## PRESIDENT OPENS NEW K.W.A.L. OUTLET

### Coast "Duty Free" Shop

PRESIDENT Daniel Arap Moi has opened the new 'KWAL Duty Free Shop' at Moi International Airport Mombasa, built at a cost of K. Shs. twenty million.

KWAL is the former Wine Agencies Ltd. a majority government owned company established in 1969 to take over the importation and distribution of wines and spirits for private merchants.

The company over the years established an extensive distribution network to ensure its products both imported and local reached all parts of the country.

Currently KWAL through its subsidiary Kenya Liquor Distributors (KLD) has over 100 wholesalers country wide.

A KWAL spokesman noted: "Although the market is small compared to that of beer, KWAL endeavours to make a good selection of quality products available to the consumer."

#### EMPLOYMENT

KWAL has about 300 brands of wine and spirits in its range a number of which are bottled locally thus saving foreign exchange and creating employment.

"KWAL has been far sighted about local production."

It is a producer of high quality local wines some of which have

attained recognition at the international level.

**Papaya** - A unique pawpaw based white table wine won Silver Medals for three years running at the Monde Selection.

This wine enjoys more than 25 per cent share of Kenya's total table wine market.

In addition, KWAL produces grape wines, vermouths and

celebration high-life which have also been medal winners.

**Oi Dolnyo Keri** grape wine has won a gold medal at Monde Selection while **Plum Rose Light Dry Wine** has won a **Silver Milano Red** and **Milano Bianco** Vermouths have also won Silver and Gold Medals respectively.

In 1987 KWAL embarked on a new K. Shs. 50 million development

complex on a 6 acre plot in Nairobi's Industrial Area to accommodate growth into the 21st Century.

By January 1989 KWAL had moved into the new complex which includes a modern winery, duty free supermarket distillation column, bottling holes, warehouses and offices.

In Marigot a little town in Baringo District, KWAL has a food

processing factory where pawpaw juice is extracted from pawpaws grown in the area.

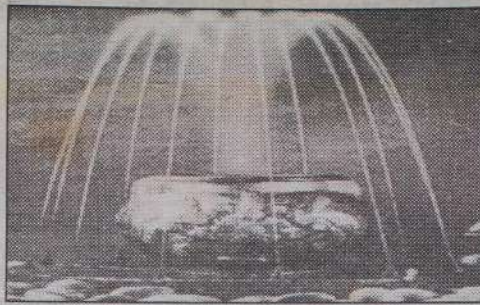

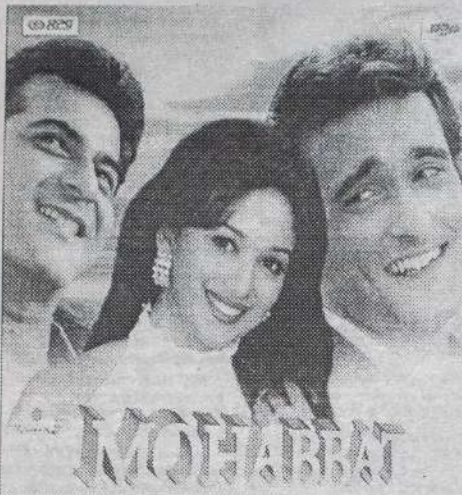

# Kenyan Movie Premieres On 'M-Net'

M-NET IS to screen the Kenyan film *The Baisikol* on Monday October 6 to 1.3 million households in Kenya and other countries in Africa.

*The Baisikol* was written and directed by Ingolo wa Keya and filmed on location in Kenya.

The film is the latest in a series produced as part of the M-Net New Directions project, which helps aspiring African film-makers to realise their vision.

New Directions acknowledges the wealth of film talent on the continent by creating an environment in which new scriptwriters and directors can gain experience and exposure.

All the costs of making *The Baisikol* - approximately K.Shs. five million - have been met by M-Net.

The pay television company launched the New Directions initiative four years ago and this is the first Kenyan film made under its banner.

*The Baisikol* tells the story of Kongo, an arrogant school headmaster in his fifties who is chasing an elusive promotion before he retires.

We find him wondering what to do when his vehicle develops mechanical problems as he is about to depart for an important meeting in Kakamega with fellow educationalists.

The proud Kongo eventually borrows the pastor's prized

bicycle, which is the envy of the entire village.

Kongo's trip turns out to be a nightmare; everything goes wrong for the know-it-all headmaster and

he has to face the wrath and ridicule of the very people he has always treated with contempt.

Scriptwriter and director Ingolo wa Keya, 42, is from the Kakamega district of Western Province.

Originally he seemed destined for a career in teaching.

He completed a degree in education, but after only three

months in a teaching post, he decided to study at the Kenya Institute of Mass Communications for a post-graduate diploma in film production.

