Major New Investment At 'Caltex Oil' Terminal

OVER 30 million shillings has been invested by Caltex Oil (Kenya) Limited in a modern labelling, filling and packaging line at the Company's Mombasa terminal.

This handles half, one, four and five litre containers which are placed in cartons for distribution in Kenya and neighbouring countries.

The equipment was commissioned by Jim Richardson, a Service Engineer from the Masterfil Company which provided the filling machine.

He worked with Thomas Chula, the Caltex Mombasa Terminal Engineer, who is responsible for maintenance at the Terminal.

Mohamed Baraka, the General Manager Consumer Sales, Lube and Technical Services of Caltex, explained:

"Caltex lubricants are blended to international standards at our Mombasa Bulk Lube Oil Plant. This was the first in East and

Central Africa to achieve ISO 9002 certification.

The new filling line represents a further step to ensure that our customers receive genuine high quality products.

It plays a major role in complementing of our efforts to improve customer service through ISO 9000 Certification of lubricant distribution."

"The new equipment has boosted our filling capacity by a massive margin. In the past the maximum output was 800 cartons per day.

We now have the capability to turn out 3,000 cartons."

"The first machine labels containers before they are conveyed to the "Masterfil" unit which fills the exact type and quantity of lubricants.

"This is carried out under lock and key behind safety glass panels".

He continued, "An induction sealing device fixes and aluminium foil sheet underneath

the external cap of each container.

"This guarantees our customers that Caltex oils are free from adulteration and protected against pilferage.

"Before the packs are placed in cardboard containers at the end of the line, code numbers are printed on the external caps.

FORMER WORLD WOMEN'S TENNIS CHAMPION HOLIDAYS AT DIANI

UNITED STATES - based former Women's World Tennis Champion Martina Navratilova has made her first visit to Africa, staying at Block Hotels Indian Ocean Beach Club located on the Kenya South Coast.

HER FAMILY AND FRIEND

Martina spent two-nights at the hotel and was accompanied by her close friend, Alexandria.

Billed as the best female player of the 20 century she enjoyed a challenging 20-year career in the US which she gave up in 1994.

The 41-year old tennis player started the sport at the age of five in her native homeland in the former Czech republic.

She took an interest in the game after watching her parents and grandparents playing in her home-country and pursued the sport after seeking asylum in the States in 1975.

Her best win ever, she reckons, was when she defeated her mother.

Martina turned professional in 1973 at the age of 16 and credits her father for the development of

her all-time career.

Besides playing tennis, Martina enjoyed playing other sports such as hockey and football.

Currently, Martina is involved in working for television and in writing books as she has not made up her mind on what to do with life.

She told *Coastweek* that one of her toughest physical weeks was in the 1991 US Open Women's Final where she lost to Yugoslavia's Monica Seles.

In her wide travels during her 20-year career, Martina had little time to see the world and has now decided to travel to make up for this; now, she wants to relax and spend quality time with her family and friends.

She told the Press that she wanted to lead a quiet life after having savoured honour and recognition during her career.

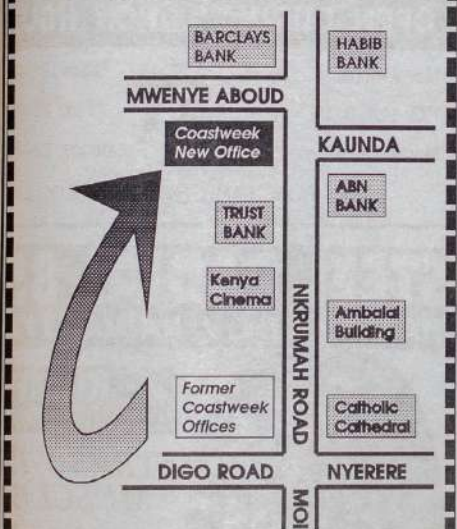
The former Czechoslovak tennis player quit active tennis in 1994, but was to take part in a seniors tourney in the US in the past week.

