PATRICK GITAU IS KENYAN CYCLING CHAMP

CYCLISTS FROM up-country again collected most of the prizes in the ninth Madaraka Bicycle Race from Mombasa's Reef Hotel on Sunday June 21.

It has been described as the 'most prestigious cycle race not only in Kenya, but in the whole of the East and Central Africa region, its main sponsors throughout being Reef Hotels.'

Now named the Mombasa Madaraka International Cycle Race - it was 22 year old Patrick Gitau from Nairobi who, for the fourth time, was overall winner in Race 'A' receiving a floating trophy and shield, also a wall clock and Shs 2500/- in cash.

Patrick also received a further Shs 1500/- and a trophy for being the 'First Senior'.

He was one of the Africa Air Rescue team which captured all three top prizes. Second overall in Race 'A' was Peter Humphries and third, Francis Mungau.

Race 'A' (about 180 kms) attracted twenty-two participants; Race 'B' (140 kms) 25 and Race 'C' (14 kms) 35, including five girls.

Among the entrants were one from India and two from the British Royal Navy. Others came from Nairobi, Nakuru and Mombasa.

'Best Coast Cyclist in Race 'A' was Francis Nyongesa, chairman of the Franyo Cycling Club, while the Best Lady in Race 'C' was Sheila Makumbi, also from this cycling club at Mtwapa.

First overall in Race 'B' was Mathew Maina, while First in the 'under 14 years of age' was

South African Charter Flight

'SHOULD FLIGHTSTAR, a South African charter, have its application to operate into Mombasa's Moi International Airport approved by Kenya's Civil Aviation Board then I feel you will have many South Africans coming here'.

So said Nigel Bruce from Johannesburg, Editor of the Financial Mail and three other magazines - one being the Diners Club's *Signature* who, together with Eve Gracie, Director of Struik Publishing, Cape Town, were on a week's visit to Kenya hosted by United Touring Company and Block Hotels.

'Because of the developed tourist industry you have in Kenya, and prices not being so expensive as in the Seychelles and Mauritius, and probably because of the novelty value, I think a lot of reasonably affluent South Africans,

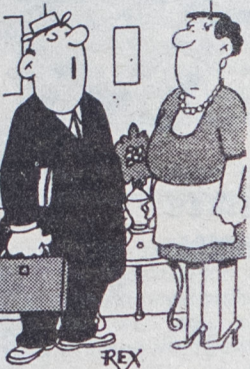

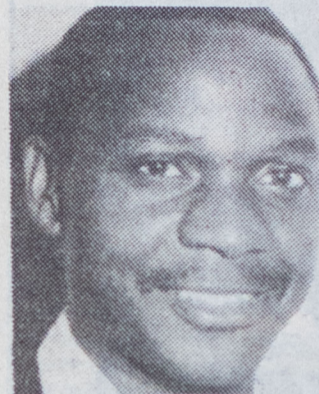

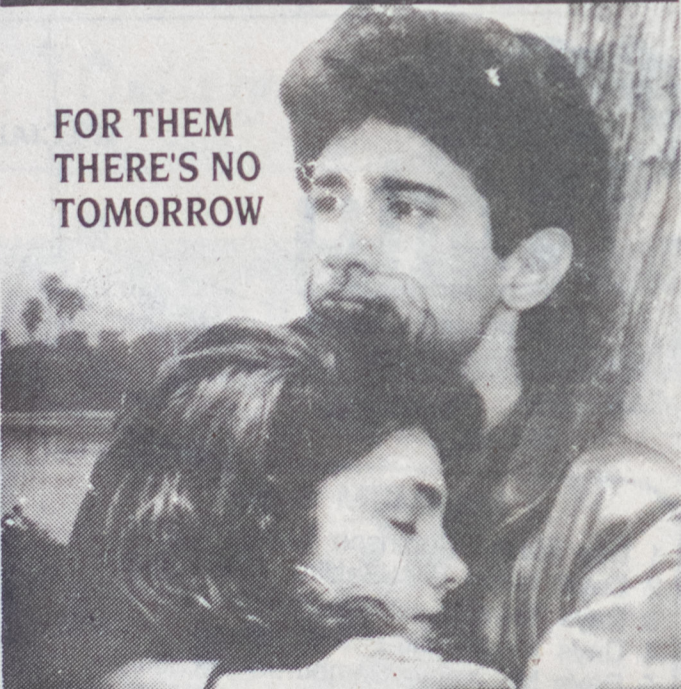

I hope of all shades of opinion and colour, will want to come here.

