Tourist Information Bureau Given 'Spring Cleaning' And A New Roof

WITH A lump of its ceiling falling down, the much talked about plans to extend the Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association's Information Bureau in Moi Avenue had to be immediately activated but, because of financial constraints, on a less grandiose scale.

It is being extended at the front and back to give it a reception area, Executive Office, small meeting room and kitchenette.

Work is expected to take ten weeks.

In the meantime, MCTA staff are housed in the Glory Car Hire office next door.

In its early days, it had been known as the East African Tourist Travel Association with an office in the Port, later becoming MCTA and moving to premises on Moi Avenue (then Killindini Road) in 1963.

Edward Rodwell, who recently achieved journalistic fame (and a world record) by keeping his

Coast Causerie column in The Standard running for 50 years, had been invited to lay the foundation stone, he being founder member of the association.

He was not feeling well, so sent his apologies.

Mrs. Lorna Hayes, Executive Officer became the stone layer instead, and was cheered as the Chairman, Zul Harunani, said 'I do not know of anyone so hard working as Lorna in the cause of tourism'.

Adding 'she was the MCTA chairman for 21 years since 1967. We wish her a long life'.

Among the guests at the ceremony were the Town Clerk of Mombasa, Mr. David Randu who was accompanied by the Town Clerk of Zanzibar, Mr. Juma Musa, who was on a Familiarisation Tour of the Town.

They were welcomed by the chairman who also introduced

his committee members with a special tribute to 'our very hard working Second Deputy Chairman, Mr. Najib Balala, who is also Chairman of the Extension Committee as well as of several others'.

The Mombasa Eye and Blood Clinic project has been undertaken by the "The Lions Club of Mombasa", and is a multi million shilling venture designed to provide a Six Floor General Hospital in the centre of Mombasa.

This project will provide among other Medical Facilities:

- A Diagnosis and Treatment Department to cater for Eye diseases, including operating and laser treatment facilities.
- A Department to cater for the safe storage of donated Eyes and Blood, and
- A Facility to cater for dental care, Ear, Nose and Throat Treatment, a Diabetic section.

"The general concept of the Clinic will provide substantial subsidised medical facilities to the many thousands of our less fortunate Kenyans, who quite simply can otherwise just not afford this type of medical assistance at present."

The Mombasa Polio Plus Project has been launched by the Rotary Club of Mombasa who have undertaken to totally eradicate Poliomyelitis in the Coast Province and Kenya in general.

"Every two minutes another child falls victim to Poliomyelitis, and 750 new cases each day amounts to the staggering figure of 275,000 new cases world-wide.

"This daily tragedy played out in Poor Villages and Urban Areas gets little public attention.

"The question is "Can this tragic waste of young human life be stopped?" The answer is "Yes".

"With our help and financial assistance the committee of the Mombasa Polio Plus Project will utilise the funds raised to mobilize Immunization Staff and Vehicles, so as to effectively carry out the total immunization programme in hundreds of small villages in the Coast Province."

HEALTH TIPS

The Agony Of An AIDS Diagnosis ...

THE AGONY of every doctor these days is to tell a patient that he has the AIDS virus.

A little while ago, a young professional lady went to see her doctor after she received news that her boyfriend of 1991 had died.

She also noticed some whitish flakes on her tongue and had just recovered from a month long diarrhoea.

Then started the real fear that she had AIDS.

Her doctor agreed to test her.

As is the case with many doctors, both he and the patient were worried for different reasons.

She feared she was positive and he was uncertain what to tell her if the result was indeed confirmed.

So with the usual nervous comforting words such as 'don't worry, it may be negative' and 'I've seen cases like yours and did not have HIV' the doctor sent her off quite certain that she had the virus.

When the lab report came, it was positive.

That put him in a spot, what and how to tell her.

He also felt a sense of helplessness frustration that he, who was meant to offer hope, could do so little to help the young lady.

Doctors respond differently to a positive test.

Some get so angry at their helplessness that they blurt out the result to the patients and send them packing.