From there Ingolo went on to practice his craft with various organisations until he founded his own company, FSS Productions.

*The Baisikol* was shot on 16 mm. film over a period of two weeks at a variety of locations in a 100 kilometre radius around Nairobi.

The role of Kongo is played by Kenyan businessman George Ohawa, who devotes his leisure time to acting in movies, television

and stage productions.

He has starred in a number of films and has done considerable voice-over work for television and radio commercials.

Another well-known Kenyan face is that of David Kakuta Muhoro, who plays the role of the pastor.

This multi-talented actor is also a lecturer in the department of literature at Kenyatta University, an author, a playwright and a director of plays; other stars include Njeri Luseno as Kongo's wife Sofia; Tony Njugunas, John, a trickster who preys on Kongo; and Paul Onsango as Paulo, an old schoolmate of Kongo, who hides a sensible nature beneath a drunken exterior.

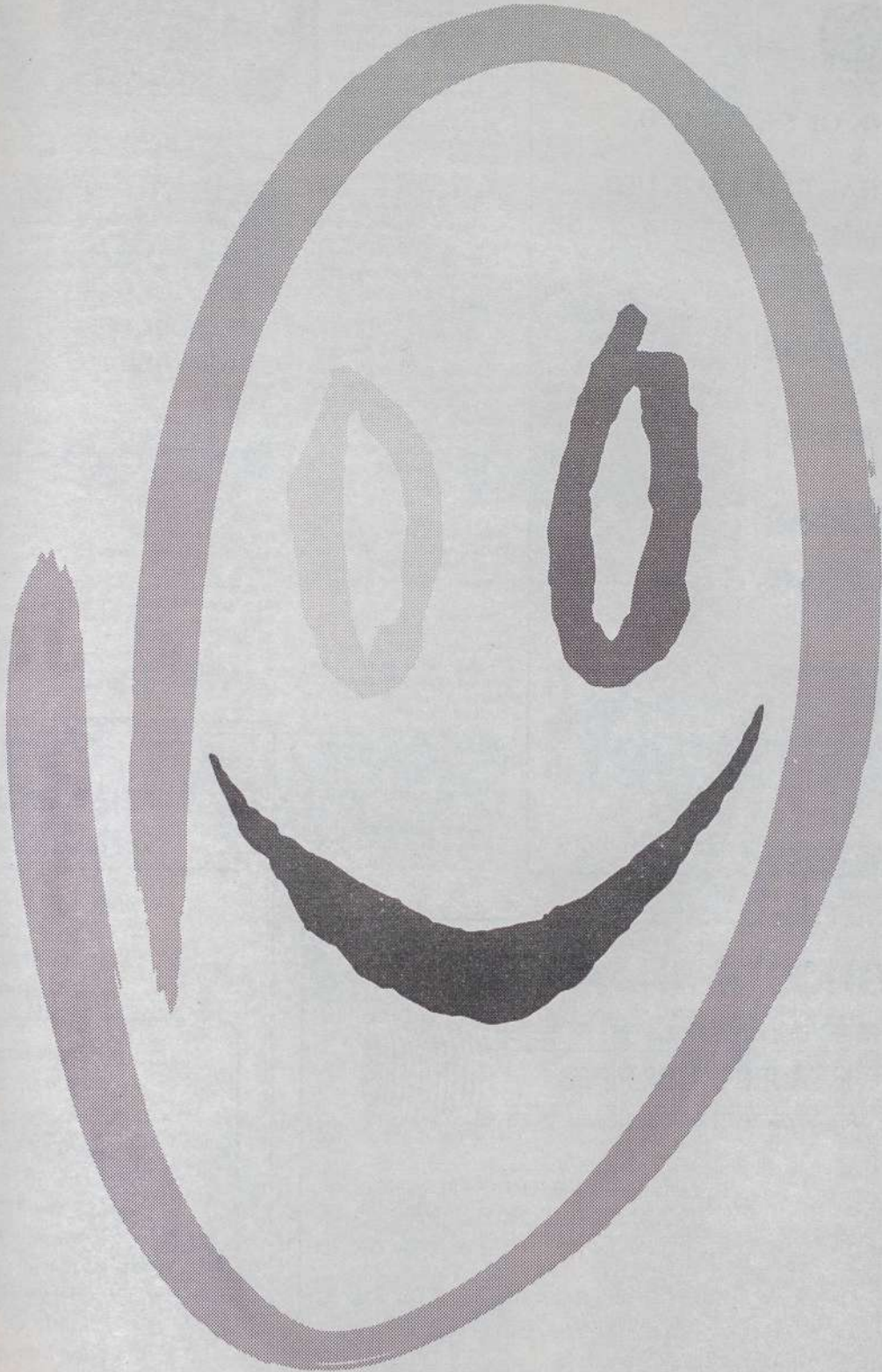

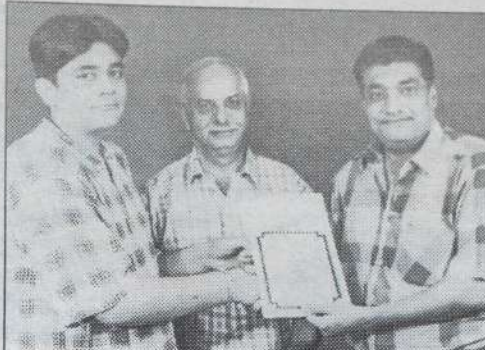

## French, German, British And Italian Tourists Enjoy Visits To Mombasa's Historic Fort Jesus Museum

IT WOULD be an eye opener for the American Embassy in Kenya to observe the many tourists from home and overseas arriving in coaches and mini buses at Mombasa's Fort Jesus Museum.

They not only tour the Fort but also Mombasa's Old Town walking on foot through Ndia Kuu to the Old Port then back to the Fort again.

Travel Advisory recently issued states 'the Department of State recommends that American citizens avoid unnecessary travel to the following districts at the Coast' one of them being Mombasa.

Recent sporadic outbreaks of 'organised' tribal violence at the coast has not targeted tourists and none has been harmed.

At Fort Jesus last Friday morning (Sept. 26) it was amazing to see the number of tourists on City Tours which also cover visits to the Akamba Carvers Co-operative at Port Reitz and Mackinnon Market.

Among them was a 32-strong group who work on the French Bourse.

They were enjoying a weeks safari/beach holiday in Kenya arranged by Voyageurs du Monde, one of the leading tour operators in France.

Only three had been to Kenya before and it was UTC, the leading tour operator in Africa, which took them on safari to Amboseli, Nairobi,

Nakuru and the Masai Mara ending with a relaxing two days at the coast at Silver Beach Hotel.

None was scared about coming to the Kenya Coast and described their holiday as 'super'.

Said their tour leader, Jean Didier 'they were very interested in coming to Kenya as it is one of the most famous countries in the world for wildlife and offers a unique combination of a safari/beach holiday'.

It appears that French press has been more restrained over its reporting of outbreaks of violence at the Coast.