'I also think that the opportunities for trade between the two countries are substantial.

There are a lot of manufacturers in South Africa, and Kenya will be able to import from them in the months ahead at substantially lower prices than they have been paying elsewhere.

'Included in the possible imports is wine, which the hotel industry would be able to offer at a very reasonable price'.

He said that articles he will be writing will be for an edition of *Signature* predominantly focussed on Africa - Kenya being the most important trading and tourist stop for South Africans'.

Mr. Bruce explained that *Signature* is distributed to all readers of our business magazines, as well as to Diners Club members. It has a circulation of around 80,000 in South Africa'.

Eve Gracie he said 'among other things edits books on birds and was particularly interested in Kenya's prolific bird life'.

He went on 'UTC very kindly asked me to come here and see some of the country which coincided with a business trip I had been planning'.

Said Mr. Bruce 'UTC is a delightful company which has looked after me extremely well.

Mine were rather complicated arrangements trying to cover as much as possible in the space of seven days.

Not one of those arrangements has in any way gone wrong and the UTC driver and guide, Jacob, was excellent and extremely knowledgeable not only about the flora and fauna but also about the country generally'.

LAKE BARINGO

He and Eve Gracie spent two nights at Lake Baringo Club being taken around by Hilary Garland the Resident Birder there, finding the bird life very interesting.

From there they went to Lake Bogoria Game Reserve seeing an

enormous profusion of flamingos, including some exotic sub-species which they did not know about.

Said Mr. Bruce 'while the fish eagle is a rarity in South Africa, they are in great profusion here'.

The safari continued to the Maasai Mara where they stayed at Keekorok Lodge 'one of the most picturesque lodges I had seen, and with very high standards'.

He noted that the scenery in the Maasai Mara was very different to the game parks in South Africa which had no rolling plains.

They had seen a great profusion of wildlife.

Said Mr. Bruce 'we came across two herds of elephant - ten in one and about twenty-four in the other. This is most unusual in the private game parks in South Africa where you would not get elephant in such numbers'.

They had also seen over 200 buffalo. Said Mr. Bruce 'South Africa does not have such large herds of buffalo'.

FISH EAGLES

They then went to Lake Victoria staying at Lonrho's Rusinga Island Fishing Camp.

Declared Mr. Bruce 'it was marvellous'.

Adding 'there again the wildlife was quite unusual and not the sort one sees in Southern Africa. The number of kites, fish eagles were quite unbelievable'.

There was also an overnight stop at the new Windsor Golf and Country Club.

Their week in Kenya ended at Nyali Beach Hotel. Said Mr. Bruce 'it is the second time for me to stay at this hotel. I like it enormously because it is so relaxed, pleasant and the people are awfully nice'.

It is understood that although *Flightstar* is the competition in South Africa to the national airlines, it has been granted 'take off' rights from South Africa to Mombasa. It is just awaiting approval by Kenya's CAB to start operating here.

With many new hotels opening and others extending on the Kenya coast such a possible boost to tourism would be most welcome.