Others are so scared of the patient's reaction to the news that they avoid testing as much as possible.

They rationalize that it would not change the management much if their patients knew, and the result would only make their lives miserable.

A related group test the patient secretly and then inform the relatives the result.

Both enter into conspiratorial silence which in the long run causes more suffering to the patient than it

alleviates.

Then there are the doctors who send confirmed cases promptly off to a counsellor to do the informing.

AIDS scares doctors as much as it does their patients.

It reminds them of their own mortality and limitations.

A little while ago I said the doctors like to feel that they can deal with anything.

And they like their patients to share this myth.

But AIDS is another matter.

Behind the self confidence, soothing and hope giving most medicines are really shaken by the epidemic.

Many go over their own past with a toothpick to see if they might have contracted the virus themselves through sexual contact or handling blood products.

Research available indicates that it is not so easy to get AIDS through handling body fluids, especially if proper precautions are taken.

Even pricking yourself with contaminated needles rarely leads to infection.

But that gives scant comfort.

One might just be the statistic that do pick up the virus that way.

To go back to our story, the patient who was tested finally showed up.

She suspected she was positive and was extremely alert to any hint the doctor gave that she had the disease.

His lengthy talk about the weather, designed to prepare for the shock, only made her more worried.

Finally he told her.

Despite her prior suspicion the result hit her like a bomb and froze her in her seat.

It would take a week for it to sink in, two months of flirting with suicide and then finally a resigned acceptance.

Incidentally, she had infected three other men since 1991.

The etchings incorporate many collaged layers of texture and colour, the wood engravings are printed on transparent Japanese tissue and float on top of the etchings.

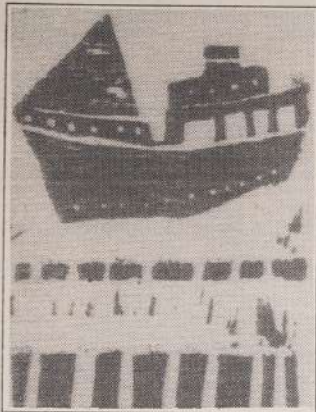
Also on show are a number of mixed media drawings.

Mamba Tonight

THE LACK of traffic and street lights in many places has again been discussed by the Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association monthly meeting and despite assurances by the Mombasa Municipal Council it appeared very little had been done.

Consequently, MCTA decided on a 'Brainstorming' delegation to the Mayor to further discuss issues which need immediate attention.

The chairman and committee members expressed disappointment at the fact that no representative from the council was present at the meeting.

Several important issues needed answering.

It was suggested that the representative should be a 'man of action', that is an executive officer such as the Town Clerk.

One of the issues was the removal of the Kibarani Rubbish Dump to a more suitable site.

The Chairman reported that MCTA and the Coast Development Authority were looking for an alternative site so as help expedite the matter.

It was also noted that in view of the increasing population expert advice should be sought on the suitability of any new site and its effect on the environment.

TOURIST MARKET IMPROVES

On Tourism Trends, Shaikat Pervaiz, UTC's General Manager Touring, Coast reported that the English market is picking up again and more charters are being planned for Summer 1994 into Mombasa.

As far as the UK tour operators

MCTA also decided to form its own Marketing Committee to further promote tourism to Kenya, particularly to the Coast. The chairman is Najib Balala, Second Deputy Chairman.

resident manager, Hotelplan, Switzerland) 'the German market looks quite promising.'

Tour operators catering for the cheaper end of the market are enjoying booming business, while the more up-market clientele remains quite stable.

On the Swiss market he said tour operators were experiencing around a 20 per cent increase in turnover compared to last year.

All destinations were selling, with the exception of Kenya.

He mentioned that the three flights a week to the Caribbea are all fully booked.

Mr. Zurcher noted that for this winter season, tour operators had been cautious about increasing the number of charter seats.

No one wanted to take the risk of their not being filled.

