DARING GUARDS RESCUE **FAMILY FROM** THUGS

ON SUNDAY morning March 29 1992 at 9.42 a.m., a mazda station wagon registration number KYA 873 drove into the compound of Dogra Singh on Bandari Road, Nyali.

Out jumped a heavily armed gang of four brandishing a revolver and pangas. They rushed into Mr. Singh's housewhich at this time of the morning was open with the family resting downstairs.

At gunpoint they demanded money from Mr. Singh which they said they knew he had in his house. He pleaded with them that he had the money upstairs and would go and get it if they would permit him.

One of the gangsters ordered him to get moving and accompanied him. On his way Mr. Singh pressed a switch to the K.K. Guards Motorola Radio Alarm System and within oneand-a-half minutes their first back-up car arrived in response to the signal.

"Hand-To-Hand"

A bitter hand-to-hand battle ensued while K.K. Guards back-up crew overpowered the three thugs in Dogra's house.

The fourth member of the gang, a look-out scout, unfortunatelyescaped: The gangsters' car was also seized by K.K. Guards on the arrival of a second back-up car.

Neither Mr. Singh or any of his family was injured but K.K. Guard's Crew Commander, Johnson Imbugua, was seriously injured by panga slashes and teeth marks suffered when he struggled with the gang leader.

Notwithstanding his injuries the crew commander wrestled the revolver from the gang leader. The revolver was real and loaded though the gangster failed to use it despite threats to do so. He was obviously too terrified at the suddenness of K.K. Guards arrival.

The police were called and visited the scene. The

U.S. NAVE IN PORT

SOME 5,800 United States Marine Corps and sailors are expected to visit Mombasa this morning at the start of a four-day call on Kenya by a U.S. Navy amphibious assault squadron led by the A.A.S. "OKINAWA". Packed with sophisticated weaponary the 17,000-ton "OKINAWA" carries more than 30 helicopters and Harrier jets and is served by 520 officers and crew, together with a further 2,090 troops. She is accompanied by four other ships. They are the 8,300-ton tank landing ship "TUSCALOOSA" carrying 220 officers and crew and 380

troops, the 20,700-ton amphibious cargo ship "DURHAM" carrying 330 officers and crew, and 220 troops, the 10,000-ton amphibious transport dock "DULUTH" carrying 490 officers and crew, and 930 troops, and the 11,125-ton dock landing ship "FORT McHENRY" carrying 350 officers and crew, and a further 330 troops. During the brief stay many marines and sailors are expected to visit coastal resorts and the nearby national game parks.



MAGNIFICENT ROYAL IMANI YACHT "ZINAT AL BINAAR" REALLY IS A "BEAUTY OF THE SEAS"

IT'S GOING TO BE A LITTLE MORE DIFFICULT I'd imagine, for mariners to get lost, know that we are under presumption that the Indonesian and not Ionian Sea is that which separates Greeks from the Italians. I met a Greek captain the other evening who'd been shown the miss-print, but unfortunately the poor chap took a lot of convincing that he was still in fact Greek and not in some way connected with the Far Fact

The Royal Omani Yacht Zinat Al Binaar duly arrived on Friday morning and berthed alongside Number One, and as her name translates, she really is 'Beauty of the Seas'.

Built in the Sultanate of Oman and launched in 1988 to LRS+100 Al Yacht Specifications, of 61 metres in length and 9.8 metres beam, she displaces 506.60 mt. Her height above W/L, with Yards hoisted is 42.5 metres.

Lanteen rigged and built on traditional lines of the Baghlah style, however used the more modern methods of construction. The Zinat Al Binaar is based at Miar Al Qaboos, and is presently on a training exercise tour, she will leave Mombasa tomorrow (Saturday) for Dar es Salaam, then Zanzibar before returning to Mombasa prior to her homebound voyage with her compliment of 28, officers and crew inclusive.

The Sultanate of Oman, as you will of course know, to coin a phrase, lies at the junction of the routes from the Gulf to India, Red Sea and East Africa and thus has occupied and continues to occupy significant geographical and historical position at the entrance of one of the world's great waterways.