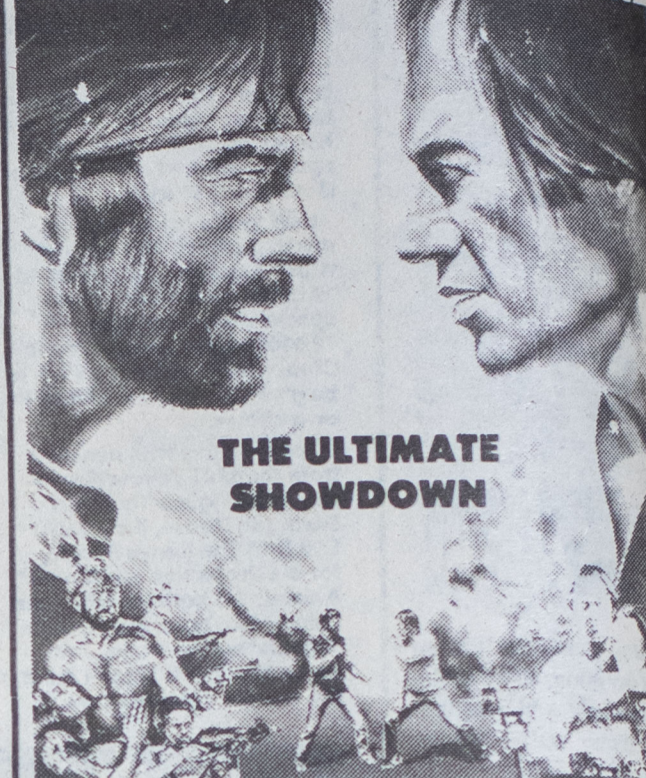

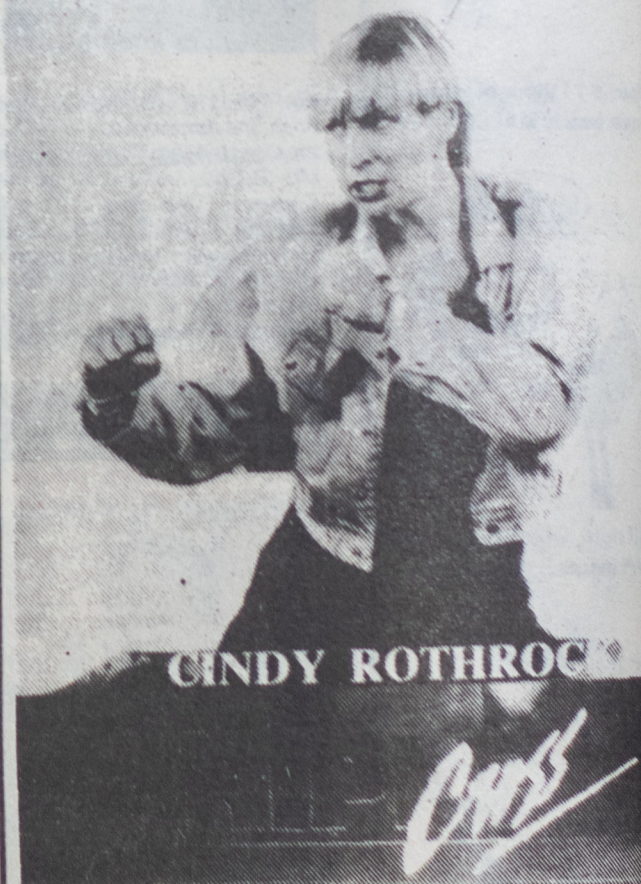

Tony Grove Confirms Ambitious Re-Development Plan For Nyali

MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS ARE planned for Nyali Beach Hotel which include the upgrading of rooms, public areas and kitchens.

Work commences in about six weeks time and said Tony Grove, Block Hotels Area Manager (Nyali, Shimba Lodge, Indian Ocean Beach Club, Jacaranda and Outspan-Treetops) 'it is going to cost a lot of money'.

On a recent visit to the coast, Mr. Grove said in an interview that the five-star Indian Ocean Beach Club, Diani, is expected to open before the end of the year and revealed that as far as Shimba Lodge is concerned 'it is going to stay small and beautiful'.

However, it is presently being given a new recreation room, also car park.

He explained 'we are very short of bar space when the hotel is full'.

The Mvita Grill kitchens are having new equipment, while the shop in the Lanes is going to be converted into a new conference centre.

Said Mr. Grove 'this is to meet the increasing demand for conference facilities'.

As well, the former Blues discotheque may become a Piano Bar.