MARINE PARKS SUCCESS

Also discussed was the new Mombasa Marine Park Conservation Fund introduced on November 1 whereby tourists from overseas staying at beach hotels between Canon Point, Shanzu, and

English Point, Nyali are being requested to contribute Dollars two per stay to this KWS fund.

It enables them to enter the Mombasa Marine Park and Reserve without charge.

Otherwise the prescribed fee is Shs 300/- for entry to the Marine Park.

Kenyan residents are being requested to pay shs 50/- per stay.

MCTA committee members were of the opinion that the scheme had taken off well and that the response from tourists had been very good.

Mr. Donald Mwakoyo, Provincial Wildlife Officer, Coast, who was representing Ali A. Kaka, Senior Warden Marine Parks at the MCTA committee meeting, said that the programme had been officially launched by the KWS Director, Dr. Richard Leakey.

Payments to this fund are received by hotels from their guests.

Mr. Mwakoyo mentioned that hoteliers can also collect this money in Kenyan currency so long as it is the equivalent of Dollars two. This, he said, had solved a lot of problems.

Under the scheme KWS undertakes the cleaning of beaches.

Said Mr. Mwakoyo 'we are grateful to the KWS director for giving us authority to add ten more to our staff.'

Adding 'at the moment we have trained 20 people to do beach cleaning'.

He mentioned this is being done on an experimental basis for one month.

They will then see if hoteliers are satisfied.

If not, they will seek a further meeting to discuss the possibility of using their staff to clean the beach and KWS share the cost.

On the question of beach security Mr. Mwakoyo said 'we have very few rangers, but have also been authorised to add more when we will be in a better position to take care of security on the beach.'

He went on 'we hope to enrol more who will be taken to our base at Manyani for training. By early January or February they will be working with us here.'

He revealed that 17 hotels had joined the KWS scheme and it is hoped that African Safari Club might do so soon.

Said Kurt Zurcher 'The European tourist does not mind at all paying Dollars two to KWS. Many were delighted to hear about it and in some cases it was the tourist pushing hotel managements into co-operating with the scheme.'

Mrs. Aase Sondhi, a member of the MCTA Executive reported on the Post-Mortem meeting on Kenya Tourism Day in London.

She said 'everyone was pleased with the results which were much better than we had hoped for'.

She considered there should be more such presentations and that perhaps other trades could be involved as well.

KENYA TOURISM EXHIBITS

Mr. Najib Balala, Second Deputy Chairman, announced that the Kenya International Tourism Exhibition 1994 is being held from 27 - 30 at KICC and that its promotion and marketing was already being attended to.

Mr. Balala said he had recently visited Tanzania and Zanzibar and could personally confirm their

participation.

Mr. Balala is Vice-Chairman of KITE's national committee representing the coast region.

MCTA is forming a KITE sub-committee which will be under his chairmanship.

At the MCTA committee meeting a representative of Local Charters Airlines, Mr. Gilbert Kibe, who is Director of Eagle Aviation, announced the launching of a package holiday to Zanzibar from Mombasa by his company.

Flights there were twice a week on Thursdays and Fridays and the package included transporting clients to and from airport and their hotels while in Zanzibar they enjoy a conducted tour of the island.

This holiday package covers one or two days in Zanzibar.

company's annual trophies and awards to the dealers and sales staff.

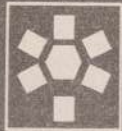

A Barge Laden With 'Jack Rigs' For San Marco Rocket Platform

THE **UNICORN LINES** general cargo vessel **Frontier** sailed out at the beginning of the week. High out of the water having discharged her 8000 odd tonnes of cargo consisting in the most part of bagged fertiliser, with steel coils, wire rods, pallets and other general cargo.

Frontier is an SD 14 Class of ship, that was particularly popular in the seventies, eighties, and still is although more so for the 'tramping' owners.

I believe that **Frontier** is one of the up-graded class, many of which were built in the Brazilian yards.

She certainly looks pretty with her blue bulwarks, bright red boot topping and then of course the duller red anti-fouling.

She has a crane as well as derricks serving Number Two and Three hatches, with derricks serving the rest (that is One, Four and Five).