It was in partial celebration of Oman's maritime heritage that the Zinat Al Bihaar was commissioned.

Unfortunately the photograph does not give her true justice, because she has some absolutely beautiful carving on either side of the bow as well as poop.

I mentioned in last week's edition of COASTWEEK that she'd be something to watch out for. She was. 'Karibu', and 'karibuni tena'. While at Mombasa her needs have been taken care of by able hands of Dogwell Shipping.

"Blunder' this time round it wasn't. The yellow and black fibre optic cable was successfully laid by the ferry Mvita from one side of the channel to the other. Missin accomplished. In the words of T.S. Elliot "Success if relative: It is what we can make of the mess we have made of things.

27 vessels due in within the next 14 days, of which five will be naval and two passenger vessels, with the *Royal Star* calling twice in the fortnight.

Of the agencies in town it looks as though Spanfreight and Mackenzie Maritime will be the busiest with seven vessels each

to attend to, Dodwell and Marship with five apiece, the other agencies picking up the rest.

The Limasol registered freighter ILovic arrived in on Tuesday morning with containers stacked three high above the deck. A reasonably modern vessel having been built in 1988, her sides have been abandoned having taken on an expansive rust coloured hue. It may well be that the operators do not have the intention of painting the hull until she goes into dry dock.

Coupla Als due in with the Al Raziqu which should by now be in port loading a consignment of bulk soda ash and produce, she'll be followed by sister company vessel the Al Rehman due on the 3rd to discharge bagged sugar.

BULK WHEAT

Another Limassol registered vessel, the 14580 DWT General cargo *Tarpon Santiago* expected in on the 5th to discharge some 12000 tonnes odd of bulk wheat. She's powered by a 9000 bhp Sulzer M/E with cargo gear consisting of 2x25t SWL cranes, 6x10t SWL derricks, and a jumbo with 180 tonnes lifting capacity.

Fucaduc the locally registered tender has been busy bringing a number of channel entrance bouys in for general maintenance and a point ich

Paint Job.
Rather big lady due in around the 10th. She's the Total Compagnie Francais de Navigation's 86,993 DWT Altus managed by Wallem, Steckmest and Company of Norway. The Altus will discharge

75,000 tonnes crude oil at KOT. Arabian Express which was initially scheduled to arrive on the 14th will I believe be a little delayed, for she suffered main engine failure 'up north' and was towed into Cherbourgh where "G/A" was declared and of course the salvor's want security to be lodged.

"UNDER ARREST"

I notice that the same bunch of vessels remain 'under arrest' in port. Judging by the length of time they've beenunder arrest it might be said that they're 'lifters'. I think it's a shame that otherwise good vessels are left to rot.

Presently at Amgeco, is the 30 year old, Honduran registered 1600 DWT vessel *Caernarvon*. She's just about the right sort of tonnage for running relief supplies to the war stricken country North

of the border.

As perhaps a matter of interest Caernarvon is a county town of Caernarvonshire no less, and noted for its famous castle and town walls started by Edward I in 1284. The first English prince of Wales was introduced to the people from this castle.

Paola the Liberian registered RoRo General cargo vessel is expected to arrive over the weekend. A versatile vessel with two quarter stern doors and ramps, three holds, three tween decks and TEU capacity of 191, of which 140 20' can be slotted in the centre hold, with the remaining 51 20' on the centre deck.

She last visited Kilindini quite a while ago so it will be nice to see an old 'face' again.

Like I mentioned earlier on, there will be two cruise liners visiting. The Royal Star with which we should by now be well acquainted having operated out of Kilindini for some time now.

The second luxury cruiser will be the Renaissance Two, built at the Cantiere Navale Ferrari in 1990 as were her three sisters, with the exception of the Renaissance which was launched a year earlier in 1989, she's registered in Roma, whereas the others are registered at Palermo.

Talking of cruise liners that operate on a frequent basis from Kilindini, I wonder what happened to the *Ambassador I* for she in the nottoo distant past used to operate weekly, cum ten days cruises operated under the auspices of Suli Suli African Cruises, and according to their brochures, advertising a weekly schedule from December 1991 through April 1992.