Said Mr. Grove 'then there will be a general upgrading and maintenance of the hotel to bring it back to what is used to be'.

Of the eight teachers, three are specially trained to teach the mentally handicapped.

The school is partly boarding and for those coming from outside the Kwale District a fee of Shs five per day is charged.

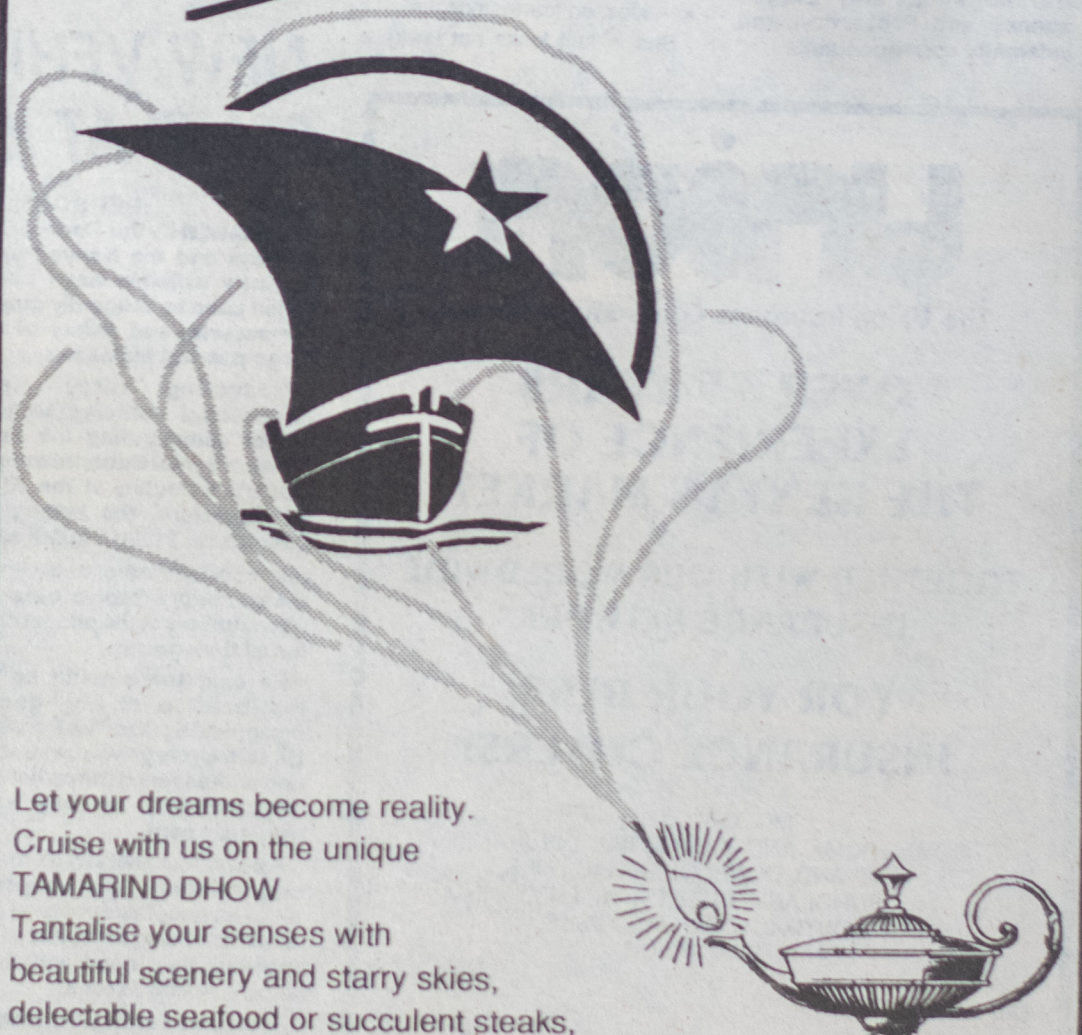

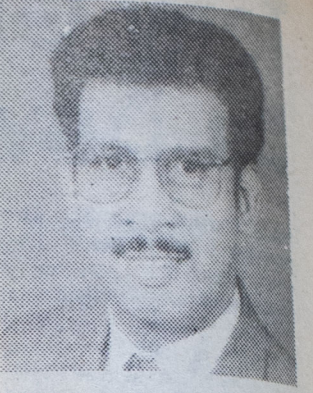

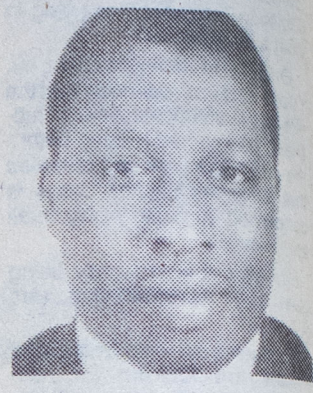

CONVERTED SHEEP CARRIER SAILS FOR KISMAYU

MONDAY AND TUESDAY SAW the departure of the four visiting Royal Navy vessels after their brief visit here. Unfortunately I omitted to mention the Boxer in last week's edition. Apologies.

Other foreign naval visitors last week were the South African naval vessels *Magnas Malan* and *Frans Erasmus* they left on Saturday morning.

We haven't seen the likes of them here for it must be many many years, if at all, so in a manner of speaking it was an 'historic' visit, although there was no prior notice of their arrival in the local press.

Karibu to them, *totsiens* and *vasbeit*. The two vessels are, I believe, named after two former South African defence ministers.

Rather large sheep carrier, the *Mukairish Alsades* left just before mid-night last Friday evening. She had arrived in the morning to bunker before sailing for Kisimayu.

The *Mukairish Alsades* was originally a bulk carrier, built in 1969, then converted into a vehicle carrier in 1976 being finally converted into her present form as a sheep carrier in 1985 with capacity of loading upto 122,845 kondoos, on fourteen decks.

She in fact looks not unlike a

block of flats, with her sides offering an enormous amount of windage.

Height of her after mast is 47 metres above the keel! She was built with a summer deadweight capacity of 24,497 mt. However only about a quarter of this is now utilized, considering that 122,845 kondoos at average of 50 kgs each only totals 6,142 m. tonnes.

An impressive sight when she sailed out with all the sections lit-up. I understand that this was her first visit here on a 'one off' basis, for she usually trades between Australia and New Zealand and Saudi Arabia carrying kondoos, which are in especially high demand during the Haj.