The port appears to be a lot more busy than it has been for the past few weeks with customers at nearly all the berths, save three.

Sunday saw the arrival of the Pioneer Offshore tug **Swisco 118** together with a barge laden with rig jacks, which after refurbishment at Mombasa, are destined for the San Marco platform at Ngomeni Bay.

There are eight jacks in total, each one weighing roughly 40m. tonnes, so some heavy pieces there.

The jacks will replace those on the San Marco platform which in turn need refurbishment and other attention, and are used as I'm sure you can imagine, for jacking the platform up and down, which I believe is done simultaneously, in preparation for shifting to different angles, according to the 'window' in the sky in preparation for satellite

launches.

Tug and tow sailed from Singapore in the beginning of November and arrived here as mentioned on Sunday, so quick calculation makes a transit time of roughly five weeks.

The lovely luxury motor yacht **Sea Sedan** is presently tied-up at the Lwatori moorings that are usually occupied by the salvage tug's **Bleon 1, Barbara** as well as the supply vessel **Steve B.**

So the buoys didn't remain lonely for too long, and are most certainly, with the presence of **Sea Sedan**, graced with a most pleasant, and elegant lady.

I suppose I should have said elegantly-lined lady, however I think the 'lined' would have been unfitting in this case, perhaps more in keeping with a dowager yacht!

CONSIDERABLE interest was shown in the Aquatank from South Africa parked on the Ballroom Terrace at Mombasa Inter-Continental Resort which can be packed into the boot of a car. You just add water for an instant Dam!

Declared Jonathan Sykes, Sales Director, Aquatan-Gundie 'you can't find a cheaper way to contain water'.

Adding 'it can be used as a fish tank as well as storing water for irrigation purposes and plant nurseries'.

Aquatank-Gundie were at the Kentax exhibition in Nairobi, then holding a seminar afterwards and inviting key people from government organisations, civil consulting engineers and civil contractors which generated lots of interest and inquiries.

Said Mr. Sykes 'so we decided it would be prudent to do the same at Mombasa and chose Mombasa Inter-Continental Resort as an ideal venue for our

presentation, our main thrust being to promote geomembrane linings and man-made pools'.

The seminar took place in the Ballroom and the presentation outside on the Ballroom Terrace.

Mr. Sykes mentioned that a 'major issue in Nairobi and Mombasa is how to store water in the rainy season for use in the dry season when rivers often run dry and there is insufficient water'.

'This can be done' he said by using geomembrane linings for the storage of drinking and irrigation

water as well as for fish farming and ornamental lakes'.

Adding 'geomembranelinings are seen to be a future replacement for reinforced concrete'.

'It is non-toxic, chemically inert and has been used worldwide for the storage of drinking water'.

'Major cost benefits which come into play are a saving of about 50 per cent compared to concrete'.

'They are durable and fully ultra-violet stabilised. The covers actually float up and down as the water level fluctuates'.

He went on 'we are providing not only South African produced materials such as high and low

density polyethylene and ethyl-vinyl acetates, but are also representing Gundie Lining Systems out of Houston, Texas, USA in their range of geomembrane linings'.

'These' he said 'are for the storage of liquids not necessarily water, but chemicals also toxic and hazardous waste liquids'.

Mr. Sykes mentioned that although they are a South African based company they have a local contact in Kenya through Githongo and associates, Box 47089, Nairobi.

Aquatank (Pty) Limited was formed by Clifford Gundie (a South African geomembrane pioneer) as a specialist company over 25 years ago.

During this period they have formulated, produced and laid over ten million square metres of its various geomembrane products.

A BIG STEP forward in Environmental affairs has been taken at a three-day workshop at Mombasa Inter-Continental Resort on the proposed formation of an Environmental Economics Network for Eastern and Southern Africa.

The thirty-five attending were mostly academicians from 12 countries including Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, Botswana, Zambia, Zimbabwe, South Africa, Namibia, Mozambique, Ethiopia and Eritrea.

