in everyday language, to reduce energy intake means to eat just enough of energy giving foods to meet daily

Any excess of these is stored as fat.

Most people advice a structured diet that keeps a close watch on the calories consumed each day.

Visiting a distician to work it out is advisable.

The other way to get rid of excess weight, is to burn it off (that is increase energy