Two of the locally based salvage tugs, *Bison I* and *Barbara* sailed on

Saturday morning. I believe that their mission on this outing is to assist with the berthing and unberthing of the *Mukairish Alsades*.

An unusual operation for the two, but nevertheless biz. is biz.

Supply vessel *Fish Eagle* arrived back last week from Somalia where

she's been doing a sterling job ferrying food-stuffs from ship to shore on behalf of the International Commitee de la Croix Rouge.

Fish Eagle will be returning there soon to undertake a different system of operation on behalf of the I.C.R.C., but more about that in one of the future columns. *Fish Eagle* incidentally left on Tuesday.

Three I.C.R.C. chartered vessels lying at Mtongwé anchorage. They being the *Gulf Spirit*, *Gulf Splendour* and *Letty T*.

The *Gulf Splendour* is fully laden and has been waiting there for a couple of days now, obviously "for instructions".

There are large scale maritime operations for the I.C.R.C. in Somalia judging by the number of vessels sporting the Red Cross colours.

The chartered in vessels getting larger too. For initially they started operations using the locally based *Murri International* supply vessel *Steve B* then gradually graduating, if you can call it that, to slightly bigger conventional cargo vessels in the form of the *Bente Dania* and *Free Trader*, to even bigger ones, such as the *Letty T* with even larger ones still in the form of the *Izrael* and others.

Activity in the port appears to be fairly busy with most of the far end berths occupied. However there are a number of the general cargo berths awaiting customers and they should have arrived by the time this hits the streets.

The *Nuska* joins the growing list of "Arrested" Vessels bringing the total upto nine. Most of the others however have been under arrest for a considerable period of time. Six vessels are restrained from sailing the majority it would appear due to infringements with Port Health.

