sessions.

The programme is more of a shock and educate seminar where the students are shown videos of serious accidents and reminded of existing traffic and alcohol consumption laws.

The second group of first time offenders (who have committed more serious offences) also undergo similar programmes.

They meet over several weeks of therapy can last up to or even beyond two years.

They are more intensely screened and given preliminary medical checks.

These groups normally consist of between six to ten people.

The third group, taking three weeks, is involved in intensive medical evaluations as well as therapy.

The fourth, and most comprehensive programme, is known as the Individual Psychological Rehabilitation for

## Alcohol-Impaired Drivers (or IRAK).

This is a three to six week course which is highly intensive and is geared to the high risk offender who is likely to repeat the offence.

The main thing about the

programmes is that they are voluntary.

If one is apprehended for an offence that was committed whilst under the influence of drink, they have to first appear in court and if found guilty are sentenced.

The driver can then apply to enter the programme through the relevant driving authorities.

If they approve the court is then notified and the driver is allowed to attend the course first.

If the driver completes the course successfully, the period of suspension from driving can be reduced by up to fifteen per cent.

The programme is still run on a voluntary basis and is rated as a success.

There are now moves afoot to persuade the law makers to include it in the statute books.

There are people who have their reservations about this move.

Taking away the voluntary nature of the existing programme could reduce the success rate since people would go as a result of being required to, rather than because they were willing to give it a go.

The motivation to succeed would be reduced drastically.

The cops and law makers in the United States of America have found this out already and are having to be creative to make their programmes work.

In America, statistics show that someone is caught drink driving every 23 minutes.

The penalties are becoming stricter and more ingenious.

Special number plates can mark repeat offenders, written test single out problem drinkers and in some twenty eight states, offenders' vehicles carry a machine that prevents the engine from starting if it sniffs alcohol in the drivers breath.

The set up of the country is such that laws on drink driving will vary from state to state.

However, most people who get booked for driving whilst under the influence can be sent to rehabilitation programmes.

Drink drivers are often repeat offenders.

Some States have found that prison sentences are not as effective as forced attendance at the so called Alcoholic Anonymous groups.

In one of the States, the court insists that each drink driver take a psychological test and complete a treatment programme.

In some States, the licence is taken away but that causes problems in rural areas where there is hardly any form of public transport.

One of the States has authorised the confiscation of repeat offenders' cars whilst other states impound or put clamps on the vehicle to stop them from being used.

In some States the laws are becoming draconian.

One of the States has introduced special license plates which start with the letter 'Z' for third time offenders.

The cops are allowed to stop them at any time for a Breathalyser test.

Some States take the punitive measures to their root.




