## Theater Geschichte

Das Schiff führt auch 12-15 Tage Spezialkreuzfahrten durch und offeriert dabei Musik, Theater, Geschichte, Kunstgeschichte sowie Kurse für Journalisten. Ein großer Hit ist jeweils im Frühjahr die "Weinprobe-Kreuzfahrt".

Es war der vierte Besuch der *MS Mermoz* in Mombasa, wo sie vier Tage blieb. Sie war bereits in den Jahren 1977 und 1983 hier.

Ihr Besuch in diesem Wildpark war ein besonderes Erlebnis, da sich der Kilimanjaro die ganze Zeit unverhüllt in seiner vollen Schönheit zeigte!

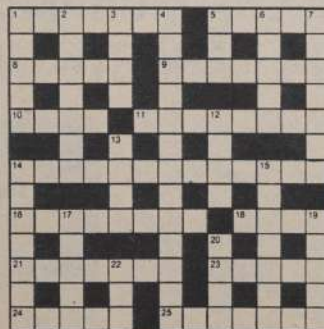

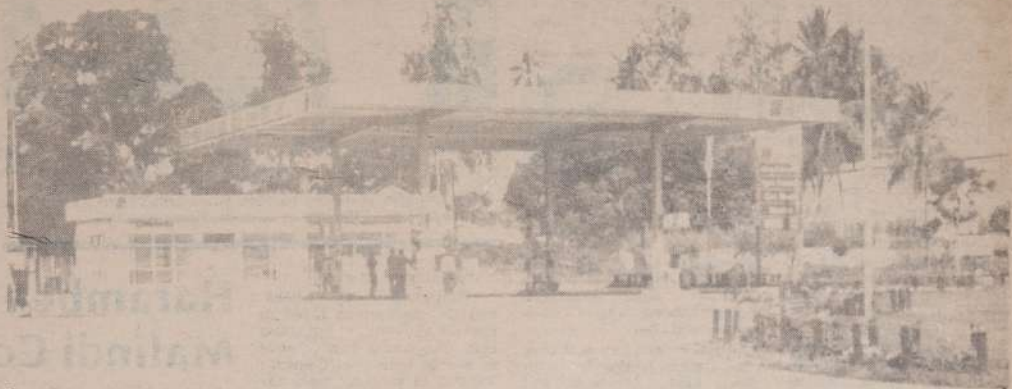

## 'East And Central African' Play-Offs

THE EAST AND Central African Club Championship qualifying matches for Group 'A' involving Kenya Breweries who are defending champions, are to take place at Mombasa Municipal Stadium from January 28, the Kenya Football Federation Secretary Sammy Obingo has confirmed.