They are specialists in the area of environmental economics, or Heads of Departments of Economics with an interest in the environment.

There were also various Ministries represented as well as two NGO organisations.

In addition, there were visitors from the Environmental

Senior Environmentalists Discuss World Economic Trends Affecting Africans

Economics Unit of the University of Goteborg, Sweden; World Bank, UNDP and IDRC (International Research Corporation), Canada.

In an interview at the hotel, the Co-Ordinator Dr. Mohamed Jama, Senior Lecturer in Environmental Economics at Nairobi University said 'it is the first workshop of its kind in Africa, with people from Eastern and Southern Africa initiating the idea of such a Network two years ago'.

He went on 'discussion at the

workshop had revolved around a document they had prepared proposing the formation of an Environmental Economics Network for this region, which had been 'accepted in principle'.

Adding 'it was three days well spent, very fruitful and productive. Everyone left feeling very good about it'.

Said Dr. Jama 'now we have a mandate to go ahead from participants and donors we hope that by next March we will have a Secretariat in Nairobi representing this region'.

Continuing he said 'we want to link research with policies so that politicians, policy and decision makers get to know problems about the environment'.

As far as environmental economics are concerned we can give them advice, based on research'.

Adding 'we also seek to have a multi-disciplinary link with geologists, marine biologists and so on so that we get their expertise and use our economics to link with relevant issues'.

Dr. Jama explained 'the idea of such a Network is basically demand driven (not donor driven) based on the needs of the people in this region of Africa'.

However, before we even begin to talk about serious research we need to develop a critical mass of people who are competent'.

Consequently, we are going to have another workshop, hopefully at this hotel'.

It will be for policymakers - the first being for senior people from governments in this region'.

Other workshops will be for academicians - people with an economic background whom we would like to train in environmental economics'.

He continued 'we are going to use the tools of economics and apply them to the environment, that is natural resources, wildlife, marine parks, forests etc'.

In conclusion he mentioned that everyone had been very happy at the hotel which had looked after them all exceedingly well'.

AUCH IN DIESEM Jahr wird African Safari Club seinem Konzept getreu bleiben, hilfsbedürftige Menschen mit Spenden zu unterstützen.

Den Mitgliedern des Organisationskomitees ist es in diesem Jahr schwer gefallen, sich zwischen den vorgeschlagenen Projekten zu entscheiden.

Aus diesem Grunde hat das Komitee entschieden, dass die diesjährigen Spenden zu gleichen Teilen an das POLIO HILFSWERK und an die AUGEN UND BLUT KLINIK IN MOMBASA gehen werden.

Das Komitee möchte unseren Gästen nachfolgend kurz erklären, welche Ziele diese beiden Projekte verfolgen:

Mombasa Augen und Blut Klinik

Dieses Projekt wurde durch den Lions Club of Mombasa ins Leben gerufen und wird ein Unterfangen von mehreren Millionen Schilling sein, um ein sechsstöckiges, öffentliches Krankenhaus im Herzen von Mombasa zu errichten.

Dieses Krankenhaus wird mitunter folgende medizinische Einrichtungen beherbergen:

- Eine Abteilung zur Erkennung und Behandlung von Augenkrankheiten mit Operationsräumen und Möglichkeiten zur Laserbehandlung.
- Eine Abteilung, in der gespandete Augen und gespandetes Blut fachgerecht gesammelt werden können.
- Eine Einrichtung zur Zahn-, Hals-, Nasen- und Ohrenbehandlung.

lung und eine diabetische Abteilung.

Das grundsätzliche Konzept der Einrichtung wird es sein, eine fundierte und subventionierte medizinische Einrichtung den tausenden von Kenianern zur Verfügung zu stellen, die ansonsten finanziell nicht dazu in der Lage sind, sich medizinisch behandeln zu lassen.

Mombasa Polio Hilfswerk

Dieses Projekt wurde von dem "Rotary Club of Mombasa" ins Leben gerufen, der sich zum Ziel

gesetzt hat, Polio d.h. Kinderlähmung an der Küste sowie in ganz Kenia auszurotten.