NEW VEHICLES FOR TOP SECURITY STAFF AT KENYA PORTS AUTHORITY

THE PERSONNEL COMMANDING the Port Police Division and the Kenya Ports Security officials have been called upon to diligently guard the security and safety of all cargo passing Mombasa.

Presenting three new operational vehicles to the officer commanding the Port Division Senior Superintendent Edward Katsutsu at the KPA Headquarters, the Managing Director Mr. Phillip Okundi said the occasion further underlined the Authority's resolve to assure all customers of the utmost care for all their goods.

He said there could be no justification of any goods disappearing from the Port Sea. He said all cargo were in transit and should reach the owners as immaculately as they were originally sent.

Said he "Our security alertness and operations must be open to all. The people concerned are, therefore, being accorded all the facilities they need and there should not be excess."

The Managing Director instructed all the drivers to take good care of the vehicles in order to serve well and longer. He said the Port Police Division was luckier than their counterparts elsewhere as the KPA bought the vehicles for

them as and when need arose and within KPA's budgetary means and programme.

The vehicles were a Peugeot 504 Estate with a three year service package from Marshalls (East Africa) Limited and two Nissan Sahara vans from D.T. Dobie Limited specially fitted for law enforcement duties.

The Managing Director was accompanied by his General Manager Mr. Julius Tua, the

Manager of Finance Division Mr. Dominic Omenyo and the Marketing and Public Relations Manager Mr. Alex Kabuga while Mr. Kenneth Oyosi and Mr. Jimmy Mwangi represented the Marshalls and D.T. Dobie firms respectively.

Two of the vehicles will be based in Mombasa while the third will be stationed at the KPA Inland Container Depot (ICD) at Embakasi in Nairobi.

