AUS DEM WELTWEIT ständig wachsenden Verantwortungsbewußtsein gegenüber der Umwelt - Flora, Fauna, Wasser und Luft ist der Ökotourismus entstanden, was sich bereits fühlbar auswirkt auf die weitere Entwicklung der Ferienländer, Kurorte und Hotels, je nachdem, ob sie als umweltfreundlich eingestuft werden oder nicht.

1991 erhielten 950 Strände und 196 Yachthäfen in Europadie blaue Fahne als Symbol einer sauberen und gesunden Umwelt.

In Deutschland wurde in einigen Schulen Umwelt als Schulfach eingeführt mit mehreren Unterrichtsstunden pro Woche. Einige führende Reiseveranstalter haben eine Umweltabteilung eingerichtet.

Deutschland, aus welchem Land das größte Touristenkontingent nach Kenia kommt, ist sehr umweltbewußt. Vor den wichtigsten Urlaubszeiten werden Karten herausgegeben, auf denen die umweltfreundlichen Ferienländer und Orte eingetragen sind.

Einer der größten Verfechter des Ökotourismus an der kenianischen Küste ist Andre Janssens, Resident Manager von Neckermann - einer der führenden Reiseveranstalter in Deutschland. Er ist gleichzeitig der Vorsitzende des Unterausschusses für Reiseveranstalter aus Übersee der Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association (MACTA).

Er war einer der beiden Vertreter von MACTA, die zu Afrikas erstem Seminar über Ökotourismus im Lake Nakuru Nationalpark delegiert wurden. Die Teilnehmer kamen aus verschiedenen Interessengruppen, aus dem privaten und öffentlichen Sektor, darunter Akademiker, Naturschützer und Entscheidungsträger aus Kenia, Tansania, Burundi, Mauritius, Deutschland, Holland, USAund Großbritannien.

Das Seminar in Nakuru endete mit der Gründung der Kenya Ecotourism Society (KES) als Mitglied des internationalen Verbandes.

Da 60 Prozent der Touristen in Kenia ihren Urlaub an der Küste verbringen, wurde Ende Oktober eine Sonderkonferenz in der Severin Sea Lodge abgehalten unterdem Vorsitz des Präsidenten von MACTA, Mr. Zul Harunani. Die Konferenz wurde offiziell eröffnet vom Minister für Tourismus und Wildleben, Mr. Noah Katana Ngala.

Unter den lokalen Rednern waren Karl Heinz Strauss, Vorsitzender von KATO (Verband der Kenianischen Reiseveranstalter), Sektion Küste; Beat Koch, Vizepräsident von KAHC (Verband der Kenianischen Hoteliers und Restaurateure), Sektion Küste; und Andre Janssens, Resident Manager von Neckerman in Kenia.

Herr Janssens betrachtet diesen Schritt zum Ökotourismus als ein Mittel, um den Rückgang des Tourismus in Kenia aufzuhalten. Kenia braucht dringend ein neues Image, und Ökotourismus könnte als ein weiteres Qualitätszeichen zu den bereits bestehenden Touristenattraktionen hinzugefügt werden. "Warum kann die kenianische Küste nicht als erste in Afrika eine blaue Fahne als Symbol einer sauberen und gesunden Umwelt erringen?" fragte Herr Janssens.

KES könnte auch offiziell grüne

Zertifikate oder Fahnen herausgeben, um Hotels und Reiseveranstalterzuveranlassen, umwettfreundlicher zu handeln.

Die Regierung könnte ihren Beitrag daran leisten, indem sie den Hoteliers bei der Errichtung von Abwasser- und Kläranlagen sowie anderen damit verbundenen Einrichtungen Steuererleichterungen gewährt.

Spezialbericht

Bezüglich Hygiene, worüber einige Touristen und Reiseveranstalter ihre Bedenken äußerten, erwähnte Herr Janssen, daß Thomson UK, der größte Reiseveranstalter der Welt, einen Video-Trainingsfilm, für Hotelangestellte über dieses Thema herausgegeben hat, der bei der Thomson Vertretung in Mombasa erhältlich

Herr Janssen wies ferner auf eine internationale Kampagne hin "Haltet die Städte sauber!" und fragte: "Warum nicht Mombasa?"