I haven't seen her this year, so

can only imagine that this seasons cruise itinery has been abandoned.

Actually, come to think of it, I haven't seen any official publication giving notice that the intended cruise schedule was abandoned, and why, especially considering that there might have been a number of bona fide tourists and others who might have been interested in taking up the cruise, only to be disappointed.

On the international front. A potentially dangerous situation befell the roro ferry *Haveleta* couple of Sundays ago.

"FREAK WAVE"

She was on herway from Cork to Rostock in France, when at around midnight was hit by a freak wave which caused two trucks to break their lashings and resulted in the *Havelet* taking a 30 degree list to port, a list of this severity leaves very little reserve before a capsize.

The 175 passengers aboard might have faced very different circumstances had more of the lorries or cargo broken loose. Havelet was refitted a year ago at

acost of around two million pounds, however there was no report that she'd been brought up to Solas 1990 standards.

In a meeting of the Maritime Safety Committee a year ago it was clearly agreed that existing ferries had inadequate sub-division reserves against problems of this nature, and that ferries should be brought up to Solas '90 standards within five years.

Japan is seeking international aid to support a plan to scrap and re-cycle larger tankers. The country is determined to boost the demolition market and replace three quarters of the world's VLCC fleet in this way.

Meanwhile an Oslo ship broker has launched a second scheme worth 740 million dollars to subsidize the scrapping of 100 VLCC's.

The scheme covers owners, finance houses and insurance interests and would involve the buying of vessels at USD 200 per tonne, and selling them to scrap yards at half the price. Beats me too!







SWISSAIR HAS introduced the world's most modern passenger aircraft - the McDonnell MD-11 - to its East Africa route.

The first MD-11 ever to land in Kenya touched down at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport on Tuesday, heralding in a new era of technical excellence and passenger comfort.

The MD-11 is the most spacious long-range tri-jet in the skies, with extra room around and in front of the seats and in the aisles - even in overhead storage compartments.

Swissair has also changed the seating specifications to make the cabins even roomier. In Business Class, for example, the normal 2+3+2 seat configuration has been replaced by a 2+2+2 seating arrangement.

Passengers can also enjoy a new high-tech audio visual system. The MD-11 is being introduced to Swissair's weekly service of three tonnes of cargo, around 30 per cent more than the aircraft it

A major advance is also seen in the MD-11's state-of-the-art cockpit, which is totally conceived for two-crew operation.

By mid-1992, Swissair will have taken delivery of 12 MD-11s at a total investment of two billion Swiss francs (Shs. 40 billion).

With the arrival of the 12 MD-11s, the airline's average fleet age will drop to a mere 5.8 years, one of the lowest in the world.



One of the zaniest ideas for a holiday is to offer oneself as a

guinea pig for some medical studies in a special camp made for a very specific purpose.

The one Kachumbari visited was somewhere in the south west of England and from what he found out is it due to close soon since there is not enough subsidy to keep it running.

The place is actually researching into the common cold.

Yes the common cold!

This holiday is very simple. The research guy need human beings to infect with the common cold in order to study the virtus and gain some kind of understanding as to how it

The people who go to this place will be purposely exposed to the virus to see whether they get infected or not and should they be then they will be studied to try and understand what it is that happens during the course of the infection.

If one would not get cured they are likely to be on this type of medication and may be slightly drowsy.


It could open up a can of worms.


What would happen if you were stopped by a cop and they decided to test you for drugs.





SEVERIN LEGT GRÖßTEN WERT AUF UMWELTSCHUTZ Das saubere Meer hat wieder eine Zukunft

EINZIGARTIGE umweltfreundliche Kläranlage, die erste dieser Art an der Nordküste von Mombasa, wurde in der Severin Sea Lodge am 15. Februar 1992 vom Minister für Umwelt und Bodenschätze, Hon. Philip Leakey, offiziell eröffnet.