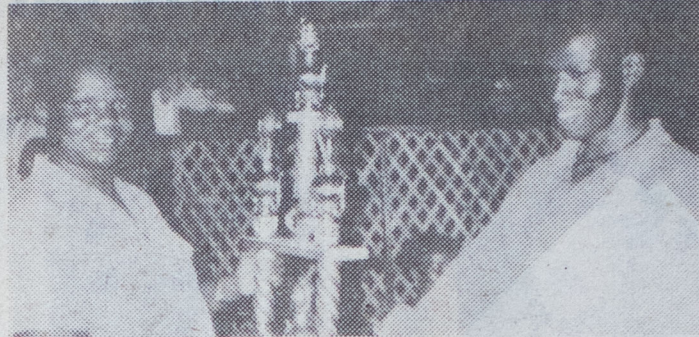

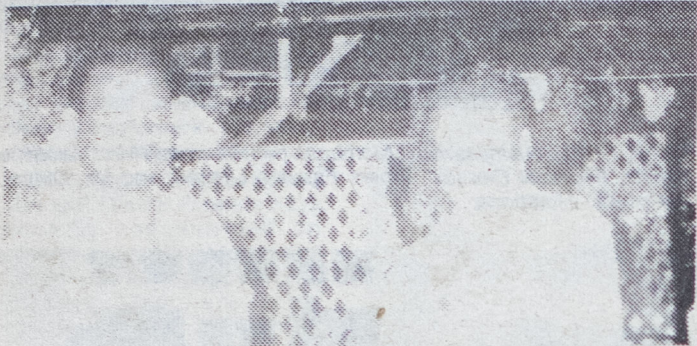

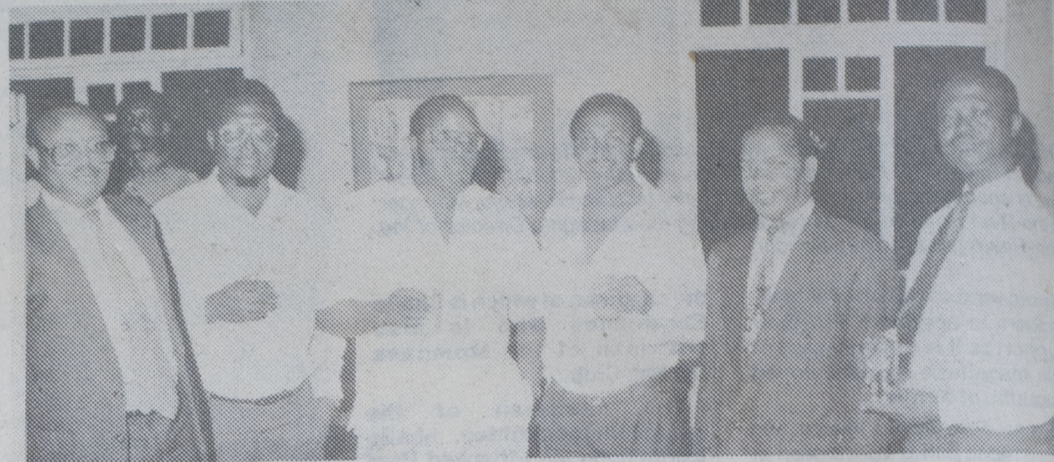

COAST BOWLS PAIRS

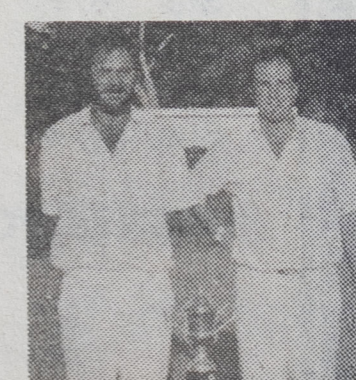

But what of the common man. Where does he benefit from the leading edge technology? Isn't it true that various developments in space industry have quickly filtered down to the ordinary man? Isn't it true that the computing power that used to be packed in a whole building now fits into a box the size of a suitcase? Yes it is true.

Kachumbari even confesses that there are simulators for ordinary motorists well nearly so.

A driving school joined hands with the local cops, the Automobile Association and a high tech company in developing a programme to try and curb the high incidence of drinking and driving offences in a certain county.

They got some volunteers to sit down and get totally sozzled. They were then put in charge of cars.

They were asked to drive in a special test track (where they were not going to endanger any road users).

Over a period of time, a large number of people went through this test track whilst up to their ears in alcohol.

The high tech company had wired up the car so that they could record exactly what was happening every second whilst the car was being driven.

All this data was stored in a computer and once the data gathering phase had been completed, the cops, the driving school specialists and the A.A. gurus sat together and selected the best sequences.

The high tech company then took a car, changed the control

system and hooked it up to an on board computer.

As a result of this, the car was able to steer itself round the course on a pre-programmed basis.

In effect they created an alcoholic driving simulator.

The idea was that learner drivers, interested members of the public and those caught driving under the influence of an alcohol would all be able to benefit from a half hour ride with a drunken driver.

For learners it was a warning about what not to do.

The members of the public were able to experience what it was like to be driven by a drunk driver and hopefully be scared into not taking a lift with a drunk or even hopefully recognising a drunk and then organising to get out of the vehicle before it was too late.

"Caught While Driving Under The Influence"

For the fellow who was caught driving under the influence, the idea was to give him a taste of his own medicine.

Being put in the passengers seat was no joke for these offenders, especially since the

cops insisted that the speed of the vehicle be increased since most drunk people tended to be so charged up that they would in fact drive faster than normal.

This experiment was tried out over a period of some two years and the recent reports indicated a marked reduction in the number of drivers who go on the road in charge of cars whilst under the influence of alcohol

Simulators are not only found in the area of reducing drink driving offences.

Now that the technology is proving to be cheap, they are being used in all sorts of amusement arcades.

The one I recently had a chance to try wasn't in an amusement arcade but was ... naturally ... a grand prix car simulator.

It was the similar in size to a pilot training simulator and this particular one was being used for promotions and so was mounted on the back of a flat bed truck that was making a round on Spanish racing circuits, which is where I caught up with it.

Having spent a day at the races

and been itching to have a go at one of these high speed pocket rockets, I got out my pesetas and paid to get into the simulator.