Participants expressed disappointment at the poor turnout when considering L.T.C. is the only venue where Mombasa residents can send their children for ballet lessons by a qualified teacher, as well as enjoy the many shows staged at the town's only non-racial cultural centre'.

While appreciating the efforts of Jean Koch appeal was made to the many affluent parents to also show their appreciation by offering L.T.C. some badly needed financial assistance.

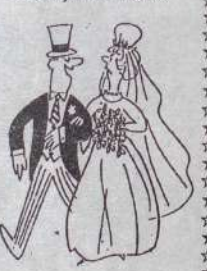

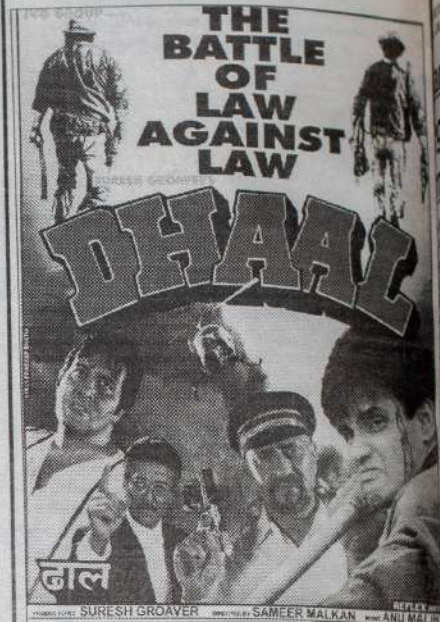

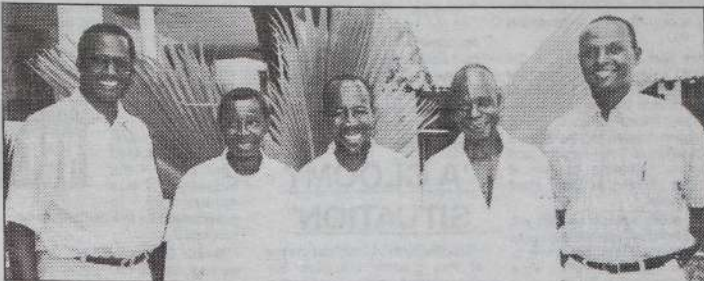
'thank you for the very good work done and this luncheon party is to show our appreciation.

Tour Industry Welcome Positive Support From Government On New Tax Incentive

LOUD CHEERS greeted the news that 'Government has allowed hoteliers to deduct all input tax on goods or services used in making the supply of restaurant services'.

It became effective on November 18, 1997.

This was in response to the industry's felt needs' declared the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife, Mr. S. M. Mbova, when addressing a Luncheon hosted by the Kenya Association of Hotelkeepers and Caterers' following its Annual General Meeting at Diani Reef Grand Hotel.

'This positive move' he said 'will reduce hoteliers operational costs thus creating room for Kenya to improve further the service rendered in such outlets.

The removal of this input tax by the Ministry of Finance' he said 'came in the wake of amendments to the Hotel and Restaurants Act as introduced in this year's Budget to allow the Catering Training Levy to be used more generously to support development of the tourism sector'.

Earlier, the KAHC chairman, Peter Mbova, had told the Chief Guest, Mr. Mbova 'the tourist industry continues to reel through its worst ever crisis since the violent disturbances at the Coast erupted last August.

It led to a massive cancellations of bookings from overseas source countries not only for the coast but also for lodges and hotels in national parks, game reserves and urban centres including Nairobi'.

He went on 'many charter companies have either stopped coming to Kenya, drastically reduced frequency of flights or have down sized their aircraft capacity.

UNUSUALLY LOW OCCUPANCIES

Some hotels have been forced to close and unless the situation improves, more are expected to do so in the near future.

Hotels which remain open are operating at extremely low occupancy levels ranging from 10-

30 per cent.