Erstmals hat ein Hotel in dieser Gegend wirkungsvolie Maßnahmen ergriffen und versucht, mittels einer modernen Kläranlage Umweltprobleme zu lösen. Die meisten Leute ahnen gar nichts von dieser tickenden Zeitbombe an der kenianischen entstanden durch unkontrollierte, unprofessionelle Abwasser- und Abfallbeseitigung, die das ganze System total überlastet. Diese unverant wortliche Handlungsweise wird in nächster Zukunft nicht wiedergutzumachende Auswirkungen auf das gesamte Ökosystem der Nordküste und das vorgelagerte Riff haben.

Das Projekt, entworfen von Herrn Zarnack Joachim Deutschland, errichtet von der Baufirma Premji Ganji Ltd. und beraten von Triad Architects, Nairobi, erhielt volle Anerkennung Dr. Iwald, dem Umweltexperten von TUI - einer der größten Reiseveranstalter Europas. Seine Aufgabe besteht darin, über Umweltprobleme zu berichten, die mit dem Tourismus zusammenmhängen, und seine Ansichten und Empfehlungen abzugeben. ob Tourismuseinrichtungen für die von seiner Firma geschickten Besucher sicher sind.

Die Anlage, die über Shs 11 Millionen kostete, wurde für eine größere Kapazität ausgelegt und kannmehr bewältigen, als Severin

Das Hotel hat auch Geschichte gemacht, als es als erstes im ganzen Lande einen vollamtlichen Umweltberater einstellte. Mr. J. Mutamia wurde für diese Schlüsselposition engagiert, wo er nicht nur die neue Kläranlage, sondern auch alle anderen Aktivitäten des Hotels im Hinblick auf Umweltschutz überwachen

Mr. Muthamias Studie über die Umwelt des Hotels erforderte chemische Analysen des Brunnenwassers, das im Hotel verwendetwird, Prüfungder Härte und Erkennen eventueller Anzeichen organischer Verschmutzung. Gleichzeitig wird Mr. Muthamia die Wasserversorgung im Hotel überprüfen wie auch ihre Leistungsfähigkeit, so daß es in Zukunft einfacher ist,

ein neues System zu entwerfen, ein Leck und andere Beschädigungen an den Leitungsrohren zu entdecken und auf diese Weise Kosten zu sparen.

Mr. Muthamia hat auch in der Nāhe des Galana Steak House das Wasser eines Brunnens untersuchen lassen, das sich als von guter Qualität erwies. Wie er sagte, soil dort bald ein Brunnen gegraben werden, hydrologische Messungen ergaben, daß in einer Tiefe von 12 bis 15 m süßwasserhaltiges Gestein vorhanden ist.

Mr. Muthamia hat dem Personal der Severin Sea Lodge vorgeschlagen, die Abfälle aufzuteilen in organische und nichtorganische Stoffe, und bei der Aussortierung des Mülls auf peinliche Sauberkeit zu achten.

Er hatte ferner Besprechungen mitdem Management des Neptune Beach Hotels nebenan über die Notwendigkeit separater Abfallbeseitigung.

PHOSPHAT

Mr. Muthamia hat überdies eine Studie in Angriff genommen über die chemische Zusammensetzung von Wasch- und Reinigungsmitteln, die in der Wäscherei verwendet werden, in bezug auf ihre Auswirkung auf die Umwelt, vor allem was Phosphate betrifft.

Wasserleitungspläne und Diagramme der Severin Sea Lodge wurden angefertigt mit Instruktionen für den Fall, wenn die Wasserversorgung ausfällt. Dadurch wird sichergestellt, daß immer Wasser im Hotel zur Verfügung steht. Anweisungen wurden herausgegeben zur separaten Aufteilung organischer und nichorganischer Abfälle mit Vorschlägen zur Müllbeseitigung, die die Umwelt nicht belasten.

Im Laufe der Zeit wird dieses neue Projekt die Umwelt verbessern, so daß die Nordküste für Touristen noch attraktiver, und auf jeden Fall gesünder sein wird.

Goldmedaille für den Koch im Norfolk Hotel

Sein Erfolg ist auch eine Ehre für das Norfolk Hotel und für Kenia, und Silas hat sich damit international als ein Koch von Format profiliert."