The experiences was one that cannot be adequately described using words.

One has to have been in a grand prix racer to get the feeling.

Simulators have come to a long way and will very soon be available to driving schools.

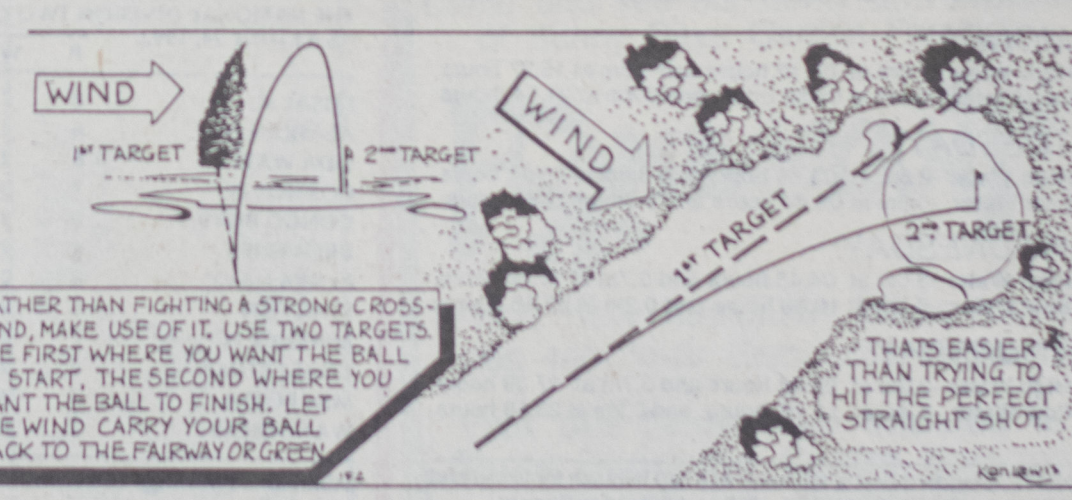
By using innovating programming, learners can be put through a whole series of situations that have been tailor made for the driving habits of their particular country or even town.

This could contribute significantly to road safety in the future.

Refresher training would be easy and teaching methods would be flexible enough to react to changing regulations and driving habits.

As Kachumbari says, one hopes that the time will come when even a matatu driver will agree to a spin in a simulator based on his own performance.

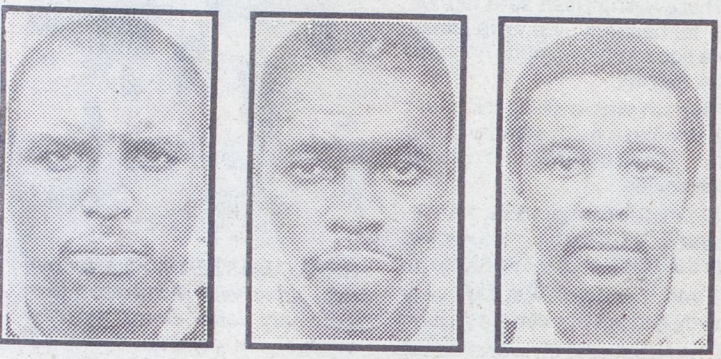

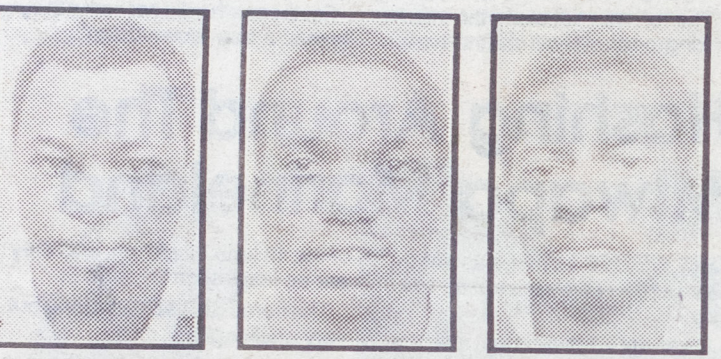