Said Jean, 'our Ministry of Foreign Affairs said we can still go to Kenya. All have had a wonderful time and are glad they came'.

They are seen on arrival at the over 400 years old Fort Jesus with Jean Didier (2nd left front) and James Geke, UTC's French Speaking representative (left front) who appealed to them all to tell their friends back home how peaceful and enjoyable their holiday in Kenya had been.

Jean is also cognizant of the fact that UTC is a member of the Kenya Association of Tour Operators which is constantly monitoring the security situation at the coast.

It has a 24-hour networked communication set-up linked to the police enabling an immediate emergency system to be activated to protect tourists.

However, despite there being many at Fort Jesus that day, its Curator Ali Abubakar, reports that the number of visitors compared to the same period last year had dropped by around 50 per cent as well as revenue.

'Tourism is our backbone' he declared.

'We survive on it and had been expecting a similar income as for the same period last year

Consequently we are very hard up'. Adding 'we are closely monitoring the situation and have cut down operational costs by around 50 per cent.

Many schools have stopped coming and there are fewer visitors to other national monuments such as Jumba la Mtwana (Mtwapa), Mnarani (Kilifi) and Gede'.

Also badly affected are individual tour guides who take visitors on conducted tours on Mombasa's Old Town.

Museum staff at Fort Jesus are almost disappointed that the Lamu Maulidi photographic exhibition, they had very proudly prepared had been seen by so few people - August/September usually being very busy months at the Fort for both visitors and students alike.

## SAD IMPACT

Such has been the disastrous impact on the tourism industry at the Coast that the World Tourism Festival Week, organised for many years by the three tourists associations at the coast - MCTA, KATO and KAHC together with Kenya Wildlife Service was cancelled.

Its Grand Finale was usually a swinging Fiesta at Fort Jesus. Even the Ministry of Tourism's cocktail party to mark World Tourism Day on September 27 at Mombasa did not take place this year.

## SOUTH AFRICAN NAVY VISIT

A SOUTH African Naval task force is currently visiting Mombasa.

It is made up of the combat support ship, SAS Drakensberg (Captain R.A.S Myers) and two warrior class strike craft (Squadron Commander, Commander (Cdr) D.G.

Jamieson, SAS Adam Kok (Cdr K.P. Mutch) SAS Jan Smuts (Cdr M.F.N. Venter) plus elements from the SA Army, SA Airforce and SA Medical Service.

They are deploying in the West Indian Ocean to participate in an exercise with members of the Inter-State Defence Security Committee (ISDC) and other African countries over the period September 15 to October 22, 1997.

This deployment is part of South African Department of Defence's agreement to improve and promote co-ordination on regional defence between the ISDC countries.