This is, indeed, sad for we had forecast a very high season during this period.

As of today (Nov. 28) approx. 35 - 40 per cent of employed staff at the coast have lost their jobs which is, indeed, most unfortunate.

Most hotels are now in such a financial crisis that they are not even able to pay for their overheads including bill for telephones, electricity and water'.

'A GLOOMY SITUATION'

Said the KAHC Chairman 'in view of this gloomy situation the association recently sent a memorandum to the Ministry of Finance, which was also copied to the Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife, appealing for an 'Industry Rescue Programme' in the way of a moratorium in payment of Government taxes, VAT, etc.

He appealed to the Permanent Secretary 'to assist with favourable consideration of our proposals'.

Continuing he noted that 'the entire tourist industry was most

disappointed with the recent introduction of a Visa for British passport holders visiting Kenya.

Britain is the second largest European source market and the timing of this Visa requirement just before the World Travel Market in London, when the industry is in such crisis, would not have been expected and will have an adverse effect on tourism.

Are you aware, said the KAHC Chairman 'the industry has appealed to government for this decision to be rescinded.

Should Government not do so, we suggest that visa requirements be waived for all visitors from major source markets staying in Kenya for a maximum of 21 days.

Such countries should include Britain, USA, Switzerland, Australia, etc.'

In his speech, the Permanent Secretary, when referring to the Visa requirement said 'I would like to reassure the industry fraternity that government is determining to ensure that the growth of the tourism sector is safeguarded in the course

of implementing various policies'.

Adding 'policy changes like the recent introduction of a Visa Requirement for British Passport holders should, therefore, not be misconstrued as signifying a lack of support to the industry.

My Ministry is certain that the UK market will continue to perform as usual given the fact that Kenya is no exception to other destinations where British tourists pay visa



fees to gain entry'. Continuing the Permanent Secretary said he was pleased to observe that most hoteliers continue to participate fully in various international tourism promotional fairs and exhibitions.

This 'he said' demonstrates your conviction that both the Government and hotel industry must continue to work together to ensure the success of the tourism sector.

While being aware that such promotional factors are quite expensive our joint participation remains extremely necessary if Kenya is to be adequately exposed to the world alongside other competitors in the tourism and travel business'.

He mentioned that the financial input by the Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife in the World Travel Market '97 was to the tune of Kshs. 13 million out of a total budget of Kshs. 18 million, the difference of about Kshs. 5 million being raised by participating companies.

A SUBSTANTIAL CONTRIBUTION

Declared the PS 'the substantial contribution by government belies claims by some stake holders to the effect that the Ministry does not take tourism promotion as seriously as ought to be the case'.

He commended those who render practical support to Kenya's promotional efforts and urged those who tend to sit on the fence to change their negative attitudes in appreciation of the good work being done to enable them to remain in the business'.

The Permanent Secretary reiterated 'the resolve of my Ministry and Government as a whole to ensure that tourism industry prospers now and in the future'.

He told the Permanent Secretary 'we are giving signals to government, through your goodness and the Treasury, that if we collapse you will not have the resources you have been harvesting.

We urge government to start investing, even in a small way, in the industry'.

Referring to the recent fire at Two Fishes Hotel he said 'there is no Fire Engine at Diani' and suggested that KAHC might in the spirit of Harambee, help in this direction.

The Permanent Secretary in the conclusion of his prepared speech took the opportunity of registering his appreciation of the support have received from the industry.

I want to believe that during those three years we have been able to develop an environment where we can share our concerns, where we can sit down to discuss your problems.

I wish to assure you the government is totally committed to solving the problems the industry has been facing'.

Here the PS mentioned 'on areas where we have been able to get some understanding of your problems is the Treasury'.

In thanking the Permanent Secretary for his support the KAHC Chairman, Coast Region, Jot Mwendwa said 'please the cow that gives the milk and when you ask for money for marketing please also mention the air need of a Fire Engine at Diani'.

