In an age where compassion for the poor and needy has become an outdated concept. Mother Teresa, as she was affectionately known the world over, has given it a new meaning and forced a cynical world to acknowledge and honour

In siums from Calcutta to Nairobi to New York; the famine infested waste of Africa, amidst earth quakes and floods; cholera infested

All this was her burning priority

This kindly wrinkled face was better known than those of most

Mother was born to Albanian parents in Skopje, Yugoslavia in 1910 andbaptised Agnes Gonxha

At the age of 12 she wanted to be a Missionary, "to go and give the love of Christ"

By the time she was 18, she had joined the Irish Branch of Loreto nuns who were working in Calcutta At the age of 27 she took her final

the world within the secure walls of the convent. It was on September 10, 1946

Mother was on a train heading for Darjeeling, when she heard a Divine Call.

"A Call within a Call", as she later explained.

She was already a nun.

This time the request was to serve the poorest of the poor.

The Loreto nuns were surprised that Mother chose to quit their congregation.

She seemed happy with them.

They were oblivious to the fact that Mother Teresa was destined to work for God.

She was inspired by Him and knew that to be closer to Him she needed to be closer to His needy

It was this will in Mother that gave her energy, moving force and organisational skill and above all compassion which gave this world The Missionaries of Charity.

For the 1979 Noble Peace Prize Winner, it had been a long journey to achieve her cause

India, also gave its highest honour. *Bharat Ratan*, to the woman who adopted India, a foreign land as her own and did so much for its people, nothing could ever be enough.

"Perhaps the greatest message Pernaps the greatest message she has given is the value and dignity of human life'; the archbishop of Calcutta said in his eulogy, "All human life is precious".

This humble writer had the privilege and honour to meet this "Saint of the Gutters" on Monday the 25th November 1991

All this happened when yours truly had accompanied Mr. Sunil Dutt, the great film maker and equally great actor, to Nairobi Airport for his return journey to



- The ground is the only one in the whole world with only three corners
- The ball does not get out of play on the side where the Fort Jesus wall is situated.

The ball just bounces off the fort wall into play. Sometimes goals are scored by bouncing the ball onto the wall.

 When the ball is kicked into the Indian Ocean another ball is played while some ball boys swim to collect the ball from the sea.

To be a ball boy at the Pamba Roho, one must be a deep sea swimmer.

 Due to the size of the field of play the ball can be kicked from one end of the field to the other.

At one time a goal was scored from a goal kick which was taken by the opposing goalkeeper.

 "Pamba Roho" is a Swahili phrase meaning decorating the heart and one will never know it's

true meaning until he participates as a spectator, player or official in the Pamba Roho Tournament.