Herr Karl Heinz Strauss, Managing Director von Pollman's Tours and Safaris sprach über KATOs Verpflichtung, heute die Umwelt zu schützen und den Ökotourismus zuunterstützen, um die Natur für morgen zu erhalten.

Er bemerkte unter anderem, daß die Chauffeure von Safarifirmen mehr Zeit als alle anderen mit den Touristen verbringen und Botschafter für Ökotourismus sein könnten. Eigentlich hättenzu dieser Konferenz auch Chauffeure eingeladen werden sollen. Er sprach über das Benehmen von Chauffeuren in Wildparks, daß die wilden Tiere nicht mit dem Fahrzeug gejagt und die Raubtiere beim Jagen nicht gestört werden sollten.

Große Ansammlungen von Fahrzeugen in den Nationalparks sollten vermieden werden. Die Autos sollten die Wege nicht verlassen und Abfälle nur an speziell dafür vorgesehenen Plätzen zurückgelassen werden, da speziell Plastiksäcke eine Gefahr für die wilden Tiere bedeuten

An der Wand des Konferenzsaales in der Severin Sea Lodge war ein großes "Verpflichtungsblatt" aufgehängt, das die Reiseveranstalter gemäß Auforderung von Herrn Strauss unterschreiben sollten als Zeichen, daß sie den Ökotourismus ernsthaft unterstützen wollen. Viele kamen dieser Aufforderung nach.

AKTIONSPLAN

David Thomson, Vorsitzender des Unterausschusses für Umweltfragen von KAHC, Küste, erläuterte einen Aktionsplan, der von allen Mitglieder-Hotels ausgeführt werden sollte, nämlich: Ein Energiesparprogramm; keine gefährlichen und giftigen Gase und Chemikalien verwenden, die die Atmosphäre verpesten; Hotelgäste und Angestellte darauf aufmerksam machen, weniger Abfälle zu produzieren und diese umweltfreundlich zu beseitigen.

Ein langer detaillierter Aktionsplan war an der Wand aufgehängt und wurde von vielen Konferenzteilnehmern als Zeichen ihrer Zustimmunmg unterschrieben.

Der Deputy Provincial Commissioner, Mr. Michael Kamau, dankte dem Tourismusminister für die gute Arbeit, die er geleistethatte, sowie den anderen Rednern, die den Ökotourismus von allen Seiten beleuchtet und erläuterthatten. Er schlug überdies vor, daß bei der Erteilung von Likör-, Restaurant- und anderen Lizenzen diese zurückgehalten werden könnten, bis die Antragsteller umweltfreundliche Maßnahmen ergriffen haben.





I put my head on the block some time back and tried to hazard how Datsun became a name for a car.

For those who cannot remember, it was the Nissan project manager's reaction when he was told that the deadline for naming a new car was

His reaction?

"Dat Soon?"

And so a name for a car was

There have been some clangers which I would like to share.

We all know it as the *Pajero* in Kenya.

It is known by that name in a lot of other countries but not in the European countries or Spanish speaking countries.

The manufacturers had to find a new name when they found out that in Spanish the word pajero means "to masturbate".

They changed the name to Shogun but I wonder whether that name would stick in the Swahili speaking parts of Kenya.

I would not use it!

Vauxhall is another car that is rarely seen in Kenya but it also had a Spanish problem.

They produced a car and named it *Nova* but when it came to exporting it to Spain they discovered that the word meant "No Go" in Spanish.

Going Local With A Trade Name Can

Cause Problems In A Literal Sense.

It appeared there as the Corsa.

The race for names has now become a science with agencies now coming up that specialise in this job.

They have computers that store a large number of names that are "no go" in most countries.

They also store names that have already been registered by some manufacturers invarious countries just in case they should need them for a future product.

It would be disappointing to say the least if a carwas named for one country and on exporting to anther place, the manufacturer found he could not use the name as it was already registered as a trademark by someone else.

When such large date bases tell the users that they cannot find a suitable name, the users often give the computer certain attributes that they wish to see.

The computers then generate "names."

An example of this process is the Renault Sairane.

The image was a luxurious, exotic car.

The computer threw up saffron which was changed to the name now used since it was unlikely that anyone would want to ride in vehicle that would evoke spices.

Numbers are becoming the vogue as names are used up.

Peugeot, Mercedes and BMW have mainly used numbers for their

models and do not seem to have had clangers.

Their formula seems simple enough.