It Seems 'Cabro-Work Blocks' Are The Only Answer To 'El Niño' On Our Roads

KACHUMBARI's experiences with various pot-holed areas was the main issue last week.

Because of the state of the roads in Mombasa, and at the risk of getting very boring, we continue with the same theme.

The Makupa causeway linking Changamwe to Makupa is indeed in a very sorry state.

It is so bad that some concerned person has ordered work to start on the repair of the road.

This is proceeding with a vengeance.

The carpet is being rolled out as fast as time and weather allows.

It is as if we are expecting a very important visitor soon.

The sad thing is that the state of disrepair is returning as fast as the roads being re-carpeted.

Within a space of five days of the re-carpeting starting on only one of the lanes, the carriageway leading towards the island already has pot-holed through the carpet.

It isn't very surprising that the potholes are in fact in exactly the same place as the ones that were being covered up by the carpet.

Signs are that potholes will continue to appear through the carpet that is being laid to hide them.

They are quite tenacious little (and big) things and cosmetics will not work.

In real life, the cost of cosmetics is high.

The use of such things to cover up or dress items that are unseemly or ungraciously can be quite expensive.

It eats away a major portion of the salaries of those who use them.

The same argument applies in taking cosmetic care of the roads.

Covering up the faults will not make them go away, they will continue to come back and haunt the motorist year in year out.

What is needed is radical surgery.

A complete face-lift is required. It is said to be expensive but so be it.

If one were to reconstruct the roads to a better standard, or even the original standard that they were built to would mean that one would not have to go back to that portion of road for a very long time.

The standard life is twenty years. The 'number ten' portion of the

hill at Kibarani is a prime example of how things should be done.

The pilot repairs to Beira road in the Shimanzi godown area is also another example.

These repairs were done using Cabro blocks that are now misplaced for coming up to ten years without any major repairs being necessary.

In fact, the lack of attention to the few bricks that are now misplaced because of a fault in the sub surface could lead to problems in the future.

The key thing is that almost all roads on the island have been affected by 'El Niño' but these portions have come through unscathed.

No potholes have shown up despite the heavy rains that they were subjected to like any other road in the Republic.

The portion of road in Nairobi leading towards Limuru that was done up in the same material is also showing remarkable resilience to wear and tear and to the weather.

Have our road repair men learned anything from these trials that have been in place for nearly ten years?

Can they claim that they are keeping up with technological advances in the world?

Is our country in a desert island where we have to learn to survive using rudimentary tools and methods that have to be invented because there is no other reference for us to draw on?

The answer to all these is a resounding NO!

Yet we keep making the same errors year in year out.

The money collected from the hard working and underpaid public is literally being poured down the drain.

ON A DIFFERENT note - Kachumbari draw my attention to a looming danger on one of the major roads in out town.

Those travelling to Nairobi from Mombasa will be painfully aware of the fact that what is left of the road between Mombasa and Mariakani is in a very sorry state thanks to the weather.

The road repair men have a challenge in keeping the road open let alone tar-macked.

The weather has made life a hell for them and I sympathise with the frustration they must be feeling because their efforts are being washed away by the rain water.

Large shallow holes that one can go through slowly present a problem but not a danger to the sensible motorist.

Those people driving from Nairobi towards Mombasa have not only the rain damaged road surface to contend with but there is now a new problem that was pointed out to me by the speleologists (cavers) who had

their Annual general Meeting on Digo road recently.

After that meeting and luncheon, they decided to drive back to Nairobi and Kachumbari decided to hitch a lift with them.

Just before they left, one of the people who had attended the meeting told them of a brand new cave they might wish to explore.

This cave is in Changamwe on the Mombasa bound carriageway of the Nairobi road.

It is marked by a large culvert that is placed in the middle of the carriageway.

The cavers went there and to their delight found that it was a

real cave.

Access to the cave is by climbing down through the culvert that has been placed to mark the entrance.