Alle zwei Minuten wird ein Kind Opfer der sogenannten Polio-myelitis, und 750 neue Fälle am Tag führen zu einer erschütternden Zahl von jährlich insgesamt 272'000 neuen Fällen weltweit.

Diese Tragödie, die sich hauptsächlich in armen Dörfern und in ländlichen Gegenden abspielt, erregt leider kaum öffentliches Interesse.

Die Frage ist: "Kann dieser bedauerlichen Verschwendung menschlichen Lebens Einhalt

gebolen werden?" Die Antwort ist "Ja!"

Mit unserer Hilfe und der finanziellen Unterstützung durch die eingenommenen Spenden kann das Komitee des Polio Hilfswerkes Mitarbeiter mobilisieren, welche die dringend notwendigen Impfungen vornehmen können, sowie Fahrzeuge beschaffen, die diese Mitarbeiter in die zum Teil abgelegenen kleinen Dörfer entlang der Küste befördern.

Das Komitee der Wohltätigkeits Beach Party freut sich über jegliche Spenden, die zur Unterstützung der beiden Projekte beitragen werden.

GEMÄLDEAUSSTELLUNG IM ALTEN GERICHTSGEBÄUDE

DER RECHT aktive Kunstkreis an der Küste (Coast Art Circle) hat einen Malerwettbewerb zum Thema "400 JAHRE FORT JESUS" ausgeschrieben. Auf gerufen wurden in erster Linie Kinder und junge Künstler. 60 Schulen an der Küste wurden aufgefordert, sich zu beteiligen.

Die Reaktion war eher mäßig; bis kurz vor Ablauf des Einreichetermins am 5. November waren nur wenige Bilder abgegeben worden. Über raschenderweise entstand dann eine Art von

Torschlusspanik (ein kleiner Junge lieferte sogar sein noch nasses Kunstwerk buchstäblich in letzter Minute per Taxi ab), so daß die Preisrichter schließlich aus 360 Bildern die besten aussuchen und an die Gewinner schöne Preise verteilen konnten.

Der Wettbewerb für Erwachsene ging weiter bis im Dezember. Bisher haben sich 25 Künstler aller Klassen und Rassen mit rund 100 Bildern angemeldet. Die Jury wird heute Freitag, den 10. Dezember 1993 die Auslese

treffen, und die Gemälde können im alten Gerichtsgebäude vom 11. bis 19. Dezember besichtigt werden. Die Ausstellung ist täglich von 10 bis 18 Uhr geöffnet - Eintritt frei.

Das Ergebnis vom Wettbewerb der Kinder war sehr erfreulich und es ist geplant, mindestens 30 ihrer Werke ebenfalls nochmals auszustellen. Viele der Bilder werden zum Verkauf angeboten. Sie eignen sich bestimmt bestens als Weihnachtsgeschenk oder als Andenken aus Kenia.

Ein Besuch der Gemäldeausstellung lohnt sich. Allein das Gebäude, das direkt neben dem Fort Jesus steht, ist eine Sehenswürdigkeit. Es ist ein alter Kolonialbau, der im Jahre 1902 entstand und als Gerichtsbau diente bis 1983, als die neuen modernen Gerichtsgebäude an anderer Stelle eröffnet wurden. Der alte Bau steht nun unter Denkmalschutz, und es ist vorgesehen, dort in Zukunft ständige wechselnde Ausstellungen abzuhalten.

Das Fort Jesus, das als Wahrzeichen der Stadt hoch über dem Alten Hafen thront, konnte dieses Jahr seinen 400. Geburtstag feiern. Im April 1593 begannen die Portugiesen mit dem Bau dieser kriegerischen Festung, die heute friedlich in der Tropensonne liegt.

Während einer stürmischen Vergangenheit wechselten sich die Besitzer mehrmals ab (Portugiesen, Araber, Sultane, Briten) und das Fort hielt im Laufe der Jahrhunderte blutigen Kämpfen, Belagerungen, Intrigen und Beschießungen stand. Es diente auch eine Zeitlang als Gefängnis, bevor es 1960 zu einem Nationalmuseum erklärt und der Öffentlichkeit zugänglich gemacht wurde.