The objectives of the visits and exercises include:

- To promote confidence building and co-operation between the countries in the region.

- To strengthen existing ties with the navies of the ISDC

countries and other African states.

- To exercise with foreign naval forces in the area thereby further improving and enhancing interoperability which is a pre-requisite for combined operations.

- To re-confirm the ability to deploy and provide distant support to forces.

- To accommodate officers from the ISDC countries and to report fishing vessel concentrations to local authorities, and

- To provide astro navigation training for SA Navy Officers.

The task force hopes to visit Maputo (Mozambique), Dar-es-Salaam and Zanzibar (Tanzania), Mombasa (Kenya), Port Louis (Mauritius), Pointe des Galets (Reunion) and Tolagnaro (Madagascar) before returning to Simon's Town via Durban on October 22, 1997.

Responding with alacrity to the appeal by the Mombasa Red Cross was Lynda Davie, Resident Manager, Inspiration Holidays which bring many British tourists here.

A fun day at Diani with lunch at Forty Thieves Beach Bar and strong support particularly by Inspiration clients from UK, raised Kshs. 70,000/= with which to buy food to present to the Red Cross for these 'local' refugees.

Meanwhile, life goes on and displaced families are coping the best they can.

Presently they are still too terrified to return to where they lived, despite the fact that initial acts of 'organised' violence appear to have given way to other thugs - arsonists and thieves.

Many children are at the Cathedral, some of whom have been absorbed into Island schools, while others enjoy art-fresco lessons in its grounds.

They help keep the gardens spick and span, while some enterprising women have set up their own market selling fruit and vegetables to the 1,100 residents there.

Some men were found ironing and others, who work at night, sleeping.

Medical care comes from the Cathedrals own dispensary, as well as from a Red Cross team.

Other 'local' refugees are at the Likoni Catholic Church which at one time had some 4,000 camped there.

It was most grateful for the Kshs. 500,000/- given by President Moi.

'But' said Father Mutua 'with so many to look after it did not last even two weeks.

There has been no further such help from the government'

Meanwhile, many have left for up-country and only 1,500 now remain.

Thus, the Roman Catholic Church is presently looking after a total of 2,600 temporarily displaced persons.

### DISASTROUS

Said Father Mutua 'we believe the initial violence was politically motivated to rid those areas of 'opposition' supporters.

It seems to have back-fired for it is not only up-country people who fled, but coastal people as well.

The perpetrators obviously did not realise the damaging publicity it would receive in the overseas press and the disastrous effect on the economy of the country through its tourism industry which has been Kenya's largest earner of foreign exchange.

It is rendering many 'voters' jobless.

Some hotels have already been forced to close down due to the drastic reduction in the number of tourists coming here.

Many other who derive a living from tourism related industries are also seriously affected.

Now it appears that other thugs are taking advantage of the situation to torch and rob homes for their personal gain'.

EINE LANGE, schneeweiß glitzende Sandbank im glasklaren Wasser des Indischen Ozeans, wo man ungestört und in absoluter Ruhe sonnenbaden kann, gehört zu den Attraktionen der Tagestour "Shirazi Escapades", die erst kürzlich eingeführt wurde.

Sie wurden von Handwerkern in den umliegenden Dörfern aus lokalen Rohmaterialien hergestellt.

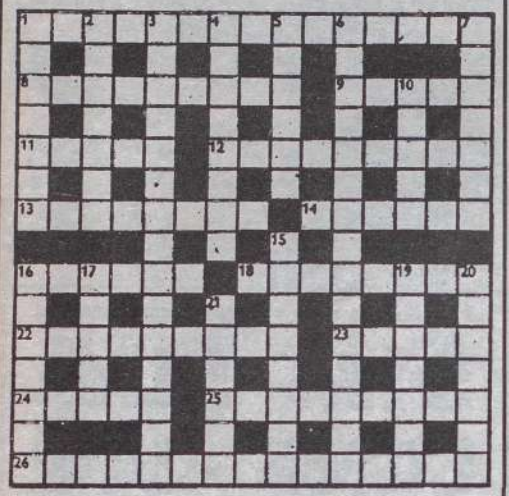

Also peanut and mulberries are among 72 plants and foods known to contain this cancer fighting agent.

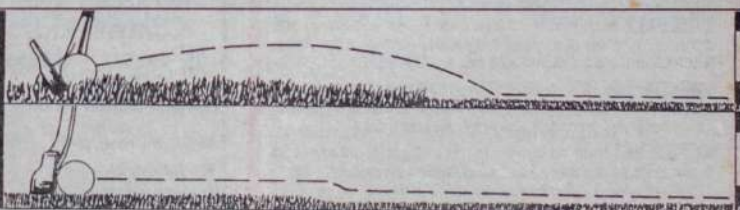