Once one gets below the road surface, there is a sizeable cave there that can fit at least six people.

Leading off from the cave are two concrete tubes which one can easily crawl through.

The stretch from them, however, discourages further exploration so the cavers left it at that.

The cave under the Nairobi road is likely to cave in if not repaired in time and motorists should be careful when approaching that spot especially heavy vehicles.

As Kachumbari says, it is apt to say that we should not sweep our problems under the carpet.

Pledges started pouring in with 2,000 sterling pounds each from

Through such generous sponsorship pledges, the Club carried out its first Eye Camp at Pemba on October 24-26, 1997 at Wete on Pemba Island in Tanzania.

Operating team included Dr. Kamal Bhandari, Mr. Binns, Mr.

Odingo, and assistants Mr. Edward and Mr. Hamisi. Lion members accompanying were Tony D'Silva - convener of Eye Camps, Chairman Murtaza Dunganwalla, Anil Aggarwal, Abdulaziz Kasmani, Inderjeet Main, Avinash Shah and a friend to Lions Club of Pwani - Zainuddin Badri making a total of 12 people who boarded, the chartered aircraft for the mission.

"Upon arrival in Mombasa, it was decided that a second eye camp be arranged on 12th, 13th, 14th December 1997.

"This time we will target the township of Chake Chake.

This is the first I.O.L. (Intra Ocular Lens Implantation) Eye Camp performed across the national borders by Lions of Mombasa Pwani under and it is also the intention that all future Eye Camps be I.O.L. camps.

Lions Club of Mombasa Pwani with similar intention have declared that as from January 1998, the Lions Eye and Blood Centre will be carrying out routine I.O.L. surgery for patients (walk-in) on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

On an average about 20 patients are operated in a month.

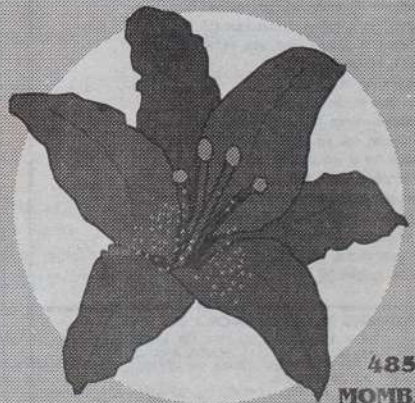

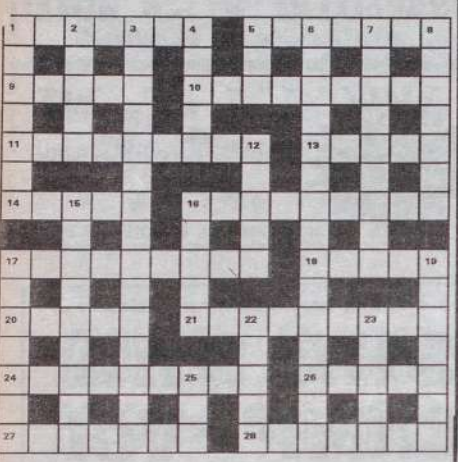

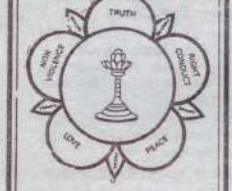

Deducing from his partner's 'double' that he must have Dummy's suit well-held, West led the Four of Spades.

Declarer played Dummy's Queen which East won with the Ace.

He returned the Five of Spades, to West's Ten and Dummy's King.

Declarer cashed the Dummy's King of Clubs and led to his Ace.

He followed by leading a low Diamond, and West won his singleton King.

He led his third Spade and

East's speculative 'double' had worked perfectly.

Without it West would have led a Heart and now Declarer would be a tempo ahead.

Declarer however, was not the innocent victim of a brilliant 'double'. If he had played a low Spade from Dummy at Trick One, the opponents could have made only two tricks in Spades and Declarer would have made his Contract. The full hand is shown above.