Der einstige Kampfplatz hat sich längst in eine friedliche Stätte verwandelt, wo oft Hochzeiten und andere Feste gefeiert werden. Seit kurzem gibt es dort auch eine "Son et Lumiere" Show (an verschiedenen Abenden - jeweils auf Deutsch, Englisch oder Französisch), die in Ton und Licht die bewegte Geschichte des Fort Jesus erzählt.

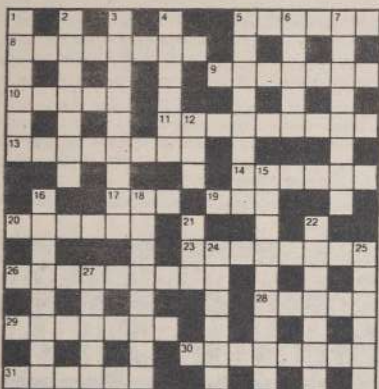

MOTOR TRADE Industry is a cut-throat business.

One illustration of how cut-throat the business in the motor trade is can be seen on the road every day.

Driving schools in Kenya are set up to teach people how to be good citizens of the Tarmac strip.

They are taught the rules of engagement as well as some on courtesy.

They are also taught the law which have been set to ensure that people live in some form of harmony and where disputes arise, there will be a way of starting the arbitration process.

The one thing that Kachumbari found missing totally during instruction was care of the car.

There was hardly any mention of what to do in order to make the car last longer and look good as well.

This was in sharp contrast to the vintage of the vehicle that were being used by the driving schools.

Most of them have vehicles that date back to the seventies and some even to the sixties.

The worst offenders are the schools that offer training for

those who want to qualify to drive lorries.

Some of the ones seen during a recent survey date back to the early sixties.

These vehicles should be taken off the streets and only



brought out when the vintage lovers meet.

They may yet quite qualify for that special place by they are rapidly getting there.

The thing that we could not bring ourselves to accept was that one was being taught how to drive with these vintage vehicles and were eventually expected to perform on the open road with "normal" cars where technology was so different.

The comfort of the pupil was also being compromised.

One of the vehicles we saw had no doors to the drivers cabin as in those days when they were manufactured, doors seemed to have been considered as an

optional extra.

It would be of great help if the law makers in this country put together a package that required driving schools to meet certain minimum standards, including banning the use of vintage of their vehicles.

That way they would produce novice drivers who were better equipped to survive in the jungle that is called a road.

As Kachumbari says, good looking ancient models should be given TLC off the road and only brought out in experienced hands rather than in hands of novices.

ALL AFRICA AND KENYA 'MAKO SHARK' RECORD

DURING THE annual Kenyan Association of Sea Angling Clubs (KASAC) night competition for Broadbill, contested along the entire coast line of the country, Peter Ruysenaars of the Pemba Channel Fishing Club brought in, not a record Billfish... but a new African record for Mako Shark.

Peter, who was fishing from the Club boat *Pingusi* (which incidentally is the Swahili word for Hammerhead shark) had earlier lost a Broadbill of some 150 lbs after a three hour struggle when the swivel on his line snapped.

Some 45 minutes later, at 4.45 am, while he was dozing to regain his strength, the crew woke him to alert him to another strike.

It was not until the fish cam to the boat and opened its jaws that Peter realised that he was on a Mako, the closest relative to the feared White Sharks.

After a fight lasting just over two hours, the monster was beaten and when it was finally weighed on the famous gantry of the club, it tipped the scales at 363 lbs (165 Kg), taken on a 50 lb (24 Kg) line.

Technical Details: The record, which is subject to ratification, beat the previous record of 355 lbs by the British angler, Thomson Aikman, in September 1993 - also in the Pemba Channel.

The fish was caught on Ande Tournament monofilament line with a Penn International twin speed reel on a Penn International Bent Butt rod.
